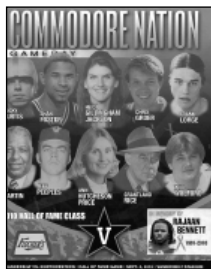

NASHVILLE – Dan Persa threw for 222 yards and three touchdowns to three different receivers, and Northwestern beat Vanderbilt 23-21 in the regular season game between the Big Ten and the SEC.

This was Persa's first start with Mike Kafka now gone, and the junior was nearly perfect as he helped ruin the debut of Vanderbilt's new head coach Robbie Caldwell in the season opener for both teams.

Persa was 19 of 21 passing and he also led the Wildcats with 82 yards rushing.

Vanderbilt had plenty of chances to make Caldwell the first Commodores' coach to win his debut since 1997.

Larry Smith threw for 240 yards and a touchdown with Warren Norman and Zac Stacy each running for touch-

downs. But the Commodores missed an extra point, a 48-yard field goal and were stopped on two 2-point conversions -- the last with 2:25 left on a bad snap.

Northwestern faced third-and-6 from its own 33 when Persa was hit a yard short of the first down marker by Vandy safety Jay Fullam. But officials flagged him for a high hit and a personal foul, allowing Northwestern to run out the clock even though it looked on replay as if Fullam simply put his shoulder into Persa's shoulder for the stop.

The crowd of 37,210, booed the officials off the field.

The Gators (6-3, 4-3) will host the Gamecocks with the winner advancing to the SEC championship in Atlanta.

Vanderbilt (2-7, 1-5) lost its fourth straight, ensuring a second straight losing season under first-year coach Robbie Caldwell. The Commodores trailed 41-0 when Ryan van Rensberg blocked a punt Javon Marshall recovered and ran in for a touchdown.

The Gators started a little slow with a rare morning kickoff with a temperature of a chilly 44 degrees. But Florida still

rolled up a season-high in points.

They also had season highs with 88 plays for 480 yards. The defense had four sacks and forced three turnovers in holding Vandy to 109 yards. Terron Saunders returned a fumble 45 yards for a TD and Solomon Patton returned a blocked punt 42 yards for another score. Mike Gillislee also had two TD runs of 3 and 43 yards.

Cobb had touchdown runs of 5 and 73 yards to help the Wildcats (6-5, 2-5 Southeastern Conference) become bowl eligible for the fifth straight season. He finished with 279 total yards, breaking the school record for all-purpose yards in a single season in the process.

Derrick Locke ran for 145 yards and two scores in his first game in a month and quarterback Mike Hartline threw for 232 yards and a touchdown in his final home game.

Kennard Reeves rushed for a career-high 105 yards for the Commodores (2-8, 1-6), but Vanderbilt couldn't make a 13-10 halftime lead stand up.

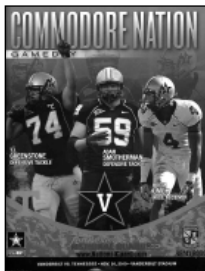

Tennessee (24) at Vanderbilt (10)

NASHVILLE – Tauren Poole rushed for 99 yards and the game-clinching touchdown and Tennessee kept its slim bowl hopes alive under first-year coach Derek Dooley with a 24-10 win over Vanderbilt.

Vanderbilt (2-9, 1-7 Southeastern Conference) threatened with a late touchdown, but Tennessee (5-6, 2-5) sent the Commodores to their sixth straight loss when Poole took advantage of a failed inside kick to rip off a 28-yard touchdown run with 1:11 remaining.

Tennessee won its third straight game for the first time since 2007.

Tyler Bray threw for 232 yards, but struggled for the first time since taking over as starter three weeks ago with two interceptions. Bray got off to a fast start, and early

on, looked like the fabulous freshman who guided Tennessee to 102 points in wins over Memphis and Mississippi by throwing for 648 yards with eight touchdowns and no interceptions.

Bray completed nine of his first 10 passes and gave the Volunteers a 14-0 lead midway through the second quarter with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Justin Hunter in the first quarter and a 20-yard scoring pass to Denarius Moore. He killed Tennessee's next two drives with interceptions, though, then had trouble connecting with his receivers the rest of the way, finishing 16 of 27.

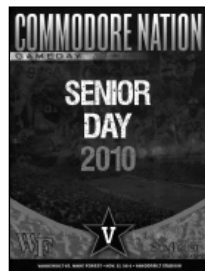

Wake Forest (34) at Vanderbilt (13)

NASHVILLE – Josh Harris rushed for 138 yards and one touchdown and Wake Forest defeated Vanderbilt 34-13 in Robbie Caldwell's last game as Vanderbilt's head coach.

Caldwell announced he was stepping down earlier in the day, ending his short tenure at the helm.

Vanderbilt (2-10) ended the season on a seven-game losing streak, which is currently tied for the second-longest skid in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

It was the Commodores' second straight 10-loss season. They have had at least nine losses in six of the last 10 seasons. The Demon Deacons (3-9), who snapped a nine-game losing skid, were aided by several Vanderbilt special teams miscues. The Commodores missed two field goals (50 and 37 yards) and had two punts blocked.

Caldwell took over in mid-July for Bobby Johnson, who abruptly resigned. That gave Caldwell, who spent the previous eight seasons as Vanderbilt's offensive line coach, just seven weeks to prepare for the season opener.

The game marked the first time since Nov. 29, 2008 – also against Vanderbilt – that Wake Forest blocked two punts in one contest.
