UTEP Spring Game

The UTEP football team will conclude its spring season by hosting the annual spring game on April 15 at 7 p.m. MT in Sun Bowl Stadium. The event affords fans the opportunity to watch the team in full pads for the first time this year in a one-hour scrimmage, which will also feature one-on-one drills and two-man pod action.

The "UTEP Spring Football Fest" will start at 5 p.m. in the North Sun Bowl parking lot with 1,000 free hot dogs for fans and students (courtesy of the UTEP Residence Hall Association), plus inflatables and games. UTEP students will also receive free hats. The pre-game festivities will also feature live music from local band Formal Intent, which recently performed at the South by Southwest festival in Austin. The band will take the stage at 5:30 p.m. A pep rally will usher in the spring game starting at 6:30 p.m. Full concessions will be sold in the Sun Bowl as well.

Miner fans are also in for a treat, with live in-game player interactions providing unprecedented access and information. There will also be free commemorative spring-game posters available, which should come in handy during the post-game autograph session with the seniors for the 2016 team and head coach Sean Kugler. UTEP football season tickets for the 2016 campaign are on sale and may be purchased by calling (915) 747-6150 or visiting the UTEP Athletics Season Ticket Office, located in Brumbelow Building Room 109 next to the Don Haskins Center.

Roster Rundown

UTEP returns 47 lettermen (24 offensive, 21 defensive and two special teams) from the 2015 team, which finished 5-7. The Miners have 17 starters (eight offensive, six defensive and three special teams) coming back. The offensive line will be counted on to provide stability with four starters returning (**Will Hernandez**, **Derek Elmendorff**, **Jerome Daniels** and **John De La Rosa**). The line concluded the season ranked first in Conference USA and tied for sixth nationally in fewest sacks allowed with only 12. Also Adding experience on offense will be quarterback **Mack Leftwich**, tight end **Hayden Plinke**, wide receiver **Tyler Batson** and fullback **Darrin Laufasa**. Two-year starters **Nick Usher** and **Gino Bresolin** return for their senior season. Entering their second season with the Miners is junior **Sky Logan**, sophomore **Kalon Beverley** and sophomore **Michael Lewis**. Rounding out the defense is junior **Alvin Jones**. #5 THINGS

1. UTEP returns 47 lettermen (24 offensive, 21 defensive and two special teams) from the 2015 team, which finished 5-7. The Miners have 17 starters (eight offensive, six defensive and three special teams) coming back.
2. UTEP will also have 24 newcomers in the mix, with 23 coming out of high school and a massive 19 hail from the state of Texas. Of those 19, seven of the newcomers are home-grown talent from El Paso
3. After only playing five home games last season, the Miners are slated to have seven home games during the 2016 campaign. The team will open play on Sept. 3 versus I-10 rival NM State. UTEP will look to extend its seven-game winning streak against the Aggies.
4. Aaron Jones has already registered 10 showings for 100-plus yard game hitting the century mark in his career. Jones is tied for fifth in program history with Paul Smith (1996-99) in 100-yard performances.
5. Alvin Jones led the Miners in just about every defensive category – tackles (93), solo stops (48), tackles for loss (14.5), sacks (6.5) and recorded a pair of safeties. Jones's tackles for loss total are tied for ninth in program history and were tied for second with two other players in Conference USA.

Also looking to continue to contribute this season on special teams is kicker **Jay Mattox**, punter **Alan Luna** and punt returner **Jaquan White**. UTEP will also have 24 newcomers in the mix, with 23 coming out of high school and one junior-college transfer.

Coaching Change Up

After his third season as the head football coach, **Sean Kugler** made some changes to the coaching staff. Leading the offense is offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach **Brent Pease**. The 25-year coaching veteran spent six seasons on Chris Petersen's Boise State. Also on offense is wide receivers coach **Theron Aych**, who spent the last five seasons at Angelo State as the offensive coordinator and assistant head coach. On defense, defensive coordinator and linebackers coach **Tom Mason** brings nearly 40 years of coaching experience. Mason was the defensive coordinator at SMU for seven years. Making his way to the Sun City is cornerbacks coach **Derrius Bell**. Bell worked on Mason's staff at SMU for three seasons and played for him for three seasons. Rounding off the new staff is assistant special teams coordinator, recruiting coordinator and safeties coach **Don Yanowsky**. Yanowsky comes to UTEP with over three decades of coaching experience on both sides of the line of scrimmage. Together the new coaching staff brings over 100 years of experience.

Young Coaching

Head Coach **Sean Kugler** sealed his coaching staff in February with the addition of **Derrius Bell** as the cornerbacks' coach. Bell is the fourth youngest coach in college football at the age of 27. Assistant coach Sean Duggan from Hawaii is the youngest coach at 22, followed by Patrick Toney from UTSA and Brett Ekkens from Akron both at 26. Bell played under defensive coordinator **Tom Mason** before serving on his coaching staff for three seasons.

Aaron is Back

Though **Aaron Jones's** 2015 season came to an early close due to a season-ending injury, the El Paso native had a memorable couple games. Jones, who still has two years of eligibility, set a program record while moving up on the all-time rushing list. The junior rushed for 209 yards (104.5 p/g) on 32 attempts (6.5 avg.) and a touchdown, while adding another 106 yards on nine receptions (11.8 avg.) and another score. Jones set a program record with a 91-yard scamper for a touchdown at Texas Tech on Sept. 6. Against the Red Raiders, before leaving the contest with the injury, Jones ran for 139 yards in the first half, while it was his seventh-best performance. The 100-plus yard game was also the 10th time Jones hit the century mark in his career. Jones is tied for fifth in program history with **Paul Smith** (1996-99) in 100-yard performances. Jones has rushed for 2,341 yards in his career, ranking no. 7 on the all-time list. Jones needs 77 yards to move past **Donald Buckram's** 2,417 yards. **John Harvey** (3,576 yards) is the all-time leading rusher in school history. Jones also racked up 162 all-purpose yards in Lubbock, giving him 2,754 in his career. Jones needs 477 yards to crack the top 10 list in program history. The week before at Arkansas, Jones registered a career-high 83 yards receiving on six catches (tied career best). In his career, Jones has 20 total touchdowns (16 rush, 4 rec.).

Receiving Experience

After having inexperience at the wide receiver position last season, four pass catchers in **Tyler Batson** (Junior), **Cole Freytag** (Senior), **Warren Redix** (Sophomore) and **Jaquan White** (Senior) will bring much experience into the 2016 campaign. The four WRs combined for 105 receptions, 1,348 yards and 14 touchdowns. White led the team in catches (41), receiving yards (494) and touchdowns (seven). Batson registered the longest catch of 2015, a 76-yard touchdown reception against Florida Atlantic. Freytag chipped in with a few big plays, hauling in a 48-yard touchdown at NM State and recording a career-long 58-yard catch at FIU. Redix completed his first full season, as the sophomore made big contributions in the second half of the season. Redix registered a career-high 75 yards receiving at Old Dominion and scored his first career touchdown on a 32-yard reception at North Texas. Prior to the 2015 season, Batson, Freytag and White combined for six receptions, 117 yards and a touchdown.

Plinke's Breakout Season

Transfer **Hayden Plinke** turned in one of the better performances by a UTEP tight end in quite sometime. In his first season with the Miners, Plinke tallied 37 receptions for 405 yards, ranking second in both categories for the Miners this season. Plinke's yards and receptions are the most by a UTEP tight end during the **Sean Kugler** era. Plinke's yards are the most by a UTEP tight end since **Brian Natkin's** 787 yards on 64 receptions in 2000. Plinke earned recognition early on garnering John Mackey Award Midseason Watch List honors. Plinke registered a career-high nine receptions for 85 yards against

Rice. The senior also gained a career-high 87 yards on four receptions at Texas Tech. The tight end didn't stop there hauling in four passes for 80 yards, including a career-long 57-yard grab in a victory over Incarnate Word.

Alvin Wreaking Havoc on the Gridiron

Junior **Alvin Jones** had a breakout 2015 campaign. The El Paso native led the Miners in just about every defensive category – tackles (93), solo stops (48), tackles for loss (14.5), sacks (6.5) and recorded a pair of safeties. Jones's tackles for loss total are tied for ninth in program history and were tied for second with two other players in Conference USA. Jones amassed 5.0 tackles for loss at NM State, the most since 2000 (Menson Holloway) in a single game, while it was the second-best performance in C-USA. Jones averaged 7.8 tackles per contest, ranking no. 12 in C-USA. Against UTSA, Jones racked up a career-high 3.0 sacks and tied his career best with 11 tackles in three separate contests (at NM State, vs. Rice, vs. LA Tech). Jones needs 5.0 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss to crack the all-time lists.

Position Shuffle

With the defense under new leadership, defensive coordinator **Tom Mason** looks to change the formation to a 3-4. With the new formation, five Miners have switched to the linebacker position (**Mookie Carlile, Silas Firstley, Leon Hayes, Lawrence Montegut** and **Nick Usher**). Carlile and Hayes were defensive backs in 2015, while Firstley, Montegut and Usher will make the switch from the defensive line. Of the 13 linebackers listed on the roster, two of them (**Cooper Foster & Alvin Jones**) have true experience at the position. Both played in all games, as Jones led the team in tackles and Foster tallied five stops in 2015.

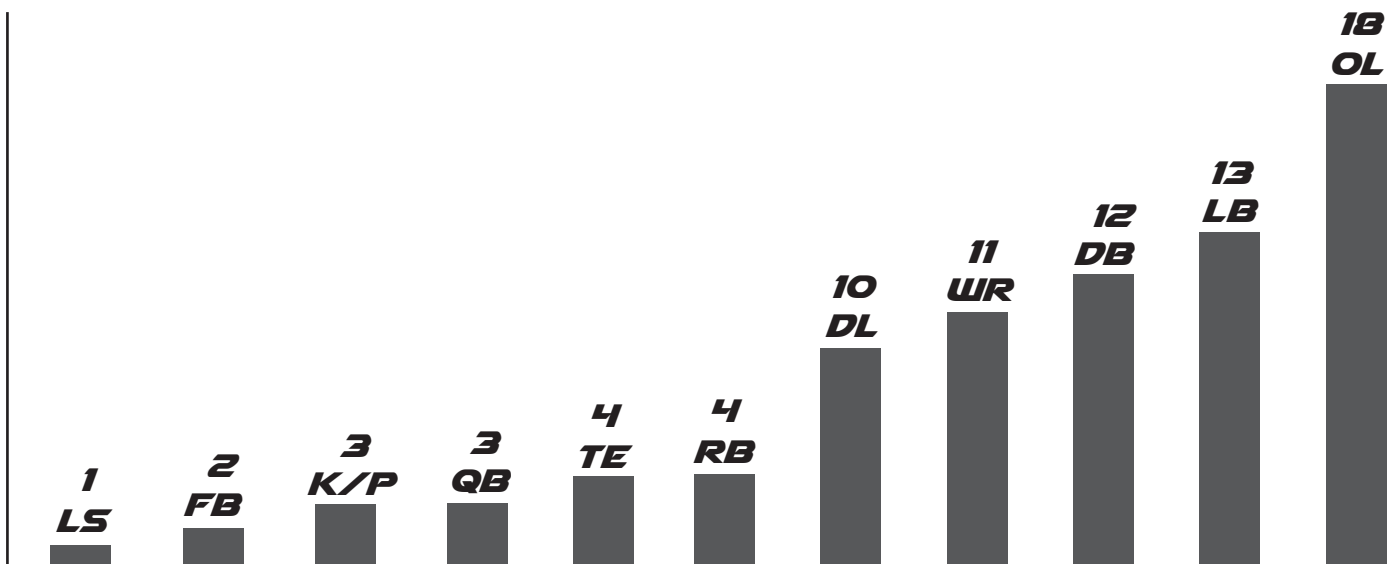
Luna on the Watch

Alan Luna did a solid job booting punts in his first season with the Miners. The native of El Paso finished the season tied for second in Conference USA and 16th nationally in punting average (44.4). His average also ranks sixth best during a single season in program history. Luna has kicked 65 punts for 2,885 yards, including 15 inside the 20-yard line and 21 punts of 50 or more yards (most in C-USA). The sophomore recorded a season-high in punts (eight), yards (375) and average (46.9) at FIU on Oct. 10. Luna's season long is 61 yards at Old Dominion, while he's booted a 60-yard punt, a feat he has achieved in four separate games (at Arkansas, at Texas Tech, vs. Incarnate Word at Old Dominion). In his first season, Luna garnered Ray Guy watch list and All-C-USA honorable mention honors.

Mattox's Career Rankings

Jay Mattox has left his mark at UTEP having already connecting on 98-of-100 extra points and 35-of-50 field goals during his career. Mattox currently ranks third in program history with 203 kicking points, while Ricky Bishop is second with 222. Reagan Schneider is the career leader for kickers with 287 points. Mattox's 98 PATs ranks second in program history with Bishop's. Schneider has 137 PATs, ranking first all-time in program history. Mattox's field goal kicking drastically improved from his freshman season, as he connected on 7-of-15 FGs (47 percent) in 2013. The last two seasons, Mattox has connected on 80 percent (28-of-35) of his three-point attempts.
