



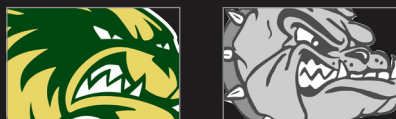

### Wolverines Travel to Gonzaga Wednesday

Utah Valley will hit the road for the first time this season when the Wolverines (1-1) travel to Spokane, Wash. to face Gonzaga on Wednesday at 7 p.m. MT. The game can be heard live by going to [WolverineGreen.com](http://WolverineGreen.com).

UVU is 1-1 after splitting two games over the weekend. The Wolverines fell 94-71 to Montana State despite big games from Robyn Fairbanks and Julie McMurray. Fairbanks had 31 points and 13 rebounds and McMurray scored 25 but the Bobcats spoiled the home opener and ended UVU's 15-game home winning streak.

A day later, Utah Valley rebounded with a blowout win over Mesa State, 83-39. Five different players reached double figures in the win led by 22 from Fairbanks.

Lauren Smith finished with 10 points and a career-high 12 rebounds for her first career double-double. McMurray also had a double-double with 12 points and 10 boards.

## DIVISION I UPDATE

Utah Valley University is in its sixth and final year of a provisional period transitioning from junior college athletics to NCAA Division I.

The school was a member of the NJCAA until the end of the 2002-03 season, which was the school's exploratory year.

From 2003-04 until the end of the 2008-09 school year, the athletics department will compete under the status, 'provisional'.

UVU will be eligible for postseason play beginning in 2009-10.

## About Gonzaga

The Bulldogs are 2-0 after knocking off Pac-10 Washington on Sunday in Seattle. Courtney Vandersloot and Tiffanie Shives combined for 39 points as Gonzaga beat the Huskies 64-59 while forcing 30 Washington turnovers.

Junior Heather Bowman was one of 30 players named to the pre-season Women's Wooden Award list for the top player in college basketball.

Spokane is home to the largest defeat in school history for Utah Valley. In a game that opened the McCarthy Athletic Center, Gonzaga outscored the Wolverines 54-17 in the second half on its way to a 46-point win, 87-41.

## Last Meeting vs. the Bulldogs

Dec. 31, 2007 (Orem, Utah) -- Five players scored in double figures as Utah Valley used a big second half to defeat Gonzaga 94-73 in The McKay Center.

The Wolverines (12-3) outscored Gonzaga (8-6) 51-34 in the second half. Robyn Fairbanks led the way for UVU with 29 points and 14 rebounds while Sandy Marvin added 23 on 7-for-10 shooting.

Rebekah Peterson had a season high 14 points, Julie McMurray chipped in 12 and Jordyn Bowen had a career high 11 points to round out the double figure scorers.

Peterson, McMurray and Bowen each had eight rebounds in the game, with Bowen setting a career high on the glass as the Wolverines outrebounded the Bulldogs 50-28.

Vivian Frieson led the Bulldogs with 20 points and eight rebounds and Jami Bjorklund had 16 for GU, who was without its leading scorer and rebounder, Heather Bowman, for the fifth straight game.

## 2008-09 Season Preview

For Utah Valley University the upcoming 2008-09 season will mark the end of one era and the beginning of another. The Wolverines, who have been a Division I independent since 2003 will play their final season as a provisional school and also shed the label of independent as they join the Great West Conference.

Head coach Cathy Nixon has what will be her first trio of experienced and tested seniors in Robyn Fairbanks, Hollie Beaman and the newly married Sandy Marvin-Wall. Those three have combined to start 241 of 249 games in three seasons with Fairbanks starting all 83 in her career.

"It's really a nice luxury to have seniors that have been here and carried the load of playing time like these kids have. It really is the first time in my coaching career that has been the case and so I'm finding some things easier so far," said Nixon. "Their level of maturity and how they're really taking control of the team and helping bring the younger players along is already evident."

Fairbanks and Marvin-Wall are the first two Utah Valley players to reach 1,000 career points with Fairbanks poised to become the first 2,000 point scorer somewhere around the nine-game mark in December (she enters the

season with 1,802 career points and a 21.7 points per game career average).

Fairbanks' resume is an impressive one. It's a long list that includes two All-America seasons, consecutive Division I Independent Player of the Year awards and a stat line from 07-08 that reads 23.8 points, 9.7 rebounds, 1.2 blocks and a .579 field goal percentage. Her points averaged ranked her fourth in the country among DI players and she was also in the top 25 in both rebounding and field goal percentage.

A year after finishing third in the nation with 23.7 points per game and WBCA Honorable Mention All-America distinction, Fairbanks earned Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America status as a junior and was the unanimous selection for her second straight DI Independent Player of the Year award.

"The thing about Robyn that I talk the most about is that she has an adorable personality. To have a player at this point in our program like her has been irreplaceable. I reflect sometimes on what Robyn's done from her very first game as a freshman (21 points, 19 rebounds) and I think that's one of the things that makes her the most special. She doesn't have an outbreak game here or there. She has done something great and special every game that she's played here and you don't see that very often at any level in athletics."

Marvin-Wall has seen her numbers increase in each of her three seasons as well. She finished third on the team with 15.2 points per game in 2007-08 and was named to the Division I All-Independent First Team. Beaman, who is the school leader in career assists, and Lauren Smith are the other two four-year seniors on the squad.

Also returning is last year's second leading scorer, junior Julie McMurray and her 15.3 points per game. McMurray along with Marvin-Wall and Fairbanks combined to average 54.2 of the Wolverines' 77.5 points per game. McMurray was named Second Team All-Independent in 2007-08.

Asumi Nakayama, Blake Reynolds and Jordyn Bowen are the remaining three returners that saw action a season ago. They'll be joined by redshirts Kayla Burningham and Kim Koeven, who both redshirted after transferring to UVU. Both Burningham and Koeven will be sophomores.

Nixon has four freshmen on her roster led by Bingham High School graduate Erika Newbold. Spanish Fork High School's Jenna Johnson, Whitney Dunlop (Snow Canyon HS, St. George, Utah) and Jacie Estes (Lake City HS, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho) round out the 2008-09 roster.

"The addition of the redshirt kids we have with Kayla and Kim and the freshmen; Erika, who is going to a factor in the paint and Jenna, who is coming along really well, will help us to be better suited to play against some of those teams that we really didn't matchup very well with last year."

"The maturity of our team will definitely be an advantage. I really do anticipate this team to be more consistent. We have a better level of maturity individually and collectively, we've added some weapons I think both offensively and defensively."

In each of the last three seasons Utah Valley has improved its win total from the year before. If that happens this year the Wolverines will be no fluke. The 2008-09 schedule is

undoubtedly the deepest and most challenging in the school's six-year NCAA history. It includes a merciless first month that opens with a home game against Montana State, and after a game against Mesa State in Orem, the Wolverines will play their next six away from The McKay Center against some big-name schools.

That trek begins at Gonzaga, a team that won the regular season West Coast Conference title and won 25 games a year ago. Following the game in Spokane, UVU will travel to The Pit in Albuquerque to face New Mexico, a team that has seven consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Boise State, a team that finished 14-2, waits after that before a trip to Hawai'i to face the Rainbow Wahine. After a game at the University of Hawai'i in Honolulu, the Wolverines will play in the Seaside Challenge at BYU-Hawai'i in Lai'e where they'll face the USC Trojans of the Pac-10 and West Coast Conference tournament champion San Diego.

Following that trip Utah Valley will return home to face Idaho State, a 2008 WNIT team and then host its first ever-SEC team when Mississippi State comes to Orem on Dec. 19.

"I do feel like first month of the season is going to be a real test for us. We're playing many of the same opponents that we played in the first month last year but now we're playing most of them on the road and that tends to be a little bit different challenge."

The rest of the schedule includes several teams that had success last year including Portland State, Chicago State, North Dakota State and 20-game winner Ohio.

The Wolverines will play two in state games, both in January, against Utah State and Southern Utah. Both are teams that UVU beat on the road last season.

The schedule will wrap in early March with UVU hosting the Division I Independent Championship. Presumably the last independent tournament that Utah Valley will be a part of as it joins the Great West for conference play in 2009-10.

Chicago State, Longwood, NJIT, Savannah State and Texas-Pan American are the five other schools that will compete in the Independent Championship.

"I'm really excited for this year and I think as a program and a team we're really excited. I look forward to this year in many ways because our schedule is harder than it's ever been, our team is more talented than it's ever been and the supporting cast around our core is better than it's ever been," said Nixon.

"It seemed when it first started six years ago it was a huge mountain and we were at the bottom. I do feel like we've made big strides but we're definitely not at the summit yet. We've still got a long way to go. In some ways many of the more difficult parts of it are still ahead, but I'm looking forward to the challenge."

## UTAH VALLEY UNIVERSITY JOINS GREAT WEST CONFERENCE

On June 10th Utah Valley University Director of Athletics Mike Jacobsen announced at a press conference the school's new affiliation with the Great West Conference. The Great West is expanding from a football-only conference to include at least seven schools and 14 sports.



By expanding to an all-sports league, the Great West has invited seven schools to enter under the Great West umbrella and begin competing in several sports in the 2008-09 year. Teams will begin to play full conference schedules in team sports and conduct the full complement of championships in 2009-10.

The schools joining UVU as members of the all-sports league are Chicago State, Houston Baptist University, New Jersey Institution of Technology (NJIT), the University of North Dakota, University of South Dakota, and the University of Texas-Pan American.

OREM, Utah - Despite a big night from Robyn Fairbanks and Julie McMurray, the Utah Valley women's basketball team dropped its season opener, 94-71, to Montana State on Friday night in Orem.

Fairbanks had 31 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks, and McMurray added 25 as the Canadian duo combined for 55 of the Wolverines' (0-1) 71 points.

The Bobcats (1-0) scored 55 second half points after holding a five-point lead at halftime to stop Utah Valley's 15-game winning streak inside The McKay Center.

"It's unacceptable to give up 94 points. Not here at home, not on the road," said head coach Cathy Nixon. "I've got to dig down into those kids and get them to work harder. Montana State is a very good basketball team, they played well. But we absolutely did not defensively do what we needed to do."

Montana State used a 36-17 run over a 10-minute span of the second half, turning a one point MSU lead into an 86-66 edge with just over three minutes remaining.

Fairbanks hit 12-of-21 from the field and 7-for-10 from the free-throw line for her 13th career 30 point game and 33rd career double-double. The senior finished fourth among Division I players in 2007-08 with 23.8 points per game.

MSU got a balanced scoring attack with six players in double figures led by 15 apiece from Erica Perry and Sarah Strand. Former Mountain View High School (Orem) star Nubia Garcia had 14 points and nine rebounds while Jenny Heringer and a double-double with 12 points and 11 boards.

In the opening half, the Bobcats used a 10-0 run on field goals from five different players to take a 21-12 lead at the 12:25 mark. The Wolverines came right back with 11 straight to take a two point edge, 25-23 with McMurray scoring the last seven of the run for UVU.

After McMurray hit two free throws put the Wolverines up 34-31, Montana State ended the half on an 8-0 run to take a 39-34 lead into the break.

OREM, Utah - Five different players reached double figures led by 22 points from Robyn Fairbanks as Utah Valley rebounded from Friday's loss for a big 83-39 win over Mesa State on Saturday afternoon.

Fairbanks was 10-for-11 from the field while Kayla Burningham and Sandy Marvin-Wall both had 14 points. Julie McMurray added 12 and 10 rebounds and Lauren Smith had 10 points and a career-high 12 boards for her first career double-double.

"She went in there with no fear and an attitude and just established herself physically," said head coach Cathy Nixon of Smith. "She's been working hard, she had a great off-season and I'm excited for her."

Defensively, the Wolverines (1-1) forced 26 turnovers and limited the Mavericks to 28.6 percent (16-for-56) from the field while also winning the rebounding battle 44-to-27. UVU offset its own 23 turnovers by hitting 55.4 percent (31-for-56) from the field including 9-of-16 (56.3) from the three-point line.

"When we do play good team defense I think we're going to be a very good team. Defense and rebounding is where we have to find our identity," said Nixon. "I hope that we can learn a lesson that if we can focus on the process, regardless of who we play, that we can be successful."

After a sluggish start allowed Mesa State to take a 13-9 lead midway through the opening half, the Wolverines rattled off 15 straight points to take a 24-13 advantage and control of the game. Kim Koeven's three with 9:37 left in the first half gave UVU a 14-13 edge, a lead they wouldn't relinquish.

Overall, the Wolverines ended the half on a 30-to-3 run capped off by a Smith lay in from Hollie Beaman, one of her seven assists, right as time expired to put UVU up 39-16 at the break.

UVU extended the lead as much as 46 in the second half when Marvin-Wall hit one of her three, three-pointers with 32 seconds left.
