Game Storylines

- Following consecutive wins at Heinz Field, including last week's dramatic 37-34 victory over Georgia Tech, Pitt hits the road to take on Coastal Division foe Virginia.

- In three ACC meetings between Pitt and Virginia, the average victory margin has been just 7.7 points. The Panthers claimed a 26-19 decision at Heinz in 2015.

- Pitt seeks its first win in Charlottesville since a 26-0 victory in 1953. Pitt dropped each of its last two games at Virginia, 24-19 in 2014 and 44-14 in 2007.

- Virginia has rallied from an 0-3 start to win its past two games, a 49-35 victory over previously unbeaten Central Michigan and a 34-20 road win at Duke.

- Virginia is under the new direction of Bronco Mendenhall, who spent the prior 11 seasons as head coach at BYU. Mendenhall led BYU to a bowl game each year of his tenure.

- Pitt's Ejuan Price is making a strong case for All-America and ACC Defensive Player of the Year honors. The senior defensive end leads the entire nation in quarterback sacks (8.5) and tackles for loss (12.5). Price has logged at least one sack in each contest this season.

- Ejuan Price spearheads a stingy Pitt rushing defense that surrenders just 98.3 yards per contest. The Panthers rank 10th nationally and second in the ACC in fewest rushing yards allowed.

- Offensively, the Panthers are averaging 37.3 points per game. Pitt has scored at least 36 points in five consecutive games for the first time in program history.

- The Panthers boast one of college football's most dangerous all-purpose players in Quadree Henderson, who is a threat in the run, pass and return game. The sophomore wide receiver is second nationally in total all-purpose yards with 1,046.

✓ In his debut campaign at Pitt in 2015, Pat Narduzzi led the Panthers to an 8-4 regular-season record, their best 12-game mark since 2009, and a Military Bowl invitation. Pitt finished as the runner-up in the ACC Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, its best conference record ever.

✓ Pitt boasted the ACC's top offensive and defensive newcomers in 2015. Safety Jordan Whitehead was named the league's Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tailback Qadree Ollison, a third-string reserve when the season began, was named the Offensive Rookie of the Year following a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

✓ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State. Under his direction, the Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14. Working under two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year Mark Dantonio, Narduzzi helped Michigan State to five Top 25 finishes.

✓ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State in one of the most thrilling games of the 2014-15 bowl season.

✓ Michigan State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

✓ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. In the wake of that championship season, Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

✓ Narduzzi has tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy.

✓ Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.

✓ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

✓ Narduzzi coached 19 first-team All-Big Ten selections. Four players won the conference's top individual awards under his watch, including two Big Ten Defensive Back of the Year honorees (Dennard in 2013 and Drummond in 2014). Shilique Calhoun was the Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year in 2013 while Greg Jones was the overall Defensive Player of the Year in 2009.

✓ Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.

✓ In 2003, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hooppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

✓ While quarterback Ben Roethlisberger headlined Miami's offense in 2003, Narduzzi's stout unit topped the MAC in rushing defense (19th nationally), scoring defense (22nd nationally) and pass efficiency defense (34th nationally).

✓ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense.

✓ From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

✓ Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.

✓ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) Coach of the Year.

SERIES NOTES

This is the ninth meeting between Pitt and Virginia in a series that dates back to 1953...Pitt leads the overall series, 5-3, and won last year's encounter at Heinz Field, 26-19...the Panthers lead the ACC series, 2-1...Pitt is 4-0 against the Cavaliers in Pittsburgh and 1-2 in Charlottesville...the Panthers dropped each of their past two games at Virginia, 24-19 in 2014 and 44-14 in 2007...Pitt's only road win in the series occurred in 1953 (26-0)...the lone postseason encounter took place in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl in Charlotte, a game that featured Pitt receiver Larry Fitzgerald and UVA standouts Matt Schaub at quarterback and Heath Miller at tight end...the Cavaliers won that bowl matchup, 23-16.

TEAM NOTES

SEEKING WIN #5...

Pitt is 4-2 following its 37-34 win over Georgia Tech last week. A victory at Virginia this Saturday would give the Panthers their fifth win in seven games. Since 2000, only eight Pitt teams have achieved at least five wins in the season's opening seven contests. Last season, in Pat Narduzzi's first year as head coach, the Panthers were 6-1 after seven games.

CLOSE SHAVES

Under Pat Narduzzi, the Panthers have a winning record in close contests. Narduzzi has directed Pitt to a 7-5 record in games decided by single digits, including this season's 37-34 win over Georgia Tech (Oct. 8) and 42-39 victory over Penn State (Sept. 10).

In contrast, the Panthers were 1-5 in single-digit contests in 2014, the year before Narduzzi's arrival. From 2010-14, Pitt was 8-17 in such games.

HEARTBREAK HOTEL

Pitt's two losses this season—both on the road—have been by a combined eight points. The Panthers lost at North Carolina (Sept. 24), 37-36, falling on a touchdown pass with two seconds to go. A week prior (Sept. 17), Pitt lost to Oklahoma State, 45-38, when the host Cowboys scored on a one-yard run with 1:28 remaining.

HEINZ SUCCESS

Pitt is 4-0 at home this season. The Panthers last won their opening four games at Heinz in 2009—winning their first six home contests—before finishing 6-1.

127 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2016 campaign marks the 127th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 708-517-42 all-time record (.575). The program's rich legacy includes 90 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.

700 CLUB

Pitt's 26-19 win over Virginia last season (Oct. 10) marked the 700th victory in program history. The Panthers are one of 23 Bowl Sub-division programs to achieve the 700-win milestone. Only five ACC schools belong to the "700 Club"—Virginia Tech (722), Georgia Tech (717), Clemson (709), Pitt (708) and Syracuse (703)—according to NCAA.org.

TURNOVER MARGIN

Pitt has been strong in the turnover margin department this season. The Panthers are plus-four with 10 takeaways compared to only six turnovers. Pitt ranks 28th nationally and third in the ACC with an 0.67 turnover margin per game.

Last season the Panthers ranked 66th in the country and seventh in the ACC with a 0.00 turnover margin (16 turnovers gained and 16 lost).

YOUR 2016 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2016 Panthers are senior offensive tackle Adam Bisnowaty, junior running back James Conner and senior defensive end Ejuan Price.

FRESH FACES

Four true freshmen have played for Pitt this season: wide receiver Maurice Ffrench, wide receiver Aaron Mathews, running back Chawntez Moss and defensive tackle Amir Watts.

Of that group, Moss has compiled the most playing time and production. Appearing in the last five contests as a reserve, Moss has rushed for 197 yards and a touchdown on 29 carries (6.8 avg.).

Ffrench has played in each of the last three games in a reserve role. In the Oct. 1 Marshall victory, he had an 11-yard touchdown run off a jet sweep. Mathews has played in the last five games, earning his first start against Marshall.

Watts has provided reserve duty on the defensive line against Villanova, Oklahoma State and Marshall.

BLUE & GOLD RALLY CAPS

Since the 2002 season, Pitt has won 27 games with second-half comebacks. The Panthers' most recent comeback was a 37-34 win over Georgia Tech (Oct. 8). Trailing 34-27 late in the fourth quarter, Pitt scored 10 points in the final 3:50, including a 31-yard field goal by Chris Blewitt as time expired, to complete the win.

It was the second time in his career that Blewitt capped a fourth-quarter rally with a walk-off field goal at the end of regulation. On Oct. 24, 2015, he kicked a 25-yard field goal on the final play to defeat host Syracuse, 23-20. The Panthers entered the fourth quarter trailing the Orange, 17-13.

That Syracuse victory marked the first time since 2009 that Pitt rallied to win when facing a fourth-quarter deficit. The Panthers previously had not overcome a deficit in the final period since Dec. 26, 2009, when they defeated North Carolina, 19-17, in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD FOR THE RIVALRY

Prior to this season, it had been 16 long years since Pitt and Penn State met on the football field. The historic rivalry was renewed on Sept. 10 and an overflow crowd at Heinz Field was treated to arguably the most thrilling contest in the history of the series.

The Panthers defeated Penn State, 42-39, in front of 69,983 fans, the largest crowd to ever attend a sporting event in the city of Pittsburgh. Interestingly, the prior mark was also a Pitt football game. On Oct. 29, 1938, the Panthers defeated Fordham, 24-13, with 68,918 in attendance at Pitt Stadium.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

SCORING OUTBURST

Over its last five contests, Pitt has scored a combined 196 points, an average of 39.2 points per game. It is the Panthers' highest point total over a five-game stretch in 36 years.

The 1980 season was the last time a Pitt team scored more over a five-game span. That year the Panthers compiled 201 points in victories over West Virginia (42-14), Tennessee (30-6), Syracuse (43-6), Louisville (41-23) and Army (45-7), an average of 40.2 points per game.

The 2016 Panthers are the first team in school history to score at least 36 points in five consecutive games.

HISTORIC SCORING PACE

Pitt is averaging 37.3 points per game to rank 34th in the nation. The Panthers' scoring is up more than nine points per game compared to last season (28.2 avg.).

Only 13 teams in Pitt football history have averaged more than 30 points per game. The Panthers' 2016 scoring average would rank second all-time in school history.

TIME MANAGEMENT

Pitt has dominated its opponents in time of possession this season, averaging 34:34 per game to rank 11th nationally and second in the ACC. The Panthers have won the time of possession battle in five of their six games this year. The lone exception was the season opener when Villanova edged Pitt by a mere 17 seconds (30:17 to 29:43).

RUSH HOUR

The Panthers feature one of the most potent rushing attacks in the country. Pitt is averaging 244.2 rushing yards per game to rank 19th in the nation and second in the ACC.

Two seasons ago, Pitt averaged 249.5 yards on the ground over 13 games (15th in the nation and third in the ACC). It was the Panthers' highest rushing output per game since the 1988 team averaged 253.2.

The school record for rushing yards per game is 290.5 set in 1976, the same season Heisman Trophy running back Tony Dorsett ran for 2,150 yards in leading Pitt to a 12-0 record and the national championship.

JAMES CONNER: HE'S BACK

When Pitt opened the season against Villanova on Sept. 3, it had been 364 days since James Conner ran onto the Heinz Field turf to play a game for the Panthers. During that nearly year-long absence, Conner defeated Hodgkin lymphoma and rehabilitated a significant knee injury.

Conner's return has been nothing short of remarkable. He currently leads the Panthers in rushing (441 yards on 104 carries) and is second in scoring (42 points on seven touchdowns).

In 2015, Conner appeared in only one game—the opener against Youngstown State—due to a torn medial collateral ligament in his right knee. Conner sustained the injury in the second quarter against YSU. He had entered the season as one of college football's most decorated players. In 2014 Conner was selected the ACC Player of the Year after rushing for 1,765 yards and 26 touchdowns.

He was named to seven postseason All-America squads as a sophomore, including first-team honors from the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). Conner was the first Pitt running back to garner first-team All-America honors in 27 years, dating back to Craig "Ironhead" Heyward in 1987.

JESTER'S BIG NIGHT

Jester Weah was a catalyst in the Panthers' 43-27 win over Marshall (Oct. 1) by producing the highest receiving yardage by a Pitt player in 12 years. The junior compiled 176 yards on seven catches—both career highs—and made the game's decisive play when he beat a defender for a 54-yard touchdown to put Pitt up by 10 with 1:04 left.

His receiving yardage was the most by a Pitt player since Nov. 6, 2004, when Greg Lee had 188 yards (on nine catches) at Syracuse.

On the season, Weah leads Pitt in receiving yards (348), receptions (tied, 17) and touchdown catches (three). His average of 20.47 yards per reception ranks 16th in the country and second in the ACC.

HIGH PERCENTAGE FOR PETERMAN

Senior quarterback Nathan Peterman is completing passes at an excellent rate this season. Peterman has connected on 65.0% of his throws (89 of 137) to rank third in the ACC and 23rd nationally. He has also done an excellent job taking care of the football, throwing only two interceptions. The Panthers rank sixth nationally and third in the ACC this season with only two INTs thrown.

AIR-TIGHT PROTECTION

The Pitt offensive line has provided exceptional pass protection, surrendering just four sacks on the season. The Panthers lead the ACC and rank eighth nationally in sacks allowed per game with an average of 0.67. The only teams to register sacks against Pitt this year are Oklahoma State (two), Georgia Tech (one) and Villanova (one).

In 2015 the Panthers surrendered 29 sacks, an average of 2.23 per game, which ranked 73rd nationally and ninth in the ACC.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE

Pitt boasts a combined 130 starts on the offensive line, led by senior tackle Adam Bisnowaty with 36 career starts. Senior offensive guard Dorian Johnson is right behind with 35 career starting assignments.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

EJUAN PRICE: PASS RUSHER SUPREME

Senior defensive end Ejuan Price spearheads Pitt's pass rush. Price leads the nation in total sacks (8.5) and tackles for loss (12.5).

It is a continuation of his highly productive 2015 season. Last year Price led the ACC and ranked eighth nationally with an average of 0.88 sacks per game. He had 11.5 total sacks, the most by a Pitt player since 2000 when defensive end Bryan Knight also had 11.5.

Price had a game for the ages last season in the Panthers' 45-34 victory over Louisville (Nov. 21). He dominated the Cardinals' offensive front for five sacks, the most by a Bowl Subdivision player last season and one shy of the FBS record.

PITT SACK MASTERS

Pitt has an illustrious history of fierce pass rushers, evidenced by its all-time career sacks list. With 25 sacks, Ejuan Price ranks seventh on that esteemed list (tied with Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Chris Doleman).

Pitt has scored five defensive touchdowns in Pat Narduzzi's two seasons as head coach. The Panthers have two defensive TDs this year to rank first in the ACC (tied) and 12th nationally.

Junior cornerback Avonte Maddox is responsible for two of those scores under Narduzzi. He had a 33-yard interception return for a touchdown in the 43-27 win over Marshall on Oct. 1. In 2015, Maddox had a 30-yard "pick six" against Louisville.

The Pitt defense has scored 29 TDs since the 2001 season. The Panthers are 24-3 when scoring at least one defensive TD in a game during that span. (The losses occurred against Notre Dame and Navy in 2015, and Oklahoma State this season.)

Pitt has been exceptional at forcing and recovering fumbles. The Panthers are fifth in the nation and pace the ACC with seven fumble recoveries. Senior end Ejuan Price has forced three fumbles. His average of 0.50 forced fumbles per game is third in the ACC and ninth nationally.

Senior linebacker Mike Caprara has recovered two fumbles (both in the Penn State win) to lead the Panthers in that category.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

BLEWITT ECLIPSES TWO PITT CAREER MARKS

Senior placekicker Chris Blewitt this season became Pitt's all-time career kick scoring leader, eclipsing a record that stood for more than four decades. Blewitt has 315 points, surpassing Carson Long (268 points from 1973-76), who held the top spot since 1975.

In the Panthers' dramatic 37-34 win over Georgia Tech (Oct. 8), Blewitt kicked three field goals—including a game-winning 31-yarder as time expired—to set Pitt's career field goal record. He now has 52 for his career, surpassing the prior record of 50 held by Conor Lee (2006-08).

In terms of overall scoring, Blewitt ranks second. The Panthers' career scoring leader is legendary tailback Tony Dorsett, who compiled 380 points from 1973-76.

QUADREE TAKES IT TO THE HOUSE

Sophomore Quadree Henderson ranks among college football's most dangerous kick returners. Henderson leads the ACC and ranks fifth nationally with a 33.1-yard return average. He has 463 yards and a touchdown on 14 returns for the season.

In the Panthers' stirring 42-39 victory over Penn State, Henderson made one of the game's critical plays when he returned a kickoff 84 yards to the Nittany Lions' 10. Three plays later James Conner scored on a shovel pass to put Pitt up 42-31, providing the winning cushion.

In the 28-7 win against Villanova, Henderson had a 96-yard touchdown return, marking the second consecutive game he had a kick return TD. In the Panthers' 2015 Military Bowl game against Navy, he took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a score—Pitt's first 100-yard kickoff return since 1990 (Ricky Turner vs. West Virginia).

Pitt used a stifling defensive effort to defeat Villanova in the season opener for both teams...the Panthers did not surrender an offensive touchdown and limited the Wildcats to 172 total yards, including a mere 53 on the ground...the game marked the return of tailback James Conner, who saw his first action since a season-ending knee injury in the 2015 opener and defeating Hodgkin lymphoma in the offseason... Conner scored Pitt's first two touchdowns, on a three-yard run and nine-yard reception, to give the Panthers a 14-0 intermission lead... The return of the Pitt-Penn State rivalry after a 16-year hiatus proved to be worth the wait as the Panthers triumphed in front of the largest crowd to ever attend a sporting event in Pittsburgh...James Conner rushed for 117 yards and scored two TDs and cornerback Ryan Lewis intercepted a Penn State pass in the end zone with 1:15 left to seal the 42-39 victory...behind a pounding rushing attack that produced 341 yards, Pitt (2-0) achieved its highest point total ever against Penn State...the 81 combined points also marked a series high...Pitt scored touchdowns on four of its first five possessions to build a 28-7 lead...Penn State (1-1) would rally to within single-digits four times in the second half and was poised to take the lead when it reached the Pitt 31 with under two minutes to play...that's when Lewis ended the threat, and the game, by intercepting Trace McSorley's pass to the end zone...Nathan Peterman threw three TDs for Pitt, including a 12-yard shovel pass to Conner that put the Panthers up 42-31 with 10:24 left...the Panthers caused four PSU turnovers, with Ejuan Price forcing two fumbles and Mike Caprara posting two recoveries.

Pitt bolted to a 27-0 intermission lead and then held off Marshall's furious second-half rally to notch a 43-27 victory at Heinz Field...the Panthers' huge halftime advantage was sliced to 30-27 with four minutes remaining in the game...trying to burn the clock and facing a 3rd-and-3 at the Pitt 46, Nathan Peterman connected with Jester Weah on a 54-yard touchdown with 1:04 remaining to essentially seal the result...Avonte Maddox would complete the scoring with a 33-yard interception return on the game's final play...it was the second "pick six" of Maddox's career (Louisville, 2015)...Peterman completed 74% of his passes (17 of 23) for a career-high 280 yards and two touchdowns...Weah compiled 176 yards on seven receptions, an average of 25.1 yards per catch...his receiving yardage was the highest by a Pitt player since 2004 (Greg Lee, 188 yards vs. Syracuse)...freshman tailback Chawntez Moss rushed for 97 yards on 12 carries (8.1 avg.) as Pitt netted 252 on the ground and 532 total yards...Ejuan Price had two sacks for 24 yards in losses...it was the first-ever meeting between Pitt (3-2) and Marshall (1-3).
