HEAD COACH JOHN BUNTING

It's been a remarkable journey for John Bunting in the five years since his return to Chapel Hill as the Tar Heels' head football coach in December 2000.

He's known the highs. His first team rode a defense led by future NFL standouts Julius Peppers and David Thornton to the program's first-ever win over Florida State and domination of Auburn in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

He's known the lows. His second and third teams were beset by inexperience, injury, attrition and all manner of ill winds, winning only five games over two years.

And he's known the highs again. His fourth team notched electrifying home victories over league rivals Georgia Tech, NC State and Miami and closed the season with road wins at Wake Forest and Duke, securing the Tar Heels a bowl bid and a contract extension from UNC administrators.

Coupled with a 4-4 league mark in 2005, Carolina has posted a 9-7 mark in ACC action over the last two years, the fourth best league record in that time.

"We believe in this man, we believe in this program, it's headed in the right direction," Chancellor James Moeser said after the season finale. "This team represents Carolina at its best."

"We had to change the culture, and John's done that," Athletic Director Dick Baddour added. "We weren't tough enough, and we'd forgotten how to win."

The Tar Heels played outstanding football in 2004, finishing the season 3-1 and coming within three points of a potential ACC title. Had Carolina not lost 27-24 to Virginia Tech, the Tar Heels could have shared ACC title honors with the Hokies. That's impressive for a team picked by the media to finish 10th of 11 teams in the ACC.

Although the Tar Heels would fall just one win shy of qualifying for postseason play in 2005, the Tar Heels continued to improve throughout the season and celebrated several outstanding victories. Carolina notched wins over league rivals NC State, Virginia and Duke and earned a win over ACC newcomer Boston College in a rematch of the 2004 Continental Tire bowl. Carolina also exacted revenge on Utah and finished 5-6 overall, 4-4 in

league play. The win over NC State was especially gratifying for a team that began the year with two narrow losses and won in Raleigh for the fifth time in the last six years.

No one's working harder than Bunting, the 1972 Carolina graduate and All-ACC linebacker under Bill Dooley. Throughout his four-year tenure at Carolina, Bunting has remained passionate, consistent, tough and disciplined. He's demanded as much from his staff and team.

"Look at what's happened last couple of years ... building, building, building," Bunting says. "Now we've got the program going in the right direction. I said at the beginning of last season that toward the end, you'd be able to recognize that. It's a tribute to our kids and staff."

Bunting certainly knows how to win—from his playing days as a Tar Heel in the early 1970s and his pro career with the Philadelphia Eagles. He won as a coach at Division III Glassboro State and as an assistant with the Kansas Chiefs, St. Louis Rams and New Orleans Saints.

"I've been around enough great coaches and I've had enough success that I understand what this business is all about," Bunting says. "There are certain things I can control, there are certain things I cannot control. I can control how our team prepares each and every day. If we're having a bad practice, I'll let 'em know it and we'll start over. This team has learned how to practice."

Both the playing and coaching components of the puzzle acknowledge the value of the CEO's vision throughout a tumultuous two years and, at times, difficult 2004 and 2005 season.

"It's been remarkable how consistent Coach Bunting has been with us as coaches and players," says secondary coach and defensive coordinator Marvin Sanders. "He was no different with me after

we'd gotten blown out at Utah than he was two weeks later when we beat Miami. He believed all along in what we were doing. We just had to continue to work hard at it. When the players know the coaches believe in what we're doing, they respond better. We were consistent with the players come rain or shine."

More and more Bunting will apply his thumbprint to the Carolina program. Fans appreciate his openness, his honesty, his regular-guy persona. Players know that no one played the game any smarter or tougher than Bunting did during his run as a Tar Heel.

He's living a dream, coaching on the campus he loved so much as a young man three decades ago. One of his favorite touches is the Old Well Walk, where the team busses deliver the players and Bunting to the Old Well two hours before home games. From there they walk through a tunnel of cheering fans through Polk Place to Kenan Stadium. It's an emotional stroll each week for Bunting.

"I have to fight back the tears every time," Bunting says. "But that's the way I am. I love this place. I couldn't be happier being back here after all these years."

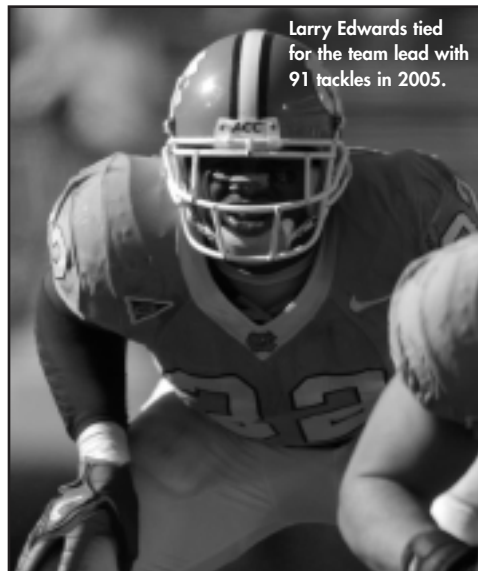

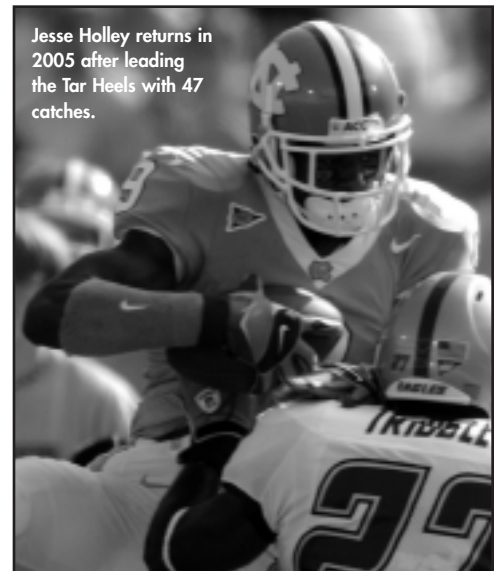
