No. 22/24 USC TO HOST No. 4 KANSAS AT THE GALEN CENTER ON SUNDAY MORNING

LOS ANGELES -- The No. 22/No. 24 USC men's basketball team (6-1) will face No. 4 Kansas (6-0) at the Galen Center at 11 a.m. on Dec. 2. USC has won six consecutive games since losing the season opener to Mercer on Nov. 10. The last time the Trojans won more consecutive games was from Nov. 25-Dec. 23, 2005 when they won nine in-a-row. The 6-1 start is USC's best since opening the 2000-01 season 8-0.

SCOUTING KANSAS -- No. 4 Kansas is 6-0 with wins against Louisiana-Monroe (107-78), UMKC (85-62), Washburn (92-60), Northern Arizona (87-46), Arizona (76-72 in OT) and Florida Atlantic (87-49), winning by an average margin of 27.8 points in the six home games. The Jayhawks went 33-5 in 2006-07 and return 13 lettermen, including four starters. Sophomore guard Sherron Collins was averaging a team-leading 16 points in the first two games, before suffering a left foot stress fracture. He had surgery on Nov. 12 and is expected to miss six week. Kansas has eight players averaging at least 7.2 points.

USC DEFEATS THE SOONERS -- USC defeated Oklahoma 66-55 on Nov. 29 at the Galen Center to register its first win at home this season. The Trojans held the Sooners to 25.0 percent shooting in the first half and opened up a 29-18 lead at the break. The lead got down to three points three times in the second half, but USC responded each time. Freshman Davon Jefferson led the way with a career-high 23 points and fellow freshman O.J. Mayo added 18, including scoring 11-straight points for the Trojans in the second half.

No. 3 MEMPHIS ON DECK AT THE JIMMY V CLASSIC -- No. 3 Memphis (6-0) is USC's opponent in the Jimmy V Classic to be held in Madison Square Garden in New York, NY on Dec. 4. The Tigers have wins over Tennessee-Martin, Richmond, Oklahoma, Connecticut, Arkansas State and Austin Peay. Memphis has won its games by an average of 18.7 points. Junior guard Chris Douglas-Roberts is averaging a team-leading 21.8 points, followed by freshman guard Derrick Rose, who has scored 17.0 points per game. Memphis returns 10 lettermen and all five starters from a team that went 33-4 in 2006-07.

THE HOME STRETCH -- After playing five of its first six games away from the Galen Center, USC is in the midst of playing five of six at home with the lone exception being the game vs. No. 3 Memphis at the Jimmy V Classic in Madison Square Garden on Dec. 4.

MAYO MAKING HIS MARK -- USC's O.J. Mayo has scored 149 points in his first seven games, the most by a Pac-10 freshman through seven games since the 1996-97 season, according to Stats, Inc. Oregon's Tajuan Porter had the second most with 141 points through his first seven games during his freshman season last year.

FACING THE BEST -- USC's 2007-08 schedule features four games against teams ranked in the top four in the country and 13 potential games against teams ranked in the ESPN/USA Today and AP preseason Top 25. USC's win over SIU on Nov. 25 gives them 11 wins over Top 25 teams in the last 3 seasons, tied for the 5th-most in the country with Texas and Ohio St., according to STATS, Inc. USC's 9 wins over ranked teams in the last two seasons are second only to UCLA's 12.

A RECORD START FOR FLOYD -- Tim Floyd posted a 42-25 record in his first two seasons as USC's head coach, the most wins by a Trojan coach in his first two seasons. Floyd has an impressive track record in the collegiate ranks along with his NBA experience. He brings 20 years of head coaching experience at the collegiate and NBA levels and owns a 291-156 record (6-1 in 2007-08) in his 15 seasons as a college head coach at Idaho (1987-88), New Orleans (1989-94), Iowa State (1995-98) and USC (2005-07). Nine of his first 14 seasons, Floyd has taken his team into the postseason (6 NCAA, 3 NIT). Floyd has helped the development of his student-athletes at each stop, as 12 players in his 14 years have made it to the NBA, including three players that did not even play high school ball.

KEEP AN EYE ON GIBSON -- USC sophomore forward Taj Gibson was one of 50 men's basketball players selected to the preseason Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy lists, the early front-runners for college basketball's coveted trophies. Gibson is USC's leading returning scorer and rebounder, averaging 12.2 points and 8.7 rebounds last season. He set two school freshman records last season with 321 rebounds and 69 blocked shots.

THE RETURNS ARE IN... -- Last season USC entered the season with the leading returning point production (83.7 percent) and rebounding (86.5 percent) among Pac-10 teams. This season, USC ranks last in the conference in returning scoring (40.2 percent) and eighth in rebounding (63.6 percent). The Trojans also return just 17.4 percent of their three-point scoring, 10th in the Pac-10. Despite being just a sophomore, Taj Gibson entered the season with the eighth-most career blocks (69) among Pac-10 players.

A HISTORY OF WINNING -- The Trojans have compiled a record of 1,422-1,018 in their first 102 years of intercollegiate basketball competition. The Trojans have had a .500 or better record in 72 of the first 101 seasons.

2006-07 SEASON IN REVIEW -- The Trojans were coming off a 17-13 season in 2005-06 and were anchored by veterans Nick Young (Jr.), Gabe Pruitt (Jr.) and Lodrick Stewart (Sr.) each reaching the 1,000 points scored plateau during the season. The Trojans went 10-2 in their first 12 games, with an overtime loss to South Carolina in the season and Galen Center opener and a 10-point loss at Kansas. USC defeated then No. 8 Wichita St. in the LV Classic and followed that up with a double-OT win against No. 14 Washington to begin conference play. USC made it three consecutive wins over a ranked opponent when they won in early January at Oregon, handing the Ducks their first loss of the season. USC did not lose consecutive games all season until the final two regular season games at Washington and Washington State. USC advanced to the Pac-10 finals with wins over Washington State and Stanford, before falling to Oregon in the championship game. USC cruised to victories over Arkansas (77-60) and Texas (87-68) in the NCAA Tournament, before losing to North Carolina in the East Regional semi-finals, 74-64.

TROJAN TIDBITS -- USC does not have a senior on the roster...USC has a preseason Wooden Award and Naismith Award candidate (Taj Gibson) for the first time since 2001 when Sam Clancy and David Bluthenthal were Wooden Award candidates and Clancy was a Naismith candidate...Gibson is also ranked as the No. 10 center in the country by The Sporting News and the No. 7 center by Lindy's...Gibson has been named a preseason third-team All-American by Rivals. O.J. Mayo is on the Bob Cousy Award candidates watch list and is rated the No. 2 point guard by The Sporting News and the No. 7 point guard by Lindy's. He also was named a preseason first-team All-American and picked as the Player of the Year by ESPN's Andy Katz and ESPN's Doug Gottlieb listed Mayo as a first-team preseason All-American. Mayo has also been selected by Collegenhoops.next as the preseason Freshman of the Year.

PAC-10 PRESEASON RANKINGS -- The Trojans were picked to finish in sixth place in the Pac-10 conference this season, according to a poll of media members who cover Pac-10 men's basketball. UCLA was picked to win the conference with 339 votes, followed by Washington State (273), Oregon (240), Arizona (238), Stanford (205), USC (184), California (140), Washington (132), Arizona State (81) and Oregon State (38). Last season, USC was a preseason No. 6 pick in the conference and finished tied for third.

INJURY UPDATES -- Freshman forward Mamadou Diarra had surgery on his groin on Nov. 5. He returned to practice this week. Kyle Austin injured his back (spasms) on Nov. 21 and has not practiced since. Marcus Simmons has been battling a high ankle sprain and has been held out of practice. He did not play at the Anaheim Classic on Thursday vs. Oklahoma.

FAMILIAR FACE..LITERALLY AND FIGURATIVELY. -- Kansas senior guard Rodrick Stewart began his career at USC with his identical twin brother Lodrick, but transferred to Kansas after their freshman season (2003-04). Rodrick started 17 games his freshman season at USC and averaged 4.4 points per contest. Lodrick remained at USC all four seasons and left USC after last season as the school's all-time leader in three-point baskets made with 232.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The Trojans have 5 players from California, 2 from Louisiana and one each from Minnesota, New York, West Virginia, Tennessee, New Mexico, Canada, Italy and Mali.

HACKETT'S TRIPLE-DOUBLE EARNS HIM TSN'S PLAYER OF THE WEEK -- Guard Daniel Hackett was named The Sporting News National Player of the Week for the week of Nov. 12-18, as he averaged 21.5 points, 6.5 assists and 5.5 rebounds, while making 71.4 percent of his shots. Hackett, who had missed six weeks with a broken jaw which was wired shut until Nov. 9 and returned to full practice for the first time on Nov. 12, scored a career high 21 points in his first game back in the 74-47 win at The Citadel on Nov. 15 and followed that up with a new career best of 22 points in the 85-75 win at South Carolina on Nov. 17. In the South Carolina game, Hackett also had career highs in rebounds (10) and assists (10) for a rare triple-double, the first by a Trojan player in at least 30 seasons.

DYNAMIC DEBUT FOR MAYO -- O.J. Mayo scored 32 points in his collegiate debut on Nov. 10 vs. Mercer, a new USC record for a freshman in his first collegiate game. His 32-point total also are the sixth-most by a Trojan freshman in a single game, with the record being 39 by Cliff Robinson on Feb. 2, 1978 vs. California. The 32 points scored by Mayo were also the most in a game by a player in the two-year history of the Galen Center.

YOUTH WILL BE SERVED -- On a roster that features no seniors and just three juniors, the Trojans will be relying on the underclassmen to handle much of the scoring. In the first seven games, USC's freshmen scored 262 of the 493 points (53.2 percent) and the freshman and sophomores accounted for 477 of the 493 points (96.8 percent). The 96.8 percent of the team's scoring coming from underclassmen is the highest in the country, followed by Western Carolina at 91.4 percent and Wake Forest at 87.2 percent, according to Stats, Inc.

GIBSON IS DOUBLE TROUBLE -- Sophomore forward Taj Gibson had 20 points and 12 rebounds in the 60-50 win vs. San Diego on Nov. 22, his second double-double of the season. He also had 13 points and 14 rebounds in the game vs. Mercer on Nov. 10. He now has 13 career double-doubles (points and rebounds) in 44 collegiate games (29.5 percent).

LOUISIANA LIGHTNING -- Trojan sophomore guard Dwight Lewis, who grew up in Metairie, La. but was uprooted by hurricane Katrina to Katy, Texas, scored a career-best 18 points in the win at South Carolina on Nov. 17. He has scored in double-figures in five of seven games this season. Lewis reached double-figures in scoring eight times in his freshman season.

NOTHING FREE AT THE LINE -- USC has shot under 60 percent from the free throw line in three of seven games this season. In the last game vs. Oklahoma, USC made 72.0 percent of its shots from the charity stripe (18-for-25). USC's best game from the line was on Nov. 17 at South Carolina when they made 23 of 27 free throws (85.2 percent). In the first seven games, the Trojans have hit just 66.9 percent of their free throws (107-for-160). Last season as a team USC hit 71.5 percent of its free throws, its best mark since hitting 71.8 percent from the charity stripe in 1984. USC has nearly doubled its opponents free throw attempts (160-81) in the first seven games.

NO MERCY FROM MERCER -- USC's first-game opponent Mercer shot 59.4 percent (38-for-64) from the field on Nov. 10 at the Galen Center. It was the highest shooting percentage in a game by a Trojan foe since UCLA made 60.7 percent of its shots on Feb. 24, 2005.

THE DEFENSE RESTS -- The 96 points allowed and 59.4 shooting percentage by Mercer in the first game were quite an aberration for Tim Floyd's teams since he arrived on the USC campus. Last season, USC held 21 of 37 opponents to under 40 percent shooting and 27 of 37 to under 42 percent from the floor. In the first two seasons of the Tim Floyd era, the Trojans held 31 of 67 opponents to 40 percent or less from the floor. The fact that USC was outshot from the floor (59.4 percent to 40 percent) was also out of the ordinary. Last year the Trojans shot better than their opponents in 31 of 37 games. The 96 points was also the most points by an opponent since Tim Floyd became USC's head coach for the 2005-06 season. USC out-shot Oklahoma 44.2 percent to 35.6 percent on Nov. 29 and held them to 55 points, the 23rd opponent in Tim Floyd's first 74 games as USC's head coach held under 60 points. The Trojans have held five of their seven opponents this season to under 37.7 percent shooting or less, making it 36 times in the first 74 games (48.6 percent) under Floyd that USC has held its opponent to under 40 percent shooting.

GIBSON MOVES UP THE CHARTS -- Sophomore Taj Gibson had six blocks on Nov. 16 at The Citadel, the most since he had a career-high seven blocks on Jan. 4, 2007 at Oregon, which had tied for the fourth most in a game by a Trojan. He has 84 career blocks which rank him seventh on USC's all-time shot block list. Avondre Jones is sixth with 101 career blocks as a Trojan.

TROJAN TV ALL-ACCESS -- USC is offering live online video streaming of four remaining untelevised games to subscribers of TrojanTV All-Access, while others will be able to access these special online events on a pay-per-view basis. Each game will be available live and on-demand. Current subscribers to TrojanTV All-Access will receive all five broadcasts for FREE as part of their subscription package. Non-subscribers have two options to purchase the games. Each game will be available for a single-game pay-per-view price of \$4.99. Fans can also purchase all four broadcasts for a price of \$19.99. Annual subscriptions to TrojanTV All-Access are \$99.95 for a 12-month subscription, while a monthly renewable subscription is just \$9.95. The remaining games to be offered exclusively on Trojan TV All-Access are Dec. 8 vs. Fresno Pacific (Exhibition), Dec. 17 vs. Delaware State, Dec. 22 vs. Cal Poly and Dec. 29 vs. UC Riverside.

DAVON CALLING -- Trojan freshman forward Davon Jefferson, a five-star recruit from Lynwood, Calif., played in his first game on Nov. 22 vs San Diego and scored five points in 19 minutes and hasn't slowed down since. Jefferson had his early season progress slowed due to a left knee injury in the preseason. In his second game on Nov. 23 vs. Miami (OH), he had seven points and a block. He then led USC with 20 points, grabbed five rebounds and had two steals in the Anaheim Classic finals win over Southern Illinois on Nov. 25. On Nov. 29 vs. Oklahoma, Jefferson made his first career start and poured in 23 points, grabbed nine rebounds and had two blocks.

MAYO NAMED ANAHEIM CLASSIC MVP -- USC's O.J. Mayo was named the MVP of the Anaheim Classic as he averaged 18.0 points and 3.7 rebounds helping lead USC to the title with wins over San Diego, Miami (OH) and Southern Illinois.

TOUGH TERRAIN FOR TROJANS -- USC is in a stretch of playing three of four games against ranked opponents, which began with a 70-45 win over No. 19 Southern Illinois. USC then defeated Big 12 power Oklahoma (66-55) in a Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series Game. Today USC hosts No. 4 Kansas (6-0) and then will travel to New York City to play No. 3 Memphis (6-0) in the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden on Dec. 4. In all, beginning with the first game of the Anaheim Classic on Nov. 22, the Trojans are playing six games in 13 days with four of the opponents being 2006-07 NCAA Tournament teams.

ROAD WARRIORS -- With wins at The Citadel and at South Carolina, USC is 2-0 on the road to start the season for just the second time in the last seven seasons, the other time being 2005-06. The Trojans were 4-6 in their 10 road games last season, 4-5 in conference on the road, with a non-conference loss at Kansas.

GREAT START FOR MAYO -- O.J. Mayo has scored in double figures in all seven games this season. The last Trojan to begin his career with more consecutive double-digit scoring efforts was Tom Lewis in the 1985-86 season, when he reached double figures in scoring in his first nine games as a freshman.

SCORING IS OVERRATED... -- USC won back-to-back games when they scored 60 or fewer points, first defeating San Diego 60-50 on Nov. 22 and then Miami (OH) 57-53 on Nov. 23. It was the first time the Trojans had won consecutive games when scoring 60 points or less since winning 58-56 in two overtimes at California on Dec. 23, 1987 and 53-47 vs. Western Kentucky on Dec. 28, 1987.

STINGY DEFENSE -- USC has held its last four opponents to 55 points or less and to an average of 50.8 (203 total) points per game. If you add in the 74-47 win at The Citadel, USC has held five of seven teams it has faced to 55 points or less.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES -- USC is 3-0 in games decided by 10 points or fewer this season, twice winning by 10 points (at South Carolina and vs. San Diego) and by four points (Miami). In head coach Tim Floyd's first two-plus seasons at USC, the Trojans have played 39 games decided by 10 points or less and have won 26 of them (66.7 percent).

TROJANS CAPTURE ANAHEIM CLASSIC TITLE -- USC defeated No. 19 Southern Illinois 70-45 on Nov. 25 to capture the inaugural Anaheim Classic title at the Anaheim Convention Center. USC shot 59.5 percent from the floor, while holding the Salukis to 32.7 percent shooting. Davon Jefferson led the Trojans with 20 points. Southern Illinois had defeated its first three opponents by an average of 18.7 points. USC's 70 points marked just the third time in the last 40 games that SIU had allowed 70 or more points. USC had defeated San Diego (60-50) in the first round and Miami of Ohio (57-53) in the semi-finals. O.J. Mayo was named tournament MVP.

THE 2007-08 TROJANS -- USC returns two starters from a team that set a school record with 25 wins (25-12) and advanced to the 2007 NCAA's "Sweet 16." The Trojans were 11-7 in conference, good for a third-place tie. USC lost its top three scorers and nearly 44 points per game in Nick Young (NBA - Washington), Gabe Pruitt (NBA - Boston/Utah DL) and Lodrick Stewart (Anaheim DL), but does return 2006-07 Pac-10 All-Freshman Team forward Taj Gibson and guards Dwight Lewis and Daniel Hackett, who combined to make 27 starts. In addition, USC has added a top-rated recruiting class featuring the much-heralded O.J. Mayo and five-star recruit Davon Jefferson, so they will be talented, but very young. The Trojan roster features seven freshmen, five sophomores and three juniors.

The Trojans began their third consecutive season with a home loss, falling 96-81 vs. Mercer at the Galen Center. The Bears came out with a hot hand, taking the lead for good at 8-6, and building a 21-point lead before settling for a 17-point bulge at the half, 47-30. USC, behind much-heralded freshman O.J. Mayo mounted a second-half rally, cutting the lead to 55-52 with 12:50 to go in the half, with Mayo scoring 11 points in the run. Mercer responded by scoring the next six points and took a 10-point lead with 7:15 to go in the game and held a double-digit lead the rest of the way. Mayo finished with a USC freshman debut-record 32 points, also establishing a new Galen Center record for points in a game. Taj Gibson had 13 points and 14 rebounds for his 12th career double-double.
