UNLV SET FOR FIFTH-STRAIGHT REGIONAL APPEARANCE

REBELS RETURN TO REGIONAL PLAY

UNLV will be playing in its fifth-straight NCAA Regional Tournament when the Rebels open up play in the West Region on Thursday. The 54-hole tournament will be played at Entrada at Snow Canyon in St. George, Utah. The West Regional is one of three regional tournaments held to determine the NCAA Championship field. A total of 324 participants have been selected for the regional competition. Of these players, 126 will advance to the championship finals held May 22-25 at the LPGA Legends Course in Dayton Beach, Florida. At the West Regional, 21 teams and three individual qualifiers will be competing for the top eight team spots and two individual spots.

REBELS AT 2006 NCAA WEST REGIONAL

The No. 15 ranked UNLV women's finished sixth at the NCAA West Regional behind the strong play of **Da Sol Chung** and the Rebels advanced to the NCAA Championships for the second time in school history. UNLV shot a three-round total of 904 (304-301-299, +40) at the Washington National Golf Course in Auburn, Wash., as the Rebels were playing in their fourth-straight regional in the program's short five-year history. Leading the way was Chung, who finished fourth overall with a three-day score of 218 (+2). The sixth-place finish for the Rebels was the highest placing for UNLV at a regional since the squad took second at the East Regional back in 2004, the first time that

the Rebels advanced to the NCAA Championships. The top eight teams and the top three individuals on non-qualifying teams from the three regionals (West, Central and East) advance to the NCAA Championships, played at the Scarlet Course at Ohio State on May 23-26. Purdue won the team title with a three-round score of 881 (+17), finishing six strokes ahead of UCLA (887, +23) while Washington (888, +24) was third in the field of 21 teams. Paige MacKenzie of Washington took home medalist honors, leading from start to finish on her way to a total of eight-under 208. She won by eight strokes over Rachel Newren of BYU, who finished the tournament at even-par 216. Chung climbed the leader board each day and on Saturday played her best round, rolling in a one-under par 71 to give her the highest individual placing for the Rebels since Sonny Oh won the West Regional as a freshman in 2003. Chung, the reigning Mountain West Conference player of the year, rolled in three birdies in her final round. **Elena Kurokawa** also cracked the top 20 for the Rebels, finishing tied for 15th with a three-round total of 224 (77-72-75, +8) as she played in her fourth regional. **Seema Sadekar** (74-79-75--228, +12) tied for 32nd, **Grace Woo** (81-7679--236, +20) tied for 66th and **Young Pak** (80-79-78--237, +21) tied for 72nd to round out the UNLV scorecard.

UNLV'S LAST TOURNAMENT

UNLV freshman **Natasha Krishna** finished tied for fourth at the 2007 Mountain West Conference Championships on April 21, but it was not enough for the Rebels to win a fourth-consecutive league crown. The

Rebels had their string of three-straight titles snapped, as they finished fourth overall as a team with a three-round total of 948 (317-320-311, +96) on the Entrada at Snow Canyon Course. TCU won the team title with a final score of 903 (+51), rallying to beat BYU (904, +52) by a stroke after the Cougars entered the third round with a six stroke lead. The victory by the Horned Frogs marks the first time that either UNLV or New Mexico had not won the team title. Jodi Ewart of New Mexico won medalist honors with a three-round total of 220 (77-71-72, +7), beating Valentine Derrey of TCU by one stroke as she carded a total of 221 (76-72-73, +8). Rachel Newren of BYU came in third and then Krishna was part of a group of four individuals who tied for fourth. Krishna shot a final-round 76 (+5) to wrap up her first MWC Tournament with a 54-hole score of 226 (+13) on the par-71, 6,130-yard course. Krishna was also named to the MWC All-Conference team, the only Rebels on the squad. **Seema Sadekar**, the squad's only senior in a lineup that included two freshmen and two sophomores, tied for 13th in her final MWC Tournament with a final score of 223 (76-77-80, +20). Rebel freshman **Melissa Mabanta** finished 26th in her first league tournament with a total of 242 (80-83-79, +29), sophomore **Nicole McGirr** came in 30th with a 247 (84-87-76, +34) and **Kasi Lee** finished 34th with a 260 (86-90-84, +47).

March 8. Although this is Bush's first collegiate coaching position, the Las Vegas native and PGA Professional brings a wealth of experience, both on and off the course, to UNLV. She will hit the ground running, as the Rebels host their annual UNLV Spring Invite, beginning March 12 at Boulder Creek Golf Club. "I am extremely happy for this opportunity," Bush said. "I'm looking forward to working with Missy and the team and having a great spring season." Bush has been a PGA member since 2001 and from 2005 until joining the Rebel program she was the Las Vegas Chapter PGA Coordinator. In 2006 Bush was named the Las Vegas PGA Professional of the Year. "Amy will be a great asset to our program. Her experiences working within the PGA section has given her great contacts. She will bring so much to our team," Ringler said. "I am very happy she has decided to join our golf family." Bush graduated from New Mexico State in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in business administration with a specialization in professional golf management, and that program is sanctioned by the PGA. Bush is married to Matt Weigel.

SADEKAR SOARING UP RECORD BOOK

Seema Sadekar is approaching the UNLV record for rounds played in a career, as the senior has now played in 128 total rounds. Sadekar is three rounds away from the record, which is held by **Elena Kurokawa** (2002-06), who played a total of 131 in her Rebel career. Sadekar will tie the mark at this week's West Regional.

A THANKFUL DAY INDEED

UNLV freshman **Natasha Krishna** made the Rebels' first tournament in Hawaii a memorable one for her, as she won medalist honors on Thanksgiving Day at the Aloha Purdue Collegiate Invitational. Krishna shot a final-round 69 (-1) on the par-70 Kiahuna Golf Course and carded an overall total of 212 (+2). It was the first medalist honors for Krishna, a native of Auckland, New Zealand, who was playing in just the fifth collegiate tournament of her career. The win marked the ninth time that a Rebel golfer has won medalist honors in the school's five-plus years of golf.

DOUBLE HONORS FOR KRISHNA

Following her win at the Aloha Purdue Collegiate Invitational, Rebel freshman Natasha Krishna earned two awards. She was named Golfweek's Player of the week on Nov. 17, 2006 and then she also earned Mountain West Conference Golfer of the Month accolades as well for the month of November.

COACH OF THE YEAR**

After her collegiate career, Ringler spent a year on the Futures Tour and attended the LPGA qualifying school before shifting her focus to the coaching arena. However, her accolades as a golfer to go along with eight varsity letters while competing in five different sports during her high school career helped earn her kudos as Monroe County's (Ind.) Athlete of the Century, chosen by the readers of the Bloomington Herald-Times. At one time she held the record at Edgewood High School for the 800, 1,600 and 3,200-meter run as well as the school's cross country record. Playing the point-guard position, she led her team to the Sweet 16 of the 1990 Indiana High School Basketball Tournament. Ringler was also inducted into the Bloomington Golf Hall of Fame in 1997 after winning four consecutive city championships from 1991-94.

She secured her first coaching job in 1997, overseeing the varsity boys' team at Edgewood High School in Ellettsville, Ind., to a 38-20 record. Ringler departed the following season, accepting her first collegiate coaching position at Washington State. She spent two years as both an assistant and interim head coach for both the Cougars' men's and women's programs.

Ringler regained her amateur status in 2000 and has found her way back to competitive golf. She competed in the 2002 Women's Trans National in Lincoln, Neb., and advanced to the championship flight before losing in the first round. As an amateur she has competed in the U.S. Women's Amateur and U.S. Women's Public Links, where she lost in the semi-finals of the 1993 championship. She finished third in the 1994 Indiana Women's State Amateur and sixth in 1992 and 1993.

She added the Nevada State Amateur Champion to her resume in 2003, capturing the crown in her first year living in the Silver State.

The former Melissa Arthur, Ringler and her husband, Lance, became proud parents on Jan. 11, 2003, with the birth of their son, Landon. The family lives in Henderson with their niece, Shea (14), and their dog, Gus.



It has taken little time for UNLV head coach Missy Ringler to establish a tradition of excellence in women's golf as she is in her fifth season as head coach of a program that is in just its sixth year of competition.

Ringler's Rebels won three consecutive Mountain West Conference Championships from 2004-06, have now made five-consecutive NCAA Regional appearances and advanced to the NCAA Championship in 2004 and again in 2006. It is Ringler, the MWC Coach of the Year in 2004 and 2006, who has quickly turned the still young program into one of the best in the Mountain West Conference and brought it to the cusp of joining the nation's elite.

"A program that is entering its sixth year and has made appearances at the NCAA Championships in 2004 and 2006 can only be attributed to the hard work of Missy Ringler and her players," said UNLV associate athletic director Lisa Kelleher. "Missy is a tireless recruiter, technically sound in her coaching and puts her student-athletes' needs on the course and in the classroom first on her priority list."

Ringler's teams have won a total of 10 tournaments in her four seasons and three Rebels - Sunny Oh (2003-04), Elena Kurokawa (2004-05) and Da Sol Chung (2005-06) - have earned MWC Player of the Year honors. Oh was a two-time All-American and Chung was named a first team All-American in her freshman season. Oh and Chung were also both named UNLV Sportswoman of the Year.

The UNLV program is one of the only programs - men or women - in the country to host two tournaments in a season. The Las Vegas Collegiate Showdown, which is supported by the Las Vegas Founders, has been held in each of the past four seasons at Anthem Country Club and has become one of the nation's premier events, attracting many of college golf's best teams. The UNLV Spring Invitational has been held the past two seasons.

A veteran in college women's golf with more than 15 years experience as a coach and a player, Ringler was announced as UNLV's second coach on June 24, 2002. She came to Las Vegas from the University of Minnesota, where she spent three seasons as the Golden Gophers' head coach. Under her tutelage, the Gophers managed a fourth-place Big Ten Conference finish and a NCAA regional appearance in 2001 and produced at least one team and individual victory in each of her three seasons.

A highly decorated player, the native of Bloomington, Ind., was a two-time All-Big Eight golfer at Iowa State. She helped led the Cyclones to their first-ever league title in 1993 and was the first player in school history to play in every tournament of her career. In her senior year, she served as captain and earned team MVP honors.
