The 2002 Utah State soccer team has its sights set on improving upon last year's 6-11-1 mark in head coach Jen Kennedy Croft's inaugural season.

"We're excited about the things that happened last season," Kennedy Croft said. "We shutout league champion Cal State Fullerton and we had great performances from individuals on the team. I hope we can build on that this year. If people report fit, we'll be ahead of the game and able to focus on what we need to do to make a good showing in the Big West."

The Aggies return 15 players from last year's squad, including forwards Amber Tracy, an all-Big West Honorable Mention selection who posted seven goals and 15 points as a sophomore, and Brigid Turner, who was second on the team in goals (3) and points (8).

Midfielders Michelle Eversman and Jessica Ebner also return. Eversman started all 18 matches last year, and recorded two goals and an assist. Ebner started 15 games and posted a goal and an assist.

Defensively, the Aggies return Megan (Edge) Tanner, Melissa Baggaley and Lyndy Goodsell.

At goal, two-year starter Tracy Brady graduated, but USU returns Megan Mills. Mills played in five matches last year and posted a 1.77 goals against average.

FORWARDS

Tracy and Turner are expected to anchor a strong frontline for the Aggies in 2002. Returnees Heather Arnell and Claire Schend provide experience, while newcomer Chanel Blaquiere will challenge the veterans.

"I hope Amber Tracy can equal her 2001 season," Kennedy Croft said. "If we get her the ball, we'll have success."

"Then we add Brigid Turner to the mix, and her stats don't show how great she's been for us. Both Turner and Tracy are selfish on the field when it's time to score goals. They take on the people they need to."

Turner is second among USU career goals and points leaders, with 17 and 37, respectively. Tracy found her way into the record books at fourth among season points (15) and goals (7) leaders, and fifth in career points (8). Tracy and Arnell each had two-goal games last year, becoming the eighth and ninth players to achieve that feat in USU's six seasons.

"Heather Arnell has a golden touch," Kennedy Croft said. "She needs to look to goal more."

Schend scored her first career goal

last season, while Lacey (Miles) Poulton played in four games for USU. Blaquiere, a freshman from Alta Loma, Calif., was a four-year letterwinner in three different sports, and Kennedy Croft anticipates she'll be an impact player for Utah State. "She's strong on the ball, has an eye for the goal and is quick. Those three qualities will make her a dangerous forward."

MIDFIELDERS

Kennedy Croft said the midfield could be the Aggies' weakness this fall. "We're lacking experience," she said. "I hope we can come through and have some great things from our veterans."

Those veterans include seniors Eversman and Ebner and junior Ally Clegg who missed most of the 2001 season recovering from an ACL injury.

"Michelle has great speed and has improved every year," Kennedy Croft said. "Jess is just a super-athletic kid who's really strong on the ball. They'll help us a lot."

As a freshman, Clegg started all 17 games, and scored two goals on 23 shots. Since, she's struggled with injuries, but will add depth in the midfield. "We're excited to have her back," Kennedy Croft said. "She could win that starting spot back if she's healthy and ready to go."

Newcomers Jessica Donelson, Charlise Harris and Tiffany Jones add to the Aggies' depth at the position. Potentially, all three will see playing time, Kennedy Croft said.

"Tiffany is small, but has great vision. Chuck (Harris) is a frontrunner with the versatility to play in the midfield. She wants to score."

DEFENDERS

Four veterans who played in all but two matches in 2001 anchor the backfield this fall, as seniors Tanner and Goodsell, junior Michelle Murri and sophomore Baggaley return.

"Megan has been our rock for three years and we expect the same from her this year," Kennedy Croft said. "She's a great leader by example." Tanner started 17 games in 2001 and contributed an assist.

Goodsell, who started 18 games, should start and play every game, Kennedy Croft said. "Lyndy is one of the strongest players on the team. She just gets better and better every year."

Murri saw action in 17 matches in 2001. "When she plays well, she's a great defender and very tenacious."

Baggaley started all 18 matches as a freshman, and was named all-Big West Honorable Mention. "Hopefully she'll

just get better from there," Kennedy Croft said. "She'll anchor our defense."

Junior transfer Shaylee Hogge, the 2000 and 2001 defensive MVP at the NJCCA Nationals and an NJCCA all-American as a sophomore, can play any defensive position for the Aggies, Kennedy Croft said.

Freshmen Elizabeth Masson of Sandy, Utah, and Jennifer McCann of Nibley, Utah, round out USU's defensive corps. "We recruited Jen because of her speed," Kennedy Croft said. "She's versatile, while Liz is scrappy and smart."

GOALKEEPERS

Mills saw 315 minutes in the net last season, allowing 31 shots. "She just keeps getting better," Kennedy Croft said. "She had a phenomenal game against Cal State Northridge last year. If she plays like that all the time, we won't have any problems."

Freshman Amy Johnson of Eugene, Ore., will push Mills. "She's a hard worker, she's intense and she has the ability to start and contribute as a freshman," assistant coach Brent Anderson said. "She will give Megan a real push."

SCHEDULE

USU opens its season at Idaho State on Aug. 30, before beginning a string of five home games in the non-conference season. They travel to Air Force on Sept. 20 and take on Wyoming in Laramie on Sept. 22.

The Big West season begins on Oct. 4 with home matches against Long Beach State and UC Irvine. USU travels to defending Big West champion Cal State Fullerton on Oct. 13. The last home matches for the Aggies are Oct. 18 and 20 against UC Santa Barbara and Cal Poly, as they close out the season with three road matches, Oct. 25 and 27 and Nov. 3.





jen KENNEDY CROFT **head COACH**

⚽ **SECOND SEASON** ⚽

On Jan. 12, 2001, Jen Kennedy Croft was named the second head soccer coach at Utah State since the program's inception in 1996.

Kennedy Croft was an assistant at Utah State for two seasons under Stacy Enos, and has 12 years of collegiate coaching experience. Prior to arriving at USU, she served as an assistant at Connecticut (1989), Maine (1990-91), Princeton (1991), Rhode Island (1992) and Arkansas (1992-93).

Kennedy Croft was the head coach at Seattle University from 1994-96 before joining the Utah State staff in 1999. At Seattle, she guided the program to a 34-19-7 record in three years while leading the team to three NAIA Regional Tournament appearances. In three years at the helm, Kennedy Croft's teams were 8-5-6 in her inaugural season, 9-11-1 in her second year and 17-3-0 in her final campaign.

In 2001, her first season as head coach at Utah State, Kennedy Croft guided the Aggies to a 6-11-1 record, their second-best year in the program's six seasons. Additionally, USU handed then-undefeated Big West champion Cal State Fullerton its only conference loss on the season.

As a player at Connecticut from 1984-77, Kennedy Croft earned four letters as a defender and was named the team's Most Valuable Player in 1987.

Kennedy Croft graduated from the University of Connecticut in 1988 with a B.A. in English. She is married to Utah State assistant track coach Stan Croft. The couple has one child, Sarah (2).

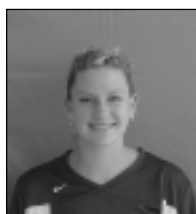

kermit I. HALL president

Dr. Kermit L. Hall became the 14th president of Utah State University on Jan. 2, 2001. He oversees Utah's land-grant university, the oldest such institution west of

the Mississippi River, with an enrollment of 21,000 undergraduate and graduate students. President Hall came to Utah from North Carolina State University where he was Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs.

President Hall holds a Ph.D. in history from the University of Minnesota, a M.S. in the study of law from Yale University Law School, and a B.A. from the University of Akron. He also graduated from Harvard University's Institute for Educational Management.

A tenured member of the department of history, President Hall regularly teaches a course in the history of the Supreme Court for undergraduates on the Logan campus. He also has held academic and administrative posts at a number of universities, serving previously as Dean of the College of Humanities and Executive Dean of the Colleges of Arts and Sciences, as well as a professor of history and law at the Ohio State University and as professor of history and law at the University of Florida.

An historian and legal scholar, Dr. Hall has authored or coauthored five books, edited or coedited 12 more and published more than 100 articles in history, political science and law journals.

President Bill Clinton nominated and the Senate confirmed President Hall as one of the five members of the John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Review Board. The Board opened to the American public millions of previously highly classified documents relating to the assassination of President Kennedy. For his service, President Hall received the James Madison Award of the American Library Association, given annually to those who have made an outstanding commitment to openness in government.

In his role as an historian, President Hall has conducted extensive research in Utah, including the records of the Utah Historical Society, the genealogical library of the LDS Church and the Western History Collection at Utah State University. He also served on the editorial board of the Western Historical Quarterly, which is housed on the Logan campus.

Since arriving on campus, President Hall has made a special effort to reach out to and become familiar with the people of Utah. He has milked a cow in every county of the state and he and his wife, Phyllis, have taught a class in at least one elementary and high school in each county in the state.

Phyllis Hall, also an educator, served as an elementary school Library Media Specialist in the Wake County School System of North Carolina before moving to Utah. Some of her other interests include working with "at-risk" students. She serves as a volunteer tutor at Ellis Elementary School in Logan.



Rance PUGMIRE athletics DIRECTOR

A seven-year member of the Utah State University Athletics Department, Rance Pugmire is in his fourth year as athletics director. After serving as the associate ath-

letics director for external operations for two years, Pugmire was appointed to the position of athletics director on July 16, 1999, replacing Bruce Van De Velde, who left to take a position as senior associate athletics director at the University of Oklahoma.

"USU is fortunate to have a person of Rance's capabilities and experience who is already employed by the university in the athletics department," said Fred Hunsaker, vice president of administrative affairs.

"This speaks well of the high caliber of personnel we have working in athletics at USU," Hunsaker said. "Rance will do a great job for our athletics program."

In Pugmire's time at Utah State, the athletics department has seen continued success both athletically and academically. USU became the first Big West school to win a basketball game in the NCAA tournament since 1993.

As the associate athletics director for external operations, Pugmire worked with a team of staff members and volunteers to stage USU's record-breaking auction, which raised \$17,000, more than the previous record. USU fundraising also showed great increases, including a record \$40,000 from its fund-raising golf tournaments.

Prior to his 1998 appointment as associate athletics director, Pugmire served as the assistant athletic director for development and media relations at USU beginning in 1995.

While at USU, he has overseen fund-raising efforts, the marketing department, the media relations department, and worked with the ticket office as well as serving as the administrator for the sports of track and cross country and softball and overseeing game-day operations for football and basketball.

Before coming to USU he worked as the regional development director at the University of Idaho from 1994-95.

He was the sports information director at Idaho from 1990-94, where he coordinated a successful campaign to help Doug Nussmeier earn the 1993 Division I-AA college football player-of-the-year award.

Prior to joining the Idaho staff, Pugmire spent three years as assistant sports information director at St. John's (N.Y.) University. Pugmire has also worked in press operations with the original USA Basketball "Dream Team" and the U.S. Olympic Festival.

A native of Hagerman, Idaho, he graduated from the University of Idaho in 1987 with a degree in journalism and a minor in political science.

Married to the former Barbara Hinkle of Fairfield, Idaho, Pugmire and his wife are the parents of two children, Jordyn, 9, and Conner, 6.





THIS IS UTAH STATE

Utah State University, founded in 1888, is a prestigious institution, sure of its identity and proud of its reputation for innovative teaching. Utah State reflects the outlooks and attitudes of the people who attend. Contemporary views among students, faculty and staff mix with traditional opinions. A beautiful, well-kept campus in Logan, Utah, includes more than 100 buildings located on 400 acres, with an additional 7,000 acres used for agricultural and other research, located throughout the state.

The USU campus is situated on a bench that was once the home of prehistoric Lake Bonneville. Logan (population 35,000) is the county seat of Cache County (population 75,000). It offers a wide array of shops, services and other amenities that complement the University.

Northern Utah's dry and sunny summers and falls allow students to enjoy the many outstanding recreation opportunities that are available, including mountain biking, sail boarding, rock climbing, hiking and camping. Winters on the valley floor are relatively mild, though the surrounding mountains receive plenty of snow for cross country and downhill skiing — just a 30-minute drive up Logan Canyon.

The importance of the individual is the focus at USU. Additional impetus is always given to individualizing baccalaureate degrees. This is a system by which students can pattern their programs within university policy and progress at their own speeds.

Utah State has a threefold purpose: teaching, research and extension. Utah State also cooperates with various agencies on a national and international level to help promote understanding and share knowledge.

With a student body of nearly 20,000 — 85 percent of them undergraduates — USU has the advantages of both large and small schools, with features such as two libraries, excellent laboratories and top-rated cultural attractions. These advantages are combined with the individualized programs, and are characterized by close, personal attention.

The student body represents every county in Utah, all 50 states and 80 foreign countries. A majority of students live on or near campus. Housing accommodations, both on and off campus, are available in many different forms.

The university was founded as part of the public education system of Utah and operates under the constitution and laws of



old MAIN

the state. It belongs to a great family of institutions known as land-grant universities, which had their origin in 1862. A rich curriculum is offered in the arts and sciences, in both undergraduate and graduate programs. Degrees granted include the bachelor's and master's degrees, Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.).

While the individual classroom attention is excellent, Utah State student-athletes are given the opportunity to receive additional individual aid through mentoring, tutoring and study hall programs. The Learning and Life Skills Center offers free seminars dealing with time management, effective note taking, exam readiness and study habits. In addition, Career Development Services assists in assessing career interests and finding appropriate majors for the undecided student.

Utah State includes eight resident colleges (Agriculture; Business; Education; Engineering; Family Life; Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences; Natural Resources; and Science) with 45 departments, a School of Graduate Studies, University Extension and research programs. There are also current programs in education aid to several foreign countries.
