QUICKLY

> No. 11/10 Utah (5-0, 2-0 MWC) returns to league play on Saturday, Oct. 16 against Wyoming (2-4, 0-2 MWC) in Laramie. Kickoff is 4 p.m. MT in War Memorial Stadium. The game will be televised by The Mtn. Radio is ESPN700 AM (espn700sports.com).

> Utah remained at No. 10 in the *USA Today* Coaches poll. Despite scoring the most points against an Iowa State team on its home field since the Cyclones began playing football 108 years ago, Utah slipped one place to No. 11 in the Associated Press poll.

> Utah is off to its third 5-0 start in the last seven years (the Utes finished 12-0 in 2004 and 13-0 in 2008).

> Utah would become bowl eligible with a win over Wyoming on Saturday. The Utes have played in seven straight bowl games, going 7-0 in postseason play since 2003.

> Utah has surpassed 50 points in its last three games and is averaging 49.0 points per game. The school record for single-season scoring average is 45.33 ppg set in 2004.

> Utah leads the nation in kickoff returns (31.17 average), sacks allowed (1, tied with Boise State) and tackles for loss allowed (11). Utah also ranks first nationally in sack yardage allowed (4) and TFL yardage allowed (33).

> With last week's win over Iowa State, Utah improved to 21-11 against BCS conference teams and its 21 wins is the most by a NAQ conference team since the BCS began in 1998. Kyle Whittingham is 12-4 against BCS teams and 2-0 this year.

> In the third-longest series in school history, Utah leads Wyoming 50-31-1. The Utes trail Wyoming 20-18 in Laramie, but have won four of the last five and six of the last nine games in Laramie, following nine straight losses in War Memorial Stadium from 1974-89. LAST WEEK

Shaky Smithson lit up Iowa State with 261 all-purpose yards, a touchdown reception and a touchdown pass to lead the No. 10 Utes to a 68-27 rout over the Cyclones in Ames. Smithson had a career-high 75 receiving yards and 186 return yards—among those a 78-yard punt return. **Jordan Wynn** passed for 325 yards and two touchdowns in directing Utah to its highest point total in 27 years. **Eddie Wide** rushed for 71 yards and two scores, **DeVonte Christopher** had 124 receiving yards and a TD, and **Reggie Dunn** became just the seventh Ute in history (the first since 1985) to return a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. Utah held the Cyclones to 0-11 on third downs behind **Chad Manis**' career-high nine tackles, interceptions by **Brandon Burton** and **Justin Taplin-Ross** and three pass breakups by **Conroy Black**.

KYLE STYLE

Now in his sixth year as Utah's head coach, **Kyle Whittingham** has been honored as the National Coach of the Year (2008), averaged over nine wins a season, is undefeated in bowl games, led Utah to its best season ever and engineered the biggest win in school history. He is just the second Utah coach—and the first in 100 years—to achieve a winning record in each of his first five seasons. He is 53-17 overall

UTAH-WYOMING SERIES

Series Snapshot ...

The third-longest series in Utah history is in its 83rd game. Wyoming is Utah's most frequent out-of-state opponent. Utah leads the series 50-31-1 and did not lose until the 24th game, posting 22 wins and a tie from 1904-48. Utah has won the last three games, and nine of the last 10, but trails the all-time series in Laramie 18-20.

Last Year ...

True freshman Jordan Wynn made his NCAA debut a memorable one, coming off the bench in the second half to lead Utah to a come-from-behind 22-10 victory over Wyoming in Salt Lake City. Wynn led four scoring drives in the second half (two field goals and two touchdowns) to bring Utah back from a 10-3 deficit. Eddie Wide tied the school record for consecutive 100-yard rushing games with his fifth straight century, running for a career-high 135 yards and a touchdown. Utah kept Wyoming off the scoreboard in the second half (allowing just 74 total yards after the break). Koa Misi led Utah with eight tackles and two sacks. R.J. Stanford had an interception and two pass breakups and Justin Taplin-Ross tallied a career-best six tackles in his first start.

mark and 12-4 against BCS schools. His 6-0 bowl record includes the 2005 Fiesta Bowl, when he and Urban Meyer served as co-head coaches. On the staff since 1994, when he coached the defensive line, Whittingham was the team's defensive coordinator from 1995 until his appointment as head coach in 2005. During his 17-year tenure, the Utes have won 70-percent of their games (138-58) and played in 11 bowl games (winning 10). Whittingham has coached four first-team All-Americans—Luther Ellis (1994), Eric Weddle (2006), Louie Sakoda (2008) and Zane Beadles (2009)—and has sent 34 players to the NFL.

OUTSIDE THE LINES

On Monday, Oct. 11, Under Armour Utah-specific fan gear for the Utah-TCU game will go on sale at local retailers, www.utahutes.com and www.underarmour.com. Featured apparel will coincide with the Wounded Warrior Project promotion for Utah's Nov. 6 game against TCU and includes the black camouflaged attire that Ute fans are encouraged to wear to the game. A portion of the proceeds will go to the Wounded Warrior Project. ... The Utes have pulled in standing room-only crowds to all three games this season in Rice-Eccles Stadium, where they are averaging 45,310 (season high of 45,730 for the Pitt game on Sept. 2). Attendance has now exceeded the 45,017 seating capacity 21 times since Rice-Eccles Stadium opened in 1998.

INSIDE THE HUDDLE

Jordan Wynn and **Shaky Smithson** were named the MWC Offensive and Special Teams Players of the Week for their roles in Utah's 68-27 victory over Iowa State. Wynn, in winning his first career MWC weekly award, passed for 325 yards and two touchdowns while orchestrating the biggest scoring output by a Utah team in 27 years. Smithson won his third award of the season and his career after rolling up 261 all-purpose yards, including 145 on punt returns and a career-high 75 receiving yards. He also threw a touchdown pass and caught a TD pass ... **J.J. Williams** (foot, missed Pitt, UNLV, UNM, SJS, ISU) is listed as doubtful for this week's game at Wyoming ... Running back **Sausan Shakerin**

saw action for the first time of the year last week after missing the first four games due to a concussion and rushed for 24 yards and a touchdown ... Making his first appearance as a Ute against Iowa State was junior defensive end **Tevita Finau**. Finau (6-5, 298), a transfer from Phoenix College who has two years to play two, enrolled in classes and joined the team on Sept. 24, the Friday prior to the San Jose State game. He is in the three deep this week at left end ... 14 Utes have scored touchdowns this season ... Utah has collected seven MWC Player of the Week citations to date: **DeVonte Christopher** (offense, Sept. 6), **Brian Blechen** (defense, Sept. 6); **Smithson** (special teams, Sept. 13, Sept. 20, Oct. 11), **Lamar Chapman** (defense, Sept. 20) and **Wynn** (offense, Oct. 11) ... Six true freshmen have played: **Blechen**, **Wykie Freeman**, **Mike Honeycutt**, **Joe Kruger**, **Westlee Tonga** and **Michael Walker**.

UTAH'S ALL-TIME RECORD

Utah's all-time football record is 610-420-31. The Utes are 374-173-16 at home (56-16 in Rice-Eccles Stadium, which opened in 1998), 218-233-13 in road games and 18-14-2 in games played at neutral sites.

UTAH VS. MWC TEAMS

The Utes are 237-134-10 all-time against Mountain West Conference schools. The breakdown follows: Air Force 12-14, Brigham Young 53-34-4, Colorado State 54-22-2, New Mexico 33-17-2, San Diego State 16-12-1, TCU 5-2, UNLV 14-2, Wyoming 50-31-1.

THE STREAK

Utah's home win streak, now at 20 games, is the third-longest active win streak in the nation, the second-longest in school history and longest home win streak in MWC history. "The Streak" dates back to a Sept. 15, 2007 victory over 11th-ranked UCLA and currently ranks behind only Oklahoma (33) and Boise State (28). The school record for consecutive home wins is 26, set from 1928-34.

OFFENSIVE ELLIPSES

The Utes are out-scoring their foes by a whopping 101-7 margin in the second quarter ... After going 9-of-9 in the red zone against Iowa State, Utah has now scored on 24-of-26 its trips inside the 20 (92%) with 18 touchdowns (69%). For complete red zone stats, see sidebar on page 4 of this release ... Utah has lost just 21 yards on rushing plays compared to 130 lost yards by its opponents ... Utah set a school record for second-quarter points against ISU with 31 (the school record for that category dates back to 1968).

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

- > Utah ranks fourth in the nation and first in the MWC in pass efficiency (173.84).
- > All three Ute quarterbacks have seen action this season in varying roles. Sophomore starter **Jordan Wynn** earned victories against Pittsburgh, San Jose State and Iowa State. While Wynn was sidelined with a thumb injury, senior **Terrance Cain** picked up wins against UNLV and New Mexico (he has played in four games total). Redshirt freshman **Griff Robles** has played in the last three games.
- > **Wynn** is 3-0 as the starter this year and 6-2 in his career. He has played in three games this season and nine in his career.
- > **Wynn** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 for his 325-yard, two-touchdown game against Iowa State. He was also named the MWC Player of the Week by Rivals.com.
- > **Wynn** is completing 68.2 percent of his passes (58-for-85) with seven touchdowns and two interceptions. His 163.0 pass efficiency rating would rank second in the MWC (behind teammate Cain) and 13th in the NCAA if he had played in the minimum number of games.
- > **Wynn** is averaging 244.0 passing yards per game, which would rank second in the conference if he met the minimum game requirement.
- > **Wynn's** 325-yard game against Iowa State marked his second career 300-yard game (he threw for 338 yards vs. Cal in 2009). He has reached the 200-yard mark five times.
- > With **Wynn** as the starter, Utah is 35-of-36 in the red zone.
- > **Cain** is 2-0 as the starter this year and 9-1 in his career. He has played in four games this season and 16 games in his two years at Utah.
- > **Cain** leads the MWC with a 184.8 pass efficiency rating. That number would lead the nation if he met the minimum number of pass attempts per game. He has completed 75.0 percent of his passes (39-of-52), with five touchdowns and no interceptions.
- > **Cain** ranks seventh in the MWC in passing yards per game (120.8) and averaged 227.5 ypg in the two games he started.
- > **Cain** broke the school record for single-game completion percentage (86.95) against New Mexico on Sept. 18, completing 20-of-23 passes, including 20 of his last 21 throws.
- > **Cain's** record completion percentage against the Lobos broke the mark held by his current position coach **Brian Johnson**. Johnson, now in his first year coaching the QBs, held the school mark with 18-of-21 passing (85.7%) vs. Utah State in 2005.

> **Cain** has passed for 200-plus yards in both games he started this season and has six career 200-yard games. His best passing game was 286 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Griff Robles**, a redshirt freshman, has seen spot duty in the last three games. Robles is Utah's third-leading rusher, gaining 120 yards on 16 carries, and averages a team-best 7.5 yards per carry. He is 0-1 passing.

> **Robles** led Utah in rushing in his NCAA debut against New Mexico with six carries for 64 yards (10.7 average). He had a long rush of 47 yards on his second play.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

> Co-starting seniors **Eddie Wide** and **Matt Asiata** are combining for over 100 yards per game, with a total of 108 rushes for 526 yards.

> **Wide** has 53 carries for a team-best 281 yards (5.3 average). He is averaging 56.2 yards per game, which leads Utah, as does his five rushing touchdowns.

> **Asiata** has a team-high 55 rushes for 245 yards (4.5 average) and averages 49.0 yards per game with three touchdowns.

> **Wide**, a 1,000-yard rusher and first-team all-conference running back last year—as well as the preseason all-MWC pick for 2010—has seven career 100-yard games. All of his 100-yard games were in 2009—when he netted 1,069 yards—including a career-best 145-yard game vs. New Mexico.

> **Wide's** best rushing game this season came against UNLV, when he rushed 15 times for 77 yards (5.1 average).

> **Wide** ranks fifth in the MWC in scoring average (7.2) and ranks fourth in total touchdowns with six (5 rushing, 1 receiving).

> **Wide** also has 15 receptions (third on the team) for 99 yards (fourth on the team) and one touchdown.

> **Asiata**, Utah's leading rusher in 2008 (707 yards) has two 100-yard games in his career, with a personal best 156 yards vs. Utah State in 2009.

> **Asiata's** best game this season was 16 carries for 65 yards against Pittsburgh.

> **Asiata** also has 14 receptions (fourth on the team) for 82 yards.

> **Asiata's** younger brother **Shawn Asiata**, a junior fullback in his first year at Utah, has played in all five games with two receptions for 15 yards and a touchdown. He got his first career start at Iowa State.

> Junior **Tauni Vakapuna** has 19 rushes for 79 yards (4.2 average) in five games. He also has a pair of touchdowns.

> Sophomore **Sausan Shakerin** saw his first action of the season against Iowa State after sitting out four games with a concussion. He had five carries for 24 yards (4.8 average) and a touchdown.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

> Senior **Jereme Brooks**, an all-conference candidate, leads Utah in receptions (24) and receiving touchdowns (4), while ranking second in receiving yards (336).

> **Brooks** ranks second in the MWC in receptions per game (4.80) and is fifth in receiving yards per game (67.2).

> **Brooks** is tied for the MWC lead with four receiving touchdowns.

> **Brooks** had a season-high 99 yards vs. New Mexico, including a career-long catch of 75 yards that went for a touchdown. It is Utah's longest offensive play of the season.

> In his career, **Brooks** has two 100-yard games, including a career-high 135 yards vs. New Mexico last year.

- > **Brooks** has 14 career touchdown catches (the eighth-best total in school history) and 19 total touchdowns (five rushing).
- > Junior **DeVonte Christopher** leads Utah in receiving yards (348) and is second in receptions (18). He has three touchdown catches.
- > **Christopher** leads the league in yards per catch (19.3) among players with double-digit receptions.
- > **Christopher** is fourth in the MWC in receiving yards per game (69.6).
- > **Christopher** has a pair of 100-yard receiving games this season and in his career, recording 155 yards vs. Pittsburgh and 124 against Iowa State.
- > **Christopher** was named MWC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for the Pitt game.
- > Senior **Shaky Smithson** ranks third on the team in receiving yards (142), which have come on just six catches for team-best 23.7-yard average. He also has two receiving touchdowns.
- > **Smithson** had a career-high 75 yards on two receptions against Iowa State, including 61-yard TD pass from Jordan Wynn.
- > **Smithson** passed for a touchdown against Iowa State—the first TD pass of his career—and is 3-for-8 passing for 42 yards in his career.
- > Others to line up at receiver this season are **Luke Matthews** (6 catches, 53 yards), **Reggie Dunn** (1 catch, 24 yards), **Griff McNabb** (1 catch, 3 yards), **Fatu Moala** (1 catch, 13 yards), **Dexter Ransom** and **Sean Fitzgerald**.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

- > Utah is tied for the nation's lead in sacks allowed with one. The first string offensive line has not allowed any sacks.
- > Preseason all-conference senior center **Zane Taylor** has 226 snaps in four games, with an average grade of 85%. He missed one game (New Mexico) with a knee injury.
- > **Taylor**, who has not committed an errant snap or allowed a sack, has four cuts and three pancake blocks.
- > **Taylor** led Utah in plays (70) and grade (89%) against Pitt.
- > Preseason all-conference guard **Caleb Schlauderaff** has a team-best 91% grade and his 95% grade against New Mexico is the best by a Ute this year. He graded out at 94% vs. Iowa State.
- > **Schlauderaff** has won 242 of a total 266 plays (including 42-of-44 against UNM).
- > **Schlauderaff** leads Utah in pancake blocks with 10 and has four cuts.
- > Right tackle **Tony Bergstrom** is Utah's OL play leader (272) and boasts an 83% overall grade.
- > **Bergstrom's** six cuts is tied for second on the team.
- > First-year starting left tackle **John Cullen** ranks second on the team in plays (271) and has a team-high nine cuts. Cullen also has three pancake blocks.
- > **Tevita Stevens**, who has 269 total plays, has started four games at right guard and one at center (UNM).

- > **Dave Kruger, Christian Cox, Sealver Siliga** and **Junior Tui'one** have started every game, but are spelled regularly by **Derrick Shelby, Trevor Reilly, Latu Heimuli, Neli A'Asa, Star Lotulelei, Joe Kruger, James Aiono** and **Tevita Finau**.
- > **Cox**, a senior defensive end, leads Utah's linemen and ranks fifth on the team in tackles with 23 stops. He has three TFL and one sack.
- > Sophomore DT **Dave Kruger's** 14 total tackles include two tackles for loss and a half sack.
- > **Siliga, Reilly** and **Tui'one** each have 10 tackles.
- > **Reilly** led the line against Iowa State with six tackles, a TFL and a pass breakup. He also blocked a PAT.
- > Seven different linemen have solo or assisted sacks: **Tui'one** (1), **Heimuli** (1), **Reilly** (1), **Cox** (0.5), **Dave Kruger**, (0.5), **Lotulelei** (0.5) and **A'asa** (0.5).

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

> Two of Utah's three starting linebackers (juniors **Chaz Walker** and **Matt Martinez**) began their careers as walk-ons, while the other (senior **Chad Manis**) was a quarterback his first two seasons at the U.

> **Walker**, Utah's tackle leader with 42 stops, ranks sixth in the MWC in tackles per game (8.4).

> **Walker's** career-high 16 tackles vs. UNLV is the most by a Ute in four seasons.

> **Walker's** 4.5 TFL ranks second on the team and is tied for seventh in the MWC. His 0.90 TFL per game is 10th in the conference.

> **Martinez** is Utah's second-leading tackler with 33 stops (6.6 per game average). He has 2.5 TFL with one sack.

> **Martinez** had a career-high 12 tackles against UNLV.

> **Martinez** made his first career interception against New Mexico, which he returned 36 yards for his first touchdown as a Ute. He had seven tackles in the game.

> **Manis** led Utah against Iowa State with a career-high nine tackles.

> **Manis** is tied for third on the team with 32 tackles. He also has 2.0 TFL and a pass breakup.

> **Boo Andersen** has come off the bench for 12 tackles, including 1.5 for loss and a half sack.

> **Victor Spikes**, a one-time backup safety who has practiced with the running backs since early in the season, is now playing linebacker.

SECONDARY NOTEBOOK

> All-America candidate and preseason all-MWC junior corner **Brandon Burton** is tied for the team lead in pass breakups with three. He is tied for fourth in the conference in the category while ranking fifth in passes defended (4) and passes defended per game (0.80).

> **Burton** has 13 career pass breakups. His 10 PBUs last year was tied for second in the MWC.

> **Burton** made his first interception of the season against Iowa State, which he ran back 57 yards to set up a Utah field goal. He has two career picks.

> **Burton** has 15 tackles, including a season-best five stops against both Pitt and New Mexico.

> 5'8", 176-pound, senior corner **Lamar Chapman** leads Utah in both sacks (3.5) and tackles for loss (6.0).

> **Chapman** ranks second in the MWC in sacks (3.5) and sacks per game (0.70), and is tied for third in the league in tackles for loss per game (1.20).

> **Chapman** leads the Ute defensive backs and is tied for third on the team in tackles with 32. His three pass breakups is also tied for the team lead.

> **Chapman** was named the MWC Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 20 for his team-high eight tackles (7 solo), two tackles for loss and a sack in Utah's 56-14 victory at New Mexico.

> True freshman safety **Brian Blechen** is tied for fifth in the league in passes defended (4) and passes defended per game (0.80).

> **Blechen** has 22 tackles, three pass breakups (tied for the team lead) and one interception.

> **Blechen** earned MWC Player of the Week honors on Sept. 6 for his game against Pitt, when he had an interception in the first play of overtime.

> **Blechen** signed with Utah as a quarterback, although he also played safety, linebacker and punter at Moorpark High School (Calif.).

> Senior free safety **Justin Taplin-Ross** has 20 tackles, a TFL, a pass breakup and an interception.

> **Taplin-Ross's** first career interception, which he returned 52 yards, came against Iowa State.

SPECIAL TEAMS SPECIALTIES

Utah leads the nation in kickoff return average (31.17) and ranks third in punt return average (21.32). The Utes are first in the MWC in both categories ... Utah leads the country in both punt returns (22) and punt return yards (469) ... Utah and Oregon are the only two teams this year that have scored at least three touchdowns on punt returns ... Returner **Shaky Smithson** has won three MWC Special Teams Player of the Week awards this year (Sept. 13, Sept. 20 and Oct. 11).

KICKING NOTEBOOK

- > Senior place kicker **Joe Phillips** ranks first in the MWC and 15th in the nation in scoring, averaging 10.6 points per game (seven field goals, 32 PATs).
- > **Phillips** set a new school record with his 20 kick-scoring points against Iowa State. Phillips was 4-for-4 in field goals and 8-for-8 in PATs.
- > **Phillips** leads the MWC and is tied for 30th in the country in field goals per game (1.40).
- > **Phillips** is 7-of-7 in field goals this year and has made 16-straight field goal attempts dating back to last season.
- > **Phillips** has made 27-of-29 (93%) field goals in two years as Utah's place kicker. He was the most accurate kicker in the MWC last year (20-22, 91%).
- > **Phillips'** long field goal this year is 44 yards. His career-best was 48 yards, set last season.
- > **Phillips** is 6-of-7 from 40 yards and out for his career and 1-of-1 this season.
- > **Phillips** has gone 8-of-8 in PATs in Utah's last three games (UNM, SJSU and ISU). The eight PATs is tied for the second-best single-game total in school history.
- > **Phillips** is 32-of-32 in PATs this year and 69-of-70 in his career.
- > **Phillips** kicked the game-winning field goal against Pittsburgh, a 21-yarder in overtime.
- > Sophomore punter **Sean Sellwood** leads the MWC in punt average (46.83). He would rank fifth in the country in the category, but he does not have enough punts to meet the minimum requirements.
- > Of his 12 total punts, **Sellwood** has five 50-yarders (long of 60 yards) and has had five downed inside the 20.
- > **Sellwood's** career long is 63 yards, set last year.
- > Redshirt freshman **Nick Marsh** has punted three times, placing one on the 9-yard line.
- > Utah has 42 total kickoffs (average 66.3) with eight touchbacks.
- > **Marsh** has handled 38 of Utah's 42 kickoffs with eight touchbacks. He is averaging 66.4 yards per kickoff.
- > **Phillips** has four kickoffs for an average of 65.8 yards and no touchbacks.

RETURN GAME NOTEBOOK

- > Utah has scored four touchdowns on special teams: three on punt returns and one on a kickoff return.
- > **Shaky Smithson** leads the nation in total punt returns (19), punt return yards (444) and punt returns per game (3.80).
- > **Smithson** leads the MWC and ranks third nationally in punt return average (23.4).
- > **Smithson's** 444 punt return yards ranks second all-time in a season at Utah. He is on pace to become the first 500-yard punt returner in a season at Utah. The record of 495 yards is held by Steve Smith (1999).
- > **Smithson** has 567 career punt return yards, which currently ranks fifth all-time in school history.
- > **Smithson** had a career-high 145 yards in punt returns (five returns) against Iowa State, including a career-long 78-yard return in the first quar-

ter. His 145 yards vs. ISU ranks third all-time in Utah's single-game books.

> **Smithson** is the only player in the country this season with three 70-yard punt returns. He had a 78-yard return against Iowa State (tied for the sixth-longest in school history), a 77-yard punt return against UNLV (the eighth-longest in school history) and a 73-yard punt return against New Mexico.

> **Smithson** returned punts for touchdowns in back-to-back weeks against UNLV and New Mexico. He returned a punt to the 2-yard line against Iowa State.

> **Smithson** is tied for second in the school single-season record books with two punt returns for touchdowns, a feat last accomplished by current Carolina Panthers' receiver Steve Smith (who set the school record for punt return touchdowns in a season with three in 1999).

> **Smithson** has three of the top five punt return yardage games in the country this season. His 145 punt return yards against Iowa State is the second-best, while his 140 punt return yards against New Mexico is the third-best and his 128 punt return yards against UNLV is tied for fifth-best.

> **Smithson** has three of the top six punt return yardage games in school history. His 145 return yards against Iowa State ranks third while his 140 yards vs. New Mexico ranks fourth. His 128 return yards against UNLV is sixth.

> **Smithson** has been named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week three this season and in his career (Sept. 13, Sept. 20 and Oct. 11).

> **Smithson** was honored as the National Punt Returner of the Week on Sept. 13 and 20 by the College Football Performance Awards.

> **Smithson** also leads the Utes in kickoff returns with six for 172 yards (28.7 average). He is third in the conference and tied for 18th nationally in the category.

> **Smithson** leads the MWC and ranks 21st nationally in all-purpose yards per game (151.8). Of his 759 all-purpose yards, 616 have come on punt and kick return yards.

> **Reggie Dunn** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Iowa State for just the seventh 100-yard kickoff return in Utah history. It was the first 100-yard return was the first by a Ute in 25 years, since Erroll Tucker did it twice in 1985.

> **Dunn** was named the National Kick Returner of the Week on Oct. 10 by the College Football Performance Awards.

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM SAYS

"We played well in all three phases of the game in our win over Iowa State. After a slow start, our offense got into high gear and took over the game, scoring on ten of our last eleven possessions. We continued our consistent play on defense and we had good production on special teams, highlighted by kicker Joe Phillips setting a school record by scoring twenty points with his place kicking. We get back into conference play this week with a road trip to Wyoming. Laramie can be a difficult place to play and we need to have a good week of preparation. We're hoping for a good turnout from our fans since the game is within driving distance."

A 9.90 ROUTINE

The Utes averaged 9.9 wins a season from 2003-09, including undefeated seasons in 2004 (12-0) and 2008 (13-0). Of Utah's five 10-win seasons in its 115-year history, four have come in the last seven years. Utah won double-digit games in 1994 (10-2), 2003 (10-2), 2004 (12-0), 2008 (13-0) and 2009 (10-3). The Utes have won nine or more games in each of the last three seasons, which is a school first.

BCS SUCCESS

In its final year as a member of a non-automatic qualifying conference, Utah has more wins against BCS schools than any other NAQ team. Since the BCS began in 1998, the Utes own 21 wins against BCS opponents and are 21-11 overall. Sixth-year head coach **Kyle Whittingham** is 12-4 against BCS schools. Utah, the original BCS Buster in 2004, is 2-0 in BCS bowl games—and is the only NAQ team with two wins against BCS teams in BCS bowl games (Pitt in the 2005 Fiesta Bowl and Alabama in the 2009 Sugar Bowl).

BOWL ROLL

Utah's nine-game bowl win streak is the longest active bowl win streak in the nation and is tied for the second-longest of all-time. Florida State holds the record with 11 consecutive bowl wins (1985-96), while the Utes are tied for second with USC, which won nine straight postseason games in a period spanning from 1923-45. Five of Utah's wins during the current nine-game win streak have come against BCS foes: USC (2001), Pittsburgh (2005/2004 season), Georgia Tech (2005), Alabama (2009/2008 season) and California (2009). Utah is 12-3 all-time in bowl games and its 80-percent postseason success rate is the best in the nation among teams that have played in at least 10 bowl games.

PAC-ING UP

The 2010 season will be Utah's last in the Mountain West Conference. On June 17, 2010, the Utes accepted an invitation to join the Pacific-10 Conference and will begin Pac-10 play in 2011. The Utes became one of eight original members of the MWC in 1999, winning conference titles in 1999 (tie), 2003, 2004 and 2008. The Pac-10 will mark the sixth conference in Utah's history. Utah competed in the Rocky Mountain Conference (1910-37), Big Seven Conference (1938-47), Skyline Conference (1948-61), Western Athletic Conference (1962-98) and MWC (1999-2010).
