**GAME #8:** The USD Toreros (3-4; 2-3 pfl), who have dropped two straight, head to Dayton, Ohio this Saturday to take on the UD Flyers (6-1; 4-0 pfl). The Halloween contest is scheduled to kickoff at 10:00 a.m. (PDT) at Welcome Stadium.

**SERIES RECORD:** This is 17th meeting between USD and Dayton with the Flyers owning a commanding 12-4 lead in the series... Dayton has won the last two meetings with the Toreros having won four straight between 2003-2006... Last season's 30-22 win at Torero Stadium snapped USD's 28-game home winning streak... The Toreros held a 22-13 half-time lead, but UD outscored the Toreros in the second half, 17-0... The Flyers held USD to 10 yards rushing on 20 attempts and 216 total yards... WR John Matthews led the offense with 11 receptions for 104 yards and 1 score.

**RADIO/INTERNET:** Saturday's contest will air live on San Diego 1700 AM with **Jack Cronin** calling the action. Cronin's pre-game will begin at 9:40 a.m. (PST), and the broadcast can also be heard via the internet at [www.usdtoreros.com](http://www.usdtoreros.com).

**SCUDELLARI LOST FOR SEASON:** Red-shirt freshman quarterback **Sam Scudellari** (Saratoga, CA) will miss the rest of the season after he suffered a fracture to his left fibula (non-displaced) in Saturday's 34-16 home loss to Jacksonville... Scudellari completed 8-of-22 passes for 172 yards and 1 TD before being replaced by **Justin Fontenberry** with 8:53 left in the game... Sam started 4 of the 6 games he appeared in this season and finished 67-of-117 (57.3%) for 1,004 yards and 8 TDs... He did not throw an interception and finished with a passer rating of 151.91(2nd in PFL).

**JACKSONVILLE DEALS TOREROS 34-16 LOSS (Oct. 24th):** The Toreros dropped a 34-16 contest to Jacksonville. The Dolphins jumped out to a 13-0 first quarter lead and never trailed. JU totaled 402 yards of offense against a Torero defense that has been hit by the injury bug of late. Jacksonville marched 60 yards on 7 plays on the game's first possession as WR Josh Philpart hauled in a 28-yard pass from QB Josh McGregor with 11:32 left in the opening period. Their second score came late in the quarter following a misplayed punt return by **Al-Rilwan Adeyemi**. Adeyemi muffed catch was recovered by Eric Kornhauser on the USD 39-yard line. McGregor hit Sam Bell for a 35-yard completion and one play later Keith Dawson rushed in for a 4-yard score to make it 13-0. In the second quarter a **Mike Levine** 41-yard field goal followed by a 2-yard **JT Rogan** touchdown run pulled the Toreros to within 13-10 with 5:44 to go. On Jacksonville's next possession the Toreros forced a punt, but the punt hit a Torero player in the leg and JU recovered with 3:04 left in the half on USD's 32. McGregor quickly connected with Tommie Rogers for a 32-yard score to extend their lead to 20-10 at halftime. The Toreros opened up the 2nd half with their own quick score as **Sam Scudellari** found WR **John McGough** up the right side for a 59-yard TD on the first play of the half and USD was back in the game, down just 20-16. From there it was all Jacksonville as the Dolphins scored the game's final two touchdowns to close out the third quarter. J.J. Laster scored on a 1-yard run, and Philpart hauled in his second TD pass from McGregor for an 8-yard score. Rogan was the team's workhorse finishing with 85 tough yards on 20 carries. He also added 101 yards on 5 kickoff returns. McGough finished with 4 receptions for 117 yards and 1 TD. **Kyle Negrete** punted 5 times, averaging 47.8 yards with a long of 55 yards. Defensively the Toreros were paced by senior captain **Gabe Derricks** (8 tackles), and LB **Anthony McCrady** (7 stops).

Head Coach Ron Caragher enters his third season at the helm of the Torero football program. In 2008 he guided the Toreros to their second straight 9-2 record, and the team

placed second in the PFL with its 6-2 mark. The season was capped off with the team's third straight win, a 28-20 home win over scholarship-program UC Davis. Caragher's first season was outstanding as he guided the Toreros to a 9-2 overall mark and 6-1 PFL record, good for a share of first place. It marked the 3rd straight season that the Toreros were crowned PFL Champions. USD finished ranked 2nd in the final Sports Network FCS Mid-Major poll. Seven Toreros were named Sports Network FCS All-Americans, while 11 players were tabbed Mid-Major All-Americans by the same outlet. Senior QB Josh Johnson was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 5th round, and three other players received looks by NFL clubs. Johnson, who passed for 43 touchdowns with just one interception, was a Walter Payton Award Finalist. Senior defensive end Eric Bakhtiari, who led the nation in sacks, was a finalist for the Ted Hendricks Award. Under Caragher's guidance as Offensive Coordinator, the Toreros ranked first in the nation among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams in scoring (44.36 points per game) and passing efficiency (197.35 rating). The 44 points per game average is a new USD single season record. Additionally, the Toreros ranked 3rd in the nation in total offense (483.1 yards per game). The University of San Diego introduced Ron Caragher as its new head football coach on January 9, 2007. Caragher became the Toreros' 12th head football coach at USD and replaced Jim Harbaugh who was hired as Stanford's head coach. Prior to being hired at USD, Caragher, (pronounced "CARE-ah-ger"), spent four seasons (2003-2006) at the University of Kentucky as an assistant coach under Rich Brooks. He was the running backs coach all four years, and starting in 2005 served as Kentucky's Head Recruiting Coordinator. In 2006 Kentucky finished 8-5 overall, and 4-4 in the Southeast Conference Eastern Division, good for a tie for third place and the program's best league mark since 1993. The 8 wins is also the program's best win total since their 9-3 campaign back in 1984. The Wildcats finished off the 2006 season in fine fashion as they upset Clemson, 28-20, in the Music City Bowl on December 29th. It was Kentucky's first bowl appearance since 1999, and the program's first bowl win in 22 years. Caragher also has Southern California ties. He spent nine seasons (1994-2002) on UCLA's staff where he worked with both Terry Donahue and Bob Toledo. After two seasons as a Graduate Assistant, Caragher was promoted to assistant coach where he coached Bruin wide receivers. Additionally, he coached punters all seven seasons (1996-2002), and kickers for his final two years (2001-02). During the 1997 and 1998 seasons, UCLA won a school-record 20 straight games and averaged more than 40 points per game while setting numerous school records. He coached in five bowl games during his term there, including the Aloha, Cotton, Rose, Sun, and Las Vegas bowls. A native of Morgan Hill, California, Caragher was a three-sport letterman at Bellarmine College Prep (1982-84) where he earned three varsity letters as a quarterback in football. He earned an athletic scholarship to UCLA in 1985 and went on to earn four varsity letters (1986-89) and was part of teams that won four consecutive bowl games. After graduating from UCLA in 1990 with a B.A. in Psychology, Ron went on to earn his Master's Degree in Education (Administrative Studies) in 1995. Caragher and his wife, Wendy, have three sons, Josh, Ryan, and Scott.

**TORERO TIDBITS:** The Toreros head to Dayton in hopes of ending a two-game skid... It will be no easy task as the Toreros have won just twice in 8 tries at Welcome Stadium... USD won back-to-back games in Dayton in 2003 & 2005... Last time out the Toreros dropped a 35-16 decision in 2007... USD will look to freshman **Bo Stompro** (San Ramon, CA) to step in at quarterback for the injured Scudellari... Stompro has yet to see any action this season as he was initially earmarked for a redshirt year by the Torero coaching staff.. His senior year at California HS he threw for 1,835 yards and 15 touchdowns... In Dayton, Stompro will be going against the PFL's #1 team in pass defense (125.6 yards per game) and total defense (208.7 yards per game)... Among PFL teams, USD ranks 2nd in punting (35.7 avg.) and kickoff returns (24.0 avg.)... Toreros that rank in the top-5 among PFL players for all games played include **Sam Scudellari** (2nd in pass efficiency, 151.9), **JT Rogan** (2nd in kickoff returns, 25.2; 3rd in all-purpose yards, 117.7; t-5th in scoring, 4.3 ppg), **Mike Levine** (4th in FG%, .750; 5th in scoring for kickers, 3.7 ppg), and **Kyle Negrete** (1st in punting, 42.9 avg.)... Negrete ranks 9th in the nation among all FCS players, while Rogan is 18th in kickoff returns... Torero leaders for the season include Rogan (306 yards rushing, 5 TDs), WR **John McGough** (30 receptions for 466 yards and 4 TDs), SS **Derek Pilkington** (47 tackles), LB **Derek Marten** (35 stops) and LB **Loka Kanongataa** (32 tackles).

**BAKHTIARI JOINS JOHNSON AT TAMPA BAY:** (Courtesy of Buccaneers.com) As a defensive end at the USD, Eric Bakhtiari used to engage in some pretty vigorous trash-talking with Toreros quarterback Josh Johnson on the practice field. Now the two will have a chance to rekindle their friendly across-the-line-of-scrimmage rivalry in the Buccaneers' backyard. The Buccaneers signed Bakhtiari to their practice squad last Wednesday, filling a spot left open after the team waived Patrick Carter and Rashaad Duncan from that eight-man unit on Tuesday. Now a first-year NFL linebacker, Bakhtiari makes the move across the states to join Johnson after spending his first season exclusively in his home state. The 6-3, 255-pound defender first entered the league as an undrafted free agent with the San Diego Chargers in 2008, the same year that Johnson was drafted in the fifth round by the Buccaneers. He split his rookie season between the practice squads for the Chargers and the San Francisco 49ers, then went to camp with the Chargers again in 2009. Given that Johnson posted a ridiculous 43-1 touchdown-interception ratio and an NCAA-record 176.68 passer rating as a senior in 2007, it might seem like Johnson would have all the ammunition in any practice-field war of words. However, Bakhtiari backed his talk up quite nicely as well, to the tune of 20 sacks during the same campaign. Bakhtiari won all-conference honors in each of his last three seasons, was the Pioneer League Defensive Player of the year in the last two and was an AP All-America selection as a senior to cap his run. In all, he finished his collegiate career with 236 tackles, 35 sacks, 67 tackles for loss and six forced fumbles. Bakhtiari joins former Torero WR John Matthews on NFL practice squads - Matthews is with the Indianapolis Colts.

**SMITH NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY:** The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) recently announced the 154 semifinalists for the 2009 William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly known as the Draddy Trophy), endowed by HealthSouth, and the candidates for the 2009 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards. USD senior offensive right tackle Conrad Smith (Long Beach, CA) is one of five student-athletes selected from the Pioneer Football League. He is joined by Dayton DT Sean Heenan, Drake DT Sean Kitts, Marist DL Terrence Turner and Morehead State LB Wes McDermott. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The NFF Awards Committee will select and announce up to 15 finalists on Oct. 29. Each finalist will be recognized as part of the 2009 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, receiving an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The Campbell Trophy winner, who will have his scholarship increased to \$25,000, will be announced live at the NFF's Annual Awards Dinner on December 8 at the prestigious Waldorf-Astoria in New York City.

**2009 TORERO TEAM CAPTAINS NAMED:** The following four Toreros have been tabbed as 2009 team captains by their teammates. Offensive captains include running back **JT Rogan** (Coronado, CA) and right tackle **Conrad Smith** (Long Beach, CA), while the defensive captains are cornerback **Gabriel Derricks** (Oak Park, CA) and defensive end **Kevin Dunn** (Santa Barbara, CA). Rogan was selected a team captain last year as well.

**SCOUTING THE DAYTON FLYERS:** Since opening the season with a 13-10 loss to Urbana, the Dayton Flyers have run off six straight wins... UD is 6-1 overall and 4-0 in the PFL, tied at the top of the standings with Butler & Drake... This past weekend the Flyers earned a 38-7 road win over Valparaiso as the Dayton defense held the Crusaders to just two first downs and 60 yards in total offense... Dayton QB Steve Valentino ran for 3 TDs and threw for one more in earning PFL offensive player of the week honors... He rushed 17 times for 127 yards and completed 13-of-18 passes for 188 yards... Senior DE Brandon Wingeier was tabbed the PFL defender of the week after totaling 4 tackles, a fumble recovery and interception that he returned for a 57-yard TD... Season leaders include Valentino (473 yards rushing & 6 TDs; 93-for-153 passing for 1,280 yards & 7 TDs), FL Justin Watkins (28 for 505 yards, 4 TDs), RB Brian Mack (259 yards, 3 TDs), Flyer James Vercammen (78 tackles; 11.5 tackles for loss), LB Joe Ries (47 tackles; 2 interceptions) and safety Kevin Burns (41 stops)... Second-year head coach Rick Chamberlin (15-4) returns 42 lettermen and 12 starters from last year's 9-3 ball club (6-2 PFL)... Welcome Stadium has been anything but hospitable to its opponents at home, where Dayton is 191-39-2 (.828) since 1974.

**TORERO FOOTBALL STAFF:** Third-year head coach **Ron Caragher** has a mix of returners (5) and newcomers (6) on his football staff this season... Returners include **Todd Washington** (3rd year), OL coach who also takes over as Offensive Coordinator; **George Darlington** (2nd year), Defensive Coordinator; **Tanner Engstrand** (5th year), moves to QB's coach; **Mike Rish** (26th year), Senior Offensive Assistant; and **Jon Sumrall** (3rd year), DL coach and Recruiting Coordinator. Newcomers include **Sam Anno**, LB's and Special Teams Coordinator; **Keith Carter**, Tight Ends; **Jerome Pathon**, Wide Receivers; **Joe Staab**, Defensive Assistant; **Ken Stills**, Defensive Backs; and **Andrew Rolin**, Undergraduate Assistant. **Dorian Keller** (2nd year) is the program's Administrative Assistant.

**JT ROGAN GRANTED 6TH YEAR BY NCAA:** USD All-America running back **JT Rogan** (Coronado, CA) was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA after missing almost the entire 2008 season because of a left knee injury. Rogan, the school's all-time leading rusher, suffered a season-ending knee injury in the first quarter of USD's 2008 home opener against Marist on August 29th. Rogan, who redshirted his freshman year back in 2004, had to file for medical and hardship waivers to receive the sixth year. "I am excited that JT has been granted a sixth year of eligibility," said 3rd-year head coach Ron Caragher. "His injury at the time appeared to be a tragic ending to an outstanding career. Now he will get the chance to finish on a higher note. JT is an all-purpose type player as he contributes in so many ways - as a runner, blocker, receiver, and returner. Having cleared the first hurdle of being granted a sixth year, his next task will be to return to full health through rehabilitation and conditioning. His addition to our team will enhance an already strong group of running backs returning for us." In last year's season-opening 40-22 win over Marist, Rogan was off to a great start to his senior year with 46 yards rushing on 3 attempts; 1 touchdown catch for 29 yards and a 36-yard kickoff return before leaving the game late in the first quarter. He enters the 2009 campaign as the program's all-time leader in rushing yards (3,013), TDs (47) and all-purpose yardage (5,344). In 2007 Rogan was named first team FCS All-America and led the nation in kickoff returns. As a running back in 2007, he rushed for 1,021 yards and 10 TDs, while catching 30 balls for seven TDs.

**TRUJILLO LEAVES FOOTBALL PROGRAM:** Senior quarterback **Sebastian Trujillo** (Durango, CO), a pre-season Payton Watch Award candidate, has left the USD football program for personal reasons. Through three starts this season for the 2-1 Toreros, Trujillo had completed 32-of-58 passes (55.2%) for 253 yards and 3 touchdowns. Last year he earned First Team All-PFL honors and team MVP honors after ranking first in the PFL in passing average (256.5 yards per game) and passing efficiency (160.2 rating). He completed 239-of-358 passes for 2,822 yards and 35 touchdowns.

**TORERO SUCCESS THE PAST SIX YEARS:** USD football has accomplished some outstanding highlights over the past six years, most notably its 55-12 combined record (.821 winning percentage) and 29-5 PFL record (.852 winning percentage). In two of the past three seasons USD has led all FCS team in scoring, including a program-best 44.4 average in 2007. All told, USD has had 23 Sports Network Mid-Major All-Americans and 47 First Team All-Pioneer Football League honorees.

## 2009 GAME RECAPS

**(GAME 6) TOREROS FALL TO DRAKE, 21-14 (Oct. 17th):** The USD Toreros dropped a hard-fought 21-14 contest to the visiting Drake Bulldogs at Torero Stadium before 2,357 fans here for homecoming. With the game tied 14-all late in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, Drake QB Mike Piatkowski connected with WR Stephen Platek for a 20-yard touchdown score that ended up being the game-winner with 4:23 to go in the game. USD went three-and-out on its final possession and Drake was able to run out the clock over the final 3:17. USD jumped out to a 7-0 lead in on the first possession of the game as QB **Sam Scudellari** completed three straight passes with the third one going 37-yards to WR **Kyle Warren** at the 13:44 mark. Drake responded with two straight touchdowns of their own. The first came with 6:32 to go in the first quarter as Stephen Platek's 1-yard rush culminated a 14-play, 63-yard drive that took 7:06. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter Piatkowski connected with Pat Cashmore for a 20-yard score with 8:36 to go in the half. That scoring drive was 9 plays, 71 yards in 3 minutes and 48 seconds. Drake would take that 14-7 lead into the locker room at halftime. In the third period Scudellari connected with Warren again for a touchdown, this time for 30 yards. That scoring play culminated a 6-play, 81-yard drive over 3:08 that knotted the score at 14-all. From there both defenses forced punts until Drake's winning score with 4:23 to go. For the game USD totaled 336 yards of offense. Scudellari completed 26-of-41 for 317 yards and 2 TDs. Junior **Godfrey Smith** (8 receptions for 107 yards) and **John McGough** (8 receptions for 62 yards). Drake limited USD's rushing game to 19 yards on 16 carries. Sophomore punter **Kyle Negrete** had a busy afternoon, punting 7 times for 267 yards (38.1 ave.) with a long of 51 yards. Drake's Piatkowski finished 11-of-27 for 119 yards and 2 scores. Stephen Platek caught 4 balls for 57 yards and the game-winning score.

**(GAME 5) TOREROS THUMP VALPARAISO 48-7 (Oct. 10th):** The Toreros bounced back from their last-second 25-24 loss at Butler with a convincing 48-7 victory over Valparaiso... Ahead 28-0 at halftime, and 34-0 early in the third period, USD received solid play from all three units - offense, defense and special teams... Redshirt freshman QB **Sam Scudellari**, in just his 2nd collegiate start, completed 11-of-29 passes for 232 yards and 3 touchdowns... He connected with six different receivers, including TD strikes to **Kyle Warren** (28 yards), **Eric Fiege** (41 yards) and **John McGough** (20 yards)... McGough led the team with 4 receptions for 95 yards, including a 47-yard reception on team's second drive that set-up **Matt Jelmini's** 22-yard TD rush - Jelmini finished with 76 yards on 13 carries... **Justin Fontenberry** carried a personal-best 16 times and finished with 57 yards rushing... **JT Rogan's** 14-yard TD rush late in the 3rd period was a milestone as he set new USD career marks for touchdowns (51) and points (308)... Defensively the Toreros limited Valpo to just 88 yards passing as both **Gabriel Derricks** (26 yards) and LB **Joe Martin** (38 yards) returned interceptions for touchdowns... Linebackers **Zach Dunaj** (8 stops) and **Derek Marten** (6 tackles), along with senior SS **Derek Pilkington** (6 tackles), led the defensive efforts... Sophomore punter **Kyle Negrete** continued his stellar punting as he placed three of his four punts inside Valpo's 20-yard line, and blasted a long of 53 yards... The Toreros tallied a season-best 412 yards of offense while limiting Valpo to 234 yards.

**(GAME 4) TOREROS DROP LAST-SECOND 25-24 CONTEST AT BUTLER (Oct. 3rd):** USD dropped a heart-breaking 25-24 last-second contest at Butler (5-0; 2-0 pfl) as Bulldog kicker David Lang converted on a 37-yard field goal with one second left... A **Kyle Negrete** 49-yard punt pinned Butler on their own 5-yard line with forty-two seconds left, but Butler QB Andrew Huck completed 5-of-6 passes, marching the team down to the San Diego 20-yard line with 5 ticks left... The game went back-and-forth with USD holding a 17-9 halftime advantage, and 24-15 lead early in the 4th period... USD scoring came from kicker **Mike Levine** (44-yard FG); a 1-yard **JT Rogan** rush in the 2nd period; a 13-yard **Patrick Doyle** TD reception from QB **Sam Scudellari**; and a 4th period 11-yard TD run by **Matt Jelmini**... For the game Scudellari, getting his first collegiate start, completed 17-28 passes for 175 yards and 1 score... Receivers **Eric Fiege** (5 catches for 30 yards), **Patrick Doyle** (4-for-65, 1 TD) and **John McGough** (4-for-49 yards) were his main targets... Rogan's TD was his 50th career score, along with his 302nd point - both marks tie John Matthews for USD all-time records... Jelmini turned in his best performance of the season finishing with 112 yards rushing and 1 TD on 22 carries... Negrete continued his solid punting as he averaged 44.8 yards on 4 punts with 3 ending up inside Butler's 20-yard line... Defensively the Toreros were paced by **Zach Dunaj** (10 tackles), **Derek Pilkington** (8 stops) and **Al-Rilwan Adeyemi** - his interception late in 4th quarter on the San Diego goal line thwarted a Bulldog scoring drive... Butler's Huck completed 25-of-38 for 260 yards and 1 TD.

**(GAME 3) SCUDELLARI LEADS 2nd HALF RALLY OVER MARIST, 17-10 (Sept. 19th):** Down 10-3 at halftime, head coach Ron Caragher inserted redshirt freshman QB **Sam Scudellari** into the lineup for the 2nd half and he responded by directing USD to two scoring drives... On their second possession the Toreros put together a 12-play, 65-yard drive that took just over six minutes that was capped off with **JT Rogan's** 2-yard TD run... During the drive Rogan carried the ball eight times, while Scudellari completed two first down plays to **Godfrey Smith** (14 yards) and **Eric Fiege** (8 yards)... With the game knotted at 10-all, USD started its game-winning drive with 2:36 left in the game... Scudellari hit WR **John McGough** up the middle for a huge 43-yard completion down to the Marist 24-yard line... After back-to-back Rogan rushes the Toreros faced third and 12 from the 26-yard line... Scudellari took the snap and rolled to his right, and immediately looked back left and connected with TE **Patrick Doyle** who was wide open; Doyle sprinted up the left side into the end zone untouched for the game winner... The Torero defense was solid the entire game, and in the 4th period limited the Red Foxes to two long FG attempts... The Toreros were paced by **Loka Kanongatta** (9 tackles), **Derek Pilkington** (8 stops), LB **Joe Martin** (7 tackles, 1 QB sack) and safety **Mike Bogard** (6 tackles, 1 pass breakup).

**(GAME 2) TOREROS FALL TO NORTHERN COLORADO, 31-12 (Sept. 12th):** USD put up a good fight in Greeley, Colorado, but came away with a 31-12 defeat to the Northern Colorado Bears (1-1), a scholarship program that is a member of the competitive Big Sky Conference... UNC jumped out to a 17-0 lead at halftime as they totaled 312 yards of offense... Big plays were USD's nemesis as the Bears' first score came on a 80-yard TD pass from QB Bryan Waggener to WR Alex Thompson... In the 2nd quarter RB Andre Harris busted loose for a 39-yard rush and one play later RB John Burnley found the endzone from 34 yards out... USD played its best ball of the day in the 2nd half as they found the endzone twice to pull to within 17-12... USD's first score came on a 10-yard TD hook-up between QB **Sebastian Trujillo** and WR **John McGough** with 4:53 left in the 3rd quarter (USD's PAT attempt was wide left)... The Toreros then strung together an 11-play, 59-yard drive that began late in the period and was capped off with 13:01 left in the game on a 2-yard rush by TB **Brendan Feliczak**... Leading up to that score was a Trujillo scramble for 16 yards on a key 4th-and-4 from the UNC 28-yard line... Three plays later Feliczak, who had 7 carries for 22 yards during the run, scored from 2-yards out (Trujillo's PAT pass attempt failed)... UNC answered again with a big play to go back up 24-12 as Waggener hit WR Patrick Walker for 65 yards down to the San Diego 7, and Harris found the endzone on the very next play... After USD went three-and-out, UNC scored again for the day's final score of 31-12... The Bears rushed seven straight times, with Harris culminating the drive with a 19-yard TD - it was Harris' 6th carry of that drive... For USD offensively, Feliczak finished with 69 yards and 1TD on 16 carries... Trujillo completed 18-37 for 121 yards and 1 TD, but 3 of his 4 picks came in the 2nd half... **Kyle Negrete** averaged 45.5 yards on 6 punts, including a personal-best 70-yarder in the 3rd period... WR **John McGough** caught 5 balls for 61 yards and 1 score... Defensively USD was paced by CB **Al-Rilwan Adeyemi** (8 tackles), LB **Loka Kanongataa** (6 tackles) and **Derek Pilkington** (6 stops).

**(GAME 1) TOREROS DEAL AZUSA PACIFIC 24-12 LOSS (Sept. 5th):** The USD Toreros won their fifth consecutive season opener with Saturday's 24-12 victory over Azusa Pacific at Citrus Stadium... The Torero defense held the Cougars to just two field goals and a net total of 12 yards rushing on 23 attempts... Strong safety **Derek Pilkington** (8 tackles), LB **Loka Kanongataa** (7 stops, 1 sack, 1 fumble recovery), and DE **Kevin Dunn** (6 stops; 2 tackles for loss) paced the defense... Chipping with 5 tackles each were **Gabriel Derricks**, **Frankie Zimmerman** and **Kellan Barker**... Offensively the Toreros were paced TB **Phil Morelli** (82 yards on 19 carries), RB **JT Rogan** (50 yards on 7 carries; 2-yard TD rush), QB **Sebastian Trujillo** (8-12 for 101 yards, 2 TDs), WR **Godfrey Smith** (4 receptions for 62 yards, 1 TD), WR **John McGough** (2 catches for 31 yards, 1 TD)... Additional highlights - punter **Kyle Negrete** averaged 43.0 yards on 4 punts), Rogan's 42-yard kickoff return setup **Stanley Shurson's** eventual 48-yard field goal in the 4th period (ties 4th longest USD field goal), and **Kyle Kofod** blocked APU's first field goal attempt in the first quarter.
