UNLV CAREER

One of college basketball's most decorated freshmen, Anthony Bennett announced on April 1, 2013, that he intends to declare for the NBA Draft ... The big Canadian is the first player in UNLV history to come to the program out of high school and leave for the NBA after one season ... He also became the first UNLV player to be named Mountain West Freshman of the Year since Dalron Johnson in 2000 ... A member of the Sporting News 2012-13 All-Freshman Team along with Kansas' Ben McLemore, UCLA's Shabazz Muhammad, Kentucky's Nerlens Noel and Oklahoma State's Marcus Smart ... Also named to the USBWA Freshman All-America Team and honorable mention Associated Press All-America ... On March 9, Bennett was announced by the Los Angeles Athletic Club as one of 15 players appearing on the final ballot for the 2013 John R. Wooden Award, which is college basketball's most prestigious honor ... He was also included in the 12-player midseason watch lists for both the U.S. Basketball Writers Association's 2013 Oscar Robertson Trophy and the 2013 Integris Wayman Tisdale Award, which is given to the National Player and Freshman of the Year, respectively ... He was then named a finalist for both awards (14 for the Robertson Trophy and eight for the Tisdale Award) ... He was also named to the list of top 30 candidates for the Naismith Player of the Year Award ... One of the top recruits to ever sign with UNLV, he was the first McDonald's High School All-American to come to campus straight from high school since "Fearless" Freddie Banks in 1983 ... A product of Las Vegas' own Findlay College Prep, Bennett was ranked the No. 7 overall recruit in the nation by ESPN and Rivals and No. 8 by Scout ... Before he took his first shot as a collegian, he was selected No. 57 in CBSSports.com's preseason list of 100 basketball players in the country.

2012-13 SEASON

Named First Team All-Mountain West and the only UNLV player to earn a player of the week honor from the league this season (Dec. 10) ... Joined Anthony Marshall in being named to the 2012-13 USBWA's All-District VIII Team ... Was also selected to the NABC's All-District 17 First Team ... Joined teammate Katin Reinhardt in being voted to the 2013 MW Championships All-Tournament Team after making 22 of 34 shots as part of 57 total points in three games ... Made 10 of 14 attempts in the MW quarterfinal vs. Air Force to break the league's 13-year-old conference tournament record for single-game field-goal percentage by a freshman with .714 ... Scored 15 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the final vs. New Mexico and duplicated those numbers in the NCAA Tournament's second round vs. California in San Jose ... Overall, Bennett played in all of UNLV's 35 games and started 32 of them ... Led the squad and ranked seventh in the MW with a scoring average of 16.1 ppg ... Also paced the team and ranked fifth in the conference with 8.1 rebounds a game ... Was second on the team with 43 blocked shots ... His 1.23 blocks per game average was good for fourth in the league ... A sometimes stunning shooter for a big man, he led the team in 3-point shooting percentage at .375 ... Also a solid free-throw shooter, his .701 percentage stood fifth on the squad ... Ranked third in the MW with 12 double-doubles (third nationally among freshmen) and second in the conference in games scoring at least 20 points this season with 13 ... Scored in double digits in 28 of 35 games, including an eye-popping run of his first 17 games on the college level ... Made his much-anticipated UNLV debut on Nov. 12 and didn't disappoint, making 9 of 13 shots en route to 22 points and seven rebounds in a win over NAU ... Also had 22 points each vs. Oregon and then Iowa State to give him three 22-point outings in his first four games ... Twice made a season-high 10 field goals in a game: vs. La Verne on Dec. 13 and vs. Cal State Bakersfield on Jan. 5 when he finished with a career-high 28 points ... Made 9 of 17 shots en route to 25 points to go with 13 rebounds in UNLV's win at Cal on Dec. 9 ... Reached double digits in rebounding in 12 games, including a career-high 16 in a home win over Air Force on Jan. 12 ... Twice blocked four shots in a game (vs. Iowa State on Nov. 12 and vs. Boise State on March 5).
