REBELS RETURN HOME FOR FINAL WEEKEND OF NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

After two straight weekends on the road, UNLV softball returns home for the final weekend of non-conference play, hosting the Rebel Classic, March 8-11. Eller Media Stadium will play host to 12 games between Thursday night and Sunday, with the Rebels set to take on DePaul, top-ranked and undefeated Washington, New Mexico State and Portland State twice from Friday to Sunday. The tournament opens Thursday night with a game between New Mexico State and DePaul at 6 p.m.

Last weekend UNLV went 3-2 at Grand Canyon's Lopes Up Classic, with wins over Princeton, Valparaiso and Grand Canyon and losses to South Dakota and Valparaiso in a second matchup. Now at 14-6 on the season, the Rebels are off to their best start through the first 20 games since the 1996 squad started 15-5. It also marks just the seventh time since the first year of the program in 1985 that UNLV has started at 14-6 or better.

Senior right-hander Janine Petmecky continued her stellar final campaign in Phoenix, picking up all three wins on the weekend. In her two starts she gave up just two runs on six hits while striking out 20 in two complete game performances. Against Valparaiso Saturday, Petmecky struck out a career-high 12 a week after setting a then career high of 10 in a 3-0 win over Yale in Houston. She has struck at seven or more batters in each of her last four starts and leads the Mountain West with a 1.21 ERA.

It was another team effort at the plate as 11 different Rebels recorded hits, with nine getting as least three or more. The effort was led by sophomore Justine Federe, who went 7-for-17 (.412) with three doubles, two runs scored and seven RBI. The second baseman is hitting .500 (9-for-18) with runners in scoring position, while her 19 RBI leads the team and ranks tied for third in the Mountain West this season.

The Rebel defense continues to be a strong component of the hot start for UNLV as they have committed just 10 errors through 20 games and their .983 fielding percentage leads the Mountain West and ranks eighth in the country.

UNLV's first game of the weekend is set for Friday, March 9 at 3:45 p.m. against DePaul, followed immediately by a game between the Rebels and the undefeated Huskies of the University of Washington at 6 p.m.

The Rebel Classic marks the final tournament of the non-conference slate, with UNLV beginning conference play on the road at New Mexico, March 16-18.

RANKING THE REBELS

• **Mountain West:** Overall UNLV sits top the MW in ERA (2.60) and fielding percentage (.983), while ranking sixth with a .283 batting average. The Rebels are second with 151 hits and are fifth with 80 runs scored.

Rebel pitchers are second in the conference in innings pitched at 140.0 and strikeouts (104) and are fourth in opposing batting average (.256). Individually, Justine Federe's 13 runs scored are tied for fifth, while her 19 RBI are tied for third. In the circle, Janine Petmecky's 1.21 ERA is first, her .195 opposing batting average is fourth and her 58 strikeouts are second.

• **NCAA:** UNLV is eighth in the country in fielding percentage (.983)

QUICK HITTERS

• UNLV's 14-6 record is the program's best since the 1996 squad went 15-5 through the first 20 games. It also marks just the seventh time since the program's first season in 1985 that the Rebels have started 14-6 or better.

• Most recently, the Rebels went 3-2 at GCU's Lopes Up Classic in Phoenix, suffering their first loss on a Friday and first loss on a Sunday during the 2018 season.

• UNLV has only committed 10 errors in 20 games this season, has 11 games without an error and has just one game where they have committed more than one.

• If the Rebels can score first and/or gain the lead by the fourth inning, there is a good chance they will win the game. They have yet to lose when they score first and are 11-1 when they are leading after four innings.

• Rebels have only lost once when they've out-hit their opponent at 9-1, but are 4-5 when out-hit by their opponents.

• UNLV is hitting .309 with runners in scoring position, while its opponents are hitting just .238 in those situations.

• Sophomore Justine Federe was huge at the plate in Phoenix, hitting .412 with seven hits, three doubles, two runs scored and seven RBI. She leads the team with 19 RBI this season and is hitting .500 (9-for-18) with runners in scoring position. Federe is currently hitting .317 with six doubles, a team-best 13 runs scored and five multi-RBI games.

• Senior Janine Petmecky picked up all three of UNLV's wins in Phoenix to bring her record to 8-1 on the season. In the three wins, including two complete games, she pitched 15.2 innings, allowed three earned runs and struck out 20, including a career-high 12 against Valparaiso Sunday.

• The Rebels already have two come-from-behind extra-inning walk-off wins this season (6-5 over Buffalo in the eighth inning on Feb. 16 and a 3-2 walk-off win over North Dakota State on Friday, Feb. 9) and added a third comeback win in Houston with a 6-5 win over UTSA thanks to a three-run top of the seventh

• UNLV has four shutouts on the season, with Petmecky responsible for three of them

- Junior Miranda Bueno entered the tournament in Houston leading the Rebels with a .441 batting average and 15 hits and was tied for first in runs scored (9) and doubles (3). She also had a 10-game hitting streak. Unfortunately, Bueno suffered a facial injury in the weekend opener and will be out indefinitely
- Senior catcher Brooke Stover has been strong offensively in 2018, hitting .308 with three doubles and nine RBI and has the second-most multi-RBI games this year
- The Rebel pitching staff has a combined 2.60 ERA, which leads the Mountain West. Petmecky leads the way with a 1.21 ERA (first in the MW), an 8-1 record and 58 strikeouts (second in the MW). The senior has given up just seven earned runs in 52.0 innings pitched

SCOUTING DEPAUL

- DePaul enters the tournament with a 14-5 record, most recently going this past weekend at the I-75 Challenge in Atlanta, Ga.
- The Blue Demons have four players hitting above .300, led by Morgan Greenwood. The junior has 19 hits, three runs scored, eight doubles and a team-best 14 RBI
- DePaul's pitching staff has been stout in 2018 with a combined 1.58 ERA. Missy Zoch and Pat Moore have combined by 13 wins, 113.3 innings pitched, 29 hits allowed and 129 strikeouts, while currently sporting a 1.37 and a 1.47 ERA, respectively
- The Blue Demons are coached by Eugene Lenti, who is in his 36th year as head coach and has almost 1,300 career wins at DePaul

SCOUTING #1/1 WASHINGTON

- The Huskies are going to be a tough test for every team at the Rebel Classic as they enter the weekend as the top-ranked team in the country.
- At 23-0, Washington is off to its best start in program history and have run-ruled its opponents 13 times this season, including the first eight out of the gate
- The Huskies have an impressive nine players hitting over .300, seven hitting at .350 or better and four hitting at .400 or better. Senior Kirstyn Thomas leads the way at a whopping .493 with 35 hits, 33 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, 10 home runs and 29 RBI. It is no surprise UW is ranked third in the nation in runs scored and has scored 10 or more runs in a game seven times
- UW doesn't just do it at the plate as their pitching staff has been stingy with a 0.90 ERA. Their two main starters - Gabbie Plain and Taran Alvelo - currently sit at a 0.55 and 0.65 ERA, respectively, with Alvelo already collecting 104 strikeouts on the season
- At the helm of the Huskies is longtime head coach Heather Tarr, who is in her 14th season at UW and has over 500 wins

SCOUTING NEW MEXICO STATE

- NMSU went 10-8 over the first month of the season, including a five-game winning out of the gate
- The Aggies have been potent on offense, hitting .312 as a team with eight different players hitting over .300. Victoria Castro and Kelsey Horton have been a strong duo at the dish, combining for 43 hits, 28 runs scored, 10 doubles and 34 RBI
- In the circle, NMSU enters the weekend with a 4.04 combined ERA. Kayla Green leads the Aggies in wins with six, while Samaria Diaz has allowed a staff-low 18 earned runs. Analise De La Roca is also a key component, leading all Aggie pitchers with 26 strikeouts
- The Aggies are coached by Kathy Rudolph, who is in her 15th season at NMSU

SCOUTING PORTLAND STATE

- Portland State currently sits at 4-12
- At the plate, PSU is led by Riley Casper, who is hitting a team-best .348, while Darian Lindsey is second with a .313. Catcher Kaela Morrow has also been productive with nine RBIs on 10 hits, including three doubles and three home runs

REBELS WELCOME NEW COACHING STAFF



Head Coach - Kristie Fox

Kristie Fox was named the sixth head coach in UNLV softball history on June 20, 2017.

Fox has accumulated experience at the highest levels of softball as both a player and a coach, and comes to Las Vegas after spending five years as head coach at UT Arlington.

At UT Arlington, Fox led the Mavericks to five consecutive conference tournament appearances and an increase in the team's win total in each of the last three seasons. Becoming one of the nation's youngest head coaches in 2012, she inherited a UT Arlington team that had won just 15 games during the previous season, failing to qualify for league tournament, but led it to 25 victories and a conference tournament berth in her first year. She was also instrumental in the school's recent \$3 million renovation of the program's facility.

A native of San Diego, Fox was a two-time All-American during her collegiate career at Arizona. She reached the pinnacle of the college game as she led the Wildcats to back-to-back NCAA Championships during her junior and senior years (2006 and 2007). As a senior, she set a Women's College World Series record with 11 hits, helping the school to its eighth national crown in softball.

At the age of 26 she accepted her first head-coaching job (UT Arlington). In her five seasons there, she led the Mavericks to 134 wins. This past season, the team made its first conference tournament semifinal appearance, and won 32 games, marking the program's highest win total since 2011. The team also made its first postseason appearance since 2003, competing in the National Invitational Softball Championship.

Under Fox, UT Arlington had seven all-conference selections and two NFCA All-Region team members, marking just the third and fourth all-region selections in program history.

Prior to her time at UT Arlington, Fox was an assistant coach at Big 12-member Texas Tech, where she was recognized as one of the top assistants in the country. With the Red Raiders, Fox helped the team to the NCAA Regionals three straight years, marking a first for the program.

She began her coaching career at her alma mater, serving as the undergraduate assistant for the Wildcats in 2008, while she completed her degree in psychology. She then spent a year as assistant coach at Murray State before moving on to Texas Tech prior to the 2010 season.

Fox also boasts national team experience, both as a player and as a coach. A former member of the USA Elite Team, she earned a gold medal in the College World Games in Taiwan with Team USA in 2006. Over the past three years she has served as an assistant coach for the USA Junior Women's National Team.

As a player, Fox finished her collegiate career (2004-07) with a .350 batting average, 260 hits and 230 RBI, while leading Arizona to a 203-43-1 record over her four years. Her All-American honors followed her sophomore and junior seasons in 2005 and 2006, respectively. After her senior season, she was chosen in the first round of the 2007 National Professional Fastpitch League Draft by the Chicago Bandits.

Assistant Coach - Andy Jarvis

Andy Jarvis joined Fox's staff in August 2017.

Jarvis follows Fox from the University of Texas-Arlington, where he served as Fox's assistant from 2013-16 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2017 season.

Together, Fox and Jarvis led the Mavericks to five consecutive conference tournament appearances and most recently their first postseason berth since 2003 as the team played in the National Invitational Softball Championship after a 32-win campaign last season. The 2017 season was also one of the best offensively in program history, with Jarvis helping the Mavericks set marks for runs scored, hits, and RBI, while posting the second-highest batting average all-time.

The Renton, Washington native played baseball at Oregon State, where he was a four-year starter and three-time All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention selection. Jarvis remains in seven Oregon State all-time career top-10 record books and still owns the Beavers' single-game home run record (3, vs. Washington State - 2001), the career RBI and total bases record and is tied for the career home run mark.

After playing professionally at the minor league level for two seasons, Jarvis spent five seasons as a volunteer assistant baseball coach at Texas Tech, working with his former college coach Dan Spencer, who was the Red Raiders' associate head coach. During his time at TTU, the Red Raiders won 140 games, including 36 over ranked opponents, and saw 28 players selected in the Major League Draft.



Pitching Coach - Tina Andreana

Tina Andreana joined Fox's staff in August 2017 and will serve as the primary pitching coach under Fox.

Originally from Oakville, Ontario, Andreana joins Fox's staff after spending the 2017 season as the pitching coach for the University of North Dakota Fighting Hawks. Prior to her stint in at UND, Andreana was a graduate assistant and pitching coach for Black Hills State for two seasons, which saw the Yellow Jackets earn their highest win total since moving up to Division II and the team's overall ERA reduced.

Andreana was a three-year starting pitcher for Oregon State Softball from 2011-13, where she helped the Beavers to back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances in 2012 and 2013 in addition to earning a Pac-10 Honorable Mention selection in 2011. She also played for the Canadian Senior National Team and earned a bronze medal at the 2010 World Championships.
