2007 CLOSEDOWN

The 2007 UNLV softball season came to a close on May 12 with an 8-3 victory over the Utah Utes in Salt Lake City, Utah. The Rebels finished their final road trip with a 2-2 mark with a doubleheader loss at BYU (May 10) and a two-game series sweep of Utah (May 11-12).

Overall, UNLV went 37-27, which was an improvement of 11 games in the win column from the 2006 season. In Mountain West Conference action the team finished 12-8 and in second place. BYU wound up taking the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament with its first place finish with a mark of 16-4.

ROBINSON'S REGIONAL SELECTION

On May 16, Christie Robinson was named to the 2007 Louisville Slugger/NFCA (National Fastpitch Coaches Association) All-West Region Second Team. Robinson closed out the year with a 15-5 record and an ERA of 2.26. She becomes the 48th Rebel in program history to be chosen to an all-region team.

MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE HONORS

The Mountain West Conference coaches bestowed Pitcher of the Year honors on Christie Robinson on May 14, as well as selecting her and fellow teammates, Kendall Fearn and Jaci Hull as All-Conference members. Head coach Lonni Alameda was tabbed the conference's Coach of the Year, as well.

Besides Robinson being named the MWC Pitcher of the Year, the league's six coaches selected Jodi Norton as the Player of the Year and Ashley Munoz as the Freshman of the Year.

Robinson went 5-0 in conference play, including three complete games. She finished third in MWC play in ERA (2.24), fourth in wins (5), seventh for innings pitched (50.0) and eighth for opposing batting average (.278). She was also named the MWC Pitcher of the Week three times this season.

Fearn hit .310 in 20 league starts at first base, while collecting 18 hits in 58 at-bats. She had seven extra-base hits with five home runs and two doubles. Defensively, she held a fielding percentage of .988 with only two errors in 169 chances. She was named the initial MWC Player of the Week to open the 2007 season.

Hull tallied a .328 hitting percentage in 20 MWC starts at short stop. She tied for the team-lead in MWC action with 19 hits. She connected for seven home runs (third in the conference) and four doubles in those games. She, also, was tops on the squad in RBI (14) and runs (16). She was also named the MWC Player of the Week three times this season.

BYU, UTAH RECAPS

The UNLV Rebels went 2-2 on its final road trip of 2007 with a trip to the Beehive State. The Rebels dropped a pair at BYU in doubleheader action, but rebounded for two wins over Utah in two days.

In the first game at BYU, the Cougars jumped out to a quick 3-0 lead in the first inning, but watch the Rebels counter with three runs of their own in the third. BYU took control of the game with a seven-run fourth inning and adding the game-clinching run in the sixth. The Cougars ended the game early with help from the eight-run rule and an 11-3 tally.

In game two, BYU broke open a 2-2 game with a single run in the fourth and two in the fifth for a

5-2 lead. UNLV pulled within one with a run in the sixth and seventh, but wound up dropping the contest 5-4.

UNLV got back on the winning track with a 6-5 win over Utah in their first game. After Utah scored four runs in the first against Stephanie Bregante, Christie Robinson entered in relief and shut down the Utes. The Rebels chipped away at the 4-0 lead with two in the third and then took hold of the game with a four-run sixth that was highlighted by an RBI-double by Rosa Ordaz and a three-run home run by Kendall Fearn.

In the season finale for both teams, Utah maintained a 2-1 lead heading into the fifth inning. UNLV then turned the tables and scored seven run through the remainder of the game for an 8-3 win. The rally began in the fifth with back-to-back run-scoring doubles by Alyssia De La Torre and Brittany Bolinger and three Ute errors. With UNLV holding a 5-3 advantage through six, Fearn added two insurance runs with a blast over the fence in left field.

HIGHLY OFFENSIVE MATTER

The Rebels hit at a .284 clip, which is the highest such total since the 1999 season. The team connected for 472 hits with 144 going for extra bases (86 doubles, 13 triples and 45 home runs).

Three Rebels hit above the .300 barrier this past season. Jaci Hull led the squad with a .370 batting average and was followed by Kelli Fangonilo's .312 and Brittany Bolinger's .304.

In the long-ball department, the team hit 45 home runs. The 2007 squad fell only five dingers shy of tying the program record of 50 set in 2005. This year's tally bests the 2006 squad by one. Kendall Fearn edged Hull for the the home run crown by one. Fearn crushed 13 (6th-most in a single-season), while Hull hit 12 (8th-most in a single-season).

The 13 triples surpassed the triple tally in 2006. The '06 squad only collected three three-baggers (all tallied by Brittany Bolinger), while this season's team hit double-digits. Bolinger led the team with four (10th-most in a single-season), while Hull, Rosa Ordaz and Jenn Newman had two apiece.

Hull and Brittany Meade were the main contributors for the team collecting 86 doubles. Hull had 17 (2nd-most in a single-season) to Meade's 12 (10th-most in a single-season). Fangonilo and Fearn came close to hitting double-digits, but fell short at nine each.

ONE HULL OF A PLAYER

After missing last season due to a medical redshirt, Jaci Hull is played at the same pace that she began 2006, prior to her injury. She is one of only two Rebels (Brittany Meade is the other) to have been in the starting lineup every game in 2007.

Overall, she led the Rebels in hitting (.370), runs (49), hits (68), doubles (17), slugging percentage (.679), walks (46) and on-base percentage (.500).

She finished 2nd in home runs (12) and tied for 2nd in triples (2).

She did a good job as the lead-off hitter. She reached base at least once in 56 of 64 contests. Northwestern, Cal Poly, Texas, New Mexico-1 & 4, San Diego State-1/4 and Arizona State-2 are the only teams to keep her off the base paths.

She was named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week on three occasions and was named to the league's all-conference team, as well.

She had 20 multi-hit games, which included a 4-for-4 performance with three doubles against Sacramento State. She had 11 multi-walk games, which included three intentional walks issued by Colorado State-3 on April 27. She had eight multi-RBI games, which included three-RBI contests against California and Colorado State (April 14). She has 13 multi-run scored games.

She had a personal-best hitting streak of seven games from March 24 (Sacramento State) through April 7 (BYU). In that time frame she went 11-for-20 for a .550 average. She began the streak with a 4-for-4 performance against Sacramento State. She scored seven runs and knocked in six, while blasting four home runs and hitting five doubles (three of which were in that 4-for-4 Sacramento State contest).

In the single-season record book, she sits tied for 9th in most games played (64), 3rd in runs (49), 2nd in doubles (17), 8th in home runs (12), 5th in total bases (125), 7th in slugging percentage (.679), 1st in walks (46) and 2nd in on-base percentage (.500).

In the career record book, she is 10th in walks (54) and sits unofficially in the top-4 of three other categories, but is one at-bat shy of qualifying. She is 4th in batting average (.372), 2nd in slugging percentage (.703) and 1st in on-base percentage (.512).

POISONOUS FANG

Kelli Fangonilo started 63 of 64 contests in 2007. Fangonilo was primarily used as the designated player the first 16 games, but switched to second base when UNLV played Mississippi (Feb. 24) in Palm Springs, Calif.

Overall, she is hit for the second-highest batting average with a .312. She collected 58 hits (nine doubles and one triple), 23 RBI and 34 runs. On the base paths she was 18-for-23.

She was second on the team in multi-hit games with 17. She had collected three hits against Long Island (March 17), Colorado State (April 14) and Southern Utah-2 (April 18).

Prior to picking up her glove in a start, she was hitting .268 with 11 hits (one double), six RBI and eight runs. She was 50-50 on the base paths, with two steals in four attempts.

Since the Mississippi game she hit .324 with 47 hits (eight doubles and one triple). She plated 17

RBI and scored 26 runs. In the steal department she was 16-for-19.

She had a personal-best hitting streak of nine games from April 5 (Utah-1) through April 18 (Southern Utah-2). In those nine games she hit .485 (16-for-33), which up her batting average at that juncture by 44-points. She knocked in five RBI and scored seven runs, while legging out four doubles.

In the single-season record book, she sits tied for 10th in games (64) and 8th in stolen bases (18).

BOLI, BOLI, BOLI...HA HA HA

Brittany Bolinger played in 63 contests with 61 starts. Bolinger finished the year with the third-best batting average at .304. She tallied 56 hits with 12 going for extra-bases (seven doubles, four triples and one home run). She scored 31 runs, while knocking in 23. She led the team in stolen bases with 19.

She closed out the 2007 campaign with a season-best six-game hitting streak. From May 5 (San Diego State) to May 12 (Utah), she hit .421 with eight hits in 19 at-bats. She scored six runs and knocked in two RBI with one triple and two doubles. In the season finale, she went 3-for-4 with two doubles against the Utes.

She had 10 multi-hit games with two coming as three-hit affairs (Delaware State-1 and Utah-4). She had four multi-RBI games with the only five-plus RBI game registered by a Rebel this season. She plated six runners in a 9-3 win over Delaware State-1.

In the single-season record book, she sits 10th in runs (39 in 2005), 9th in doubles (4) and 6th in stolen bases (19).

In the career record book, she is 8th in triples (7) and 8th in stolen bases (32).

FEARN GOLLY

Kendall Fearn holds a .297 batting average, which was good enough for fourth-best amongst the Rebels. She scattered 51 hits with 22 going for extra bases (nine doubles and 13 home runs). She had the second-highest slugging percentage with a .576 tally. Her on-base percentage came in second and was greatly aided by 24 walks and two hit-by-pitches.

She had 13 multi-hit games, which included logging three hits in contests against Utah State, Virginia and Colorado State (twice). She had 11 multi-RBI games, with two four-RBI games against Virginia and Kent State and four three-RBI games vs. Illinois, Sacramento State, New Mexico-3 and Utah-3.

She was named the 2007 Mountain West Conference's initial Player of the Week on Feb. 6, for her efforts in leading UNLV to a 5-0 record in the Alexis Resort Kick-Off Classic. She earned all-conference honors, as well.

In the record book, she sits sixth in single-season

home runs with her 13 jacks this season, while she is fourth in career homers with 21. Her .560 career slugging percentage puts her at #5.

PICKING UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF

In UNLV's 2005 magical season, Brittany Meade was named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-West Region Second Team, Mountain West All-Conference Team and a player of the week (May 3).

In 2006, she sat out the year with a redshirt and watched as UNLV went 26-37.

In 2007, she hit .280 with 52 hits. She was second on the team in doubles with 12. Her on-base percentage was not only helped by her 52 hits, but by 11 walks and a single-season school record of 10 hit-by-pitches.

She had eight multi-hit games with two three-hit affairs (Illinois-Chicago and Southern Utah-2). She had six multi-RBI games with one four-RBI contest (Nicholls State) and two three-RBI affairs (Southern Utah-1 & 2).

She had the longest hitting streak amongst the Rebels this season with a 10-gamer. From Feb. 23 (Penn State) through March 5 (Delaware State-1), she went on a 10-game hitting streak and hit at a .316 clip. She tallied 12 hits (two doubles), three RBI and three runs.

She, also, had a seven-game hitting streak snapped in the first game of the Arizona State doubleheader on Tuesday, April 24. In those seven games, she raised her batting average 40-points. During the streak, which began in New Mexico, she hit .524 with 11 hits (two doubles and one home run). She scored five runs and knocked in seven.

In the single-season record book, she sits 9th in games (64), 10th in doubles (12) and 1st and 8th in hit-by-pitches (10 in 2007 and 7 in 2005).

In the career record book, she is 2nd in hit-by-pitches (17).

SENIOR(ITA) FREIGHT

Brittany Freight was the lone senior on the UNLV softball team this season. The elder classman closed out her senior season hitting .287, which was the fifth-best batting average on the team. She collected 41 hits (seven doubles and one triple), 13 RBI and 22 runs.

She had 10 multi-hit games with a three-hit contest on Feb. 16 against Florida International.

In her four-year career, she played in the most games as a Rebel with 248 appearances. In the remaining career categories she sits 6th in at-bats (678), 7th in runs (91), 8th in hits (188), 7th in doubles (30), 9th in total bases (234)10 in hit-by-pitch (9) and 10th in stolen bases (31).

PAUS-ING WHILE PLAYING

Caitlyn Paus appeared in 61 games, while she started 52. Paus tallied a .281 batting average with 38 hits. Her slugging percentage of .407 was aided

Lonni Alameda is in her fourth season as UNLV's head coach and holds an overall record 132-118, which includes 37 victories in 2007.

Prior to taking over the Rebels, UNLV had seven-straight seasons of below-.500 records. Although Alameda's first season (2004: 25-35) only amassed 25 wins, the program improved four-games over the 2003 campaign. In 2005, the program took a giant leap forward with its 44-19 mark. The 2006 season was riddled with injuries as the team went 26-37.

The 2005 season featured the Rebels' assault on the program's record book, appearances in the national rankings, a trip to the NCAA Regionals and the introduction of several conference and national award winners, such as Marissa Nichols and Caitlyn Paus. The 44 wins in 2005 were the third-most in the program's history, while the 17 Mountain West Conference wins were the most-ever since UNLV joined the league in 1999. Also, UNLV finished in second-place in the regular season and in the conference tournament.

With the year UNLV had in 2005, Alameda was named the Mountain West Conference's Coach of the Year and the staff as a whole was honored as the NFCA's West Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

Since the summer of 2004, Alameda has helped in the development of Canada's National Softball Team. She has served as an assistant coach for the past 2.5 years. She coached with Team Canada up until the 2004 Summer Olympics and resumed as an assistant to head coach Lori Sippel following the Rebels' 2005 season. In the summer of 2006, Team Canada qualified for the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China after its showing in the World Championships.

Alameda came to Las Vegas after eight seasons as the assistant coach at Stanford University (Palo Alto, Calif.) where she helped guide the Cardinal to a 320-179-1 record and six straight NCAA Regional appearances. She oversaw the pitching staff there and produced three All-Americans: Becky Blevins, Marcy Crouch and Dana Sorenson.

Prior to her stint at Stanford, Alameda spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Barry University (Miami Shores, Fla.). She helped the Buccaneers to a fifth-place NCAA Division II finish in her first year. She also spent some time on the international stage, serving as instructor for both the Aruba (1995) and Spanish (2000) national teams.

by ten of those hits that went for extra-bases with six doubles, one triple and three home runs. She scored 30 runs and plated 14 RBI.

She split time between second base and right field in the 2007 season. She had eight multi-RBI games with one four-hit contest (March 13 vs. Fordham). She had three multi-RBI games.

In the single-season record book, she is 7th in at-bats (208 in 2005), 10th in runs (39 in 2005), 3rd in RBI (44 in 2005), 10th in total bases (110 in 2005).

In the career record book, she is 7th in runs (91) and 10th in home runs (18).

BURNIN' BERNARDI

Bri Bernardi played in 59 contests with 51 starts, 49 of which were as a catcher. Bernardi hit .268 this past season with 34 hits. She connected for 10 extra-base hits, five doubles and five home runs. She knocked in 17 RBI and scored 13 runs.

She had nine multi-hit games with two going for three hits (Virginia and DePaul). She had six multi-RBI games with one four-RBI contest (Arizona State-2) and one three-RBI affair (Southern Utah-1).

AND HERE'S TO YOU MISS ROBINSON

Christie Robinson made 39 appearances in the circle in 2007 with 24 coming via the start. Robinson led the Rebels with a 15-5 mark and notched two saves in relief. She tossed a team-high six complete games.

In 136.1 innings of work, she allowed 44 earned runs on 151 hits. She struck out 66 and walked only 28.

She had two complete-game shutouts. On Feb. 16, she blanked Florida International and then matched that feat against San Diego State on May 6.

Her efforts were not over looked as she was garnered with three MWC Pitcher of the Week honors, the MWC's Pitcher of the Year award and named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-West Region Second Team.

SITTING 'EM DOWN

Stephanie Bregante was thrown "into the fire" so to speak as a freshman in 2007. Bregante made one less appearance than Christie Robinson and Heather Slettvet in the circle this season. She was given the ball on 38 occasions (17 starts) and held a record of 12-10. Her .545 winning percentage places her 8th in the career pitching record book.

In 116.1 innings of work she amassed an ERA of 3.49, while having nearly a 3-to-1 ratio of strikeouts (130) to walks (50). She surrendered 108 hits, which accounted for 58 earned runs to score.

On two occasions she struck out nine batters, Maryland (Feb. 25) and BYU (April 6). In that same Maryland contest she picked up one of her two seven-inning shutouts. The Sacramento State contest on March 24 was the other.

The Mountain West Conference recognized her as the league's Pitcher of the Week on April 10.

SPITTIN' IMAGE

Heather Slettvet went 9-11 in her first year at UNLV after transferring from Mt. SAC in Los Angeles, Calif. Slettvet tossed a team-best 142.1 innings, while tying Christie Robinson in appearances with 39. Her 18 starts were second only to Robinson's 24.

In the closing department she wound up with four saves, which are the second-most ever in a single season at UNLV.

In the circle, she struck out 117 batters and walked 71. She gave up 153 hits, which led to 65 earned runs.

On April 5, in game two of the doubleheader vs. Utah, she struck out a team-high 12 Utes. The 7.0 complete-game effort was one of three for her, as she collected the 2-1 win over Utah.

SIX IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

When the offense was going well, the wins came in abundance. The Rebels went 20-3 when they scored six or more runs in a game. The three losses in that 21-game stretch is an 8-6, 11-inning defeat to DePaul (March 2), a 12-7 loss to Southern Utah (April 18) and a 10-9 loss to Arizona State (April 24).

Breaking it down even further. When the team scored seven or more runs, they were 17-2. The two losses came within a week's span with a 12-7 defeat at Southern Utah (April 18) and a 10-9 loss at Arizona State (April 24).

On the other hand, when UNLV scored five or less runs they were below .500. Currently, the team held a 17-24 mark in those contests, which was aided by seven wins in MWC play (Utah - twice, BYU - twice, CSU - once and SDSU - twice).

30-WINS AND MORE TO GO

With the Rebels 5-3, come-from-behind, extra-inning win over Colorado State on April 15, UNLV hit the 30-win barrier. The Rebels closed out the 2007 season with 37.

Since the softball program was brought back in 1985, the Rebels have now hit the 30-win mark 11 times. The 1991 and 1995 Women's College World Series teams sit tied for the most wins with 49 each. The 2005 squad comes in third with its 44. The 1994 team is fourth with 39, while the 2007 and 1993 editions had 37, which is good enough for fifth.

WHO'S GOT ALL THREE

The UNLV offense has four players that have registered at least one double, one triple and one home run this season.

Jaci Hull (17 doubles, 2, triples and 12 home runs) leads the way. Brittany Bolinger (7, 4, 1), Rosa Ordaz (6, 2, 5) and Caitlyn Paus (6, 1, 3).

Bolinger is the only one of the three to repeat from

the 2006 season. She was the only Rebel to register at least one triple last season.

EXTRA, EXTRA

Through 64 games played, the Rebels have given the fans a little bit more than they paid for. UNLV played in six games, in which the team has provided "free softball" to fans.

In those six contests, the Rebels held a 4-2 edge. UNLV won three straight extra-inning affairs, including the 5-3, nine-inning tilt with Colorado State (April 15). The last time the team played six extra-inning games was back in 1995.

The record for most extra-inning games was 14 in 1991.

GETTING THE FIRST RUN

The Rebels hold an 26-4 mark when they were the first in the game to put a run up on the scoreboard. The only losses that UNLV suffered were to Notre Dame (Feb. 24), Longwood (March 10), Pacific (March 24) and Arizona State-2 (April 24).

When the opponents scored first, the Rebels held a losing mark of 9-21. UNLV rallied for wins against Tulsa (Feb. 8), Marshall (Feb. 10), Illinois-Chicago (Feb. 11), Virginia (Feb. 22), Delaware State-1 (March 5), Utah-1 (April 5), Colorado State (April 14) and in both games of the doubleheader vs. New Mexico (April 29).

HOLDING ONTO THE LEAD

The Rebels held the lead after the fourth inning 26 times. In those 26 instances the team went 23-3. The three losses were to Notre Dame (Feb. 24), Pacific (March 24) and Arizona State-2 (April 24).

When the team trailed after the fourth inning, they held a record of 8-20 (Tulsa - Feb. 8; Tulsa - Feb. 10; Long Island - March 17; Utah (1) - April 5; Colorado State - April 15; New Mexico (3) - April 29; Utah (3) - May 11 and Utah (4) - May 12).

When the team was tied after the fourth inning, they held an advantage at 6-4.

HITTING HOMERS HELPS

The 2007 Rebels hit 45 home runs in 33 games. Those 41 home runs have come in 30 contests. In those 33 games, in which UNLV hit a home run the team went 33-10.

In the remaining 31 games where no home runs were hit by UNLV, the was three-games under .500 with a mark of 14-17.

RACKING UP THE HITS

When UNLV out-hit its opponents this season the team held a 28-3 record, with the only losses coming on March 2 against DePaul, on April 24 to Arizona State (game two) and New Mexico on April 28.

When UNLV was out-hit in 31 games the team posted a 7-24. The Rebels notched wins over Maryland (Feb. 25), Harvard (March 9), Miami (March 10), Utah-1 & 2 (April 5), BYU (April 7) and Utah (May 11) with less offensive firepower than its opponents.

The Rebels went 2-0 this season in games, in which they tied the opponent in hits. The first win came in the first game of the season, a 3-2 win over Tulsa (Feb. 8), while the second didn't happen until the final game of the season, a 8-3 victory over Utah on May 12.

YOU HIT ME, I'LL TAKE MY BASE

With the conclusion of the 2007 season, Rebel batters can now recuperate from being hit by opposing pitchers' offerings. In 64 contests the Rebels were hit 33 times. The 33 HBPs comes in as the second-highest tally in program history with 2005's 36 leading the way.

Brittany Meade owns nearly a third of the HBPs this season, as she was

plunked a single-season record ten times. Combining the seven from the 2005 to the 2007 figure, she now sits 2nd in the all-time career book with 17. She trails Pauline Glenn 23 HBPs for the record.

Brittany Freight and Jenn Newman trailed Meade's tally, but were hit four times apiece. Jaci Hull came in fourth with her three HBPs.

There were 11 Rebels that were hit at least once in 2007. There were only three players that had 34 or more at-bats that didn't get hit by a pitch and they were: Caitlyn Paus, Heather Slettvet and Sandy Nakamura.

SPEED ON THE BASE PATHS

On the base paths, the Rebels turned into speed racer. The team broke the all-time single-season mark of 105 attempts from back in 1991 with the 111 this season. The team fell one successful steal shy of tying the all-time tally of 86 set in 1991. The 85 steals this season nearly doubled the 2006 total of 48.

The 2007 stolen bases and attempts figures had not been put up by the offense since the 1993 season. Back then the '93 team stole 78 in 95 tries.

BALL FOUR, BALL EIGHT, BALL 12

The Rebel batters took advantage of the opposition's inability to hit the strike zone. Not only did the offense explode for big numbers during the season, the hitters have been patient at the plate. The Rebels tallied 159 walks in 14 weeks of play.

Jaci Hull led a total of nine Rebels that amassed 10 or more walks apiece. Hull paced the team with her single-season school record of 46 (nine intentional).

Kendall Fearn was the only Rebel besides Hull to break the 20+ walk barrier. Fearn was given 24 free passes (including one intentional).

Kelli Fangonilo and Brittany Bolinger tied for third with 13 each. Brittany Freight and Brittany Meade came in fifth with 11, while Caitlyn Paus, Bri Bernardi and Rosa Ordaz rounded out the double-digits with 10.

HOW UNLV FARED AGAINST NCAA PARTICIPANTS

When the 2007 NCAA Tournament was announced there were 17 schools that UNLV had played against this season. Of those 17 schools, a total of 25 games were played. The Rebels fared best against Harvard (1-0), Long Island (1-0), Southern Utah (2-1), Penn State (1-0), BYU (2-2) and Oregon (1-1). They didn't play so well against Oregon State (0-1), UCLA (0-1), Texas (0-1), DePaul (0-1), Cal (0-1), Cal Poly (0-1), Fresno State (0-1), Notre Dame (0-1), Northwestern (0-1), Pacific (0-2) and Arizona State (0-2).

IN THE NCAA STATISTICS

The UNLV Rebels placed in the final NCAA statistics coming in 41st in triples (averaging 0.20 per game) and 13th in double plays turned (0.44). Individually, Heather Slettvet was tied for 19th in saves (4), while Jaci Hull came in 14th in walks (averaging 0.72 per game).
