MASON: BUILD ON SUCCESS

Derek Mason looks to build on the successes of consecutive nine-win campaigns as he takes the helm of Vanderbilt football this season. Thirteen starters and 43 letterwinners from a 9-4 squad that finished with a Top 25 ranking will greet Mason when preseason camp opens this summer. The returnees include six starters and 19 letterwinners on offense, five starters and 21 letterwinners on defense, and two of three specialists.

Mason is extremely familiar with the upbeat climate surrounding the Commodores. In 2010, he joined a Stanford program also trending upward. In Mason's four years in Palo Alto, Stanford became one of the nation's elite programs, making four straight BCS appearances, winning consecutive Pac-12 titles, and playing in back-to-back Rose Bowls.

Mason has attracted a top-notch coaching staff as he attempts to duplicate the Stanford success at Vanderbilt. The group includes a former successful major college head coach, six former coordinators, and three coaches with successful tenures in the NFL.

Several standouts must be replaced off the 2013 Vanderbilt squad, including record-breaking receiver **Jordan Matthews**, quarterback **Austyn Carta-Samuels**, offensive tackle **Wesley Johnson**, cornerback **Andre Hal**, safety **Kenny Ladler** and kicker **Carey Spear**.

Despite the substantial losses due to graduation, Mason will direct a young, yet talented Commodore squad.

The pro style offense features seven starters from a year ago, including center **Joe Townsend**, guards **Jake Bernstein** and **Spencer Pulley**, tackle **Andrew Jelks**, tight end **Steven Scheu**, receiver **Jordan Cunningham** and running back **Jerron Seymour**.

Though just four returning starters are back on defense – linebacker **Darreon Herring**, tackles **Vince Taylor** and **Adam Butler**,

and end/linebacker **Kyle Woestmann**, the unit has more than a dozen additional letterwinners who played key minutes in 2013.

Punter **Taylor Hudson**, returner **Darrius Sims** and snapper **Andrew East** rank among the team's top specialists.

Keen observers of the Vanderbilt program are also excited to see the development of several highly regarded first- and second-year players on the roster.

For the second straight year, Vanderbilt kicks off with a Thursday night matchup, hosting Temple on August 28. The game is part of a conference doubleheader that serves as the introduction of football coverage on the SEC Network.

The schedule features seven additional games in Nashville, one downtown at LP Field and six on campus. On Sept. 6, Vanderbilt and Ole Miss square off on ESPN in a featured SEC matchup at LP Field. The Commodores also host UMass on Sept. 13 and South Carolina on Sept. 20 before hitting road for games at Kentucky and Georgia. The 'Dores final four home games come against Charleston Southern (Oct. 11), Old Dominion (Nov. 1), Florida (Nov. 8) and Tennessee (Nov. 29).

OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Starters back: 2 Letterwinners: 6

After staging Spring Practice with just two quarterbacks in uniform, the Commodores enter August camp with six candidates competing for the open signal calling position and a trio of talented prospects vying for the starting tailback role.

Without doubt, the biggest question facing new offensive coordinator **Karl Dorrell** is deciding who will guide the Commodores' pro-set offense. The former UCLA head coach and key Houston Texans' offensive assistant has several candidates, including sophomore **Patton Robinette**, redshirt freshman **Johnny McCrary** and recent transfer **Stephen Rivers**.

Robinette started three games last year, including wins at Florida and Houston in the BBVA Compass Bowl. He demonstrated a dual-threat ability that resulted in 11 total touchdowns. McCrary's athleticism and strong arm were on full display throughout spring drills. Rivers is an intriguing late addition, transferring to Vanderbilt as a graduate student after playing behind talented Zach Mettenberger for two years at LSU.

Junior **Josh Grady**, a dual-threat player who saw limited action last year, adds depth at the position. The 2014 signing class also includes two prospects, **Wade Freebeck** and **Shawn Stankavage**.

New running backs mentor **Charles Bankins** appears to have a three-person competition for the tailback role involving juniors **Brian Kimbrow** and **Jerron Seymour**, and redshirt freshman **Ralph Webb**.

Seymour rushed for 716 yards and a record-breaking 14 touchdowns last year, while Kimbrow posted 341 rushing yards and three TDs. Seymour is an excellent inside runner and among the SEC's best in short-yardage situations. Kimbrow offers greater quickness and big-play abilities. Webb displayed breakaway speed and inside toughness during an impressive showing last spring.

Junior **Derek King** will get preseason snaps at running back.

The team's lone signee at running back, **Dallas Rivers**, brings a bigger frame and different dimension to the corps.

Senior **Kellen Williams**, a former linebacker, enters August camp as the team's likely fullback. Two walk-ons – **Joseph Hoffman** and **Chris Martin** – complete the fullback candidates.

RECEIVING CORPS

Starters back: 1 Letterwinners: 6

Commodore fans will see a notably different receiver corps in 2014, following the graduation of Jordan Matthews, the most prolific receiver in Southeastern Conference history.

With the departures of Matthews and second leading receiver Jonathan Krause, new Vanderbilt receivers coach **Marc Lubick** promises to oversee a competitive camp with starting jobs at stake.

Senior walk-on **Trey Wilkins** and a pair of sophomores, **Jordan Cunningham** and **Latevius Rayford**, are the team's most experienced receivers. Cunningham's 15 receptions for 123 yards tops the team's returnees at wide receiver.

Junior **Kris Kentera** is a potential target, bringing a bigger body to the wide receiver position after catching 20 passes the last two years playing tight end/H-back.

Redshirt freshmen **C.J. Duncan** and **Gerald Perry** flashed plenty of ability during spring drills. Duncan could become a fan favorite, bringing an array of playmaking skills to the Commodore offense. No Vanderbilt receiver displayed surer hands during the spring than Perry.

The development of a third redshirt freshman, **DeAndre Woods**, who missed all of 2013 to injury, would create more depth at the position.

The staff also signed four wide receiver prospects: **Rashad Canty**, **Ronald Monroe**, **Caleb Scott** and **Trent Sherfield**.

Redshirt freshman **Chandler Dorrell**, also joins the Commodores as a

transfer from Stanford.

Walk-ons **Curtis Graves** and **Nigel Walker** round out the WR prospects.

First-year coach **Gerry Gdowski** expects continued development from the team's corps of tight ends.

Junior **Steven Scheu** developed into a quality starter in 2013, catching nine passes for 123 yards and a touchdown. Scheu also possesses the physical frame to effectively block for the 'Dore running game.

Dillon van der Wal looks to create more opportunities during his final season.

The new staff also secured a transfer from Stanford tight end **Davis Dudchock**, a graduate student who becomes eligible this year.

Redshirt freshman **Nathan Marcus** also impressed during spring drills. Freshman **Mitch Parsons** also joins the roster.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Starters back: 4 Letterwinners: 9

The Vanderbilt offensive line, which includes four of five starters back from a year ago, should be a strength of the Commodores this season.

New offensive line coach **Keven Lightner** inherits a unit that includes two-year starters at center and both guard positions, and a pair of experienced tackles. The corps also blends solid depth, with another five contributors competing for more playing time.

In 2013, the offensive line helped Vanderbilt produce its most potent scoring offense of the modern era. The team's 30.1-point average ranks as the highest single-season average since the 1910s.

The new staff must replace All-SEC left tackle Wesley Johnson. Drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers, Johnson graduated with a school-record 51 consecutive starts.

The staff expects sophomore **Andrew Jelks** to move into Johnson's vacancy at tackle. Jelks earned SEC All-Freshman honors last year after impressing in eight starts at right tackle.

The core of the offensive line is senior center **Joe Townsend**, and junior guards **Jake Bernstein** and **Spencer Pulley**. All three are All-SEC caliber performers and are entering their third seasons as starters.

Townsend tops the entire squad with 22 career starts and enters his final year as a contender for the Rimington Trophy.

Pulley and Townsend as the only 'Dores to start every game last year.

Bernstein has started in 17 of his last 18 appearances.

Fifth-year senior **Andrew Bridges**, who missed much of the 2013 season to injury, is back to reclaim the right tackle role across from Jelks. He is expected to face strong competition from a trio of young Commodores: sophomores **Blake Fromang** and **Kevin McCoy**, and redshirt freshman **Sean Dowling**.

Sophomore **Will Holden** and redshirt freshman **Delando Crooks** possess the ability to push Bernstein and Pulley at the guard positions, while a third sophomore, **Barrett Gouger**, can swing between center and guard.

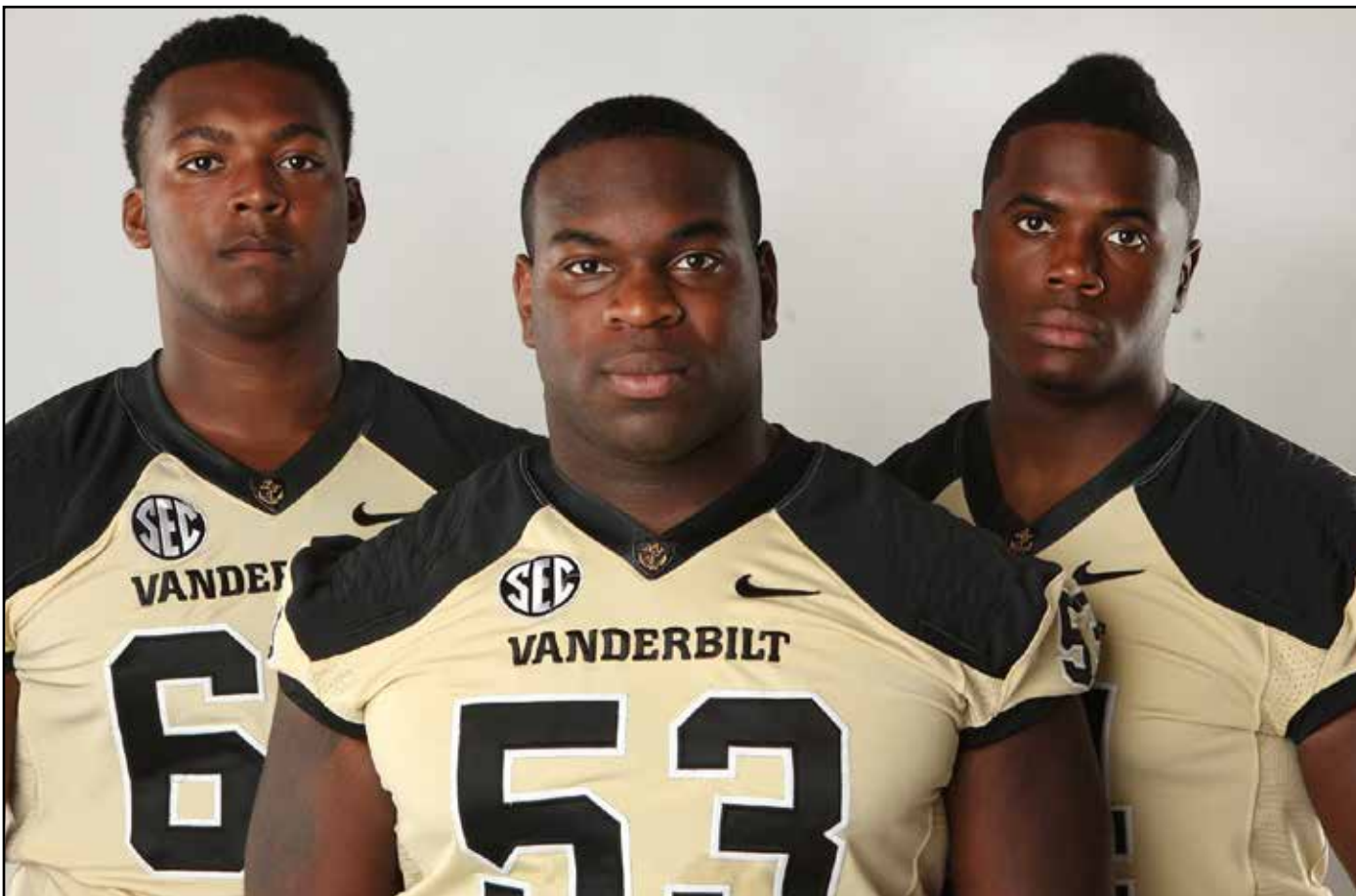
Senior **Ryan Brockway** also provides depth at tackle.

The team's signing class also includes three highly regarded prospects **Bailey Granier**, **Cole Hardin** and **Bruno Reagan**.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Starters back: 2 Letterwinners: 4

The Vanderbilt defensive line returns with three proven performers and several young Commodores seeking an opportunity for playing time.

First-year coach **Frank Maile** will mentor a unit that could qualify as Vanderbilt's most talented defensive line corps in recent years. The former Utah State DL coach will also guide the unit's shift to a 3-4 alignment.

Vanderbilt's 3-4 will be anchored by a pair of senior tackles with starting experience from a year ago, **Vince Taylor** and **Barron Dixon**.

Taylor produced 12 solo tackles and 18 total tackles as a 10-game starter in 2013. Coming off an impressive showing in spring drills, Vanderbilt coaches believe Taylor has All-Southeastern Conference abilities at the nose tackle position. Dixon was more productive than Taylor last year, contributing 26 total tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. Dixon earned a single start while playing in all 13 games for the Commodores as a junior.

Sophomore **Adam Butler** is arguably the Commodores' most versatile linemen. The 6-5, 310-pound Butler brings the ability to play tackle or end to the Vanderbilt defense. Butler is also a proven performer on the field,

having contributed 16 solo tackles and six tackles for loss as a redshirt freshman in 2013.

The Commodores will be counting on a pair of youngsters, sophomore **Torey Agee** and redshirt freshman **Jay Woods**, to earn playing roles in the defensive line rotation. Agee brings excellent work ethic to the line corps while Woods possesses excellent natural abilities and could be a breakout player for the Commodore defense this fall.

Three intriguing newcomers – **Nifae Lealao**, **Sekou Clark** and **Riley Tindol** – could move into playing roles. Lealao is a highly recruited Northern Californian who possesses the size and quickness to play either tackle or end. Clark and Tindol are being targeted as defensive ends by Commodore coaches.

LINEBACKER CORPS

Starters back: 2 Letterwinners: 9

The reshaped 3-4 Commodore defense features several proven playmakers and excellent overall depth among the linebacking corps.

Two top defensive starters from a year ago, senior **Kyle Woestmann** and junior **Darreon Herring**, highlight a position grouping that also features several young prospects expected to quickly impact the defense.

The roster also includes several exciting young players in the corps ready to push for playing time this August.

New coaches **David Kotulski** (coordinator/inside linebackers) and **Kenwick Thompson** (outside linebackers) will look to mold the unit that played a 4-3 alignment in 2013. Six of the team's 15 linebacker prospects are former defensive ends looking to prosper at a new position.

Herring, a two-year starter, was one of the Commodores' most productive defenders in 2013, ranking second on the team with 84 total tackles and 10 defensed passes, and third with 47 solo tackles. Herring is supported by a trio of linebackers that contributed last year: junior **Jake Sealand** and sophomores **Harding Harper** and **Ja'karri Thomas**. Sealand was the team's fifth leading tackler last year.

Two talented redshirt freshmen, **Nigel Bowden** and **Zach Cunningham**, are expected to compete for substantial roles at inside linebacker after demonstrating explosive abilities last spring.

The candidates at outside linebacker include some of the team's most explosive players, including Woestmann, junior **Caleb Azubike** and sopho-

more **Stephen Weatherly**. All three were productive defensive ends for the Commodores in 2013: Woestmann contributing a team-high six sacks, Azubike registering four sacks among 9.5 tackles for loss, and Weatherly adding 2.5 sacks.

Junior **Jimmy Stewart** also had 15 tackles and a pair of sacks last year and will be among those competing at outside linebacker.

The coaches also expect redshirt freshmen **Jonathan Wynn** and **Landon Stokes** to continue improving after posting impressive performances during spring drills.

Senior **Casey Hughes** also could get snaps at outside linebacker.

The Commodores added a pair of linebacker prospects in the 2014 signing class: **Hawkins Mann** and **Charles Wright**.

DEFENSIVE BACKFIELD

Starters back: 0 Letterwinners: 6

Plenty has changed in just one year with the Commodore defensive secondary. Last year, Vanderbilt was returning a secondary that included two All-Southeastern Conference performers fully intact. This year, the staff looks to find new starters at every position.

Given that reality, the spring performance of several players gave Vanderbilt's new coaching staff plenty of hope that the 2014 secondary will be just as effective as the 2013 unit.

The Commodores return two upperclassmen at safety in junior **Jahmel McIntosh** and junior **Andrew Williamson**, who might have departed spring drills as one of Vanderbilt's most impressive defenders.

While Williamson appears penciled in as the starter at strong safety replacing Kenny Ladler, McIntosh will compete with redshirt freshman **Oren Burks** among others for the open free safety role. Burks brings athleticism and physicality to the position. Two other redshirt freshmen, **Jalen Banks** and **Ryan White**, also will push for serious roles. In addition to senior walk-on **Josh Gregory**, the new Commodore staff signed three highly regarded safety prospects, **Khari Blasingame**, **Emmanuel Smith** and **Tre Tarpley**.

New defensive backs coach **Brett Maxie** also must replace both starting cornerbacks from a year ago. **Andre Hal** and **Stephen Clarke** are currently

in NFL camps with Houston and Miami, respectively.

Three sophomore cornerbacks – **Paris Head**, **Torren McGaster** and **Darrius Sims** – appear set to push for the vacancies at cornerback after gaining valuable experience last year.

Defensive staffers also were impressed during spring drills with the talents of a pair of redshirt freshmen, **Tre Bell** and **Taurean Ferguson**.

The Commodore secondary also will include three impressive freshmen recruits: **Tre Herndon**, **Bryce Lewis** and **Ladarius Wiley**. Senior walk-on **Alex Hysong** also will get plenty of preseason repetitions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Starters back: 3 Letterwinners: 5

While the Commodores enter the season looking to replace two specialists that will go down among the best in team history, placekicker Carey Spear and punt returner Jonathan Krause, the team has several standouts returning among its special team corps.

The Commodores' top returning specialists are senior punter **Taylor Hudson**, sophomore kick returner **Darrius Sims** and dependable senior snapper **Andrew East**.

Hudson displayed accuracy and as a first-year punter, averaged 42.9 yards to rank among the SEC's Top Ten. He will face strong competition from sophomore **Colby Cooke**, who averaged 45.1 yards on 14 punts.

Talented redshirt freshman **Tommy Openshaw** is expected to compete with walk-on sophomore prospect **David Holtgrave** to become Vanderbilt's new placekicker. They will replace Spear, an All-SEC recipient and current Philadelphia Eagle who set several Commodore records during his career.

East is one of the nation's premier snappers, and will return to handle both punt and conversion snaps for the fourth consecutive season. East will be backed by three sophomores – **Gaither Barker**, **Wilson Johnson** and **Jacob Schultz** – among others.

The Commodores' top kick returners are Sims and **Brian Kimbrow**. Sims averaged 22.8 yards on 25 returns as a freshman. His career long return of 71 yards came at Tennessee. Kimbrow averaged 16.0 yards on 12 returns last years.

Sims, **C.J. Duncan** and **Jordan Cunningham** are among those expected to contend for the open punt return role, though several other candidates could step forward in preseason camp.
