• BC (7-11, 2-2) has lost both of its ACC games on the road, including a 76-62 setback Thursday night at NC State.

• The Demon Deacons (10-8, 1-3) are on a three-game slide after opening their conference schedule with a 58-55 win vs. Virginia Tech at home.

THE SERIES WITH WAKE FOREST

• Boston College is 9-3 all-time against the Demon Deacons.

• The Eagles own a 6-3 record against Wake Forest since 2005-06.

• BC won both of the meetings last year, including an 81-67 win in the ACC Tournament.

• Wake Forest won three straight meetings in the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons.

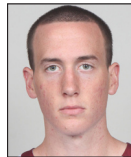

HEAD COACH STEVE DONAHUE

**SECOND SEASON
28-24 AT BOSTON COLLEGE
174-162 OVERALL**

Steve Donahue is in his second season as the head basketball coach at Boston College. He assumed the position on April 7, 2010 after serving 10 years as the head coach at Cornell.

In his first season at the Heights, Donahue guided the Eagles to a 21-13 record, including a 9-7 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference action. BC earned a berth in the National Invitation Tournament and advanced to the second round.

Donahue established an up-tempo style of play that allowed the Eagles to lead the ACC in field goals made, and rank second in three-point field goal percentage and assist-turnover ratio, and third in assists.

Donahue led Cornell to three consecutive Ivy League titles (2008-2010) and a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet 16.

In his 10 seasons leading the Big Red, Donahue totaled a 146-138 record. Cornell achieved the best Ivy record over the last five years (55-15) and Donahue was recognized for his work by being named a court coach by USA Basketball for the Under-18 national team trials in Washington, D.C., in July of 2008. Donahue coached and/or recruited seven of the school's top 13 all-time leading scorers, two Ivy League Player of the Year selections, two Ivy League Rookie of the Year players, eight NABC All-District selections, six Academic All-District picks and two Academic All-Americans.

Under his guidance, the Big Red recorded a perfect 14-0 Ivy League mark in 2007-08, joining Penn and Princeton as the only league schools to achieve that record. Cornell reached new heights in 2009-10, winning the program's third straight Ivy League title en route to an Ivy League-record 29 wins, the program's first NCAA win, and a trip to the Sweet 16. Cornell climbed as high as No. 22 nationally in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, the program's first national ranking in 59 years, and set an Ivy League record for three-pointers in a season (326). The team also set single-season school records in points (2,545), field goals (913), assists (543) and blocked shots (127). The Big Red won the MSG Holiday Festival with a victory over St. John's, Cornell's first win over a Big East school since 1969, and captured a season-opening win at Alabama, the team's first win over a school from the Southeastern Conference since 1972. Cornell went 11-1 at home and won 18 games away from home, the most among any Division I school. The most attention was given to Cornell's effort in a 71-66 loss at No. 1 Kansas, a game the Big Red led with less than one minute to play. The Big Red then shocked the college basketball world as a No. 12 seed, knocking out both fifth-seeded Temple and fourth-seeded Wisconsin by double figures.

For his efforts, Donahue was named the Clair Bee Coach of the Year, the NABC District 4 Coach of the Year, the midseason Hugh Durham Coach of the Year by collegeinsider.com as the top mid-major coach in the country, and was a finalist for both the Hugh Durham Award and the Jim Phelan Award for national coach of the year.

Cornell earned its second consecutive Ivy League title in 2008-09, becoming the first team other than Penn or Princeton to win consecutive outright championships in conference history. The Big Red went 21-10 and won the Ancient Eight by three games with its 11-3 mark. It was the first time Cornell had posted consecutive 20-win seasons.

The 2007-08 district Coach of the Year according to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), the United States Basketball Writers' Association (USBWA) and CollegeInsider.com (Hugh Durham National Mid-Major Coach of the Year finalist), Donahue directed the 2007-08 Big Red to a 22-6 record and the program's first Ivy title in 20 years.

Off the court, Donahue expects his players to succeed in the classroom and contribute in their community. Cornell players made frequent appearances in local schools, speaking to students on the importance of a good education.

Renowned as a top recruiter and for his offensive mind while an assistant at the University of Pennsylvania, Donahue learned the trade from some of the nation's top coaches. Donahue served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Fran Dunphy at Penn for 10 years. During his tenure as a Quaker assistant, he was heavily involved in the recruitment of five of Penn's top 20 all-time scorers. He was also instrumental in the Quakers winning six Ivy League titles in his last eight years there, advancing to the NCAA Tournament five times and earning national recognition with a top 25 ranking.

Prior to joining Dunphy's staff at Penn, Donahue coached for two seasons under Hall of Fame coach Herb Magee at Philadelphia University. During his two seasons there, the Rams won 20 games each season and also competed in the 1989 NCAA Division II tournament.

Donahue served as an assistant for current Lafayette head coach Fran O'Hanlon at Monsignor Bonner HS, helping to guide Bonner to the 1987-88 Philadelphia Catholic League championship. He began his coaching career at Springfield (Pa.) HS under Skip Werley, his former college coach. He served as head coach of the junior varsity and assistant coach for the varsity team for three seasons.

He played both baseball and basketball at Ursinus College, earning four letters in both sports. He served as basketball team captain as a senior. In his freshman season, Donahue helped the basketball squad finish 23-8 and advance to the NCAA Division III tournament's semifinal round. The following year, Ursinus advanced to the tournament's quarterfinal round. He graduated in 1984 with a bachelor's degree in economics and business administration.

Donahue and his wife, Pamela, have four children, Taylor (15), Matthew (14), Katie (9) and Jack (8).

LAST YEAR AGAINST WAKE FOREST

- Boston College and Wake Forest played twice in the span of four days last season in the regular season finale and then in the first round of the ACC Tournament.
- The Eagles won both times, 84-68 in the regular season, and then 81-67 in the conference tournament.
- In the regular season win, Biko Paris, Corey Raji and Joe Trapani led the way for Boston College. Raji registered 21 points, Paris posted 19 and Trapani totaled 17 to lead BC to an 84-68 win before a sellout crowd of 8,606 in Conte Forum.
- Reggie Jackson recorded 14 points and a game-high seven assists.
- After Wake Forest jumped out to a 21-15 lead six minutes into the contest, BC blitzed the visitors with an 18-2 run to gain a 33-23 advantage with 7:05 left in the half. Raji scored eight points and Paris sank two 3-pointers to lead the rally.
- BC, which sank seven of its 12 treys in the first half, led 44-30 at the break.
- Jackson was one of three Boston College players with at least 20 points in the Eagles' 81-67 victory against Wake Forest on in the first round of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament.
- Jackson scored 27, Joe Trapani added 22 points and Biko Paris had 21 for the fifth-seeded Eagles.
- They shot nearly 54 percent on 29-of-54 shooting, made 10 3-pointers and used a huge first-half run to defeat Wake Forest for the second time in a week.

EAGLES FALL AT NC STATE

- Freshman **Dennis Clifford** had 12 points and five rebounds as BC lost at NC State, 76-62, Thursday in front of 16,051 at the RBC Center.
- Scott Wood scored 16 points for the Wolfpack and C.J. Leslie added 14 points.
- NC State ran off 15 straight points to take control and pushed the lead to 18 by late in the first half.
- NC State led 45-28 at the break and never let BC closer than 16 points until the final minute.
- After BC erased an early 10-point deficit to tie the game at 21, five different NC State players scored during the 15-0 spurt that put the Eagles away early.
- Howell scored five during the run, which ended when Wood buried a jumper to make it 36-21 with 3:11 left. Boston College ended its six-minute drought with a 3-pointer from freshman **Jordan Daniels**, but NC State answered with a turnaround jumper from Williams, a transition layup from Howell and a driving reverse layup by Leslie that made it 42-24 with about 90 seconds left before the break.

THE BROADCAST TEAM

Jon Meterparel and Malcolm Huckaby will call all the Boston College basketball action during the 2011-12 season. This will mark the pair's second season together with the Eagles.

Meterparel, who also serves as the play-by-play voice for Boston College football, joined the Dennis and Callahan morning show on WEEI in 2000. Prior to that, he had worked at WFNZ radio in Charlotte, NC, for nearly three years. A native of Weston, MA, Meterparel also worked with the Triple A Charlotte Knights (baseball), UNC Charlotte (basketball color analyst) and New England Revolution (soccer).

Huckaby is no stranger to BC basketball fans. He starred for the Eagles from 1990-94, finishing his 126-game career with 1,316 points. He currently ranks 18th on BC's career scoring list. Huckaby also ranks fourth on the career three-point field goals list, having sank 199 treys in his brilliant four-year career.

BC IN ACC PLAY

- Boston College has started 2-2 in the ACC with both of its wins coming at Conte Forum.

STIFLING DEFENSE

- The Boston College defense held Stony Brook to just 11 first-half points on December 11, which was a Conte Forum (opened in 1988) record low by any team in a half.
- The previous low was held by Georgetown which scored 12 in the first half on January 29, 2005.
- The Seawolves were held without a point for the final 11:50 of the first half as the BC offense rattled off 22 unanswered points.
- SBU went 0-for-16 from the floor in the final 11:50 and went 0-for-8 from beyond the arc. It also committed five turnovers.
- Stony Brook was 5-for-33 from the field in the half (15.2 percent) and shot 29.7 percent for the game.
- It was the first time a BC defense held its opponent under 30 percent shooting since November 30, 2004 when it did it against Long Island.
- The Eagles committed just five fouls in the game, including one in the first half, and allowed SBU to take five free throws the entire game.
- The five BC fouls were also the fewest by any team in Conte Forum history. The previous low was six which the Eagles did twice, the last time versus Bucknell on December 22, 2010.

THREES

- Boston College ranks third in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 3-point field goals made per game with 7.4.
- Duke leads the league with 8.1 per game while Miami is averaging 7.7.
- The Eagles have sunk five or more 3-pointers in 16-of-18 games this season. They hit three on December 29 against Harvard and four vs. Virginia Tech on January 14.
- BC has made eight from beyond the arc 11 different times this year. It had a season-high 12 triples against Bryant on December 18 and then 11 vs. Sacred Heart three days later.

CLIFFORD STEPS UP

- Freshman **Dennis Clifford** has earned a place in the starting five the last nine games.
- He is 44-for-63 from the floor (.698) in the last nine outings. Clifford's 12.7 points per game in that span is the best on the team while his 5.2 rebounds are second.
- The Bridgewater, Mass., product is also leading the team in field goals, field goal percentage, free throws (25) and blocks (12) in the last eight games.
- Clifford has led BC in scoring in each of the last three games and in four of the last six.
- Clifford was shooting at a .480 clip in the first nine games this year.

CLIFFORD NAMED ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Clifford was selected ACC Rookie of the Week for the week ending January 15, according to an announcement made by the league office.
- Clifford is the second BC player to receive league rookie of the week accolades this season. **Lonnie Jackson** earned the honor last month.
- Clifford averaged 15.0 points and 5.5 rebounds per game as the Eagles posted wins over Clemson and Virginia Tech. The Bridgewater, Mass., freshman had 15 points and seven rebounds in the 59-57 win over the Tigers and 15 points and four rebounds in a 61-59 victory over the Hokies.
- On the year he is averaging 9.8 points and 5.3 rebounds per games and is shooting .592 from the floor.

JACKSON FINDS RHYTHM

- Freshman **Lonnie Jackson** has been a key part of the Eagle offense in the last 13 games.
- The Valencia, Calif., product averaged 9.6 minutes a game in the first five outings of the season, going 0-for-4 from 3-point land.
- Since then, Jackson has started 11 games and averaged a team-high 30.8 minutes per game. He played a career-high 44 minutes vs. Rhode Island in a double overtime loss.
- He also found his rhythm from the floor. He is 42-for-96 (.438) from the field and 33-for-71 (.465) from beyond the arc in the last 13 games.
- Jackson is averaging 10.0 points per game in the last 13 contests which ranks second on the team.

JACKSON NAMED ACC ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

- Jackson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on December 19 for his performance against Bryant.
- He erupted for a career-high 26 points on December 18 to lead BC to a 75-55 win.
- He went 8-for-13 from the field and 7-for-11 from 3-point land. Those seven 3-pointers are the second most by a player in the ACC this season. It is also the second best 3-point percentage (.636) among those with 10 or more attempts.
- Jackson is the first BC player to hit seven 3-pointers in a game since Tyrese Rice did it against North Carolina on March 1, 2008. He also hauled in five rebounds.

ANDERSON'S INCREASED PRODUCTIVITY

- Freshman **Ryan Anderson** found his stroke at the Dunkin' Donuts Center December 8 and has been one of BC's key players ever since.
- He went 5-for-8 from the field and 3-for-4 from beyond the arc against Providence. He set a then-career high with 16 points and hit three 3-pointers.
- Including the game against the Friars, Anderson leads BC in the last 10 games with 6.8 rebounds and is second with 10.9 points. He also leads the team in offensive boards (14).
- Anderson has accounted for all three of BC's double-doubles this season and two of them have come since the Providence game.
- He had 13 points and 10 rebounds in the season-opener against New Hampshire and recorded 12 points and 12 boards December 18 versus Bryant.
- He recorded career highs with 18 points and 14 rebounds in a double overtime loss to Rhode Island on January 2.

HECKMANN'S DAY vs. UC RIVERSIDE

- Freshman **Patrick Heckmann** poured in 32 points in a 66-61 overtime win against UC Riverside November 25 in the 76 Classic.
- He went 9-for-13 from the field, including 4-for-5 from beyond the arc. He was also a perfect 10-for-10 from the foul line.
- His 32-point performance was tied for the second most in 76 Classic history. Arizona State's James Harden holds the record with 40 and also had a 32-point game in 2008.
- Heckmann's point total is also tied for the eighth-most all-time in the ACC by a freshman and is the second most in the conference this season.
- Twenty-one of Heckmann's points came in the second half and overtime.

PLAYING TIME

- Boston College has used 10 different starters in 18 games this season.
- The Eagles have also utilized nine different starting lineups this year.
- Junior **Matt Humphrey**, sophomore **Gabe Moton** and freshmen **Ryan Anderson**, **KC Caudill** and **Patrick Heckmann** started three consecutive games from November 25-30.
- The Eagles have started five newcomers in each of the last 10 games.
- Humphrey started the first 13 games of the season - the only player to do that - and has 16 overall.
- Freshman **Ryan Anderson** also has 16 starts while classmates **Dennis Clifford** and **Jordan Daniels** both have 12.
- The Eagles have nine players who average 10 or more minutes a game.

FRESH FACES

- Boston College has an entirely new look this season as it welcomed 12 newcomers to the program.
- Among the 12 newcomers are nine freshmen and a trio of transfers.
- There are four freshmen that hail from California, two from Massachusetts and one each from Germany, Florida and Pennsylvania.
- BC also gained transfers in **Salah Abdo** (Trinity graduate), **Matt Humphrey** (Oregon) and **Deirunas Visockas** (Lafayette graduate).

WHAT WAS LOST

- BC lost 10 lettermen from the 2010-11 team.
- Included in that list is the leading scorer and assister in Reggie Jackson (18.2 ppg, 152 ast) and leading rebounder Joe Trapani (7.0 rpg).
- Statistically, BC lost 92 percent of its blocks, 89 percent of its scoring and assists, 80 percent of its rebounding and 78 percent of its steals.

THE RETURNERS

- Boston College retained the services of sophomore **Danny Rubin** who played in 29 games and started 23 of them.
- He averaged 4.1 points, 1.6 rebounds and 0.5 assists in 16.8 minutes a game.
- Graduate student **John Cahill** was added to roster in November after coming on strong late last season. He started the last seven contests and averaged 2.1 points per game. He averaged 27.7 minutes a game in the final 10 games of 2010-11.
- The Eagles also got **Gabe Moton** (2.5 ppg, 1.3 rpg) and walk-on **Peter Rehnquist** (0.6 ppg, 0.3 rpg) back on the roster.

DONAHUE'S DISCIPLES

- Last season, Donahue's Disciples showed up to Conte Forum when Boston College hosted North Carolina and then after the season, Ryan Dunn and his fellow Disciples met with **Steve Donahue** to figure out how to get more students to games.
- Donahue sent out a tweet (@Coach_Donahue) reaching out to the Disciples in September and the rest is history.
- The Disciples' (@BookofDonahue) 12 members have a goal of bringing the team and the student body closer together and to ultimately create an excitement and buzz around Conte Forum during games.

EAGLES SIGN TWO IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

- Two high-school standouts – 6-foot-3-inch guard **Olivier Hanlan** and 6-foot-2-inch guard **Joe Rahon** – have signed national letters of intent to play at Boston College.
- Hanlan is a standout at the New Hampton (N.H.) School. A native of Gatineau, Quebec, he also plays in the Albany City Rocks AAU program. Hanlan has also played for Dave Smart, who has won seven Canadian National Championships, as part of his Ottawa Guardsmen program. His coach at New Hampton is Pete Hutchins.
- Rahon, who plays at Torrey Pines (Calif.) High School, earned All-CIF first team, All-San Diego Section first team and All-North County honors as a junior. Also the Palomar League Player of the Year, he averaged 16.3 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.7 assists in 2010-11. Rahon shot 55.0 percent from the field, including 44.0 percent from long range (51 treys made). He also plays in the Dream Vision AAU program. Rahon, whose brother James plays for San Diego State, is a member of the Union-Tribune All-Academic Team with a 4.0 grade-point average.

SHOTS FROM THE HEART

- Boston College head coach **Steve Donahue** is one of 64 coaches around the country taking part in the second annual Shots from the Heart tournament, presented by ColleagueInsider.com.
- The event, which also features a tournament for assistant coaches, will benefit the Skip Prosser Foundation.
- Each coach will shoot 25 free throws. A member of the athletic department will tally the results and the coach with the most points will advance. Shots 1-10 are worth one point, 11-15 are worth two points, 16-20 are worth three points, 21-24 are worth four points and shot 25 is worth five points.
- Skip Prosser spent 21 years as a head coach at Loyola (MD), Xavier and Wake Forest. He made 18 postseason appearances and is the only coach in NCAA history to take three different schools to the NCAA Tournament in his first year as coach. In 2008, ColleagueInsider.com created the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award, given annually to the coach who not only achieves success on the court but who also displays moral integrity off of it.
- Prosser passed away on July 26, 2007 of a heart attack.
- Donahue has defeated Indiana State's Greg Lansing and Tulane's Ed Conroy to advance to the third round where he will face Arizona's Sean Miller.

EAGLES PICKED 12TH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- Boston College was selected 12th in the Atlantic Coast Conference's preseason men's basketball media poll. The announcement was made at the league's "Operation Basketball" (media day), which was held at the The Ritz-Carlton Hotel in Charlotte, N.C., on October 19.
- North Carolina was selected first in the preseason media poll. The Tar Heels were picked to finish first in 57 of 59 ballots. Duke was picked second, followed by Florida State. Virginia was tabbed to finish fourth, followed by Miami and Virginia Tech.
- The second half of the preseason list was - in order - Clemson, NC State, Maryland, Georgia Tech, Wake Forest and BC.

BC WELCOMES TWO NEW ADDITIONS

- Boston College has a pair of fresh new faces on its roster with the addition of **Fr. Jeremy Clarke, S.J.** and **Fr. Greg Kalscheur, S.J.**
- The two Jesuit priests are welcome newcomers to Steve Donahue's staff.
- Fr. Jeremy Clarke, S.J. is an Australia Province Jesuit working in the history department, teaching Asian history. He has been a basketball fan for years and one memorable basketball moment for him was watching the Harlem Globetrotters play an exhibition match in Shanghai in the late 1980s. His favorite all time players include Andrew Gaze, Michelle Timms and Patrick Mills, because of their hard work and sheer will to win. He is excited about the energy and drive of the BC Eagles team this year and thinks they'll be so good that there won't be any need for any Hail Marys, but is saying a few anyway!
- Fr. Greg Kalscheur, S.J., is an associate professor in the law school, teaching civil procedure, constitutional law, and law and religion. He has been a college basketball fan since his undergraduate days at Georgetown, when he was able to travel to three Final Fours as a member of the Georgetown pep band. He is looking forward to a great season for the BC Eagles in 2011-12.

JACKSON'S ROLE INCREASED IN OKLAHOMA CITY

- Boston College guard Reggie Jackson was selected by the Oklahoma City Thunder with the 24th pick in the first round of the 2011 NBA Draft.
- Jackson was the ninth Boston College player to have been selected in the first round. The previous eight Eagles were Gerry Ward in 1963, Terry Driscoll in 1969, John Bagley in 1982, Dana Barros in 1989, Bill Curley in 1994, Troy Bell in 2003, and Jared Dudley and Sean Williams in 2007.
- Jackson earned 2010-11 All-ACC first-team honors. He also captured USBWA All-District I honors, NABC All-District 2 accolades and Associated Press All-America honorable mention honors.
- The junior averaged 18.1 points, 4.3 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game in 16 conference contests this past season. The Colorado Springs, Colo., resident ranked among ACC leaders in seven categories (conference games only): scoring (fourth), assists (third), free-throw percentage (second, .870), field-goal percentage (seventh, .471), three-point field-goal percentage (sixth, .398), three-point field goals made (ninth, 2.1) and minutes played per game (tied-eighth, 33.3).
- Jackson is seeing increased playing time as the backup point guard after Eric Maynor was lost for the season to a torn ACL.
- He is averaging 10.9 minutes, 3.1 points and 1.4 assists per game for the 12-3 Thunder.

BC TO HOST 2012 NCAA REGIONAL

- Boston College is serving as the host institution for the East Regional of the 2012 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, set for March 22-24, 2012 at the TD Garden.
- The 2012 championship begins with the First Four, four first-round games taking place in Dayton on March 13 and 14. Second- and third-round action takes place in Albuquerque, Louisville, Pittsburgh and Portland on March 15 and 17; while Columbus, Greensboro, Nashville and Omaha will host second- and third-round games on March 16 and 18.
- Boston will serve as the East Regional site and Phoenix will host the West Regional on March 22 and 24. Atlanta will host the South Regional and St. Louis will be the site for the Midwest Regional on March 23 and 25.
- The 74th Men's Final Four will take place March 31 and April 2 in New Orleans.

GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE SECOND IN NATION

- Boston College, along with Duke University, tied for second in the nation for overall Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in all sports among FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) schools, according to data released by the NCAA in late October.
- The 97 percent that both schools registered was second only to Notre Dame's 99 percent.
- Twenty-one BC sports teams received a perfect GSR score of 100, the most teams with a perfect score of any FBS athletics program in the country. This marked the third consecutive year the Eagles recorded the most perfect scores among their FBS counterparts. In addition, the football team's score of 93 was one of only six FBS programs in the country to receive a score of 90 or better.
- The 21 Boston College teams that recorded a perfect GSR score of 100 included men's baseball, fencing, golf, skiing, sailing, swimming and tennis along with women's basketball, cross country/track, rowing, fencing, field hockey, golf, ice hockey, sailing, skiing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball.
- The five FBS institutions that received scores of 90 or better were Notre Dame (97), Duke (93), Northwestern (94), Rice (93), BC (93) and Navy (91).

Benson collected the rebound on the missed second attempt and with time running out, Abreu lost the ball near the top of the arc.
