QUICKLY

> No. 20 Utah (1-0, 0-0 MWC) hosts UNLV (0-1, 0-0 MWC) in the Mountain West Conference opener for both teams on Saturday, Sept. 11 at 2 p.m. in Rice-Eccles Stadium. The game will be televised live on the Mtn. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com).

> Utah's home win streak now stands at 18 games after a 27-24 overtime victory over Pitt last Thursday. It is the second-longest home win streak in school history. The school record of 26 was set from 1928-34. Utah's current home win streak dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA.

> Utah's 18-game home win streak is the third-longest active home win streak in the nation behind Oklahoma (31) and Boise State (26).

> Utah is ranked No. 20 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marks Utah's first appearance in the A.P. poll this season. Utah was ranked No. 24 in the first coaches' poll.

> UNLV was also Utah's first conference opponent (and second opponent of the season) in 2008. The Utes won that game, 42-21, in Salt Lake City on Sept. 6.

> Utah leads the series with UNLV 13-2, including a 7-0 advantage in Salt Lake City. See box on page 2 for more series information.

> Utah's win over Pittsburgh was its 20th over a BCS school since the Bowl Championship Series began in 1998. In its final year in a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS teams than any other NAQ program and is 20-11 overall against the BCS since 1998. (For more, see BCS Success later in this release).

> Ute receiver **DeVonte Christopher** and safety **Brian Blechen** were named the MWC offensive and defensive player of the week, respectively. Christopher led Utah with a career-high 155 receiving yards, while Blechen, playing in his first collegiate game, had five tackles and an interception in overtime.

DID YOU KNOW?

Saturday's game marks the third time in four years that the Utes will play the Rebels coming off big wins against BCS teams. In 2007, the Utes beat No. 11 UCLA, only to lose to UNLV the next week. In 2008, Utah followed up a win at Michigan with a victory over UNLV. This Saturday, the Utes host UNLV coming off a win over No. 15 Pittsburgh.

LAST WEEK

True freshman safety **Brian Blechen** intercepted a Pitt pass in overtime and **Joe Phillips** made a 21-yard field goal to give Utah a 27-24 win over the 15th-ranked Panthers. The third-largest crowd in Utah history (45,730) watched the 24th-ranked Utes take a 24-13 lead midway through the fourth quarter when **Jordan Wynn** and **DeVonte Christopher** hooked up for a 61-yard touchdown pass. But Pitt scored 11 unanswered points to send the game into overtime. Utah finished with 405 yards to Pitt's 266, and the Ute defense held Heisman candidate **Dion Lewis** to 75 yards rushing. Wynn passed for 283 yards and three touchdowns, and Christopher had a career night with eight receptions for 155 yards. In his first start, **Chaz Walker** led the defense with a career-high 11 tackles.

Last Year ...

A busy night by the defense, which scored a touchdown and advanced to the UNLV 8-yard line after creating another turnover, fueled a 35-15 Utah victory. Robert Johnson led the way with two tackles for loss, an interception and a touchdown. His touchdown came after Christian Cox intercepted a pass and then fumbled. Johnson grabbed the loose ball and raced 64 yards to pay dirt. In his first career start, cornerback Lamar Chapman led all Ute tacklers with eight stops and also made a pass breakup in the end zone. The Utes spent a lot of time in the Rebel backfield—recording a season-high 13 tackles for loss and three sacks. Eddie Wide led the offense with 111 net rushing yards.

KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year, averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons, and his 49-17 overall mark includes an 11-4 advantage over BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 16-year tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (134-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

J.D. Williams, who coached Utah's corners last year, is now the assistant head coach, pass defense coordinator and defensive backs coach at UNLV ... At the start of the week, a limited number of tickets still remained for Saturday's MWC opener against UNLV ... The 45,730 fans in attendance at last week's game made up the third-biggest crowd ever to watch a football game in Rice-Eccles Stadium. It marked the 19th time since Rice-Eccles Stadium opened in 1998 that the crowd has exceeded the seating capacity of 45,017 ... A pre-game tribute will be made to victims of 9/11, with fire, police and military personnel on hand for a moment of silence and a release of red, white and blue balloons in Rice-Eccles Stadium.

INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Quarterback **Jordan Wynn** is day-to-day with a sprained thumb, while linebacker **J.J. Williams** is questionable (foot) and running back **Sausan Shakerin** (concussion) is out ... Utah has three Las Vegas natives on scholarship: running back **Eddie Wide**, receiver **DeVonte Chris-**

topher and offensive lineman **Jeremiah Tofaeono**. Wide (2006) and Christopher (2007) were both Nevada Gatorade Players of the Year, while Tofaeono was first-team all-state as an offensive and defensive lineman ... Converted quarterbacks made big contributions at their new positions in last week's win over No. 15 Pitt. **Christopher**, now a receiver, had a career-high eight receptions for 155 yards; linebacker **Chad Manis** had four tackles and a pass breakup in his first start; and true freshman starting safety **Brian Blechen** made five tackles and an interception in overtime ... Five true freshmen played in Utah's season opener: **Blechen**, **Wykie Freeman**, **Mike Honeycutt**, **Joe Kruger** and **Westlee Tonga** ... Utah played two brother combinations in the first game: running backs **Matt** and **Shawn Asiata**, and defensive linemen **Dave** and **Joe Kruger**.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 606-420-31. The Utes are 372-173-16 at home (54-16 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 216-233-13 in road games and 18-14-2 in games played at neutral sites.

UTAH VS. MWC TEAMS

The Utes are 235-134-10 all-time against Mountain West Conference schools. The breakdown follows: Air Force 12-14, Brigham Young 53-34-4, Colorado State 54-22-2, New Mexico 32-17-2, San Diego State 16-12-1, TCU 5-2, UNLV 13-2, Wyoming 50-31-1.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > Sophomore **Jordan Wynn** is 1-0 as the starter this season and 4-2 for his career.
- > **Wynn** connected on 21-of-36 passes (.583) for 283 yards and a career-tying three touchdowns in a season-opening win against Pittsburgh.
- > **Wynn's** 283-yard game against Pitt marked his fourth career 200-yard passing game.
- > After week one, **Wynn** is tied for 14th in the NCAA in passing yards per game (283.0), tied for 20th in total offense (293.0) and ranks 46th in pass efficiency (146.3).
- > **Wynn** ranks third in the MWC in passing and total offense, and fifth in pass efficiency.
- > With **Wynn** as the starting quarterback, Utah is 25-for-26 in the red zone. Utah scored points on 23 consecutive red zone trips to start his career, including the first two opportunities this season.
- > **Wynn's** career-best game came against Cal in the 2009 Poinsettia Bowl. He threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns to earn offensive MVP honors.
- > Senior backup **Terrance Cain** did not play against Pittsburgh.
- > **Cain** was 7-1 as Utah's starter through the first eight games last season before relinquishing the job to Wynn. He played in all 12 regular season games in 2009.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > Co-starting senior running backs **Matt Asiata** and **Eddie Wide** (first-team all-conference in 2009 and a preseason all-league pick) combined for 112 yards on 25 carries (4.5 yard average) against Pittsburgh in the opener.
- > **Asiata** had a team-high 16 carries for 65 yards (4.1 average), while **Wide** rushed nine times for 47 yards (5.2 average). Wide also had four receptions for 24 yards.
- > **Asiata** played in his first game since surgery for a knee injury in game four of 2009. Before being forced to the sideline, Asiata was averaging a league-leading 101.3 yards per game.
- > **Asiata's** career-high of 156 yards came against Utah State (2009).
- > **Wide** has seven career 100-yard games—with a best of 145 yards vs. New Mexico—all coming last season.
- > Sophomore **Sausan Shakerin** (concussion) will not play. He also missed the Pitt game.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- > Senior all-conference candidate **Jereme Brooks**, Utah's sole returning starter, has played in 39 of 40 games since his freshman year.
- > After one game, **Brooks** is tied for eighth in the MWC in receptions (5) and fourth in receiving yards (87).
- > **Brooks**, who caught two touchdown passes against Pitt, is tied for first in the MWC and 22nd in the NCAA in scoring (12.0 average).
- > **Brooks** has 12 career TD catches and 17 total career touchdowns (includes five rushing) in his career. His seven touchdown receptions last season led Utah and tied for third in the MWC.
- > **Brooks** has two 100-yard games (both last season), including a career-best 135 yards vs. New Mexico.
- > Sophomore **DeVonte Christopher** was Utah's top receiver against Pittsburgh with career highs of eight catches and 155 yards. He also scored his first career TD on a 61-yard pass from Jordan Wynn.
- > **Christopher**, a former quarterback, had two receptions for 38 yards as a redshirt freshman last year.

- > Through week one, **Christopher** is tied for first in the MWC in receptions (8), second in receiving yards (155) and fourth in all-purpose yards (155).
- > **Christopher** is tied for sixth in the NCAA in receiving yards and tied for 13th in receptions.
- > Starting alongside Brooks were sophomore **Luke Matthews** (1 catch for 4 yards) and first-time starter **Shaky Smithson** (1 catch for 3 yards).
- > **Dexter Ransom, Griff McNabb, Reggie Dunn** and **Fatu Moala** saw their first playing time as Utes last week.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- > The Utes did not give up a single sack to Pitt, which was the nation's leader in sacks a year ago (3.62 sacks per game).
- > Preseason all-conference center **Zane Taylor** was Utah's play leader (70) vs. Pitt. He won 62 of those plays for a team-high 89% grade. Taylor also had a pancake block.
- > Preseason all-conference guard **Caleb Schlauderaff** got off to a good start, winning 61 of his 69 total plays for an 88% grade. He led Utah with two pancake blocks and also had a cut.
- > Right tackle **Tony Bergstrom** recorded an 86% grade in 69 plays against Pitt.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

> Utah's experienced and deep defensive line was instrumental in holding Pittsburgh Heisman candidate Dion Lewis to 75 rushing yards (his career low).

> Sophomore nose tackle **Dave Kruger** and senior end **Christian Cox**, were Utah's top tacklers on the line against Pitt with six apiece.

> **Kruger, Cox** and tackle **Sealver Siliga**, who all started a year ago, were joined by first-time starter **Junior Tui'one** at end. Tui'one had a career-high five tackles and a 9-yard sack vs. Pitt.

> Playing in his first NCAA game, redshirt freshman **Latu Heimuli** recorded a 7-yard sack and three total tackles.

> Nine linemen rotated in against Pitt: **Dave Kruger, Cox, Siliga, Tui'one, Heimuli, Joe Kruger, Derrick Shelby, James Aiono, Neli A'Asa** and **Star Lotulelei**.

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

> Utah played a first-time starter at all three linebacker positions against Pittsburgh: Juniors **Chaz Walker** (mac) and **Matt Martinez** (rover), and senior **Chad Manis** (stud). All three played in reserve roles at linebacker a year ago, with most of their playing time coming on the special teams.

> **Walker** was the game's leading tackler with a career-high 11 stops against Pitt. He also had a pass breakup.

> **Walker's** 11 tackles was tied for the fourth-best total by a MWC player on opening weekend.

> **Martinez** had six tackles, while **Manis** tallied four tackles and a pass breakup.

> Junior **J.J. Williams**, who was scheduled to start at rover prior to a foot injury in camp, remains questionable this week. On this week's depth chart, Williams is listed as an "or" at both middle linebacker (with **Walker**) and rover (**Martinez**).

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

> All-America candidate and preseason all-MWC corner **Brandon Burton** led Utah with two pass breakups against Pittsburgh. He led Utah and tied for second in the league in pass breakups last season with 10.

> **Burton** also had five tackles against Pitt.

> Senior corner **Lamar Chapman** led the defensive backs and was second on the team with seven tackles vs. Pitt. Listed as the co-starter at corner a week ago, the job is all Chapman's this week.

> True freshman safety **Brian Blechen** made a splash in his first career game. Blechen, Utah's only true freshman starter in the opener, made an interception on the first play of overtime.

> **Blechen**, also had five tackles in the game.

> **Blechen** signed with Utah as a quarterback, although he also played safety, linebacker and punter at Moorpark High School (Calif.).

> In his second career start—and his first start at free safety, senior **Justin Taplin-Ross** had five tackles against Pitt.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

> Senior placekicker **Joe Phillips** kicked his first game-winning field goal against Pittsburgh, a 21-yarder in overtime. He was 2-of-2 in field goals for the game (also making a 26-yard field goal) and 3-of-3 in PATs.

> **Phillips** has made 11 consecutive field goals dating back to last year. The 2009 honorable mention all-conference pick has 22 career field goals.

> Sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood**, an honorable mention all-MWC pick last season, averaged 41.7 yards per punt on three punts (long of 51 yards) vs. Pitt. He placed one punt inside the 20-yard line.

> In his first action, redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** averaged 63.2 yards on five kickoffs against Pitt. He had one touchback.

> **Marsh** recovered a fumble on a second quarter kickoff that would lead to a Utah touchdown.

> **Jereme Brooks** had the most success in the return game against Pittsburgh with three kick returns for 63 yards. Also lining up for kick returns was **Shaky Smithson, Reggie Dunn and DeVonte Christopher**.

> **Smithson** and **Griff McNabb** each fielded punt returns vs. Pitt for a total of minus two yards.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

“The atmosphere at Rice-Eccles Stadium on Thursday night was unbelievable, and with the home crowd behind us, we were able to start the season off with a victory over the 15th-ranked Pitt Panthers. It was great to get the win, but we obviously have a lot of corrections to make and many things to work on this week in practice.

“Our team played with great effort and emotion, which really was the difference in the game. Offensively, we were able to move the ball but need to do a better job finishing drives and possessing the football. The defense played well and we were especially pleased with the way we were able to defend the running game.

“We are at home again this weekend as we open conference play against UNLV. Our players and coaches are looking forward to another electric atmosphere in our stadium that provides our team with a huge home field advantage.”

BOWL ROLL

Utah’s nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah’s wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

WINNING WAYS

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah’s five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 20 wins against BCS opponents and are 20-11 overall. Here are the leaders: Utah (20), Navy (18, play Maryland Sept. 6), TCU (18), BYU (16) and Fresno State (15). Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games with wins over Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

SALT LAKE CITY—True freshman safety Brian Blechen intercepted a Pitt pass in overtime and Joe Phillips made a 21-yard field goal to give Utah a 27-24 win over the 15th-ranked Panthers. The third-largest crowd in Utah history (45,730) watched the 24th-ranked Utes take a 24-13 lead midway through the fourth quarter when Jordan Wynn and DeVonte Christopher hooked up for a 61-yard touchdown pass. But Pitt scored 11 unanswered points to send the game into overtime. Utah finished with 405 yards to Pitt's 266, and the Ute defense held Heisman candidate Dion Lewis to 75 yards rushing. Wynn passed for 283 yards and three touchdowns, and Christopher had a career night with eight receptions for 155 yards. In his first start, Chaz Walker led the defense with a career-high 11 tackles.
