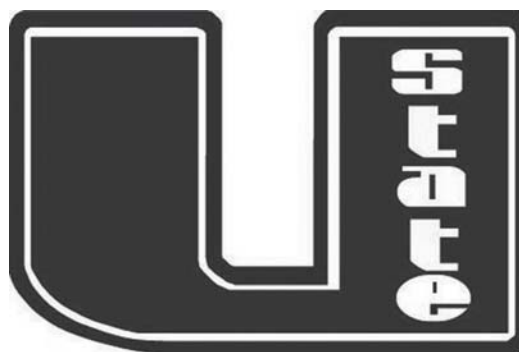

MEDIA INFORMATION

To The Media

The 2005 Utah State football media guide has been prepared to assist you in covering the Aggies this season. Additional information is available by contacting the Athletic Media Relations Office at (435) 797-1361 or through USU's website at www.UtahStateAggies.com.

Weekly Press Release

Each Sunday a complete release previewing the upcoming game and reviewing the season will be available on the Utah State University athletic web site at www.UtahStateAggies.com. This release will also be e-mailed and/or faxed to media requesting this service each Sunday afternoon.

Credentials

To obtain credentials for Utah State home games, requests should be made on company letterhead and sent to the Athletic Media Relations office at least one week in advance of the game. Credentials will be granted on this priority basis:

1. Daily newspapers; 2. Originating radio stations; 3. Opponent's media as designated by its media relations director; 4. National media; 5. Local print media which covers USU events on a regular basis; 6. Other.

Credentials will be mailed if enough advance notice is given. Credentials not mailed will be left at the will call in the ticket booth at the south end of Romney Stadium.

Parking

Credentialed media will be allowed access to the parking lot on the west side of the stadium (Blue Lot). A parking pass is required for admittance to that area and should be requested at least one week in advance of the game.

Press Box Services

Access to the press box is limited to those with working credentials. A pregame meal will be served approximately one hour prior to kickoff.

Game programs, game notes, and flip cards will be provided prior to the game. Statistics and play-by-play information will be provided during the game. At the conclusion of the game a complete statistical book, typed quotes and postgame notes will be available in the press box.

Final game statistics will be faxed to media requesting the service.

Wireless internet will be available to media at the game. A limited number of telephones will be available in the press box on a first-come, first-served basis. Requests for personal phones should be made through USU Telephone Services at (435) 797-3201 at least one week prior to the game.

Photographers' Access

Photographers are allowed to shoot on the sidelines outside the team bench area (team bench areas are between the 25-yard lines). Photographers must remain outside of the team bench area. Photographers may also shoot from the photo decks on top of or below the Romney Stadium press box. Team rosters are provided in the press box.

Interviews

All requests for interviews with Utah State players and coaches should be made directly through the Athletic Media Relations Office (435) 797-1361 and should be made at least one day in advance. The best time for player interviews is before or after practice, while Head Coach Brent Guy should be available in the mornings as well as before or after practice. Player interviews will be conducted through Wednesday each game week.

The Utah State lockerroom is closed to the media on game days. Postgame interviews will take place after a brief cooling off period in a designated area.

Press Conferences

Head Coach Brent Guy will hold a press conference in Logan each Monday during the season at The Copper Mill Restaurant (55 North Main) at 11:30 a.m. Selected players will also be available at the press conference. Quotes from the press conference will be available on USU's web site (www.UtahStateAggies.com) each Monday afternoon and will also be faxed and/or e-mailed per request.

Western Athletic Teleconferences

Each Monday during the season, the Western Athletic Conference will host a weekly media teleconference featuring a coach and player from each team. Brent Guy will be on the call from 10:53 to 11 a.m. Contact the conference office, (303) 799-9221, or each school for a complete schedule.

Aggie fans will be able to follow Utah State home games through the Aggie website at www.UtahStateAggies.com, through Game Tracker, a program that documents each play and updates statistics throughout the contest.

Utah State football games are broadcast on **KVNU (610 AM)** and **KVFX (94.5 FM)** in Logan, Utah as well as on the following stations: **98.3 FM (Salt Lake City)**, **106.3 FM (Ogden/SLC)**, **104.7 FM (Utah County/SLC)**, **102.3 FM (Bear Lake)**, and **105.5 FM (Randolph)** as well as on the internet at www.UtahStateAggies.com. Al Lewis serves as the play-by-play announcer while Craig Hislop serves as the analyst. The Brent Guy radio show, hosted by Lewis, will be broadcast on Thursdays on KVNU.

Logan, Utah is home to Utah State University and is located approximately 75 miles north of Salt Lake City, Utah. **From Salt Lake International Airport:** Take I-80 East out of the airport to 215 North, which will run into I-15 North. Follow I-15 North to exit 362 (Highway 89-91) at Brigham City. Follow Highway 89 into Logan, where it becomes Main Street. Stay on Main Street until you reach 1000 North and turn right. Turn left at 800 East and the football stadium will be on your right. The parking lot is located on the west side of the stadium just off 800 East.

WESTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Western Athletic Conference

In its 44th year, the Western Athletic Conference continues to evolve and features some of the nation's best intercollegiate competition. One thing that remains unchanged is the persistent nature of the nine schools in the WAC to advance their programs to contend at the top levels of the NCAA.

The WAC provides its student-athletes the chance to travel to scenic destinations and gain exposure in some of the nation's most diverse markets. In addition, the WAC's student-athletes work to achieve the highest levels of success with the academic support of their respective institutions.

The WAC has experienced tremendous success. Over the past three years, it has won 63.6 percent of its bowl games, the best winning percentage of any conference in the nation. In the past two seasons, the WAC has sent a total of eight teams to bowl games. Last year, WAC football teams led the nation in scoring. Boise State has won 35 of its last 37 football games and boasts the second best record in the nation since 2001.

In men's basketball, a team has advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 11 consecutive seasons. Every current school in the WAC has competed in the NCAA Tournament since 1990. Fresno State softball and Louisiana Tech women's basketball have both competed in every NCAA Tournament ever held.

Current WAC alums have made their presence felt as well. David Carr (Fresno State) was the first player selected in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans. Cheryl Ford (Louisiana Tech) was named the WNBA Rookie of the Year and helped the Detroit Shock win the league's championship in 2003. And in 2004, the United States' softball team won the Olympic gold medal with former Fresno State players Laura Berg and Lovie Jung.

In 2001, the WAC partnered with ESPN and added SportsWest in 2003 for unprecedented coverage of football and basketball. Over the past two years, the networks have shown a total of 52 football games, by far the most in a two-year range in WAC history.

The WAC is the sixth oldest among the nation's 11 Division I-A conferences. Its history traces back to July 27, 1962, when the original six-team league of Arizona, Arizona State, Brigham Young, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming began competition.

The first championship was held in November 1962, when Arizona won the men's cross country title and New Mexico followed with the first WAC football title. Arizona finished second in the NCAA College World Series and, less than three years later, Arizona State claimed the league's first NCAA title when the Sun Devils won the College World Series trophy. Rice was the last WAC school to earn an NCAA team title when it won the College World Series in 2003.

Since that year, several changes have occurred. UTEP and Colorado State became members in September 1967, while Arizona and Arizona State withdrew on June 30, 1978. The WAC then added San Diego State (1978), Hawai'i (1979) and Air Force (1980). Before 1990, the WAC sponsored championships only in men's sports. However, a merger with the High Country Athletic Conference formed a single conference under one administrative structure, and the 1990-91 athletic year was the first in which both men and women competed under the WAC name. Fresno State was added in 1992, and then in 1996, the women's programs from Air Force and Hawai'i along with six new schools (UNLV, Rice, San Jose State, SMU, TCU and Tulsa) came into the WAC. Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, UNLV, New Mexico, San Diego State, Utah and Wyoming withdrew on June 30, 1999. Nevada (2000), Boise State (2001) and Louisiana Tech (2001) were added while TCU withdrew following the 2000-01 season. The current membership was established on July 1, 2005,

when Idaho, New Mexico State and Utah State joined the WAC after Rice, SMU, UTEP and Tulsa withdrew.

The WAC has had just five commissioners in its history. Paul Brechler was named the first leader of the conference and held the position from 1962-1968. He was followed by Wiles Hallock (1968-71), Stan Bates (1971-80), Dr. Joe Kearney (1980-94) and Karl Benson (1994-present).

Presently, the WAC crowns team and individual champions in 19 sports – eight men's and 11 women's. For the men, there are championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, indoor track and field and outdoor track and field. Championships for women are held in basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and volleyball.

The WAC office has been located in the Denver area since the conference's inception with the exception of a two-year stay in Phoenix from 1964-66.
