QUICKLY

> Utah (0-0, 0-0 Pac-12) hosts Montana State (0-0, 0-0 Big Sky) in the season opener for both teams on Thursday, Sept. 1. Kickoff is 6 p.m. MDT in Rice-Eccles Stadium. The game will be televised on KJZZ TV (channel 14 and Comcast channel 3 in Salt Lake City). For those outside the viewing area, a free live video stream of the KJZZ telecast will be hosted on UtahUtes.com—signifying the first time a Utah football game has been streamed live from Rice-Eccles Stadium. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com).

> A sellout is anticipated for Thursday's game vs. MSU. Limited bleacher seats and standing room tickets may be purchased on UtahUtes.com, at the Rice-Eccles Stadium box office and by calling 801-581-UTIX.

> Looking ahead, only single seats and standing room tickets remain for home games against Washington, Arizona State, Oregon State and Colorado, while around 700 seats remain for the UCLA game. Utah has sold out its allotment of 32,000 season tickets for the fourth-straight year.

> Utah leads the series with FCS member Montana State 9-0, with its most recent win in 1982. See page 2 for complete series information.

> Utah is 31-0 all-time against Big Sky Conference schools. The last time Utah played a Big Sky school (or an FCS school) was in 2008, when the Utes beat Weber State 37-21. Utah's only other game against an FCS school in this decade was Big Sky member Northern Arizona in 2006 (a 45-7 Utah win).

> Utah has made nine bowl appearances since 2001, going 8-1 with a 2-0 record in BCS bowl games. The Utes have finished in the Top 25 five times in the last eight years, including a No. 2 A.P. ranking in 2008. Utah finished No. 4 in the A.P. poll in 2004.

> Since 2003, Utah has compiled a 79-22 overall record (78%) for an average of nearly 10 wins a season (9.88) with undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0).

UTAH-MONTANA STATE SERIES

Series Snapshot ...

Most of this series was played in the first half of the 20th century, with the exceptions falling in 1951 and 1982. Utah's 9-0 lead includes six shutouts. Eight of the nine games were played in Salt Lake City, most recently in 1982 (a 30-12 Ute victory). Utah's point advantage in the first nine games was 455-25.

Last Time (Sept. 4, 1982, Salt Lake City): Utah opened its season with a 30-12 win over the Bobcats in Chuck Stobart's first game as Utah's head coach. Carl Monroe's two touchdowns included a 96-yard kickoff return in the first quarter. He also scored on a 45-yard touchdown run—part of a 167-yard rushing game for Monroe, who would go on to set a school single-season rushing record (1,507 yards) that still stands today.

At the first quarter break, Ute ski coach **Kevin Sweeney** will be presented with the annual Don Reddish award, honoring him as the school's top coach in a sport other than football, basketball or gymnastics. Sweeney led Utah to an NCAA runner-up finish last March.

BALLS IN THE AIR

In honor of the inaugural Pac-12 game (Utah at USC on Sept. 10), the conference office has created two commemorative footballs to mark the occasion. The balls will go on a two-week journey to the Pac-12 schools, starting on Aug. 29 in Eugene, Ore., and ending in Los Angeles on Sept. 10. They will land in Salt Lake City on Sept. 7. The balls will be tracked on Twitter (hashtag #pac12kickoff) with a photo of each coach signing the balls and a status update. One ball will be auctioned off for charity and the other will be kept in the lobby at the Pac-12 offices.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

Head coach **Kyle Whittingham's** son **Tyler Whittingham** and nephew **Jason Whittingham** joined the team last week. Tyler is a senior walk-on safety and Jason is a freshman defensive lineman who served a church mission after signing with the Utes in 2009 ... Brothers **Joe** and **Dave Kruger** both play on the defensive line. Their brother Paul Kruger, a 2008 first-team all-MWC defensive lineman for Utah, now plays linebacker for the Baltimore Ravens. Brother-in-law **Tony Bergstrom**, who is married to their sister Jessica, is a senior right tackle for the Utes ... Running back **Tauni Vakapuna** is the younger brother of Cincinnati Bengal running back Fui Vakapuna ... Receiver **Dres Anderson** is the son of former 10-year NFL player Willie "Flipper" Anderson ... Tight end **Jake Murphy** is the son of former Atlanta Braves' all-star outfielder Dale Murphy.

ROAD WARRIERS

Fans have purchased more than 13,000 tickets to 2011 road games from the Utah ticket office, which is believed to be the most tickets sold for a road season in school history. Ticket sales to date, which do not include tickets purchased directly through the host school or through other means follow: USC (5,000/some seats remain at \$65), BYU (2,800/ allotment sold out), Cal (3,000/ allotment sold out), Arizona (1,500/ some seats remain at \$60). Tickets are also available for the Pitt (\$40) and Washington State (\$50) games.

PAC-12 ERA BEGINS

On July 1, 2011, the University of Utah began official membership in the Pac-12 Conference. The Utes accepted an invitation to join the conference on June 17, 2010. Utah's previous conference affiliations follow: Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98), Mountain West Conference (1999-2010).

WHITTINGHAM FILE

Entering his seventh year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has a 58-20 overall record, a 12-5 mark against BCS schools and 4-3 ledger against the Pac-12. Utah has won 10 or more games and finished in the Associated Press and/or Coaches' Top 25 for the past three seasons. Whittingham was named the 2008 National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Paul "Bear" Bryant Awards committee after leading Utah to a 13-0 season, a victory over Alabama in the Sugar Bowl and a No. 2 final A.P. ranking. He joined the Utah staff in 1994 as the defensive line coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator a year later. In his 17-year tenure, Utah has won 70-percent of its games (143-61) and 10 of 12 bowl games. He is 6-1 in bowl games, including a victory as co-head coach of the 2005 Fiesta Bowl team. Whittingham has coached seven All-Americans, including five first-team All-Americans (three consensus). A linebacker for Brigham Young from 1978-81, Whittingham earned first-team all-WAC and WAC Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1981. He played in the first four Holiday Bowls and was named Defensive MVP of the 1981 game. In 2008, he was inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 615-423-31. The Utes are 376-174-16 at home (58-17 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 221-234-13 in road games and 18-15-2 in games played at neutral sites. Utah is 76-120-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools.

UTAH VS. THE BIG SKY

Utah is 31-0 against Big Sky teams including a 20-0 mark against the Montana schools. Utah's series breakdown vs. Big Sky schools follows: 11-0 vs. Montana, 9-0 vs. MSU, 6-0 vs. Idaho State, 3-0 vs. Weber State, 1-0 vs. Northern Arizona and 1-0 vs. Portland State.

OFFENSIVE ELLIPSES

First-year offensive coordinator **Norm Chow** has installed a multiple offense, replacing the spread formation Utah has utilized since 2003 ... **Tim Davis** is back as Utah's offensive line coach after stops at Wisconsin, USC, the Miami Dolphins, Alabama and Minnesota.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > Junior **Jordan Wynn** begins his third year as the starter, having earned the job midway through his true freshman season in 2009.
- > **Wynn** is 11-4 as the starter and has appeared in 16 games over the past two years.
- > In 10 games last year (he missed three games with injury), **Wynn** completed 62% percent of his passes (186-for-299) for 2,334 yards and 17 touchdowns.
- > **Wynn** has four career 300-yard games and eight career 200-yard games.
- > With **Wynn** on the field in the past two seasons, Utah is 52-of-56 (93%) in the red zone.
- > **Wynn** has the 10th-best mark for career touchdown passes (25) at Utah and ranks 12th in career passing yards (3,663).
- > There is no NCAA experience behind Wynn. New scholarship quarterbacks on the roster are junior **Jon Hays** and true freshman **Tyler Shreve**.
- > **Hays** earned the backup spot behind Wynn in fall camp. He originally signed out of junior college with Nebraska-Omaha, but came to Utah in the summer after UNO dropped its football program.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > Utah breaks in a new starter for the first time since the 2007 season with the loss of three-year co-starters Matt Asiata (2008, 2010) and Eddie Wide (2009, 2010).
- > Junior college transfer **John White**, the 2010 Central West Conference Offensive Player of the Year for L.A. Harbor College, has won the starting job, backed up by senior **Tauni Vakapuna**.
- > **White** set a number of school records at L.A. Harbor College, including career rushing yards (2,527), rushing touchdowns (34) and total touchdowns (41). He rushed for 1,491 yards last season, averaging 8.1 yards per carry, with four 200-yard games.
- > **Vakapuna**, a walk-on who played last year, is the only running back with any carries at Utah. He rushed 19 times for 79 yards (4.2 average) and two touchdowns in 2010.
- > Also jockeying for playing time are true freshman **Harvey Langi**, a high school All-American and the 2010 Utah 5A MVP, and sophomore walk-on **Thretton Palamo**, an internationally-acclaimed rugby star. In 2007, Palamo became the youngest player ever, at age 19, to participate in the Rugby World Cup.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- > Preparing to start for his second season is junior **DeVonte Christopher**, who led Utah in receiving yards (660) and touchdown catches (6) on 39 catches. Christopher was named honorable mention all-Mountain West Conference.
- > Junior **Reggie Dunn** looks to make his first start on Thursday and will split time at Z-receiver with redshirt freshman **Dres Anderson**.
- > **Dunn**, Utah's co-fastest player with 4.32-second 40 speed, caught four passes for 70 yards last year. He also rushed 12 times for 99 yards (8.2 average) and two touchdowns.
- > **Anderson** (4.40-second 40 speed) has been neck-and-neck with **Dunn** for the starting job.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

> Three senior starters return in **Tony Bergstrom**, **John Cullen** and **Tevita Stevens**.

> **Bergstrom**, an all-Pac-12 Conference and All-America candidate, prepares for his third year starting at right tackle.

> **Cullen** will start at left tackle for a second-straight year.

> **Stevens** will start at center after starting at right guard for the past two seasons. Center is considered his natural position.

> Of Utah's guard candidates, only junior **Sam Brenner** has significant NCAA experience. Brenner has played in 25 games in the past two years and will start at right guard.

> Sophomore **Vyncent Jones**, who played in four games a year ago, will get his first college start at left guard.

TIGHT END/FULLBACK NOTEBOOK

> Utah will utilize several hybrid tight end/receiver/fullback types in its new offense.

> The first-string tight end, junior **Kendrick Moeai**, started 11 games last season with 11 catches for 225 yards and a touchdown.

> Backing up Moeai is freshman **Jake Murphy**.

> Either junior **Luke Matthews** or junior **Dallin Rogers** will start at fullback, depending on the package the Utes use.

> **Matthews**, who started 11 games as a sophomore receiver last year, caught 18 balls for 289 yards and three touchdowns.

> **Rogers** had 11 receptions for 167 yards and two touchdowns as a tight end in 2010.

> Three others who will see time at fullback this season are walk-ons **Shawn Asiata**, **Karl Williams** and **Max Moala**.

> Of Utah's fullbacks, only **Matthews** has carried the ball. He had five rushes for 30 yards as a freshman in 2009.

> Senior **Chaz Walker**, Utah's leading tackler with 113 stops last year, was the second-leading tackler in the MWC and a second-team all-MWC pick.

> **Walker** will start for his second year in the middle, where he had seven tackles for loss, two sacks and two interceptions in 2010.

> Senior **Matt Martinez** will start at rover for a second year. Martinez, honorable mention all-MWC in 2010, ranked second on the team in tackles with 91.

> Backups who should see playing time against MSU include **J.J. Williams, Trevor Reilly, V.J. Fehoko** and **Boo Andersen**.

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

> All first-time starters will man Utah's secondary, including two newcomers to the program (JC transfer **Keith McGill** and true freshman **Eric Rowe**).
