- > Utah has won 10 of its last 11 bowl games. Its only loss was to Boise State in the 2010 Las Vegas Bowl.
- > Utah is playing in its 11th bowl game in the last 14 years.
- > Kyle Whittingham is 7-1 in bowl games.
- > From 1999-2009, Utah won nine-consecutive bowl games to tie for the second-longest bowl win streak in NCAA history.
- > Utah went 2-0 in BCS bowl games, beating Pittsburgh in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

PAST LAS VEGAS BOWL HIGHLIGHTS

Utah earned the first bowl win for the new Mountain West Conference at the 1999 Las Vegas Bowl, edging Fresno State 17-15. Mike Anderson set a Las Vegas Bowl record that stands today with 254 rushing yards and scored both of Utah's touchdowns ... On Christmas day in 2001, Utah's defense sacked USC quarterback Carson Palmer five times and held the Trojans to 151 total yards and just one rushing yard in a 10-6 victory ... Ute highlights were few in a 26-3 loss to No. 10 Boise State in the 2010 Las Vegas Bowl. Utah forced and recovered a fumble on the Boise State 20-yard line on the game's first drive, but couldn't score.

LOCAL TIES

Utah has four Las Vegas players on its roster: offensive tackle **Jeremiah Poutasi** (Desert Pines HS), running back **Bubba Poole** (Cimarron HS), linebacker **Marcus Sanders-Williams** (Durango HS) and defensive back **Casey Hughes** (Legacy Memorial HS). Poutasi is in his third year starting, Poole and Sanders-Williams are both in the two deep, and Hughes is redshirting in his first season at Utah. Hughes, Poole and Poutasi were all first-team all-state as preps.

UTES REAP NATIONAL HONORS

Junior punter **Tom Hackett** is the first Ray Guy Award winner in Utah and Pac-12 history. With several All-America teams still to be announced, **Hackett** and senior defensive end **Nate Orchard** have been named to five All-America teams (four first team, including the Walter Camp Foundation). **Orchard** won the Ted Hendricks Award as the nation's top defensive end who also demonstrates leadership and community contributions. Senior **Kaelin Clay** made the CBSSports.com (1st team) and Scout.com (2nd team) All-America teams. Freshman offensive lineman **Lowell Lotulelei** is a Scout. com second-team Freshman All-American. UTAH-CSU RIVALRY

Utah and Colorado State competed in the same conference for 63 years with joint membership in the Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-63) and Mountain West Conference (1999-2010) ... Utah leads the all-time series 55-22-2 ... The two teams have never met at a neutral site ... For complete series results, see page 2.

STATCHAT

Utah leads the Pac-12 in sacks (52/4.33 per game, also leads the nation), tackles for loss (100 total/8.3 per game), net punting (42.8) and kick return average (24.5) ... 100 TFL is a single-season record at Utah ... Utah is tied for 13th in the nation in defensive touchdowns (4) ... Ray Guy Award winner **Tom Hackett** leads the nation in punts inside the 20-yard line (35) and inside the 10-yard line (19). He ranks second nationally in punt average (47.0) ... **Devontae Booker**, who has rushed for 1,350 net yards in his first season at Utah and averaged 130.1 yards in the nine conference games. He leads the Pac-12 in carries (266) and ranks second in rushing yards per game (112.5) ... **Nate Orchard's** 17.5 sacks is a Utah single-season record. He leads the nation in sacks per game (1.46) and is second in total sacks (17.5) ... Utah's 10 sacks against UCLA ties the most by any team in a game this season and is the most against an FBS team.

Utah is 293-154-11 against current members of the Mountain West
Conference ... Utah finished the regular season with its best overall
(8-4) and conference (5-4) records since joining the Pac-12 in 2011 ...

Kyle Whittingham is 7-1 in bowl games (includes a win as co-head coach of the 2005 Fiesta Bowl team) ... Utah's five first-team All-Pac-12 selections surpassed its previous best of three set in its first year of Pac-12 competition in 2011 ... Utah is 5-1 on the road—its best road record since its final season in the Mountain West Conference (5-1 in 2010). Utah's four Pac-12 road wins exceeded its total conference road wins (3) in its first three seasons in the conference.

Tenth-year Utah head coach **Kyle Whittingham**, the 2008 National Coach of the Year, has an 84-43 career record that includes seven bowl victories—among them a 2009 Sugar Bowl win over No. 4 Alabama. Whittingham was one of 13 coaches on the watch list for the 2014 Dodd Trophy and one of 20 semifinalists for the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year Award. His teams have played in eight bowl games and the current team is awaiting its bowl destination. For more on Whittingham, see sidebar on page 2.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > 6'7" junior **Travis Wilson** has played in all 12 games with 10 starts and a 7-3 record. He has been the primary starter since the seventh game of his true freshman season, playing in 33 of 36 games with a 14-12 career record as the starter.
- > **Wilson** is 173-for-287 (60.3%) passing for 2,012 yards and 17 touchdowns (4 INT).
- > **Wilson** passed for a season-high 311 yards in the final regular season game vs. Colorado. It is his only 300-yard passing game this season and the third of his career.
- > **Wilson**'s 5,150 career passing yards ranks sixth in school history. He is 53 yards from tying for fifth place (5,203, Alex Smith, 2002-04).
- > **Wilson** has 40 career touchdown passes—fifth all-time at Utah and seven away from tying for fourth (47 by Alex Smith, 2002-04).
- > **Kendal Thompson** played in seven games with two starts (1-1) before a season-ending knee injury against Oregon on Nov. 8.
- > **Thompson** finished his junior season 32-of-52 passing for 324 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions in seven games played.
- > **Thompson** also rushed 56 times yards for 192 yards (second on the team at the time of his injury) and one touchdown.
- > Redshirt freshman **Conner Manning** made his only appearance as a Ute in the fourth quarter against Arizona, completing 2-of-6 pass attempts for 28 yards and an interception.
- > Redshirt freshman **Brandon Cox** saw his only career action in game one against Idaho State, going 3-for-3 passing for 17 yards and rushing twice for 22 yards and a touchdown (16 yards).
- > Junior **Adam Schulz** (pronounced Shultz), who has not played in a game this season, is another potential backup for Wilson.
- > **Schulz**, a former walk-on, played in six games last season with three starts, passing for 1,008 yards and six touchdowns (5 INT). He also played in one game as a freshman.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > In his first season at Utah, junior **Devontae Booker** was named first-team All-Pac-12 after averaging 130.1 yards in nine conference games.
- > **Booker** averaged 112.5 yards per game overall, which ranks second in the Pac-12 and 21st in the nation.
- > **Booker's** 1,350 net yards ranks fourth in school single-season history. He needs 46 yards to tie for third (1,396, Dameon Hunter, 2001).
- > After playing sparingly in the first three non-conference games, when he had just 31 total rushes for 179 yards (59.7 ypg), **Booker** has rushed 235 times for 1,171 yards (130.1 ypg) in the last nine games.
- > **Booker** leads the team in carries (266), net yards (1,350), yards per carry (5.10) and rushing touchdowns (9). He also leads the team in total touchdowns with 11 (2 receiving).
- > **Booker** has six 100-yard games, which is tied for the fourth-most in a season in school history. His 100-yard games have come against Oregon State (229), Washington State (178), UCLA (156), Arizona State (146), Arizona (142) and USC (102).

- > **Booker's** 229 yards at Oregon State is the best single-game rushing total in the Pac-12 this season. His 37 carries against Arizona State is the most by a Pac-12 player in a game this season and his 33 carries against UCLA is second.
- > **Booker** ranks second in the Pac-12 (21st in the nation) in all-purpose yards per game (140.8).
- > **Booker** is tied for second on the team in receptions with 39 and his 282 receiving yards is fifth. He had a career-high 110 receiving yards and a TD against Oregon.

- > **Orchard** is tied for ninth in the Pac-12 in forced fumbles (2). He has seven career forced fumbles, which is tied for third-most all-time at Utah.
- > **Orchard** also has five career fumble recoveries (1 this season), which is tied for fifth most in school history.

- > **Hackett** has landed 35-of-77 (45.5%) punts inside the 20 this season (a percentage that leads the Pac-12) and has 77-of-178 (43.3%) punts inside the 20 for his career.

- > **Hackett** has 25 punts of 50+ yards this season, which is second in the Pac-12 and is second all-time at Utah.
- > Against the Pac-12's No. 2 and 4 punt returners, **Hackett's** punting held USC's Nelson Agholor (10.6 average) without a return (USC had 1 return for 2 yards) and UCLA's Ishmael Adams (9.7 average) to one return for one yard. Stanford's Ty Montgomery (19.8 average, two touchdowns) was held without a return.
- > **Hackett** is second in the Pac-12 in punts of 50+ yards (25) this season (second-most in a season at Utah) and has 45 in his

career to rank fourth all-time at Utah.

- > **Hackett's** 3,619 punt yards is a school record, breaking the record he set last season (3,300).
- > **Hackett** has had just 17 touchbacks in his three-year career (10 this season).
- > **Hackett** has 178 career punts, which is the fifth-most all-time at Utah.
- > Hackett's 7,891 career punt yards ranks fifth all-time at Utah.
- > Hackett was named the Ray Guy Award Player of the Week three times this season (vs. Fresno State, UCLA and Stanford) and was the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week vs. Colorado. He was the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) National Punter of the Week vs. UCLA.
- > **Hackett** is 2-for-2 this season on fake punts for first downs (Idaho State, Colorado).

KICKING NOTEBOOK

- > First-team All-Pac-12 placekicker and two-time Lou Groza semifinalist "Automatic" **Andy Phillips** is a former U.S. Ski Team member (2007-11) who had never played in a football game at any level prior to last season.
- > **Phillips** ranks second in the nation in field goals of 40+ yards with 12 (12-of-15), with makes of 41, 43 (twice), 44, 45, 46 (twice), 47, 48 (twice) and 50 yards (twice).
- > **Phillips** leads the Pac-12 in field goals per game (1.83), which is tied for fifth in the nation.
- > **Phillips** is 2-of-2 in 50-yard field goals this season (Michigan, Arizona State) and 3-of-3 in his career, with a long of 51 yards against Arizona State in 2013.
- > **Phillips** is 22-for-26 (84.6%) overall in field goal attempts. His 22 field goals leads the Pac-12 and is tied for fifth in the nation. He is tied for 11th in the nation and is second in the conference in field goal percentage.
- > **Phillips'** 22 field goals ties the school single-season record with Louie Sakoda (2008).
- > **Phillips** has connected on 39-of-46 field goals in his career (84.8%). His 39 total field goals is third all-time at Utah while 46 attempts is fourth-most all-time.
- > In his career, **Phillips** is 21-of-26 (80.7%) from 40+ yards.
- > **Phillips** is second in the Pac-12 in scoring (8.7 points per game).
- > **Phillips** has made at least three field goals in four games this season (Michigan, UCLA, Oregon State, Arizona State).
- > Phillips made 12 consecutive field goals during one stretch of the season before his streak was snapped on his fourth kick against ASU. It tied the third-longest made field goal streak in school history.
- > **Phillips** is 38-of-39 in PATs this season and 79-of-80 in his career. He missed the first PAT of his career against Colorado after 78-straight makes.
- > **Phillips** was a two-time Lou Groza Star of the Week (vs. Michigan, UCLA) and a two-time Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week (Michigan and Oregon State).
- > **Phillips** is 3-for-3 in successful onside kicks in his career.
- > **Phillips** has 38 touchbacks on 67 kickoffs and a 62.1-yard average.
- > Utah has 39 touchbacks on 69 total kickoffs.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

- > Head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is in his first season as the special teams' coordinator and his unit captured three of the four first-team specialist awards on the 2014 All-Pac-12 Conference team: punter **Tom Hackett**, kicker **Andy Phillips** and return specialist **Kaelin Clay**.
- > Utah ranks third in the nation and leads the Pac-12 in net punting (42.81).
- > The Utes lead the Pac-12 (10th nationally) in kick return average (24.48) and are sixth nationally and second in the Pac-12 in punt return average (15.15).
- > In his first season, first-team All-American and All-Pac-12 senior returner **Clay** leads the Pac-12 and ranks fourth in the nation in punt return average (16.9). He has 21 punt returns for 354 yards and three touchdowns.
- > **Clay** is one of two players in the country this season with three punt returns for touchdowns and four total returns (1 kick-off) for a touchdown.
- > Three of **Clay's** 21 punt returns this year have gone for touchdowns (66 yards vs. Michigan, 46 yards vs. Idaho State and 58 yards vs. Washington State). One of his 21 kickoff returns was also for a touchdown (100 yards vs. Idaho State).
- > Clay's three punt return touchdowns ties the Utah single-season record set by Steve Smith (currently of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens) in 1999.
- > Clay's 354 yards in punt returns ranks seventh in a season at Utah.
- > **Clay** also ranks third in the Pac-12 in kickoff return average (25.4). He has 21 kick returns for 534 yards and one touchdown.
- > **Clay** had seven kick returns for 179 yards against Oregon. His 179 yards in kick returns is the fifth-most ever in a game by a Ute and his seven returns is tied for the third-most all-time in a game.
- > **Clay's** school-record 331 all-purpose yards against Oregon is the sixth-most in a game by an FBS player this season (179 kick return, 152 receiving).
- > Clay was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week the first week of the season against Idaho State after returning a punt (46 yards) and kickoff (100 yards) for touchdowns.
- > Clay's punt return for a touchdown against ISU came on his first touch as a Ute.
- > Sophomore **Chase Dominguez** has handled all of the special teams' snaps since last fall, which includes 153 punt, 46 field goal and 80 PATs for a total of 279 snaps.

UTAH VS. THE PAC-12

Utah is 90-142-6 all-time against Pac-12 schools and 14-22 as a member of the conference. Here's the breakdown: Arizona (20-18-2), Arizona State (6-20), California (4-5), Colorado (27-31-3), Oregon (8-20), Oregon State (7-11-1), USC (4-9), Stanford (4-3), UCLA (3-10), Washington (0-8), Washington State (7-7).

CAPACITY CROWDS

Utah broke the school record for season attendance this fall, averaging 46,436 fans a game. All six home games exceeded Rice-Eccles Stadium's seating capacity of 45,807. Utah has played to 31 straight sellouts in Rice-Eccles Stadium extending back to the 2010 season-opener against Pittsburgh. Of the sellouts, 28 were played before standing-room only crowds that

exceeded Rice-Eccles Stadium's seating capacity (45,017 from 1998-13; 45,807 starting this season). The largest home crowd in school history (47,619) saw Utah beat No. 20 USC on Oct. 25, 2014.

COACHES' CORNER

Three members of Utah's staff have been head coaches at the NCAA level: head coach **Kyle Whittingham**, offensive coordinator **Dave Christensen** (Wyoming) and running backs coach **Dennis Erickson** (Idaho, Wyoming, Washington State, Miami, Oregon State and Arizona State). All three have been recognized as a conference coach of the year: **Whittingham** (Utah/Mountain West), **Christensen** (Wyoming/Mountain West) and **Erickson** (Washington State, Oregon State, Arizona State/Pac-12; Miami/Big East; and Idaho/Big Sky). **Whittingham** (2008/Utah) and **Erickson** (2000/Miami) were National Coach of the Year recipients.

SALT LAKE CITY— Up just 14-7 in the first quarter, the Utes exploded for a 21-0 second-quarter run and ran away from Idaho State 56-14 in the season opener for both teams. Most starters, including quarterback Travis Wilson, spent the second half on the sidelines after taking a 35-7 lead into the locker room. Wilson completed 13-of-18 passes for 265 yards and a touchdown and also ran for a score. Backups Kendal Thompson (6-of-10 passing for 69 yards) and Brandon Cox (3-of-3 passing for 17 yards and a 16-yard touchdown run) finished the rout. Kaelin Clay dazzled in his Ute debut, returning a punt (46 yards) and kickoff (100 yards) for a touchdown. Devontae Booker opened his Ute career with a 61-yard reception—adding 78 rushing yards and two touchdowns. Dres Anderson had 111 receiving yards on four catches in one half of play. Nate Orchard (8 tackles, 2.5 sacks) and Jared Norris (8 tackles, 1.5 TFL) led the defense.
