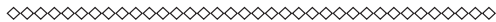

Remember to visit our Hall of Fame display located in the northwest concourse of the McKay Center.

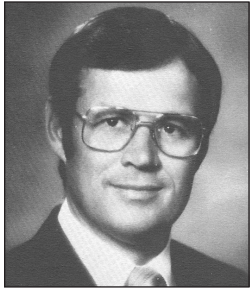
Criteria

5. Former coaches or others who have contributed significantly to Wolverine Athletics may be eligible.

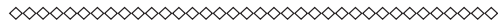

Dr. J. Marvin Higbee has been a great supporter of Utah Valley University Athletics over the years. As president of the institution from 1982 to 1988, he hired the school's first full-time athletic director, Mike Jacobsen, and helped to create the vision of what Wolverine Athletics could become. When Dr. Higbee took over the reins of the school, the Wolverines had no basketball arena, and only a handful of fledgling intercollegiate programs. He was the driving force behind the planning and building of the Activity Center, which became the main arena for men's and women's basketball from 1984 to 1996, and has continued to be the site for intercollegiate volleyball and wrestling to this day.

Dr. Higbee provided the impetus to develop the Wolverine Athletic program into one of the premier NJCAA programs in the nation. His leadership, vision, and dynamic support helped paved the way for what has become a truly unique and outstanding athletic program. After leaving Utah Valley, Dr. Higbee continued to be a loyal supporter of Wolverine athletics.

Dr. Higbee is a local product – a graduate of Lincoln High School in Orem. He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from nearby Brigham Young University, and has a doctorate in educational administration and psychology from the University of Southern California.

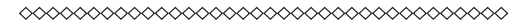
Before coming to UVU, Dr. Higbee served as the Assistant Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University of Texas and was the President of Snow College from 1974-1982

After leaving UVU, Dr. Higbee served as corporate director of education marketing and sales at Novell, a worldwide computer software vendor. He then took a position as the senior vice president of the education division of Wicat Systems Inc., a technology-based education and training company. He has served on the Board of Directors of the Mountain Valley Chapter of American Red Cross, and the Board of Directors of the Utah Humanities Council. Dr. Higbee has long been a respected civic and educational leader in the local community.

Dr. Higbee lives in Saratoga Springs, Utah, with his wife, the former Ethelynn Goodrich, who was born in Vernal, Utah and raised in Moses Lake Washington. They are the parents of eight children, and have 48 grandchildren with a 49th on the way.

*Cross Country (1998-2000)*



Marie was an outstanding track and cross country athlete at UVU from 1998 to 2000. She was the NJCAA National Champion in the 10,000 meter run in 2000 and earned All-America honors. She also won the Region Championship in the 10,000 meters. In cross country she finished fourth in the nation in both the 1998 and 1999 seasons, earning All-America honors both years. She led UVU to a 2nd-place team finish at nationals in 1998 and a 3rd-place finish in 1999. She also earned All-Region Cross Country honors both years, and was named UVU's cross country MVP her freshman and sophomore years. She was also named the school's Female Athlete of the Year for the 1999-2000 season.

Marie was also an outstanding student. She earned an associate's degree at UVU, garnering NJCAA Academic All-America honors in 1999 and 2000. She also served as the UVU Student Athlete Council chairperson.

Before coming to UVU, Marie lettered four years in cross country and track at Orem High School. She was selected team MVP and Runner of the Year for the 1996-97 season. She was named All-Region three years in cross country and twice in track and was an All-State selection in cross country three times.

After leaving UVU, Marie ran track and cross country for nearby Brigham Young University. She earned a bachelor's degree in recreation management and youth leadership at BYU and completed a special education licensure program as well.

Marie took a job as the assistant track and cross country coach at Orem High school in 2001. In 2004 she became the head coach at Orem. She led her women's track team to two State Championship titles and two Region titles. In cross country her teams won two Region titles and finished second in the state twice. Along with her coaching duties, Marie also taught the severe unit of special education at Orem High and spent a year as the student council advisor. She was also a home/hospital teacher for Alpine School District for severely disabled twin girls.

Glahn left the coaching ranks in 2008. She currently teaches special education seminary for the LDS Church at Orem High School. In 2003 she married Peter Glahn. Peter and Marie now have two children, Gracie and Daniel. Marie was born in Provo, Utah., the daughter of Richard and Connie Hodson.
