FLORIDA STATE BRINGS A FOUR GAME WINNING STREAK TO WAKE FOREST

No. 23 Florida State, which has won four consecutive ACC games and is in a tie for first place in the ACC standings, travels to play Wake Forest at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum on Wednesday, January 24, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles have risen to the top of the ACC standings with consecutive wins over Virginia Tech (Jan. 10, 63-59), North Carolina (Jan. 14, 90-57), Maryland (Jan. 17, 84-70) Duke (Jan. 21, 76-73). Florida State's victories over then No. 3 North Carolina and then No. 4 Duke marks the second consecutive season the Seminoles have defeated two top five ranked teams, as they trumped No. 1 Duke (Jan. 12, 2011, 66-61) during last year's regular season and No. 5 Notre Dame (March 20, 2011, 71-57) to advance to the Sweet 16 of the 2011 NCAA Tournament. The pair of wins over top five teams in the same season marks the third time in school history the feat has been accomplished – also 1996-97 (No. 5 Maryland and No. 5 Wake Forest), 2010-11 (No. 1 Duke, No. 5 Notre Dame) and 2011-12 (No. 3 North Carolina and No. 4 Duke) Following Wednesday night's game at Wake Forest, the Seminoles will return home to host Georgia Tech on Feb. 1, at 7:00 in their only meeting with the Yellow Jackets during the regular season.

SEMINOLES THIRD CONSECUTIVE WIN OVER A TOP FIVE RANKED OPPONENT

Florida State's victories over then No. 3 North Carolina and then No. 4 Duke in the span of eight days during the month of January, have earned the Seminoles three victories in their last four games against top five ranked teams. The Seminoles defeated the Tar Heels and the Blue Devils this season and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament with a win over No. 5 Notre Dame in March of 2011. The Seminoles' only loss to a top five ranked team since March of 2011 came to then No. 4 ranked UConn in overtime the final round of the Battle4Atlantis on Nov. 26, 2011.

SEMINOLES' SNAER NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Michael Snaer, who averaged 16.5 points, 3.0 rebounds and hit the game-winning shot at the buzzer in the Seminoles' 76-73 over No. 3 Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium, was named the ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career by the league office on Monday. Snaer shot .500 from the field (12 of 24), made three 3-point shots and shot .750 (six of eight) from the free throw line as Florida State defeated both Maryland and Duke and vaulted to the top of the ACC standings.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Wake Forest and gain its fourth consecutive win over the Demon Deacons. It would tie the Seminoles' mark for longest winning streak against Wake Forest since a four-game streak during the 1992 and 1993 seasons. Florida State won the first four games it played against Wake Forest when it joined the league for the 1991-92 season;

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its fifth consecutive ACC game for the first time 2009-10 season when Florida State closed its regular season ACC schedule with six consecutive wins. The Seminoles have won at least five consecutive games five times in school history;

...Defeat Wake Forest and win its fourth consecutive game against a team from the state of North Carolina. The Seminoles have wins over North Carolina and Duke this season and won their final

Florida State defeated four ranked opponents during the 2010-11 season

Florida State defeated both No. 1 ranked Duke (Jan. 12, 2011) and No. 5 ranked Notre Dame (March 20, 2011) during the 2010-11 season. It marked the first time since the 1996-97 season with victories over No. 5 ranked Maryland (Jan. 29, 1997) and No. 5 ranked Wake Forest (March 1, 1997) and only the second time in school history that Florida State had defeated multiple top five ranked teams in the same season.

FLORIDA STATE'S WINNING PERCENTAGE IN THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last four years (since the start of the 2008-09 season) in total games played with 78 wins. The Seminoles averaged 23.3 wins per season with records of 25-10 (2008-09) and 22-10 (2009-10) and 23-11 (2010-11) in the last three seasons.

FLORIDA STATE BACK IN NATIONAL RANKINGS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest ranked No. 23 in this week's Associated Press Poll – the third week this season the Seminoles have been national ranked by the blue-ribbon panel of national writers and broadcasters. The Seminoles were ranked No. 22 during the week of Nov. 21 and No. 25 during the week of Nov. 14 earlier this season and have a 4-2 record when playing as a ranked team this season.

...Can Florida State win the ACC? North Carolina wasn't just the prohibitive favorite in the league but in the nation, and Duke was not far behind. But here we are in January and the answer is, absolutely. While Duke and North Carolina have to tussle with another in Chapel Hill and Durham, the Seminoles only have to see the Blue Devils again, and that will be in Tallahassee.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S 4-1 RECORD IN THE ACC

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest ranked No. 23 nationally by the Associated Press and with a 4-1 record in ACC play. It marks the second consecutive season the Seminoles are 4-1 in conference play – they improved to 5-1 in their first six league games last season before suffering their second conference loss of the season to Clemson. A victory over the Deacons would improve the Seminoles to 5-1 for the third time in school history (also 1992-93 and 2010-11) and would tie the school record for the best six game start to their ACC season.

FLORIDA STATE HAS...

...Won five of its last six games since defeating Auburn, Jan. 4, 2012 at the Donald L. Tucker Center;
...Won 21 of its last 27 ACC games since Jan. 14, 2010. The Seminoles won their final six regular season ACC games of the 2009-10 season, were 11-5 during the 2010-11 season and are 4-1 so far this season.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST DUKE...

...Florida State held Duke to a .397 field goal shooting percentage on Saturday in Durham. The Blue Devils are currently ranked first in the ACC with a .492 shooting percentage for the season –the Seminoles held the Blue Devils 9.5 percentage points below their shooting for the season;
...Duke averages 4.4 blocked shots per game and 6.7 steals per game. The Blue Devils totaled one blocked shot and four steals on Saturday as the Seminoles took the 76-73 win in Durham;
...The Seminoles held the Blue Devils to 73 points in their win as Duke averages 80.5 points scored per game. Duke allows an average of 69.2 points per game – the Seminoles scored 76 points in their second ever win in Cameron Indoor Stadium;
...Florida State shot a near season high .540 against the Blue Devils in gaining the 76-73 win. It marked only the third time this season an opponent has shot better than .500 percent from the field against the Blue Devils;
...Trailed at halftime and were outbounded by the Blue Devils and won the game, 76-73. It marked the first time this season the Seminoles had rallied from a halftime deficit to win a game and won a game while being outbounded this season.

FLORIDA STATE EARNS TWO CONSECUTIVE ACC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK HONORS

Florida State's Deividas Dulkys (Jan. 17) and Michael Snaer (Jan. 23) have earned ACC Player of the Week honors in the last two weeks to bring the Seminoles' POW total to three this season – Bernard James earned the award on Nov. 21.

LAST GAME VS. WAKE FOREST

Bernard James scored 15 points while Florida State pulled away in the second half to beat Wake Forest 84-66 on Feb. 19, 2011 at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston, Salem, N.C. Guard Ian Miller and Deividas Dulkys each added 14 for the Seminoles as they dominated the Demon Deacons after the halftime break. Florida State trailed by two at halftime before using a 13-2 run to push ahead by double figures, then the Seminoles steadily increased the margin by attacking the rim while Wake Forest seemed to grow steadily more passive. The Seminoles shot 53 percent in the second half and scored 53 points after the break. Okaro White (13 points) had a sequence in the second half that illustrated Florida State's attacking mindset. First came his reverse layup in traffic while drawing a foul for a three-point play. Then he stole the inbound pass and beat two Demon Deacons to a loose rebound while falling out of bounds before driving by Travis McKie for a layup to end that possession.

By The Numbers**

.540 Florida State's field goal shooting percentage in its win over Duke was its second best of the season – behind only a .571 shooting percentage against Stetson.

.650 Senior Bernard James is shooting .650 from the field (13 of 20) in the last two games. He is averaging 14.5 points per game in those two games.

.707 Senior Deividas Dulkys has scored 780 career points with 552 of them (.707 percent) coming on his 184 made career 3-point shots.

1 Senior Xavier Gibson led the Seminoles in scoring with 16 points against Duke – it marked the first time this season Gibson has led the team in scoring.

2 Sophomore Okaro White earned his second career double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds in the Seminoles' victory over then No. 3 North Carolina. It marked the first double-double by a Seminole player coming off the bench since forward Anthony Richardson did it by totaling 16 points and 10 rebounds against Stetson on Dec. 23, 2004.

2 The Seminoles and Duke are the only two teams in the ACC to finish in the top four of the ACC standings AND with double digit ACC wins in each of the last three seasons.

2 Florida State's Leonard Hamilton is the second longest tenured head coach in the ACC – he is in his 10th season in Tallahassee – and is ranked behind only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski in terms of longevity in the ACC.

3 A total of three Seminoles have been named ACC Player of the Week this season – Bernard James (Nov. 21), Deividas Dulkys (Jan. 16) and Michael Snaer (Jan. 23). The Seminoles earned a total of two ACC Player of the Week awards during the 2010-11 season (both by Chris Singleton). The three ACC Player of the Week awards one season is a school record for the Seminoles since joining the league for the 1991-92 season.

4 Florida State is looking to play in its school record fourth straight NCAA Tournament.

4 Florida State is 4-2 this season when playing as a ranked team. The Seminoles have been ranked as high as 20th in the ESPN/USA Today poll and have been as high as 22nd in the Associated Press poll this season.

6 Florida State has earned double figure steals in six games this season – 14 against UMass, 13 against Harvard, 12 against UConn, 13 against North Carolina Greensboro, 12 against North Carolina and 10 against Maryland.

6 Senior Bernard James has a single season career high six double doubles this season with four of them coming in the last 11 games (against UConn, at Michigan State, against Loyola Marymount and at Virginia Tech).

FLORIDA STATE'S SCORING DEFENSE IN THEIR LAST FOUR ACC GAMES

Florida State limited Duke to 73 points in its victory over the Blue Devils on Saturday – 7.5 points below their season average which ranks second in the ACC. In the last week, the Seminoles have held the top two scoring teams in the ACC (North Carolina and Duke) well below their season long scoring averages. In limiting North Carolina to 57 points, the Seminoles held the Tar Heels to more than 28 points below their season long scoring average of 85.1 points per game. The Seminoles defeated the Tar Heels, 90-57, on Jan. 14.

Florida State has shot .750 percent or better from the free throw line in each of its last six games and enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest ranked sixth in the ACC in team free throw percentage with a .713 mark. During the span of the last six games a total of five of the Seminoles are shooting .800 or better (Okaro White, 1.000; Ian Miller, .909; Xavier Gibson, .857; Michael Snaer, .828 and Deividas Dulkys, .800). James On Senior CLASS Award List

Bernard James, who spent six years as a member of the United States Air Force in Iraq, Qatar and the Middle East (2003-08) and who is currently a starter for the Florida State basketball team, is one of 30 candidates for the 2011-12 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award presented to the senior who is judged to be the best and brightest student athlete in college basketball. James served our country before earning his Associates Degree from Tallahassee Community College in 2010 and continuing his studies at Florida State also in 2010. He is on track to earn his bachelor's degree in social sciences in 2012.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

"One of the reasons I am eligible for this award is that I am going to receive my degree in April and that is very important to me," said James. "It is important to me, my family and Coach (Leonard) Hamilton that I work toward receiving my degree. Earning my degree is a goal that I have set for myself and a milestone in my life that I am looking very much forward to achieving."

James averaged 8.6 points and 5.9 rebounds while leading the Seminoles in blocked shots (2.4) in helping lead Florida State to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in 2011. He became a starter midway through the season and helped the Seminoles to a third place finish in the ACC standings and a trip to the Sweet 16 for only the fourth time in school history. James was Florida State's leading scorer in seven different games including Florida State's win over No. 5 ranked Notre Dame in the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

The 30 candidates will be narrowed to 10 finalists in midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, Division I men's and women's coaches and fans who will select one finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

DULKYS NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior guard Deividas Dulkys, who averaged 18.0 points, 3.5 rebounds, 3.0 blocked shots, 2.5 assists and 2.0 steals in two wins for Florida State during the week of Jan. 9-16, was named the ACC Player of the Week on Jan. 17 by the league office. Dulkys shot .765 from the field (13 of 17), .750 from the 3-point line (eight of 12) and .667 from the free throw line. He scored a career high of 32 points in the Seminoles' win over then No. 3 North Carolina. It marked his career high point total for a single game during his 113-game career. He also tied his career highs for assists with four (against North Carolina), steals with four (against North Carolina) and totaled a career high five blocked shots in the Seminoles' win on the road at Virginia Tech. Dulkys made his career high of eight 3-point field goals in the Seminoles' 90-57 win over the Tar Heels. His previous career high was five in five different career games – his season high was four in three different games. His eight 3-point field goals made against the Tar Heels established a school record for 3-point shots made in a single game in ACC play. The previous record was seven by four players including current NBA players Toney Douglas (New York Knicks) and Von Wafer (Orlando Magic). Dulkys' eight 3-point field goals made are tied for the third best single game effort in school history. The school record is 10 by George McCloud on Feb. 23, 1989 vs. La Salle. Dulkys' eight 3-point shots made were the most by a Seminole player since James Collins made eight against UConn on March 25, 1997.

DULKYS SHOOTING THE BALL WELL

Senior Deividas Dulkys enters Wednesday's game shooting a career-high .411 from the 3-point line (30 of 73), a career-high .625 from inside the arc (20 of 32) and a near career high .826 from the free throw line through the first 19 games of the 2011-12 season.

MILLER IS THE SCORER THE SEMINOLES WERE LOOKING FOR

Sophomore Ian Miller has scored in double figures in five of the last seven games. He enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest as the Seminoles' second leading scorer with 12.3 points per game scoring average, with only playing in eight games. His career high (overall and ACC) came on Jan. 17 when he scored 18 points in Florida State's win over Maryland. Miller has scored at least 15 points in five games after scoring only seven points in his season debut against Florida on Dec. 22. He's averaging 14.0 points scored per game since totaling 17 against Princeton on Dec. 30.

MILLER IS ONE OF THE SEMINOLES' TOP FREE THROW SHOOTERS

Sophomore Ian Miller, who has scored in double figures in five of the last seven games, is one of the Seminoles' top free throw shooters. He is shooting .893 (25 of 28) for the season (he has played in only eight games) and is shooting .938 in his four ACC games. More than 25 percent (25 of 98) of his points have come from the free throw line – he is already fifth on the team in free throws attempted with 28 despite playing in 11 fewer games than most of his teammates.

Florida State's 2011-12 Recruiting Class

In continuing an annual tradition that has now reached its 10th consecutive season, Leonard Hamilton and the Florida State men's basketball team have signed a top 25 nationally ranked recruiting class with the addition of four outstanding recruits who will become Seminoles in 2012: Devon Bookert (Anchorage, Ak./West), Montay Brandon (High Point, N.C./Wesleyan Christian), Robert Gilchrist (London, England/Polk State College) and Aaron Thomas (Cincinnati, Ohio/Brewster Academy).

Florida State's class is ranked as high as No. 17 nationally by Rivals.com and Hamilton is not done yet. With two graduate students and four seniors on the Seminoles' current roster, Hamilton is still looking to add two more players to his already bountiful recruiting class.

"We are very excited about the recruits in our incoming class," said Hamilton.

"Our staff has done another tremendous job of identifying and cultivating four players who we know will have a tremendous impact on our program during their entire careers. We have added everything we were looking for - ball handling skills, shooting ability, size and strong basketball knowledge."

Bookert (6-2, 165) was named the 2011 Gatorade Player of the Year in the state of Alaska as he averaged 25.0 points, 8.5 assists, 7.1 rebounds and 3.6 steals per game as a senior at Anchorage West High School. He has graduated from high school and is currently spending a prep season at the Impact Basketball Academy in Las Vegas.

Brandon (6-7, 195) is currently ranked as the 59th best player and the 11th best guard in the nation by Rivals.com. He is a four-star recruit who averaged 19.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game as a junior. Considered a natural for Hamilton's system at Florida State, Brandon can play the one, two or three spots on the floor and is comfortable both handling the ball and playing on the wing.

Gilchrist (6-9, 210) is a junior college transfer from Polk State College in Winter Haven, Fla., who will have two years of eligibility remaining when he joins the Florida State program for the 2012-13 season. Ranked as the 16th best junior college player in the nation, he led Polk to the Suncoast Conference championship in 2011 as he earned all-conference first team honors as a freshman. Gilchrist averaged 9.0 points, 6.9 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game while shooting .481 from the field as a freshman.

Thomas (6-4, 195) is the No. 56 ranked prospect by Rivals.com and was the No. 13 ranked shooting guard and the No. 71 ranked overall player in the nation as a senior at Withrow High School in Cincinnati. He is considered to be one of the top scorers and most athletic players in the class of 2012. Thomas is one of the top players at Brewster who will have at least four players accept Division I scholarships during the 2011 signing period.

GIBSON FROM THE BONUSPHERE

Senior Xavier Gibson continued a game-ending 24-15 run that propelled the Seminoles to their 76-73 victory over Duke on Saturday with a timely 3-point shot – his first since making one of his three long range shots on the season against UConn on Nov. 26. Gibson's 3-point shot allowed the Seminoles to continue a run that saw them recover from being down 58-52 with 8:51 left in the game to taking the lead and winning the game 76-73 on a buzzer beating 3-point shot by Michael Snaer.

GIBSON ACTUALLY BEGAN THE SEMINOLES RUN WITH TWO FREE THROWS

Senior Xavier Gibson scored five consecutive points – two on free throws at the 9:28 mark and three more on a 3-point shot at the 8:51 mark -- to vault the Seminoles from eight down (50-58) to only three down (55-58) in a matter of 37 seconds of the second half of Saturday's victory over Duke. Gibson began a 26-15 game ending run that saw the Seminoles recover from a 50-58 (minus eight point) deficit to a game-winning 76-73 (plus three point) advantage at the buzzer.

GIBSON WITH A SINGLE SEASON CAREER HIGH FOR BLOCKED SHOTS

Senior Xavier Gibson blocked three of Florida State's team record tying 15 shots in the Seminoles victory over Virginia Tech (Jan. 10) and sent back three more shots in the Seminoles' 76-73 win over Duke. He has now blocked more shots in 19 games this season (30) – a new single season career high -- than he did in any of his first three seasons. Gibson is ranked 13th in school history with 86 career blocked shots.

HAMILTON, MILLER AND WHISNANT RETURN HOME AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton (Gastonia, N.C.), sophomore Ian Miller (Charlotte, N.C.) and Terry Whisnant (Cherryville, N.C.) will pal return to their home state of North Carolina for the second straight game on Wednesday as Florida State travels to play at Wake Forest in Winston-Salem.

WHISNANT HOLDING ONTO THE BASKETBALL

Freshman Terry Whisnant, who has become one of the most sure handed players on the Seminoles' roster, has been charged with only one turnover in the last 10 games and 96 minutes played. He enters Wednesday's game against Wake Forest with zero turnovers in his last three games and only one since the Seminoles' game against UNC Greensboro on Dec. 11.

WHITE PRODUCTIVE OFF THE BENCH

Sophomore Okaro White, who has scored in double figures in two straight and for a total of five games this season, has continued to be a very production Seminole while coming off the bench. He is averaging 12.5 points in the last two games (12 in the Seminoles' win over North Carolina and 13 in Florida State's win over Maryland) while shooting .421 from the field and a perfect 1.000 from the free throw line. He is averaging more rebounds per game and nearly as many points and minutes per game as a reserve as compared to his numbers as a starter. White made two free throws with 5.5 seconds remaining in the Seminoles' win over Virginia Tech to clinch the four point win.

Florida St. vs. Maryland: Bernard James uses stint in military to help surging Seminoles

Some young basketball players attract big-time college recruiters by starring on championship high school teams. Others do it by dazzling on AAU traveling squads, dominating top-flight summer camps or showboating in all-star games.

[Bernard James](#) did none of that.

His proving ground was the U.S. Air Force. He enlisted in 2002 as a rail-thin 17-year-old, just 185 pounds on his 6-foot-5 frame. He came out in 2008 five inches taller, 40 pounds heavier and seasoned by the duty, danger and responsibility that came with three deployments to the Middle East.

James's third deployment was spent working as a security guard at Camp Bucca, a military prison outside Basra in southern Iraq that once housed 22,000 detainees. (It was recently transformed into a hotel by its new owner, an Iraqi development company.) During James's tour, riots broke out roughly once a week, he recalled. And mortar attacks were near monthly occurrences — one so close it killed seven detainees, injured 67 and left James with a slight hearing loss and memories that will not fade.

“Going in [to the Air Force], I was kind of immature and inexperienced — a somewhat sheltered kid,” James said in a recent telephone interview. “Coming out, I was definitely a man. I had matured a lot. My work ethic had grown. And I learned how to be responsible and a productive member of society.”

James's uncommon maturity is just part of what's in store for the young [Maryland Terrapins](#) (12-4, 2-1) when they travel to Tallahassee for Tuesday's game against [Florida State](#) (11-6, 2-1), which flexed its muscle with a 90-57 dismantling of No. 3 North Carolina this past weekend.

Three weeks shy of his 27th birthday, the 6-10 James (now 240 pounds) supplies the bulk of the Seminoles' rebounds. He accounts for 9.1 of the team's 40.4 per-game average (11th best in NCAA Division I). He's also adding just over 10 points and two blocks per game. And he is the emotional anchor when the Seminoles' poise deserts them.

“He’s a guy we all look up to,” said senior guard Deividas Dulkys, 23, of Lithuania, who exploded for a career-high 32 points against North Carolina. “[James] is not the biggest talker on the team, but when he says something, everybody listens to him: One, because he’s much older; and two, he has life experience — not necessarily basketball experience — but life experience that we believe can help us.”

A native of Savannah, Ga., James never played high school basketball and only started learning basic offensive and defensive schemes after being drafted to compete on an intramural team while in the Air Force.

Footage of his performance in an armed-forces tournament at Nellis Air Force Base in Las Vegas found its way to a Florida State recruiter. And after James bolstered his academic profile at Tallahassee Community College, Coach Leonard Hamilton extended a scholarship.

“We’re accustomed to looking under more rocks and knocking on more doors and maybe being turned down more,” Hamilton said, conceding that James’s route to Division I was unorthodox but chafing at a suggestion that he took a chance in signing him.

“We felt we had a committed athlete who showed a certain level of maturity. We knew he could learn, so we just had to teach him as a parent. I never felt it was [taking] a chance.”

In his final season of NCAA eligibility, James is on track to graduate this spring with a degree in economics. But he describes his basketball game as still “a work in progress,” with his offense slightly more evolved than his defense.

“When I got here I was really fundamentally unsound,” James said. “[The coaches] went back and gave me a foundation. I’ve improved in every area of the game.”

And he continues to work on being a leader for his teammates.

“A lot of times they do look to me to pull the team back together and keep us on a good track,” James said. “At times that has been tough for me. I’ve embraced it since the beginning, but I’m still learning to be a leader on the basketball court. It was a lot easier [in the Air Force]. I knew exactly what I needed to do and what I needed to say.”

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Leonard Hamilton said before the season ever started that his Florida State men's basketball team "would win games by committee." Three games into the 2011-12 campaign and the head coach's sentiments have proved true. The No. 24 Seminoles defeated visiting Stetson 79-66 at the Donald L. Tucker Center behind double-figure scoring from Deividas Dulkys, Okaro White and Bernard James. It was the third time in as many games this year that FSU got double-digit scoring from at least three players. White's 18 points were just one shy of matching his career best and Dulkys was a perfect 4-for-4 from 3-point range with 16 points. James' second-consecutive double-double output (15 points and 11 rebounds) moved Florida State to 6-0 all-time when the big man records double-digit points and rebounds in the same game. White's clutch free throws sealed the win. Florida State looked more like its typically dominant self on that side of the basketball court against Virginia Tech. In addition to halting over a dozen Virginia Tech shots, the 'Noles held their opponents to just 30.5 percent from the field and 16.7 percent from 3-point range. Michael Snaer contributed nine points before fouling out of the ballgame in the final moments for an FSU team that shot 41.2 percent. Luke Loucks added seven points and five assists. Erick Green led the Hokies with 21 points but he wishes his total would have reached 23. Green had an opportunity to tie the game at 61-61 with 10 seconds remaining but Deividus Dulkys' defensive pressure forced him to miss a driving shot attempt before White snagged the rebound and was fouled. Dulkys registered a career-best five

blocks. Miller also set a new career high for blocks with four and James and Xavier Gibson had three blocks each. For the game, the Seminoles won the rebounding battle 36-29.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The Seminoles upset visiting North Carolina, 90-57, at the Donald L. Tucker Center capping off a day that started before the sun ever rose when fans began lining up outside the arena for a chance to be in the crowd during ESPN's live College Gameday broadcast. North Carolina found itself in that peculiar and unfamiliar position because of Florida State's stifling defense and Deividus Dulkys' couldn't-miss shooting effort. The Lithuanian-born senior had the best game of his career, scoring 32 points on 12-of-14 shooting from the floor -- including an 8-of-10 mark from 3-point range. The Florida State defense didn't hurt either. UNC -- the nation's leader in scoring prior to Saturday's upset -- was held to a season-low scoring total of 57. The Tar Heels also shot a season-worst 37.3 percent from the field and their bench players were outscored by Florida State reserves 24-8. FSU also out-rebounded UNC, 41-33, and forced 21 Carolina turnovers while notching 12 steals. The Seminoles' stout defense set up what was the team's best offensive performance of the season. En route to a season-high 90 points, FSU shot 48.4 percent overall and 44.4 percent from 3-point range. Michael Snaer added 17 points and five rebounds while Okaro White came off the bench with a double-double effort in scoring 12 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Bernard James had eight points and nine rebounds and Luke Loucks registered six points and six assists. Loucks and Dulkys also added eight of Florida State's 16 total assists. The Seminoles started the game on a 9-2 run and led by as many as 12 in the first half before taking a 36-28 lead into the break.

DURHAM, N.C. - Michael Snaer's buzzer-beating 3-pointer, le the Florida State men's basketball team to a 76-73 win over No. 4 Duke -- a win that snapped the Blue Devils' 45-game winning streak at Cameron Indoor Stadium. After Duke's Austin Rivers hit a lay-up to tie the game at 73-73 with less than five seconds left on the game clock and with no time-outs to use, Luke Loucks took FSU's inbounds pass hastily across mid court where Bernard James' well-placed screen gave him the necessary room to find the game's soon-to-be hero. By beating Duke Florida State capped off what could be considered one of -- if not the -- greatest regular-season weeks in the program's history. Exactly seven days after giving the Tallahassee crowd a reason to rush the court after upsetting then-No. 3 North Carolina, the 'Noles players had a reason to rush the court in Durham following Snaer's big shot. Not only did FSU defeat two top-five teams in a span of one week while also sandwiching a victory over Maryland in between those two games but the Seminoles also moved into a tie for first place in the competitive ACC. It was also Duke's first home loss to an unranked opponent since 2007 when Florida State came into Cameron Indoor and did the same thing. Xavier Gibson's 16 points led Florida State while Bernard James added 12 points and five rebounds. Deividas Dulkys finished with 12 points and Loucks posted eight of his own. The Seminoles held Duke to just 39.7 percent shooting as Rivers scored a game-high 19 points. Andre Dawkins added 14 points and Seth Curry had 12. Ryan Kelly -- one of just three bench players to participate for the Blue Devils -- contributed 10 points.
