Utah State Plays At Idaho Saturday In Season-Finale Aggies Face Vandals In Reunion For Andersen And Akey

QUICKLY -- To wrap up its 2009 season, Utah State (3-8, 2-5 WAC) heads to Moscow, Idaho to take on Idaho (7-4, 4-3 WAC) on Saturday, Nov. 28... Kickoff from UI's Kibbie Dome (16,000) is slated for 3 p.m. (MT)... Saturday's match-up of the Aggies and Vandals will be televised on ESPN-Regional on Altitude (Comcast Ch. 61 in Cache Valley).

FINAL GAME FOR AGGIE SENIORS -- Saturday is the final game in an Aggie uniform for USU's 15 seniors... That group includes DT Alan Bishop, WR Xavier Bowman, S James Brindley, LB Adrian Bybee, WR Chase Griffiths, WR Nnamdi Gwacham, LB Paul Igboeli, DE Antonio May, C Brennan McFadden, TE Jeremy Mitchell, CB Kejon Murphy, WR Omar Sawyer, PK Chris Ulinski, LB Chris Williams and TE Zac Zimmerman.

SATURDAY'S STORYLINES -- Things to watch for in Saturday's match-up between the Aggies and Vandals:

- Utah State head coach Gary Andersen and Idaho head coach Robb Akey were assistants at Northern Arizona together in 1995-96, with Andersen serving as the assistant head coach/defensive line and helped with special teams while Akey was the special teams coordinator and linebackers coach in 1995 before shifting to defensive coordinator... Both Andersen and Akey were under then-NAU head coach Steve Axman, currently Idaho's offensive coordinator.
- Both teams' last game was against No. 6 Boise State, with USU losing 52-21 at Logan this past Friday while Idaho had a bye this past week after losing at Boise, 63-25, last Saturday.
- USU has won its last two season-finale and four of the last five.
- The Aggies are going for their third WAC win, which would give Utah State back-to-back three-win conference records for the first time since 1999-2000, going 3-3 and 4-1 in Big West action, respectively, USU's final season in the Big West.
- USU is trying for a three-game win streak in the series, which would be the longest since winning five-straight from 1971-97.
- Saturday is USU's first game indoors of the season and the first since the Aggies' last visit to Moscow in 2007.
- Utah State's pass offense is fourth in the WAC (235.0 ypg) while Idaho's pass defense is eighth in the league (259.2 ypg).
- The Aggies' rushing offense is third in the conference (373.2 ypg) while the Vandals' rush defense is also third in the WAC (154.9 ypg).
- UI's pass offense is second in the league (281.1 ypg) while USU's pass defense is seventh (236.4 ypg).

UTAH STATE NOTE-ABLES

SEEKING WIN NO. 4 -- Utah State is currently 3-8 overall and a win would give the Aggies their first four-win season since going 4-7 in 2002, a stretch of four straight seasons with at least four wins... The current stretch of six seasons without at least four wins in the longest in the program's history.

THREE-WIN CONFERENCE LEDGER -- USU is also seeking its third WAC win, which would give the Aggies back-to-back three-win conference records for the first time since 1999-2000, going 3-3 and 4-1 in Big West action, respectively, USU's final season in the Big West.

ROAD WOE-IORS RETURNING TO SCENE OF LAST ROAD WIN -- On Saturday, Utah State will be returning to the scene of the Aggies' last win on the road, on an 11-game road losing skein since, losing all five road games this season as well as all six away games last year... USU's last road win was a 24-19 triumph over Idaho on Nov. 24, 2007.

USU IN SEASON FINALES -- The Aggies are a backwards slurpee-weilding convenience store 11-7 in their last 18 final games of the year, winning two in a row and four of the last five after dropping the previous four in a row... All-time, USU is 44-64-3 in its season finales... Saturday marks the second time in three years that USU has faced Idaho for the Aggies' season-finale as well as the third time in the last seven years after taking on the Vandals in their last game of the year in 2007 and 2003, both also at Moscow... Here's a closer look at USU's last 10 season-finales in which the Aggies have gone 5-5, winning four of the last five:

-- Utah State has a 15-17-2 record in games in the state of Idaho... USU is 2-6 at Boise State, 8-9-1 at Idaho, 1-0-1 vs. Idaho at Boise, 1-1 at Idaho State, 0-1 in the Humanitarian Bowl at Boise (1997), and 3-0 at Idaho Marines (1942, '44 and '45).

2009 RUSHING ATTACK AMONG USU ELITE

-- This season's Utah State rushing attack has amassed 2,148 rushing yards, the first time over 2,000 rushing yards since 2,028 in 1975 and the most since 2,701 a year earlier in 1974... Overall this season holds the No. 7 spot on USU's single-season rushing list, needing 129 yards to catch the 1973 squad's 2,277's roads.... USU's 22 rushing TD's are the fifth-most in school-history:

-- Utah State is third in the WAC and 16th in the NCAA country for least amount of offensive three-and-outs per game with a 2.64 average, totaling 29 three-and-outs in its 11 games... Meanwhile, Idaho, USU's Saturday opponent is tied for both the WAC and NCAA lead with 1.19 per game with Nevada... USU's season-low is one three-and-out done three times, at Fresno State (Oct. 31), vs. San Jose State (Nov. 14) and last Friday (Boise State), while the Aggies has a season-high six at New Mexico State (Oct. 10).

ON THIS DAY IN HISTORY:

Nov. 28

1811 – Beethoven Piano Concerto No. 5 in E-flat major, Op. 73, was premiered at the Gewandhaus in Leipzig.

1814 – The Times in London is for the first time printed by automatic, steam powered presses built by the German inventors Friedrich Koenig and Andreas Friedrich Bauer, signaling the beginning of the availability of newspapers to a mass audience.

1912 – Aggies battle to draw with Utes of Utah, 7-7, the first of two ties vs. Utah on this season and first of four ties in the series history.

1929 – Utah State beaten by Utah, 26-7.

1935 – USU ties Utah, 14-14, the second of two ties with Utah on Nov. 28 as well as the fourth and final draw with the Utes in the series history overall.

1957 – Aggies topped by Utes, 21-6.

BOREL NOW AT 2,500 PASSING YARDS, 2,500 TOTAL OFFENSE AND COUNTING

-- Junior QB Diondre Borel recently topped the 2,000 passing yard plateau, becoming the 18th Aggie QB to reach that milestone... Borel currently has 2,516 passing yards this season, moving to No. 11 on USU's single-season passing list, needing 93 yards to reach the top 10 with the No. 10 spot currently held by Jose Fuentes with 2,709 in 2000... Borel reached 2,000 yards with the fewest attempts and the second-best for completions... Borel also has 2,972 yards of total offense which has vaulted him to the No. 4 spot, needing 182 yards for the No. 3 spot by Brent Snyder with 3,154 in 1998, 192 for the No. 2 spot by Jose Fuentes with 3,164 in 2002 and 288 yards for the school record of 3,260 yards by Anthony Calvillo in 1993... TURBO-ING TO 1,000 YARDS RUSHING AND BEYOND -- Sophomore

RB Robert Turbin currently has 1,183 rushing yards this season, becoming the 14th Aggie running back with 1,000 rushing yards in a season... Turbin becomes the first 1,000 yard rusher since Emmett White in 2001... With his 24-yard TD run in the second quarter, Turbin broke the USU single-season rushing record for a sophomore, moving him to 1,159, passing the previous record of 1,135 yards by Rick Parros in 1977... Turbin also jumps to No. 9 on USU's single-season rushing list, passing Parros at No. 11, Roy Shivers (1,138 in 1965) at No. 10, Archie Gibson (1,150 in 1973) for the No. 9 spot... Turbin now has 1,183 rushing yards, needing 53 yards for the No. 8 spot to tie Parros' 1,236 yards in his senior season of 1979... Demario Brown is also the school's single-season rushing record holder with 1,536 in 1999.

Turbin and Borel became the 20th and 21st players, respectively in Utah State history to reach the 1,000 career rushing yards milestone and the first since David Fiefia (2000-03), who finished with 1,193... Turbin is currently No. 11 on USU's all-time rushing list with 1,685 yards, needing 135 more to crack the top 10, as Jack Hill (1952, 55-56), currently holds the No. 10 spot with 1,820 yards... Junior QB Diondre Borel presently has 1,098 career rushing yards, needing 46 yards to reach the No. 19 spot, currently held by Jerry Hughes (1971-72) with 1,144 yards... ABOUT USU -- Utah State is 3-8 overall and 2-5 in WAC play after a 52-21 loss to No. 6 Boise State Friday night... The Aggies are led by the backfield duo of junior QB Diondre Borel and sophomore RB Robert Turbin... Borel is 196-of-337 passing (58.2 pct) for 2,516 yards with 13 TD's and four INTS's... Turbin topped the 1,000 yard mark for the season and currently has 1,183 yards on 183 carries (6.5 ypc/107.5 ypg) with 10 TD's... Borel adds 456 yards rushing on 167 carries (2.7 ypc/41.5 ypg) with six TD's... Sophomore WR Stanley Morrison leads the Aggie receivers with 30 catches for 526 yards (17.5 ypc/47.8 ypc) with two TD's, while senior WR Omar Sawyer adds 29 receptions for 312 yards (10.8 ypc/28.4 ypg) with two TD's and Turbin adds 28 catches for 348 yards (12.4 ypc/31.6 ypg), sharing the team-lead for TD catches with senior WR Xavier Bowman... Junior WR Eric Moats has snagged 25 passes for 362 yards (14.5 ypc/32.9 ypg) with one score while Bowman has 21 receptions for 248 yards (11.8 ypc/22.5 ypg)... Defensively, sophomore LB Bobby Wagner has a team-best 106 tackles (9.6 pg), including a team-leading seven for loss... Junior S Rajric Coleman is second on the team with 73 tackles (6.6 pg) with three TFL's and two INT's... Senior S James Brindley is third on the team with 69 stops (6.3 pg), snaring a team-leading three interceptions and six pass break-ups... Junior P Peter Caldwell has a 42.2 ypp average with 17 punts of 50+ yards, including a new career-high 62-yarder on Saturday, as well as 26 inside the 20-yard line... Senior K Chris Ulinski is 12-of-18 (66.7 pct) on field goals and has 20 touchbacks on kickoffs.

IN THE STAT RANKINGS -- USU has several players amongst the WAC and NCAA statistical leaders, as well as in the team stats:

-- Utah State is third in the WAC and 21st in the NCAA in rushing offense (195.3 ypg), while ranking fourth in the conference and 43rd in the country in passing offense (235.0 ypg) to rank sixth in the league and 24th in the nation in total offense (430.3 ypg).

-- USU's defense is seventh in the league and 111th in the nation in rushing defense (211.9 ypg) as well as seventh in the conference and 81st in the country in pass defense (236.4 ypg), to rank eighth in the WAC and 111th in the NCAA in total defense (448.3 ypg).

-- Sophomore RB Robert Turbin is third in the WAC and 22nd in the NCAA in rushing (107.6 ypg)... Turbin also is third in the WAC and 33rd in the country in all-purpose yards (139.2 ypg), as well as 10th in the league in total offense (107.6 ypg) and tied for seventh in the conference and tied for 63rd in the nation in scoring (7.1 ppg).

-- Sophomore LB Bobby Wagner leads the WAC and ranks tied for 20th in the NCAA in tackles (9.6 pg).

-- Senior S James Brindley is eighth in the conference and 95th in the country in tackles (7.7 pg) as well as tied for the third in the WAC and tied for 52nd in the nation in interceptions with three (0.3 pg)... Brindley also is second in the WAC and ranks 31st in the NCAA in passes defended with nine off three interceptions and six pass break-ups.

-- Junior P Peter Caldwell is third in the WAC and is 43rd in the NCAA in punting (42.0 ypp).

-- Senior K Chris Ulinski is tied for second in the league and tied for 42nd in the nation in field goals (1.2 pg) as well as fourth in the conference in field goal percentage (70.6, 12-of-17)... Ulinski also leads the WAC with 20 touchbacks.

-- Freshman KR Kerwynn Williams is fifth in the WAC and 71st in the FCS in kick return average at 23.3... Williams also is No. 2 on USU's single-season kick return yardage with 932, behind the school-record mark of 1,260 by All-American, Kevin Robinson in 2007.

ABOUT IDAHO -- The Vandals are 7-4 overall and 4-3 in WAC action, and are coming off a bye week... Idaho is like USU in that its last game was against No. 6 Boise State, as the Broncos beat the Vandals, 63-25, on Saturday, Nov. 14... Junior QB Nathan Enderle is fourth in the WAC and 43rd in the NCAA in total offense (236.2 ypg) and is second in the league and 11th in the nation in passing efficiency (152.3), as well as second in the conference in passing average/game (240.4 ypg), completing 161-of-259 (62.2 pct) for 2,404 yards with 15 TD's and nine INT's... Senior WR Max Komar is second in the conference and 22nd in the country in receiving yards/game (58.6 ypg) along with fifth in the league and tied for 43rd in the nation in receptions/game with 5.2 pg... Senior RB De'Maundray Woolridge is eighth in the WAC and 63rd in FBS in rushing (72.3 ypg) with 16 TD's, which ranks him third in the league and tied for 14th in the nation in scoring (8.7 ppg)... Defensively, junior FS Shiloh Keo is second in the conference and tied for 27th in the country in tackles (9.4 pg), adding three INT's and five pass break-ups, leading Idaho in both... Freshman P Bobby Cowan has a 44.3 ypp average with 10 inside the 20... Fellow freshman K Trey Farquhar is 13-of-19 (68.4 pcg) on field goals with a long of 54 yards.

UTAH STATE-IDAHO SERIES -- Utah State holds a slight 17-16-2 all-time series advantage, winning the last two meetings... Idaho holds a 9-8-1 edge in games at Moscow, as the Aggies' win there in 2007 snapped a two-game USU losing skid... USU is 4-5 vs. UI in the last nine meetings after the Aggies won the previous five in a row and 11 of the previous 13... Besides the 18 times at Moscow and 14 times at Logan, the teams have met three times at neutral sites, once in Pullman, Wash., in 1999 with Idaho winning 31-3, as well as twice in Boise, Idaho with the teams playing to a scoreless draw in 1940 before the Aggies won, 19-7, in 1953..

AGGIE-VANDAL NOTE-ABLE -- Utah State has one player from the state of Idaho, in senior LB Adrian Bybee (Pocatello/Highland HS)... Idaho does not have any players from Utah but do have 11 players from Idaho.

COACHING CONNECTIONS -- USU head coach Gary Andersen and UI head coach Robb Akey were assistants at Northern Arizona together in 1995-96, with Andersen serving as the assistant head coach/defensive line and helped with special teams while Akey was the special teams coordinator and linebackers coach in 1995 before shifting to defensive coordinator... Both Andersen and Akey were under then-NAU head coach Steve Axman, currently Idaho's offensive coordinator... Also in the mix was current USU defensive coordinator Bill Busch, who was the secondary coach at the time... Axman was an assistant at Stanford in 1986, where he coaches with current USU offensive coordinator Dave Baldwin, who was receivers coach at that time at Stanford... Third-year Idaho defensive coordinator Mark Criner was a graduate assistant at Utah State from 1991-92 and an assistant coach for the Aggies from 1992-93... Akey graduated from and began his coaching career at Weber State in 1998 and was an assistant coach for the Wildcats from 1988-94... Idaho offensive line coach Dan Finn was a graduate assistant coach at Southern Utah from 2003-04, coaching on Andersen's staff there, and also coaching along side current Aggie linebackers coach Kevin Clune, who was the defensive coordinator for the T-Birds during that time... Finn later went to Utah as a graduate assistant for the offensive line, coaching with Andersen... Vandals' quarterbacks coach Jonathan Smith was a QB on the 1998 Oregon State squad that beat Utah State, 20-16.

USU BESTS VS. IDAHO -- Here is a look at some of the top USU statistical individual performances against the Vandals over the years: Louie Giammona ran for 247 yards in 1974, Melvin Blue ran for 224 yards in 1997, Jose Fuentes threw for 421 yards in 2000, Tony Adams threw for 406 yards in 1972 and Matt Sauk threw for 396 in 1997... Aaron Jones had 233 receiving yards in 2000, Bob Wicks 211 in 1971 and Tom Forzani 193 in 1972... Jim Turner's school record 100-yard fumble return came against the Vandals in 1962, while Overton Curtis had a 96-yard kickoff return in 1958, Jerry Arguello had a 77-yard punt in 1998 and Steve Mullins had a 70-yard punt in 1999 against Idaho... Team bests include 662 yards of total offense in 1997, which ranks third in school history and school-best 501 rushing yards in 1960.

WAC BITS AND PIECES

- Nevada rushed for 574 yards (the most by any team in the nation this year) in a 63-20 win at New Mexico State. Luke Lippincott ran for 162 yards to give him 1,028 on the season. Nevada became the first team in NCAA history to have three players rush for 1,000 yards in the same season as Vai Tava and quarterback Colin Kaepernick reached that mark last week. Tava added 126 yards on the ground against the Aggies, while Kaepernick rushed for 114 on just nine carries.

- Kevin Goessling hit a 35-yard field goal on the game's final play as Fresno State defeated Louisiana Tech, 30-28. Fresno State finished its WAC schedule with a 6-2 record. Louisiana Tech's Ross Jenkins was 14-of-22 for 206 yards and four touchdowns, three of which went to Dennis Morris who caught seven passes for 131 yards.

- Hawai'i stopped San Jose State on four straight plays following a Leon Wright-Jackson five-yard touchdown run as the Warriors beat San Jose State in overtime, 17-10. Shane Austin made his first career start at quarterback for the Warriors and was 28-of-46 for 299 yards. Jon Medeiros hauled in 10 of those passes for 149 yards.

- On Friday, Boise State's Doug Martin rushed for 121 yards and four touchdowns in the Broncos' 52-21 win at Utah State. Jeremy Avery ran for 116 yards and two touchdowns, while Kellen Moore was 15-of-29 for 233 yards and a touchdown. The game was tied at 14 apiece before the Broncos scored three touchdowns in less than five minutes late in the second quarter.

LOGAN, Utah - Freshman Robert Turbin rushed for 123 yards, including 106 in the second-half, as Utah State rolled up 580 yards of total offense in a convincing 42-17 WAC win against Idaho on Sept. 20. The 42 points scored for USU is the most under head coach Brent Guy, as is its 25-point margin of victory. Utah State, who has won three straight league games dating back to 2007, improves to 1-3 overall and 1-0 in the WAC. Utah State's 580 yards of total offense is its most since gaining 684 against Weber State in 2001, while its 356 rushing yards is the most since the 1999 season when it had 388 at Nevada. Turbin's 123 yards on the ground are the most for an Aggie since the 2006 campaign. Sophomore QB Diondre Borel scored Utah State's first touchdown on a 33-yard run in the second quarter and finished the game with 93 rushing yards. He also had 191 passing yards (12-21-1) and two TDs, which ties his career-high. Idaho scored on its first possession of the game and led 17-14 late in the third quarter following a 43-yard field goal from Tino Amancio. USU then exploded for 28 points in the final 15:34 of the game to record its largest margin of victory since it defeated Arkansas State, 49-0, on Oct. 25, 2003 in Logan. USU's first score of the second-half came on a 46-yard pitch and catch from Borel to freshman WR Stanley Morrison to tie the game at 14. The Aggies then took their first lead of the game with :34 seconds to play in the third quarter as junior TE Jeremy Mitchell hauled in a 15-yard scoring strike from Borel. USU's next score came via its defense as junior DE Darby Golden sacked Idaho's Nathan Enderle in the end zone, forcing a fumble that was recovered by senior DT Ben Calderwood. On the Vandals' next possession, junior S James Brindley intercepted a fourth-down pass and returned it 34 yards to the Vandals' 41. USU quickly turned that INT into seven points as sophomore RB Curtis Marsh raced 41-yards down the right sidelines on the Aggies' first play from scrimmage for the score. Utah State's final series of the game was its most impressive going 97 yards in 12 plays, 10 of which were runs, in 6:05 culminating with a 26-yard scoring run by Turbin.

AGGIES-VANDALS LAST TIME AT MOSCOW

UTAH STATE 24, IDAHO 19

November 24, 2007 • Moscow, Idaho • Kibbie Stadium

For the first time since 2003, Utah State won back-to-back games after the Aggies were victorious over the Vandals of Idaho, 24-19, on Nov. 24 at UI's Kibbie Dome. It was USU's first consecutive road wins since 1999 as the Aggies end their season with a 2-10 record. Senior WR/KR Kevin Robinson set the NCAA career all-purpose yards per play record in the game as well. Robinson also became the USU career receptions record holder with his 178th career catch, passing Kevin Curtis' record of 174 from 2000-01. For the game, Robinson had seven catches for 86 yards and a 6-yard TD catch, diving just inside the pylon. Robinson's TD catch was his 21st career TD reception, moving to a tie for third on USU's career TD receptions list, tying Aaron Jones (1997-2000). Senior QB/P Leon Jackson III broke his own school record for rushing yards by a QB (328 in his sophomore season of 2005 that he shared with Jerod Walker, also in 2005) on a 2-yard rush on USU's opening drive and ends the season with 338. Jackson also had two rushing TD's for the Aggies, his fifth and sixth rushing TD's this season. Those are the most rushing TD's for a USU QB since Matt Sauk had six in 1997. The six rushing TD's are the most for a USU individual since David Fieflia's seven rushing TD's in 2003. He also set a school record for single-season completion percentage (65.4 - 151-of-231), topping the previous mark of 60.2 by Eric Hipple in 1979. Utah State hung on from a 24-10 lead early in the third quarter. After having a 10:04 - 4:56 time of possession advantage in the third quarter, the Aggies were out-possessed 11:35 - 3:25 in the fourth, as Idaho scored 10 points, the last on a TD with 5:42 to play. The USU defense survived a fourth-and-seven attempt from its own 24 as Idaho QB Nathan Enderle's pass was incomplete, turning the ball over to the Aggies with 1:39 on the clock. Jackson ended the game 11-of-15 for 118 yards and one TD passing, as well as 14 rushes for 11 yards and two TD's. Freshman TB Derrvin Speight had 57 rushing yards on 15 carries, while fellow freshman TB Curtis Marsh had eight carries for 42 yards, including a new career-long of 26. Senior FB/TE Jimmy Bohm, who entered the game with 13 career yards on seven career carries, more than tripled his career yardage with 41 yards on six carries, including career longs of 13 and 14 yards. USU was out-gained by Idaho, 428 to 272 in total offense, as the Aggies had 154 yards rushing and 118 passing. Idaho had 237 yards rushing and 191 passing.

LAST GAME NOTES -- Utah State vs. #6 Boise State - Friday, Nov. 20

-- Utah State finishes its home ledger with a 3-2 mark, its first winning season at home since 2003 when the Aggies also went 3-2.

-- Junior QB Diondre Borel made his 20th-straight start Friday, the top streak for USU.

-- After returning to limited action last Saturday after missing the previous three games with an injury, senior LB Paul Igboeli made his first start since the Nevada game (Oct. 17)... It was Igboeli's team-leading 39th career start.

-- Senior S James Brindley also returned to the Aggies' starting line-up, after seeing limited action with an injury, making his 30th career start, as did junior OT Spencer Johnson, tying for second on the team.

-- After a three-game streak of scoring on its opening possession, USU failed to score on its first possession of the game for the fourth time overall this season.

-- Junior RB Michael Smith's first quarter TD was his third rushing TD, all of 20+ yards (40 and 20-yard TD runs inn Southern Utah game - Sept. 26)... His third quarter TD was his fourth of the season, with all four coming in two games (two in Southern Utah game, two on Friday).

-- With his 24-yard TD run in the second quarter, sophomore RB Robert Turbin broke the USU single-season rushing record for a sophomore, moving him to 1,159, passing the previous record of 1,135 yards by Rick Parros in 1977.

-- Turbin also jumps to No. 9 on USU's single-season rushing list, passing Parros at No. 11, Roy Shivers (1,138 in 1965) at No. 10, Archie Gibson (1,150 in 1973) for the No. 9 spot... Turbin now has 1,183 rushing yards, needing 53 yards for the No. 8 spot to tie Parros' 1,236 yards in his senior season of 1979.

-- It was Turbin's 10th rushing TD this season, needing one more for the single-season top 10.

-- Turbin scored his 18th career rushing TD, moving to a tie for No. 7 on USU's career rushing TD list with Roy Shivers (1964-65).

-- Utah State trailed at halftime for the fifth time this season and USU is now 0-5 when trailing at intermission.

-- Junior P Peter Caldwell, a Ray Guy Award Semi-finalist, boomed a career-long 62-yard punt in the fourth quarter... It was Caldwell's second 60+ yard punt this season, topping a 61-yarder in the Nevada game... Overall, it was Caldwell's fourth career punt of 60 or more yards, with a pair of 60 yarders last season.

-- Junior QB Diondre Borel's 201 passing yards gives him 2,516 passing yards this season, moving to No. 11 on USU's single-season passing list, needing 93 yards to reach the top 10 with the No. 10 spot currently held by Jose Fuentes with 2,709 in 2000.

-- Borel now has 2,972 yards of total offense this season, vaulting to the No. 4 spot, needing 182 yards for the No. 3 spot by Brent Snyder with 3,154 in 1998, 192 for the No. 2 spot by Jose Fuentes with 3,164 in 2002 and 288 yards for the school record of 3,260 yards by Anthony Calvillo in 1993.

-- Borel's 201 passing yards give him 4,221 career passing yards, moving to a tie for No. 8 on USU's career passing yards list with Leon Jackson III (2004-07), needing 501 for the No. 7 spot held by Travis Cox (2001-04) with 4,722.

-- Friday was the third ranked opponent for Utah State this season, marking the third-straight season that the Aggies have played at least three ranked teams in the same season... Overall, it is the fifth time since 1957 that the Aggies have faced three ranked teams in the same slate.

-- All three of USU's ranked opponents have also been in non-Saturday games, and Friday was USU's 16th-straight loss in a non-Saturday game since 1993.

-- Sophomore RB Bobby Wagner now has 106 tackles, giving USU a 100-tackle linebacker for the third year in a row (Jake Hutton, 102 in 2007 and 110 in 2008).

-- Wagner is the first sophomore to lead the team in tackles since James Jenkins in 1984 with 85 stops.

-- Utah State now has 2,148 rushing yards, the first time over 2,000 rushing yards since 2,028 in 1975 and the most since 2,701 a year earlier in 1974.

-- The Aggies' 4,733 yards of total offense is the most since 4,943 in 1997.

--- Friday was the third ranked opponent for Utah State this season, marking the third-straight season that the Aggies have played at least three ranked teams in the same season... Overall, it is the fifth time since 1957 that the Aggies have faced three ranked teams in the same slate.

-- USU is now:

-- 4-12 all-time vs. Boise State, now on a nine-game skein, including four-straight when BSU is ranked.

-- 2-6 vs. Boise State at Logan, losing the last four in a row.

-- 6-2 on Nov. 20, as Friday's loss snaps a three-game winning streak on the date.

-- 1-51 against Top 25, including 1-11 at home.

-- 0-2 vs. No. 6 ranked opponents, Boise State Friday night and on Sept. 29, 2001, 38-21, to No. 6 Oregon.

-- 5-7 in its last 12 home finales, dropping four of its last five.

TURBO TURBIN JOINING ELITE COMPANY -- With his career-high 148 yards vs. Utah, sophomore running back Robert Turbin logged his second-career 100-yard outing, joining the 123 total vs. Idaho last season as a freshman... Turbin became the seventh Aggie running back to post 100 yards as a freshman... However, he joined rare company with his 100-yard outing as a sophomore, becoming just the fourth Aggie to do so... The other three: Demario Brown (4,053 yards), Abu Wilson (3,933) and Rick Parros (3,537), are numbers 1-2-3 on USU's career rushing list, respectively.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN -- Utah State football head coach Gary Andersen announced the Aggies' 2009 captains, after a vote by the team... All three of the defensive captains are seniors, while the offensive captains consist of a senior, a junior and a sophomore... Representing the defense will be the senior trio of safety James Brindley, linebacker Paul Igboeli and cornerback Kejon Murphy... The offensive captains are senior center Brennan McFadden, junior quarterback Diondre Borel and sophomore running back Robert Turbin.

BOOMSKI ULINSKI -- Chris Ulinski's WAC-leading 21 touchbacks in 2008 were three more than USU's three previous years combined total of 18 consisting of nine in '07 (by Ulinski), one in '06 and eight in '05, especially impressive since kickoffs were moved back from the 35-yard line to the 30-yard line prior to the 2007 season... Ulinski has 46 career touchbacks, currently with a WAC-leading 16 in 2009.

BAND OF BROTHERS -- Utah State has two sets of brothers on its roster: The Igboeli brothers - senior LB Paul and junior CB Washington (Grand Prairie, Texas / Grand Prairie HS), and the Erickson brothers - junior OL Preston and freshman OL Parker (Sandy, Utah / Alta HS).

JUST KICKIN' IT -- A new streak started with USU's first successful PAT at Utah on Sept. 3 by senior PK Chris Ulinski, who made both of his attempts... After making his first 57 in a row, Peter Caldwell missed his final attempt of last season in the Aggies' 47-2 win over New Mexico State... Caldwell is tied for sixth on USU's career PAT made list with 57 and fourth on the career PAT percentage list (57-of-58, .970)... Caldwell is also 23-of-33, .700, for career field goals, ranking seventh on the career field goals made list, eighth on the attempts list and fifth on the FG percentage list.

111 / 117 -- USU is taking the field for the 111th season of football in 117 years. The Aggies beat Utah, 12-0, in 1892, but then did not field a team until 1896, when they again only played one game but then played every year since with the exceptions of 1918 when to World War I and influenza cancelled the season and 1943 due to World War II.

Andersen Tidbits

-- He was 9-1 vs. Utah State while an assistant coach at Utah.

-- Andersen becomes the third-youngest head coach in the WAC behind Louisiana Tech's Derek Dooley (41) and Boise State's Chris Peterson, by six months (45).

-- He becomes the second Aggie head coach that is a Utah alum, joining USU legendary head coach E. Lowell Romney (1919-48), who graduated from Utah in 1917.

-- While at Utah, Andersen was a part of a Utes coaching staff that posted a 13-5 (.722) record against current WAC schools, going 0-3 vs. Boise State, 2-1 vs. Fresno State, 1-0 vs. Hawai'i, 1-0 vs. San Jose State and 9-1 vs. Utah State.

-- At Utah, Andersen was a part of two Ute teams that went 2-0 in BCS action, finishing No. 2 in the 2008 AP Poll and No. 4 in 2004.

-- As an assistant coach at Northern Arizona (1995-96), Andersen was 1-1 against current WAC schools, beating Boise State and losing to Idaho, both in 1995.

UTAH STATE HEAD COACH

GARY ANDERSEN

• Gary Andersen was named Utah State head football coach on Dec. 4 by USU Athletics Director Scott Barnes.

• Andersen becomes the 26th head coach in 115 years of Aggie football.

• Andersen comes to Utah State after five seasons as the assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and defensive line coach at Utah, where he has helped guide the Utes to a 13-0 record in 2008. Utah finished the season ranked No. 2 in the Associated Press poll after winning the BCS Sugar Bowl with a dominating 31-17 victory over Alabama.

• Andersen was a part of seven bowl teams as Utah has an 8-0 bowl record since 1999, giving the Utes the nation's longest bowl winning streak.

• Overall, Andersen spent 11 seasons as an assistant coach at Utah after coaching for the Utes from 1997-2002 before becoming the head coach at Southern Utah in 2003 and then returning to Utah in 2004.

• Andersen was named a finalist for the 2008 Broyles Award, honoring the top assistant coach in college football. He was also tabbed as the No. 1 non-BCS recruiter by Rivals.com in 2005 and was named a Rivals.com top 10 non-BCS recruiter in 2008.

• In 2003, Andersen migrated south to become the head coach at Southern Utah, guiding the Thunderbirds to a 4-7 record and bettering their win total of the previous three seasons combined. He turned around a program that was 102nd in the nation in the final 2002 I-AA Gridiron Power Index, which is used to determine playoff selections, into the No. 36-ranked team in his lone season.

• Andersen will be reaching a rare plateau in USU's season-opener on Sept. 3, when he leads the Aggies into action against his former team Utah... Since 1982, only two other head coaches in college football have began the season against their former team from the season before.

Virginia - In 1982, George Welsh coached his first game at Virginia against Navy, the school he coached at before going to UV.

Northwestern - In 1999, Randy Walker opened his Northwestern head coaching career by facing his former school, Miami (Ohio). He was the head coach at Miami from 1990-98.

Toledo - In 1991, Gary Pinkel of Toledo played at Washington in the fifth game of the season, where he was defensive coordinator the previous season.

• Andersen will be trying to become the first new Aggie head coach to win in his debut since Phil Krueger in 1973, as his eight predecessors all lost their debuts.

• Andersen is the second coach in USU history to open their coaching career against Utah, as Dave Arslanian began his Aggie tenure against the Utes on Sept. 5, 1998.

• Andersen also faces another former team when he and the Aggies make their home debut against Southern Utah on Sept. 26... Andersen was head coach at Southern Utah in 2003.

• At 45, Andersen is the third-youngest head coach in the WAC behind Louisiana Tech's Derek Dooley (41) and Boise State's Chris Peterson, by six months (45).





ACADEMIC / SCHOOL SERVICE

Utah State football had 13 academic all-WAC selections, part of USU's 42 fall academic all-conference honors, which led the WAC... Overall, USU had 181 student-athletes recognized by the league office for academic achievements during the 2008-09 academic year, as Utah State has led the WAC in all-conference honors all four years that it has been in the league.

Of the 13, seven are returners, while three other returners earned academic all-WAC in 2007.

AGGIE FOOTBALL TIDBITS

THESE UNITED STATES -- There are a total of 42 Californian's on USU's 2009 roster, the most from any state, while there are 33 players from Utah, which ranks second, followed by Texas (13) and Florida (3)... Six other states have two players each, while a total of eight players are the lone representative of their home state... Overall, the Aggies' roster has 17 different U.S. states represented, which is one of two countries represented as freshman LB Connor Williams is from Canada.

FOOTBALL ISN'T JUST AMERICA'S GAME -- USU has six players who were born internationally, believed to be the most of any team this season in the country... Senior WR Nnamdi Gwacham (Nigeria), junior TE Jerome Barbour (Germany), junior OL Tariq Polley (England), redshirt freshman WR Emmanuel Ojeriaki (Nigeria), redshirt-freshman LB Alfred Kikau (Fiji) and freshman LB Connor Williams (Canada) all were born outside of the United States.

THE SHORT OF IT -- Sophomore RB Josh Flores is the shortest player on Utah State's 2009 roster at 5'5" ... Overall, Flores is one of seven players on the Aggies' roster under 5'10" tall.

THE TALL OF IT -- Sophomore TE Tarren Lloyd is the tallest player on Utah State's team at 6'7" ... Lloyd is also one of two players on the squad who is over 6'5" tall, joined by 6'6" senior TE Zac Zimmerman.

TRANSFER-MERS -- USU has 13 junior college transfers on the Aggies' 2009 roster... Four players on the roster came to USU from Snow College: junior LS Dustin Akana, senior DT Casey Davis, junior OL Preston Erickson and junior S Joey Schrader.

HEAVY O-TILLERY -- Sophomore OG's Philip Gapelu and Funaki Asisi are the lone two players on Utah State's 2009 roster who are at least 300 pounds... The Aggies have five other offensive linemen who are in the 290's: senior OC Brennan McFadden, junior OT Spencer Johnson, junior OL Tariq Polley, sophomore OL Christian Browne-Frazier and freshman OL Tyler Larsen.

WISE, EXPERIENCED OL' MEN -- Five Aggie seniors are three-year letterwinners: DT Alan Bishop, WR Xavier Bowman, WR Nnamdi Gwacham, LB Paul Igboeli and WR Omar Sawyer.

JUNIOR DOZEN -- A total of 12 juniors on the USU roster are two-year lettermen.

KICKIN' CHRIS -- Chris Ulinski's WAC-leading 21 touchbacks in 2008 were three more than USU's three previous years combined total of 18 consisting of nine in '07 (by Ulinski), one in '06 and eight in '05, especially impressive since kickoffs were moved back from the 35-yard line to the 30-yard line prior to the 2007 season.

SALT LAKE CITY - Matt Asiata rushed for a career-high 156 yards and 19th-ranked Utah amassed 519 yards of total offense as the Utes extended its nation-long winning streak to 15 straight games with a 35-17 win against Utah State here Thursday night in both teams season-opener. Sophomore RB Robert Turbin led USU's new spread-offense with a career-high 148 rushing yards, including a school-record 96-yard scamper in the second quarter. The 96-yard run tops the previous school record of 95 yards by Percy Hanson in 1920, the Aggies' longest individual record. Turbin's 148 yards are the most for a USU individual since James Samuals's 159 yards vs. Troy State in 2002. USU ended the game with 221 yards rushing and 342 total yards. Utah State's first drive of the season was its most impressive as junior college transfer RB Michael Smith ran for 11 yards on its first play, followed by two more on the next play before junior QB Diondre Borel connected with junior WR Stanley Morrison for a 48-yard pass play that gave the Aggies first and 10 on the Utes 18-yardline. Following a false start on its next play, the possession stalled and USU settled for a 29-yard FG by senior PK Chris Ulinski. Utah State had a chance to extend its early lead as the Aggie defense forced the first turnover of the game on the Utes second play from scrimmage as junior DT Sean Enesi forced an Asiata fumble that was recovered by sophomore LB Bobby Wagner on the Utes 28. However, USU was unable to score as it missed a 48-yard FG. Following the Aggies' first two possession, Utah quickly changed the momentum of the game as it scored back-to-back TDs on a 65-yard pass play and a 22-yard pass play to make the score 14-3 for the home team. Utah State then cut the score to 14-10 on Turbin's 96-yard TD run to make the score 14-10 at the end of the first quarter as the Aggies had 179 yards of total offense as compared to 185 for the Utes. Utah opened the second-half by scoring 12 straight points via an 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive, a safety following a blocked punt, and a 44-yard FG to make the score 26-10. USU ended the half on a positive note following an interception from senior S James Brindley as Borel capped a three-play, seven-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run with :51 remaining in the half to cut the Utes lead to 26-17. An offensive explosion in the first-half turned into a defensive battle in the second-half as the only points scored after intermission were by the home team as Utah scored a TD midway through the third quarter on a 1-yard TD run by Asiata, and capped the scoring with another safety with :49 to play in the game. Utah State managed just 120 yards of total offense in the second-half, but limited the Utes to 210 yards. Brindley led the Aggies with 14 tackles in the game, one shy of his career-high, while Wagner posted a career-high 12 stops.

TEXAS A&M 38, UTAH STATE 30

COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Junior quarterback Diondre Borel threw for a career-best 334 yards and the sophomore duo of running back Robert Turbin and receiver Stanley Morrison topped the 100-yard milestones for rushing and receiving, but it was not enough as Utah State lost to Texas A&M, 38-30, on Sept. 19 at historic Kyle Field. USU falls to 0-2 on the young season, while TAMU improved to 2-0. Turbin finished with 121 yards, becoming USU's first USU running back with back-to-back 100-yard outings since David Fiebia in 2003, after his 148 at Utah on Sept. 3. Morrison finished with a career-best 126 yards on six catches, while senior Omar Sawyer added a TD. Junior quarterback Diondre Borel was 24-of-47 passing for a career-best 334 yards with one TD. Borel also rushed for 34 yards and two more scores, his second multi-TD rushing outing of his career. Utah State made the first-ever match-up between USU and TAMU interesting with a late rushing TD by Borel. The visitors then recovered the onside kick, but couldn't score in the waning seconds to get any closer. USU ended with 521 yards of total offense with 334 passing and 187 rushing. TAMU totalled 573 total offensive yards on 322 passing and 251 rushing. Sophomore linebacker Bobby Wagner had a game-high 13 tackles, while senior safety James Brindley posted nine stops and junior defensive tackle Sean Enesi logged seven tackles. USU opened the scoring with a 50-yard TD by Turbin, his second TD in as many games of 50+ yards after his school-record 96-yard scamper two weeks ago in the Utah game. Turbin's score ended Utah State's seven-play 94-yard drive. The home team countered with a 35-yard TD toss from Jerrod Johnson to Uzoma Nwachukwu, tying the score at 7-all. The visiting Aggies marched down the field and Borel capped an eight-play, 82-yard charge with a 1-yard plunge, also his second rushing TD in as many games. USU's lead was short-lived as TAMU reeled off 17 unanswered points, the last TD on a 16-yard TD pass from Johnson to Nwachukwu again with 1:26 left in the half, as the home Aggies took a 24-14 lead into intermission. Senior placekicker Chris Ulinski pulled USU within 24-17 with a 43-yard field goal on the navy and white Aggies' opening drive of the second half. Johnson and Nwachukwu hooked up again for the third time of the time, this time a 50-yard TD pass and catch to take a 31-17 lead at the 12:20 mark of the third stanza. The scoreboard was frozen on that score for the remainder of the third quarter and the first nine seconds of the fourth, when TAMU scored on a 10-yard TD toss from Johnson to Ryan Tannehill. Utah State pulled within 38-23 on a 19-yard pass from Borel to Sawyer and went for two, but failed. The navy and white Aggies scored again with 25 seconds left on a 2-yard dash by Borel. USU recovered the onside kick and ran three plays before a fumble thwarted the drive. TAMU collected the fumble then took a knee to end the game.

UTAH STATE 53, SOUTHERN UTAH 34

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State erupted for 53 points en route to a 53-34 Homecoming win over Southern Utah on Sept. 26 at Romney Stadium. The Aggies won first-year head coach Gary Andersen's USU home debut, improving to 1-2 on the season while the Thunderbirds dropped their third in a row, falling to 1-3. It was Utah State's first home-opening win since 2005 and the Aggies' first Homecoming win since 2006, improving to 49-28-2 all-time in celebrating the navy and white tradition. USU amassed 604 yards of total offense, the most since 2001 and the ninth-most in school history and reached many other milestones along the way. Most notable was the running back tandem of sophomore Robert Turbin (17 carries, 104 yards) and junior Michael Smith (eight carries, 100 yards), who became the first pair of Aggie backs to both rush for 100 yards since 1989 when Demetrius Brown (22-131) and Brett Payne (28-166) both did so at Pacific. With 108 receiving yards, Turbin also became the first USU running back to have 100-yard receiving and rushing in the same game since Emmett White in 2000. Additionally, Turbin became the first Aggie back to have three-straight 100-yard rushing outings since White in 2001. Sophomore quarterback Diondre Borel completed his first five pass attempts on the way to 15-of-21 passing for 316 yards with a career-best three TD's. Borel is the first Aggie QB to throw for 300 yards in back-to-back games since Jose Fuentes in 2002. USU had a balanced 302 yards of total offense in each half for its 604 yard output, on 259 rushing and 345 passing. SUU had 367 total offense yards (262 passing, 105 rushing), getting just 145 after halftime, as the Aggie defense held the Thunderbirds' scoreless in the fourth quarter and only 10 points in the third. Quarterback Cade Cooper led SUU with 250 yards passing with three TD's on 24-of-48 passing. Fesi Sitake had nine catches for 98 yards with two TD's. Sophomore linebacker Bobby Wagner and senior cornerback Kejon Wagner had seven tackles each to lead the USU defense with Wagner notching two tackles for loss. Senior safety James Brindley and junior cornerback Chris Randle both snagged an interception. After the Aggie defense held the T-Birds to a punt, USU fumbled the return on its own 30, setting up an SUU field goal, Utah State erupted for 21 unanswered points, starting with a 29-yard pass from sophomore wide receiver Stanley Morrison to Turbin. Borel later connected with Smith for a 54-yard TD pass and catch then Turbin capped the streak with a 16-yard scoring run. SUU closed to 21-17 on two TD passes from Cooper, but a 34-yard Chris Ulinski field goal and a 77-yard pass play from Borel to Turbin opened up a 31-17 USU advantage. SUU closed to 31-24 at the half on a Cooper to Sitake 6-yard pass with 14 seconds left. Smith scampered 40 yards for a TD on USU's opening third-quarter possession and later scored on a 20-yard run, alternating around SUU scores. Morrison had a 69-yard TD catch from Borel, and sophomore defensive end Junior Keiaho socked SUU's Ammon Olsen in the end zone for a safety to cap the scoring. It was USU's first safety since 2003.

PROVO, Utah - Utah State battled but came up short, falling to No. 20 Brigham Young, 35-17, on Oct. 2 at a brisk, sold-out LaVell Edwards Stadium. The game completed non-conference play for Utah State, and the Aggies enter Western Athletic Conference action with a 1-3 mark. BYU improved to 4-1 on the season with the win, its 10th in a row over USU. The Cougars now lead the all-time series, 43-33-3. Utah State tallied 322 yards of total offense, its 10th-consecutive game of 300 yards of total offense. Junior quarterback Diondre Borel was 20-of-28 passing for 213 yards with a TD to senior wide receiver Xavier Bowman in the waning seconds. Borel also had 38 yards rushing and another score, marking the third-straight game and fifth of his career that Borel has rushed and thrown for a TD in the same game. Senior wide receiver Omar Sawyer had a team-leading four catches for 58 yards, one of a season-high 12 different players with a catch. BYU posted 431 yards of total offense, led by Max Hall's 218 yards passing on 16-of-23 with three TD's, but the Aggies intercepted him twice, the second two-pick game for the USU defense. Harvey Unga also ran for 118 yards with a TD. Luke Ashworth had a game-best 91 yards and a TD while Dennis Pitta had 83 yards and two TD's, each catching five passes. Junior cornerback Rajric Coleman posted a career-high 13 tackles to go with his first career interception. Sophomore linebacker Bobby Wagner, who entered the game leading the WAC and ranking tied for 14th in the country in tackles with 11 per game, was one stop above his average with 12 tackles. Wagner, who added a fumble recovery Friday, registered his third double-digit tackle outing in four games this season. Senior safety James Brindley added 11 stops to go with USU's lone sack of the game, while senior cornerback Kejon Murphy posted his first interception of the season. After junior cornerback Chris Randle's fumble recovery on BYU's opening possession, USU took over and drove down the field before Borel scored on a 6-yard scamper. That would be the Aggies' lone lead of the game. The Cougars then reeled off 21 unanswered points on a 10-yard pass from Hall to Pitta, a 48-yard pass from Hall to Ashworth and a 3-yard run by Manase Tonga, which came with 29 seconds left in the half after a costly USU fumble. Coleman's interception set up a 20-yard field goal by senior placekicker Chris Ulinski to pull the Aggies within 21-10, but that would be the closest USU would get. BYU scored on an 8-yard TD by Unga and a 13-yard pass from Hall to Pitta for a 35-10 lead before Bowman's TD catch for the final score. Junior punter Peter Caldwell had a career day, booming five punts for a 49.2 ypg average, including a career-best three punts of over 50 yards and pinning BYU inside the 5-yard line twice.

NEW MEXICO STATE 20, UTAH STATE 17

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - New Mexico State's Kyle Hughes' 28-yard field goal as time expired gave NMSU a 20-17 win over Utah State on Oct. 10 in USU's Western Athletic Conference opener. Utah State is 1-4 overall with the loss and 0-1 in WAC action while NMSU improves to 3-3 overall, 1-1 in conference action. The loss snapped USU's two-game win streak in the series and the navy Aggies now lead the all-time series 27-7, as well as 15-3 in Las Cruces. The loss offset a milestone night for sophomore running back Robert Turbin with a career-best 184 yards, the most for a USU running back since Emmett White's 233 yards vs. Weber State in 2001. Turbin also went over the 1,000 career rushing yards milestone, becoming the first since White (1998-2001). Utah State amassed 429 yards of total offense with 258 rushing and 171 passing, but had 12 penalties for 128 yards. New Mexico State posted 230 total offense yards, on 149 rushing and just 81 passing, the lowest for a USU defense since 72 at North Texas in 2000. Turbin posted his 184 yards on 24 carries, while junior quarterback Diondre Borel was 15-of-25 passing for 156 yards with one TD, a 21-yard pass to senior wide receiver Xavier Bowman. Sophomore wide receiver Stanley Morrison also had a TD pass, a 15-yard end around pass to senior wide receiver Omar Sawyer. Sophomore linebacker Bobby Wagner, the WAC's leading tackler, made 11 stops while three other navy Aggies made eight each. USU almost opened the scoring, after a long pass from Borel to Sawyer that Sawyer staggered and stumbled before regaining his balance on the way to the endzone. The play was reviewed and ruled that Turbin's knee touched the ground at the 10-yard line. An unsportsmanlike penalty put the ball back at the 25 and USU's drive stalled with a missed field goal. NMSU scored on a 1-yard run by Trevor Walls with 3:48 left in the first quarter and went up 10-0 at the 9:35 mark on a 31-yard field goal by Hughes. USU got on the board with a 34-yard field goal from senior PK Chris Ulinski with 7:09 to play. The navy Aggies tied the score at 10-all with 48 seconds left in the half on a 15-yard end around pass from Morrison to Sawyer. It was Morrison's second TD toss this season, after a TD toss to Turbin in the Southern Utah game. Saturday was the first time that USU was tied at the half and just the second time in the last four seasons. Utah State took the second half kickoff and marched down the field, getting a 55-yard run from Turbin before Borel later hit senior WR Xavier Bowman with a 21-yard TD pass. NMSU tied it at 17's with 7:48 left in the third on a 1-yard Smith scamper, but neither team scored again until Hughes' game-winning kick. Utah State had several threats thwarted by penalties.

NEVADA 35, UTAH STATE 32

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State's frenzied rally came up short, losing 35-32 to Nevada Saturday in USU's Western Athletic Conference home opener at a clear and sunny Romney Stadium. USU is now 1-5 overall and 0-2 in WAC action on the season, with both losses by three points after last Saturday's 20-17 loss at New Mexico State on a last-second field goal. Nevada improves to 2-0 in league play and evening its overall mark at 3-3. The Aggies are now 4-16 against the Wolf Pack, losing the last five in a row. Junior quarterback Diondre Borel threw for a career-high 353 yards on 25-of-42 passing with three TD's, his second three TD outing this season. Four of his passes went to senior wide receiver Nnamdi Gwacham for a career-high 140 yards, including a career-long 77-yard reception in the first quarter to set up USU's first TD of the game. The Aggies had a total of 427 yards of total offense, while the Wolf Pack tallied 502 yards, including 313 on the ground, with Vai Tava (147) and Luke Lippincott (104) combining for 251 of that with one TD each. Lippincott's 69-yard scamper with 4:08 left proved to be the winning score as it gave Nevada a 35-24 lead. USU cut it to 35-32 with 2:35 to go on a 14-yard pass from Borel to Gwacham, followed by a two-point conversion from Borel to sophomore running back Robert Turbin. The Aggies went for the on-side kick and initially recovered it, but were called for offside. On the re-kick, Nevada recovered and ran out the clock for the win. Senior safety James Brindley led USU with a game-high nine tackles, including one for a loss and snared his team-leading third interception of the season. It was also his ninth of his career as he needs one more to reach USU's career top 10 list. The sophomore linebacker tandem of Bobby Wagner and Kyle Gallagher had eight stops each. The Aggies opened the scoring with a 1-yard plunge from Turbin at the 6:41 mark of the first quarter and USU went ahead 14-0 with 12:25 to go in the second stanza after an 8-yard pass from Borel to sophomore wide receiver Eric Moats, for Moats' first career TD catch. Nevada sandwiched a pair of TD passes from Colin Kaepernick, the first an 11-yarder to Lippincott, and a 44-yarder to Virgil Green around a 32-yard scoring strike from Borel to Turbin to make it 21-14 in USU's favor at halftime. Kaepernick finished the game 10-of-24 passing for 189 yards with three TD tosses, while also rushing for 77 yards. On the Aggies' opening possession of the second half, junior punter Peter Caldwell's punt bounced off Nevada's returner Jonathan Amaya and USU sophomore wide receiver Stanley Morrison recovered at the Nevada 13-yard line. A penalty and sack stalled USU's drive and senior kicker Chris Ulinski booted a season-long 48-yard field goal for a 24-14 USU lead with 10:23 in the third quarter. The Wolf Pack reeled off 21-straight points on a Tava 5-yard run, a 49-yard TD pass from Kaepernick to Brandon Wimberly, and Lippincott's 69-yard run to open its 35-24 lead that USU couldn't counter.

UTAH STATE 23, LOUISIANA TECH 21

LOGAN, Utah - Sophomore safety Walter McClenton came off the bench to anchor a resolute Utah State defense in leading the Aggies to a hard-fought 23-21 win over Louisiana Tech on Oct. 24 in a Western Athletic Conference clash at a cold and damp Romney Stadium. McClenton replaced senior safety James Brindley who left the game with an injury after the first series, and posted a career-high 14 tackles. McClenton had only one career stop prior to the LTU game. He tallied seven solo and seven assists, while posting one pass break-up, a sack and forced fumble, as part of an Aggie defense that held Louisiana Tech to 273 yards. LTU had 165 yards in the fourth quarter, rallying from a 23-7 lead with 14 points to close the gap. The Bulldogs pulled to 23-21 on a 20-yard TD pass from Ross Jenkins to Dennis Morris with 6:15 to go in the game, but LTU's two-point conversion pass attempt was denied by the USU defense, and the Aggies hung on for the win with a fourth-down stop at midfield in the waning minutes. The USU defense logged a season-high four sacks against LA Tech after having just four coming in to Saturday's game, part of posting nine tackles for loss against LTU. Sophomore linebacker Kyle Gallagher posted one and a half sacks as part of his seven tackles, in making his first start of the season. Fellow sophomore linebacker Bobby Wagner matched Gallagher with seven stops and snared an acrobatic interception in the second quarter to set up a 27-yard field goal by senior kicker Chris Ulinski just before half to give USU a 20-7 intermission lead. Ulinski booted a career-high three field goals. Offensively, Utah State was led by sophomore wide receiver Stanley Morrison, matching a season-high with six catches for 72 yards, including a 41-yard TD catch in the second quarter, his second scoring reception of the season, both of over 40 yards. Morrison was one of eight different Aggie receivers, matching USU's season-high from the BYU game on Oct. 2. Junior quarterback Diondre Borel was 17-of-31 passing for 188 yards with the TD pass to Morrison, while sophomore running back Robert Turbin had 94 yards on 22 carries. Junior running back Derrvin Speight had 44 yards on the ground on four carries, including a career-long 44-yard rush for TD. Speight made his first start since 2007 after not seeing any action last season with a foot injury. Utah State jumped out to a 10-0 lead, opening the scoring with the Borel to Morrison TD toss, followed by a 28-yard field goal by Ulinski. LTU's Phillip Livas returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a TD to pull the Bulldogs to 10-7. USU responded with Speight's 44-yard TD run, busting then swerving through a huge hole created by the offensive line. Ulinski's field goal closed the first half scoring, as the Aggies scored 20 points in the second quarter, a season-high points in a quarter. Ulinski booted his third field goal of the game with his longest of the afternoon, a 40-yarder with 5:21 to play in the third stanza, as USU opened its 23-7 lead. LA Tech's rally began with a 26-yard pass from Jenkins to R.P. Stuart followed by a two-point pass from Jenkins to Livas to pull the Bulldogs within 23-15 at the 10:38 mark of the fourth quarter. After USU went three-and-out, LTU drove down the field, capping the drive with the pass from Jenkins to Morris, but missing the two-point conversion. The Aggies again went three-and-out, and senior punter Peter Caldwell pinned LTU to its own 16-yard line, one of his four punts inside the 20-yard line. The Bulldogs drove to midfield before the drive was thwarted by the Aggie defense on fourth-down. USU took a knee on three plays, running down the clock and starting up the celebration.

FRESNO STATE 31, UTAH STATE 27

FRESNO, Calif. - For the fourth game in a row, Utah State's final score was a difference of four points after the Aggies were edged 31-27 by Fresno State on Halloween, Oct. 31, at a sunny Bulldog Stadium. Junior QB Diondre Borel became the first Aggie signal-caller to rush for 100 yards since 2005 with a career-best 105 and a TD while throwing for 240 yards and another TD on 20-of-31 passing. It was the fourth time this season that Borel ran and threw for a TD in the same game. Sophomore RB Robert Turbin rushed for 138 yards and a TD, as he and Borel became the second Aggie duo this season to both run for 100 yards. Borel completed a pass to a season-high nine different receivers, led by senior WR Xavier Bowman's career-best seven catches for 65 yards and a TD while junior WR Eric Moats had 59 yards on four catches. The Aggies had 503 yards of total offense, while the Bulldogs had 466. Fresno State RB Ryan Mathews, the nation's leading rusher amassed 185 yards with two TD's. Ryan Colburn was 17-of-27 passing for 256 yards and a TD. Colburn was picked off once by the Aggies, as USU junior CB Rajric Coleman snared the oskie late in the second quarter, setting up senior K Chris Ulinski's 23-yard field goal as time expired in the first half to send USU into the locker room with a 27-17 halftime lead. However, Fresno State stormed back with 14 second half points while the Aggies didn't score. USU got on the board first with a 26-yard Ulinski field goal on the Aggies opening possession of the game, a drive that included 43 and 16-yard rushes by Turbin. Fresno State countered with a fast scoring drive of its own, capped by a 9-yard run by Mathews. The Aggies bounced back on their next drive, started by a 54-yard pass play from Borel to sophomore WR Stanley Morrison and finished by a 5-yard TD toss from Borel to Bowman for a 10-7 USU lead. That advantage would be short-lived as the Bulldogs bounced back and Seyi Ajirrotutu snagged an 18-yard pass from Colburn for a 14-10 FS lead. The Bulldogs took a 17-10 lead with a 50-yard field goal from Fresno State's Kevin Goessling, the same Bulldog kicker who booted a 58-yarder as time expired to beat Utah State 30-28 last season. A 1-yard Turbin plunge knotted the score at 17-all, and Fresno State's A.J. Jefferson fumbled while returning the ensuing kickoff and Aggie junior LB Maxim Dinka Mba recovered, setting up USU at the FS 40-yard line. Seven plays later, Borel darted in from a yard out. Coleman logged his second INT of the season to end Fresno State's ensuing drive, setting up Ulinski's field goal to end the first half. A 2-yard scoring rush from FS's Lonyae Miller at the 8:10 mark of the third quarter pulled the Bulldogs within 27-24 and Mathews put Fresno State ahead with a 10-yard scoring dash with 4:53 to play in the fourth quarter. USU went three-and-out on its ensuing drive, and the Bulldogs ran out the clock.

HAWAII 49, UTAH STATE 36

HONOLULU - After Utah State scored first, Hawaii erupted for 35 unanswered points and went on to beat the Aggies, 49-36, on Nov. 7 at a humid Aloha Stadium. USU is now an even 5-5 all-time vs. Hawaii, but is 2-4 in Honolulu, losing in its last four visits. The Aggies rang up 446 yards of total offense, but allowed 697 to Hawaii, including 431 in the first half. Junior QB Diondre Borel was 23-38 passing for 344 yards and two TD's, but threw two interceptions, snapping his streak of passes without an INT at 228, the longest active streak in the nation entering Saturday, leaving Saturday as the third-longest of the year. Sophomore RB Robert Turbin had 60 yards rushing on 13 carries with two TD's, while senior WR Omar Sawyer had six catches for 86 yards and Turbin had six catches for 51 yards total. Hawaii was led by Bryant Moniz on 21-37 passing for 337 yards with four TDs, two to Greg Salas, part of his 10 catches for 187 yards. Leon Wright-Jackson had 15 rushes for 167 yards and three TDs, while Alex Green added 110 yards rushing. Defensively, sophomore LB Bobby Wagner led the Aggies with nine tackles. Senior CB Kejon Murphy snared his third interception of the season on the first Hawaii pass of the game, setting up USU's opening score on a 7-yard Turbin run, and the PAT by senior K Chris Ulinski gave USU an early 7-0 lead. But then flood gates opened and Hawaii erupted for 35 unanswered points, taking a 35-7 lead into halftime. The Warriors opened with a 57-yard TD pass from Moniz to Jon Medeiros, then a 1-yard run by Wright-Jackson, closing the first quarter with a 14-7 lead. Jovonte Taylor caught a 35-yard scoring pass from Moniz, then a Wright-Jackson 9-yard scamper followed by a 10-yard pass from Moniz to Salas. Hawaii could have had more, closing the half with a field goal attempt, but junior DT Devin Johnson broke through the line to block the kick. UH rang up 431 yards of offense (216 rushing, 215 passing), which was one yard shy of its season-average per game entering the game. USU took the second half kick and charged down the field before Turbin capped the drive with a 3-yard plunge by Turbin, closing to 35-14. After Hawaii missed a 42-yard field goal, Utah State again marched down the field, finishing the charge with a 16-yard TD toss from Borel to senior TE Jeremy Mitchell, the first tight end catch for a TD this season, pulling the Aggies within 34-21. Hawaii's ensuing drive was thwarted by sophomore S Walter McClenton's first career interception and return gave the Aggies the ball back at the UH 6-yard line, but a missed FG left USU without any points. A 5-yard TD scamper by Wright-Jackson capped UH's next possession, opening a 42-21 lead, but USU cut it to 42-28 with a 31-yard catch and run for a TD by junior RB Michael Smith from Borel. That would be the closest the Aggies would get as the Warriors added another TD pass from Moniz to Salas made it 49-28. Borel scored on a 1-yard scamper and hit Sawyer with the two-point conversion with 1:06 left in the game, but Hawaii recovered the onside kick and ran out the clock for the final margin of 49-36.

UTAH STATE 24, SAN JOSE STATE 9

LOGAN, Utah - Sophomore running back Robert Turbin rushed for a career-high 190 yards and reached two milestones along with way to lead Utah State to a 24-9 win over San Jose State at a cold and snowy Romney Stadium in Western Athletic Conference action on Nov. 14. Turbin's 190 yards push him over the 1,000 yard mark for the season, becoming the first USU running back since Aggie legend Emmett White did so in 2001. Turbin now has 1,122 on the season, jumping up to No. 12 on USU's single-season rushing list. Turbin now has 1,624 yards for his career, becoming the first Aggie since White (1998-2001) to reach 1,500 career rushing yards. The 190 yards is the best individual rushing total for an Aggie running back since White's 233 yards vs. Weber State in 2001 and is the most vs. a FBS opponent since White's 274 vs. Wyoming in 2001. It was Turbin's sixth 100-yard rushing outing this season, the most since White had eight in 2001. Junior QB Diondre Borel added 73 rushing yards and sophomore RB Derrvin Speight logged 70 yards on the ground and a TD, as Utah State finished with 381 yards rushing on the day, the 14th-most in school history and the most since 1999 when USU had 388 vs. Nevada. The Aggies ended with 431 yards of total offense, behind the play-calling of USU offensive coordinator Dave Baldwin, who was SJSU's head coach from 1997-2000. The Spartans had 301 yards of total offense, but the USU defense limited SJSU to 56 yards rushing, Utah State's best defensive rushing outing since 2007. With the win, the Aggies improve to 3-1 at home this season, guaranteeing the Aggies a winning season at home, USU's first winning season since 2003, going 3-2. Not to be outdone by his backfield mate, Borel topped the 4,000 career passing yards milestone, giving him 4,020 for his career, the 10th Aggie signal-caller to reach that mark. Borel also surpassed the 5,000 yards of total offense milestone, as his 123 yards in the game give him 5,095 for his career, the eighth Aggie to reach the 5,000 yard plateau and vaulting to No. 7 on the USU career total offense list. Defensively, sophomore LB Bobby Wagner made a team-leading 10 tackles, while junior S Rajric Coleman logged nine stops to go with a fumble recovery. The Spartans were led by Jordan La Secla's 18-of-34 passing for 216 yards, while Lamron Muldrow had 46 yards rushing, and scored SJSU's lone TD on the day, a 2-yard run in the third quarter. Turbin's 190 yards was accompanied by two touchdowns, a 6-yard dart in the first quarter and a 35-yard scamper in the second quarter, putting USU ahead 14-0 at halftime. The Aggies' opening drive nearly stalled, as they lined up for a 48-yard field goal, but senior WR Xavier Bowman successfully executed a fake, running 25 yards for a first down and nearly a touchdown. On the next play, Turbin scored his first TD of the day. Muldrow's TD run pulled the Spartans within 14-6 after the two-point conversion failed, and Tyler Cope later hit a 31-yard field goal to close the gap to 14-9. On USU's ensuing possession, the Aggies faced a fourth-and-one at midfield, but the offensive line created a hug hole for junior RB Michael Smith to burst through for the first down and more, ending with a 23-yard gain. After a penalty slowed the drive, senior PK Chris Ulinski booted a 40-yard field goal for a 17-9 USU lead with 13:42 left in the game. After the Aggie defense held SJSU, the USU offense marched down the field, getting a career-long 47-yard run by Speight along the way, and Speight later capped the drive with a 6-yard TD scamper and Ulinski's upright spill gave USU the final scoring margin of 24-9 with 9:35 to play. The Spartans' next possession saw them reach midfield before the Aggie defense held them, and later denied any rally, with sophomore DE Levi Koskan sacking La Secla on SJSU's fourth-down attempt. It was USU's first win over SJSU since 2005, but the Aggies have won the last two of three at Logan. The Spartans still lead the all-time series 20-11-1 and with the series now even at 8-8 at Logan.

#6 BOISE STATE 52, UTAH STATE 21

LOGAN, Utah - Utah State kept it close with 6th-ranked Boise State for a quarter and a half, until the Broncos pulled away with 21 points in the final five minutes of the first half and won, 52-21, on Nov. 20 in a nationally-televised game from USU's Romney Stadium. It was USU's final home game of the season, as the Aggies finish their home ledger with a 3-2 mark, their first season with a winning record since 2003. The loss spoiled USU's Senior Night, as the Aggies honored their 15 seniors before the game. It also spoiled the first nationally televised game from Romney Stadium since at least 1977 and the first time that the ESPN network televised a football game in Logan. Sophomore RB Robert Turbin topped USU's single-season rushing record for a sophomore on a 24-yard scoring run, as he now has 1,183 yards on the season, topping the previous sophomore mark of 1,135 by Rick Parros in 1977. The win improves Boise State to 11-0 overall and 6-0 in Western Athletic Conference action while USU is now 3-8 overall and 2-5 in WAC play. It was the Broncos' 14th-straight WAC win, with their last conference loss coming in 2007. Utah State is now 4-12 all-time vs. Boise State, losing the last nine meetings, including the last four times when BSU has been ranked. Junior RB Michael Smith scored on a 22-yard run to tie it at 7-7 with 5:52 in the first quarter. After a Boise State TD, Utah State countered with the 24-yard TD rush Turbin to knot the score at 14-all with 6:28 remaining in the first half. The Broncos then scored 21 points in the final five minutes of the half to take a 35-7 halftime lead and never looked back, amassing 572 yards of total offense in the process, led by 121 rushing yards and four TD's from RB Doug Martin while fellow RB Jeremy Avery added 116 yards and two TD's. QB Kellen Moore was 15-29 for 233 yards and one TD, hitting WR Titus Young for five passes for 102 yards. Utah State was led by Turbin with 61 yards rushing while junior QB Diondre Borel was 18-30 passing for 201 yards. Smith ended the game with 44 rushing yards on two TD's and had 48 yards receiving on two catches, including 25 on a fake punt pass play from sophomore WR Stanley Morrison. Junior WR Eric Moats had a team-high 70 yards on three catches while senior WR Xavier Bowman added four catches for 23 yards. Sophomore LB Bobby Wagner led USU with 13 tackles, while BSU was led by Jeron Johnson's 14 stops.
