GAME #7: The USD Toreros (3-0 PFL, 4-2), under the direction of first year head coach **Dale Lindsey**, head to the midwest this weekend to take on the Dayton Flyers (2-1 PFL, 4-2). Game time is 3:00 p.m. (PDT) in Dayton, Ohio at Welcome Stadium (11,000 seats).

SERIES RECORD: This will be the 21st meeting between USD and Dayton with the Flyers owning a commanding 14-6 series advantage... The Toreros have won the last two meetings, including last year's 41-9 outcome in San Diego on October 27th... **Mason Mills** set a school record with 511 passing yards, while WR **Sam Hoekstra** set a school record with 246 receiving yards... Mills finished the day 31-41 for 511 yards and 4 TDs; Hoekstra had 11 receptions for 246 yards and 1 score... The Torero defense hounded Dayton quarterback Will Bardo all evening, holding him to 70 yards on 8-of-26 passing... Two seasons ago (Nov. 5, 2011) USD escaped with a 31-28 road win over the UD Flyers.

WEBCAST/VIDEO STREAM: Saturday's contest will be webcast with **Jack Cronin** (play-by-play) bringing you all the action. The pre-game begins at 2:50 p.m. (PDT). Additionally, a video feed and live stats can be found at www.daytonflyers.com.

A LOOKAHEAD: The Toreros return to Walter J. Zable Field at Torero Stadium on Saturday, October 26th against the Butler Bulldogs. Game time is slated for 1:00 pm.

LAST & OLIARO EARN PFL RECOGNITION: Senior DE **Blake Oliaro** and sophomore kicker **David Last** were named PFL Players of the Week for their performances in the Toreros' thrilling 35-33 come from behind victory over Marist. Last was named Special Teams Player of the Week for hitting the game-winning 28-yard field goal to seal the Toreros' victory. The game-winner came on Last's second opportunity - his 33-yard kick as time expired missed but the Red Foxes were penalized for running into Last, giving him a second chance with zeros on the clock. Last also had a 32-yard first-quarter field goal and went 3-for-4 on PAT's. He also handled kickoff duties, booting six kickoffs, an average of 64.2 yards, including a trio of touchbacks. Oliaro was named Co-Defensive Player of the Week, for his stat-stuffing performance. Oliaro provided San Diego's first points of the day when he sacked Marist quarterback Chuckie Looney in his own endzone for a safety. He finished the game with a team-best 10 tackles, nine of those solo stops. He also had two tackles for loss that were both quarterback sacks, including the first-quarter safety that went as a seven-yard loss in the book. Oliaro shares the honor with Drake's Taylor Coleman, who had eight tackles (three for loss) and a sack to help

the Bulldogs to a 27-6 victory over Davidson.



TORERO TIDBITS: USD will enter Saturday's game owning a PFL-best nine straight league wins (home and away) dating back to last season... Among PFL teams, USD ranks first in total offense (491.7), pass efficiency (167.6), third down conversions (34-75, 45.3%) and field goals (8-8, 1.000)... Among PFL players for all games, **Mason Mills** ranks first in total offense (297.8), passing yards per game (313.8) and pass efficiency (169.1 rating); **Ryan Belden** ranks 1st in punting (44.0 average); **Blake Oliaro** ranks 1st in tackles for loss (1.50 per game); **Reggie Bell** ranks 2nd in receptions per game (5.8 catches; 35 receptions) and receiving yards per game (107.0; 642 yards); **David Last** ranks 2nd in scoring (8.2 ppg; 49 points) and field goals made per game (1.33; 8-for-8)... Toreros listed among FCS leaders include: **Mason Mills** is #6 in pass efficiency (169.1), #7 in completion percentage (.679) and passing yards per game (313.8), #9 in passing yards (1,883), #11 in total offense (297.8) and passing yards per completion (14.16), and #13 in completions per game (22.17); **Blake Oliaro** is #17 in sacks per game (0.8) and #18 in tackles for loss per game (1.5); **Ryan Belden** is #9 in punting (44.0), and **Reggie Bell** is #7 in receiving yards per game (107.0) and #9 in total receiving yards (642).

MILLS CLOSING IN ON ANOTHER PASSING RECORD: Senior QB **Mason Mills**, who was recognized by the San Diego Hall of Champions as a star of the month for September, is closing in on another all-time USD passing record... Already the program's all-time leader in completions (764) and attempts (1,144), Mills needs just 181 more yards of passing to knock off Josh Johnson's school record of 9,699... Mills, currently with 9,519 yards, passed by Johnson's previous marks for completions (724) and attempts (1,065) in earlier contests this season... With 74 career touchdown passes, Mills needs just two more touchdown passes to move into the #2 spot ahead of Eric Rasmussen (75; 2000-2003)... Josh Johnson, currently in his 6th year in the NFL and first year with Cincinnati, owns the school mark with 113 touchdown passes.

JAMES CRACKS 2,000 YARDS IN RUSHING: Senior running back **Kenn James** (San Diego, Calif.) continues to be the team's top rusher with 451 yards on just 62 carries (7.3 yards per carry average)... With his 32-yard effort against Marist last Saturday, James cracked the 2,000 yard barrier... He now owns 2,029 career rushing yards which ranks 7th all-time at USD... Holding down the 6th spot is Joe Henry (2,085 yards from 1978-81)... The all-time mark for rushing yards is held by current USD football radio analyst JT Rogan (3,559 yards from 2005-09).

BELDEN TOP PUNTER IN PFL: Freshman punter **Ryan Belden** (Diamond Bar, Calif.) ranks #1 among PFL punters, and is 9th overall in the FCS with his 44.0 yards per punt average... He owns five punts of 50+ yards, and has 7 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line... Two Saturdays ago against Mercer he boomed an 80-yarder and finished the game with 4 punts for 207 yards (51.8 average)... His 80 yard punt ranks second all-time in Torero history and is the longest in over 55 years... The Torero record was set by Vern Valdez in 1957 vs. Mexico Polytechnic.

LAST SETS NEW FIELD GOAL RECORD: Redshirt sophomore kicker **David Last** has made all eight of his field goal attempts this season... The eight straight makes is a new Torero streak breaking the previous mark of 7 (Ernie Collins, 2012; Tim Roth, 1997)... Last, who kicked the game-winner against Marist with no time on the clock from 28-yards, got some help from the Marist defense to set the record... His first attempt from 33 yards with 5 seconds to go missed wide, but the Red Foxes were called for a roughing the kicker penalty... Last leads the Toreros in scoring with 49 points.

JAMES & MILLS EARN NATIONAL RECOGNITION: Senior running back **Kenn James** and senior quarterback **Mason Mills** were both recognized as offensive performers of the week by the national organization College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) on Sept. 30th... Against Stetson, James rushed 13 times for 146 yards and 2 touchdowns... He found the endzone from 24 and 34 yards outs... Mills, who left the game after the first series in the third period, completed 18-of-20 passes for 269 yards and 2 scores, both to WR **Brandon White** (2 & 15 yards).

HOEKSTRA EARNS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS: San Diego senior **Sam Hoekstra** was selected to two Preseason All-America squads for his special teams play as a punt returner. He was tabbed 3rd team by both The Sports Network FCS Preseason All-America team and the College Sports Journal FCS Preseason All-America team. Last season he ranked 20th among all FCS players in punt returns with his 9.18 yards per return average.

TRIO OF TOREROS NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-PFL SQUAD: A trio of USD football players were among the 26-man 2013 Preseason All-PFL squads, the league announced today. The three seniors include fullback **Lawrence Larivee** (Chino Hills, Calif.), wide receiver/return specialist **Sam Hoekstra** (Carlsbad, Calif.) and offensive tackle **Cody Tescher** (Glendora, Calif.).

THOMAS COBBS - AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM NOMINEE: Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) recently announced 150 nominees for the 2013 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. The award recognizes a select group of college football players who have made a commitment to enriching the lives of others while contributing to the greater good of their communities. USD senior tight end **Thomas Cobbs** (Irvine, Calif.) is one of the candidates for the 2013 AFCA Good Works Team. Cobbs is the team liaison with the Autism Tree Project in San Diego where he helps develop a buddy program with USD football players and autistic children; he is involved with Lace Up Stand Up, a non bullying workshop where he helps teach kids at local boys and girls clubs about intervention techniques as well as personal responses to handle situations correctly; and he is active with Shop with a Jock, helping underprivileged kids shop for gifts during the holiday season. A Finance/Marketing major with a 3.58 grade-point average, following graduation Cobbs aspires to attend medical school and pursue a career in sports medicine.

FOUR RECEIVE 2012 ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS: Four Toreros were named to the 2012 Capital One Academic All-America District 8 Division I football team. The four Toreros included senior OL **Matt Peleti** (Laguna Niguel, CA; 3.61 GPA, Finance), junior DB **Robbie Beathard** (San Diego, CA; 3.79 GPA, Accountancy), junior DE **Blake Oliaro** (Folsom, CA; 3.56 GPA, Mechanical Engineering), and sophomore DB **Troy McClelland** (San Diego, CA; 3.84 GPA, Accountancy).

TOREROS TEN YEAR RUN: Over the past 10 seasons (2003-2012) the Toreros have combined for an overall record of 81-29 (73.6 winning %)... Last year the Toreros won their final six games to finish 8-3 overall and with a 7-1 Pioneer Football League mark and share of the PFL title for the second straight year... Over the past 10 years the Toreros own an overall PFL record of 51-15 with a share or outright ownership of the league title six times.

Head Coach Dale Lindsey - 1st Season

The University of San Diego introduced Dale Lindsey as its new head football coach on December 29, 2012, at a Saturday afternoon press conference held in the Warren Hospitality Suite of the Jenny Craig Pavilion. Lindsey becomes the Toreros' 13th head coach and replaces Ron Caragher who recently was hired as head coach at San Jose State University.

"After Coach Caragher informed me that he was leaving USD, the first person I met with was our Defensive Coordinator, Dale Lindsey," said Ky Snyder, USD Executive Director of Athletics. "His knowledge of the game of football, of our team,

of transitions, the respect he commands from both our coaches and players made him the likely person for me to put in charge of our program while we searched for a new Head Coach. We knew the characteristics that we were looking for: Integrity, belief and promotion of the student-athlete, great knowledge of the game of football, a recruiter who can identify talent that can be nurtured, a coach of coaches and one with connections to build our staff; and, a person who can be creative in moving our program forward. As we spoke to and interviewed many coaches, we kept coming back to the realization that the characteristics and experience that we were looking for, was already on our staff. We could not find someone with more integrity, belief in the student-athlete and knowledge of the game than Dale Lindsey. Both the coaches and players look to him to learn and draw on his experience. In his heart, Dale Lindsey is a teacher and a leader. That fits the University of San Diego and our Football program. I am very excited to introduce Dale Lindsey as our new Head Football Coach of the University of San Diego."

Lindsey returned to USD's staff this past season where he was the program's defensive coordinator. The Toreros finished the season with an overall record of 8-3 and earned a share of the Pioneer Football League title with Butler and Drake with 7-1 records. The Toreros won their final six games, and among 121 FCS teams in the country, USD ranked 14th in scoring defense (19.27), 15th in rushing defense (120.0) and 19th in pass efficiency defense (114.56).

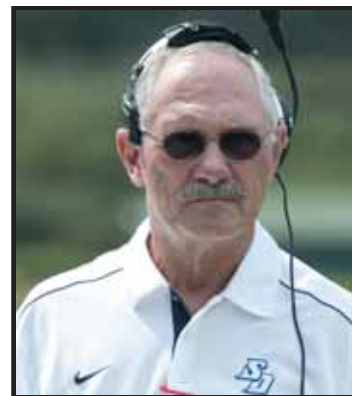
From 2009-2011 Lindsey was at New Mexico State University where he was assistant head coach and linebackers coach. Prior to NMSU, he spent his first season with the USD staff in 2008, where he was the Torero linebackers coach. That season Lindsey helped the 9-2 Toreros' defense hold its opponents to just 18.9 points a game and 322 yards of total offense per contest.

Lindsey brings a wealth of football experience as a former NFL player and coach. His resume includes over 30 years of football coaching at the high school, college and professional ranks. Most recently with the Washington Redskins (2004-06), Lindsey also spent time on the San Diego Chargers staff as defensive coordinator (2002-03) and linebackers coach (1992-96).

From 1992-96, Lindsey was the linebackers coach on the Chargers' defensive staff that helped guide the team to a pair of AFC West titles (1992 and 1994), three playoff appearances (1992, 1994 and 1995) and one AFC Championship (1994). Lindsey also spent time with the Chicago Bears, New England Patriots, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Green Bay Packers.

Lindsey played both linebacker and fullback for two years at Western Kentucky, helping the 1963 Hilltoppers to a 10-0-1 mark and the Tangerine Bowl Championship. Overall, the two Topper teams (1963-64) he played on went 16-3-2. A two-time All-OVC pick, he earned All-America honors as a linebacker in 1964 and was named to the all-time OVC Team in 1988. A Bowling Green (Ky.) High product, he was drafted by the Cleveland Browns (in the seventh round) and by the New York Jets of the American Football League (sixth round) in 1965 and went on to play nine seasons at linebacker for the Cleveland Browns (1965-73).

In 2008, Lindsey was inducted into the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame in Louisville, Kentucky. Lindsey and his wife, Eva, reside in Rancho Bernardo, and have five children - Blan, Jennifer, Kim, Johnny and Derek.

JOSH JOHNSON WITH CINCINNATI BENGALS: Johnson joins the Cincinnati Bengals as an unrestricted free agent for 2013 ... He entered NFL as a fifth-round draft choice of Tampa Bay in 2008 and played in 26 games with five starts for Bucs from '08 through '11 ... Signed with San Francisco as an unrestricted free agent for 2012, was released by the 49ers in final preseason cuts, then signed with Cleveland for the final regular-season game, seeing brief action without a pass attempt ... His career NFL statistics include 96 completions in 177 attempts (54.2 percent) for 1042 yards, five TDs and 10 INTs ... Also has 6.9-yard career rushing average, with 37 carries for 254 yards.



SCOUTING THE DAYTON FLYERS: The Dayton Flyers (2-1 PFL, 4-2) have won their last two games, including last weekend's 49-20 road win over PFL newcomer Stetson... Dayton is 2-1 in home games with their lone loss at Welcome Stadium coming against the Marist Red Foxes back on September 28th (31-20)... In their win at Stetson last Saturday the Flyers jumped out to a 35-0 lead before cruising to the 49-20 win... QB Will Bardo completed 7-of-13 passes for 164 yards and 1TD, and added 41 yards rushing with a TD... RB Connor Kacsor led the Flyer ground attack with 128 yards and 3 TDs on 22 carries... In their home win two weeks ago over Davidson (40-8), Kacsor gained 244 yards on 26 carries with 2 TDs in earning the PFL Offensive Player of the Week award... Season leaders include Kacsor (548 yards, 6 TDs), Bardo (84-for-163 for 957 yards & 6 TDs; 290 yards rushing and 4 TDs), slot receiver Gabe Macis (18 receptions for 169 yards), slot receiver Ross Smith (17 receptions for 217 yards), Flyer Ryan Schwenke (3 interceptions), LB Colin Monnier (56 tackles, 2 sacks) and CB Howard Savage (37 stops, 2 forced fumbles)... Head Coach Rick Chamberlin (Dayton, '80) is in his 6th year as head coach and owns a 44-18 record... One of the original PFL members in 1993, Dayton has won or shared 11 PFL titles (1993, 1994, 1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2007, 2009, 2010)... USD moved to Welcome Stadium in 1974 and owns an impressive 206-44-2 record (.822)... Dayton football contact is Doug Hauschild (sid@udayton.edu).

The Toreros found themselves down 20-5 early in the 3rd period before rallying for victory. In the first half Marist held a 14-5 lead with the defense limiting the Toreros to just 139 yards of offense, including just 41 yards thru the air by QB **Mason Mills**. After Looney opened the 3rd period with his second touchdown pass to Martin, the Toreros answered with three straight touchdowns. Mills connected with **Sam Hoekstra** for 9 yards and **Cole Naone** for 3 yards before **Montell Allen** closed out the quarter with a 1-yard burst. Allen's score gave USD its first lead of the game and was set up by **Ryan Downing's** blocked punt and recovery on the Marist one yard line. In the fourth period USD extended its lead to 32-20 on a 62-yard pass play from Mills to **Reggie Bell**. Marist rallied with back-to-back touchdown passes from Looney for a 33-32 lead with 5:19 to go. USD began their final drive from their own 25-yard line with 5:19 to go. Thirteen plays and 64 yards later, Last kicked the game winner. The Torero defense, which gave up 228 yards of offense to Marist in the first half, held the Red Foxes to just 146 over the final two periods. Defensive ends **Blake Oliaro** and **Steve Gargiulo** both had big days. Oliaro finished with 10 tackles, 2 sacks, including the safety; Gargiulo finished with 9 stops, 3 sacks, and 1 forced fumble. Mills, who had just 41 yards of passing at intermission on 4-of-14 passing, rallied the Toreros in the second half to finish with game totals of 20-of-39 for 349 yards and 3 touchdowns. **Brandon White** (5 catches for 100 yards) and **Reggie Bell** (4 catches for 104 yards, 1 TD) were his key targets. **Joe Ferguson** was USD's top rusher with 53 yards on 9 carries. For Marist, Looney finished 19-of-33 for 298 yards and 5 touchdowns, with Martin totaling 6 receptions for 118 yards and 3 TDs.

The USD Toreros improved to 2-0 in PFL play with today's convincing 45-13 victory as they handed the Mercer Bears (4-1, 1-1 PFL) their first loss of the season after bringing back football for the first time since 1941. Senior kick return specialist **Kenn James** opened the game with a 95-yard TD return matching his personal best. Senior quarterback **Mason Mills** was nearly perfect on the day as he completed 23-of-27 passes for 413 yards and 3 touchdowns. At the end of the first period with USD ahead 21-7, Mills' stat line was 9-for-9 for 184 yards and 2 touchdown passes. With his fourth completion of the day, a 5-yarder to **Sam Hoekstra** in the team's second series, Mills became the program's all-time leader in completions. Now with 744 career completions, he passed by Josh Johnson who held the previous mark of 724 (2004-2007). Mercer came into the game averaging 43.8 points and 456.5 yards of total offense, with their defense holding opponents to just 13.5 points and 241.5 yards. The Torero defense was up to the challenge as they limited the Bears to just 295 yards of offense (107 rush, 122 pass). Senior captain **Robbie Beathard** led the way with 7 tackles, and 2 pass break-ups. **Zach Devaney** chipped in with 7 tackles, while senior defensive end **Blake Oliaro** added 6 tackles, 1 sack (-7 yards), 2 tackles for loss (-9) and 1 quarterback hurry. Free safety **Matt Miller** added 6 stops and corner **Toney Sawyer** finished with 5 tackles and an interception. Other offensive stars besides Mills and the entire offensive line included **Kenn James** (86 yards rushing, 1 TD), **Reggie Bell** (7 catches for 127 yards, 1 TD), **Brandon White** (6 receptions for 111 yards, 1 TD) and **Sam Hoekstra** (4 catches for 121 yards, 1 TD). Freshman punter **Ryan Belden** averaged 51.8 yards on 4 punts, including an 80-yarder on his first attempt. That ranks second best all-time at USD with the record held by Vern Valdez (85 yards vs. Mexico Poly in 1957).

The USD Toreros (1-0 PFL, 2-2), gunning for their third straight PFL title, took a big step in the right direction with Saturday's 59-0 road win over league newcomer Stetson (0-1 PFL, 1-3). On the strength of 400 yards of total offense in the first half the Toreros jumped out to a 35-0 intermission lead and never looked back. USD would go on to finish with 624 yards of offense and its 59 points was the team's most since earning a 62-23 win over Jacksonville in 2007. **Kenn James** and **Joe Ferguson** carried the bulk of the load on the ground.
