> No. 5/6/6 Utah (8-0, 5-0 MWC) plays No. 3/4/4 TCU (9-0, 5-0 MWC) in Salt Lake City on Saturday, Nov. 6. Kickoff is 1:30 p.m. MT in Rice-Eccles Stadium. ESPN College Football GameDay will host its shows from the Rice-Eccles Stadium parking lot on Friday and Saturday (more below). The game itself will be televised by CBS C. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com) and Westwood One, with ESPN Radio GameDay hosting its shows on location as well.

> ESPN College Football GameDay will be in Salt Lake City this weekend, broadcasting shows from the Rice-Eccles Stadium west parking lot on Friday (10 a.m.-noon MT) and Saturday (7-10 a.m.). Fans are encouraged to arrive at 6 a.m. Saturday (general parking is available in the Huntsman and Merrill Engineering lots). ESPN Radio GameDay is also coming to town and will host a variety of shows from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. MT Saturday on the lawn by the Eccles Tennis Center.

> Utah is No. 5 in the BCS Standings and No. 6 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls this week, the earliest it has ever been ranked this high. Utah's best national ranking came in 2008, when it finished the season ranked No. 2 after crushing Alabama 31-17 in the Sugar Bowl. Utah is off to its third 8-0 start in the last seven years (the Utes finished 12-0 in 2004 and 13-0 in 2008).

> No. 3 TCU is the highest ranked opponent Utah has hosted in Rice-Eccles Stadium since it opened in 1998 and ties the highest ranking ever by an opponent in Salt Lake City (BYU was No. 3 in the 1984 game in old Rice Stadium). The highest ranked opponents previously to visit Rice-Eccles Stadium were No. 11 UCLA in 2007 and No. 11 TCU in 2008. Utah beat both teams. Utah's current No. 5 BCS ranking ties its best ever for a home game. The Utes were ranked No. 5 by the A.P. for a 52-21 home win over Brigham Young in 2004.

> The Utes lead the series with TCU 5-2, including a 3-0 mark in Salt Lake City. For more on the series, see page 2.

DÉJÀ VU?

There are plenty of similarities between the upcoming game and the 2008 Utah-TCU game in Salt Lake City: Both teams were ranked (Utah No. 10 and TCU No. 11), the game was played on Nov. 6 and televised nationally on CBS College Sports, the theme of the game was a “Blackout” and both teams were undefeated in Mountain West Conference play. Utah won that game 13-10.

THE STREAK

Utah's home win streak, now at 21 games, is the third-longest active home win streak in the nation, the second-longest in school history and longest in MWC history. “The Streak” dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA and currently ranks behind only Oklahoma (35) and Boise State (29). The school record for consecutive home wins is 26, set from 1928-34.

UTAH-TCU SERIES

Series Snapshot ...

The Utes lead the series 5-2 and are 3-0 in Salt Lake City. The last time these teams met in Rice-Eccles Stadium, No. 10 Utah edged No. 11 TCU 13-10 in a battle of MWC unbeatens in 2008.

Last Year ...

Utah had no answers for the No. 4 ranked team in the country, falling to TCU 55-28 in Ft. Worth. After Utah tied the game at 7-7 on **Shaky Smithson's** 10-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, TCU scored four unanswered touchdowns. David Reed (111 yards on six receptions) broke the drought with a sensational catch on a 50-yard pass play from **Jordan Wynn**, but the Utes trailed 38-14 at the half. Robert Johnson's 10 tackles led the defense, which allowed 549 total yards—the most by a Ute opponent all season.

GET YOUR BLACK OUT

Saturday's game is the third-annual Blackout game for the Utes, with the preceding Blackouts coming against TCU in 2008 and Wyoming in 2009. Utah is 2-0 in Blackout games in Salt Lake City. This year's Blackout will also feature a camouflage theme in honor of the Wounded Warrior Project. Fans are encouraged to wear black, or black and camouflage, attire to the game. Apparel is being sold online at www.utahutes.com and at local licensed retailers. The Ute players will wear specially designed camouflage and black jerseys with the words Duty, Honor, Courage, Commitment, Country, Integrity and Service replacing their last names. CBS will auction off the game jerseys on Nov. 8 on UtahUtes.com. Also in recognition of the Wounded Warrior Program, 25,000 American flags will be handed out at the entry gates, three wounded veterans will serve as honorary captains for the coin toss and 50 active and retired soldiers will hold a huge American flag for the National Anthem.

LAST TIME THEY MET IN SLC

The last time Utah and TCU played in Salt Lake City, No. 10 Utah staged a late rally to beat No. 11 TCU 13-10. Trailing 10-6 with 2:48 remaining, current Ute quarterbacks coach **Brian Johnson**, then a senior QB for Utah, completed 7-of-9 passes culminating with a touchdown pass to Freddie Brown with less than a minute left. Until the late-game offensive heroics, this was a defensive battle. After relinquishing 10 points in the first nine minutes of the game, Utah held TCU scoreless the remainder of the way. Stevenson Sylvester, now with the Pittsburgh Steelers, led Utah with 10 tackles, and had one of the team's four sacks. Sean Smith, now a Miami Dolphin, returned an interception 37 yards to set up a Louie Sakoda field goal.

BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has 21 wins against BCS opponents since the BCS began in 1998, which is tied for the most by a non-automatic qualifying school with Navy. However, Utah is 21-11 (.656) in games against BCS teams, while Navy is 21-45 (.318). Sixth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is 12-4 against BCS schools. Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games—and is the only NAQ team with two wins against BCS teams in BCS bowl games (Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl).

BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

PAC-ING UP

The 2010 season will be Utah's last in the Mountain West Conference. On June 17, 2010, the Utes accepted an invitation to join the Pacific-10 Conference and will begin Pac-10 play in 2011. The Utes became one of eight original members of the MWC in 1999, winning conference titles in 1999 (tie), 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Pac-10 will mark the sixth conference in Utah's history. Utah competed in the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98) and MWC (1999-2010).

OUTSIDE THE LINES

Paint the Town Red contest winners will be honored at the game. Taking first place was RANLife Home Loans, in second was Mid City Salon and the third-place winner was Van Boerum & Frank Associates Inc. ... With its final home games against TCU and Brigham Young both sold out in advance, Utah is guaranteed of selling out every game this year. The Utes have averaged 45,240 to their first four home games, which exceeds the seating capacity of 45,017. The school record for season attendance average is 45,585 set in 2008.

INSIDE THE HUDDLE

True freshman safety **Brian Blechen** was named the MWC Defensive Player of the Week for his role in Utah's 28-23 win over Air Force. Blechen made a career-high nine tackles (one an assisted tackle for loss), along with an interception and a fumble recovery. It is Blechen's second MWC citation this season ... Utah has won nine MWC Player of the Week citations to date: **DeVonte Christopher** (offense, Sept. 6), **Brian Blechen** (defense, Sept. 6, Oct. 31); **Shaky Smithson** (special teams, Sept. 13, Sept. 20, Oct. 11), **Lamar Chapman** (defense, Sept. 20) and **Jordan Wynn** (offense, Oct. 11, Oct. 25) ... Six true freshmen have played: **Blechen, Freeman, Mike Honeycutt, Joe Kruger, Tonga** and **Michael Walker**.

turnovers, holding AFA to 0-3 in fourth down attempts and making a critical stop on a two-point conversion after the Falcons had closed within five in the fourth quarter. Freshman **Brian Blechen** had a career day with a team-high nine tackles and contributed a third-quarter interception that set up Utah's final score. Blechen also recovered a fumble. Other big defensive plays came on **Justin Taplin-Ross'** interception, a fumble caused and fumble recovered by **Greg Bird** and a forced fumble by **Lamar Chapman**.

KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year (2008), averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons. He is 56-17 overall and 12-4 against BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 17-year tenure, the Utes have won 71-percent of their games (141-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 613-420-31. The Utes are 375-173-16 at home (57-16 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 220-233-13 in road games and 18-14-2 in games played at neutral sites.

UTAH VS. MWC TEAMS

The Utes are 240-134-10 all-time against Mountain West Conference schools. The breakdown follows: Air Force 13-14, Brigham Young 53-34-4, Colorado State 55-22-2, New Mexico 33-17-2, San Diego State 16-12-1, TCU 5-2, UNLV 14-2, Wyoming 51-31-1.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > Utah ranks fourth in the nation and first in the MWC in pass efficiency offense (170.8).
- > Sophomore starter **Jordan Wynn** is 6-0 as the starter this year and 9-2 in his career. He has played in six games this season—missing the UNLV and New Mexico games with a thumb injury—and in 12 games in his career.
- > **Wynn** ranks 11th in the nation and leads the MWC in pass efficiency (162.4).
- > **Wynn** has completed 69% percent of his passes (112-for-162) with 13 touchdowns and six interceptions.
- > **Wynn** ranks second in the MWC and 33rd in the nation in passing yards per game (238.5).
- > **Wynn** has passed for 300 yards twice this season and three times in his career—most recently against Colorado State (321 yards). Wynn's season high is 325 yards against Iowa State, while his career best is 338 yards vs. Cal in 2009.
- > **Wynn** has four 200-yard games this season and seven in his career.
- > With **Wynn** on the field, Utah is 46-of-48 in the red zone the last two years (24-of-26 this season).
- > **Wynn** is a two-time MWC Offensive Player of the Week honoree, receiving the award on Oct. 11 (Iowa State) and Oct. 25 (CSU).
- > Senior **Terrance Cain** has played in six games this season and is 2-0 as the starter with wins over UNLV and New Mexico.
- > **Cain** has a record of 9-1 as the starter and has played in 18 total games.
- > **Cain** has a 186.51 pass efficiency rating this season, which would lead the MWC and rank second in the nation had he met the minimum number of pass attempts per game (15).
- > **Cain** has completed 77% of his passes (49-of-64), with six touchdowns and no interceptions.
- > **Cain** ranks ninth in the MWC in passing yards per game (100.3) and averaged 227.5 ypg in the two games he started. He also ranks 10th in the league in total offense (112.5 ypg).
- > **Cain** set the school record for single-game completion percentage (86.95) against New Mexico on Sept. 18 by completing 20-of-23 passes, including 20 of his last 21 throws.
- > **Cain** has six career 200-yard games, including both games he started this season. His best game was 286 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.
- > **Griff Robles**, a redshirt freshman, has seen duty in four games. Robles is Utah's third-leading rusher, gaining 124 yards on 17 carries, and averages 7.3 yards per carry (tied for second-best among those with double-figure carries). He is 0-1 passing.
- > **Robles** led Utah in rushing in his NCAA debut against New Mexico with six carries for 64 yards (10.7 average). He had a long rush of 47 yards on his second play.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > Co-starting seniors **Matt Asiata** and **Eddie Wide** have combined for 69% of the team's total carries (202 of 290) and 64% of its net rushing yards (979 of 1,532). Their combined rushing average is 122.3 yards per game, while the team average is 191.5.
- > Among the MWC rushing leaders, **Wide** is seventh (61.4 ypg) and **Asiata** is eighth (61.0 ypg).
- > **Wide** is tied for the MWC lead in touchdowns scored with 11 (9 rushing, 2 receiving) and touchdown scoring average (8.2).

> **Wide** leads Utah in rushing yards (491) while ranking second in carries (98). He averages 5.0 yards per carry.

> **Wide** ranks 10th in the MWC in all-purpose yards (85.5 ypg). In addition to his rushing numbers, Wide has 21 receptions (third on the team) for 193 yards and two touchdowns.

> **Wide**, a 1,000-yard rusher and first-team all-conference running back last year—as well as the preseason all-MWC pick for 2010—has seven career 100-yard games. All of his 100-yard games were in 2009—when he netted 1,069 yards—including a career-best 145-yard game vs. New Mexico.

> **Wide's** best rushing game this season was an 82-yard effort against Air Force. He also had a season-high 23 carries and two touchdowns against the Falcons.

> **Asiata** has 104 rushes for 488 yards (4.7 average).

> **Asiata** is tied for sixth in the MWC in touchdowns scored with six, all on the ground.

> **Asiata** has 22 career rushing touchdowns, which is tied with three others for the fourth-best mark at Utah.

> **Asiata** has Utah's only 100-yard rushing game this year (109 vs. Wyoming) and his 95 yards against Air Force last week marked the second-best rushing total by a Ute this season.

> **Asiata** has three 100-yard games in his career, with a personal best 156 yards vs. Utah State in 2009. He was Utah's leading rusher in 2008 (707 yards).

> **Asiata** rushed 26 times against AFA, which was a season high. He had 95 yards and a touchdown against the Falcons.

> **Asiata** also has 18 receptions (fourth on the team) for 96 yards.

> Sophomore **Sausan Shakerin** has 12 carries for 105 yards and two touchdowns in four games. He missed the first four games with a concussion.

> Junior **Tauni Vakapuna** has played in all eight games, primarily on special teams, and has 19 rushes for 79 yards (4.2 average) and two touchdowns.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> Senior all-conference candidate **Jereme Brooks** leads Utah in receptions (38) and ranks second in receiving yards (451) and touchdowns (4).

> **Brooks** ranks third in the MWC in receptions per game (4.75), fifth in receiving yards per game (56.4) and is tied for fourth in receiving touchdowns (4).

> **Brooks** had a season-high 99 yards vs. New Mexico, including a career-long catch of 75 yards that went for a touchdown. It is Utah's longest offensive play of the season.

> **Christopher** is second in the MWC in yards per catch (19.2) among those averaging at least three receptions per game.

> **Christopher** has three 100-yard receiving games this season and in his career: 155 yards vs. Pittsburgh, 124 vs. Iowa State and 111 vs. CSU.

> **Christopher** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for the Pitt game.

> Senior **Shaky Smithson** has 13 catches for 234 yards (third on the team) and averages 18.0 yards a catch. He also has three touchdown receptions.

> **Smithson** had a career-high 75 yards on two receptions against Iowa State.

> **Smithson** has also played a cameo role at quarterback and is 3-for-8 passing for 42 yards in his career, with a touchdown pass against Iowa State.

> **Luke Matthews** has played an increasingly larger role in recent weeks, recording nine of his 13 receptions, 179 of his 207 yards, and both of his touchdowns in the last four games.

> **Reggie Dunn** (3 catches for 28 yards) has rushed eight times for 87 yards and two touchdowns.

> Others to line up at receiver this season are **Griff McNabb** (2 catches, 8 yards, 1 TD), **Fatu Moala** (2 catches, 18 yards), **Dexter Ransom** (2 catches, 12 yards) and **Sean Fitzgerald**.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

> The Utes have allowed just three sacks, which is tied for second in the nation and is first in the MWC.

> Preseason all-conference selection **Caleb Schlauderaff** was named to SI.com's Midseason All-America team as a second-team guard.

> The offensive line notes and stats below do not include total plays, plays won, plays lost or grade for the Air Force game on Oct. 30. The only stats from that game are cuts and pancake blocks.

> **Schlauderaff** leads the Utes in overall grade (88%) and pancake blocks (15).

> **Schlauderaff** has won 337 of 383 total plays in the seven games that were graded (including 42-of-44 against UNM).

> **Schlauderaff's** 95% grade against New Mexico is the best by a Ute this year. He graded out at 94% vs. Iowa State.

> Preseason all-conference senior center **Zane Taylor** has started and played in seven games (missing the New Mexico game with a knee injury) and has not committed an errant snap or allowed a sack.

> **Taylor** leads the Ute offensive line in plays per game, averaging 57.5 in the six games he was graded.

> **Taylor** has six cuts and nine pancake blocks (second on the team).

> **Taylor's** season grade is 86% and he led the Utes against Pitt (89%) and Wyoming (92%).

> Right tackle **Tony Bergstrom**, Utah's OL play leader (392) in the seven games that were graded, has an 82% season grade.

> **Bergstrom** has nine cuts, two pancakes and has not allowed a sack.

> Right guard **Tevita Stevens** is second on the line in total plays (388) in the seven games that were graded.

> **Stevens** has started all eight games, including one game at center (New Mexico) when Taylor was injured.

> **Stevens** has an 84% overall grade and his 12 cuts ranks second on the team. He has six pancakes.

TIGHT END NOTEBOOK

- > **Kendrick Moeai** leads the tight ends with 130 receiving yards on eight catches. He has played and started in seven games, while missing the Wyoming game with a concussion.
- > **Brad Clifford** has six catches for 79 yards but is doubtful to play this week due to a shoulder injury. He has made two starts and played in five games, missing games against San Jose State, CSU and Air Force with the injury.
- > Sophomore **Dallin Rogers** leads the tight ends in touchdown receptions with two and has five catches for 80 yards.
- > **Neli A'asa** and **Westlee Tonga** have also seen time at tight end, although Tonga is currently out with a knee injury. A'asa, whose primary job is on the defensive line, started at tight end against Iowa State.

DEFENSIVE DATA

Utah is ranked in the top 10 in the nation in total defense, scoring defense, pass defense, opponent first downs, opponent third-down conversions and opponent fourth-down conversions. Please refer to the sidebar on page 4 of this release for Utah's complete MWC and NCAA rankings ... Utah ranks 12th in the nation in total sacks (23) ... Opponents are averaging just 2.9 yards per rush and five of eight have rushed for under 100 yards: Pittsburgh (82), New Mexico (69), San Jose State (94), Wyoming (67) and Colorado State (28).

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- > Utah rotates a dozen players on its defensive line every game, making it one of the deepest D-lines in the nation.
- > Sophomore nose tackle **Dave Kruger**, senior right end **Christian Cox** and junior tackle **Sealver Siliga** have started every game. Junior **Derick Shelby** has started the last two games at left end while senior **Junior Tui'one** started the first six games.
- > Backups who rotate in are **Neli A'Asa**, **Trevor Reilly**, **Latu Heimuli**, **Star Lotulelei**, **Tevita Finau**, **Joe Kruger** and **James Aiono**.
- > **Cox** leads Utah's linemen and ranks sixth on the team in tackles with 33. He has 4.5 TFL and two sacks.
- > **Cox** is tied for the conference lead in fumble recoveries (2) and recoveries per game (0.25), with both coming in the last two games vs. CSU and Air Force.
- > **Siliga's** 23 tackles ranks second among the linemen and includes a half sack.
- > **Dave Kruger** has 20 total tackles, two tackles for loss and a half sack.
- > **Shelby** has 19 tackles with two forced fumbles (which ranks fifth in the MWC). He also has two pass breakups.

2010 UTAH FOOTBALL NOTES

- > Coming off the bench, freshman defensive end **Reilly** ranks third on the team in tackles for loss with 5.5 and has 15 total tackles.
- > **Reilly** also has two sacks, a pass breakup and a blocked PAT (vs. Iowa State).
- > Eight linemen have contributed solo or assisted sacks: **Cox** (2.0), **Reilly** (2.0), **Shelby** (2.0), **A'asa** (1.5), **Tui'one** (1.0), **Heimuli** (1.0), **Dave Kruger**, (0.5), **Siliga** (0.5) and **Lotulelei** (0.5).
- > Two defensive linemen have appeared on the offense as well. **A'asa** sees frequent action at tight end, starting against Iowa State, while **Lotulelei** has subbed in at offensive guard in the past two games (CSU and Air Force).

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

- > Three of Utah's four tackle leaders are linebackers.
- > Two of Utah's three starting linebackers (junior middle linebacker **Chaz Walker** and junior rover **Matt Martinez**) began their careers as walk-ons, while the other (senior 'stud' LB **Chad Manis**) was a quarterback his first two seasons at the U. All are first-year starters.
- > **Walker** leads Utah in tackles with 61 total and ranks ninth in the MWC in tackles per game (7.6).
- > **Walker's** career-high 16 tackles vs. UNLV is the most by a Ute in four seasons.
- > **Walker's** 6.0 TFL ranks second on the team. His first sack of the season came against Air Force on the final play of the game.
- > **Martinez** is Utah's second-leading tackler with 45 stops (5.6 per game average). He has 4.0 TFL with 1.5 sacks.
- > **Martinez** has an interception, which he returned 36 yards for a touchdown against New Mexico, and a pass breakup.
- > **Manis** is fourth on the team with 40 tackles. He also has 2.0 TFL and a pass breakup.
- > Sophomore **Boo Andersen** has backed up at all three linebacker positions and has 22 tackles, 2.0 TFL and a half sack.

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

- > Preseason all-MWC junior corner **Brandon Burton** is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups.
- > **Burton** has 14 career pass breakups. His 10 PBUs last year was tied for second in the MWC.
- > **Burton** has 28 tackles with one tackle for loss and an interception with a 57-yard return. He forced a fumble against Air Force.
- > All-conference candidate **Lamar Chapman** is the only defensive back listed among the MWC's leaders in sacks and is Utah's leader in both sacks and tackles for loss.
- > Despite his 5'8" stature, **Chapman**, a senior corner, ranks second in the league in sacks per game (0.69) and is tied for second in total number of sacks (5.5). His 0.69 sack average is tied for 34th in the nation.
- > **Chapman** also ranks second in the MWC in tackles for loss (9.5) and TFL average (1.19).
- > **Chapman** is third on the team with 42 total tackles and his 29 solo tackles is tops on the team.
- > **Chapman** is tied for third on the team in pass breakups (3) and he had a forced fumble against Air Force.
- > **Chapman** was named the MWC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 20 (New Mexico).

- > True freshman safety **Brian Blechen** led the Utes against Air Force with a career-high nine tackles (one an assisted tackle for loss), an interception and a fumble recovery. It is Blechen's second league honor. He also was recognized on Sept. 6 for an opening game performance against Pitt that was highlighted by an interception on the first play of overtime.
- > **Blechen** was also named the Rivals.com MWC player of the week on Oct. 31.
- > **Blechen** is tied for sixth in the league and leads Utah in passes defended with six (4 pass breakups, 2 interceptions).
- > **Blechen**, who is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups, has 35 tackles, two interceptions, 1.5 TFL, a half sack and a fumble recovery.
- > **Blechen** signed with Utah as a quarterback, although he also played safety, linebacker and punter at Moorpark High School (Calif.).
- > Senior free safety **Justin Taplin-Ross** has 29 tackles, three TFL (one sack), a pass breakup and two interceptions. He had five tackles and an interception against Air Force.
- > Junior **Greg Bird** earned his first career start at Air Force at safety (the Utes utilized three safeties in the starting lineup against AFA) and had his best game to date as a Ute. Bird forced a fumble, recovered a fumble, broke up a pass and made three tackles (one a tackle for loss) against the Cadets.
- > **Conroy Black** is Utah's third corner and has played every game with 12 tackles, an interception, three pass breakups and a sack.

SPECIAL TEAMS SPECIALTIES

- Utah ranks No. 1 nationally in punt return average (21.14) and punt return yards (592) ... The Utes are 16th in kickoff return average (25.50) ... Utah and Oregon are the only teams this year that have scored at least three touchdowns on punt returns ... Utah is first in the league in kickoff coverage (46.7 net average) ... Returner **Shaky Smithson** has won three MWC Special Teams Player of the Week awards this year (Sept. 13, Sept. 20 and Oct. 11).

KICKING NOTEBOOK

- > Lou Groza semifinalist and All-America candidate **Joe Phillips** is 9-of-10 in field goals this season. His only miss, a 42-yard attempt into a stiff headwind against Air Force, snapped a streak of 18 consecutive made field goals.
- > **Phillips'** 18 consecutive made field goals is a school record.
- > **Phillips** is tied for the national lead in PAT scoring (47).
- > **Phillips** ranks third in the nation among active kickers in career field goal percentage (90.62%). The senior has made 29-of-32 field goals in his two years as Utah's placekicker and led the MWC in field goal percentage last year when he made 20-of-22 attempts (91%).
- > **Phillips** leads the MWC and is tied for 21st in the nation in scoring, averaging 9.2 points per game (9 FG, 47 PAT).
- > **Phillips** ranks fifth in school history in career field goals made (29).
- > **Phillips** is 7-of-9 from 40 yards and out for his career and 2-of-3 this season.
- > **Phillips** has booted a career-long 48-field goal twice, including against Wyoming this season.

2010 UTAH FOOTBALL NOTES

- > **Phillips** set a new school record with his 20 kick-scoring points against Iowa State, when he was 4-for-4 in field goals and 8-for-8 in PATs.
- > **Phillips** went 8-of-8 in PATs against UNM, SJSU, ISU and CSU. The eight PATs is tied for the second-best single-game total in school history.
- > **Phillips** is 47-of-48 in PATs this year and 84-of-86 in his career. He had a PAT blocked against Wyoming, snapping a streak of 54-straight PATs.
- > **Phillips'** 84 career PATs is fifth all-time at Utah.
- > **Phillips** kicked the game-winning field goal against Pittsburgh, a 21-yarder in overtime.
- > **Phillips** gained seven yards rushing on a fake field goal play for a first down against Air Force.
- > Sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood**, who has been named a Ray Guy Award nominee, is averaging 42.5 yards per punt.
- > Of his 20 total punts, **Sellwood** has six 50-yarders (long of 60 yards) and has had eight downed inside the 20.
- > **Sellwood** pinned Air Force at the 1-yard line with 28 seconds left and Utah nursing a 28-23 lead.
- > **Sellwood's** career long is 63 yards, set last year.
- > Utah has 62 total kickoffs (average 66.3 yards) with 16 touchbacks.
- > Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** has handled 53 of Utah's 62 kickoffs with 15 touchbacks. He is averaging 66.4 yards per kickoff.
- > **Phillips** has nine kickoffs for an average of 65.9 yards and one touchback. He made and recovered an onside kick against Colorado State.

RETURN GAME NOTEBOOK

- > Utah's special teams have scored four touchdowns (three on punt returns and one on a kickoff return).
- > **Shaky Smithson**, the Midseason All-America first-team punt returner by SI.com, leads the nation in punt return average (23.33), punt return yards (560), total punt returns (24) and punt returns per game (3.00), despite teams kicking away from him for the past two games.
- > **Smithson** is the only player in the country this season with four 100-yard punt return games.
- > **Smithson** has four of the top 10 punt return yardage games in the country this season: 145 vs. Iowa State (2nd), 140 vs. New Mexico (3rd), 128 vs. UNLV (5th-tie), 111 vs. Wyoming (10th).
- > **Smithson** is the only player in the nation this year with three 70-yard punt returns. He had a 78-yard return against Iowa State (tied for the sixth-longest in school history), a 77-yard punt return against UNLV (eighth in school history) and a 73-yard punt return against New Mexico.
- > With four regular season games remaining, **Smithson's** 560 yards in punt returns is just three shy of the Mountain West Conference record of 563 set by TCU's Jeremy Kerley in 2009. The NCAA record is 791 yards, set back in 1948.
- > **Smithson** has already become the first player in Utah history to reach 500 yards in punt returns in a single season. Smithson's 560 punt return yards this season breaks the school record of 495 yards set by current Carolina Panther star Steve Smith in 1999.
- > **Smithson** has 683 yards in career punt returns, which ranks fourth among all active players in the NCAA FBS and is also third all-time at Utah.

- > **Smithson** is averaging 70.0 yards a game in punt returns and has a career average of 37.9 yards per game.
- > **Smithson** has four of the top 10 punt return yardage games in school history: 145 vs. Iowa State (3rd), 140 vs. UNM (4th), 128 vs. UNLV (6th), 111 vs. Wyoming (10th).
- > **Smithson** returned punts for touchdowns in back-to-back weeks against UNLV and New Mexico. He returned a punt to the 2-yard line against Iowa State.
- > **Smithson** is tied for second in the school single-season record books with two punt returns for touchdowns, a feat last accomplished by Steve Smith, who set the school record with three punt returns for touchdowns in 1999.
- > **Smithson** has been named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week three times this season and in his career (Sept. 13, Sept. 20 and Oct. 11).
- > **Smithson** was honored as the National Punt Returner of the Week on Sept. 13 and 20 by the College Football Performance Awards.
- > **Smithson** also leads the Utes in kickoff returns with nine for 217 yards (24.1 average).
- > **Smithson** is second in the MWC and ranks 41st nationally in all-purpose yards per game (126.5). Of his 1,012 all-purpose yards, 777 have come on punt and kick return yards.
- > **Reggie Dunn** has returned kicks the last four games and ranks second on the team with 161 yards on just four returns (40.2 average).
- > **Dunn** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Iowa State for just the seventh 100-yard kickoff return in Utah history. It was the first 100-yard return by a Ute in 25 years, since Erroll Tucker did it twice in 1985.
- > **Dunn** was named the National Kick Returner of the Week on Oct. 10 by the College Football Performance Awards.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"We were able to come away from Air Force with a victory and move to 8-0 on the season. The Falcons are an extremely difficult opponent to prepare for and to play, especially in Colorado Springs, and getting the win was our sole objective. Our attention now turns to TCU. The Horned Frogs are playing great football and are among the nation's leaders statistically in virtually every major offensive, defensive and special teams category and have no apparent weaknesses. They have tremendous team speed and athleticism and are extremely well coached. Obviously, this will be a high profile game, but we have played in these types of games before and we anticipate our players will handle the situation well. With the ESPN College GameDay crew rolling into town, this will be a great opportunity for our fans, and especially the MUSS, to share in the national exposure that comes with a game of this magnitude."

A 9.90 ROUTINE

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

SALT LAKE CITY—Jordan Wynn returned from a two-game injury absence to start at quarterback, but he and the rest of the first string gave way to backups in the second half of a 56-3 rout of San Jose State on Sept. 25. Wynn completed 14-of-18 passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns in one half of play. Utah scored on its very first offensive play when Reggie Dunn ran a reverse 43 yards for a touchdown. The Spartans responded immediately with a 71-yard kickoff return to Utah's 20-yard line, only to settle for a field goal. They would not score again on a Utah defense that held them to 1-of-12 on third down conversions and just seven first downs. Nearly everyone got into the act for Utah, which piled up 427 yards of total offense and got touchdowns from eight different players.
