THE SKINNY

The Nevada football team will honor 19 seniors on Saturday as the Wolf Pack looks to clinch its sixth winning season in the last seven years when it plays host to Idaho in the regular season finale on Saturday ... Nevada leads the all-time series 19-9 and the Wolf Pack has won six straight in the series since Idaho joined the WAC ... Nevada is ranked fifth in the nation in total offense and ninth in the country in rushing offense ... The Wolf Pack is 15th in the nation in punt returns and 24th in sacks allowed ... Freshman quarterback Cody Fajardo is 28th in the nation and leads the WAC in passing efficiency ... Rishard Matthews leads the WAC in receiving yards and is seventh in the country ... Matthews is tied for 14th in the nation in receptions and second in the WAC ... Matthews is fifth in the nation in punt returns and is second in the WAC in that category ... Brett Roy ranks seventh in the nation and leads the WAC in sacks while he is ninth in the country leads the WAC in tackles for loss ... Khalid Wooten and Isaiah Frey are second in the WAC and tied for 17th in the nation in interceptions ... This is Nevada's fifth appearance on the WAC Sports Network (3-1) ... Nevada was picked third in the WAC in preseason voting by coaches and media, behind Hawaii and Fresno State ... Nevada won the WAC Championship last year along with Boise State and Hawaii ... Nevada returns 14 starters (6/7/1) from last year's 13-1 team and 31 overall letterwinners (15/15/1) ... Amongst the returners are four All-WAC players in 2010 in senior wideout Rishard Matthews, junior offensive lineman Chris Barker, senior linebacker James-Michael Johnson and senior cornerback Isaiah Frey.

LAST TIME THEY MET (Nov. 6, 2010)

MOSCOW, Idaho (AP) - Colin Kaepernick threw a career-high five touchdown passes and No. 25 Nevada piled up a team record 844 yards of offense as the Wolf Pack beat Idaho 63-17.

Rishard Matthews caught two touchdown passes, ran for a score, and had 151 receiving yards for Nevada (8-1, 3-1 Western Athletic Conference), which had its highest point total of the season.

Idaho (4-5, 1-3), which came in averaging 30 points per game, suffered a second straight big defeat as the Vandals struggled to become bowl eligible for a second consecutive season. They lost 45-10 at Hawaii last weekend.

Media Information

PRACTICE SCHEDULE/INTERVIEW POLICY

Nevada student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews Monday and Tuesday on the field before practice. Coaches are also available before practice Wednesday and Thursday but those practices are closed to the media and public. (Schedule adjusted if game is on Thursday or Friday). All interview arrangements must be made through the Nevada Media Services office. Nevada generally practices at 2:15 p.m. each day (interviews at 1:55 p.m.), but please check with the media services office for any changes to the weekly schedule. Players are not allowed to do telephone interviews unless it is with their hometown media or a national media outlet and pre-arranged through the Nevada Media Services office. Generally, the Nevada Media Services office will record (video) pre-practice interviews on Mondays and those will be posted on www.nevadawolfpack.com. For information on receiving a copy of those interviews directly, contact Director of Electronic Media Ryan Jerz (rjerz@unr.edu).

WEEKLY RADIO SHOW

Chris Ault's weekly radio show with Ryan Radtke is on Thursday from noon until 1 p.m. It is available in Northern Nevada on ESPN Radio 94.5 and for free at www.nevadawolfpack.com. In addition to Ault, Radtke will interview assistant coaches and players on the show.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the media room on the first floor of Cashell Football Center. No Nevada student-athletes or coaches are to be interviewed on the field or en route to the locker room, and the Nevada locker room is closed. Following the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, Nevada head coach Chris Ault and three to four requested players will be available. For road games, Nevada's locker room will be closed, but Ault and requested players will be available outside the visiting locker room or in the designated visiting media interview area after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period. No student-athletes are to be interviewed on the field or en route to the locker room.

MEDIA WORK AREA

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, Ethernet and phone lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The interview/media work room in Cashell Football Center has Ethernet and phone lines available. Media are asked to work in the Cashell media room if working more than 90 minutes post-game. The press box at Mackay Stadium will close 90 minutes following the game.

WEEKLY QUARTERBACK CLUB LUNCHEONS

Beginning Sept. 12 and continuing each Monday throughout the season, the AAUN hosts a Quarterback Club Luncheon at the Peppermill Hotel/Casino at 11:30 a.m. Head coach Chris

WAC COACHES TELECONFERENCE

CREDENTIALS

All requests for credentials & parking passes for Wolf Pack football games should be made through the Nevada Media Services Office no later than 48 hours before game time. Please fax credential requests on company letterhead to (775) 784-4386. Media can reach the Mackay Stadium press box (second level on the west side of the stadium) by using the elevator or the stairways on the north and south ends of the building.

PARKING

There are two areas of media parking and each is parking-pass specific. The oldmedia parking is located behind Lombardi Recreation Building, southeast of the stadium and a brown pass is required. The lot may be accessed by taking Evans Avenue and then turning west on East Stadium. Lot is on your left. The other media parking is in the West Stadium Parking Complex, located directly west of Mackay Stadium with parking on level two with a green pass. General parking is also available on floors 4, 5 and 6 and can only be accessed from Virginia Street via Sixteenth Street.

Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

The Vandals had given up just 21 total points in winning their first three games in the Kibbie Dome, but gave up more than that in the first half.

Kaepernick completed 20 of 30 passes for 320 yards and was not intercepted or sacked. The senior had thrown 12 touchdown passes in the previous eight games, and his career best was four in one game.

Four of Kaepernick's touchdown passes came in the first half, as the Wolf Pack built a 28-3 lead.

LAST TIME OUT

LOGAN, Utah (AP) - Nevada (6-5, 4-2 WAC) was led by Lampford Mark, who carried the ball 22 times for 111 yards and a touchdown in 21-17 loss to Utah State on Saturday.

Utah State scored on two pass plays in the third quarter and recovered a fourth-quarter fumble to top Nevada.

Adam Kennedy threw for 140 yards and a touchdown for the

MOVING UP: Rishard Matthews

Rishard Matthews is coming off a career game last week against Utah State in which the senior wide receiver caught a career-best 12 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown. For Matthews, it marked his sixth game this season – and eighth of his career – in which he had at least 100 yards receiving. It was his second career 200-yard game as he posted a 220-yard effort earlier this season against UNLV.

Matthews enters this week's game ranked seventh in the nation in receiving yards at 113.6 yards per game and 14th in the country in receptions per game at 7.18. He leads the WAC in yards and is second in the conference in catches.

Matthews is moving up in the record books at Nevada, despite being in just his second season with the Wolf Pack. He has 1,250

receiving yards so far in 2011, which ranks sixth on Nevada's single-season list. What makes the more impressive is that he has 1,250 yards on just 79 receptions, which doesn't even rank in the top 10 on Nevada's single-season receptions lists. In his brief two-year career, Matthews has 2,219 receiving yards, which is 12th on Nevada's all-time career list.

As a punt returner, Mathews is fifth in the nation with 14.05 yards per return and his 86-yard return for a touchdown earlier this season is the seventh-longest return in the country this season. He has 553 punt return yards in his career at Nevada, which ranks seventh on the Pack's career list. His 309 punt return yards this season is ninth-best in single-season history.

Aggies (6-5, 4-2 Western Athletic Conference) and ran for a critical first down in the final minute preserve the win.

Utah State scored what proved to be the decisive touchdown on the final play of the third quarter. On a double-pass play, wide receiver Stanley Morrison hit Robert Turbin with a 34-yard strike for the score.

Nevada was threatening to score with 5:40 remaining in the game when Wolf Pack backup quarterback Tyler Lantrip fumbled on a fourth-down attempt for a first down. The ball was recovered by Bobby Wagner on the Aggie 11-yard line.

THREE-DOT REVIEW

With the loss, Nevada saw its record move to 6-5 on the year. The loss moved Nevada's all-time record to 509-440-33 and Hall of Fame Coach Chris Ault saw his record move to 225-102-1 ... Senior wideout Rishard Matthews had a huge game for the Wolf Pack, catching a career high 12 passes for 205 yards and a touchdown ... Matthews had a long reception of 76 yards on a screen pass from Tyler Lantrip ... He also had three punt returns for 24 yards and a 60+ yarder called back due to penalty ... Matthews now has six 100-yard receiving games on the season and eight in his career ... The 205 yards were the most since he had 220 earlier this season against UNLV ... For the fourth straight game and sixth time in his career, senior running back Lampford Mark topped the 100-yard mark in rushing with 22 for 111 yards ... Mark also recorded a touchdown on a 35-yard run - his seventh of the season. He is now averaging 104.0 yards per game ... Junior cornerback Khalid Wooten moved back into a tie for the team lead in interceptions when he picked off an Adam Kennedy pass early in the third quarter ... Wooten now has four on the year, tied with fellow cornerback Isaiah Frey ...

Utah State won the opening coin toss and deferred to the second half ... The Wolf Pack received the opening kickoff and defended the north ... Tray Session made his first start of the season, in place of Shane Anderson ... Senior Corbin Louks started in place of Aaron Bradley at the F receiver spot ... Chris Barker his 38th consecutive game - all 38 games of his career ... Rishard Matthews has caught a pass in all 25 games of his career ... Kicker/punter Jake Hurst placed four of his six punts inside the 20 and was 1-of-2 on field goals ... Session set season highs with five catches for 47 yards ... Corbin Louks set a career high with seven catches.

SENIOR DAY

Nevada will honor 19 seniors prior to today's game against Idaho. They are: Wide receiver Shane Anderson; safety Bubba Boudreaux; defensive end Kaelin Burnett; defensive tackle Willie Faataualofa; cornerback Isaiah Frey; tight end/long snapper Scott Frisbie; offensive lineman Steve Haley; punter/kicker Jake Hurst; linebacker James-Michael Johnson; quarterback Tyler Lantrip; wide receiver Corbin Louks; defensive tackle Zack Madonick; running back Lampford Mark; linebacker Brandon M. Marshall; wide receiver Rishard Matthews; center Jeff Meads; center Jordan Mudge; defensive tackle Brett Roy and wide receiver Tray Session.

Nevada has two other players listed on its roster as seniors in linebacker DeAndre Boughton and tight end Zach Sudfeld. Boughton is sitting out this year due to medical redshirt and will return next season. Nevada will appeal to the NCAA for a sixth year of eligibility for Sudfeld, who was injured in the season opener at Oregon and who has missed a number of games in his career due to injury.

WREAKING HAVOC: Brett Roy

The list of defensive linemen who are playing better football than Brett Roy right now is likely pretty short.

Roy was snubbed for All-WAC honors after a breakout season in 2010 in which he recorded 14.5 TFLs and 8.0 sacks from his tackle position. Now, even without standout ends Dontay Moch (third-round pick of the Bengals) and Ryan Coulson (Patriots signee) departed for the NFL, Roy has taken his game to another level this year.

Through 11 games this season, Roy has already surpassed his sack and TFL totals from last season. He enters this week's game with 10.0 sacks (leads WAC and fourth in the nation) and 17.5

tackles for loss (leads WAC and fourth in the nation).

He was named to a pair of midseason All-America team this year - third team by Phil Steele Publications and second team by Sports Illustrated.

A former walk-on linebacker, Roy has matured into one of the top tackles on the West Coast. For his career (and nearly all of his statistics have come from the start of the 2010 season), Roy ranks ninth all-time in career TFLs with 33.0 and he is fifth in career sacks with 17.0.

He is moving up the Nevada's single-season charts in both sacks and tackles for loss this year:

Nevada head coach Chris Ault has well over 200 wins in his Hall of Fame career three dozen of those victories have been comeback victories in the last 30 minutes of games. Ault entered this year with 34 come-from-behind wins and he moved that number to 36 with back-to-back comeback wins to wrap up play in October.

On Oct. 22 against Fresno State, Nevada trailed 24-23 in the third quarterback when Fresno State scored on its opening drive of the half. Nevada took the lead for good when Bubba Boudreaux recovered a fumbled punt return in the end zone and the Pack never looked back en route to the 45-38 win.

On Oct. 29 at New Mexico State, Nevada trailed going into the second half, 27-20. But the Wolf Pack scored the first three touchdowns of the second half to take control of the game as Nevada would go on to win 48-34.

Ault, of course, was the first to engineer the greatest comeback in the history of the NCAA when he guided the Pack back from a 35-point deficit against Weber State in 1991.

MASON MAGLEBY, JACK OF ALL TRADES

Third-string quarterback Mason Magleby has served in a variety of roles for the Wolf Pack this year. He has served as the team's holder on all extra-point and field goal attempts. He also served as team's long-snapper for a game when senior Scott Frisbie was out. That made Magleby just the second quarterback in the country this year to also serve as a long-snapper (Brandon Fricke at Central Michigan is the other).

Magleby also successfully executed Nevada's first fake field goal attempt in at least a decade when he rolled out and found Kolby Arendse from 15 yards out for a touchdown. That TD added to an impressive (albeit short) statistical line for Magleby this season. He is 5-of-5 for 88 yards and two touchdowns with an efficiency of 379.84.

KICKING WOES

Nevada has already had to use four different players in the kicking game so far this season as injuries have taken their toll.

The Wolf Pack opened the season with sophomore Anthony Martinez as the team's place-kicker, junior Allen Hardison as the kickoff specialist and senior Jake Hurst as the team's punter. And that was the situation through three games until Martinez, whose name is already in Nevada's career record book, suffered an injury in practice.

Beginning with the Boise State game on Oct. 1, Hardison also took over the team's place-kicking duties and fared well. He connected on all 19 extra points and 7-of-10 on field goals, including a 48-yarder against Fresno State.

But then came the New Mexico State game on Oct. 29, when Hardison went down in the second half with an injury. That forced Hurst, the punter, to take over the kicking duties and the senior came through with three extra points while also handling kickoffs.

Against Hawaii on Nov. 12, true freshman Colin Ditsworth made his collegiate debut as he took over the kickoff duties with Hardison still ailing. Hurst remained as the team's place-kicker and hit all six extra points.

Martinez is also still out with injury. He is only a sophomore but his name can already be found on the school's career PAT Top 10 in the record book.

Martinez set a school record during the historic 2010 season with 76 extra-points, which was 13 better than the previous school record. That number alone is already good for ninth on Nevada's all-time career PAT list. The record is held by Brett Jaekle (2005-08) with 211. The next spot in front of Martinez is held by

Charlie Lee, who is eighth with 88 from 1972-75. Martinez is 8-of-9 on PATs in 2011 to give him 84 for his career. But the sophomore has not played since the Texas Tech game due to injury.

Martinez holds two of Nevada's single-game bests with nine extra points against Idaho in 2010, which is tied for second, and eight against Utah State, which is tied for 10th.

SPECIAL TEAMS GIVETH AND THEY TAKETH AWAY

Nevada's special teams have had some up and down moments in 2011 but they came up big in the 45-38 win over Fresno State.

Senior Rishard Matthews gave Nevada a special teams boost in the first quarter as the punt returner put Nevada's first touchdown on the board with an 86-yard return for a score. It was the second punt return TD of his career and Nevada's first since Matthews took one back against Boston College in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl Game. It the first punt return in a regular season game since Marlon McLaughlin took one back against Louisiana Tech in 2001. At 86 yards, it ranks as the fourth-longest punt return in the country this season.

Another special teams standout of the day was senior Bubba Boudreaux, who recovered a Fresno State fumbled punt in the end zone for Nevada's second special teams score of the game. It was the second straight game that Boudreaux made a big special teams play as he blocked a punt last week against New Mexico.

Kicker Allen Hardison connected on three field goals for the Pack for the second time in his brief career. He hit a pair of three-pointers from 22 yards out in the first quarterback before connecting from 48 yards just before halftime. That marked Nevada's longest field goal since Brett Jaekle hit from 50 yards against UNLV in September of 2007.

Fast-forward to the Hawaii game on Nov. 12 and Nevada had a number of special teams miscues. Late in the second quarter, Nevada had a punt blocked by Hawaii, which recovered in the end zone for a touchdown that briefly tied the game at 14. Kendall Brock then fumbled the opening kickoff in the second half, giving Hawaii the ball inside the Pack 20-yard line. Punter Jake Hurst also had a below average game besides the block with five punts for just a 34.6-yard average, though he did place two inside the 20-yard line.

HELLO, MY NAME IS ... KENDALL BROCK

In game five of the season (against UNLV), Nevada pulled the redshirt of highly touted true freshman Kendall Brock, a running back/wide receiver/kick returner from Fresno, Calif.

Brock's debut came on the first play of the game as he lifted a struggling kick return unit with a 35-yard return on his first touch. But, thanks to a defense that pitched a shutout, it was the only time Brock and the kick-return unit saw the field against the Rebels, though Brock did play on other specials teams units in the game. Against New Mexico, Brock's role expanded a bit as the freshman had five carries for 70 yards, caught two passes for 17 yards and returned a kickoff for 31 yards. Brock returned six kicks for 123 yards against Fresno State and also had one carry for six yards.

Brock has not played in enough games to make the national or conference rankings. If he did, he would rank fifth in the WAC and 67th in the nation.

HURST EXCELLING

After three years of waiting in the wings behind Brad Langley, senior punter Jake Hurst has made the most of his opportunity this year. Hurst is fifth in the WAC and 41st nationally with an average of 41.9 yards per punt. He was rewarded for his efforts earlier this year with a WAC Special Teams Player of the Week award after the win over San Jose State.

LONG STRANGE TRIP

On Oct. 18, 2008, Corbin Louks scored a pair of touchdowns -- both rushing TDs -- in a game against Colorado State. On Oct. 8 of this year, Louks saw the end zone again, this time on a 34-yard reception. The difference between the scores is the latter came as a Nevada wide receiver and the former was as a quarterback at the University of Utah. What happened in between is an unusual tale. Louks lost his starting job at Utah prior to the 2009 season and sought a transfer

to Nevada, which had also recruited him out of high school. He came to Nevada and sat out the season as a transfer. He started the first game of the 2010 season as a starting safety, but suffered a knee injury in the game and lost his starting job. He returned to play on special teams during the year and was converted to a wide receiver prior to the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. He's been in the receiving corps in all of 2011 and then snagged that elusive touchdown grab in the Battle for the Fremont Cannon.

LINEBACKER TANDEM

Senior linebackers James-Michael Johnson and Brandon M. Marshall are two of the most experienced players on the team as the duo combines for 93 career games played and 79 starts. They are Nevada's active leaders in tackles (chart, page 7). You can also find each senior's name in the Nevada record books. Johnson is sixth all-time in career tackles for loss with 35.5 while Marshall is on his heels with 33.5. Both are among the active leaders in the NCAA in that category. This week, Johnson ranks 12th while Marshall is 20th.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

No matter the quarterback, Nevada has been able to spread the ball all around to a number of different wide receivers, tight ends and running backs this year. Entering this week, Nevada has 13 different players who have caught at least one pass this season. That breaks down to five wide receivers, five running backs and three tight ends. Nevada is one of 21 schools in the country to have at least five players with an average of 10.5 yards per catch (minimum of five catches).

FAJARDO SEIZES QUARTERBACK JOB

Nevada clearly had big shoes to fill this year in replacing quarterback Colin Kaepernick, perhaps the greatest player in school history. Senior Tyler Lantrip started the first four games for Nevada and had some high moments, especially his 366-yard effort off the bench in a win against UNLV. But redshirt freshman Cody Fajardo has seized the starting job for Nevada with his abilities in the Pistol offense. Fajardo had a breakout game against Texas Tech, running for 139 yards and two scores while throwing for another, but he missed the Boise State game due to injury.

He got his first collegiate start against UNLV on Oct. 8 and had some ups and downs in the 37-0 win. Against New Mexico the following week, Fajardo settled in. He ran for 86 yards and two scores and complete 20-of-25 for 203 yards against the Lobos. Fajardo was tremendous in his first WAC start as he led Nevada to a 45-38 win over Fresno State. He threw for a career-high 313 yards and a touchdown on 19-of-27 passing and also rushed for 61 yards and two more scores.

After that game, Fajardo (and Coach Ault) credited Lantrip for his performance on the sideline in helping Fajardo read the defense and function within the offense.

Fajardo got his first road win, his fourth win as a starter (in four starts) and his first WAC Offensive Player of the Week award all in one fell swoop with his performance against New Mexico State. Fajardo accounted for 343 yards and four touchdowns (all rushing) in the win over the Aggies.

He extended that streak to five wins in five starts with another WAC POW award following Nevada's win at Hawaii, in which he accounted for 371 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in the win.

LIGHTING THE LAMP

It was a long wait, but senior running back Lampford Mark finally saw some playing time during the Wolf Pack's win over UNLV. Mark suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament in practice in November of 2010 and missed the final three games of the season and all of spring drills. He then missed the first four games of 2011 due to illness.

But Mark has come on as of late and could be the featured back in the Pistol offense the rest of the way.

Against the Rebels, Mark carried the ball 15 times for 75 yards and a touchdown. The 4-yard TD run was the first score for Mark since Nov. 20 of last year against New Mexico State. With the 75 yards, Mark went over the 1,000-yard mark for his career at Nevada.

Against New Mexico, Mark found even more success as he ran for 39 yards on nine carries with three touchdowns. The TDs marked his first multi-touchdown game of his career and were the most rushing scores in a game by a Nevada player since Colin Kaepernick had three at Louisiana Tech last season.

Mark came through again at New Mexico State, entering the game in the second half and ran for 185 yards and a touchdown on just eight carries. He broke an 80-yard TD run – the longest run of his career. He later eclipsed that with an 85-yard run in which he was stopped just short of the end zone.

He started against Hawaii and scored Nevada's first touchdown of the game on a 4-yard plunge. He topped the 100-yard mark for the fourth time in his career with 105 yards on 24 carries. Mark got another start against Louisiana Tech and responded with his third straight 100-yard game as he notched 109 yards on 28 carries. He put forth a similar effort against Utah State with his fourth straight 100-yard game with 111 yards on 22 carries.

ROAD WARRIORS

The schedule was not kind to the Nevada football team to open this year. The Wolf Pack opened with four games on the road and two were against teams who opened the season ranked in the Top 5 (Oregon and Boise State) while the other two are against a BCS foe (at Texas Tech) and a conference game (at San Jose State), respectively.

The Wolf Pack was the second-to-last FBS team in the nation to play a home game when the team finally opened at Mackay Stadium on Oct. 8 against in-state rival UNLV. But the flip side of the schedule is this: Nevada will only leave Reno once following Nov. 1 (Nov. 26 at Utah State).

SHUTOUT

The Nevada defense tossed a shutout at UNLV with the 37-0 victory. It was notable because it marked the first-ever shutout in the 37-game rivalry series. It was also Nevada's first shutout since 2006, when the Wolf Pack blanked Louisiana Tech 42-0 on Nov. 18 that year. It was Nevada's first shutout at Mackay Stadium since Nov. 11, 2006, when the Wolf Pack shutdown Utah State to the tune of 42-0.

Nevada's shutout against UNLV did not come easy, however. In fact it was more impressive considering UNLV twice had the ball in the red zone and the Rebels' average starting field position was its own 40-yard line.

Senior cornerback Isaiah Frey stopped one Rebel drive in the red zone when he made a brilliant interception in the end zone that was intended for UNLV's top offensive player in wideout Philip Payne (who was held without a catch in the game). The other red zone drive ended on downs when Brett Roy (of course) made a tackle for a loss on a fourth-and-short play.

WAC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

So far in 2011, Nevada has won seven player of the week honors from the Western Athletic Conference. Since Nevada joined the WAC in 2000, Wolf Pack players have been honored by the league 58 times in the weekly awards. The list this year:

Hawaii.

Sept. 19: **Mike Ball**, Offense; **Jake Hurst**, Special Teams. Ball rushed for 124 yards and two touchdowns in Nevada's 17-14 win at San Jose State. Hurst punted six times for 259 yards (43.2-yard average). He had a long of 49 yards and placed two inside the 20-yard line, including one at the Spartan 3-yard line for the Wolf Pack.

COACHING CONTINUITY

Nevada is one of 34 FBS schools that made only one change on its coaching staff this season but that new addition was a familiar face. Casey Moore, a former Stanford star who spent time in the NFL, is the new running backs coach for the Pack this season. But he was already on staff as he spent the 2010 season as the team's quality control assistant on the offensive side.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Four Wolf Pack standouts were selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2011 season. On the offensive side of the ball, senior wideout Rishard Matthews and junior lineman Chris Barker were selected. From the defense, senior tackle Brett Roy and linebacker James-Michael Johnson were chosen. The voting was done by the players.

This is the second season in a row that Johnson has been named a captain while Barker joins a rare group in Nevada history being elected captain as a junior.

THE DEAN OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL COACHES

With Ault in his 27th season, he is now the dean of college coaches in FBS and the only active FBS coach who is enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Among active coaches Chris Ault ranks third with Mack Brown of Texas in career victories. Here's the list:

WATCH LISTS

Nevada has a number of players who are on preseason Watch Lists for end-of-the-year awards this season.

Senior wideout/punt returner Rishard Matthews is on a pair of lists -- the Biletnikoff Award for the nation's top receiver and the Paul Hornung Award, which is given to the nation's most versatile player.

James-Michael Johnson is also on two lists. The senior linebacker is on the Watch List for the Bronko Nagurski Award, given to the nation's top defensive player. He is also on the Watch List for the Butkus Award, given to the nation's top linebacker.

Junior offensive lineman Chris Barker is on the list for the Outland Trophy, which is given annually to the nation's top interior lineman.

NEVADA PICKED THIRD IN FINAL SEASON IN WAC

Coming off a 13-1 season that saw Nevada claim a share of the Western Athletic Conference championship, the Wolf Pack has been pegged for third place in the conference this year, according to preseason polls released by the conference. In the WAC coaches' poll, Nevada received two first-place votes but narrowly finished behind Fresno State. In the media poll, Nevada received 11 first-place votes and was third behind the Bulldogs. Hawaii is considered the preseason favorite to win the league, according to both polls.

Both polls have predicted the exact order of finish: 1. Hawaii; 2. Fresno State; 3. Nevada; 4. Louisiana Tech; 5. Utah State; 6. Idaho; 7. San Jose State; 8. New Mexico State. The media was also asked to predict the conference preseason players of the year and Hawaii quarterback Bryant Moniz won the offensive honor while the defensive award went to Utah State linebacker Bobby Wagner.

WOLF PACK RADIO COVERS THE SILVER STATE

The Wolf Pack Radio Network has added additional affiliates throughout the state and expanded its football pre-game show to 90 minutes this season.

The WPRN has also extended its football pre-game show to 90 minutes this year. The show will break down the day's game, featuring interviews with Ault, Wolf Pack players and analysis of the Wolf Pack's opponents. Nevada play-by-play voice Ryan Radtke will host the pre-game show and will be joined by analyst Chris Vargas and a newcomer to the network in former Wolf Pack star wide receiver Alex Van Dyke. Vargas, a standout quarterback for the Wolf Pack in the 1990s, and Van Dyke, are both enshrined in the Nevada Athletics Hall of Fame and their names can be found throughout the Wolf Pack records books. Additionally, the weekly Wolf Pack Coach Show airs live every Thursday from noon-1 p.m. on ESPN Radio 94.5 FM and Fox Sports Radio 630 AM. It is also available for free at www.nevadawolfpack.com.

Notable

With his three terms as the Pack's head coach Chris Ault has become one of the most legendary and decorated coaches in the West. Here is just a sample of his ledger:

- Has taken Nevada to postseason play 13 times (seven bowl appearances)
- Engineered the greatest comeback in NCAA history (35 points vs. Weber State in 1991)
- Directed 32 second-half comeback victories in his career.
- Sports Illustrated's list of 50 greatest sports figures of the 20th century from the state of Nevada, 1999
- Nevada Football's Coach of the Century by the Reno Gazette-Journal, 1998
- Elected to four athletic Halls of Fame: UNLV (inducted 1991 as assistant coach on 1974 undefeated team); University of Nevada (inducted 1993 as head football coach); Pacific High School, San Bernardino, Calif. (inducted in 1997 as a prep standout there in the 1960s); National College Football Hall of Fame (inducted 2002 as a head coach)
- In the history of college football, no coach has ever had his team lead the nation in both passing offense and rushing offense during the course of his coaching tenure...until 2009. Ault's Wolf Pack led the nation in rushing in 2009, 14 years after his 1995 team led the nation in passing.

- At 23, became youngest high school head coach in the state of Nevada at Bishop Manogue in Reno.
- At 29, became head coach at Nevada, the youngest college coach in the nation.
- At 40, became athletics director in addition to head coaching

duties at Nevada, one of the youngest to do both jobs.

At 55, was elected into the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame, one of the youngest coaches ever inducted. At 62, won 200th of his coaching career, doing so in the 11th-fewest amount of games amongst the 54 coaches in NCAA history who have accomplished the feat.
