QUICKLY

> No. 9/9 Utah (6-0, 3-0 MWC) hosts Colorado State (2-5, 1-2 MWC) on Saturday, Oct. 23. Kickoff is 4 p.m. MT in Rice-Eccles Stadium. The game will be televised by The Mtn. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com) and SIRIUS XM (Channel 91).

> Utah is ranked No. 9 across the board this week. Utah checked in at No. 9 in the first BCS standings of the season, moved up two positions in the Associated Press poll from a week ago, and gained one spot in the USA Today Coaches poll.

> The 6-0 Utes are bowl-eligible for an eighth-straight season. Utah has the nation's longest active bowl win streak at nine games (1999, 2001, 2003-09).

> Utah is off to its third 6-0 start in the last seven years (the Utes finished 12-0 in 2004 and 13-0 in 2008).

> Utah puts a 20-game home win streak on the line against CSU. It is the third-longest active win streak in the nation, the second-longest in school history and the longest in MWC history. For more, see "The Streak."

> Utah leads the nation in kickoff returns (29.2 average) and TFL yardage allowed (47). The Utes rank in the top 10 nationally in several categories, including scoring offense (No. 4/45.8 ppg) and scoring defense (tied for No. 9/14.0 ppg). >With 17-consecutive made field goals, dating back to last season, Utah's Joe Phillips is tied for the longest FGM streak in the nation. Phillips also owns the school record for consecutive field goals. For more on Phillips, see 'Kicking Game Notebook.'

> Utah's series with CSU is the fourth-longest in Utah football history at 78 games. The Utes have won six of the last seven, lead 54-22-2 overall and 31-8-2 in Salt Lake City. For more on the series, see page 2 of this release.

MCCARTHEYS HONORED

The McCarthy family, philanthropists and longtime Utah boosters, will be honored during the Utah-CSU game for their \$2 million donation toward the construction of the McCarthy Family Track & Field. Earlier in the day, University of Utah administrators and members of the McCarthy family will officially dedicate the McCarthy Family Track & Field. The dedication ceremony will begin at 11 a.m., Saturday, Oct. 23 at the new track, which is located north of Ute Softball Field at 98 S. Wasatch Drive.

THE STREAK

Utah's home win streak, now at 20 games, is the third-longest active win streak in the nation, the second-longest in school history and longest home win streak in MWC history. "The Streak" dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA and currently ranks behind only Oklahoma (34) and Boise State (28). The school record for consecutive home wins is 26, set from 1928-34.

Last Year ...

Interceptions by Robert Johnson on three consecutive series boosted Utah to a come-from-behind 24-17 victory over Colorado State on a frigid day in Ft. Collins. Utah, which trailed by as many as 14 points (17-3) in the second half, scored the final three touchdowns of the game. Two of Johnson's picks set up Utah touchdowns, and the third allowed the Utes to run out the game clock deep in CSU territory. Terrance Cain completed 75-percent of his passes (24-32) for 248 yards and two touchdowns. Cain also rushed for 71 yards. David Reed had 140 receiving yards and a touchdown, while Eddie Wide rushed for 101 yards and a touchdown, and also caught what would prove the game-winning touchdown pass. Stevenson Sylvester led Utah with seven tackles.

LAST WEEK

Matt Asiata rushed for 109 yards and Utah's defense pitched a shutout for three quarters in a 30-6 victory over Wyoming in Laramie. Utah scored on its first possession when **Jordan Wynn** found a wide-open **Luke Matthews** for a 45-yard touchdown pass. Matthews finished with four grabs for 66 yards while tight end **Brad Clifford** had a career game with five receptions for 63 yards. Utah broke the game open with a 16-point second quarter to take a 23-0 lead into halftime. The Utes, who held the Cowboys to 67 net rushing yards, recorded 11 tackles for loss to the tune of 52 yards. **Brandon Burton** tied his career high with six tackles, while **Trevor Reilly** had 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year (2008), averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his

first five seasons. He is 54-17 overall and 12-4 against BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 17-year tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (139-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

The theme for Saturday's game is "Uth" Day and youth 12 years and younger with a game ticket are invited to follow the football team on to the field as part of the pre-game Ute Walk at 1:30 p.m. In compliance with NCAA regulations, the youth may be accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older. No registration is necessary. Additional youth activities, including balloon animals, face painting and games with student-athletes from various Ute teams, will be held in the southeast

plaza by the Hoberman Arch beginning at 2 p.m. ... The women's tennis team will be honored at the game for its 2010 MWC Championship and head coach Mat Iandolo will be recognized as the 2009-10 Don Reddish Coach of the Year.

INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Ute running backs coach **Aaron Alford** played defensive back for Colorado State, lettering in 1993 ... Expected to miss this week's game against CSU is tight end **Brad Clifford** (shoulder) ... Utah has collected seven MWC Player of the Week citations to date: **DeVonte Christopher** (offense, Sept. 6), **Brian Blechen** (defense, Sept. 6); **Smithson** (special teams, Sept. 13, Sept. 20, Oct. 11), **Lamar Chapman** (defense, Sept. 20) and **Wynn** (offense, Oct. 11) ... Six true freshmen have played: **Blechen**, **Wykie Freeman**, **Mike Honeycutt**, **Joe Kruger**, **Westlee Tonga** and **Michael Walker**.

OFFENSIVE ELLIPSES

Utah has scored 42.5% of its total points in the second quarter, when it is outscoring its foes 117-7. The Utes broke a 42-year old second-quarter scoring record against Iowa State with 31 points ... The Utes are averaging 7.0 yards per play ... Utah has lost just 32 yards on rushing plays compared to 202 lost yards by its opponents.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

> Utah ranks fifth in the nation and first in the MWC in pass efficiency offense (169.49).

> Sophomore starter **Jordan Wynn** is 4-0 as the starter this year and 7-2 in his career. He has played in four games this season—missing the UNLV and New Mexico games with a thumb injury—and in 10 games in his career.

> **Wynn** is completing 67.3 percent of his passes (74-for-110) with nine touchdowns and five interceptions. His 158.64 pass efficiency rating would lead the MWC and rank 17th in the NCAA, but he does not meet the minimum game requirement (75%).

> **Wynn** passed for a season-high 325 yards against Iowa State. It was his second career 300-yard game (he threw for 338 yards vs. Cal in 2009).

> **Wynn** has six 200-yard games in his career and three this season.

> With **Wynn** on the field, Utah is 39-of-41 in the red zone in the last two years (17-of-19 this season).

> **Wynn** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 for his role in Utah's 68-27 win over Iowa State.

> Senior **Terrance Cain** has played in five games this season and is 2-0 as the starter with wins over UNLV and New Mexico.

> **Cain** has a record of 9-1 as the starter and has played in 17 total games.

> **Cain** has a 185.22 pass efficiency rating this season, which would lead the MWC and rank second in the nation had he met the minimum number of pass attempts per game (15).

> **Cain** has completed 75.5 percent of his passes (40-of-53), with five touchdowns and no interceptions.

> **Cain** ranks eighth in the MWC in passing yards per game (99.2) and averaged 227.5 ypg in the two games he started.

> **Cain** broke the school record for single-game completion percentage (86.95) against New Mexico on Sept. 18, completing 20-of-23 passes, including 20 of his last 21 throws.

> **Cain** has six career 200-yard games, including both games he started this season. His best game was 286 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Griff Robles**, a redshirt freshman, has seen duty in three games. Robles is Utah's third-leading rusher, gaining 120 yards on 16 car-

ries, and averages a team-best 7.5 yards per carry (among those with double-figure carries). He is 0-1 passing.

> **Robles** led Utah in rushing in his NCAA debut against New Mexico with six carries for 64 yards (10.7 average). He had a long rush of 47 yards on his second play.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

> Co-starting seniors **Matt Asiata** and **Eddie Wide** have combined to average 115.3 yards per game with 137 rushes for 692 yards.

> Among the MWC rushing leaders, **Asiata** is seventh (59.0 ypg) and **Wide** is eighth (56.3 ypg).

> **Asiata** has 71 rushes for 354 yards (5.0 average) and three rushing touchdowns.

> **Asiata** became Utah's first 100-yard rusher of the season last week at Wyoming when he netted 109 yards on 16 carries (6.8 average).

> **Asiata** has three 100-yard games in his career, with a personal best 156 yards vs. Utah State in 2009. He was Utah's leading rusher in 2008 (707 yards).

> **Asiata** also has 15 receptions (fourth on the team) for 94 yards.

> **Wide** leads the team with six rushing touchdowns. He has 66 carries for 338 yards (5.1 average).

> **Wide** ranks fifth in the MWC in touchdown scoring average (7.0) and is tied for second in total touchdowns with seven (6 rushing, 1 receiving).

> **Wide**, a 1,000-yard rusher and first-team all-conference running back last year—as well as the preseason all-MWC pick for 2010—has seven career 100-yard games. All of his 100-yard games were in 2009—when he netted 1,069 yards—including a career-best 145-yard game vs. New Mexico.

> **Wide's** best rushing game this season came against UNLV, when he rushed 15 times for 77 yards (5.1 average).

> **Wide** also has 18 receptions (third on the team) for 140 yards (fourth on the team) and one touchdown.

> Sophomore **Sausan Shakerin** has eight carries for 25 yards and a touchdown, all in the last two games. He missed the first four games (concussion).

> **Shawn Asiata**, a junior fullback in his first year at Utah and the younger brother of Matt Asiata, has played in all six games with two receptions for 15 yards and a touchdown. He got his first career start at Iowa State.

> Junior **Tauni Vakapuna** has 19 rushes for 79 yards (4.2 average) in six games. He also has a pair of touchdowns while playing in all six games.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> 13 players have caught passes for Utah and seven have made touchdown catches.

> Senior all-conference candidate **Jereme Brooks** leads Utah in receptions (25) and receiving touchdowns (4-tied), and ranks second in receiving yards (357).

> **Brooks** ranks fourth in the MWC in both receptions per game (4.17) and receiving yards per game (59.5).

> **Brooks** is tied for second in the MWC with four receiving touchdowns.

> **Brooks** had a season-high 99 yards vs. New Mexico, including a career-long catch of 75 yards that went for a touchdown. It is Utah's longest offensive play of the season.

> In his career, **Brooks** has two 100-yard games, including a career-high 135 yards vs. New Mexico last year.

- > Junior **DeVonte Christopher** leads Utah in receiving yards (388) and receiving touchdowns (4-tied), and is second in receptions (21).
- > **Christopher** ranks third in the MWC in receiving yards per game (64.7) and 10th in receptions per game (3.50).
- > **Christopher** is second in the league in yards per catch (18.5) among those with double-figure catches.
- > **Christopher** has a pair of 100-yard receiving games this season and in his career: 155 yards vs. Pittsburgh and 124 against Iowa State.
- > **Christopher** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for the Pitt game.
- > Senior **Shaky Smithson** ranks third on the team in receiving yards (142), which have come on just six catches for team-best 23.7-yard average. He also has two touchdown receptions.
- > **Smithson** had a career-high 75 yards on two receptions against Iowa State.
- > **Smithson** passed for a touchdown against Iowa State—his first touchdown pass—and is 3-for-8 passing for 42 yards in his career.
- > **Luke Matthews** has made 10 grabs for 119 yards and a touchdown.

- > Utah is tied for second in the nation in sacks allowed with two. The first string offensive line did not allow a sack until game six (vs. Wyoming).
- > Preseason all-conference senior center **Zane Taylor** has snapped an average of 57.8 times per game. He has 289 total snaps in five games (he missed the New Mexico game with a knee injury).
- > **Taylor**, who has not committed an errant snap or allowed a sack, has six cuts and six pancake blocks.
- > **Taylor** led Utah in plays (70) and grade (89%) against Pitt. He also led the Utes with a 92% grade vs. Wyoming.
- > Preseason all-conference guard **Caleb Schlauderaff** leads the Utes in overall grade (89%) and pancake blocks (11).
- > **Schlauderaff's** 95% grade against New Mexico is the best by a Ute this year. He graded out at 94% vs. Iowa State.
- > **Schlauderaff** has won 293 of a total 328 plays (including 42-of-44 against UNM).
- > Right tackle **Tony Bergstrom** is Utah's OL play leader (336) and boasts an 81% overall grade.
- > **Bergstrom** has seven cuts.
- > Left tackle **John Cullen** ranks second on the team in plays (334) and has a team-high 13 cuts.
- > **Cullen** also has five pancake blocks.
- > Right guard **Tevita Stevens** has played 332 downs, snapping the ball as the center in the UNM game. (He played right guard in the other five games).

- > **Cox**, a senior defensive end, leads Utah's linemen and ranks fifth on the team in tackles with 25 stops.
- > **Cox** has three TFL and one sack.
- > Sophomore DT **Dave Kruger's** 15 total tackles include two tackles for loss and a half sack.
- > Freshman DE **Reilly** has become an impact player off the bench, making 11 of his 15 total tackles in the last two games while leading the line in tackles against both Iowa State (6 tackles) and Wyoming (5 tackles).
- > **Reilly** ranks second on the team and is tied for eighth in the MWC in tackles for loss (5.5), with 3.5 of those coming in the last two games.
- > **Reilly** has 2.0 sacks, a pass breakup and a blocked PAT (vs. Iowa State).

> Two of Utah's three starting linebackers (juniors **Chaz Walker** and **Matt Martinez**) began their careers as walk-ons, while the other (senior **Chad Manis**) was a quarterback his first two seasons at the U.

> **Walker**, Utah's tackle leader with 47 stops, ranks eighth in the MWC in tackles per game (7.8).

> **Walker's** career-high 16 tackles vs. UNLV is the most by a Ute in four seasons.

> **Walker's** 5.0 TFL ranks third on the team.

> **Martinez** is Utah's third-leading tackler with 36 stops (6.0 per game average). He has 2.5 TFL with one sack.

> **Martinez** has one interception, which he returned 36 yards for a touchdown against New Mexico, and a pass breakup.

> **Manis** is fourth on the team with 35 tackles. He also has 2.0 TFL and a pass breakup.

> **Boo Andersen** has backed up at all three linebacker positions and has 16 tackles, 2.0 TFL and a half sack.

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

> All-America candidate and preseason all-MWC junior corner **Brandon Burton** is tied for second on the team in pass breakups with three.

> **Burton** has 13 career pass breakups. His 10 PBUs last year was tied for second in the MWC.

> **Burton** also has an interception, which he returned 57 yards against Iowa State, and two career picks.

> **Burton** led Utah and with a career-tying six tackles (one TFL) against Wyoming. He has 21 tackles this season.

> Senior corner **Lamar Chapman** is putting up all-conference numbers and is the only defensive back listed among the MWC's top-10 sack leaders.

> Despite his 5'8" stature, **Chapman** leads the MWC in tackles per loss average (1.33) and is tied for 37th in the nation.

> **Chapman** ranks third in the league in total sacks (4.5), sacks per game (0.75) and tackles for loss (8.0). He leads Utah in sacks and is tied for 30th in the nation in sacks per game.

> **Chapman** is Utah's second-leading tackler with 37 total stops and his 27 solo tackles is tops on the team.

> **Chapman** is tied for second on the team in pass breakups (3).

> **Chapman** was named the MWC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 20 for his role in Utah's 56-14 victory at New Mexico.

> True freshman safety **Brian Blechen** is tied for fourth in the league, and ranks first on the team, in passes defended (5) and passes defended per game (0.83).

> **Blechen** has 25 tackles, a team-high four pass breakups, an interception, 1.0 TFL and a half sack.

> **Blechen** earned MWC Player of the Week honors on Sept. 6 for his performance against Pitt that was highlighted by his first career interception on the first play of overtime.

> **Blechen** signed with Utah as a quarterback, although he also played safety, linebacker and punter at Moorpark High School (Calif.).

> Senior free safety **Justin Taplin-Ross** has 21 tackles, a TFL, a pass breakup and an interception.

> **Taplin-Ross's** first career interception, which he returned 52 yards, came against Iowa State.

Utah leads the nation in kickoff return average (29.21) and ranks second in punt return average (21.74). The Utes are first in the MWC in both categories ... Utah leads the country in both punt returns (27) and punt return yards (587) ... Utah and Oregon are the only two teams this year that have scored at least three touchdowns on punt returns ... Utah leads the league in kickoff coverage (46.8 net average) ... Returner **Shaky Smithson** has won three MWC Special Teams Player of the Week awards this year (Sept. 13, Sept. 20 and Oct. 11).

KICKING NOTEBOOK

- > Senior All-America candidate **Joe Phillips** is tied for the most-consecutive field goals in the nation by an active player. Phillips has converted on his last 17 field goal attempts (including 8-of-8 this season), tying him for first in the nation with David Ruffer of Notre Dame. Utah will play Notre Dame on Nov. 13.
- > **Phillips'** 17-consecutive made field goals is a school record.
- > **Phillips** ranks second in the nation among active kickers in career field goal percentage (93.3%). He has made 28-of-30 field goals in his two years as Utah's placekicker and led the MWC in field goal percentage last year when he made 20-of-22 attempts (91%).
- > **Phillips** ranks second in the MWC and 20th in the nation in scoring, averaging 9.8 points per game (eight field goals, 35 PATs).
- > **Phillips** is third in the MWC and is tied for 33rd in the country in field goals per game (1.33).
- > **Phillips'** 28 field goals ranks fifth in school history.
- > **Phillips'** tied his career-long with a 48-yard field goal against Wyoming. He also made a 48-yard field goal against Louisville last season.
- > **Phillips** is 7-of-8 from 40 yards and out for his career and 2-of-2 this season.
- > **Phillips** set a new school record with his 20 kick-scoring points against Iowa State. Phillips was 4-for-4 in field goals and 8-for-8 in PATs.
- > **Phillips** went 8-of-8 in PATs against UNM, SJSU and ISU. The eight PATs is tied for the second-best single-game total in school history.
- > **Phillips** is 35-of-36 in PATs this year and 72-of-74 in his career. He had a PAT blocked against Wyoming, snapping a streak of 54-straight PATs.
- > **Phillips** 72 career PATs ranks eighth in school history.
- > **Phillips** kicked the game-winning field goal against Pittsburgh, a 21-yarder in overtime.
- > Sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood** is averaging 45.9 yards per punt. If he had enough punts to meet the minimum requirement, he would rank eighth in the country.
- > Of his 14 total punts, **Sellwood** has five 50-yarders (long of 60 yards) and has had seven downed inside the 20. Both of his punts against Wyoming dropped inside the 20-yard line.
- > **Sellwood's** career long is 63 yards, set last year.
- > Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** has punted three times, placing one on the 9-yard line.
- > Utah has 48 total kickoffs (average 66.8 yards) with 12 touchbacks.
- > **Marsh** has handled 44 of Utah's 48 kickoffs with 12 touchbacks. He is averaging 66.8 yards per kickoff.
- > **Phillips** has four kickoffs for an average of 65.8 yards and no touchbacks.

RETURN GAME NOTEBOOK

- > Utah's special teams have scored four touchdowns (three on punt returns and one on a kickoff return).
- > **Shaky Smithson** leads the nation in total punt returns (23), punt return yards (555) and punt returns per game (3.83).
- > **Smithson** leads the MWC and ranks third nationally in punt return average (24.1).
- > With six regular season games remaining, **Smithson** has already become the first player in Utah history to reach 500 yards in punt returns in a single season, achieving the feat with his 111-yard game last week against Wyoming. Smithson's 555 return yards this season breaks the school record of 495 yards set by current Carolina Panther star Steve Smith in 1999.
- > **Smithson** has 678 career punt return yards ranks third among all active players in the NCAA FBS and is also third all-time at Utah.
- > **Smithson** is averaging 92.5 yards in punt returns a game and has a career average of 42.4 yards per game.
- > **Smithson** is the only player in the nation this year with three 70-yard punt returns. He had a 78-yard return against Iowa State (tied for the sixth-longest in school history), a 77-yard punt return against UNLV (the eighth-longest in school history) and a 73-yard punt return against New Mexico.
- > **Smithson** is the only player in the country with four 100-yard punt return games this year.
- > **Smithson** has three of the top five punt return yardage games in the country this season. His 145 punt return yards against Iowa State is the second-best, while his 140 punt return yards against New Mexico is the third-best and his 128 punt return yards against UNLV is tied for fifth-best. Additionally, his 111 yards against Wyoming stands ninth on the list.
- > **Smithson** has four of the top 10 punt return yardage games in school history: 145 vs. Iowa State (3rd), 140 vs. UNM (4th), 128 vs. UNLV (6th), 111 vs. Wyoming (10th).
- > **Smithson** returned punts for touchdowns in back-to-back weeks against UNLV and New Mexico. He returned a punt to the 2-yard line against Iowa State.
- > **Smithson** is tied for second in the school single-season record books with two punt returns for touchdowns, a feat last accomplished by Steve Smith, who set the school record with three punt returns for touchdowns in 1999.
- > **Smithson** has been named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week three times this season and in his career (Sept. 13, Sept. 20 and Oct. 11).
- > **Smithson** was honored as the National Punt Returner of the Week on Sept. 13 and 20 by the College Football Performance Awards.
- > **Smithson** also leads the Utes in kickoff returns with seven for 183 yards (26.1 average).
- > **Smithson** is second in the MWC and ranks 26th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (146.8). Of his 881 all-purpose yards, 738 have come on punt and kick return yards.
- > **Reggie Dunn** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Iowa State for just the seventh 100-yard kickoff return in Utah history. It was the first 100-yard return by a Ute in 25 years, since Erroll Tucker did it twice in 1985.
- > **Dunn** was named the National Kick Returner of the Week on Oct. 10 by the College Football Performance Awards.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"Our win against Wyoming puts us at 6-0 on the year and makes us bowl eligible. Overall, we played good football against the Cowboys, although there is always room for improvement. This week, we are facing a Colorado State team that put up a lot of points this past weekend against UNLV and seems to have found an offensive rhythm. We have been in some hard-fought battles with CSU through the years and we anticipate another this Saturday. We're excited to be back in Rice-Eccles Stadium for the first time in a month. There is an element of satisfaction in winning in someone else's stadium, but our players and coaches get the biggest charge out of playing for our home crowd."

A 9.90 ROUTINE

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 21 wins against BCS opponents and are 21-11 overall. Sixth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is 12-4 against BCS schools. Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games—and is the only NAQ team with two wins against BCS teams in BCS bowl games (Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl).

BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.
