## NCAA Tournament Success

With 10 appearances in the past 13 seasons, the University of Utah is no stranger to the NCAA Tournament. Since 1998, the Utes have become a fixture in the tournament and have developed a rich history of success in that short span.

"Every year we play a nationally-competitive schedule to prepare for the NCAA Tournament," head coach Beth Launiere says. "Our goal is to continue to go to the NCAA Tournament year-in and year-out."

The team has participated in the NCAA Tournament 10 times (1998-2006, 2008) and advanced to the second round eight times. The 2001 and 2008 teams both went 2-1 in the tournament, concluding each season with a loss in the Sweet 16. The Utes lost to eventual national champion Stanford to conclude the 2001 campaign, while the 2008 team saw its season come to a close at No. 5 Washington.

The Utes qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 1998 and advanced to the second round in each of their first three appearances.

The team's regional semifinal appearance in 2001 was the first time in Utah volleyball history that a team had advanced to regionals. The Utes topped Texas Tech, 3-0, and Utah State, 3-1, in the first and second rounds on Crimson Court. Utah fell to host Stanford, 3-1, in Palo Alto in the regional.

In 2003, Utah was down 0-2 to No. 13 Santa Clara in 2003 in the first round before rallying for a thrilling five-set victory. The following night, the Utes fell in three sets to host Washington.

Utah played host to the first and second rounds for the second time in 2005 after winning the Mountain West Conference's automatic bid.

## All-Americans

### **Kim Turner (2000-03) • Third Team (2003)**

A 6-2 middle blocker, Turner was among the top players in the country in 2003. She ranked 18th in the nation in blocks per set (1.48) and 31st in hitting percentage (.367). Turner's senior year ended with Co-MWC Player of the Year honors for the second year in a row as she led the MWC in hitting percentage (.434) and points per set (5.61). During conference play, she had 231 kills, which set the league's single-season record. Turner ended her four years ranked first in the Utah career record books in kills (1,620), total blocks (670), block assists (589) and is now second in hitting percentage (.324).

### **Lyndsey Henderson (2002-04) • Honorable Mention (2004)**

Henderson averaged 1.67 blocks per game which ranked second in the conference and eighth nationally. Offensively, she racked up 3.59 kills per game and hit .322 for the season, checking in at third and fifth in the MWC, respectively. The 6-5 middle blocker established herself as one of the team's go-to threats, bagging double-digit kills in 25 of the 30 matches this season. Among that string is a career-best 22 kills in leading Utah to an upset victory over then-No. 6 UCLA. Her list of accolades also included AVCA all-region honors, all-MWC and MWC Player of the Week (Oct. 18).

### **Shelly Sommerfeldt (2002-05) • Honorable Mention (2005)**

Sommerfeldt wrapped up her 2005 campaign by winning her third all-conference award and began the postseason winning all-MWC Tournament and Tournament MVP accolades. She ranked sixth in the MWC in racking up 3.54 kills per game and hit .229 for the year and was 10th in the league in averaging 2.89 digs in addition to 0.92 blocks.

### **Arial Salvo (2005-06) • Second Team (2006)**

Salvo, a 6-0 outside hitter, was named the MWC Player of the Year in 2006, averaging 4.13 kills, 3.35 digs, 0.78 blocks and 0.45 aces per set. She led the Utes and the MWC with 49 aces on the year. Salvo completed her Utah career with 3.73 kills, 0.34 aces, 2.90 kills and 0.83 blocks per set and also had a hitting percentage of .269.

### **Whitney Webb (2004-07) • Third Team (2006)**

Webb had a breakout season as a junior in 2006 for the Utes, averaging 3.13 kills, 2.67 digs and 1.29 blocks per set. She ranked 63rd in the nation in hitting percentage, and led all MWC outside hitters with a .344 hitting percentage. Webb was a significant factor in helping Utah lead the nation in blocks (3.71 per set) while ranking seventh in hitting percentage (.323). In addition to All-America honors, Webb was also an All-West Region and all-conference selection in 2006. She finished her career with 2.77 kills and 0.99 blocks per set.

### **Lori Baird (2005-08) • Third Team (2008)**

Baird was recognized as an AVCA All-West Region selection as well as the MWC Co-Player of the Year. Baird finished the season second in the MWC and 16th in the country with 1.39 blocks per set. She became the 10th member of Utah's 1,000-kill club and finished her career with the Utes seventh in school history with 1,236 career kills. Baird led the team with 3.05 kills per set, which finished fourth in the MWC. Baird finished her career second in school history with 584 career block assists and third with 631 career total blocks. Baird posted seven career double-doubles, three in 2008, including a school-record 16 block assists to go along with 11 digs in a 3-0 win at BYU.

### **Emillie Toone (2004-08) • Honorable Mention (2006, 2008)**

Toone earned AVCA Honorable Mention recognition for the second time in her career after ending her career as the most efficient attacker in school history (.345). Toone led the MWC and was 12th in the nation with a school-record .393 hitting percentage, breaking her own record of .369 (set in 2006). She also tied or led Utah in kills six times during 2008. On the block, Toone finished her Ute career second in school history in total blocks (635) and third in block assists (583). Toone finished 2008 third in the conference and 19th nationally with 1.37 blocks per set, while leading or tying for the team lead in blocking during 13 matches this season.



## Crimson Court

Top-notch volleyball, a driving MUSS Student Section and band team with a raucous crowd to make Utah's Crimson Court one of the finest volleyball-only facilities in the nation.

One of the most intimidating competition venues in the country since 2000, Utah has racked up a 125-23 (.845) home record and has tallied a 72-11 (.867) mark in conference home matches during that span.

After a comprehensive renovation project, the court was officially dedicated on Sept. 9, 1994. It was christened with a win over Montana State and a marathon five-set victory over San Jose State in the Utah Classic. A new playing surface was installed during the summer of 2011.

The largest crowd ever recorded at Crimson Court assembled on Sept. 25, 2009, as 1,747 fans watched Utah rally from down two sets to defeat BYU. The near-capacity crowd also was treated to a 35th Anniversary celebration and Alumni Reunion.

Utah set the single-season attendance record in 2001. The Utes hosted 12,020 fans over the course of 15 matches, averaging 801 fans per contest.

Not only has the fan-friendly Crimson Court been a launching pad for the Utes' 10 NCAA Tournament appearances, but Crimson Court has also played host to the NCAA Tournament, entertaining opening-round action in 2001 and 2005.

### Top Moments in Crimson Court History

#### Nov. 20, 2010

All three members of the Ute senior class achieved a milestone in their final appearance at Crimson Court in a four-set win over TCU. Keisha Fisher set the school's career dig record. Karolina Bartkowiak moved into 10th place on the school's all-time kills list, while Stephanie Neeley joined Utah's 3,000-assist club.

#### Sept. 25, 2009

Head coach Beth Launiere won her 400th career match after the Utes overcame a two-set deficit to defeat BYU in front of a school-record 1,747 fans as the program held its 35th Anniversary Alumni Reunion.

#### Nov. 22, 2008

'Championship Saturday' sees No. 22 Utah conclude its 12-1 home season with a 3-1 win over No. 15 Colorado State to claim its sixth conference championship.

#### Oct. 9, 2008

Kathryn Haynie became the 11th member of Utah's 1,000 career kill club as the Utes swept UNLV, 3-0.

#### Nov. 9, 2006

No. 9 Utah capped its second unbeaten home campaign (13-0) since 2000 with a 3-1 win over Wyoming.

#### Nov. 4, 2005

Unranked Utah upended No. 12 BYU, 3-0, in front of 1,591 fans. The Utes held one of the most potent offenses in the nation to a mere .172 hitting as they raced their home winning streak out to 12.

#### Sept. 17, 2004

The unranked Utes upset the No. 6 UCLA Bruins in five sets.

#### Aug. 31, 2002

No. 13 Utah edged past No. 12 Pacific, 3-2, to claim the Utah Classic title and extended its home winning streak to 20 matches. The Utes win streak extended to 29 straight at Crimson Court.

#### Nov. 30, 2001

The Utes hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Tournament and beat Utah State, 3-1, in the second round to advance to the Sweet 16 for the first time.

#### Nov. 3, 2001

No. 15 Utah downed No. 6 Colorado State in ending the Rams' 20-match winning streak, 3-2. It was CSU's first (and only) conference loss of the season.

#### Sept. 5, 2000

Utah erased a 2-0 deficit to topple top-ranked Stanford. The Utes established what was then the school record for assists (93) and kills (97) in a match.

#### Sept. 22, 1995

The Utes snapped an 18-match losing streak to in-state rival BYU with a 3-0 home victory over the Cougars. It was only the Utes' second-ever win over BYU and it was Launiere's first.

## 2011 Season Outlook

After winning six Mountain West Conference titles and going 137-43 (.761) through 11 years of league play, the University of Utah volleyball program will begin competing in the Pac-12 Conference. Who better to usher in this new era than 22nd-year head coach **Beth Launiere**?

Launiere owns a 425-238 (.641) career record and has been named the AVCA West Region Coach of the Year three times (2001, '06, '08) and the MWC Coach of the Year (2004, '06, '08) of the Year three times during her tenure. To continue that level of success in their new conference, Launiere and the Utes know a difficult challenge lies ahead.

"We started preparing [for the move to Pac-12] last spring," Launiere said. "We put in as many hours this spring as we ever have. Not just hours, quality hours. The team was as focused and motivated as ever. We met a lot and talked about what we're heading into."

Utah is familiar with its new league as it has played all 11 of its fellow Pac-12 teams at least four times over the program's 36-year history. The Utes own wins over each Pac-12 school and have earned impressive victories since 2000, including a 3-2 road win at Arizona State last season as well as a five-set win over No. 1 Stanford at Crimson Court in 2000.

"We looked at the Pac-12 from top to bottom and found where we fit in statistically," Launiere said. "We shared a lot of the information with the team, so we're going to go in with as much awareness and preparation as we can. With that said, we can't prepare 100% for what we're getting into. There's going to be a learning curve, no question. With an increased learning curve, the growth rate is higher. That's what we're excited about."

A young, yet experienced team featuring only a pair of seniors, middle blocker **Danielle Killpack** and right-side hitter **Jennifer Lanting**, will lead the Utes into the rigors of the Pac-12.

"Some of the top teams will have size and speed that we haven't faced consistently, but the meat of the conference is not going to shock us," Launiere said.

"The difference is going to be facing those teams every single night. You can't have a down night and if you do, you're going to get beat. How we respond is really going to be a key. In the past, we might have a couple weeks to get some things figured out. Now we'll have 24 hours. That's the difference."

Aside from competing against an elevated schedule, the Utes will look for a team effort to make up for the loss of the 2010

graduating class, a trio of athletes who left their mark on the school record books.

"I see it as a whole team replacing opposite hitter Karolina Bartkowiak, libero Keisha Fisher and setter Stephanie Neeley," Launiere said. "That's why I put us in that young category. Our two returning all-conference players were freshmen last year. The other area where we're young is the setting and libero positions, even though they aren't freshmen. I see that as a positive because this group is going to be able to grow together in the new conference in the next couple of years."

Sophomores **Morgan Odale** and **Erin Redd** had impressive first seasons at Utah and return this season along with PrepVolleyball.com's 20th-ranked incoming freshmen class.

"Players like Redd and [Morgan] Odale, who have proven they are going to be a big part of our offense, are going to get a lot of sets," Launiere said. "They have to step up because their roles are going to change significantly. They garnered all-conference and freshman of the year honors last season while our seniors carried the team for the most part, so we definitely need them to take on more responsibility.

"The fact that we have two freshmen all-conference players from last season returning and have as big and athletic class that we've ever had coming in as freshmen, it really is a new era for Utah Volleyball," Launiere said. "We have an opportunity to redefine our whole team. It is a balanced group, in that respect, even though it's young."

### Middle Blocker

Killpack finished last season fourth in the MWC with 1.27 blocks per set after leading the MWC with 1.27 blocks per set in 2009.

"We'll get strong senior leadership out of [Killpack]," Launiere said. "She's ready to take on that position as captain. We're looking forward to her stepping up."

Redd, a sophomore from Spanish Fork, Utah, finished second in the MWC with a .354 hitting percentage, which tied for fourth in the school's single-season record book. She finished third on the team with 2.40 kills per set and recorded at least 10 kills in 13 MWC matches.

"We want to try to get the ball to [Redd] more this year and increase her attempts," Launiere said. "She proved by the end of last season that she is a big-time player for us."

Freshman **Bailey Bateman** will also provide stability to the Utah middles. Bateman is a 6-0 product from West Hooper, Utah and was selected as PrepVolleyball.com's Top 100.

"Bailey is a great competitor and an aggressive athlete, who just loves to play volleyball," Launiere said. "She is going to excel as an NCAA Division I level athlete in this environment because of those qualities. She should adjust to the DI level well because of her athleticism."

### Outside Hitter

Last season's MWC Freshman of the Year, Morgan Odale, returns as Utah's top offensive option. Odale finished in the MWC's top 10 in six different statistical categories during her freshman season.

"We depended on Morgan a lot as a freshman last season," Launiere said. "She responded and grew every match then made technical and physical changes during the offseason which will make her that much better. We're excited to have her take on more responsibility and on-court leadership this year."

Sophomore **Brooke McAlister** is a big, talented offensive player who has all-around skills. Last season, her best performance was when she posted a season-high 15 kills on 44 attempts with two blocks, two service aces and an assist in a five-set win at Northwestern.

"[McAlister] has had two knee surgeries since the season ended," Launiere said. "She gained a lot of experience last year and this will be her third in the program. For Brooke, it really is just about how her knees hold up. When she's healthy, she does good things. She can be an offensive weapon for us. She's also a good blocker."

Junior **Natalie Nichols** along with freshmen **Shelby Dalton**, **Becca Fuchs** and **Chelsey Schofield** will supply the depth in the outside hitter position for Utah.

Nichols appeared in three matches last season for the Utes and corralled three digs at Wyoming.

"[Nichols] had a great offseason," Launiere said. "She continues to amaze with us with the improvement that she makes. She played in a couple of tournaments this spring and made some big plays for us." Dalton was a versatile prep athlete at Grand County High School in Moab, Utah. In addition to starring in volleyball, she was a pitcher on the 2010 state champion softball team and also was a center on the basketball team.

"[Dalton] is an intriguing player to us," Launiere said. "She comes in after an impressive career at Grand County High School, where she was an all-state selection in volleyball, basketball and softball. She is a big, physical player and her potential is high."

Fuchs led Menomonee Falls (Wis.) High School to the semifinals of the 2010 WIAA State Tournament. She played club

volleyball for Milwaukee Sting 17 Gold and was selected to the Prep Volleyball Showcase All-Tournament Team in 2010.

"[Fuchs] is a nice athlete and a very good jumper, who will be exciting to watch," Launiere said. "She has played the game a lot and has a high volleyball IQ." Schofield, a product of Mountain View High School in Provo, Utah, was named to PrepVolleyball.com's Top 100 team.

"[Schofield] is one of the more skilled players to ever come into the program as a freshman," Launiere said. "She has been playing the game for a very long time. She's athletic, long and has a lot of shots. She can play with finesse but put the ball away as well."

### Opposite/Right Side Hitter

Lanting, a Corcoran, Calif. native, returns for her senior season and owns four career double figure-kill performances. She registered a career-high 14 kills in Utah's 3-2 home win against BYU in 2010.

"[Lanting] has proven she can put up good numbers for us," Launiere said. "She is a low-error attacker. Her blocking will be a key for us."

Between [Lanting] and an exciting incoming freshman, **Alli Spurrier**, who is a 6-3 left-handed player, we're going to be in good shape in that position," Launiere said.

Spurrier, hailing from Olympus High School in Salt Lake City, was selected to the 2010 4A State Tournament team.

"[Spurrier] has tremendous blocking instincts," Launiere said. "She's long and big at the net. She's a left-handed attacker and will bring a significant blocking presence to our team. [Spurrier] plays the right side and will have the ability to affect our opponents' top outside hitters."

### Setter

A pair of juniors will lead the Utes from the setter position.

**McKenzie Odale** made the first two starts of her career at last season's Utah Classic and had a career-high 29 assists and added five digs against UC Davis. She also had 23 assists and career highs of four kills and three blocks against Utah State. Her versatility was shown as she gathered the first two career double-doubles: 18 assists and 11 digs at Missouri State and 21 assists and 15 digs against Pacific.

"[McKenzie Odale] gained a lot of experience and along with her athleticism, she is making her presence felt on the court," Launiere said. "She brings a level of athleticism to the floor that we've never seen in the setting position. She's arguably the best athlete on our team."

**Abby Simmons** returns from a thumb injury suffered during preseason training last year. In 2009, she finished 10th in the MWC with 5.43 assists per set and owns six career double-doubles, including 24 assists and a career-high 14 digs in a sweep at BYU.

"[Simmons] got back into the swing of things, in terms of running the offense after her thumb injury," Launiere said. "She has two years of experience running the offense under her belt during her freshman and sophomore years.

"They are both doing really well and they both bring something different to the court."

### Libero

**Nikki Sim, Candace Tufaga** and **Lea Adolph** will compete for playing time as Utah's libero.

Sim, a sophomore from Salt Lake City, is the lone returner in the group. She appeared in 20 matches last season and popped up four digs at New Mexico.

"[Sim] stepped up in the libero position last spring," Launiere said. "She's still unproven, but showed signs that she's ready to take on more responsibility for us in the back court. She's ready for the task."

Tufaga, a native of Kahuku, Hawaii, played two seasons at Sheridan College before joining the Utah program and had 2.02 kills per set last season for the Generals. In 2009, she played in 78 sets and averaged .45 service aces per set during, which ranked 41st in the nation.

"[Tufaga] played outside hitter at the junior college level but her ball control skills are what attracted her to us. She can pass," Launiere said.

Adolph, a native of Waltrop, Germany, attended Pascalgymnasium in Muenster and played club volleyball for TV Datteln,

SCU Luedinghausen and USC Muenster. She was a member of some very successful teams as she helped her squad take fourth at the 2010 Junior European Championship.

"We're excited to bring [Adolph] here from Germany," Launiere said. "She's played libero at the highest levels in German Junior Volleyball as a member of the junior national team. She's a fiery competitor, who's talented and comes with a lot of experience."

### Schedule

The Utes will host 17 matches at Crimson Court during the 2011 regular season, including a pair of tournaments: the Utah Classic on Aug. 26-27 and the Utah Invitational on Sept. 9-10. The final match of the Utah Invite will be against BYU at 7 p.m. on Sept. 10. In between the home tournaments, the Utes will take on an international team Nova KBM Maribor, Slovenia on Aug. 30.

"Utah fans, and volleyball fans in general, are in for a treat," Launiere said. "Some of the best volleyball in the country will be played at Crimson Court."

Utah's first Pac-12 match will be Sept. 13 at Colorado. First serve from Boulder is set for 7 p.m. MT.

After traveling to Stanford and California on Sept. 16-17, the Utes will host their first Pac-12 match at Crimson Court against Oregon State on Sept. 23. The NCAA Tournament begins Dec. 1 with the first and second rounds. The NCAA Championship will be held at the Alamodome in San Antonio Texas, Dec. 17-19.

"One thing I'm looking forward to is coming into the conference as a relative unknown entity to the other Pac-12 teams," Launiere said.

"This year, no one knows what we're going to do. That gives us some ability to fly under the radar a bit as we learn about the Pac-12 Conference. As much as we don't know everything we're going to face, the other teams don't know our abilities and what Utah Volleyball is all about. That's a good position to be in.

"We've always played a strong schedule and never shied away from facing great competition," Launiere said. "We're really looking forward to playing the great volleyball teams of the Pac-12 weekly. We're ready."

**Beth Launiere**  
**Head Coach**

Utah head coach Beth Launiere has successfully led the University of Utah volleyball team through plenty of obstacles during her 21-year tenure. However, an entirely new set of hurdles await Launiere and the Utes in the fall of 2011: the Pac-12 Conference.

Launiere (425-238, .641) took over in 1990, looking to straighten out a team that won only one match in 1989. In 21 years, Launiere has sculpted the Utes into a top-25 power. The Utes have qualified for the NCAA Tournament 10 times, won six Mountain West Conference titles (regular season and tournament combined) and have recorded 13, 20-win seasons.

Launiere has earned plenty of recognition as the leader of the Utes, she was named the AVCA West Region Coach of the Year three times (2001, '06, '08) and the MWC Coach of the Year (2004, '06, '08) of the Year three times.

Launiere's ability to attract top-notch talent has helped take Utah to the forefront of the national scene. She has guided seven Utes to All-America honors while 11 have garnered all-region accolades. The incoming 2011 freshman class was ranked 20th in the nation by prepvolleyball.com, while the 2005 freshman class was ranked the eighth-best by *Volleyball Magazine*.

Launiere's accomplishments earned her the opportunity to coach for USA Volleyball during each of the last three summers. She coached the USA/BIP Team at the 2011 European Global Challenge in Belgrade, Serbia and Pula, Croatia last July and was head coach of the USA National A2 Program in May of 2010 at the Open Division of the USA Open National Championships in Phoenix, Ariz. Launiere was also on the sidelines as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team at the 2009 FIVB World Grand Prix in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Li Miao, Chinese Taipei and Bangkok, Thailand.

Launiere's impact on the sport goes well beyond the court. She has guided volleyball on the national stage as the AVCA President during the 2009 calendar year and as the President-Elect in 2008. She has also been a member of the AVCA Board of Directors since 2004 and served a three-year term as the Division I Volleyball Coaches Representative from 2005 to 2007 after being a part of the AVCA's All-America Committee for five years.

On the court, Launiere has helped Utah volleyball reached new heights on both the conference and national levels. In 11 years of MWC play, Utah won three tournament championships (2001, '02, '05) and three regular-season titles (2004, '06, '08) while qualifying for the NCAA Tournament 10 times.

The Utes have reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament eight times with regional semifinal appearances in 2001 and 2008. In 2001, Utah fell to eventual national champion Stanford, 3-1. Utah was the only team to win a game against the Cardinal during the tournament. In 2008, the Utes swept Furman and host Clemson in the first two rounds before being defeated by Washington in Seattle.

The 2008 team went 26-6 overall and won their sixth overall MWC title in school history after starting the MWC season 0-2. Utah went on to take 14 consecutive conference victories against conference foes. Lori Baird was the MWC Player of the Year, while Launiere earned the third MWC Coach of the Year honor of her career.

In 2006, Utah set the school record for wins in a season (28), set the school and conference record for league wins (16) and became only the second MWC school ever to go undefeated in conference play. The team won a school-record 25 straight during the season and was ranked as high as ninth in the AVCA poll. Led by Emillie Toone, who finished second in the country in blocking, Utah led the nation in blocks (3.71). Launiere was voted both the MWC and AVCA West Region Coach of the Year for the second time in her career.

Launiere led Utah to its first national ranking in 2000 after defeating No. 1 Stanford, 3-2, on Sept. 5, 2000. The next week, the Utes appeared in the Sept. 18th AVCA Top 25 poll, coming in at No. 18. Utah earned its highest ranking in school history on Sept. 2, 2002, when it was ranked eighth.

Launiere arrived at Utah in 1990 and took over a team that had compiled a 1-32 record the previous year. Inspiring a turnaround in the program, she recorded Utah's first winning season in seven years (18-15) in 1992, just her third year.

Utah earned its first postseason berth in 1993, placing third in the NIVC. The Utes led the nation in blocks that year, while Mikki Kane-Barton was the top individual blocker in the country. It was the first time any Western Athletic Conference team earned the nation's top rank in blocking.

In addition to seven AVCA All-Americans, 17 of Launiere's players have earned 21 different All-MWC honors, while 11 have been named all-region. Kim Turner (2002-03), Aerial Salvo (2006) and Lori Baird (2008) were each named MWC Player of the Year. Launiere's recruits have also rewritten the record book, holding career records in kills, attempts, assists, aces, digs, total blocks and hitting efficiency.

Many of her players have represented Utah internationally in various US Olympic Development programs. Several players have gone on to compete in the USA Volleyball system, including Turner, Salvo, Toone, Baird, Sydney Anderson, Lyndsey Henderson, Danielle Killpack, Morgan Odale, Abby Simmons and Kelsie Kartchner. Danielle Leichliter trained overseas with Vanajan RC.

Prior to coming to Utah, the Grand Rapids, Mich., native was as an assistant coach at Illinois (1988-89). The Illini went 57-12 during Launiere's stay and made it to two NCAA Tournaments, including a 1988 Final Four showing.

An assistant at Ferris State (Mich.) from 1985-87, Launiere helped the Bulldogs win three postseason bids, including an appearance in the 1987 NCAA Division II Final Four.

Launiere graduated in 1985 from Aquinas College (Mich.). She earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and economics and has a master's in sports administration from Illinois.

Brian Doyon will be in his third season as a member of the Utah volleyball coaching staff. He brings a vast amount of experience in many different aspects of the game and will look to help Utah maintain its position as one of the top programs in the nation.

Prior to joining the Ute coaching staff, Doyon served as the head coach of Battle Mountain High School in Vail, Colo., for six years. He compiled a 113-38 (.748) record and won the 2006 state championship. His Battle Mountain teams posted three 20-win seasons and earned three top-five finishes at the state tournament.

He was named the 2006 Rocky Mountain News 4A Coach of the Year after mentoring 2006 AVCA High School Senior All-Americans Crystin Rodrick and Britney Brown. That season, Doyon earned the 2007 Colorado High School Coaches Association 4A Coach of the Year award.

Doyon's coaching experience also extends into the collegiate ranks. Since 2005, he has been the assistant director of Terry Pettit's Summit of Extraordinary Coaching, where he assisted in developing and hosting a seminar for college coaches. Doyon has also assisted Colorado State's Elite Skills, Team, and Collegiate Prep camps since 2006, and has served as the director of Rocky Mountain Volleyball Camps and the sports coordinator of the Vail Recreation District since 2004.

His other volleyball coaching experience includes a two-year term as the head coach of the Avalanche Volleyball Club in Edwards, Colo., from 2002 to 2004. He also was an evaluator at the USA High Performance Tryout in Denver, Colo., in 2005.

Doyon's collegiate playing career was with the Syracuse club volleyball team in 1993 and 1994, where he was a two-year starting middle blocker. He graduated from SUNY Environmental Science and Forestry in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in Landscape Architecture and began his coaching career as an assistant at Fayetteville Manlius High School in Syracuse, N.Y., in 1993.

The San Paulo, Brazil native came to Utah after a two-year stint at Salt Lake Community College, where she led the Bruins to a third-place finish at the national tournament as an NJCAA All-Tournament team selection and a second-team All-American.

Angus earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Utah in parks, recreation and tourism.

Brian Hosfeld will join the University of Utah volleyball staff as an interim assistant coach for the 2011 season.

Most recently, Hosfeld served as an assistant coach at Texas for seven seasons from 2004-07. He helped the Longhorns reach the NCAA Final Four during each of the last three seasons, including a national runner-up finish in 2009. During his time in Austin, Hosfeld mentored 10 different student-athletes who earned 13 AVCA All-American citations and 13 All-Big 12 Conference selections.

Before joining the Longhorn coaching staff, Hosfeld was the winningest head coach in school history at Baylor University with 129 victories over eight seasons with the Bears. He led Baylor to the NCAA Tournament in 1999 and 2001, the first two postseason berths in school history. The 1999 team went 26-9 overall and beat Temple in the first round. Under Hosfeld's tutelage, three players earned AVCA All-District recognition and eight were All-Big 12 Conference honorees.

Hosfeld has also served as the Director of the USA Volleyball Development Camp four times (2005 and '06 in Austin and 2002 and '03 in Waco) and was the head coach of the USA A2 Junior National Team in 2005. He was also the head coach for the USA squad that earned a silver medal at the 1997 World University Games in Sicily.

Hosfeld began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Long Beach State where he was an assistant coach for the 1993 NCAA champions. The 49ers also reached the Final Four in 1994.

Hosfeld received an Associate Arts degree from Long Beach City College in 1986 and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Physical Education from Long Beach State in 1991.

## 2010 Review

The University of Utah volleyball team ended its 2010 season 17-14 overall and finished third in its final season in the Mountain West Conference with an 11-5 record against league foes.

The Utes were 11-3 at Crimson Court and are now 23-4 at home since 2008. Utah was 6-2 in home matches against conference opponents.

Utah ended its MWC era in impressive fashion with a pair of road wins at then-No. 14 Colorado State and Wyoming during the final week of the season.

Utah upset No. 14 Colorado State, 3-1 (15-25, 25-23, 25-21, 25-21), Nov. 24 at Moby Arena. This was the Utes' first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent since defeating Colorado State on Nov. 22, 2008 at Crimson Court. The Utes had only seven service errors in the four-set match, compared to eight for the Rams.

**Danielle Killpack** earned the last MWC Player of the Week award of the season after posting team-high averages of 3.86 kills and 1.86 blocks per set against the Rams and Cowgirls. Killpack also led the Utes with a .659 hitting percentage, posting a flawless performance on the attack over the weekend with 27 kills on 41 swings without a single attack error.

Earlier in the season, Utah rallied from a 2-1 deficit to beat Northwestern, 3-2 (19-25, 25-23, 19-25, 25-23, 15-12), to win the Northwestern Challenge title Sept. 4 at Welsh-Ryan Arena.

Utah had three hitters with double-figures in kills, led by Northwestern Challenge Most Valuable Player **Karolina Bartkowiak**, who had 15 kills, four blocks and one block against the host Wildcats. **Morgan Odale** and **Keisha Fisher** were named to the all-tournament team. Odale had her third double-double of the season, second consecutive, with 13 kills and 12 digs to go along with two blocks.

Redshirt freshman **Brooke McAlister** set a new career high with 15 kills and four digs.

In Utah's annual Deseret First Duel rivalry with BYU, Odale had a match-high 19 kills and Utah swept BYU (25-16, 25-21, 25-18) Oct. 1 in the season's opening Deseret First Duel match in Provo. The Utes outhit the Cougars .362 to .194 and came up with 43 digs compared to 29 for BYU. Odale registered her 19 kills on 42 swings with three errors for a .381 hitting percentage to go along with eight digs and two blocks.

Bartkowiak became the 12th member of Utah's 1,000-kill club as the Utes defeated BYU, 3-2 (18-25, 25-20, 21-25, 25-12, 15-6), in the year's second Deseret First Duel match Oct. 29 at Crimson Court. It was Utah's third consecutive five-set win for the Utes over BYU at Crimson Court. Utah outhit the Cougars .248 to .123 in the match and held a 15-10 edge in blocks.

Utah has not lost to BYU since Nov. 7, 2007 and has taken 14 of the last 17 matchups against the Cougars since 2003.

All three members of the Ute senior class achieved a milestone in their final appearance at Crimson Court in a four-set Senior Day win over TCU on Nov. 20. Fisher set the school's career dig record. Bartkowiak moved into 10th place on the school's all-time kills list, while **Stephanie Neeley** joined Utah's 3,000-assist club.

Four Utah players - Fisher, Bartkowiak, Redd and Odale - were named to the 2010 all-MWC Volleyball Team while Odale was also selected as the Freshman of the Year.

Bartkowiak went on to earn Honorable Mention All-AVCA West Region recognition and finished her Utah career with 1,115 kills, which stands ninth in school history. She is tied for seventh in school history with a .281 hitting percentage.

In only three years as a full-time starter at the libero position, Fisher set the school-record with 1,608 career digs. Fisher had 498 digs this season, which also stands first in school history.

Odale finished her freshman campaign in the MWC's top 10 in six different statistical categories. Odale was listed second in the conference-only stats with 0.35 service aces per set, sixth with 3.86 points per set and is seventh with 3.21 kills per set against league opponents. Odale was fourth in the overall statistics with 3.90 points per set, seventh in kills (3.28/set) and 10th in service aces (0.25/set).

Redd, a freshman middle blocker, finished second in the MWC with a .354 hitting percentage, which ties Bartkowiak's 2008 mark for fourth in school history. She was second place in the conference-only stats with a .368 clip in league matches.
