What's On Tap

Vanderbilt hits the road for the second time in three weekends in Southeastern Conference play, taking on No. 8 Florida in Gainesville. The Commodores and Gators will open the three-game set on Friday at 5:30 p.m. CT and will continue on Saturday at 3 p.m. ET and Sunday at Noon CT. The latter two games will be televised on SUN Sports. Check your TV listings for availability in your area.

About Florida

Florida is 18-6 on the season and 4-2 in the SEC after dropping two of three against Ole Miss in Oxford last weekend. The Gators fell to in-state rival Florida State, 7-2, on Tuesday in Jacksonville.

UF has been led offensively freshman infielder Austin Maddox who is hitting .382 with seven homers, nine doubles and 33 RBI. Sophomore first baseman Preston Tucker, the SEC Co-Freshman of the Year in 2009, is second on the team with a .359 batting average with four homers, seven doubles and 20 RBI. As a team the Gators hitting at a .306 clip with 28 homers, 41 doubles and 171 run scored in 24 games (7.1 per game).

Florida's rotation for the weekend will be sophomore left-hander Alex Panteliodis (5-1, 2.03 ERA) on Friday, freshman southpaw Brian Johnson (2-1, 3.42 ERA) on Saturday and freshman right-hander Hudson Randall (2-2, 5.00 ERA) on Sunday. The Gators have a 3.97 team ERA with 190 strikeouts and 54 walks in 213.0 innings pitched.

Defensively UF has made 20 errors on the year and has a .978 fielding percentage, tied with Ole Miss for best in the SEC.

Gray Named SEC Pitcher of the Week

Sophomore pitcher Sonny Gray was named Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Week the league announced on Monday.

Gray handcuffed No. 21 Kentucky for seven innings Friday night, holding the Wildcats to just four hits while striking out six and walking three in the Commodores 7-0 win. He didn't allow a runner to third base, with the four hits allowed singles, including one of the infield variety.

It is the second combined shutout Gray has thrown this season. He is 4-2 overall with a 2.25 ERA with 39 strikeouts and 16 walks in 40.0 innings. In his two SEC starts the Smyrna native is 1-1 with a 0.71 ERA with 10 strikeouts in 12.2 innings. Opponents are hitting just .208 against him this season.

This marks the second time Gray has won the weekly award this season after receiving the nod after the right-hander threw 8.0 innings of three-hit shutout baseball in the 9-0 win over Niagara on Feb. 19. He did not allow a runner to second base (only one in game) until the eighth inning and struck out eight batters to just one walk.

In addition Gray was recently named to the College Baseball Foundation initial Pitcher of the Year Watch List for 2010. This is the second award watch list that the Smyrna, Tenn., native has been named to including the Golden Spikes Award.

Corbin Coaching Milestones

Head coach Tim Corbin notched his 400th career victory on March 24 over Wright State. His next win will be his 300th at Vanderbilt as he enters the weekend with 299 victories in his time in Nashville. Corbin is currently seven wins behind Larry Schmittou (306), who is second on the school's all-time win list. The Commodores all-time wins leader is Roy Mewbourne who went 655-608-9 from 1979-2002.

Corbin also had 106 victories in five seasons at Presbyterian

Espo Power

Third baseman Jason Esposito is having a great sophomore season at the plate, already surpassing his home run total of a year ago. As a freshman he hit .287 with four homers, 13 doubles and 42 RBI while starting in all 64 games played. This season Esposito is hitting .368 with five homers, 10 doubles and 32 RBI. He is also the team leader with 13 stolen bases in 15 attempts.

Hit by Pitch Harris

Senior shortstop Brian Harris currently leads the nation in hit by pitches with 20 on the year. The Nashville native has been an on-base machine with 26 walks as well and has a .595 on base percentage.

He is currently second on the team in hitting at a .372 clip with three homers, including a three-run homer against Wofford on Wednesday, and 19 RBI.

A first-team All-SEC pick and All-SEC Defensive Team selection a year ago, he has also continued to play a steady short with just five errors on the year, including just one in six SEC contests thus far.

Freshmen Contributions

Freshmen Anthony Gomez and Connor Harrell are making the most of their opportunities thus far this season and have earned more playing time for their performances on the field in the process.

Gomez, a middle infielder from New Jersey, is hitting .536 in 22 games, including 13 starts. He has the team's longest hitting streak this year at 14 games and in five of those games he extended the skein in just one at bat. He leads the team with a .611 batting average (11-for-18) in SEC play.

Harrell, an outfielder from Texas, is hitting .354 in 24 games, including 22 starts. He has a homer, eight doubles and 20 RBI and has played a steady outfield. He has consistently hit in SEC games as well with a .348 average and five RBI.

Giobbi named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List

Senior catcher Andrew Giobbi is on the official watch list for the 2010 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Award.

The Portland, Maine, native has had an outstanding season thus far behind the plate, having thrown out 15 of 32 runners attempting to steal. He has also caught a pitching staff that has a stellar 3.02 team ERA, best in the SEC. Offensively he has come on strong, leading the team with a .424 (14-for-33) batting average in the eight-game win streak. He has four doubles, a homer 12 RBI and nine runs scored in that span. This is the second year in a row "Gio" has been named to the watch list.

The watch list will be narrowed down to the semifinalists, whom will be announced May 19, 2010. Ballots will be sent to the national voting panel at the end of May for a vote to determine the three finalists. The finalists will be announced June 2, 2010 prior to the NCAA Regionals and Major League Baseball Draft. A final vote among the national committee will occur during the College World Series. All finalists will be brought to Wichita and the winner will be announced at the 13th Annual Greater Wichita Sports Banquet on July 1, 2010.

Commodore Tidbits

Vanderbilt enters the Florida series riding an eight-game win streak and has the most wins in the SEC with 23 ... VU's start is the second best in school history, just one game behind the 2007 squad which sported a 24-3 record at the same point, including a 3-3 record in SEC action ... VU completed its most recent homestand with a 7-0 record and are 19-1 at home this year ...

The Commodores swept Kentucky over the weekend, winning the series for the first time since the 2007 season. The teams played a doubleheader on Saturday to avoid forecasted inclement weather on Sunday ... The Commodore bullpen came up big in the five games, notching two wins while sporting a 2.29 ERA with 21 strikeouts and eight walks in 19.2 innings. Overall the team has a 2.91 ERA, tops in the SEC, with 211 strikeouts and 82 walks in 226.0 innings ... Sonny Gray and Corey Williams combined on a five-hit shutout of then No. 21 Kentucky

in Friday night's win. Gray held UK to four hits in seven innings with six strikeouts and three walks. Williams came on in the eighth and pitched two innings of one-hit ball with two strikeouts and a walk. He made three relief appearances on the week and allowed just two hits with six strikeouts and three walks in six innings ... Chase Reid made two appearances and picked up wins in both and now is tied with Gray for the team lead in wins with four. He started against Lipscomb (3/23) and went six innings, allowing one run on five hits with three strikeouts. Reid then pitched three innings of one-hit relief with three strikeouts against Kentucky (3/27) in the 2-1 win in game one of the doubleheader. On the week he struck out six in eight innings, allowing just a run on six hits ... Taylor Hill allowed one run, unearned, in 4.1 innings against UK in the first game of the doubleheader Saturday. Will Clinard threw three innings of two hit relief in two outings, while Russell Brewer did not allow a run of his own in three appearances, hurling 2.2 innings of two hit work with two strikeouts and two walks ... Offensively VU hit .347 with two homers, 12 doubles and 46 runs scored in five games (9 per game) ... Andrew Giobbi led the team with a .455 batting average (10-for-22), including a 4-for-5 night against UK in the series finale ... Brian Harris was 6-for-16 (.375) with a double, homer, four RBI and eight runs scored. He walked three times, while getting hit six more times for a .600 on base percentage ... Bryan Johns was also 6-for-16 (.375) with a double, three RBI and seven runs scored ... Grayson Garvin made his 2010 debut against Wofford on Tuesday and struck out the side in the ninth inning ... Navery Moore made his first collegiate start against Wofford on Wednesday and picked up the win.

Commodores Picked To Finish Fourth In SEC East

Vanderbilt was picked to finish fourth in the Southeastern Conference Eastern Division as the league office released its annual preseason coaches poll today. The Commodores received one first-place vote in the division with Florida, last year's division winner, garnering 64 of a possible 66 points from the coaches. LSU is predicted to repeat as the 2010 Southeastern Conference baseball champions, as voted by the league's 12 baseball coaches in the 19th annual preseason SEC poll. The Tigers, ranked No. 2 nationally in multiple preseason polls, seek to capture their league-leading 15th SEC Championship. The Tigers return eight position players with starting experience and 10 pitchers from their 2009 squad which claimed the NCAA National Championship. Since 1996, the SEC has named a regular season champion as well as a tournament champion. Prior to 1996, the tournament champion was considered the SEC Champion. In the overall SEC Champion vote, LSU received five of a possible 11 votes. Florida received four votes while Arkansas had three. In addition to picking a preseason SEC champion, the league's head coaches voted a predicted order of finish in the SEC Eastern and Western Divisions. In the Eastern Division, Florida was the favorite with 64 of a possible 66 points. South Carolina came in second with 52 points and Georgia third with 42. LSU was favorite in the Western Division with a total of 63 points. Arkansas was second with 59, while Ole Miss, who shared the overall title last season with LSU, finished third with 39.

HEAD COACH TIM CORBIN



In seven seasons at Vanderbilt, Tim Corbin has turned Vanderbilt into one of the national powers of college baseball and taken the program to unprecedented success with four straight NCAA regional appearances.

In 2009, Corbin took a young squad with seven new offensive starters and molded them into a team that finished with a 37-27 record and runner-up finishes in the Southeastern Conference tournament and the NCAA Louisville Regional.

The 2009 draft saw six Commodores selected, highlighted by junior pitcher Mike Minor's selection with the seventh overall pick by the Atlanta Braves. His selection marked the fifth time in the last three seasons a Vanderbilt player has been picked in the first round.

Corbin's overall record of 276-157 (.637) is third best in terms of wins at Vanderbilt, and first in terms of winning percentage for coaches with 100 games or more.

In 2008, Corbin guided the Commodores to their second straight 40-win season (41-22) and third consecutive appearance in the NCAA tournament. The Commodores battled through the first half of the season without the services of Preseason Player of the Year Pedro Alvarez and managed to record road sweeps over Mississippi State and Tennessee for the first time in school history.

The 2008 draft saw eight current Commodores selected, highlighted by Pedro Alvarez who was taken with the second overall pick by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Vanderbilt became the first school in draft history to have the first overall pick (David Price in 2007) and second overall pick in consecutive drafts, an indication of the talent Corbin has brought into the program over the last six years.

In 2007, Corbin guided the Commodores to their best season ever, finishing with a school record 54 wins. The team also achieved a No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history and held that honor for 13 of 15 weeks during the regular season.

The Vanderbilt baseball team also swept through the Southeastern Conference, winning both the regular season and tournament crown for the first time ever, and it marked the first time an SEC team had done it since 1996. The team lost only one conference series the entire season against SEC West Division winner Arkansas in Fayetteville and avenged the series loss by defeating the Razorbacks in the SEC tournament title game.

The conference recognized Corbin for the work he had done, naming him SEC Coach of the Year. Corbin also picked up Co-National Coach of the Year by College Baseball Insider and regional coach of the year honors by the American Baseball Coaches Association.

The Commodores hosted their first ever NCAA regional as the No. 1 National Seed and arrived as a power in college baseball.

Corbin's success and methods of running the Vanderbilt program has earned him respect among the college and international baseball communities.

In the summer of 2006 he managed the USA Baseball National Team to a 28-2-1 record that culminated with a gold medal finish at the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World University Championship in Havana, Cuba. The .919 winning percentage set a new national team high and it garnered special recognition by the United States Olympic Committee.

In 2006 he guided a youthful Commodore squad to a 38-27 record and sixth-place finish in the rugged Southeastern Conference. The team was the youngest team in the league, with seven everyday starters being freshmen or sophomores. For the second time in three seasons, Corbin guided the team to the SEC Tournament Championship game and the young squad also gained valuable NCAA experience after advancing to the championship round of the Atlanta Regional.

The 2006 team posted impressive series wins over College World Series participant Georgia, Super Regional participants South Carolina and Ole Miss, and took series on the road against Florida and LSU. The team handed LSU its worst conference loss at home in school history in the process.

In addition to on the field successes, the baseball program itself has had significant upgrades to the facilities with a new fieldhouse, complete with new locker rooms for players, coaches and Commodore alums playing professional baseball. Also included are coach's offices, a classroom that overlooks Hawkins Field and a new weight room. New for 2009 are permanent seats in the outfield pushing Hawkins Field seating capacity to double the amount when Corbin arrived in 2003. These recent upgrades reinforce the

excitement and commitment made to the baseball program due to the successes Tim Corbin has achieved as well as those he will strive to accomplish in the future.

He has already pushed the program to its most successful season, rewritten a significant portion of its record book, and ascended to the ranks of Southeastern Conference and national powers. For him, such excellence has been a constant in a career that covers three decades in both the collegiate and international baseball ranks.

Corbin, along with his coaching staff, are a tireless group that saw their recruiting efforts pay in 2005 as their recruiting class was labeled the nation's best by *Baseball America*.

Professional baseball has also taken notice of the program as 28 VU players have been drafted over the last four years, including eight in 2008.

In 2005, Corbin directed the squad to its second consecutive 30-win season, an achievement that had not been done in over 15 years. The campaign was highlighted with series wins over Alabama, Mississippi, South Carolina and College World Series participant Tennessee.

In 2004, Corbin not only directed the Commodores to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 24 years, he guided them to their first-ever Super Regional as they swept through the Charlottesville Regional with victories over George Mason, Princeton and host Virginia. In the Super Regional they fell to the eventual national runner-up, Texas, but still carved out a piece of history as the first team in NCAA baseball history to make it that far one year after having finished with a sub-.500 record.

Along the way Vanderbilt racked up 45 wins, was the only team to rank among the SEC's top five in earned run average (first), batting average (fourth) and fielding percentage (first), and finished with a .703 winning percentage, which was third-best in the highly competitive conference, which sent nine schools to the NCAA Tournament. The Commodores' school-record .978 fielding percentage was second in the nation, and their 30 error-free games were 11 more than the previous season.

Before Corbin was hired as the 21st coach in program history, Vanderbilt had not earned a spot in the conference tournament in a decade. Not only has he led his team there twice, the Commodores made it to the 2004 championship game.

During the 2004 regular season, Vanderbilt swept a series against Mississippi State for the first time. It was one of three conference whitewashes and one of five series' wins in all.

His efforts earned him the 2004 Vanderbilt Coach of the Year award and a nomination for the Nashville Sports Council's Sports Person of the Year. Plus, a school-record five players were named to the SEC All-Tournament team, five players were drafted on the first day and seven VU players in all were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft, topped by No. 6 overall pick pitcher Jeremy Sowers.

His first Vanderbilt team finished 27-28 overall and 14-16 in the SEC, good enough for second in the Eastern Division. It earned a conference tournament berth with a season-ending sweep of Tennessee capped by a dramatic ninth-inning rally in the finale. The overall and conference victory totals were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach and were made more impressive by the fact that the Commodores were 12-5 in one-run games.
