## UH-USU STORYLINES

- ▶ UH has lost its last 10 road games dating back to 2011, which is tied for the second longest in school history.
- ▶ UH has started a season 0-7 twice — this season and during its winless campaign of 1998 (0-12).
- ▶ UH's current seven-game losing streak is tied for the third longest in school history.
- ▶ UH is one of five remaining winless teams in FBS this season.
- ▶ Quarterback Sean Schroeder has thrown for 300-plus yards in four straight games with 12 TDs.
- ▶ Over the last four games, UH is out-scoring its opponents 57-12 in the fourth quarter with three games coming down to the final possession.
- ▶ UH has been held scoreless in the third quarter five times in seven games this season and is out-scored 66-21.

## THIS WEEK'S MATCH-UP

The University of Hawai'i football team embarks on a 10-day road trip which will cover nearly 10,000 miles and four states in search of its first win of the season. First up for the Rainbow Warriors is a Mountain West contest against Utah State, Saturday, Nov. 2 in Logan, Utah. Kick-off is 2:00 p.m. MT (10:00 a.m. HT) at Romney Stadium.

UH (0-7, 0-5 MW), which dropped its seventh consecutive game with a 35-28 defeat to Colorado State last week in Honolulu, will then fly to the east coast to play a non-conference game at Navy, Nov. 9 in Annapolis, Md.

For the third time in the last four games, Hawai'i had a chance to win or tie the game on its final possession, however, its Hail Mary attempt fell incomplete. The Rainbow Warriors rallied from a 35-17 halftime deficit, shutting out the Rams in the second half, and scoring 11 points late in the fourth quarter to force the dramatic ending.

Thus, UH is off to its worst start since its winless 1998 campaign and are assured of a losing record for the third consecutive season. Its current seven-game losing streak marks the second straight year the team has strung together a losing streak of that length and is tied for the third longest in school history.

Utah State (4-4, 3-1) was idle last week and enters the contest 3-1 in its inaugural season in the Mountain West and are coming off a 45-10 victory at New Mexico two weeks ago.

GENERAL NOTES

UH-CSU POST-GAME NOTES:

▶ UH dropped back-to-back homecoming games for the first time since losing five straight for 1994 to '98.

▶ UH dropped to 37-26-1 all-time in Homecoming games since 1949.

▶ Senior wide receiver Billy Ray Stutzmann extended his streak to 27 straight games with a reception following his 27-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter. Stutzmann has scored in each of the last four games.

▶ Sean Schroeder had his fourth straight 300-yard game. Schroeder finished 28-for-49 with a career-high 349 yards and two touchdowns and one interception. Schroeder also scored on a 2-yd run in the 4th quarter, his second career rushing TD (also at Colorado State last year).

▶ Junior quarterback Taylor Graham made his first appearance since UH's road game at Nevada on Sept. 21. Graham was intercepted by Kevin Pierre-Louis on his first throw in the third quarter and finished 3-of-7 for 37 yards with a long of 28.

▶ UH trailed at the half for the sixth time in seven games this year.

▶ Senior wide receiver Chris Gant scored for the third straight game with a 38-yard reception in the first quarter and finished with a career high eight catches for 159 yards. The senior wide receiver has five touchdowns and has had more than 100 yards receiving in three of the last four games.

▶ Freshman defensive back Trayvon Henderson recorded an interception for the third straight game with 2nd quarter pick of Garrett Grayson.

▶ UH gave up a defensive touchdown for the fourth time this season when Max Morgan returned a UH fumble 73 yards for a score in the first quarter.

▶ Freshman Diocemy Saint Juste returned his first career kickoff 78 yards in the first quarter. The freshman finished with four returns for 161 yards and a 32.2-yard return average.

UH VS. USU SERIES HISTORY:

▶ The series is tied 6-6.

▶ The teams last met Nov. 5, 2011 in Honolulu. USU erased a 28-7 halftime deficit and out-scored the Warriors 28-3 in the second half for a

35-31 victory.

▶ USU has a 3-2 advantage in games played in Logan, Utah.

▶ UH won the last meeting in Logan, 45-7 in 2010, in a game in which the Warriors out-scored the Aggies 31-0 in the second half.

▶ UH won five of the seven meetings when the teams were part of the Western Athletic Conference and scored 45 points or more in those games.

▶ The series began in 1927 with UH winning 21-20 on Dec. 17, 1927 in Honolulu.

**THE ROAD LESS TRAVELED:** Dating back to the 2011 season, UH has lost its last 10 road games, which is tied for the second longest streak in school history. Included in that streak is six consecutive conference losses. The school record is 15 straight losses which ran from 1995-99 seasons. UH lost 10 straight from 1974-79. Last season, the Warriors lost a single-season school record six games.

**LIFE ON THE ROAD:** For the sixth time in seven seasons, the Rainbow Warriors will stay on the continent for consecutive road games. Following this week's Utah State game, UH will travel to the East Coast for a non-conference game at Navy. The trip will cover 10 days, 9,863 air miles, and seven airports (Honolulu-Los Angeles, Ogden, Salt Lake City, Baltimore, Washington D.C. and San Francisco). For a road trip to Army and Colorado in 2010, in which the team travelled the farthest east for a game in school history, the trip lasted 13 days and covered 11,184 miles.

**ON NATIONAL TV:** UH has made 66 all-time appearances on national television and owns a 17-47-2 record. UH has lost its last 12 games on national television, its last win against Colorado on ESPN2 to open the 2011 season.

**FOURTH QUARTER DRAMA:** Over the past four games, UH has out-scored its opponents 57-12 in the fourth quarter, which included three dramatic finishes. The Warriors nearly erased a 42-3 third quarter deficit against Fresno State by scoring 34 straight second half points, including 20 in the fourth quarter before eventually falling 42-37. Against UNLV, UH scored 20 straight fourth quarter points, erasing a 36-17 deficit to take the lead before losing on a last second field goal. Last week, UH rallied from a 35-17 halftime deficit against Colorado State, shutting out the Rams in the second half and closing to within 35-28 before a last second Hail Mary fell incomplete.

**THIRD QUARTER HICCUP:** UH has been held scoreless in the third quarter five times in seven games this season, including the last two games against UNLV and Colorado State. Overall, the Warriors have been out-scored 66-21 in the third quarter with only three scoring drives in 25 possessions. During those possessions, UH punted the ball 12 times, turned the ball over six times, missed three field goals, and turned the ball over on downs once.

**WE MUST PROTECT THIS HOUSE:** The 2013 season marks Aloha Stadium's 39th season as home to the Rainbow Warrior football team. The stadium opened Sept. 12, 1975 and UH boasts an all-time mark of 183-121-4 for a 60.1 winning percentage in the Halawa venue.

**OFFENSIVELY SPEAKING...:** Over the past four games, the Rainbow Warriors have averaged 32.3 points and 444.0 yards of total offense, including 368.5 yards through the air. The team amassed 431 total yards (377 passing) against Fresno State, 473 total yards (386 passing) vs. San Jose State, 454 total yards (325 passing) at UNLV, and 418 (386 passing) vs. Colorado State.

**BACK IN THE SADDLE:** Despite the return of starting quarterback Taylor Graham, who started the team's first three games, last year's starter Sean Schroeder got the starting nod and took the majority of the snaps last week against Colorado State. The Laguna Niguel, Calif., native passed for a career-high 349 yards (28-of-49) and two touchdowns while also rushing for another score. He has passed for 300 or more yards in the last four games of which he boasts totals of 97-of-172 (56.4%) for 1,337 yards and 12 touchdowns. Schroeder ranks sixth in the Mountain West and 34th nationally, averaging 247.7 yards per game.

**MAKING BIG PLAYS:** The receiving corps is a big reason for UH's resurgence on offense. Senior wideout Chris Gant has 467 receiving yards on 22 catches and four touchdowns over the past four game. The Long Beach, Calif., native has caught touchdown passes in three straight games and is the team's deep-ball threat with five catches of 40 or more yards in the past four games. Senior wideout Billy Ray Stutzmann extended his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 27 and has a touchdown catch in each of the past four games after missing the first three games due to an off-season injury.

**O-LINE SHUFFLE:** After starting five different offensive line combinations in the first five games, UH has settled on a starting group. The past two games has featured a line of tackles Sean Shigematsu (right) and Mike Milovale (left), guards Ben Dew (right) and Kody Afusia (left), and center Ben Clarke. Only Clarke has started all seven games at the same position, while Milovale has started all seven games between guard and tackle positions.

**DEFENSIVELY SPEAKING...:** UH is tied for third nationally with 62.0 tackles for loss, averaging 8.9 per game, and is fifth in the Mountain West and tied for 43rd nationally with 16 sacks. The Warriors have also forced 12 turnovers this season (8 INTs and 6 fumbles), which is tied for 43rd nationally.

**SECOND HALF ADJUSTMENT:** After surrendering 313 total yards and 35 points to Colorado State in the first half last week, the UH defense shut down the Rams offense in the second half. The Warriors did not allow a point after intermission and held CSU to only 95 yards of total offense in seven possessions. The Rams punted all seven times and did not cross midfield, while running back Kapri Bibbs managed only 50 yards rushing and did not find the endzone after totaling 87 yards and three scores in the first half.

**CREATING TURNOVERS:** The UH defense created 10 turnovers in the last four games, including six interceptions. With a pick last week against Colorado State, freshman defensive back Trayvon Henderson has an interception in each of the past three games. Cornerback Ne'Quan Phillips had picks in consecutive games against Fresno State and San Jose State. The sophomore from Miami, Fla., leads all defensive backs with seven passes defended along with 34 total tackles.

**TACKLING MACHINE:** Linebacker Brenden Daley is the team leader in tackles with 52 and is tied for 21st nationally averaging 1.36 tackles for loss per game with 9.5 total. The Moorpark, Calif., native has led the team in tackles in three games, including a career-high 12 tackles against UNLV. Senior Art Laurel is second on the team with 51 tackles, including 8.0 for loss, three sacks, and one interception. The Wahiawa, O'ahu native tied his career-high with 10 tackles last week against Colorado State. Linebacker Jerrol Garcia-Williams has 44 tackles and has at least seven tackles in five of seven games this season.

**THE HARDY WAY:** Senior defensive back John Hardy-Tuliau has 39 career starts – most of any current player on the team – in his fourth season at Hawai'i. The Temecula, Calif., native has starts at safety, cornerback, and nickelback and has accumulated 192 career tackles, six interceptions, seven blocked kicks, and two touchdowns. This season, Hardy-Tuliau has 28 tackles, including 3.5 for loss, and four pass breakups.

**TAKE IT TO THE HOUSE:** UH has come close to returning a kickoff for a touchdown in each of the past two games. Last week against Colorado State, freshman Diocemy Saint Juste - making his first start at returner - busted his first career return 78 yards. Junior Bubba Poueu-Luna started his first game as kick returner against UNLV and returned one 86 yards in the second quarter. Saint Juste averaged 37.5 yards on four returns last week while Poueu-Luna averaged 37.7 yards on three returns against UNLV. Senior Chris Gant started the first five games at kick returner and averaged 21.6 yards on 18 returns.

**MAN OF ALL TRADES:** Junior Scott Harding has done it all for the Warriors during his career and this year is no different starting games at receiver, punter, and punt returner. The Brisbane, Australia native leads the team with 33 receptions and has used his rugby-style kicking as a weapon for the team at punter, averaging 41.5 yards on 29 punts. He had a long of 62 yards last week against Colorado State in which he averaged 46.0 yards on six punts. In addition, Harding ranks 30th nationally and third in the MW with a 9.1 punt return average. Last season, he finished the year 13th nationally in with a 12.8 average.

**OH, SNAP:** For the first time in nine years, a player not named Ingram is serving as long snapper. Brothers Jake (2005-08) and Luke (2009-12) were each four-year starters before taking their talents to the NFL. Junior safety Kawika Borden is the team's long snapper for punts while freshman Brodie Nakama is handling the short snaps on extra points and PATs. During the Ingram era, UH did not botch a field goal or PAT attempt due to a bad snap. UH has one each this season.

**BIG SHOES TO FILL:** UH also has a new primary punter for the first time in five years. Junior college transfer Ruben Guzman of Riverside City College and Scott Harding are each handling the punting duties this season. Guzman has 23 punts for a 41.6 average. He has two punts over 50 yards and four pinned inside the 20. The left-footed kicker averaged 42.7 yards per punt last season at Riverside City College.

With nearly 40 years of experience as an assistant coach at both the collegiate and professional ranks, Norm Chow spent the 2012 season as a head skipper for the first time in his career. Chow and his Hawai'i Warriors were faced with a daunting schedule that included road games at USC and Brigham Young — two former stomping grounds for Chow — which led to a 3-9 finish in the program's first season in the Mountain West.

Statistics aside, Chow spent his inaugural season instilling discipline and a new offense to a program which at one time appeared in eight bowls during a 12-year span. UH switched from the Run-and-Shoot offense to a more conventional Pro-Set offense, which Chow has mastered and become known as one of the top offensive minds in the country.

Chow, a Punahou School alum and Palolo Valley native, was named the program's 22nd head coach, Dec. 22, 2011, succeeding Greg McMackin who retired after four seasons as head coach of the Warriors. Chow also became the first Asian-American head coach of a major college football program. His long coaching resume includes 39 years of experience collegiately and in the National Football League. Among his 36 years as a collegiate coach, Chow spent 27 years at BYU, one year at North Carolina State, four years at USC, three years at UCLA and one year at his alma mater, Utah. Chow also spent three years as offensive coordinator for the NFL's Tennessee Titans.

Prior to arrival in Mānoa, Chow was the offensive coordinator at Utah, where he led the Utes to a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 South Division in 2011 and a 30-27 victory over Georgia Tech in the Sun Bowl.

Known as an offensive mastermind, success has followed Chow where ever he's been. A three-time national Assistant Coach of the Year, Chow has served as offensive coordinator for three national championship teams (Brigham Young-1984 and USC-2003 and '04) and has tutored three Heisman Trophy winners (Ty Detmer-BYU, Carson Palmer-USC and Matt Leinart-USC) and six NFL first-round draft picks (Palmer, Leinart, Philip Rivers-N.C. State, Steve Young-BYU, Jim McMahon-BYU and Marc Wilson-BYU).

**WE ARE THE "RAINBOW WARRIORS"**

When referring to the UH football team, please use the nickname "Rainbow Warriors." In an effort to standardize its nicknames, on July 1, 2013, the University of Hawai'i officially changed its men's team nickname to "Rainbow Warriors." The school's women's teams are still referred to as "Rainbow Wahine." The word "Wahine" (pronounced wah-HEE-nay) means woman in the Hawaiian language. The rainbow has been part of UH's nickname since 1923.

**WHAT'S AN 'OKINA?**

What's that punctuation mark in the word Hawai'i? In the Hawaiian language, it's called an 'okina, which translates literally means separator. Phonetically it is referred to as a glottal stop, similar to the sound that would be made in the English oh-oh. The 'okina is actually a letter in the Hawaiian language.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i hung tough with No. 24 Southern California for much of the game before succumbing 30-13 at Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium. The game was one of 17 played on the opening day of the 2013 college football season.

The Rainbow Warriors (0-1) led 5-3 after a safety and field goal to start the second quarter before allowing 17 unanswered to end the half. After a scoreless third quarter, the Trojans added 10 more in the fourth to lead 30-5 before the Hawai'i ended the scoring with a 60-yard pass play from Taylor Graham to Keith Kirkwood.

Graham, a junior from Wheaton, Ill., was making his first career FBS start. He was under pressure for much of the game and was sacked seven times while throwing four interceptions. He finished 16-of-41 for 208 yards.

UH finished with 231 yards of total offense, including only 23 on the ground. USC netted 364 total yards as quarterbacks Cody Kessler and Max Wittek each played one half. The Trojans rushed for 192 yards with Tre Madden (109) and Justin Davis (74) combining for 183 yards.

Graham's second pass was intercepted by Sua Cravens, which gave the Trojans a short field and led to a field goal. His second and third picks led to 14 points, including one that slipped through receiver Marcus Kemp's hands right to USC defender Josh Shaw, who raced 35 yards for the score and a 17-5 lead.

After trailing 3-0 at the start of the second quarter, the Rainbow Warrior defense came up big with a safety after a sack by linebacker Art Laurel on USC quarterback Cody Kessler. The play was set up by Scott Harding's pooch punt to the 1-yard line.

On the ensuing free kick, the Warriors marched downfield and settled for a 42-yard Tyler Hadden field goal for a 5-3 lead. That advantage held up until Graham's second interception led to a Kessler to Nelson Agholor 19-yard touchdown pass play.

Hawai'i had a chance to stop the bleeding as Kamalani Alo ripped the ball out of the hands of USC punt returner Marqise Lee giving the Rainbow Warriors the ball. UH turned the ball over on downs and the Trojans capitalized, marching into position for a career-long 52-yard field goal by Agholor.

In the fourth quarter, Graham's fourth errant pass deep in USC territory led to a 22-yard field goal by Agholor and a 23-5 lead. The Trojans tacked on a meaningless touchdown with Justin Davis' three yard run with 42 seconds left. The Warriors' were not done, as Graham connected with a 60-yard bomb.

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Hawai'i hung tough in the first half before Oregon State scored 19 unanswered points in the second, to hand the Rainbow Warriors a 33-14 loss Saturday in a non-conference game at Reser Stadium.

With the score tied at 14 at the half, the Beavers used a pair of Sean Mannion to Brandin Cooks touchdowns to seal the victory. Mannion finished the game with 372 yards passing while Cooks had seven catches for 92 yards and a pair of scores.

For the game Oregon State, out-gained UH 508-239, including a 306-111 advantage after the break.

Down 14-0 in the second quarter, the Warrior defense came up big as safety John Hardy-Tuliau forced Mannion to hurry his throw and Julian Gener intercepted his pass and returned it 23 yards for the touchdown.

UH forced OSU to punt on its next possession and Graham led the Warriors on a nine-play, 80-yard drive capped by a 15-yard touchdown pass to Clark Evans which tied the score at 14 heading into halftime.

The Beavers opened the second half scoring with Brandin Cooks' first of two third quarter hook-ups with Mannion. After a Hawai'i punt, OSU drove the field again, capped by a Mannion-to-Cooks TD for a 28-14 lead.

The Beavers scored on their opening possession of the game, spurred by a pass interference penalty by Hawai'i and 48-yard screen pass from Mannion to Storm Woods. On the next play, Mannion found Kevin Clute in the back of the end zone for the score.

OSU got on the scoreboard again in the second quarter as Mannion found Richard Mullaney on a 19-yard scoring strike. UH would score consecutive touchdowns to knot the score up going into the locker room, but were shutout in the second half, sealing their fate.

RENO, Nev. – Nevada got a solid performance from a redshirt freshman quarterback and the Wolf Pack defense forced six turnovers to hand Hawai'i a 31-9 loss in the Mountain West opener for both teams.

In his first career start, Tyler Stewart threw for 202 yards and three touchdowns to give Nevada (2-2, 1-0 MW) its third straight win in the series over the Rainbow Warriors (0-3, 0-1 MW). UH meanwhile, turned the ball over six times—all in the second half. Both of Nevada's second-half touchdowns were off UH turnovers.

Hawai'i trailed just 17-9 at the break, but failed to score in the second half. It was the second straight game that UH was shutout after the break, following its 33-14 loss at Oregon State two weeks ago.

It was a physical game that saw four UH starters knocked out of the game, including quarterback Taylor Graham. Sean Schroeder came in relief late in the second quarter, while reserves Jeremy Higgins and Ikaika Woolsey also saw action behind center.

UH got off to strong start, forcing a three-and-out on defense then marching down field on a 13-play drive that ended with a Tyler Hadden field goal. The Wolf Pack, however, responded with 17 unanswered points off of three drives of 70-plus yards.

The Rainbow Warriors continued to move the ball in the first half but a pair of UH drives stalled in Wolf Pack territory with failed fourth-down conversions. UH took some momentum into the locker room with a touchdown drive in its final possession of the second quarter as Schroeder found Chris Gant for 21-yard score to make it 17-9.

UH, however, got off to a rough start in the second half as an interception deep in its own territory set up a short field for the Wolf Pack. Nevada cashed in five plays later on a Brandon Wimberly 7-yard catch. Another UH turnover led to a Wolf Pack touchdown early in the fourth quarter when a Brock Hekking sack caused a UH fumble that was returned two yards by Alex Bertrando.

UH ended the contest with a 376-340 yard advantage but couldn't overcome a rash of turnovers.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i nearly overcame a 39-point deficit before falling to No. 25 Fresno State, 42-37, Saturday in a Mountain West contest at Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium.

The Rainbow Warriors (0-4, 0-2 MW), who saw their season-opening losing streak extend to four games, rallied from a 42-3 third quarter deficit by scoring 34 unanswered points. UH threatened the NCAA record for largest comeback victory of 35 points set by Michigan State over Northwestern in 2006.

Backup quarterback Sean Schroeder threw for a career-high 321 yards and three touchdowns in less than two quarters of action after replacing starter Ikaika Woolsey, who made his first career start.

With 1:57 left in the game, Schroeder directed the Warriors to the Fresno State 40 yard line by completing 6-of-8 passes, including a critical fourth down conversion. With the clock winding down, his final pass was intercepted by L.J. Jones ending the rally.

Woolsey, a redshirt freshman, finished 7-of-19 for 56 yards and his one interception was returned 56 yards for a touchdown, giving Fresno State its largest lead. Schroeder completed 17-of-27, including two passes of 50- and 60-yards to receiver Chris Gant, who finished with four catches for 133 yards. Running back Steven Lakalaka rushed 13 times for 66 yards and two scores.

The Bulldogs (4-0, 2-0) scored on three of their first four possessions for a 21-0 lead and scored three quick third quarter touchdowns to build their lead to 42-3 with 6:15 remaining. Quarterback Derek Carr threw for 324 yards and two touchdowns, both to receiver Josh Harper, who finished with 123 yards on nine receptions.

During UH's big comeback, the Warriors forced four Bulldog turnovers – two interceptions and two fumbles which led to three scores. Hawai'i's first four touchdowns averaged 33 seconds in length while three of its drives lasted only two plays.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i got off to a fast start but saw San Jose State reel off 31 straight points in a 37-27 loss Saturday in a Mountain West game at Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium.

In the first meeting between the teams as MW members, the Rainbow Warriors (0-5, 0-3 MW) led 14-3 in the first quarter before the Spartans scored 31 unanswered for a 34-14 lead. Hawai'i saw its season-opening losing streak extend to five games, its worst start since the winless 1998 campaign. The Spartans (2-3, 1-1) snapped a three-game losing streak.

UH quarterback Sean Schroeder, who started the game at wide receiver, took the majority of the snaps the rest of the game and finished with 28-of-50 for a career-high 342 yards and three touchdowns. He was also picked off three times. Wide receiver Vasquez Haynes hauled in six catches for a career-high 128 yards and one score while running back Steven Lakalaka carried 16 times for 77 yards.

SJSU quarterback David Fales threw for 318 yards and three scores. The Spartans out-gained the Rainbow Warriors, 534-to-473.

After the Spartans got on the scoreboard first with a 44-yard field goal by Austin Lopez, the Warriors answered with a six-play drive capped by a nine-yard touchdown rush by Chris Gant off an end-around. The Warriors got on the scoreboard again after a SJSU punt and Schroeder found Haynes in the back of the end zone to go ahead 14-3.

But Fales led the Spartans answered back with consecutive touchdown drives – the first a 61-yard connection with Chandler Jones and the second a 35-yard pass to Billy Freeman. The Spartans extended their lead to 20-14 following a career-long 51-yard field goal by Lopez, which hit the cross bar and bounced over.

Just before the half, the Spartans scored again after UH's failed fourth-down attempt gave SJSU the ball near midfield. Two plays later, Jarrod Lawson scooted 39 yards for the score and a 27-14 halftime lead.

The Spartans extended it lead to 34-14 late in the the third quarter. UH tried to rally with Schroeder touchdown passes to Billy Ray Stutzmann (28 yards) and Chris Gant (50 yards) but it wasn't enough as the Spartans held on.

The Rainbow Warriors (0-6, 0-4 MW) rallied from a 19-point deficit in the fourth quarter to take the lead late in the game, but Nolan Kohorst nailed a 44-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Rebels (4-2, 2-0 MW) to their fourth straight win.

Sean Schroeder's 44-yard connection with Chris Gant concluded a string of 20 straight UH points to give the Rainbow Warriors a 37-36 lead with 1:44 left. UNLV, however, was able to respond in the game's final possession, driving down to the UH 27-yard line to set up Kohorst's winning field goal.

Schroeder, who made his first start of season under center, finished 24-of-47 for 325 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions. It was his third straight 300-yard game.

The Rainbow Warriors led 17-13 at the break—UH's first halftime lead of the year—however, the Rebels scored 23 unanswered points in the second half to take a sizeable lead in the fourth quarter. UNLV racked up 579 yards for the game, the most the Rainbow Warriors have surrendered in three years. Caleb Herring passed for 385 yards, while Tim Cornett ran for 162.

After a scoreless first quarter, the fireworks began in the second quarter when the teams combined for 30 points—21 of which came in the final 2:26. UH ultimately held a 17-13 lead going into the locker room.

UNLV however scored on its first three drives of the third quarter, then tacked on another touchdown early in the fourth quarter, to go up 36-27 with 13:11 remaining. However, there was no quit in a resilient UH squad as a 15-yard rumble by Steven Lakalaka and a 48-yard touchdown reception by Billy Ray Stutzmann help set the stage for the game's final two dramatic minutes when the teams exchanged scoring drives.

HONOLULU –Hawai'i saw another valiant comeback fall short in a 35-28 defeat to Colorado State in a Mountain West contest at Hawaiian Airlines Field at Aloha Stadium.

The Rainbow Warriors (0-7, 0-5 MW) remained winless after rallying from a 35-17 halftime deficit only to see their comeback fall short with a hail mary in the end-zone fall incomplete.

Quarterback Sean Schroeder passed for a career-high 349 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for another score. His main target was receiver Chris Gant, who hauled in eight catches for a career-high 159 yards and one score.

With the Rams leading 35-17 at halftime, the second half wasn't much of an offensive shootout as the teams were scoreless in the third quarter and for the first half of the fourth quarter. Schroeder then led the Warriors to consecutive scoring drives to pull UH to within 35-28 with 2:54 remaining.

After forcing the Rams to punt, Hawai'i took over one last time with 1:24 left but only managed to drive to the CSU 45-yard line before Taylor Graham's heave into the endzone dropped to Aloha Stadium turf.

UH's defense came up big in the second half, shutting out the Rams in seven possessions while allowing only 95 yards of total offense. Linebacker Art Laurel led the UH defense with 10 tackles, including one sack.

The Rams (4-4, 2-1) controlled the tempo in the first half, scoring on five of their nine possessions and tallying 313 yards of offense, including 165 on the ground. CSU running back Kapri Bibbs scored the first of his three first half touchdowns during the Rams' first drive.

After a 78-yard kickoff return by Diocemy Saint Juste on the ensuing kickoff, two plays later, Schroeder was stripped of the ball which was scooped up by CSU's Max Morgan and returned 73-yards for a touchdown.

But just as fast, the Rainbow Warriors answered with a 38-yard pass play from Schroeder to Gant during a six-play drive but the Rams scored on their next possession as Garrett Grayson hooked up with Crock Gillmore on a 20-yard strike.

Down 21-7, UH answered again as Schroeder marched the Warriors downfield in five plays capped by a 27-yard pass to Billy Ray Stutzmann, the fourth straight game the senior has scored. CSU continued to pound it on the ground with two more Bibbs' rushing touchdowns – sandwiched by a UH field goal – to push its lead to 35-17.
