GAME #3: The USD Toreros (1-1) play both their home opener and PFL opener this coming Saturday, September 19th, when they host PFL newcomer Marist College (1-1). Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. at Torero Stadium.

SERIES RECORD: This is the 5th meeting between USD and Marist with the Toreros owning a 4-0 series record... These two teams last met in the 2008 opener at Torero Stadium on August 29th with USD winning 40-22... Marist led 9-7 at the end of the 1st quarter with **JT Rogan** going down with a season-ending knee injury... QB **Sebastian Trujillo** tossed two TDs in the 2nd quarter as USD led 20-9 at halftime... Trujillo finished 16-23 for 191 yards and 4 TDs... **Phil Morelli** stepped in for the injured Rogan and finished with 17 carries for 64 yards... WR **John Matthews** hauled in 4 receptions for 63 yards and 2 TDs... LB **Loka Kanongatta** led the defense with 13 stops and 1 blocked kick.

TOREROS FALL TO NORTHERN COLORADO, 31-12: USD put up a good fight in Greeley, Colorado this past Saturday, but came away with a 31-12 defeat to the Northern Colorado Bears (1-1), a scholarship program that is a member of the competitive Big Sky Conference... UNC jumped out to a 17-0 lead at halftime as they totaled 312 yards of offense... Big plays were USD's nemesis as the Bears' first score came on a 80-yard TD pass from QB Bryan Waggener to WR Alex Thompson... In the 2nd quarter RB Andre Harris busted loose for a 39-yard rush and one play later RB John Burnley found the endzone from 34 yards out... USD played its best ball of the day in the 2nd half as they found the endzone twice to pull to within 17-12... USD's first score came on a 10-yard TD hook-up between QB **Sebastian Trujillo** and WR **John McGough** with 4:53 left in the 3rd quarter (USD's PAT attempt was wide left)... The Toreros then strung together an 11-play, 59-yard drive that began late in the period and was capped off with 13:01 left in the game on a 2-yard rush by TB **Brendan Feliczak**... Leading up to that score was a Trujillo scramble for 16 yards on a key 4th-and-4 from the UNC 28-yard line... Three plays later Feliczak, who had 7 carries for 22 yards during the run, scored from 2-yards out (Trujillo's PAT pass attempt failed)... UNC answered again with a big play to go back up 24-12 as Waggener hit WR Patrick Walker for 65 yards down to the San Diego 7, and Harris found the endzone on the very next play... After USD went three-and-out, UNC scored again for the day's final score of 31-12... The Bears rushed seven straight times, with Harris culminating the drive with a 19-yard TD - it was Harris' 6th carry of that drive... For USD offensively, Feliczak finished with 69 yards and 1 TD on 16 carries... Trujillo completed 18-37 for 121 yards and 1 TD, but 3 of his 4 picks came in the 2nd half... **Kyle Negrete** averaged 45.5 yards on 6 punts, including a personal-best 70-yarder in the 3rd period... WR John McGough caught 5 balls for 61 yards and 1 score... Defensively USD was paced by CB **Al-Rilwan Adeyemi** (8 tackles), LB **Loka Kanongataa** (6 tackles), **Derek Pilkington** (6 stops) and **Derek Marten** (5 tackles, 1 fumble recovery)... For UNC, RB Andre Harris finished with 152 yards rushing & 2 TDs, and QB Bryan Waggener was 10-20 for 221 yards and 1 TD.

Head Coach Ron Caragher enters his third season at the helm of the Torero football program. In 2008 he guided the Toreros to their second straight 9-2 record, and the team

placed second in the PFL with its 6-2 mark. The season was capped off with the team's third straight win, a 28-20 home win over scholarship-program UC Davis. Caragher's first season was outstanding as he guided the Toreros to a 9-2 overall mark and 6-1 PFL record, good for a share of first place. It marked the 3rd straight season that the Toreros were crowned PFL Champions. USD finished ranked 2nd in the final Sports Network FCS Mid-Major poll. Seven Toreros were named Sports Network FCS All-Americans, while 11 players were tabbed Mid-Major All-Americans by the same outlet. Senior QB Josh Johnson was drafted by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 5th round, and three other players received looks by NFL clubs. Johnson, who passed for 43 touchdowns with just one interception, was a Walter Payton Award Finalist. Senior defensive end Eric Bakhtiari, who led the nation in sacks, was a finalist for the Ted Hendricks Award. Under Caragher's guidance as Offensive Coordinator, the Toreros ranked first in the nation among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams in scoring (44.36 points per game) and passing efficiency (197.35 rating). The 44 points per game average is a new USD single season record. Additionally, the Toreros ranked 3rd in the nation in total offense (483.1 yards per game). The University of San Diego introduced Ron Caragher as its new head football coach on January 9, 2007. Caragher became the Toreros' 12th head football coach at USD and replaced Jim Harbaugh who was hired as Stanford's head coach. Prior to being hired at USD, Caragher, (pronounced "CARE-ah-ger"), spent four seasons (2003-2006) at the University of Kentucky as an assistant coach under Rich Brooks. He was the running backs coach all four years, and starting in 2005 served as Kentucky's Head Recruiting Coordinator. In 2006 Kentucky finished 8-5 overall, and 4-4 in the Southeast Conference Eastern Division, good for a tie for third place and the program's best league mark since 1993. The 8 wins is also the program's best win total since their 9-3 campaign back in 1984. The Wildcats finished off the 2006 season in fine fashion as they upset Clemson, 28-20, in the Music City Bowl on December 29th. It was Kentucky's first bowl appearance since 1999, and the program's first bowl win in 22 years. Caragher also has Southern California ties. He spent nine seasons (1994-2002) on UCLA's staff where he worked with both Terry Donahue and Bob Toledo. After two seasons as a Graduate Assistant, Caragher was promoted to assistant coach where he coached Bruin wide receivers. Additionally, he coached punters all seven seasons (1996-2002), and kickers for his final two years (2001-02). During the 1997 and 1998 seasons, UCLA won a school-record 20 straight games and averaged more than 40 points per game while setting numerous school records. He coached in five bowl games during his term there, including the Aloha, Cotton, Rose, Sun, and Las Vegas bowls. A native of Morgan Hill, California, Caragher was a three-sport letterman at Bellarmine College Prep (1982-84) where he earned three varsity letters as a quarterback in football. He earned an athletic scholarship to UCLA in 1985 and went on to earn four varsity letters (1986-89) and was part of teams that won four consecutive bowl games. After graduating from UCLA in 1990 with a B.A. in Psychology, Ron went on to earn his Master's Degree in Education (Administrative Studies) in 1995. Caragher and his wife, Wendy, have three sons, Josh, Ryan, and Scott.

TOREROS DEAL AZUSA PACIFIC 24-12 LOSS: The USD Toreros won their fifth consecutive season opener with Saturday's 24-12 victory over Azusa Pacific at Citrus Stadium... The Torero defense held the Cougars to just two field goals and a net total of 12 yards rushing on 23 attempts... Strong safety **Derek Pilkington** (8 tackles), LB **Loka Kanongataa** (7 stops, 1 sack, 1 fumble recovery), and DE **Kevin Dunn** (6 stops; 2 tackles for loss) paced the defense... Chipping with 5 tackles each were **Gabriel Derricks**, **Frankie Zimmerman** and **Kellan Barker**... Offensively the Toreros were paced TB **Phil Morelli** (82 yards on 19 carries), RB **JT Rogan** (50 yards on 7 carries; 2-yard TD rush), QB **Sebastian Trujillo** (8-12 for 101 yards, 2 TDs), WR **Godfrey Smith** (4 receptions for 62 yards, 1 TD), WR **John McGough** (2 catches for 31 yards, 1 TD)... Additional highlights - punter **Kyle Negrete** averaged 43.0 yards on 4 punts), Rogan's 42-yard kickoff return setup **Stanley Shurson's** eventual 48-yard field goal in the 4th period (ties 4th longest USD field goal), and **Kyle Kofoed** blocked APU's first field goal attempt in the first quarter.

TORERO TIDBITS: The Toreros were 6-1 in home games last year at Torero Stadium... The team's lone loss at the hands of Dayton (30-22) on November 1st, 2008, ended a school-record 28-game winning streak at Torero Stadium that began back in game five of the 2004 campaign... **Kyle Negrete's** 70-yard punt in the 3rd quarter at Northern Colorado was the third longest in school history - the record is held by Vern Valdez in 1957 (85 yards vs. Mexico Poly), while Dylan Mora holds down the second spot with a 73-yarder against Dayton in 2001... Through two games Negrete leads the PFL and ranks 5th in the nation with his 44.50 average... For active PFL players, USD has two players leading in their statistical areas - **JT Rogan** leads in career rushing with 3,082 yards; **Sebastian Trujillo** leads in passing yards (3,044)... USD's balanced running attack has been spread out between **Phil Morelli** (99 yds), **Brendan Feliczak** (96 yds), **JT Rogan** (69 yds) and **Matt Jelmini** (49 yds)... Receivers John McGough (7-92 yds, 2 TDs) and **Godfrey Smith** (7-81, 1 TD) have been **Sebastian Trujillo** main targets... Rogan is averaging 23.7 yds on 6 kickoff returns... Strong safety **Derek Pilkington** leads the defense with 14 stops.

JOHNSON & MATTHEWS STICK WITH NFL SQUADS: Two former Toreros received good news recently regarding their bids with NFL teams, while one did not. Former Torero quarterback Josh Johnson has made the Tampa Bay roster as the team's third quarterback. John Matthews, in the Colts camp, was signed to the team's practice squad. Former USD defensive end Eric Bakhtiari was waived by the San Diego Chargers after competing for a spot at linebacker. In three preseason appearances Josh Johnson combined to complete 17-of-30 passes for 218 yards and 1 TD. In his first preseason appearance against the Tennessee Titans, he completed 3-of-5 passes for 15 yards, but impressed his coaches with a 43-yard scrambling touchdown run. In the team's final preseason appearance against the Houston Texans, Johnson completed 12-of-21 passes for 182 yards and 1 score. He directed one 4th quarter touchdown drive and another 84-yard march that came up 5 yards short near the end of regulation. On the team's depth chart, he finds himself behind Bryon Leftwich and Josh Freeman. Matthews appeared in all four preseason contests for the Colts. He finished with 7 receptions for 85 yards with a long of 21 against the Bengals. He caught 3 balls for 30 yards against Minnesota.

SEBASTIAN TRUJILLO NAMED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST: For the fourth straight year the USD football program will be represented on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, bestowed annually upon the top player in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Senior quarterback **Sebastian Trujillo** (Durango, CO) is on the initial list of 20 candidates heading into the 2009 campaign. He follows in the footsteps of quarterback Josh Johnson (2006 & 2007) and wide receiver John Matthews (2008). In final voting, Johnson was 6th in 2006 and 3rd in 2007; Matthews placed 7th last season. Last year Trujillo passed for 2,822 yards and 35 touchdowns on his way to earning First Team All-PFL honors. "It is an honor for Sebastian to be named to the Walter Payton Award pre-season watch list," said head coach Ron Caragher. "I am confident he will build upon a successful '08 season in which he was a first year starter in our program, and I look forward to his continued growth and development as a quarterback and leader of our offense." TOREROS PFL FAVORITES: USD was picked to win the PFL title in the preseason PFL Coaches poll, receiving 5 first place votes and 77 points... USD was followed by Dayton (3), 71 points; Jacksonville (2), 71 points; Morehead St., 51 points; Butler, 42 points; Drake, 40 points; Davidson, 37 points; Marist, 32 points; Valparaiso, 20 points, and Campbell, 9 points.

2009 TORERO TEAM CAPTAINS NAMED: The following four Toreros were tabbed as 2009 team captains by their teammates. Offensive captains will be QB **Sebastian Trujillo** (Durango, CO) and running back **JT Rogan** (Coronado, CA), while the defensive captains are cornerback **Gabriel Derricks** (Oak Park, CA) and defensive end **Kevin Dunn** (Santa Barbara, CA). Rogan was selected a team captain last year as well.

SCOUTING THE MARIST COLLEGE RED FOXES: Marist College (Poughkeepsie, NY) is in its first season as a member of the Pioneer Football League... Head Coach Jim Parady (18th Yr.) returns 79 players and 18 starters from last year's 4-7 ball club... The Red Foxes are off to a 1-1 start after opening the season with a 31-12 road victory over Sacred Heart... This past weekend they dropped their PFL opener to Drake, 34-6... In that contest the Red Foxes committed 6 turnovers (4 fumbles, 2 interceptions) while totaling 181 yards of offense (38 rush; 143 pass)... QB Chris Debowski completed 12-of-21 passes for 143 yards, but was sacked 6 times by the Drake Bulldogs... WR James LaMacchia hauled in 6 balls for 74 yards... Defensively for Marist, LB Kevin Foley totaled 11 tackles and DB Nick Andre chipped in with 10... Two-game leaders include RB O'Neil Anderson (92 yards), RB Greg Whipple (38 yards, 2 TDs), QB Chris Debowski (26-41 for 360 yards and 1 TD), WR James LaMacchia (14 receptions for 227 yards, 1 TD), LB Kevin Foley (22 tackles) and DB Nick Andre (19 tackles)... Marist is a former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

JT ROGAN GRANTED 6TH YEAR BY NCAA: USD All-America running back **JT Rogan** (Coronado, CA) was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA after missing almost the entire 2008 season because of a left knee injury. Rogan, the school's all-time leading rusher, suffered a season-ending knee injury in the first quarter of USD's 2008 home opener against Marist on August 29th. Rogan, who redshirted his freshman year back in 2004, had to file for medical and hardship waivers to receive the sixth year. "I am excited that JT has been granted a sixth year of eligibility," said 3rd-year head coach Ron Caragher. "His injury at the time appeared to be a tragic ending to an outstanding career. Now he will get the chance to finish on a higher note. JT is an all-purpose type player as he contributes in so many ways - as a runner, blocker, receiver, and returner. Having cleared the first hurdle of being granted a sixth year, his next task will be to return to full health through rehabilitation and conditioning. His addition to our team will enhance an already strong group of running backs returning for us." In last year's season-opening 40-22 win over Marist, Rogan was off to a great start to his senior year with 46 yards rushing on 3 attempts; 1 touchdown catch for 29 yards and a 36-yard kickoff return before leaving the game late in the first quarter. He enters the 2009 campaign as the program's all-time leader in rushing yards (3,013), TDs (47) and all-purpose yardage (5,344). In 2007 Rogan was named first team FCS All-America and led the nation in kickoff returns. As a running back in 2007, he rushed for 1,021 yards and 10 TDs, while catching 30 balls for seven TDs.

TORERO FOOTBALL STAFF: Third-year head coach **Ron Caragher** has a mix of returners (5) and newcomers (6) on his football staff this season... Returners include **Todd Washington** (3rd year), OL coach who also takes over as Offensive Coordinator; **George Darlington** (2nd year), Defensive Coordinator; **Tanner Engstrand** (5th year), moves to QB's coach; **Mike Rish** (26th year), Senior Offensive Assistant; and **Jon Sumrall** (3rd year), DL coach and Recruiting Coordinator. Newcomers include **Sam Anno**, LB's and Special Teams Coordinator; **Keith Carter**, Tight Ends; **Jerome Pathon**, Wide Receivers; **Joe Staab**, Defensive Assistant; **Ken Stills**, Defensive Backs; and **Andrew Rolin**, Undergraduate Assistant. **Dorian Keller** (2nd year) is the program's Administrative Assistant.

TORERO SUCCESS THE PAST SIX YEARS: USD football has accomplished some outstanding highlights over the past six years, most notably its 55-12 combined record (.821 winning percentage) and 29-5 PFL record (.852 winning percentage). In two of the past three seasons USD has led all FCS team in scoring, including a program-best 44.4 average in 2007. All told, USD has had 23 Sports Network Mid-Major All-Americans and 47 First Team All-Pioneer Football League honorees.

NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP SUBDIVISION (FCS): The term that represents the level of Division I football in which USD plays is Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships and compete in a 16-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion. The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. FBS teams can offer up to 85 scholarships.

LOOKING AHEAD TO NEXT WEEK: The Toreros have a bye on September 26th before making back-to-back PFL road trips to the midwest to face Butler (Oct. 3rd) and Valparaiso (Oct. 10th).
