## NO. 4 USC MEN'S VOLLEYBALL HOSTS NO. 15 UC SANTA BARBARA, NO. 3 UCLA

### THE FACTS

The No. 4-ranked USC men's volleyball team (4-3 overall, 3-3 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation) returns home after a 2-week road trip to host No. 15 UC Santa Barbara (2-5, 0-3) on Wednesday (Feb. 1) at 7:30 p.m. and then No. 3 UCLA (9-1, 4-0) on Friday (Feb. 3) at 7 p.m. in retiring Bruin head coach Al Scates' final regular season visit to USC in his 50-year career. Both MPSF matches will be held in the Galen Center.

### ON THE INTERNET

All of USC's home matches will be video- and audiocast on USCTrojans.com, with ex-Trojan player and assistant coach Mark Beltran, former USC player Dustin Avol and onetime Northeastern player/Winthrop assistant coach Paul Duchesne alternating announcing duties. USC's road matches will be audiocast on USCTrojans.com. Live stats for home matches will be on USCTrojans.com.

### RANKINGS

USC is ranked fourth in both the current AVCA Division I-II Top 15 poll and the Volleyball Magazine Top 10 poll. UCLA is third and second, respectively. UC Santa Barbara is 15th in the AVCA poll, but not ranked by Volleyball Magazine.

### OPPONENTS

USC is 50-47 all-time against UC Santa Barbara, but has lost the last 2 meetings (last year in the final of the MPSF Tournament and the semifinal of the NCAA Final Four) after having beaten the Gauchos in the previous 6 matches. USC trails in its series with UCLA, 86-39, but the Trojans have won the past 5 meetings and 8 of the past 9 to give USC head coach Bill Ferguson a 9-2 record over legendary Bruin head coach Al Scates. UCLA plays at Pepperdine on Wednesday (Feb. 1) before playing UCLA.

### LAST MATCHES

No. 2 UC Irvine beat No. 5 USC in 4 sets, 25-17, 23-25, 25-21, 25-16, in an MPSF road match on Jan. 27. Tony Ciarelli had 14 kills for USC, while Jeff Carlson added 12 kills (hitting .304) and 7 digs and Henry Cassidy had 10 digs. The Anteaters hit .333 to USC's .234 and had more blocks (13.0 to 4.0) and aces (8 to 3). USC fell behind 6-3 in the first set and could never catch up as UCI hit .591 to Troy's .290. The second set was tied at 23-23 before a Steven Shandrick kill and an Anteater hitting error gave the win to the Trojans, who hit .417 to UCI's .118. UC Irvine scored 4 consecutive points in the third set to build a comfortable 21-17 lead and was never threatened while hitting .364 to USC's .042. The fourth set was tight midway through before a 5-0 UCI run gave the Anteaters all the cushion it needed at 22-15. On Jan. 28, Tanner Jensen had 14 kills while hitting .417 to lead USC to a 25-21, 25-14, 27-25 sweep at UC San Diego in an MPSF match to break Troy's 3-match losing skid. The Trojans hit .309 in the match to UCSD's .122 and had more digs (32 to 24) and blocks (9.0 to 5.0). Ciarelli added 9 kills and 2 aces for Troy, while Robert Feathers had 7 blocks and Cassidy had 8 digs. USC led the first set 22-21 before the Tritons committed a service error and 2 attack errors to close the set as Troy hit .391. The Trojans rolled off 8 consecutive points to build a 17-11 lead in the second set and were never threatened while hitting .500. USC crept back from a 17-13 deficit in the third set to build a 23-21 lead, but UCSD scored the next 2 points and even led 25-24 before a Ciarelli kill and a pair of Triton attack errors finished the match.

**2012 NCAAS AT GALEN CENTER**

USC is hosting the 2012 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championships for the first time ever. The tourney, featuring the nation's top 4 teams, will be held May 3 and 5 at the Galen Center. USC, which has appeared in 2 of the past 3 NCAA Championships, has made 13 Final Four appearances, with 4 NCAA titles, 7 runner-up finishes and placing third twice.

**RETIRED JERSEYS**

Two former Trojan men's volleyball greats—**Steve Timmons (#6)** and **Adam Johnson (#9)**--will have their jerseys retired after the March 2 match versus Hawaii. Timmons (1980-82), with his trademark redheaded flat top, was one of volleyball's most potent hitters as he perfected the back row attack. He played on USC's 1980 NCAA championship squad and was an All-American first teamer in 1982. He then starred indoors internationally and on the beach. He won Olympic gold medals in 1984 and 1988 and a bronze in 1992 (becoming the first American male to win 3 volleyball medals). He was a starter for the U.S. team that won the first-ever "Triple Crown" of volleyball: the 1984 Olympics, 1985 World Cup and 1986 World Championships. He was inducted into the U.S. Volleyball Association Hall of Fame in 1998 and the USC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2001. Johnson (1984-87), who in 1986 became USC's first-ever College Player of the Year, was an All-American first team pick his final 3 seasons (becoming USC's second 3-time All-American first teamer). He led Troy to 3 consecutive NCAA Finals appearances (1985, 86, 87). He then became a star on the beach, winning 44 tourneys and more than \$1.6 million in a 13-year career. They will join ex-Trojan luminaries Tim Hovland, Bob Yoder, Celso Kalache and Dusty Dvorak with banners hanging in the Galen Center commemorating their retired jerseys.

**CIARELLI**

USC is led in 2012 by powerful 6-6 senior outside hitter **Tony Ciarelli**, a co-captain who is one of the nation's most dynamic players. The 2-time All-American second teamer has recorded 1,323 kills, 570 digs, 231 blocks and 112 aces in his 4-year starting career. He was named a 2012 pre-season All-American first teamer by the Off The Block website. Last season, he was second on the Trojans in kills (350) and aces (36), tied for third in blocks (64) and was fourth in digs (142) while hitting .317. He spent this past summer competing internationally (at the Pan American Games with the U.S. Men's National Team) and on the beach (at the World University Games). In 2010, he had 406 kills, 194 digs and 73 blocks while leading USC in aces (38). In

2009, he was an All-American second teamer and the National Freshman of the Year.

### SHANDRICK

USC's only other senior in 2012 is 6-7 middle blocker **Steven Shandrlick**, also a co-captain. He was named a 2012 pre-season All-American second teamer by the Off The Block website. As a starter last spring, he led the Trojans in blocks (104) and topped USC's regulars in hitting percentage (.500) while getting 169 kills, 30 digs and 12 aces. He hit .430 in 2010 with a 1.25 block average (a USC rally scoring era record).

### CASSIDAY

USC's third returning starter in 2012 is 6-3 sophomore libero **Henry Cassiday**. He was named a 2012 pre-season All-American second teamer by the Off The Block website. He was the team's leader in digs (257) while tying for third nationally in dig average (2.62) and he had just 18 receptions errors on 579 attempts in 2011. He was an All-American third teamer last year and made the MPSF All-Freshman

team. This past summer, he started for the U.S. Junior National Team that placed fourth at the 2011 FIVB Junior World Championship (claiming its highest finish ever).

### BATTLING AT OPPOSITE

Looking to take over at opposite hitter in 2012 are a pair of 6-5 players: junior **Maddison McKibbin** and sophomore **Tanner Jansen**. McKibbin, a tested lefty, has 18 career starts at 3 positions (opposite, outside and libero). He has been bothered early in 2012 by an ankle sprain. Last year, he played on the outside, seeing action in 15 matches (with 5 starts, including the season's first 3 contests). In 2010, he made the MPSF All-Freshman team. Three of his relatives have played volleyball at USC, including older brother Riley. Jansen was impressive in the 3 matches he played last year (he hit .438 while starting twice). He redshirted in 2010.

### OTHER RETURNERS

Three other Trojans on the 2012 roster have notched playing time—albeit limited—in their careers. **Jeff Carlson**, a 6-3 junior,

has appeared in 18 career matches as a backup setter. An accomplished beach player (he teamed with Ciarelli at the World University Games last summer), he also is working at outside hitter this season. He redshirted in 2010 while recuperating from a shoulder injury after seeing action in just 3 matches in 2009. Junior **Steven Mochalski**, a 6-6 outside hitter, has seen action in 18 career matches (he redshirted in 2010), while 6-3 soph setter **Chris Trefzger** has played in 6 career matches (all in 2010) but redshirted last season. Also returning are 3 young players who entered the 2012 season having yet to step on the court: sophomores **J.B. Green**, a 6-0 libero who also has played football at USC, and 6-2 setter **Tyler Hornacek**, and 6-5 redshirt freshman outside hitter **Joey Booth**. Then there is 6-3 redshirt freshman libero-outside hitter **Paul Yoder**, who played club volleyball at USC last year. He is one of 6 Yoders to have played in college, including 4 at USC.

### THE FRESHMEN

USC's 2012 starting lineup could include several members of its talented 8-player true freshman class:

### USC HEAD COACH BILL FERGUSON

It took sixth-year USC men's volleyball head coach **Bill Ferguson**, one of the game's top young coaches, just a short time to put the Trojans back on the volleyball map. He has a **89-61 career record** at USC, with 2 trips to the NCAA Championships, an MPSF tourney title and an MPSF regular season crown. He has gone 9-2 against crosstown rival UCLA.

In **2011**, he was named **MPSF Coach of the Year** as his fifth USC team went 23-4 (USC's most wins since 1999) and advanced to the NCAA Final Four for the second time in 3 years, where it fell in the semifinals. The Trojans went 20-2 in the MPSF (their most league victories since 1986), won their first MPSF regular season title since 1999 (the first outright since 1991) and were the runner-up in the MPSF tourney. USC was ranked No. 1 nationally the entire season until finished third in the final poll. Along the way, the Trojans won 12 consecutive matches (their longest streak since a school-record 30 in 1990-91), 17 straight home matches (their longest streak since a school-record 19 in 1999-2001) and 11 MPSF matches in a row (their most since 18 in 1991-92). Thirteen of USC's wins were 3-0 sweeps. The team's first 3 losses of 2011 came in 5 sets. USC led the nation in kills (14.16), digs (9.76) and assists (13.35) and its .351 hitting percentage was a school rally scoring era record. The Trojans snapped a 17-match losing streak to Cal State Northridge and held UCLA to its fewest total (55) and set (12) points against USC in the rally scoring era that began in 2001.

In **2010** in his fourth Trojan campaign, his team was 16-11 overall and 13-9 in the MPSF (sixth place). USC began the season No. 1 in the AVCA poll (its first pre-season top ranking since 1991 and its first No. 1 ranking anytime since late in 2000). Troy held that top spot for

the first 4 polls while off to a 6-1 overall start and 4-0 MPSF start (its best starts since 2000). USC appeared in its fourth consecutive MPSF tourney, its longest streak since going 7 straight from 1989 to 1995.

In **2009**, he was named the **AVCA and VBall Magazine National Coach of the Year** as he guided the Trojans to a 21-11 overall mark (USC's most overall wins since 2001) and a fifth-place tie in the MPSF at 13-9 (USC's most MPSF victories since 1999). USC won its first-ever MPSF Tournament title. His Trojans defeated 7 Top 6-ranked teams. He guided USC into the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1991, where it lost in 5 sets in the final. He also helped USC to the MPSF tourney final for the first time since 1999 and its first back-to-back-to-back appearances in the MPSF tournament since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001, as well as to its highest national ranking (second) since 2000. USC's 5-match early-season winning streak was its longest since 2001. USC posted its first back-to-back wins over BYU since 1997-98 and snapped a 14-match losing skid to the Cougars that stretched to 2001. His Trojans posted a third consecutive victory over UCLA, USC's longest such streak over the Bruins since getting 4 in a row in 1980-81. With a 3-0 win over UC Irvine in the MPSF tourney semis, USC snapped a 10-match losing streak to the Anteaters that stretched to 2004 and was the Trojans' first win at Irvine since 2000. USC also won a pair of pre-season tourneys (in Canada and Hawaii).

In **2008**, he led USC to its most overall and league wins since 2001 and its first back-to-back appearances in the MPSF tournament since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001. USC was 13-16 overall and 10-12 for eighth place in the MPSF. His Trojans swept UCLA, the first time USC defeated the Bruins twice in a row since 1991 and the first time since 1990 that USC recorded consecutive wins at Pauley

Pavilion. And his squad had a 5-game victory at Pepperdine (USC's first victory in Malibu since 1999, snapping a 9-match losing streak there).

In **2007**, his first season as head coach, he guided USC to its best season in 6 years. The Trojans had their most overall (12-16) and MPSF (9-13) wins, their highest MPSF finish (eighth) and their first appearance in the MPSF tournament since 2001. USC beat UCLA at Pauley Pavilion for the first time since 2000 and the 3-0 win was its first sweep over the Bruins since 1991. Troy also snapped a 12-match losing streak to Hawaii and did so in Honolulu, its first win there since 1999.

In the summer of 2006, he was the head coach of the 2006 USA Volleyball Men's Junior National A2 team. He also coached the Southern California Volleyball Club 17 boys team to a gold medal at the 2011 Junior Olympics.

Ferguson, 41, was an assistant at USC in 2006. This is his second stint at USC, as he also was an assistant for 2 years (1997-98).

He was one of the nation's most successful junior volleyball coaches and club directors before returning to USC in the summer of 2005. In his 15 years of coaching experience at the club level (Santa Monica Beach Club, Reebok Palisades Club, Los Angeles Athletic Club and Southern California Volleyball Club), he coached teams to 19 medals (including 12 golds) at national championships and the clubs he directed won 31 medals.

Ferguson played for Palisades High in Pacific Palisades (Calif.), where he was on the 1988 L.A. City championship team. He then took a 2-year hiatus from volleyball. While enrolled at Santa Monica (Calif.) College, he pursued a competitive surfing career.

He and his wife, the former Brenn Larson, who played at Washington State and UCLA, have a daughter, Blake, 1.

--**Micah Christenson**, a 6-5 setter from Kamehameha-Kapalama High in Honolulu (Hi.), is one of the most decorated players ever from Hawaii and could transition immediately into a starting job at USC. A 2-time prep All-American, he was the state's Player of the Year in both volleyball and basketball while leading his team to state titles in both sports. He started for the U.S. Youth National and Junior National teams the past 4 years, helping the Junior National squad to a best-ever fourth place at the 2011 FIVB Junior World Championship (joining Cassidy in the starting lineup).

--A pair of 6-6 freshmen join the mix at outside hitter: **Cristian Rivera** of Colegio San Jose in Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico, and **Austin Rysyk** of Bellarmine Prep in San Jose (Calif.). Rivera, who guided his high school to 2 Puerto Rican championships, has significant international experience while representing his country in the Pan American Cup, FIVB Junior World Championship and FIVB Youth World Championship this past summer (he was the final cut on Puerto Rico's 2011 World League roster). Rysyk, coming off summer knee surgery, led Bellarmine to a pair of CIF Central Coast Section Division I titles.

--Three frosh middle blockers look to earn a starting role: 6-8 **Robert Feathers** of Loyola High in Los Angeles (Calif.), 6-8 **Chris Lischke** of DeSmet High in St. Louis (Mo.) and 6-5 **Ben Lam** of Punahou High in Honolulu (Hi.). Feathers was an All-CIF Division I first teamer in 2011 and was a member of Loyola's 2009 and 2010 squads that won CIF Southern Section Division I titles (the 2009 team also captured the state crown and was ranked No. 1 nationally). He played on the 2009 U.S. Youth National team at the FIVB Youth World Championship and won gold medals at the 2008 and 2010 Junior Olympics. Lischke, who didn't play volleyball last year while at a JC, helped DeSmet to the 2009 state Class 4 title. Lam was on Punahou's 2009 and 2010 state championship teams and was a 2-time All-State selection.

--6-6 freshman middle blocker **Tyler Cundiff** of Iolani High in Honolulu (Hi.) will redshirt in 2012. He made various All-State teams in 2010 and 2011.

--Available at setter or opposite hitter is 6-2 freshman **Robbie McKnight** of Laguna Beach (Calif.) High, a 2-time All-CIF Division II first teamer and 2-time gold medalist at the Junior Olympics.

#### NEW ASSISTANT

**Cameron Green**, who spent the past 3 seasons with the USC men's volleyball team, returned to Troy in late January of the 2012 season to serve as an assistant coach. He replaces J.J. Riley, who left to become an assistant with the Utah women's program. He was a volunteer assistant coach in 2011

after being an administrative assistant for 2 seasons (2009-10). Green, 37, is a long-time successful club, high school and beach coach. He has coached with the Southern California Volleyball Club since 2007, serving as its director since 2010. His boys' 17 team won bronze medals at the 2011 and 2009 Junior Olympics. He was the owner, administrator and head coach of X Volleyball Club from 2003 to 2007. From 2000 to 2006, he coached boys' teams with the LBC Volleyball Club, winning gold medals at the 2001 (13s) and 2004 (16s) Junior Olympics and a silver in 2002. He also coached boys' teams with Club Manhattan (2000-01), South Coast Volleyball Club (1995-98) and Torrance Volleyball Club (1993).
