RHODE ISLAND vs. LEHIGH... The Rhode Island men's soccer team will face Lehigh in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Wednesday, November 15 at 7:00 p.m. It marks the first time the teams have ever met. The Mountain Hawks enter the game with a 15-1-2 record while the Rams are 12-5-5.

VERSUS COMMON OPPONENTS... Rutgers is the only team that both Rhode Island and Lehigh have faced this season. Rhody tied the Scarlet Knights, 1-1, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament and advanced to the second round with a 4-2 shootout victory. When Lehigh faced Rutgers on Sept. 1, the Mountain Hawks were handed their only loss of the season - a 2-0 defeat

in Piscataway, N.J. Since falling to the Scarlet Knights, Lehigh has remained undefeated over 16 games with a 14-0-2 record.

VERSUS RANKED TEAMS... Rhode Island has posted a 2-1 record against teams ranked in last week's NSCAA/adidas and Soccer America polls while the Mountain Hawks have not faced any teams in the Top 25. URI split games with No. 7/20 Saint Louis (L, 3-1 / W, 2-0) and defeated No. 13/16 Harvard (2-1).

VERSUS TEAMS IN THE 2006 NCAA TOURNAMENT... Rhode Island has posted a 3-2-2 record against teams in the 2006 NCAA Tournament while Lehigh is 2-1-2. URI defeated Harvard (2-1) and Providence (2-1), split games with Saint Louis (L, 3-1 / W, 2-0), fell to Old Dominion (1-0, OT) and tied Brown (3-3) and Rutgers (1-1). The Mountain Hawks defeated Adelphi (2-0) and Bucknell (2-0), lost to Rutgers (2-0) and tied Binghamton (0-0) and Bucknell (1-1 in the Patriot League Semifinals - Bucknell advanced with a 4-1 shootout victory).

IN THE NCAA FIRST ROUND... The 24th-ranked Rhode Island men's soccer team battled to a 1-1 double overtime tie with Rutgers before going on to seal the victory with a 4-2 advantage in the penalty kick shootout. With their first win over the Scarlet Knights since October 14, 1986, the Rams advance to the second round of the NCAA for the first time since the 2000 season when the team made it to the Sweet Sixteen. Rhody took the lead just 5:41 into the match when senior Jeffrey Gonsalves (Markham, Ontario) tallied his team-leading 18th goal of the season. The Rams moved the ball up the field after freshman goalkeeper Chris Pennock (Middlesborough, England) pulled down a Rutgers corner kick and threw the ball out to Gonsalves. Gonsalves dribbled the ball down the left side of the field and sent a pass to junior Danleigh Borman (Cape Town, South Africa) who crossed another pass to classmate Lukasz Tumicz (Bisztynek, Poland) in the right corner of the field. Tumicz drew the Scarlet Knights' keeper towards him before sending a pass to the far post. Junior Geoffrey Cameron (Attleboro, Mass.) trapped the ball and tapped a quick pass to the center of the goal where Gonsalves snuck a shot past Matt VanOekel for the 1-0 advantage. The Scarlet Knights countered with a goal of their own with just 7:30 left in the first half when Nick LaBrocca blasted a shot into the top left corner of the net from 30 yards out, knotting the score at 1-1. Rhody had an excellent shot at a go-ahead goal eight minutes into the second half when sophomore Kevin Hamill (Easton, Conn.) set Borman up with a breakaway ball. Borman took the ball in towards the goal but was robbed by VanOekel before taking a solid shot. The Rams had a few more opportunities in the second half when Cameron drilled a shot on goal that was blocked by an RU defender in the 72nd minute. Junior Steve Mellen (North Kingstown, R.I.) collected the ball and fired off another quick shot that VanOekel was able to get his hands on. A minute and a half later, Cameron had a great look at the top right corner but shot the ball just wide of the post. After two scoreless overtime periods, the game moved into a decisive five-round penalty kick shootout. Rutgers shot first and LaBrocca got the ball past Pennock. Junior Dawid Badecki (Jelenia Gora, Poland) evened things up for Rhody with a shot that bounced off the inside of the right post and into the back of the net. The Scarlet Knights sent Michael Crowley to the line next and the Rams caught a break when Crowley's shot sailed up over the crossbar. Tumicz followed with a shot that beat VanOekel and gave URI a 2-1 advantage. Chris Moore went on to score for Rutgers and Cameron netted a goal for Rhode Island, for a 3-2 Rhody lead after three rounds. Pennock came up huge making a diving save on Bart Koffeman's shot and junior Callum Bissett (Pencaitland, Scotland) followed with the goal that sealed the win for Rhode Island.

IN THE ATLANTIC 10 TOURNAMENT... Rhode Island posted a 1-0 win over third-seeded Richmond in the Atlantic 10 Semifinals on Nov. 3. Danleigh Borman scored the loan goal for Rhody, an unassisted tally for the 1-0 win. In the Championship match, the Rams cruised to a 2-0 victory over top-seeded Saint Louis. Jeffrey Gonsalves scored the first goal of the game while Lukasz Tumicz netted the insurance goal on a pass from Danleigh Borman. The win marked the second-consecutive season that Rhode Island defeated SLU in the A-10 Championship game as the Rams tied Billikens through two overtimes last season before clinching the tournament title with a 5-4 shootout victory.

A-10 ALL-CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMERS... Five Rams were named to the Atlantic 10 All-Championship squad: Danleigh Borman, Jeffrey Gonsalves, Geoffrey Cameron, Callum Bissett and Adam Howarth. Additionally, Borman was named the Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

NATIONAL HONORS... Geoffrey Cameron, Danleigh Borman and Jeffrey Gonsalves each earned national recognition this season. Most recently, Cameron was named to the College Soccer News National Team of the week on Nov. 12, after recording an assist and netting his penalty kick in the third round of the match-deciding shootout at Rutgers on Saturday, Nov. 11. Borman was named to the Soccer America and College Soccer News National Teams of the Week after his performance at the Atlantic 10 Championship. Gonsalves has continuously been compared to the nation's best, claiming a spot on College Soccer News' 2006 Preseason All-American Third Team, as well as being named to CSN's National Team of the Week, Soccer America's National Team of the Week and SoccerTimes.com's National Honor Roll throughout the season. The senior forward also landed a spot on the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Season First Team.

AMONG THE BEST... Jeffrey Gonsalves and Lukasz Tumicz currently rank among the nation's top offensive players. With 18 goals this season, Gonsalves is second in the country to Notre Dame's Joseph Lapria (20). The senior forward is 9th in the nation with .82 goals per game and 12th in points per game, averaging 1.82. Tumicz is tied for 12th overall with .50 assists per game. As a team, Rhode Island has the 18th best offense in the nation, generating 1.95 goals per game.

INTERNATIONAL FLAIR... Of the 23 Rams on Rhode Island's roster, nine were born outside of the United States. Jeffrey Gonsalves is from Canada while Adam Howarth and Chris Pennock call England home. Dawid Badecki and Lukasz Tumicz are natives of Poland. Callum Bissett comes from Scotland. James Quiah was born in Liberia. Danleigh Borman is from South Africa and Kedan Crosby grew up in Trinidad. Additionally, Assistant Coach Gareth Elliott, who played for the Rams from 1998-2001, is from Northern Ireland.

DOMESTIC PRODUCTS... Of the 14 Rams that are from within the United States, three are from Rhode Island and four are from Connecticut. Two come from New York and one comes from each of the following states: Maine, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Jersey and Ohio.

JOHN O'CONNOR

Head Coach
First Season
Alma Mater • Maine '84

John O'Connor, the winningest soccer coach in University of Chicago history, enters his first season as the head men's soccer coach at Rhode Island. He brings an impressive resume to the URI sidelines, which includes five seasons as an assistant coach at Dartmouth under current Notre Dame Head coach and Scottish international Bobby Clark. O'Connor replaces Ed Bradley, who retired last fall after 17-years on the Rhody sidelines.

"John's passion for soccer, proven results in developing the infrastructure for program success, and the highest respect he has from former student-athletes, coaching colleagues and administrators continually impressed us during the search process," said URI Director of Athletics Tom McElroy. "His many accomplishments as the architect behind Chicago's success on the field and in the classroom gives us great confidence that he will be able to build upon what Ed Bradley accomplished at URI before him."

He was named the NCAA Division III Coach of the Year in 1996, after leading Chicago to the NCAA Tournament Semifinals and earning the program's highest ranking (No. 5) ever. It was only his second season at the helm of a program that had registered just three winning seasons in the previous 20 years.

"John is a great coach because of his mastery of the x's and o's of the game, but what sets him apart is the way he deals with student athletes," said his mentor Clark. "I've seen the way his positive energy impacts a soccer program, an athletic department and a community. I have no doubt he will be very successful in his new position."

O'Connor, a native of Wayland, Mass., guided the Maroons to a 14-5-1 record and a No. 18 ranking in the final national poll after making their second NCAA Division III Tournament semifinal appearance this past season.

O'Connor became the leader in all-time wins in the program's history in 2001, a campaign which marked Chicago's first-ever University Athletic Association (UAA) men's soccer championship. The Maroons finished the season ranked No. 2 in the South Central region and No. 14 nationally.

With a 113-74-17 (.596) record in 11 seasons at Chicago, O'Connor tops all Chicago men's soccer coaches in winning percentage (.596) and winning seasons (9).

O'Connor developed 46 All-UAA performers, 12 All-Region selections, an All-American, an Academic All-American, and an

NCAA postgraduate scholarship winner.

Prior to his arrival at Chicago, O'Connor spent five seasons at Dartmouth College under Clark. During their tenure together, the Big Green posted an overall record of 40-19-7, including a 17-10-1 mark in the Ivy League with two conference titles (1990, 1992) and two appearances in the NCAA Division I quarterfinals (1990, 1992).

While at Dartmouth, O'Connor also served as Director of Coaching for the Upper Valley Lightning Youth Soccer Association and was a Region I Olympic Development Program staff member.

"O'Connor has proven himself successful on the Division-I level, and was able to transform Chicago into one of the elite Division III programs in the country," said URI head women's soccer coach Zac Shaw. "He is a student of the game and there is no question in my mind he will be a great success and a tremendous addition to the athletics department here at Rhode Island."

O'Connor, who also coached at Orono high school, was an assistant coach at his alma mater, the University of Maine, from 1984-1986.

O'Connor earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from the University of Maine in 1984 and a master's degree in education from Maine in 1986. He holds a United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "A" License and a National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Premier Diploma.

O'Connor resides in Wyoming, R.I. with his wife Sheila, who is the former women's swimming coach at the University of Chicago, and their two children, Megan (4) and Michael (2).





GARETH ELLIOTT Assistant Coach

Gareth Elliott is in his fourth season on the Rams sidelines. A 2002 graduate of URI with a degree in Kinesiology, he has been involved in plenty of success with the Rhode Island soccer program as a player for four years and more recently as an Assistant Coach.

A native of Belfast, Northern Ireland, Elliott is one the best players in school history, playing for the Rams from 1998-2001. During that time the Rams captured two regular season Atlantic-10 Championships, won two Atlantic-10 tournaments and appeared in two NCAA Tournaments. In 2000, he and his teammates advanced to the round of 16 before falling to five-time NCAA Division I Champion University of North Carolina.

In his first year as an assistant coach, he helped lead Rhody to an Atlantic-10 Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. This past season on the bench, his last with his mentor Ed Bradley, the Rams gained another post season berth by virtue of the Atlantic-10 tournament championship before bowing out to in-state rival Brown University 2-1 in the 2005 NCAA Division I Tournament.

"I feel fortunate to be able to have been able to return to Kingston and give something back to the institution which provided me with such a great athletic and academic experience" Gareth said. "I'm excited to continue helping to develop a great group of players and assist them in reaching the goals they have set for themselves as individuals and as a team".

Elliott ranks among the top-five in career points with 87 for his career. During a four-year span, he scored 31 goals and added 25 assists. Elliott also ranks fifth in career games played with 78. He was a three-time member of the Atlantic-10 All-Tournament team and earned National Soccer Coaches Association All-Region honors during his senior year.

"Gareth has been invaluable in helping with my transition to URI" stated Head Coach John O'Connor. "His ability to relate to the players while still maintaining his professional responsibilities is a tribute to his love for Rhode Island and the experience he had here as a student-athlete. Our players were lucky to have a young coach of his quality here in Kingston during the time between Ed Bradley's retirement and my coming on board."

Coach Elliott's responsibilities include the recruiting of student-athletes in the United States and abroad, coordinating team travel, alumni relations and assisting Coach O'Connor in the day to day operation of the program. Elliott also trains the team in the technical components of the game in the winter and throughout the academic year. He is a United States Soccer Federation licenses coach and will be pursuing his NSCAA Advanced National Diploma this winter.



PAT LAUGHLIN Assistant Coach

Pat Laughlin is in his first season with the Rams, after spending six successful years as the Head Coach at Dean College in Franklin, Mass.

While at Dean, Laughlin helped take the program to new heights, which included its first-ever trip to the NJCAA National Finals in 2002. During

his tenure, the Bulldogs captured the New England Region Championships in 2002 and 2003 and were finalists in 2005. During his six seasons in Franklin, his teams, which included four NJCAA All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans, combined to post a record of 69-36-6. Laughlin was named New England Region Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the National Coach of the Year in 2002.

"Pat comes to URI with a great coaching pedigree

including stints as a head coach and Division I Assistant," stated head coach John O'Connor. "He has a great knowledge and background in the game, knows the players in Rhode Island and along with Gareth Elliott, is a great boost for the program at a crucial time of transition here at URI."

A native of Dallas, Texas, Laughlin is a 1992 graduate of the University of Maine, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in History. He earned his Masters of Education in Sports Management at Cleveland State University in 1996 while also serving as assistant coach.

As a player, Laughlin was a four year letter-winner for the Black Bears and the teams he played on were ranked among the top ten in the New England Region three of his four seasons in Orono. Pat captained the team as a senior, and over his career was named to the North Atlantic Conference All-Academic team in addition to receiving the University of Maine Scholar-Athlete Medallion three times.

Prior to Laughlin's arrival at Dean, he built a program at Champlain College, improving each season he was there to post a 28-21-3 record. The Beavers were Northeast Region Champions in 1997 and finalists in 1998 and 1999. As a Division I Assistant at Cleveland State University he acted as the recruiting and travel coordinator as well as assisted in preparing and initiating training sessions for the perennial Horizon League contenders.

Laughlin presently is a member of the Region I Olympic Development Program regional staff. He also coaches with the USL Super Y League. He holds a "B" Coaching License from the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) and an Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA).

"I'm excited to come to URI and to be able to be part of such a historically successful program," stated Laughlin. "Coach O'Connor and I both played under Jim Dyer at Maine so our basic coaching philosophies began under the same circumstances. I look forward to meshing the different things Gareth, Coach O'Connor and I bring to the table at here at Rhode Island."

Coach Laughlin's responsibilities include recruiting student-athletes as the program recruiting coordinator, purchasing team equipment and supplies, coordinating advanced scouting, alumni relations and assisting Coach O'Connor in the day to day operation of the program. Pat also trains the team in the technical components of the game in the winter and throughout the academic year.

FRANK BREGREN Director of Soccer Operations

Frank Bergren is longest tenured member of the Rams' staff, entering his eighth season in 2006. A graduate of the University of Rhode Island, he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education in 1975 and completed his Master's of Science degree from URI in 1981.

"I am so pleased with the fact that Frank has continued on as a member of our staff after Eddie's retirement" said Head Coach John O'Connor. "Coach Bergren brings a wealth of experience and knowledge in an area which is crucial to the success of the team and the program."

A native of Westerly, R.I., Bergren was the varsity boy's soccer coach at North Kingstown High School from 1995-1998. He joined the Rams' staff under former URI boss Ed Bradley in 1999 and has been a part of the program ever since. In addition to his work with Rhody men's soccer, he also serves as the department head for Physical Education and Health at Westerly High School where he has worked for 29 years.

Coach Bergren's responsibilities include coordinating pre-game warm-up as well as overseeing post-game recovery of the players. In cooperation with strength and conditioning Coach Doug Stone, he also assists in designing and implementation of the year-round fitness program for the student-athletes. He also coordinates video taping and post-game editing of matches for team review in addition to working with players who may not be a part of the traveling party.

Bergren holds an Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and is a United States Soccer Federation licensed coach. He has been a staff coach for the

Rhode Island boy's Olympic Development Program and is a former assistant director of the Connecticut Soccer School.

Frank resides in North Kingstown, R.I. in the village of Wickford, with his wife Wendy, son Skip and daughters Molly, a 2006 URI graduate and former URI women's soccer defender, and Emily who is a member of the Rhode Island class of 2008.

BEN SMITH Goalkeeper Coach

Ben Smith is in his second season as Volunteer Goalkeeper coach for the Rams' net minders. A 1992 graduate of Castleton State College, he received his Bachelor of Arts in Applied Mathematics. He also earned his Masters of Science degree in Industrial Engineering from the University of Massachusetts in 1995.





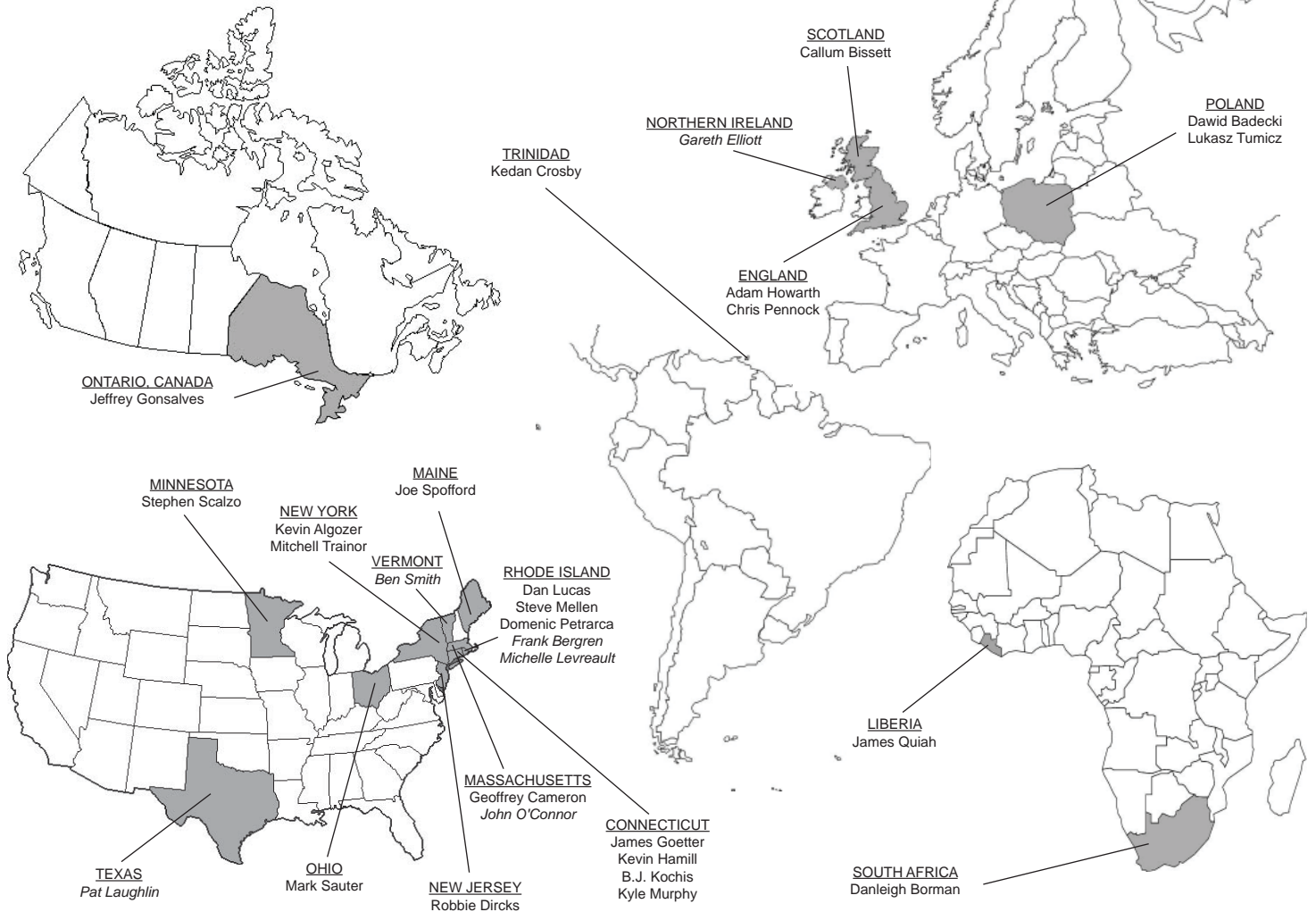
