QUICKLY

> No. 14/14 Utah (2-0, 1-0 MWC) makes its first road trip of the season, playing at New Mexico (0-2, 0-0 MWC) in Albuquerque on Saturday, Sept. 18. Kickoff is at 6 p.m. MT in University Stadium. The game will be televised live on The Mtn. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com).

> Utah jumped six spots to No. 14 in both the Associated Press and *USA Today* Coaches' polls. It is Utah's highest ranking since Nov. 8, 2009, when the Utes were No. 14 in the coaches' poll (No. 16 A.P.) prior to a loss to TCU. Utah finished last season ranked 18th in both polls.

> Utah's **Kyle Whittingham** earned his 50th win as a head coach last week over UNLV. Whittingham's 50-17 overall record includes a win as the co-head coach of the Fiesta Bowl in January of 2005. (The NCAA recognizes that game as a win for both Whittingham and former Ute coach Urban Meyer).

> Utah's starting quarterback against New Mexico is to be determined, dependent on the status of sophomore **Jordan Wynn** (thumb injury to his throwing hand). Wynn led Utah to an overtime win over Pitt in the first game, while senior **Terrance Cain** earned the victory against UNLV last week.

> Last year's 45-14 win over New Mexico came on the first start of **Wynn's** career. In the best starting debut ever by a Ute true freshman quarterback, Wynn passed for 297 yards and two touchdowns.

> Also in last year's win, **Eddie Wide** set the school record for consecutive 100-yard games. Wide's career-best 145-yard game against the Lobos was his sixth-consecutive triple-digit rushing game.

> Utah leads the series 32-17-2 with UNM, but has only a 13-12-1 edge in Albuquerque. Utah has held the upper hand in the last three contests, including two of the last three in Albuquerque. Utah is 3-2 against New Mexico when the Utes are nationally ranked. A ranked Utah team lost to New Mexico in 1994 and 2003, but has avoided an upset the last three times (in 2004, 2008 and 2009). HOME ALONE

After wins over then No. 15 Pitt and UNLV, Utah's home win streak now stands at 19 games—the longest home win streak in MWC history and the second-longest in school history. The school record of 26 was from 1928-34. Utah's current home win streak dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA. Utah's 19-game home win streak is the third-longest active home win streak in the nation behind Oklahoma (32) and Boise State (26).

LAST WEEK

Terrance Cain passed for 207 yards and two touchdowns in place of injured starter Jordan Wynn and Utah beat UNLV 38-10. Cain completed 13-of-20 passes and was not intercepted or sacked. **Shaky Smithson** provided the sizzle for an over-capacity crowd (45,102) in Rice-Eccles Stadium. Smithson returned a punt 77 yards for a touchdown and also caught a 55-yard touchdown pass. **Eddie Wide** rushed for 77 yards and two touchdowns and **Jereme Brooks** had four receptions for 77 yards and a score. **Chaz Walker** led the defense with a career-high 16 tackles, while **Matt Martinez** also had a career day with 12 stops. **Brian Blechen** made two pass breakups to go with seven tackles.

Last Year ...

Jordan Wynn made the best starting debut ever by a Utah true freshman quarterback, passing for 297 yards and two touchdowns, and Utah erupted in the second half to crush New Mexico 45-14. Eddie Wide spearheaded the second-half shelling by rushing for 122 of his career-high 145 yards in the last two quarters to become the first player in school history to rush for 100 yards in six consecutive games. Freshman RB Sausan Shakerin turned in the first 100-yard game of his career and Jereme Brooks registered a career-high 135 receiving yards. After allowing a first-quarter touchdown, Utah's first-string defense did not allow another score. (The Lobos pinned a touchdown on the Ute backup defenders with 0:17 remaining). Mike Wright had a team-high seven tackles and Brandon Burton and Ryan Lacy grabbed their first career interceptions.

KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year, averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons, and his 50-17 overall mark includes an 11-4 advantage over BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 17-year tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (135-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

This week's game is Utah's only road game in September. Next month, the schedule flip-flops, with only one home game scheduled ... Ahead for Utah is Homecoming on Sept. 25 against San Jose State ... The Utes are averaging 45,416 fans in two games in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which seats 45,017.

INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Shaky Smithson was named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week after returning five punts for 128 yards (25.6 average) and a 77-yard touchdown in Utah's win over UNLV. Smithson's 77-yard punt return against the Rebels was the seventh-longest punt return in school history and Utah's first punt return for a touchdown since 2007 ... Preseason all-conference center **Zane Taylor** (knee) is doubtful for the UNM game, while quarterback **Jordan Wynn** (thumb) is day-to-day and punter **Sean Sellwood** (ankle) is probable ... **Neli A'asa**, who as a defensive tackle is a key contributor on the defensive line, has also played tight end in both games—his primary position back in 2008 ... **James Aiono** has moved

into the three-deep at right end ... Six true freshmen have played this season: **Brian Blechen**, **Wykie Freeman**, **Mike Honeycutt**, **Joe Kruger**, **Westlee Tonga** and **Michael Walker** ... Making his NCAA debut against UNLV was sophomore JC transfer OL **Ron Tongaonevai**.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 607-420-31. The Utes are 373-173-16 at home (55-16 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 216-233-13 in road games and 18-14-2 in games played at neutral sites.

UTAH VS. MWC TEAMS

The Utes are 236-134-10 all-time against Mountain West Conference schools. The breakdown follows: Air Force 12-14, Brigham Young 53-34-4, Colorado State 54-22-2, New Mexico 32-17-2, San Diego State 16-12-1, TCU 5-2, UNLV 14-2, Wyoming 50-31-1.

- > **Wynn** connected on 21-of-36 passes for 283 yards against Pittsburgh. It was his fourth career 200-yard game. His three touchdown passes tied a career high.
- > With **Wynn** as the starting quarterback, Utah is 25-for-26 in the red zone. Utah scored points on 23 consecutive red zone trips to start his career, including the first two opportunities this season.
- > **Wynn's** career-best game came against Cal in the 2009 Poinsettia Bowl. He threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns to earn offensive MVP honors.
- > Senior **Terrance Cain** started in place of Wynn against UNLV and improved to 8-1 as the starter (1-0 this year). Cain has played in 13 games in his two years at Utah.
- > **Cain** passed for 207 yards and two touchdowns, completing 13-of-20 passes, against UNLV. It was his fifth 200-yard game.
- > **Cain's** career-best passing game was 286 yards in the 2009 season opener against Utah State.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

- > Co-starting seniors **Matt Asiata** and **Eddie Wide** have split carries down the middle—each rushing 24 times.
- > **Wide**, first-team all-conference a year ago and the preseason pick for 2010, is averaging 62.0 yards per game and 5.2 yards per carry. He has two touchdowns.
- > **Wide** has seven career 100-yard games, all coming in 2009. His career best is 145 yards vs. New Mexico.
- > **Wide's** best rushing game this season came against UNLV last week, when he rushed 15 times for 77 yards (5.1 average).
- > **Wide** also has six receptions—third on the team—for 32 yards.
- > **Asiata** is averaging 52.0 yards per game and 4.3 yards per carry.
- > **Asiata** has two 100-yard games in his career, with a personal best 156 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.
- > **Asiata's** best game this season was 16 carries for 65 yards against Pittsburgh.
- > **Asiata** has two receptions for 19 yards.
- > Junior **Tauni Vakapuna** got first career carries against UNLV, rushing twice for six yards.
- > Junior fullback **Shawn Asiata** has played in both games. He has not carried the ball but has one catch for five yards.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

- > Senior **Jereme Brooks**, an all-conference candidate and Utah's leading receiver, has nine catches for 164 yards and three touchdowns (all team highs).
- > **Brooks** is tied for sixth in the MWC in receptions (4.5 per game), ranks fourth in receiving yards (82.0 per game) and is tied for third in scoring (9.0 points per game).
- > **Brooks** ranks 42nd in the nation in receiving yards (82.0) per game.
- > **Brooks** ranks sixth in the MWC in all-purpose yards (113.5 per game). His totals include 63 yards on three kickoff returns.
- > For his career, **Brooks** has 13 touchdown catches and 18 total touchdowns (five rushing).
- > **Brooks** has two 100-yard games in his career (both last season) with a high of 135 yards vs. New Mexico.
- > Junior **DeVonte Christopher** ranks fifth in the MWC in receiving yards (81.5 per game) and is tied for sixth in receptions (4.5 per game).
- > **Christopher** is tied for 43rd in the NCAA in receiving yards (81.5 per game).

> Utah did not allowed a sack in its first two games.

> Preseason all-conference guard **Caleb Schlauderaff** has won 101 of 112 plays for a team-best 90% grade.

> **Schlauderaff** leads Utah in pancake blocks (4) and is tied for the team lead in cuts (2).

DEFENSIVE DATA

Opponents have scored a touchdown on just 1-of-7 trips inside the red zone for a 14% touchdown rate. They have made four field goals inside the red zone to put Utah's red zone defense at 71.4%, third in the MWC ... The Utes are second in the MWC and 28th nationally in rushing defense (92.0), and third in the MWC in scoring defense (17.0) and total defense (292.5).

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- > Utah boasts perhaps the deepest defensive line in the conference and maybe the country.
- > Starters **Dave Kruger**, **Christian Cox**, **Sealver Siliga** and **Junior Tui'one** have been able to stay fresh due to regular substitutions by **Latu Heimuli**, **Joe Kruger**, **Derrick Shelby**, **James Aiono**, **Neli A'Asa**, **Star Lotulelei** and **Trevor Reilly**.
- > Senior end **Cox** is Utah's leader on the line in tackles with 12 stops. He has one tackle for loss.
- > Tackle **Dave Kruger's** eight total tackles include a half tackle for loss.
- > Linemen with sacks through the first two games are **Tui'one** and **Heimuli**—each with one—and **A'asa** with a half sack.

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

- > Junior linebacker **Chaz Walker's** 27 tackles is tied for first in the nation, while his tackle-per-game average of 13.5 leads the MWC and is tied for fifth nationally.
- > **Walker** posted a career-high 16 tackles vs. UNLV. It was the most tackles by a Ute since Steve Tate recorded 17 against Boise State in 2006.
- > **Walker's** 16 tackles against UNLV is tied for the fourth-best single-game total in the nation this season.
- > Junior rover **Matt Martinez**, who ranks second on the team and eighth in the MWC in tackles with 18 (one TFL), made a career-high 12 tackles against UNLV.
- > Stud linebacker **Chad Manis** also had a career day against UNLV with seven tackles. He has 11 tackles on the this season, plus a pass breakup.
- > **Boo Andersen** also saw time at linebacker vs. UNLV, making three tackles (one TFL), and keeping UNLV out of the end zone on fourth and goal from the 1-yard line on the game's last play.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

- > Utah has caused a fumble on a kickoff in both of its games this year. Both plays led to scores.
- > Utah ranks seventh nationally and first in the MWC in punt return average (21.0).
- > Senior place kicker **Joe Phillips**, the most accurate kicker in the MWC last year (20-22, 91%), has extended his string of consecutive made field goals to 12 by making all three attempts this season.
- > **Phillips** is 23-of-25 (92%) in two years as Utah's place kicker and 3-of-3 this year.
- > **Phillips** is 6-of-7 from 40-yards and out.
- > **Phillips** is also 8-of-8 in PATs this year and 46-of-47 in his career.

his third career punt of 60 yards or longer. He left the game in the second half with a left ankle injury, but should play this week.

> Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** has handled all 12 kickoffs for Utah with three touchbacks. He is averaging 66.4 yards per kickoff.

> **Marsh** made his first career appearance at punter against UNLV, downing one of his three punts on the 9-yard line.

> **Shaky Smithson**, the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week (Sept. 13), had a career game against UNLV with five punt returns for 128 yards (25.6 average) and a 77-yard touchdown.

> In addition to his MWC award, **Smithson** was named as the National Punt Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards.

> **Smithson's** 128 yards in punt returns against UNLV ranks fourth in school history.

> **Smithson's** 77-yard punt return against the Rebels was the seventh-longest punt return in school history and Utah's first punt return for a touchdown since 2007 (Derrick Richards, 75 yards vs. Utah State).

> **Smithson** leads the MWC and ranks eighth nationally in punt return average (21.0). He has six returns for 126 yards.

> **Jereme Brooks** leads the Utes in kickoff returns (3 returns, 21.0 average).

> Others who have lined up deep are **Smithson** (1, 22 yards), **Griff McNabb** (1, 12 yards), **Reggie Dunn** and **DeVonte Christopher**.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"It's always important to start off on a positive note in conference play and getting a win against UNLV accomplished just that. Although we still have many deficiencies that need to be addressed, we feel good about the progress we made between games one and two. Terrance Cain played the way we expected him to and the offense didn't miss a beat with him at the controls. We find ourselves in the same situation at quarterback this week as Jordan will be day-to-day with his thumb injury. Defensively we played very well, only giving up one field goal the entire game. A tremendous special teams effort was overshadowed by another blocked punt, our second in as many games. The MUSS and another capacity crowd at Rice-Eccles was once again a huge advantage for our team.

"This week we are on the road for our game against New Mexico. The Lobos have had a couple of tough games, but we are fully aware of the talent and athletic ability they have on their squad. In addition, Albuquerque has proven to be a tough place for us to play in years past."

BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

WINNING WAYS

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 20 wins against BCS opponents and are 20-11 overall. Here are the leaders: Utah (20), Navy (18), TCU (18), BYU (16) and Fresno State (15). Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games with wins over Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl.

PAC-ING UP

The 2010 season will be Utah's last in the Mountain West Conference. On June 17, 2010, the Utes accepted an invitation to join the Pacific-10 Conference and will begin Pac-10 play in 2011. The Utes became one of eight original members of the MWC in 1999, winning conference titles in 1999 (tie), 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Pac-10 will mark the sixth conference in Utah's history. Utah competed in the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98) and MWC (1999-2010).
