UNLV SET FOR SECOND TRIP TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

UNLV HEADS TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS AT OHIO STATE

UNLV opens play on May 23 at the NCAA Women's Golf Championships, being played at the Scarlet Course in Columbus, Ohio. The 14th ranked Rebels will be playing in their second NCAA Championship tournament in the five year history of the program. UNLV advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time in 2004 and both appearances have been under head coach **Missy Ringler**.

THE 2004 NCAA TOURNAMENT

The No. 14 UNLV women's golf team shot its best round in the final round, carding a team 295 to finish 21st at the NCAA Championships, the squad's first trip to the national tournament. The 295 represented the best round of the four for the Rebels, who qualified for the tournament in only the program's third year of existence. Sophomore sensation **Sunny Oh** led the Rebels, finishing 28th overall at six-over par 294. Oh, the MWC player of the Year, went on to be earn second-team All-America honors from the NGCA, a year after earning honorable mention honors.

2005-06 Season Notebook

FOURTH STRAIGHT REGIONAL

Playing in their fourth consecutive regional, UNLV finished sixth at the 2006 West Regional to advance to the NCAA Championships. The Rebels shot a three-round total of 904 (304-301-299, +40) and were led by **Da Sol Chung**, who finished fourth. **Elena Kurokawa** (T15th), **Seema Sadekar** (T32nd), **Grace Woo** (T66th) and **Young Pak** (T72nd) rounded out the scores for UNLV.

REBELS MAKE IT THREE IN A ROW

Da Sol Chung won medalist honors in a one-hole playoff and UNLV women's golf grabbed the first-round lead and never relinquished it in winning its third-straight Mountain West Conference Tournament Championship on April 22 at the Entrada at Snow Canyon course. The then-No. 12 ranked Rebels shot a total of 895 (291-303-301, +31) on the Entrada at Snow Canyon Course and won by five strokes over New Mexico (303-295-302--900, +36) as UNLV was led by Chung. UNLV senior **Elena Kurokawa**, last year's conference player of the year, finished tied for fifth, carding a three-round total of 225 (75-74-76, +9). She was followed by teammates **Seema Sadekar** and **Grace Woo**, who both finished tied for seventh, as they both shot rounds of 72-78-76--226 (+10). **Young Pak** finished 23rd with a three-round score of 72-81-83--236 (+20). It didn't take long for Chung to break the tie, as she birdied the first playoff hole to win the individual title.

EVERYBODY HAIL CHUNG!

UNLV freshman golfer **Da Sol Chung** has made quite the impact in her first season, winning medalist honors at the MWC Championships, as well as Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year honors. Chung became the third consecutive Rebel to earn the league POY, as she led the conference in stroke average for the year. She also shared the freshman of the year award with Mikaela Backstedt of New Mexico. Chung was joined on the All-MWC Team by teammates **Elena Kurokawa** (the 2005 MWC Player of the Year), **Seema Sadekar** and **Grace Woo**.

MISSY MARVELOUS ONCE AGAIN

UNLV head coach **Missy Ringler** was named the Mountain West Conference's Coach of the Year after she guided the Rebels to their third-straight league title. The honor marks the second time in three

years that Ringler has won the award, as she won it for the first time in 2004, her second year at the helm.

CHUNG BREAKS UNLV RECORD

Rebel freshman Da Sol Chung broke the UNLV record for low score in a 54-hole tournament, carding a 209 (-4) at the Wildcat Invitational in Tucson, Ariz., back on Feb. 20-21. Chung opened the tournament with an even-par 71, but fired back-to-back rounds of two-under 69 to help UNLV finish sixth in a field that included 11 of the top 15 teams in the country. On the year Chung has finished in the top 10 in eight of the 10 tournaments she has played in. Her 72.7 stroke average is tops in the MWC.

DUO HONORED BY GOLF WEEK

Elena Kurokawa was named to the publication's preseason third team and **Da Sol Chung** was named as one of eight freshmen in the country to watch. Kurokawa had a strong junior year last season as she was named the 2004-05 Mountain West Conference Player of the Year after earning medalist honors at the Mountain West Conference Championship. She fired a career low 67 (-4) at the Spartan Invitational, which was tied for the second-lowest round by score and par in Rebel history and she finished her year with a 74.56 scoring average, the second-lowest single-season average on record. Chung, from Seoul, Korea, enters her freshman year at UNLV as one of the top prospects in the country. A 2005 graduate of Dae Won Fil High School in Seoul, Chung was a member of the Korean National Team. She competed at the 2004 Nevada Women's Open, finishing in a tie for fifth. Her three-round score of 215 (-1) was the lowest amateur score in the event.

she served as captain and earned team MVP honors. After her collegiate career, Ringler spent a year on the Futures Tour and attended the LPGA qualifying school before shifting her focus to the coaching arena. However, her accolades as a golfer to go along with eight varsity letters while competing in five different sports during her high school career helped earn her kudos as Monroe County's (Ind.) Athlete of the Century, chosen by the readers of the Bloomington Herald-Times. At one time she held the record at Edgewood High School for the 800, 1,600 and 3,200-meter run as well as the school's cross country record. Playing the point-guard position she led her team to the Sweet 16 of the 1990 Indiana High School Basketball Tournament. Ringler was also inducted into the Bloomington Golf Hall of Fame in 1997 after winning four consecutive city championships from 1991-94.

She secured her first coaching job in 1997, overseeing the varsity boys team at Edgewood High School in Ellettsville, Ind., to a 38-20 record. Ringler departed the following season, accepting her first collegiate coaching position at Washington State. She spent two years as both an assistant and interim head coach for both the Cougars' men's and women's programs.

Ringler regained her amateur status in 2000 and has found her way back to competitive golf. She competed in the 2002 Women's Trans National in Lincoln, Neb., and advanced to the championship flight before losing in the first round. As an amateur she has competed in the U.S. Women's Amateur and U.S. Women's Public Links, where she lost in the semi-finals of the 1993 championship. She finished third in the 1994 Indiana Women's State Amateur and sixth in 1992 and 1993.

She added the Nevada State Amateur Champion to her resume in 2003, capturing the crown in her first year living in the Silver State.

The former Melissa Arthur, Ringler and her husband, Lance, became proud parents on Jan. 11, 2003, with the birth of their son, Landon. The family lives in Henderson with their niece, Shea (13), and their playful dog, Gus.

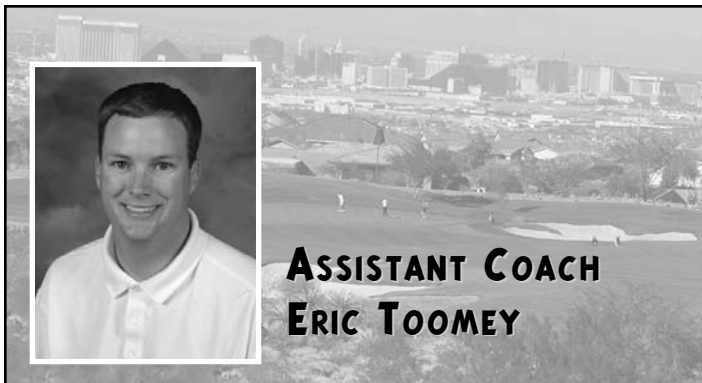
It has taken no time for UNLV head coach **Missy Ringler** to establish a tradition of excellence in women's golf as she wraps up her fourth season as head coach of a program that is finishing just its fifth year of competition.

Ringler's Rebels have won the last three Mountain West Conference Championships, made four consecutive NCAA Regional appearances and earned NCAA Tournament bids in 2004 and again in 2006. It is Ringler, the MWC Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2006, who has quickly turned the still infant program into one of the best in the Mountain West Conference and to the cusp of joining nation's elite college programs.

"A program that is less than five years old and making its first team appearance at the NCAA Championships in 2004 can only be attributed to the hard work of Missy Ringler and her players," said UNLV associate athletic director Lisa Kelleher. "Missy is a tireless recruiter, technically sound in her coaching and puts her student-athlete's needs on the course and in the classroom first on her priority list."

A veteran in women's golf with more than 15 years experience as a coach and a player, Ringler was announced as UNLV's second coach on June 24, 2002. She came to Las Vegas from the University of Minnesota, where she spent three seasons as the Golden Gophers' head coach. Under her tutelage, the Gophers managed a fourth-place Big Ten Conference finish and a NCAA regional appearance in 2001 and produced at least one team and individual victory in each of her three seasons.

A highly decorated player, the native of Bloomington, Ind., was a two-time All-Big Eight golfer at Iowa State. She led the Cyclones to their first-ever league title in 1993 and was the first player in school history to play in every tournament of her career. In her senior year,

Washington State. The Snohomish, Wash., native, transferred from Nevada, Reno to Washington State and earned three letters in golf for the Cougars and served as the team captain before earning his bachelor's degree in humanities in 2000.

Toomey landed his first coaching position as the men's and women's assistant at Iowa State and spent two seasons in Ames before heading to Tucson, where he worked as an assistant golf professional at El Conquistador Country Club. He left Tucson to join the Rebels, where he is involved in all of the day-to-day activities of the program.

"Eric is a great addition to our program," Ringler said. "He understands the way I operate and I have full trust in his abilities to coach these players. The quality of our practices and preparation has improved greatly due to his knowledge and interaction with the team."

Toomey married the former Erin Naeve on July 17, 2004. Erin works in leisure sales for the Harrah's Corporation.

Eric Toomey enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Rebel program after serving as an assistant at Iowa State. Toomey, 29, played for Missy Ringler while she was a coach at
