## QUICK HITS

> No. 24 Utah (0-0, 0-0 MWC) hosts No. 15/15 Pittsburgh (0-0, 0-0 Big East) in the season opener for both teams on Thur., Sept. 2. Game time is 6:30 p.m. in Rice-Eccles Stadium. The game will be televised live on VERSUS. Radio is ESPN700 AM ([espn700sports.com](http://espn700sports.com)) and Westwood One (national radio).

> Utah has two streaks going: 17-straight home wins and nine straight bowl wins (the nation's longest current bowl win streak). See "Right at Home" and "Bowl Roll" for more.

> The NCAA recognizes the first victory of Kyle Whittingham's head coaching career as Utah's 2005 Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh. Whittingham served as co-head coach that game with Urban Meyer and both coaches were credited with a win. Whittingham enters his sixth full season as a head coach with a 48-17 overall record.

> The Utes are tied for No. 24 with West Virginia in the preseason USA Today Coaches' Poll. It marks the second-straight year—and the second time in school history—that Utah has been ranked in the preseason. In 2009, the Utes were ranked No. 19 by A.P. and No. 18 by the coaches.

> Last year's No. 18 final ranking in both polls marked the fifth time Utah has finished in the Top 25. Final rankings (A.P./Coaches) follow: 1994 (No. 10/8), 2003 (No. 21/21), 2004 (No. 4/5), 2008 (No. 2/4), 2009 (No. 18/18).

> Utah hopes to snap a winless streak in season-openers against a foe ranked in the A.P. poll. The Utes are 0-5 against A.P.-ranked teams in season openers, with losses to No. 17 UCLA in 1956, No. 14 Nebraska in 1968, No. 20 Texas Tech in 1973, No. 5 Oklahoma in 1977 and No. 11 Nebraska in 1992. In the first game of 2008, the Utes beat a Michigan team that was ranked No. 24 in the coaches' preseason poll.

> Utah has won its last three home games against ranked foes, beating No. 11 UCLA in 2007, No. 11 TCU in 2008 and No. 16 Brigham Young in 2008.

## RIGHT AT HOME

The Utes put a 17-game home win streak on the line against Pitt this Thursday. Dating back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over then 11th-ranked UCLA, it is the second-longest home win streak in school history and the longest since the Utes won 26-straight home games from 1928-1934.

## BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

## WINNING WAYS

The Utes have averaged 9.9 wins a season since 2003, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years.

## UTAH-PITT SERIES

### Series Snapshot ...

These two teams have met once previously, with Utah winning 35-7 in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, Ariz., to cap a perfect 12-0 (2004) season. The NCAA officially counts Pittsburgh as Kyle Whittingham's first victory, since he was the co-head coach with Urban Meyer in the Fiesta Bowl.

### Last Time They Met ...

TEMPE, Ariz.—In the first BCS game ever for a non-BCS school, No. 5 Utah steamrolled over Big East co-champion and No. 19-ranked Pittsburgh, 35-7, in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. Led by offensive co-MVPs Alex Smith and Paris Warren, Utah jumped to a 28-0 lead before Pittsburgh's only score of the day. The Ute defense set a bowl record with nine quarterback sacks. Defensive MVP Steve Fifita had 5 tackles, 2 tackles for loss and a sack. The Utes enjoyed a home field atmosphere as the vast majority of sold-out Sun Devil Stadium was red-clad. It is believed to be the most Ute fans ever to attend a Utah football game.

Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

### BCS SUCCESS

Entering its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 19 wins against BCS opponents and are 19-11 overall. Here are the leaders going into 2010: Utah (19), Navy (18), TCU (17), BYU (15) and Fresno State (14). Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games with wins over Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

### PAC-ING UP

The 2010 season will be Utah's last in the Mountain West Conference. On June 17, 2010, the Utes accepted an invitation to join the Pacific-10 Conference and will begin Pac-10 play in 2011. The Utes became one of eight original members of the MWC in 1999, winning conference titles in 1999 (tie), 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Pac-10 will mark the sixth conference in Utah's history. Utah competed in the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98) and MWC (1999-2010).

### KYLE STYLE

In five years as Utah's head coach, Kyle Whittingham has been honored as the National Coach of the Year, averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons, and his 48-17 overall mark includes a 10-4 advantage over BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 16-year

tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (133-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

### PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

Named to the preseason all-Mountain West Conference team were running back **Eddie Wide**, offensive linemen **Caleb Schlauderhoff** and **Zane Taylor**, and defensive back **Brandon Burton**. The preseason media poll picked the Utes to finish second to defending champ TCU in league play. The Utes received 242 points to TCU's 279 points. The remainder of the MWC preseason poll had Brigham Young third with 207 points, followed by Air Force (195), Wyoming (147), San Diego State (128), Colorado State (96), UNLV (56) and New Mexico (45).

### WATCH OUT

These Utes have been named to watch lists: **Brandon Burton**, Jim Thorpe Award (Defensive Back); **Joe Phillips**, Lou Groza Place-Kicker Award; **Caleb Schlauderhoff** and **Zane Taylor**, Outland Trophy (Interior Lineman); **Shaky Smithson**, Paul Hornung Award (Most Versatile Player); **Eddie Wide**, Doak Walker Award (Running Back).

### OUTSIDE THE LINES

The Utes have set a record for season ticket sales for the sixth-straight year, selling out their allotment of 31,737. Another 7,000 tickets were reserved by students ... Only limited standing room tickets remain for this Thursday's game. Utah's games against TCU and BYU are also sold out, although some standing room tickets remain for TCU ... New steel signs measuring 25' tall x 10' long and weighing 8,506 pounds have been installed in the south end zone on either side of the video board. The signs recognize Utah's 2005 Fiesta Bowl and 2009 Sugar Bowl victories. The Utes plan a formal ceremony recognizing the new structures in Rice-Eccles Stadium at Thursday's game, when a highlight video of Utah's bowl wins over Pittsburgh and Alabama will be shown.

## INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Expected to make their first starts as Utes against Pittsburgh are: OT **John Cullen**, WR **Shaky Smithson**, DE **Junior Tui'one**, LB **Matt Martinez** or **Chaz Walker**, LB **Chad Manis** and SS **Brian Blechen**. Blechen is the only true freshman in the starting lineup ... Walk-on safety **Bryce Bennion** has quit the team ... **Jamel King** (concussion) is off the injured list and in the two deep at rover linebacker ... After just one week of practice, **Star Lotulelei** has moved into a co-backup role at defensive tackle with **Neli A'asa** behind starter **Sealver Siliga** ... Starting rover linebacker **J.J. Williams** (foot) is questionable for the Pitt game. Running back **Sausan Shakerin** (concussion) is out.

## UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 605-420-31. The Utes are 371-173-16 at home (53-16 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 216-233-13 in road games and 18-14-2 in games played at neutral sites.

## UTAH VS. THE BIG EAST

Utah is 7-0 against the Big East, including a 4-0 mark against Louisville and a 1-0 record against Pitt, South Florida and West Virginia.

## QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > Sophomore **Jordan Wynn**, the MVP of the Poinsettia Bowl, will start. Wynn played in the last six games of 2009 as a true freshman. He was 3-2 as the starter.
- > In **Wynn's** five games as the starting quarterback, Utah went 21-for-21 in the red zone.
- > **Wynn** had a career game in leading Utah to victory over California in the Poinsettia Bowl, throwing for 338 yards and three touchdowns.
- > **Wynn** averaged 249.4 passing yards in five games as a starter and 221.5 yards per game overall in 2009. He had three games of 200 yards or better passing.
- > **Wynn** completed 58.1 percent of his passes for 1,329 yards and eight touchdowns (four interceptions).
- > Only the third true freshman to start for Utah since the NCAA restored freshman eligibility in 1972, **Wynn** was also the most successful. In his starting debut, he passed for 297 yards and two touchdowns in a 45-14 win over New Mexico.
- > Senior backup **Terrance Cain** was 7-1 as Utah's starter through the first eight games last season before relinquishing the job to Wynn.
- > **Cain** played in all 12 regular season games in 2009 and ranked third in the MWC in pass efficiency (139.4), eighth in total offense (161.8) and eighth in passing average (135.3). He completed 63.7 percent of his passes for 1,624 yards.
- > **Cain** averaged 214.7 yards passing in the seven games he played in all four quarters.
- > **Cain** had 13 touchdowns (11 passing, two rushing) and four 200-yard passing games.
- > Redshirt freshman **Griff Robles** could also see playing time with a specific package of plays.

## RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > Utah boasts two of the top running backs in the league, if not the nation, in seniors **Matt Asiata** and **Eddie Wide** (the leading returning rusher in the MWC). They are listed as co-starters on the depth chart.
- > **Asiata**, Utah's leading rusher during Utah's 13-0 Sugar Bowl season in 2008, is coming off a knee injury that cost him the final nine games of last season.

> **Wide** replaced Asiata midway through game four of last season and went on to first-team all-conference honors. He was named to the preseason all-conference team for 2010.

> **Wide** rushed for 1,069 yards (82.2 ypg) while becoming just 10th player in Utah history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. He scored a league-best 13 touchdowns (12 rushing).

> **Wide** finished with seven 100-yard games (tied for third all-time at Utah) and broke the school record with six consecutive 100-yard games.

> **Wide's** career rushing high is 145 yards vs. New Mexico (2009).

> Before his season-ending injury against Louisville in game four of last season, **Asiata** was averaging a league-leading 101.3 yards per game.

> **Asiata** finished with 74 carries for 330 yards and four TD's. He averaged 82.5 yards per game and 4.5 yards per carry.

> **Asiata's** career-high of 156 yards came against Utah State in 2009.

> Another who will play is junior **Tauni Vakapuna**, who walked on last spring and has been extremely impressive in camp. He is the younger brother of Cincinnati Bengal (and former BYU) running back Fui Vakapuna.

## RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> Senior **Jereme Brooks** is the only returning starter for a unit that lost the league's best receiver, David Reed. Reed was drafted in the fifth round by the Baltimore Ravens.

> **Brooks**, who has played in 38 of 39 games since his freshman year, is an all-conference candidate.

> **Brooks** ranked seventh in the MWC in receptions per game (4.31) and eighth in receiving yards per game (53.5) in 2009. He had 56 catches for 696 yards.

> **Brooks'** seven touchdown receptions led Utah and tied for third in the MWC. He has 10 TD catches in his career.

> **Brooks** has two 100-yard games (both last season), including a career-best 135 yards vs. New Mexico.

> Slated to start for their first season are senior **Shaky Smithson** and sophomore **Luke Matthews**. Both played as backups a year ago.

> Despite its inexperience, Utah has a lot of players to choose from at receiver. As many as six other receivers are expected to see playing time alongside the starters, including **Devonte Christopher**, **Dexter Ransom**, **Griff McNabb**, **Reggie Dunn**, **Fatu Moala** and **Mo Lee**. Of those, only Christopher (a converted quarterback) has played in an NCAA game.

## OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

> Even with the loss of first-team all-conference left tackle and second-round NFL draft pick Zane Beadles, the offensive line is viewed as a team strength with four starters returning.

> The headliners are preseason all-conference picks **Zane Taylor**, at center, and **Caleb Schlauderaff** at left guard. Both seniors were placed on the Outland Trophy watch list.

> Two other starters return from last year's line that gave up just 20 sacks and helped the running backs average 4.3 yards a carry. In their second year as starters are junior right tackle **Tony Bergstrom** and sophomore right guard **Tevita Stevens**.

> Getting his first collegiate start against Pitt is junior **John Cullen**—the nation's top-ranked JC offensive lineman in 2009 by Rivals.com.

## TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

> Utah has four players on the depth chart at tight end and all are expected to play, led by co-starters **Kendrick Moeai**, a sophomore, and **Brad Clifford**, a senior.

> Moeai had two touchdown catches—the first of his career—in Utah's Poinsettia Bowl win over Cal. In 13 games last season he had four catches for 77 yards.

> Clifford is Utah's most veteran tight end with three letters and two starts. He had one catch (-2 yards) in 13 games a year ago.

> Others who will play are sophomore **Dallin Rogers**, who started as a true freshman in 2007 before leaving for a church mission, and freshman **Westlee Tonga**.

## SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

> Utah looks to replace three of four starting defensive backs from a year ago, including fifth-round NFL draft pick **Robert Johnson** (Tennessee) at free safety and seventh-round pick **R.J. Stanford** (Carolina) at corner.

> All-America candidate and preseason all-MWC selection **Brandon Burton** will start at corner for his second year. He led Utah and tied for second in the league in pass breakups last season with 10.

> Senior **Lamar Chapman** and redshirt junior **Conroy Black** will man the other corner, where they are listed as co-starters. Chapman is also the starting nickel back—the same position he held last year, when he made four starts there and one at safety.

> At free safety, senior **Justin Taplin-Ross** played in all 13 games in a backup role as a junior last year with one start.

> The Utes will go with a true freshman at strong safety, where **Brian Blechen** won the job shortly after the start of fall camp. Blechen played quarterback, safety, linebacker and punter in high school (Moorpark HS, Calif.).

## DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

> The defensive line was the position least affected by graduation, even with the loss of first-team all-conference end Koa Misi, who was a second-round NFL draft pick (Miami).

> Anchoring a deep defensive line is junior tackle **Sealver Siliga**, an all-conference candidate who won honorable mention honors as a sophomore last year.

> Sophomore **Dave Kruger** is another all-conference candidate at tackle. Kruger, brother of former all-conference DL Paul Kruger (now with the Baltimore Ravens) was a 2009 second-team Freshman All-American.

> The Utes run six deep at tackle, where backups **James Aiono**, **Neli A'Asa**, **Star Lotulelei** and **Latu Heimuli** will all see playing time.

> Utah's ends are interchangeable, with seniors **Junior Tui'one** and **Christian Cox** slated to start on the left and right side this week. Cox led Utah in sacks with 5.5 last year while playing mostly in a backup role (he played in all 13 games and started the last three).

> **Derrick Shelby**, the starting left end in 2009 before a season-ending knee injury, will rotate with Tui'one at left end, while the latest Kruger addition—true freshman **Joe Kruger**—will backup Cox at right end.

## LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

> Linebacker is the least known quantity on the defense since all three starters graduated, among them **Stevenson Sylvester**—a fifth-round NFL draft choice of Pittsburgh.

> Starting at stud linebacker is senior **Chad Manis**, a former quarterback who switched to defense last season. Juniors **Matt Martinez** and **Chaz Walker** share the top spot on the depth chart at middle linebacker. All three contributed in a backup role last year and on special teams.

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

> Utah returns two of the best kickers in the league in senior placekicker **Joe Phillips** and sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood**. Both made the honorable mention all-conference team as first-year starters in 2009.

> **Phillips** led the Mountain West Conference in field goal percentage (.909) while making 20-of-22 field goal attempts. His 20 made field goals ranks as the second-best season total in school history.

> **Sellwood** averaged 42.9 yards per punt and placed 19 punts inside the 20-yard line. Along with his league recognition, Sellwood was a Freshman All-American by Rivals.com (second team) and Phil Steele (third team).

> Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** steps in for graduated four-year starter Ben Vroman on kickoffs and is the primary backup at placekicker and punter.

> Sophomore **Patrick Greene** will handle the snaps (short and long) for the second season.

> In the return game, senior **Shaky Smithson** is No. 1 for both kickoff and punt returns. He led Utah a year ago in kickoff returns with 23 for an average of 24.7 yards per return. He took over the punt returns in the last three games of 2009, averaging 9.5 yards per return to finish fourth in the MWC.

> Sophomore JC transfer **Reggie Dunn** will line up deep with Smithson on kickoff returns, where the Utes run five deep (others are **Jereme Brooks**, **Conroy Black** and **DeVonte Christopher**). Second in line to return punts is **Griff McNabb**.

## HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

“Opening up the season against the University of Pittsburgh presents a big challenge for our football team and one that our players and coaches have worked hard for and have been looking forward to for quite some time. We will have a lot of new faces in the lineup this year, particularly on the defensive side of the ball.
