## QUICKLY

> It's Homecoming for No. 13/13 Utah (3-0, 2-0 MWC) when it hosts San Jose State (1-2, 0-0 WAC) on Saturday, Sept. 25 in Rice-Eccles Stadium. Kickoff is 6 p.m. There is no TV. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com).

> The Utes moved up one spot in both polls to No. 13. It is their highest ranking since the Sugar Bowl champion Utes finished the 2008 season ranked No. 2 in the nation (Associated Press) and No. 4 (coaches).

> Utah's home win streak, now at 19 games, is the longest home win streak in MWC history, the second-longest in school history and the third-longest active win streak in the nation. "The Streak" dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA and currently ranks behind only Oklahoma (33) and Boise State (26). The school record for consecutive home wins is 26, set 1928-34.

> Utah leads the series with San Jose State 5-1 with its loss coming on Homecoming of 1974 in Salt Lake City. For more on the series, see box on page 2 of this release.

> Utah's all-time record in homecoming games is 55-30-4. The Utes have won their last three homecoming games (Utah State, 2007; Weber State 2008; Louisville, 2009).

> Utah leads the Mountain West Conference and is ranked in the top 20 in the nation in both passing efficiency offense and passing efficiency defense. Utah's 177.7 passing efficiency offense is No. 7 nationally and its 101.8 passing efficiency defense is No. 19.

> Utah returner **Shaky Smithson** won his second MWC Special Teams Player of the Week award in as many weeks and cornerback **Lamar Chapman** won his first MWC Defensive Player of the Week award following Utah's 56-14 win over New Mexico.

> Utah's coaches will participate in the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA)-sponsored Coach to Cure MD program at this Saturday's game. The coaches will wear a Coach to Cure MD logo patch in support of research projects for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy.

## LAST WEEK

**Terrance Cain** completed 20-of-23 passes, including 20 of his final 21 attempts, to break the school single-game record for completion percentage (86.9%) and Utah crushed New Mexico 56-14. Cain finished with 248 yards passing and three touchdowns (no interceptions), while also rushing for a touchdown. **Jereme Brooks** caught six passes for 99 yards—one a 75-yard touchdown catch—while third-string quarterback **Griff Robles** led Utah's rushers with six carries for 64 yards. **Joe Phillips** made all eight PATs to tie for the second-most in school history. Utah, which allowed just one defensive touchdown, got eight tackles from **Lamar Chapman, Chad Manis** and **Chaz Walker**. Each had two tackles for loss and Chapman had a sack. **Matt Martinez** returned his first career interception 36 yards for a touchdown.

## KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year (2008), averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons, and his 51-17 overall mark includes an 11-4 advantage over BCS schools. ### Last Time They Met ...

SAN JOSE—A 17-point fourth quarter boosted Utah to a 24-14 win. **Terrance Cain** and **Jereme Brooks** connected for a 51-yard pass play for the go-ahead touchdown to start the fourth quarter. **Eddie Wide** scored on Utah's next drive to put the Utes up 21-7. But the Spartans would counter with a TD of their own on the next series. Utah then advanced to the San Jose State 4-yard line on **Sausan Shakerin's** 46-yard run on his very first carry as a Ute. Utah would settle for a **Joe Phillips'** field goal from 25 yards out (the first field goal attempt of his career). Brooks totaled a (then) career-high 98 receiving yards and **Matt Asiata** ran for 94 yards. Joe Dale had seven tackles for the defense and the game ended with an interception by Mike Wright.

On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 17-year tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (136-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

### OUTSIDE THE LINES

The Homecoming Court will be presented at the first quarter break ... It will be Family and Parent Weekend on campus ... The Varsity Club is holding its annual reunion and former U. varsity athletes will gather in the Eccles Field House prior to the game and will be recognized at the game ... This Saturday marks Utah's last home game until Oct. 23 ... The Utes are averaging 45,416 fans in two games in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which seats 45,017.

### INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Preseason all-conference center **Zane Taylor** (knee, missed UNM) is probable for the San Jose State game, quarterback **Jordan Wynn** (thumb, missed UNLV, UNM) is day-to-day, tight end **Brad Clifford** (shoulder) is out, linebacker **J.J. Williams** (foot, missed Pitt, UNLV, UNM) is out, running back **Sausan Shakerin** (concussion, missed Pitt, UNLV, UNM) is out. Expected to return to play is DL **Derrick Shelby** (ankle, missed UNM) ... Utah has garnered five MWC Player of the Week awards in the first three weeks of the season: **DeVonte Christopher** (offense) and **Brian Blechen** (defense) were honored on Sept. 6; **Shaky Smithson** (special teams) on Sept. 13; and **Smithson** (special teams) and **Lamar Chapman** (defense) on Sept. 20 ... The first field goal attempt and make of **Joe Phillips'** career came last year against San Jose State—a 25-yarder. He went on to lead the MWC in field goal percentage (91%), making 20-of-22 attempts in 2009. Phillips is 3-of-3 this season ... Six true freshmen have played for the Utes: **Brian Blechen**,

**Wykie Freeman, Mike Honeycutt, Joe Kruger, Westlee Tonga and Michael Walker.**

### UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 608-420-31. The Utes are 373-173-16 at home (55-16 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 217-233-13 in road games and 18-14-2 in games played at neutral sites.

### UTAH VS. MWC TEAMS

> **Wynn**, Utah's No. 1 quarterback, has missed the last two games with a thumb injury to his throwing hand. His status for this week remains "day to day."

> **Wynn** has a 4-2 record as the starter

and is 1-0 this year with an overtime win over then-No. 15 Pitt. He has played in a total of seven games in his career.

> **Wynn's** 283-yard passing game against Pitt was his fourth career 200-yard game. His career high is 338 yards (vs. Cal in 2009).

> With **Wynn** as the starting quarterback, Utah is 25-for-26 in the red zone. Utah scored points on 23 consecutive red zone trips to start his career, including the first two opportunities this season.

> **Cain** has started the last two games in place of Wynn and is 2-0 this year and 9-1 as Utah's starter. Cain has played in 14 games in his two years at Utah.

> **Cain** has a 204.0 pass efficiency rating, which would lead the nation except he has not played in the minimum percentage of games required (75%).

> **Cain** is completing 76.7 percent of his passes (33-of-43), has five touchdowns and has not been intercepted. He is averaging 227.5 yards per game, which would rank third in the MWC if he met the minimum game requirement.

> **Cain** broke the school record for single-game completion percentage (86.95) by completing 20-of-23 passes against UNM. He connected on 20 of his last 21 throws after starting the game with two incompletions.

> **Cain's** record completion percentage against the Lobos broke the mark held by his current position coach **Brian Johnson**. Johnson, now in his first year coaching the QBs, held the school mark with 18-of-21 passing (85.7%) vs. Utah State in 2005.

> **Cain** has passed for 200-plus yards passing in both games this season and six times in his career. His career best passing game was 286 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Griff Robles**, a redshirt freshman, made his first Ute appearance against New Mexico, playing the entire fourth quarter.

> **Robles** finished as Utah's leading rusher with six carries for 64 yards (10.7 average). He had a long rush of 47 yards on his second play.

## RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

> As a team, the Utes are averaging 4.8 yards per carry.

> Co-starting seniors **Eddie Wide** and **Matt Asiata** have combined for 65 rushes and 285 yards, accounting for 61% of the team's carries and 66% of its net yards.

> The runners' numbers are nearly identical, with **Wide** rushing 32 times for 149 yards (4.7 average) and **Asiata** rushing 33 times for 136 yards (4.1 average). Wide has two touchdowns and Asiata one.

> **Wide**, first-team all-conference a year ago and the preseason pick for 2010, has seven career 100-yard games, all coming in 2009. His career best is 145 yards (vs. New Mexico in 2009).

> **Wide's** best rushing game this season came against UNLV, when he rushed 15 times for 77 yards (5.1 average).

> **Wide** also has eight receptions—third on the team—for 37 yards.

> **Asiata** has two 100-yard games in his career, with a personal best 156 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Asiata's** best game this season was 16 carries for 65 yards against Pittsburgh.

> **Asiata** has seven receptions (fourth on the team) for 73 yards (third on the team). His career-best receiving game was last week against New Mexico, when he made five catches for 54 yards.

> Junior **Tauni Vakapuna** has nine rushes for 49 yards in three games.

> **Vakapuna** had his best game as a Ute against New Mexico, getting

seven carries for 43 yards and his first career touchdown.

> Junior fullback **Shawn Asiata** has played in all three games. He has not carried the ball but has one catch for five yards.

## RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> Senior **Jereme Brooks**, an all-conference candidate and Utah's leading receiver, has 15 catches for 263 yards and four touchdowns (all team highs).

> **Brooks** ranks second in the league and 32nd in the nation in receiving yards per game (87.7).

> **Brooks** is tied for third in the MWC in receptions (5.0 per game).

> **Brooks** had a season-high 99 yards vs. New Mexico, including a career-long catch of 75 yards that went for a touchdown. It is Utah's longest offensive play of the season.

> **Brooks** has 14 career touchdown catches (the eighth-best total in school history) and 19 total touchdowns (five rushing).

> **Brooks** ranks eighth in the MWC in all-purpose yards (108.7 per game). His totals include 63 yards on three kickoff returns.

> Junior **DeVonte Christopher** is Utah's second-best receiver with 11 catches for 218 yards and two scores.

> **Christopher** is third in the MWC in receiving yards (72.7 per game). Christopher's 19.8 yards per catch leads the league.

> **Christopher** had career highs of eight catches and 155 yards against Pittsburgh. He also scored his first career TD on a 61-yard pass from Jordan Wynn vs. Pitt.

> **Christopher** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for his 155-yard game against Pitt.

> Others to line up at receiver this season are **Luke Matthews** (4 catches, 28 yards), **Shaky Smithson** (2 catches, 58 yards, 1 TD), **Fatu Moala**, **Griff McNabb**, **Reggie Dunn**, **Dexter Ransom** and **Sean Fitzgerald**.

> Preseason all-conference senior center **Zane Taylor** (knee) missed last week's game, but should be available this Saturday.

> **Taylor** has totaled 115 plays with 100 wins and an 87% grade. He has one cut and three pancake blocks.

> **Taylor** led Utah in plays (70) and grade (89%) against Pitt.

> Preseason all-conference guard **Caleb Schlauderaff** has a team-best 92% grade, winning a remarkable 143 of 156 plays (including 42-of-44 against UNM).

> **Schlauderaff** leads Utah in pancake blocks with six and has two cuts.

## DEFENSIVE DATA

Utah had 14 tackles for loss against New Mexico, which is tied for the second-most in a game in school history. It is the most Utah has had in one game since tallying 14 TFL against Boise State in 1999 ... The Utah defense has given up just three touchdowns this season. Other touchdowns came after turnovers or on special teams ... The Utes are tied for the MWC lead and tied for 18th nationally in red zone defense (66.7%). Only two of the six opponent scores have been touchdowns for a league-low 22.2% touchdown rate ... Utah also leads the league in rushing defense (84.3) and pass efficiency defense (101.8). The Utes, who are second in the MWC in scoring defense (16.0), total defense (271.7), opponent first downs (51) and sacks (9), are ranked the top 25 nationally in several defensive categories: 19th in rushing defense (84.3), 19th in total defense (271.7), 19th in pass efficiency defense (101.8), 22nd in sacks (9 for 54 yards) and 24th in scoring defense (16.0).

Utah ranks third nationally and first in the MWC in punt return average (24.5) ... The Ute are second in the conference and 20th in the nation in kickoff return average (25.7) ... In the first three weeks of play, returner **Shaky Smithson** has won two MWC Special Teams Player of the Week awards (Sept. 13 and 20).

## SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

> Senior place kicker **Joe Phillips**, the most accurate kicker in the MWC last year (20-22, 91%), has made his last 12 field goal attempts, dating back to last season.

> **Phillips** is 3-of-3 in field goals this year with a long of 44 yards.

> **Phillips** has made 23-of-25 (92%) field goals in two years as Utah's place kicker.

> **Phillips** is 6-of-7 from 40-yards and out for his career and 1-of-1 this season.

> **Phillips** went 8-of-8 in PATs against New Mexico, which tied the second-best single-game total in school history and is the most by a Ute since Louie Sakoda kicked nine against San Diego State in 2008.

> **Phillips** is 16-of-16 in PATs this year and 54-of-55 in his career.

> **Phillips** kicked the game-winning field goal against Pittsburgh, a 21-yarder in overtime.

> Sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood** ranks third in the MWC in punt average (47.4). He has three 50-plus yard punts (his season best is 60 yards).

> **Sellwood** has seen three of his punts downed inside the 20—two against UNM.

> Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** has punted three times, placing one on the 9-yard line.

> Utah has 21 total kickoffs (average 66.3) with six touchbacks.

> **Marsh** has handled 20 of Utah's 21 kickoffs with six touchbacks. He is averaging 66.1 yards per kickoff.

> **Phillips** has one kickoff for an average of 70.0 yards and no touchbacks.

> **Shaky Smithson** leads the MWC and ranks fourth nationally in punt return average (26.6).

> **Smithson**, the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week two weeks running, ranks first nationally in punt return yards with 266. His 10 total punt returns is tied for the national lead.

> **Smithson** is the only player in the country with over 200 yards in punt returns this season.

> **Smithson** returned punts for touchdowns in back-to-back weeks against UNLV and New Mexico. He had a 77-yard punt return against UNLV (the seventh-longest punt return in school history) and a 73-yard punt return against New Mexico.

> **Smithson** has moved into a tie for second in the school single-season record books with two punt returns for touchdowns (also accomplished by Steve Odom, 1972 and 1973; Erroll Tucker, 1985). Steve Smith (3, 1999) holds the school record.

> **Smithson** has two of the top three punt return yardage games in the country this season. His 140 punt return yards against New Mexico is the second-best and his 128 punt return yards against UNLV is third-best.

> **Smithson** has two of the top five punt return yardage games in school history. His 140 yards against New Mexico ranks third, while his 128 return yards against UNLV is fifth.

> In addition to his MWC awards, **Smithson** has been honored as the National Punt Returner of the Week for the last two weeks by the College Football Performance Awards.

> **Smithson** also leads the Utes in kickoff returns with three for 105 yards (35.0 average). He had two returns for 83 yards against New Mexico for 223 total return yards in the game (140 in punt returns).

> **Smithson** leads Utah and ranks 36th in the nation in all-purpose yards per game (143.3). Of his 430 all-purpose yards, 371 have come on punt and kick return yards.

## HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

“We did a lot of positive things in our win over New Mexico. We were productive on offense and Terrance Cain was particularly effective throwing the ball. Our defense was able to control the game, allowing the Lobos just one offensive touchdown. Our special teams performed well across the board and for the second week in a row Shaky Smithson came up big in the return game.

“We have taken a step forward each week so far, but there is still work to be done. Our biggest issue right now is ball security. We put the ball on the ground four times against New Mexico and that cannot continue.

“San Jose is our next test and we are looking forward to another opportunity to play in front of our home crowd at Rice-Eccles.”

## BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

## WINNING WAYS

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

## BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 20 wins against BCS opponents and are 20-11 overall. Here are the leaders: Utah (20), Navy (19), TCU (19), BYU (16) and Fresno State (15). Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games with wins over Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

## PAC-ING UP

The 2010 season will be Utah's last in the Mountain West Conference. On June 17, 2010, the Utes accepted an invitation to join the Pacific-10 Conference and will begin Pac-10 play in 2011. The Utes became one of eight original members of the MWC in 1999, winning conference titles in 1999 (tie), 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Pac-10 will mark the sixth conference in Utah's history. Utah competed in the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98) and MWC (1999-2010).
