SATURDAY'S GAME PREVIEW...

UNLV opens its 43rd year of football along with kicking off the **Bobby Hauck** era on Saturday by hosting 12th-ranked **Wisconsin** at 8 p.m. PT ... UNLV is looking to win five straight season-openers for only the second time in history (1973-77) ... The Rebels are 22-20 all-time in season lid-lifters, including 17-6 when opening at home ... Hauck, who was the winningest coach in Big Sky Conference history, looks to become the sixth head man in school history to win his opening game leading the Rebels ... This marks the sixth time that UNLV opens a season vs. a ranked opponent, including the No. 25 Badgers in 2002 ... UNLV is 2-8 all-time vs. the Big 10 Conference, having only played UW and Northwestern ... The Rebels are slated to face another team from the league when Minnesota comes to town in 2012 ... UW is 14-6-1 vs. MWC teams ... This marks the fourth appearance by UNLV on VERSUS and the first at home since the 2007 game vs. Wisconsin.

REBELS vs. BADGERS NOTES...

Wisconsin leads the all-time series 6-2 and the Badgers are 3-1 vs. UNLV at Sam Boyd ... One of those games was the "Blackout Bowl" of 2002, which made national news for the wrong reasons as power was knocked out at SBS and the game was ruled final at 27-7 UW with 7:41 still remaining in the fourth quarter ... Over the last 14 quarters of play, UW has scored only three offensive touchdowns against UNLV, dating back to the 2002 season (one in 2004 and a pair in 2007) ... UW receivers coach **DelVaughn Alexander** was a two-time member of the UNLV coaching staff (1998 under **Jeff Horton** and 2000-02 under **John Robinson**) ... The popular inter-regional series is set to continue with the Rebels heading to Madison to open the 2011 season on Sept. 3 ... UNLV has faced UW more times (eight) than any other team from a BCS auto-bid conference ... These two schools will also meet on the basketball court later this year with the Runnin' Rebels hosting the Badgers on Nov. 20.

Rebels Drop Heartbreaker To Badgers

LAS VEGAS – UNLV (1-1) nearly pulled off the greatest upset in program history but fell just short against No. 5 Wisconsin (2-0), 20-13, in front of a sellout crowd at Sam Boyd Stadium. The third-largest crowd in Rebel football history as well as a national television audience on VERSUS watched the two teams trade scores throughout the evening, with the final strike coming on a 29-yard TD naked bootleg by Badger quarterback **Tyler Donovan** late in the fourth quarter that gave Wisconsin the final seven-point advantage. UNLV, which led much of the night, got the ball back with 1:53 left on the game clock and, after getting one first down, saw its drive stall. A pair of sacks of UNLV quarterback **Travis Dixon** put the team in fourth-and-15, and **Rodelin Anthony** could not haul in a pass from Dixon that would have given UNLV a first down, turning the ball over to Wisconsin and essentially ending the game. UNLV struck first, getting a touchdown through the air in the first quarter when Dixon found **Casey Flair** from five yards out for a 7-0 Rebel lead. The scoring pass was the first of Dixon's career and it was one of many connections between the two as Dixon rang up 258 passing yards, with Flair setting career highs of 10 receptions for 126 yards. Wisconsin answered with a touchdown of its own just seconds into the second quarter, a three-yard scoring run by **Garrett Graham**, but the Badgers mishandled the snap on the PAT and UNLV still led 7-6. Neither team would do much offensively in the second frame until Wisconsin put together a 13-play drive that culminated with a 27-yard field goal by **Taylor Mehlhaff** as time ran out in the half, putting Badgers up 9-7. UNLV regained the lead on a 25-yarder by **Sergio Aguayo** in the third before the Badgers moved back in front on a 51-yard boot from Mehlhaff early in the fourth. Once again the lead changed hands, with Aguayo drilling another three-pointer, this time from 35 yards out, giving the Rebels a 13-12 lead with 7:43 left. Donovan responded, leading the Badgers on a 10-play drive that covered nearly six minutes and was capped on a boot-leg run by the QB on first down that went down the left sideline 29 yards for the score.



POLL POSITIONS

UNLV has played 31 teams ranked in at least one of the two major polls at the time of the game. The Rebels hold a 5-26 record against such competitors. Four of the Rebels' 2010 opponents (Wisconsin, Utah, West Virginia and TCU) were members of the preseason top 25, meaning UNLV could face at least four ranked teams, which is the school record, for the third consecutive season. Interestingly, four of UNLV's wins over ranked opponents have come on the road vs. teams in the top 15. UNLV, in fact, has lost 12 consecutive games at home vs. ranked teams. The only time UNLV downed a ranked opponent at home was on Nov. 10, 1984, when QB **Randall Cunningham** led the program to a 26-20 victory over No. 20 (UPI) Cal State Fullerton.

CLAUSEN GETS OPENING NIGHT NOD

Junior **Mike Clausen** did enough in preseason camp to be named the starting quarterback for this week's opener vs. Wisconsin. "We had an outstanding competition in camp and I feel like we have three quarterbacks who can help us win this year," said UNLV head coach Bobby Hauck. "I'm excited for Mike to get the starting spot for our opening game." It will mark the first time Clausen starts an opening game but the lefty from Riverside, CA, is no stranger to the lead role. He started the final three games of his rookie season after **Omar Clayton** suffered an injury and won his first start vs. New Mexico and then downed Wyoming the next week to become only the second Rebel rookie to win his first two starts (**Scott Sims** in 1987). Last fall, he came off the bench in Game Two vs. Oregon State and nearly directed his team to an upset of the 24th-ranked Beavers. Down 20-7 in the fourth quarter, Clausen led UNLV on a seven-play, 66-yard drive that culminated with a 13-yard scoring toss to **Rodelin Anthony**. After the Rebel defense held, Clausen went back to work, this time on a 6-play, 51-yard drive ending with him finding **Phillip Payne** in the back corner of the end zone for an eventual 21-20 lead. On the night,



Clausen completed 6-9 attempts for 58 yards and also rushed four times for 25 net yards. He also started at Nevada, Reno in 2010 and set multiple career highs by completing 26-50 attempts for 276 yards and one score. In his career, he has thrown for 1,230 yards, nine touchdowns and four interceptions. As a freshman, he broke the school record for most pass attempts without an interception to start a career at 119 -- just 19 attempts short of the NCAA FBS record set by current Oklahoma State head coach **Mike Gundy** in 1986.

HEAD COACH BOBBY HAUCK

Bobby Hauck, the winningest coach in Division I FCS, was hired as the 10th head coach in Rebel football history on Dec. 23, 2009.

Hauck (pronounced HOWK) spent the previous seven seasons as the record-setting head coach of the University of Montana where he compiled an overall record of 80-17, including leading the Grizzlies to three national championship games in the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision (formerly I-AA). The winningest coach in Big Sky Conference history, Hauck earned at least a share of the league's title all seven years at Montana en route to compiling a record of 47-6. The recent numbers are even more impressive as his records in the last four seasons are 51-6 overall and 31-1 in conference play.

Hauck, 45, was named Big Sky Coach of the Year in 2006, 2007 and 2009 and AFCA Regional FCS Coach of the Year in 2006 and 2009.

"It's my belief that Bobby Hauck is one of the great young coaches in America today," UNLV Athletics Director Jim Livengood said. "His ability to direct a program, his history of success in recruiting and his love for the game of football clearly project him as having an exciting future here at UNLV."

A veteran of eight bowl games, Hauck also brings tremendous experience from stints coaching in both the Pacific-10 and Big 12 conferences. "I'm excited to be here and believe UNLV is a tremendous opportunity for me and my family," Hauck said. "We're looking forward to building on the foundation put in place here by Mike Sanford and our first order of business is to get excitement building within our team and within the entire community."

Hauck was the youngest head coach in modern Montana history when he was named to the post in 2002, and record-setting success soon followed as he compiled four more conference championships than anyone in Grizzly history. His 2009 team finished 14-1 and reached the FCS Championship game for the second consecutive season.

Previous to taking over his alma mater, he spent four years at the University of Washington (1999-2002) where he coached defensive backs and special teams and was considered one of the top recruiters in college football. Before that he was at the University of Colorado for four seasons (1995-98) where he was the special teams and recruiting coordinator while also coaching the safeties.

Before joining the Buffaloes, Hauck coached the outside linebackers and handled recruiting duties for Northern Arizona University (1993-94). He served as a graduate assistant at UCLA in 1990-91 and in 1992 served as the Bruins' on-campus recruiting coordinator. Hauck began his collegiate coaching career as a volunteer assistant for Montana in 1988-89, working with the secondary and then the inside linebackers. A native of the Treasure State, Hauck was a three-sport star at Sweet Grass High School in Big Timber, Mont., and went on to twice letter in track and field at the University of Montana. His first coaching position was in 1987 as an assistant at his prep alma mater before joining the college ranks.

Hauck, born on June 14, 1964, earned his bachelor's degree from Montana in 1987 and master's from UCLA in 1991. He and his wife, Stacey, have four children: daughters Sydney, Alexandra and Elise and son Robby. His father, Robert Hauck Sr., coached high school football in the state of Montana for three decades and his brother, Tim Hauck, played 13 seasons as a defensive back in the NFL and is currently an assistant coach with the Tennessee Titans.

“TUI” TO WEAR WIESNER IN 2010



Before UNLV's season-opening game vs. No. 12 Wisconsin this Saturday, senior defensive tackle **Isaako Aaitui** (pronounced e-saw-AH-co ah-ah-2-e) will be recognized as this year's recipient of the **Tom Wiesner** (pronounced WEEZE-ner) Award and will have the honor of wearing the Wiesner Jersey, which is designated by special stitching on the back, throughout the 2010 season. The second Rebel defensive linemen to earn the award, Aaitui is the unquestioned

leader of this year's UNLV line and was a preseason Third Team All-MWC selection by Phil Steele's. The native of Pago Pago, American Samoa (Faga'itua High School) has been transformed since hitting campus in 2006 from a raw rugby player with only one year of organized football experience into the NFL prospect that he is today. The expected three-year starter has 73 total tackles, including 11.5 for loss, to his credit while wearing the Scarlet & Gray. The award, which debuted in 2002 and is voted on by the coaching staff and senior class, was created to honor one Rebel senior that best exemplifies the late Mr. Wiesner's courage, enthusiasm, dedication and toughness. A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia. He was inducted posthumously into the University of Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008. "The players did a great job in choosing Tui for the Wiesner Award," said UNLV head coach **Bobby Hauck**. "He has shown to be a tremendous team leader and fights hard every practice, whether he's hurting or not."

PAULO IS BATTLE BORN!

Head coach **Bobby Hauck** helped begin a new tradition at UNLV in 2010 with the introduction of the "Battle Born Jersey No. 36." In 1864, Nevada became the 36th state to enter the union, and the state's official slogan, which also appears on the state flag, is "Battle Born," reflecting the state's entry on the Union side during the American Civil War. Beginning this season, Rebel Football Jersey No. 36 -- complete with a patch on the back of the state flag, will be worn by a Nevadan who best exemplifies the Battle Born spirit of his state and the toughness and pride of Rebel Football. The inaugural recipient of the Battle Born Jersey No. 36 is starting senior linebacker **Ronnie Paulo**, who turned in his normal No. 56 just before the season. The 6-2, 235-pound MLB was born in Africa but grew up in the Silver State and graduated from Western High School in Las Vegas in 2006. Named preseason second team All-MWC by Phil Steele's, Paulo was also ranked the No. 52 ILB in the nation.

STATES-OF-THE PROGRAM ADDRESS

From Alaska to Florida, from Canada to American Samoa -- the 2010 Rebels come from hometowns spread across the continent. In fact, no less than 12 different states, two countries and one U.S. territory are represented on this year's roster. While a vast majority of Rebels naturally hail from California and Nevada, a state that continues to become even more fertile recruiting ground is Texas. Currently 13 UNLV players are products of the Lone Star State, including three tailbacks: **C.J. Cox** (Garland, TX/North Garland HS), **Imari Thompson** (DeSoto, TX/Cedar Hill HS) and freshman Tim Cornett (Galena park, TX/North Shore HS). Meanwhile, nearby Arizona is home to no less than eight current Rebels, including four that have started games: DB **Travis Dixon** (Chandler, AZ/Hamilton HS), RB **Channing Trotter** (Mesa, AZ/Red Mountain HS), OL **John Gianninoto** (Tucson, AZ/Catalina Foothills HS) and TE **Kyle Watkins** (Phoenix, AZ/Cactus Shadows HS/Scottsdale CC).

NEW FACES, OLD TERRITORY

While new head coach **Bobby Hauck** brought an entirely new staff to Las Vegas, one assistant has a brief history with the Rebels: offensive coordinator/QBs coach **Rob Phenicie** spent one year assisting **John Robinson's** first Rebel staff in 1999. In fact, four members of UNLV's all-new coaching staff do have roots in the Mountain West Conference. Phenicie was at Wyoming from 2000-02, passing defense coordinator/DBs coach **J.D. Williams**, who was the 16th overall pick in the 1994 NFL Draft out of Fresno State, spent last season coaching at Utah; OL coach **Chad Germer** worked on the Cowboys' staff from 2003-08; and TE coach **Brent Myers** was with the Utes in 2003. Also, the final addition to Hauck's staff, line-



backers coach/recruiting coordinator **Brent Guy**, served as head coach at Utah State from 2005-08 and faced UNLV three times while in Logan.

SALDI STAYS WITH REBELS

He may not be on the playing field right now but UNLV's **Bryce Saldi** is always on the minds of his Rebel teammates as the junior linebacker continues to improve from a serious brain injury suffered during a skateboarding accident on July 3, 2009. Saldi, a graduate of Texas prep powerhouse Southlake Carroll High School, earned his first UNLV letter as a freshman in 2008 by playing in all 12 games, primarily on special teams. The son of former Dallas Cowboys tight end **Jay Saldi** was on vacation in Southern California at the time of the accident and was at Loma Linda University Medical Center for nearly two months. While he was transported back to the Dallas area just before UNLV's 2009 season opener, Saldi's Rebel locker was still active, as No. 54's playing gear was put out before every practice and game last fall, even while the team dressed in an armory at its off-campus training site. When UNLV traveled to play at nearby TCU last October, representatives from the school were able to attend a tailgate fundraiser at his high school alma mater while a small group of his friends stopped by Saldi's rehabilitation center for a visit. In 2010, Saldi's locker in the Lied Athletic Complex remains his and you can still find his No. 54 on all active UNLV football rosters until after what would have been his senior season with the program in 2011. O.T. SO NICE, THEY DID IT TWICE!

UNLV went into the 2008 season with one of college football's worst records in overtime (only SMU had more losses with a 1-8 mark) but the Rebels suddenly won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State. The Rebels became only the sixth team to ever win in overtime in consecutive games: Northwestern did it in both 2004 and '07, Boston College (2006), TCU (2005), USF (2003) and San Diego State (1998).

PHILLIP'S HOUSE OF PAYNE: OPPONENT END ZONES

After just two seasons, UNLV junior WR Phillip Payne has compiled 14 receiving touchdowns. The Las Vegas native needs just three more to move into the top five at the school and just 10 more over his Rebel career would tie him with all-time record-holder Henry Bailey (24 from 1991-94).

In July, Payne was one of two wide receivers voted by the media to the official 2010 Preseason All-Mountain West Conference Team. The Western High School product heads into his third season with the Rebels with 87 receptions for 1,097 yards. His freshman mark of seven touchdowns was just one shy of the school's rookie record and also the

MWC mark of eight by BYU's Austin Collie in 2004. Payne had at least one score in his first five career games, which tied the school record for most consecutive games with a TD catch (Sam "Disco Kid" Greene 1980). With the departure of UNLV's all-time leading receiver Ryan Wolfe, Payne, who had 29 grabs as a freshman and 58 as a sophomore, will be looked upon to step into an even bigger role in 2010.

OH, CAPTAINS, MY CAPTAINS

After years of game-only captains at UNLV, new head coach Bobby Hauck installed the more-traditional permanent captain system for this season. After a vote by players, four seniors were selected to lead the Rebels in 2010. On defense it was safety Alex De Giacomo (Westminster, CA/EI Camino College) and linebacker Ronnie Paulo (Las Vegas/Western HS). On offense it was a pair of linemen, guard/center John Gianninoto (Tucson, AZ/Catalina Foothills HS) and tackle Matt Murphy (Lake Forest, CA/EI Toro HS).

SILVER STATE SIGNINGS=RECRUITING GOLD?

While Bobby Hauck's first recruiting class at UNLV included student-athletes whose hometowns were spread among five states and two countries, a school-record eight signees from the Las Vegas area highlighted February's haul for the new head coach. The impressive total of locals shattered the UNLV record of five, which was set four times, including 2009. "There's good football in the state of Nevada, and especially Las Vegas," Hauck said. "One of the things I said we were going to do when I took this job was try to recruit every Nevada kid that could help us win a Mountain West championship."

Beau then played for Mike Sanford his final three seasons, including a Mountain West Conference Defensive MVP campaign in 2007 before becoming a fourth-round NFL Draft pick by the Cleveland Browns. REBELATIONS...

UNLV's quarterback the last time the Rebels hooked up with Wisconsin in 2007 is still on the team but now is a veteran on defense. Senior DB **Travis Dixon** came to town as a quarterback out of Chandler, AZ, and won the starting job here as a rookie. After becoming the first freshman QB in history to lead UNLV to a season-opening victory at Utah State, Dixon nearly helped UNLV knock off the fifth-ranked Badgers in Week Two, finishing with 258 yards and a score on 23-36 passing in the 20-13 final. When **Omar Clayton** took over the job full-time before the 2008 season, Dixon moved sides of the ball and has started seven games at safety, totalling 41 tackles ... For the first time in school history the UNLV football team will play 13 regular-season games in 2010. The expanded schedule is allowed per NCAA rules whenever schools play at Hawaii. The Rebels have played 13 games just three times before but all of those campaigns included either a postseason NCAA playoff game (1974) or bowl appearance (1984 and 2000) ... No less than nine of UNLV's 13 opponents in 2010 played in a bowl game last season, which is a school record ... UNLV will make a rare cross-country trip for a first-ever meeting with traditional power West Virginia on Oct. 9. The game will also mark the first time the Rebels will play a team from the Big East Conference. UNLV last played in the Eastern Time Zone on Sept. 5, 2004, at Tennessee, and has not traveled so far east since playing at Miami in 1972 ... Junior quarterback **Mike Clausen** was second on the team with seven rushing touchdowns last fall and he now stands fifth in UNLV history for TD rushes by a QB with nine. Just two more would put him third behind **Jason Thomas'** 24 and **Glenn Carano's** 20 ... The Rebels return their top four rushers from the 2009 season: RB **Channing Trotter** (541 yards), QB Clausen (288), QB **Omar Clayton** (238) and RB C.J. Cox (173) ... Returning quarterbacks Clayton and Clausen helped UNLV compile a 59.5 passing completion percentage in 2009, which ranked second in school history for a single season behind only the 62.0 mark posted in 1984 ... UNLV's fastest player, CB **Deante' Purvis**, returned kickoffs at a record pace last fall. His 50 returns were the most in the nation last year and the most ever in a season at UNLV and in the Mountain West Conference. In fact, the total was just five

short of the NCAA FBS record of 55 set by **William White** of Army in 2002. Against BYU last October, Purvis broke UNLV's 118-game streak of not having a kickoff return for a touchdown when he took one back 94 yards and found the end zone to mark his program's first such play since **Lenny Ware** did it at home vs. Utah way back in 1999 ... The Rebels are still looking for their first punt return for a TD since 2001, however, as the program's 99-game drought currently ranks fifth in the nation ... Legendary figure **John Robinson** became the first UNLV player or head coach enshrined into the College Football Hall of Fame during ceremonies culminating July 17 in South Bend, Ind. The former USC and L.A. Rams coach was at UNLV from 1999-2004 when he brought the Rebels their most recent bowl-game appearance.

PRO-REBEL FORCES

With NFL rosters still being whittled down, there are seven former Rebels currently fighting for spots across the league. In addition, former Cleveland Browns LB **Beau Bell (2004-07)** has been signed by the Omaha Nighthawks of the United Football League. Also, 2008 CFL Special Teams Player of the Year **Dominique Dorsey (2001-04)** is a kickoff return specialist north of the border for the Saskatchewan Roughriders. When OL **Joe Hawley** was selected in the fourth round by the Atlanta Falcons on April 24, it marked the fourth consecutive year that at least one UNLV player was taken in the NFL Draft, which is the longest streak for the program since an eight-year string in 1975-82 when the draft had significantly more rounds.

PRACTICE PALACE

One of college football's largest and most impressive areas of its kind, Bill "Wildcat Morris" Rebel Park has been transformed into an athletics showcase over the past decade. In 2010, a state-of-the-art UBU synthetic surface was installed at a cost of \$700,000, replacing an artificial surface originally installed in 2002 thanks to a \$1 million gift from the family of Ernie Becker Sr. The new surface and lighting system followed other donations secured since 1999, such as dozens of palm trees to line the fields and a desert garden built behind a Rebel Red archway welcoming fans, all of which have turned the park into one of the most aesthetically pleasing sports training facilities in the nation.



ON THE RADIO

UNLV football's radio broadcasts, including the coach's show, in 2010 offer a new way for fans to listen along with a new but familiar voice behind the microphone. All 13 UNLV football games will be heard again in Southern Nevada this fall on ESPN 1100 AM but also for the first time on 98.9 FM.
