



1 – DEXTER STRICKLAND

Junior, Guard, 6-3, 180, Rahwah, N.J.



Suffered a torn right anterior cruciate ligament in the second half of the win at Virginia Tech on Jan. 19 and is out for the rest of the season.

Career: Started 59 of 92 games • Scored 617 points (6.7 per game) and has 192 assists • Has played at both guard slots in his career – primarily at the point as a freshman and the two-guard as the start of his sophomore season, but began to see

more action at the point in the last 16 games a year ago • Started this year at the off-guard spot but played about six to eight minutes a game as the primary ball handler • Has scored in double figures 22 times (six times this year) with a career-high 19 against William and Mary in Dec. 2010.

2011-12: Shot a team-best 57.0 percent from the floor • Prior to being injured, he was tied for the team lead in steals with 25, second in assists with 39 and fifth at 7.5 points per game • Had two or more steals nine times • Was 11 for 18 from the floor (.611) in ACC action • Attempted his first three-pointer of the season against Boston College on Jan. 7th • Last made a three-pointer at NC State on Feb. 23, 2011.

Had three steals and was UNC's defensive player of the game against Boston College • Played one of his best all-around games as a Tar Heel in the home win over Miami as he scored a season-high tying 14 points, had three assists, no turnovers and two steals and played exceptional defense • Helped hold the Canes' top perimeter scorers to 7 of 25 shooting with seven turnovers • Made 7 of 9 field goals against the Canes • Had eight first-half points as UNC built a 15-point advantage • The 14 points are the third-most in an ACC game in his career.

Shared team scoring honors with 14 points on 6 of 8 shooting from the floor against Nicholls • Had nine points and three steals against Evansville and won his first defensive player of the game award this year as he helped limit the Aces to under 30 percent shooting from the floor • Had 10 points, three assists and two steals vs. Elon.

Handed out five assists in the loss at Kentucky • Played well on both ends of the floor in the win over Wisconsin as he had nine points and helped limit Jordan Taylor to 6 of 20 shooting from the floor • Led UNC in scoring in the first half with seven points and added a baseline jumper with 5:31 to play that gave UNC a 49-41 lead • Has scored in double figures three times with a high of 13 against Mississippi Valley State • Also had six assists and six rebounds against the Delta Devils • Had 10 points, five assists and two steals in the win over Michigan State • Made 5 of 8 shots from the floor and finished with 12 points, two assists and two steals against UNLV • Was the only starter to shoot at least 50 percent from the floor against the Rebels.

5 – KENDALL MARSHALL

Sophomore, Guard, 6-3, 186, Dumfries, Va.



Career: Carolina's all-time leader in assist average with 7.6 per game (Ed Cota second at 7.46) and frst with assist-error ratio of 2.89 to 1 (Ty Lawson second at 2.78) • Has 456 assists and 158 turnovers, the second-best ratio in ACC history (NC State's Sidney Lowe, 2.94) • Third in ACC history in assists per game behind NC State's Chris Corchiani (8.37) and Duke's Bobby Hurley (7.68) • Has 15 or more assists five times and is the only Tar Heel with 15 or more assists in multiple games • Only happened three other times

(once each by Raymond Felton, Jeff Lebo and Cota) in UNC history • Reached 400 assists in fewer games (55) than any Tar Heel in history • Has 10 or more assists 16 times (*the rest of the ACC has five combined 10-assist games among active players*), including a career-high 16 against Florida State on 2/6/11, Long Beach State on 12/10/11 and at Maryland on 2/4/12 • Has the third-most 10-assist games in UNC history and the eighth-most in ACC history • Carolina is 37-6 in his 43 starts • Has more assists than turnovers in 52 of 60 games • Has five of UNC's top eight single-game assist totals • Scored in double figures eight times with a high of 18 at Clemson on Feb. 12, 2011.

2011-12: An outstanding candidate for the Bob Cousy Award as the top point guard in the nation – is one of 11 finalists for the award • Mid-season candidate (one of 25) for the Wooden Award • Began the week second in the nation in assists and assist-error • Leads the ACC in assists (9.8 per game) and assist-error ratio (3.4) • On pace for the highest assist per game average and second-best assist-error ratio in UNC history • Helps Carolina lead the nation in scoring and rank second in the ACC in field goal percentage • Has 226 assists, 66 turnovers and 54 field goals • Has two 16-assist, two 15- and one 14-assist performances • Those are the five highest assist totals in the ACC this year • The 226 assists are already the ninth-most in UNC history • Has more assists than turnovers in 21 of 23 games • Playing a team-high 31.8 minutes per game • Leads the team with 33 steals • Scored in double figures twice (14 at Wake Forest and 12 vs. Miami) • Averaging 9.1 points over the last seven games (averaged 5.4 points over the first 16 games) • UNC's fourth-leading scorer in ACC play (8.8).

Had 16 assists and nine points in win at Maryland • Also committed six turnovers, but had only one in the final 28 minutes • Played the final 7:19 with four fouls • The 16 assists tied his own school record for most assists in an ACC game, set a Comcast Center record and were the most ever by a Tar Heel in an away game • Has 45 assists and 11 turnovers in last four games.

Opened ACC play with 11 assists against Boston College, most ever by a Tar Heel against BC • Scored in double figures for the first time as a sophomore with 12 points on 5 of 7 shooting from the floor against Miami • Added eight assists and played stellar defense, helping to limit the Canes' backcourt starters to six field goals • Struggled at Florida State with a season-low four assists and a career-high seven turnovers • Had 11 assists in 74-55 win over NC State • Posted consecutive double-figure assist games for the first time in ACC play when he had 11 against NC State on Jan. 26 and 12 against Georgia Tech on Jan. 29 • Only had one turnover against the Yellow Jackets, marking the third time this year he had at least a dozen assists and only one turnover • Scored a season-high 14 points and had six as-

sists (UNC only had 22 field goals) in win at Wake Forest • Attempted a season-high 11 shots from the floor at Wake.

Had 29 assists in games against Long Beach (16) and Appalachian State (13) to tie his own school record for consecutive games (set the mark earlier this year) • Established UNC records for most assists in consecutive games for two (29), four (52) and five games (60) • Had 15 assists in 91-75 win at UNC Asheville • The 15 assists were the most by a Tar Heel in a road game • Also had 15 assists (10 in the first half) of 102-69 win over Tennessee State • Had 14 assists and a career-high six steals against South Carolina (a 15th assist was wiped out by an official's inadvertent whistle).

Had assists on seven of UNC's 19 field goals against Wisconsin, but it was his defense that led the Tar Heels past the Badgers • Graded out as his finest defensive performance of his college career (won UNC's defensive award) as helped limit the Badgers to 35.9 percent shooting from the floor, including 6 of 20 by standout point guard Jordan Taylor • Also made four key free throws in the final minute • Scored a eight points and had eight assists at Kentucky • Matched his career-best with two three-pointers at Kentucky.

Freshman, Guard, 6-0, 160, Wilmington, N.C.



Has played in 19 of the 23 games, including all eight ACC games • Scored a season-high three points against Michigan State, South Carolina, Evansville, NC State and Georgia Tech • Handed out three assists against Mississippi Valley State • Has 14 assists and three turnovers • Played five or more minutes in seven different games • Hit a three-pointer and had an assist in ACC wins over NC State and Georgia Tech.

Prep: Hoggard High School • Earned first-team Associated Press and North Carolina Basketball Coaches all-state honors and was the Mideastern Conference and District 2 Player of the Year in 2011 • Two-time team captain, MVP and all-district honoree • Played for Coach Brett Queen • Scored 1,078 points and had 231 assists in 76 career games • Averaged a career-high 20.5 points and 3.0 assists per game as a senior • Hoggard's all-time leader in made free throws (280) and three-point field goal percentage (.381) • Led Hoggard to the conference tournament championship in 2011 • One of three players in school history to score 1,000 or more points.

Freshman, Guard, 6-5 1/2, 220, Greensboro, N.C.



2011-12: Carolina's sixth-leading scorer at 6.9 points per game • Earned all-tournament honors at the Las Vegas Invitational, the first UNC non-starter to accomplish that since Danny Green in Vegas in 2007.

Has scored in double figures in six games (once in the last 11 games) • Shooting 30 of 97 from three-point range • Tied with Harrison Barnes for the second-most threes (trailing only Reggie Bullock's 42) •

Made three-pointers in 15 of the 23 games • Is 4 for 28 from three in the last seven games • Is 42 for 49 (.857) from the free throw line • Leads the Tar Heels in free throw percentage • Averaging 4.1 points in the eight ACC games.

Made 10 of 12 free throws against Appalachian State • Sprained his right ankle and was limited to nine minutes against Evansville • Also played just nine minutes in the following game against Long Beach State, scoring two points • Grabbed a season-high six rebounds against Elon • Scored 16 points against Monmouth, making 4 of 9 from three-point range • Had a key offensive rebound and putback basket in the win at Maryland.

Had eight points, two assists and two steals against Georgia Tech, the first time he had made multiple three-pointers since the ACC opener against Boston College.

Suffered a sprained left wrist and bone contusion early in the second half of the Wisconsin game when he attempted to draw a charge and braced himself with his left hand • Played with his left wrist taped at Kentucky and responded with 11 points in 14 minutes on 3 of 4 shooting from three-point range • Scored eight first-half points against the Cats as UNC built a 43-38 lead at the break.

Three-pointer on the aircraft carrier gave Carolina a 17-point lead over Michigan State • Had a season-high three assists vs. Tennessee State • Scored a season-high 19 points and was 5 for 8 from three-point range against South Carolina • Tied for team scoring honors with 15 points in the loss to UNLV • Made 9 of 14 shots from the floor (8 of 13 from 3FG) in the two games in Las Vegas • Was Carolina's top defender against the Runnin' Rebels.

Junior, Forward, 6-10, 210, Tampa, Fla.



Carolina's all-time leader in blocked shots per game • Has blocked 252 shots in 97 games (2.6 per game) • Passed Sam Perkins for second place in UNC history against Georgia Tech • Second behind only Brendan Haywood (304) • Is 12th in ACC history in blocks per game and 13th in blocks (Duke's Shane Battier is 12th with 254) • Had a career-high nine blocks on the aircraft carrier against Michigan State, tying the second-most by a Tar Heel • Has blocked five or more shots 17 times and seven or more

five times • Leading active shot blocker and second-leading active rebounder in the ACC • Has double-doubles in 19 of his last 33 games and grabbed 10 or more rebounds in 28 of his last 39 contests • Has scored in double figures 54 times, grabbed 10 or more rebounds 39 times and posted 29 double-doubles • Has 119 more blocks than any other active ACC player.

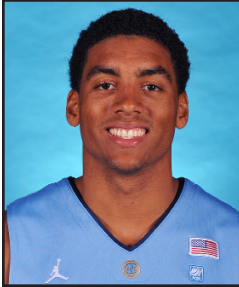

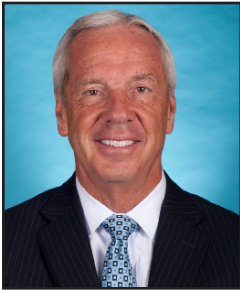
