QUICKLY

> No. 10/10 Utah (4-0, 2-0 MWC) comes off a bye week to play Iowa State (3-2, 1-1 Big 12) in Ames, Iowa, on Saturday, Oct. 9. Game time is 6 p.m. CT (5 p.m. MT). The game will be televised by Fox College Sports, which is available locally on Comcast's Sports Entertainment Package (channels 262, 263 or 264) and DIRECTV's Sports Pack (channels 617 or 623). Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com).

> Iowa State is 3-0 at home this season, with wins over Northern Illinois, Northern Iowa and Texas Tech. Utah is 1-0 on the road, with a win at New Mexico.

> The Utes jumped to No. 10 in both polls in the latest rankings, moving up three places in the Associated Press poll and two spots in the USA Today Coaches' poll. It marks Utah's highest ranking in two seasons. Utah, which finished the 2008 season ranked No. 2 in the nation, did not crack the top 10 until Oct. 26 that year.

> Utah is winless against the Cyclones in four previous meetings, all played in the 1970s. For more on the series, see the box on page 2 of this release.

> Utah coach Kyle Whittingham's teams are 5-0 coming off regular season bye weeks, with victories over Wyoming (2005, 2007), Colorado State (2006, 2009) and New Mexico (2008).

> Counting bowl games and season openers, Whittingham is 15-2 when he has had extra preparation time. Whittingham is 4-2 in season openers, 5-0 coming off byes and 6-0 in bowl games (his bowl record includes a victory as the co-head coach of the 2005 Fiesta Bowl team).

> Utah is ranked in the top 10 in the nation in both scoring offense (44.2 ppg, tied for No. 6) and scoring defense (12.8 ppg, No. 7). The Utes are also ranked No. 7 in total defense (246.8 yards per game), No. 7 in pass efficiency offense (172.8) and No. 11 in rushing defense (86.8 ypg). A 9.90 ROUTINE

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 20 wins against BCS opponents and are 20-11 overall. Sixth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is 11-4 against BCS schools. Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games—and is the only NAQ team with two wins against BCS teams in BCS bowl games (Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl).

BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

PAC-ING UP

The 2010 season will be Utah's last in the Mountain West Conference. On June 17, 2010, the Utes accepted an invitation to join the Pacific-10 Conference and will begin Pac-10 play in 2011. The Utes became one of eight original members of the MWC in 1999, winning conference titles in 1999 (tie), 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Pac-10 will mark the sixth conference in Utah's history. Utah competed in the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98) and MWC (1999-2010).

THE STREAK

Utah's home win streak, now at 20 games, is the third-longest active win streak in the nation, the second-longest in school history and longest home win streak in MWC history. "The Streak" dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA and currently ranks behind only Oklahoma (33) and Boise State (27). The school record for consecutive home wins is 26, set from 1928-34.

LAST GAME

Jordan Wynn returned from a two-game injury absence to start at quarterback, but he and the rest of the first string gave way to backups in the second half of a 56-3 rout of San Jose State on Sept. 25. Wynn completed 14-of-18 passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns in one half of play. Utah scored on its very first offensive play when **Reggie Dunn** ran a reverse 43 yards for a touchdown. The Spartans responded immediately with a 71-yard kickoff return to Utah's 20-yard line, only to settle for a field goal. They would not score again on a Utah defense that held them to 1-of-12 on third down conversions and just seven first downs. Nearly everyone got into the act for Utah, which piled up 427 yards of total offense and got touchdowns from eight different players.

KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year (2008), averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons. He is 52-17 overall mark and 11-4 against BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 17-year tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (137-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Elliss (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

UTAH VS. THE BIG 12

The Utes are 28-48-3 all-time against the Big 12. In the past 20 years, Utah is 3-2 against the Big 12, with wins over Kansas in 1993 and 1996, a win over Texas A&M in 2004, and losses to Nebraska in 1992 and Texas A&M in 2003.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

Utah is 1-2 in the state of Iowa with the win over Iowa in 1978 and losses to Iowa State in 1972 and 1976 ... The Utes have pulled in standing room-only crowds in all three games this season in Rice-Eccles Stadium, where they are averaging 45,310 (season high of 45,730 for the Pitt game on Sept. 2). Attendance has now exceeded the 45,017 seating capacity 21 times since Rice-Eccles Stadium opened in 1998.

Still out are linebacker **J.J. Williams** (foot, missed Pitt, UNLV, UNM, SJS) and running back **Sausan Shakerin** (concussion, missed Pitt, UNLV, UNM, SJS) ... Utes have collected garnered five MWC Player of the Week citations so far this season: **DeVonte Christopher** (offense, Sept. 6), **Brian Blechen** (defense, Sept. 6); **Shaky Smithson** (special teams, Sept. 13 and 20) and **Lamar Chapman** (defense, Sept. 20) ... Six true freshmen have played for the Utes: **Brian Blechen, Wykie Freeman, Mike Honeycutt, Joe Kruger, Westlee Tonga** and **Michael Walker**.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

OFFENSIVE ELLIPSES

Utah is outscoring its foes 70-7 in the second quarter ... Utah has allowed just one sack--which is tied for first in the nation--and its first-string offensive line has not allowed any ... The Utes have scored on 15-of-17 (88%) trips into the red zone with 13 touchdowns (76%). For complete red zone stats, see sidebar on page 4 of this release ... Utah's best league and national rankings are in passing efficiency (No. 1/7, 172.8) and scoring (No. 1/6T, 44.2). For Utah's complete MWC and NCAA rankings, see sidebar on page 4 of this release ... Utah has 36 rushing and 36 passing first downs and 76 total first downs (includes four penalty) ... Utah is converting on 51% of its third-down conversions (25-of-49) and is 3-of-3 on fourth down conversions.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

> All three Ute quarterbacks have seen action this season in varying roles. Starting sophomore QB **Jordan Wynn** earned victories against Pittsburgh and San Jose State, while missing the UNLV and New Mexico games with a thumb injury. While Wynn was sidelined, senior **Terrance Cain** picked up wins against UNLV and New Mexico (he also played in the second half of Utah's blowout win over San Jose State). Redshirt freshman **Griff Robles** has a special package of plays and subbed in against UNM and San Jose State.

> **Wynn** has a 5-2 record as the starter and is 2-0 this year. He has played in a total of eight games in his career.

> **Wynn** has completed 64.8 percent of his passes (35-for-54) with five touchdowns and just one interception. His 154.98 pass efficiency rating would rank second in the MWC (behind teammate Cain) if he had played in enough games.

> **Wynn** is averaging 203.5 passing yards per game, which would

rank third in the conference if he met the minimum game requirement.

> **Wynn** threw for a season-high 283 yards against then-No.15 Pitt on Sept. 2. It was his fourth career 200-yard game. His career high is 338 yards (vs. Cal in 2009).

> With **Wynn** as the starter, Utah is 28-for-29 in the red zone.

> **Cain** is 2-0 as the starter this year and 9-1 in his career. He has played in 15 games in his two years at Utah.

> **Cain** leads the nation with a 192.5 pass efficiency rating, completing 75.5 percent of his passes (37-of-49), with five touchdowns and no interceptions.

> **Cain** ranks fourth in the MWC in passing yards per game (162.0) and averaged 227.5 ypg in the two games he started.

> **Cain** broke the school record for single-game completion percentage (86.95) by completing 20-of-23 passes against UNM. He connected on 20 of his last 21 throws.

> **Cain's** record completion percentage against the Lobos broke the mark held by his current position coach **Brian Johnson**. Johnson, now in his first year coaching the QBs, held the school mark with 18-of-21 passing (85.7%) vs. Utah State in 2005.

> **Cain** has passed for 200-plus yards in both games he started this season and six times in his career. His career best passing game was 286 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Griff Robles**, a redshirt freshman, has seen spot duty in the last two games and is Utah's third-leading rusher, gaining 98 yards on 10 carries (9.8 average).

> **Robles** led Utah in rushing in his NCAA debut against New Mexico with six carries for 64 yards (10.7 average). He had a long rush of 47 yards on his second play.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

> Co-starting seniors **Eddie Wide** and **Matt Asiata** are combining for nearly 100 yards per game, with a total of 84 rushes for 397 yards.

> **Wide** and **Asiata**, who account for 65% of the team's carries and 55% of its net yards, have very similar numbers. Wide has rushed 40 times for 210 yards (5.2 average, 52.5 ypg) and three touchdowns. Asiata has 44 carries for 187 yards (4.2 average, 46.8 ypg) and two scores.

> **Wide**, a 1,000-yard rusher and first-team all-conference running back last year—as well as the preseason all-MWC pick for 2010—has seven career 100-yard games. All of his 100-yard games were in 2009—when he netted 1,069 yards—including a career-best 145-yard game vs. New Mexico.

> **Wide's** best rushing game this season came against UNLV, when he rushed 15 times for 77 yards (5.1 average).

> **Wide** also has 11 receptions—third on the team—for 53 yards.

> **Asiata**, Utah's leading rusher in 2008 (707 yards) has two 100-yard games in his career, with a personal best 156 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Asiata's** best game this season was 16 carries for 65 yards against Pittsburgh.

> **Asiata** has nine receptions (fourth on the team) for 76 yards (third on the team).

> **Asiata's** younger brother **Shawn Asiata** is in his first year on the team. A junior fullback, Shawn Asiata has played in all four games with two receptions for 15 yards and a touchdown.

> Junior **Tauni Vakapuna** has 17 rushes for 74 yards (4.4 average) in four games. He also has a pair of touchdowns.

- > Senior **Jereme Brooks**, an all-conference candidate, leads Utah in receptions (20), receiving yards (307) and touchdowns (4).
- > **Brooks** is tied for the league lead in receptions per game (5.00) and ranks fourth in the MWC in receiving yards per game (76.8).
- > **Brooks** leads the MWC in receiving touchdowns with four.
- > **Brooks** had a season-high 99 yards vs. New Mexico, including a career-long catch of 75 yards that went for a touchdown. It is Utah's longest offensive play of the season.
- > In his career, **Brooks** has two 100-yard games, including a career-high 135 yards vs. New Mexico last year.
- > **Brooks** has 14 career touchdown catches (the eighth-best total in school history) and 19 total touchdowns (five rushing).

> **Walker**, Utah's tackle leader, is tied for fourth in the MWC and 21st in the nation in tackles per game (10.0).

> **Walker** has 40 total tackles and has led or tied for the team tackle lead in three of four games.

> **Walker's** career-high 16 tackles vs. UNLV is the most by a Ute in four seasons and is tied for the ninth-best single-game total in the nation this season.

> **Walker's** 4.5 TFL ranks second on the team.

> **Martinez** ranks second on the team and 11th in the MWC in tackles (31) and tackles per game (7.8). He has 2.5 TFL.

> **Martinez** had a career-high 12 tackles against UNLV.

Utah and Oregon are the only two teams this year that have scored three touchdowns on punt returns ... Utah's 313 yards of punt returns ranks third in the country and its 16 total punt returns is tied for seventh in the nation ... Returner **Shaky Smithson** has won two of four MWC Special Teams Player of the Week awards this year (Sept. 13 and 20).

KICKING NOTEBOOK

> Senior place kicker **Joe Phillips**, the most accurate kicker in the MWC last year (20-22, 91%), has made his last 12 field goal attempts, dating back to last season.

> **Phillips** is 3-of-3 in field goals this year with a long of 44 yards. He has not attempted a field goal in the last two games.

> **Phillips** has made 23-of-25 (92%) field goals in two years as Utah's place kicker.

> **Phillips** is 6-of-7 from 40-yards and out for his career and 1-of-1 this season.

> **Phillips** went 8-of-8 in PATs against both New Mexico and San Jose State to tie the second-best single-game total in school history.

> **Phillips** is 24-of-24 in PATs this year and 62-of-63 in his career.

> **Phillips** kicked the game-winning field goal against Pittsburgh, a 21-yarder in overtime.

> Sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood** leads the MWC in punt average (48.5). He would rank second in the country in the category, but he does not have enough punts to meet the minimum requirements.

> **Sellwood** has five 50-plus yard punts (his season best is 60 yards).

> **Sellwood** has seen five of his punts downed inside the 20—two each against UNM and SJSU.

> **Sellwood** also has one rush for 17 yards on a fake punt call.

> Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** has punted three times, placing one on the 9-yard line.

> Utah has 30 total kickoffs (average 66.6) with eight touchbacks.

> **Marsh** has handled 28 of Utah's 30 kickoffs with eight touchbacks. He is averaging 66.5 yards per kickoff.

> **Phillips** has two kickoffs for an average of 68.0 yards and no touchbacks.

RETURN GAME NOTEBOOK

> **Shaky Smithson** leads the MWC and ranks fifth nationally in punt return average (21.4).

> **Smithson's** 14 total punt returns is tied for fourth nationally and he ranks second nationally in punt return yards with 299.

> **Smithson** returned punts for touchdowns in back-to-back weeks against UNLV and New Mexico. He had a 77-yard punt return against UNLV (the seventh-longest punt return in school history) and a 73-yard punt return against New Mexico.

> **Smithson** was the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week twice this season (Sept. 13 and 20).

> **Smithson** was honored as the National Punt Returner of the Week on Sept. 13 and 20 by the College Football Performance Awards.

> **Smithson** also leads the Utes in kickoff returns with four for 131 yards (32.8 average).

> **Smithson** leads Utah and ranks fourth in the MWC in all-purpose yards per game (124.5). Of his 498 all-purpose yards, 430 have come on punt and kick return yards.
