The Seed: Wake Forest is the East Rutherford Regional No. 4 seed. The Deacons, who were a No. 2 seed in the East last year, was last a No. 4 seed in 1984.

Thursday's Opponent: No. 1 seed St. Joseph's, 29-1, earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament. The Hawks' only loss came to Xavier in the Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament.

Sweet 16 Begins Thursday vs. 29-1 Hawks

Wake Forest, making its 10th NCAA Sweet 16 appearance and its first appearance since 1996, faces once-beaten, fifth-ranked and No. 1 seed St. Joseph's Thursday night in the East Rutherford Regional semifinals (approximately 9:57 p.m./CBS).

The 17th-ranked Demon Deacons, 21-9, beat Virginia Commonwealth (79-78) and Manhattan (84-80) by a combined five points last week in Raleigh to earn their first Sweet 16 berth since Tim Duncan's junior season.

The Hawks, 29-1, won their first 27 games of the season before finally stumbling to Xavier in the Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament. St. Joseph's beat Liberty (82-63) and Texas Tech (70-65) last week.

St. Joseph's leads the all-time series, 11-6. The two teams met in the NCAA Tournament in 1961 and 1962.

A Quick Look At The Deacons

Wake Forest, facing one of the nation's most difficult schedules with one of college basketball's youngest rosters, has ridden a roller-coaster season to a 21-9 record.

The Deacons, who have no scholarship seniors on the roster, began the season with an 11-game winning streak, rising all the way to No. 4 in the Associated Press poll. Wake proceeded to lose six of its next eight games, with four of those losses coming to ranked opponents.

Wake then won six straight, including three straight over ranked teams, to end the month of February. The Deacons lost their final two regular season games, then lost in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals to Maryland, giving Wake a three-game losing streak.

The Deacs are back on a roll, beating Virginia Commonwealth and Manhattan in the first two rounds of NCAA Tournament play. More on the 2003-04 Deacons:

■ The Wake Forest schedule is rated as the fourth-toughest nationally. The Deacons' final 17 regular season games included 15 ACC games and dates with nationally-ranked non-conference foes Texas and Cincinnati.

■ The Deacons are one of the nation's most proficient offensive teams. They lead the ACC and rank second nationally in scoring (83.7 ppg.) and the Deacons lead the ACC in field goal percentage (47.4 percent).

■ On the flipside, Wake ranks last in the ACC in field goal percentage defense (44.7 percent). Over the last 10 games, Deacon opponents have shot 48.7 percent.

■ Wake has out-rebounded 10 of its last 11 opponents.

■ For the most part, Wake Forest uses an eight-man rotation that includes three juniors, three sophomores and two freshmen.

■ The Deacons often use a three-guard lineup of freshman **Chris Paul**, sophomore **Justin Gray** and junior **Taron Downey**.

■ Paul is the 2004 ACC Rookie of the Year and he has been named National Freshman of the Year by two sources, including Dick Vitale.

■ Gray is the first Wake Forest sophomore to earn first team All-ACC honors since Tim Duncan in 1995.

Wake-St. Joseph's Series History

■ Wake Forest and St. Joseph's will meet for the 18th time, but for the first time in more than 20 years, and for the first time in the NCAA Tournament in more than 40 years.

■ St. Joseph's leads the all-time series, 11-6.

■ Wake Forest has won the last three meetings, including the last meeting, 88-65 - Dec. 27, 1982 at the ECAC Holiday Festival in New York, NY.

■ The Deacons and Hawks met every season, from 1960-61 to 1968-69.

■ The two teams first met during the 1938-39 season.

Wake Forest lost that game, 54-49, but the Deacons were eventually one of eight teams invited to the inaugural NCAA Tournament that season.

■ St. Joseph's won the first seven meetings between 1939 and 1962.

■ The two teams met twice in both 1960-61 and in 1961-62. In both of those seasons, Wake and St. Joseph's met during the regular season and later in the NCAA Tournament.

■ St. Joseph's holds a 3-2 series lead in Winston-Salem, a 7-0 series lead in Philadelphia and Wake Forest holds a 3-1 lead on neutral courts.

■ Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser is 5-4 all-time against St. Joseph's, including a 5-3 record while coaching at Xavier and an 0-1 mark in his only year at Loyola (MD).

Wake vs. St. Joseph's In The Tournament

■ The two teams have split a pair of NCAA Tournament meetings.

■ In the two times Wake Forest and St. Joseph's have met in the NCAA Tournament, the winner has gone on to the Final Four.

■ In 1962, the Deacons beat the Hawks, 96-85 in overtime at College Park, MD in the East Regional semifinals. Wake went on to beat Villanova in the regional finals to advance to the Final Four for the first time.

■ In 1961, St. Joseph's beat Wake Forest, 96-86 in Charlotte in the East Regional championship game, earning the Hawks a Final Four berth.

Wake vs. St. Joseph's, Part Two

■ Remarkably, Thursday's game will mark the first time that Wake Forest has played St. Joseph's when the Demon Deacons were nationally-ranked. St. Joe's was ranked in two of the 17 previous meetings. The Hawks were ranked #4 when they beat Wake in 1966 and St. Joseph's was ranked #3 when it beat the Deacons in 1965.

■ Two of the best rebounding performances in Wake Forest history came against St. Joseph's. The Deacons grabbed 63 rebounds when the two teams met in Jacksonville (FL) on Dec. 26, 1975. Wake also pulled down 63 boards when the two teams met on Dec. 11, 1962. The Deacons out-rebounded the Hawks 63-29 in that game.

■ When St. Joseph's scored 117 points against Wake on Feb. 6, 1965, it broke a record for the most points ever scored against the Deacons. That mark was broken the next season by NC State (121 points).

■ With 17 previous meetings, St. Joseph's has been one of Wake Forest's most frequent non-conference opponents, even though the teams have not met in more than 20 years. In fact, outside of current and former ACC opponents and in-state non-conference opponents, Wake has played only William & Mary, VMI, Virginia Tech, George Washington and Temple more frequently than St. Joseph's.

Deacon-Hawk Connections

■ Deacon coach **Skip Prosser's** first loss as a head coach came at the hands of St. Joe's on Dec. 4, 1993.

■ St. Joe's only loss of the current season was to Xavier, Prosser's former team.

■ Hawk forward Arvydas Lidzius and Deacon forward **Vytas Danelius** are both from Lithuania.

■ Both teams opened their seasons at Madison Square Garden on consecutive nights. On November 13, the Deacons defeated Memphis 85-76 behind 20 points from Taron Downey. The next night, St. Joe's got 20 points from Jameer Nelson to upend Gonzaga, 73-66.

■ St. Joe's assistant coach Monte' Ross is a 1992 graduate of Winston-Salem State University.

■ Wake Forest associate head coach **Jeff Battle** (Dobbins Tech) and St. Joe's coach Phil Martelli (St. Joseph's Prep) both attended high school in Philadelphia.

■ ESPN's Andy Katz named St. Joe's guard Jameer Nelson as national player of the year while ESPN's Dick Vitale selected Wake Forest guard **Chris Paul** as national freshman of the year.

■ In the 1962 NCAA Tournament match-up, St. Joe's was coached by Dr. Jack Ramsey and the Deacons featured guard Billy Packer. Both are now enjoying successful broadcasting careers.

■ St. Joseph's Jameer Nelson ranks third nationally in steals. Wake Forest's **Chris Paul** ranks tied for fifth.

■ Wake Forest (2nd) and St. Joseph's (22nd) both rank among the nation's highest-scoring teams.

■ St. Joseph's (47.7 percent) ranks among the nation's top 25 in field goal percentage. Wake ranks last in the ACC in field goal percentage defense (.447).

■ Wake Forest has out-rebounded 10 of its last 11 opponents. St. Joseph's has been out-rebounded this season by 3.4 boards per game.

Wake Forest vs. The No. 1 Seed

■ Wake Forest will face a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time. The Deacons are 1-2 all-time in those games.

■ The Deacons' win over a No. 1 seed in 1984 is one of the most memorable games in Wake Forest history. Wake topped No. 1 seed DePaul in the regional semifinals, 73-71 in overtime. The win sent Wake Forest to the regional finals and ended the career of Blue Demon head coach Ray Meyer.

■ Both of Wake's losses to a No. 1 seed came against Kentucky -- in 1993 and 1996.

Wake Forest vs. The Atlantic 10

■ Wake Forest is 76-59 all-time against teams currently in the Atlantic 10, including an 81-66 win over Richmond on Dec. 6th in Winston-Salem.

■ The Deacons have won their last seven meetings with A-10 schools. Their last loss came against Xavier, which was coached at the time by Skip Prosser, 87-76 on March 15, 1999 in the second round of the NIT.

■ Wake Forest is 2-1 in the NCAA Tournament all-time against teams currently in the Atlantic 10 with all three of those meetings coming long before the A-10 was born. Two of the three NCAA Tournament meetings with A-10 teams came against St. Joseph's. The other was a regional semifinal win over St. Bonaventure in 1961.

A Closer Look At The Wake-St. Joe's Series

Dec. 27, 1982 -- ECAC Holiday Festival New York, N.Y. (Madison Square Garden)

Delaney Rudd led six Deacs in double figures with a game-high tying 20 points as Wake Forest cruised past St. Joseph's, 88-65... the Deacs out-rebounded the Hawks, 50-32... Bob Lajewski led St. Joseph's with 20 points ... the Hawks shot 50 percent in the loss.

Dec. 26, 1975 -- Gator Bowl Tournament Jacksonville, Fla. (Jacksonville Coliseum)

Rod Griffin scored a game-high 21 points as all five Deacon starters reached double figures in a 107-83 win... the Deacons recorded 52 free-throws, including 30-of-39 in the first-half alone... St. Joe's was whistled for 32 fouls and had four players foul out... the teams combined for 119 rebounds and 161 field goal attempts.

Feb. 22, 1969 Winston-Salem, N.C. (Winston-Salem Coliseum)

Dickie Walker scored 23 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and dished out five assists to help Wake Forest rally from a nine-point halftime deficit en route to a 87-77 victory... Hawk Mike Hauer led all scorers with 29 points... the Deacs outscored St. Joseph's, 52-33, in the second-half.

Feb. 28, 1968 -- Philadelphia

Mike Hauer scored 21 points and grabbed 25 rebounds to lead St. Joseph's over the Deacons, 85-69... the Hawks out-rebounded the Deacons, 61-33.

Feb. 19, 1967 Winston-Salem, N.C. (Winston-Salem Coliseum)

Cliff Anderson scored a game-high 30 points and Al Grundy corralled 15 rebounds to lead St. Joseph's over the Deacons, 79-66... Wake committed 27 turnovers... the Hawks registered 75 field goal attempts, while WFU managed only 55... Paul Long led WFU with 19 points.

Jan. 12, 1966 -- Philadelphia

Matt Guokas, future NBA head coach of the Orlando Magic, scored 20 points and dished out eight assists to lead the Hawks to a 97-72 rout.

Feb. 6, 1965 Winston-Salem, N.C. (Winston-Salem Coliseum)

Billy Oakes scored 22 points to lead five St. Joseph's players in double figures as the Hawks raced past Wake Forest, 117-91... St. Joseph's shot 58.3 percent (49-for-84) for the entire game; shot 76.5 percent (26-for-34) and scored 65 points in the second-half.

Jan. 18, 1964 -- Philadelphia

Bob Leonard scored a team-best 17 points as the Demon Deacons shot 50.8 percent (29-for-57), but St. Joseph's won the game, 73-64... the Hawks out-rebounded Wake Forest, 43-25.

Dec. 11, 1962 -- Winston-Salem, N.C.

Frank Christie scored 16 points, grabbed 10 rebounds and dished out seven assists to lead Wake Forest past St. Joseph's, 75-46... Butch Hassell scored 13 points and collected 17 rebounds as the Deacs dominated the boards, 63-29... St. Joseph's shot only 22.2 percent (16-for-72) from the field.

Mar. 16, 1962 -- NCAA East Regional Semifinal College Park, Md. (Cole Fieldhouse)

Len Chappell scored 34 points and grabbed 18 rebounds as the Deacons moved into the Elite Eight with a 96-85 overtime victory... Billy Packer scored 17 points, including a jumper with only four seconds left, sending the game into OT... St. Joseph's was credited with only two assists on its 30 field goals... Tom Wynne scored 29 points to lead St. Joseph's... the Deacons outscored the Hawks, 22-11, in overtime... future Philadelphia 76ers coach Jim Lynam

scored 15 points for then St. Joseph's coach and future NBA head coach Dr. Jack Ramsey.

Jan. 13, 1962 -- Philadelphia, Pa. (The Palestra)

Len Chappell scored 24 points and grabbed 12 rebounds, but Bill Hoy and Tom Wynne had 17 each to lead St. Joseph's to a 65-63 victory... Billy Packer scored 17 points, grabbed four rebounds and had four assists.

Jan. 31, 1961 -- Winston-Salem, N.C.

Jack Egan scored 28 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead the Hawks over Wake Forest, 72-70... Len Chappell scored 22 points and Billy Packer had 17... the Hawks snapped the Demon Deacons' 15-game home winning streak.

Mar. 18, 1961-- NCAA Tournament Second Round Charlotte, N.C.

Playing all 40 minutes, Len Chappell's 32 points and 16 rebounds were not enough to overcome six St. Joseph's players in double figures as the Hawks beat Wake Forest, 96-86... St. Joseph's led 48-28 at halftime... Bill Hoy led the Hawks with 20 points, while Frank Majewski chipped in 19 and Jim Lynam 15... Paul Westhead, future NBA head coach, played one scoreless minute for the Hawks.

Feb. 14, 1959 -- Philadelphia, Pa. (The Palestra)

Dickie Odom led four players for Wake Forest in double figures with 17 points, while Dave Budd added 16 in a 76-67 loss.

■ Wake Forest makes its 19th NCAA Tournament appearance. The Deacons are 26-18 all-time in Tournament play.

■ The Deacons are making their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and their 11th appearance since 1991.

■ Including appearances in the NIT, Wake Forest is appearing in postseason play for the 14th consecutive year. That's the longest current streak in the ACC.

■ Wake Forest has appeared in the Final Four once -- in 1962 -- behind Len Chappell and Billy Packer.

■ The Deacons have made it to the Elite Eight six times -- most recently in 1996.

■ Wake Forest is in the Sweet Sixteen round of the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time.

■ WFU is 14-5 all-time in NCAA Tournament first-round games. The Deacs won their last three first-round games -- vs. Pepperdine in 2002, vs. East Tennessee State in 2003 and vs. VCU in 2004. Wake's last first-round loss came against Butler in 2001.

■ Wake Forest is 5-3 all-time in regional semifinal games and 1-4 in regional championship games.

■ The Deacons are 4-2 in NCAA Tournament play under coach Skip Prosser.

Prosser's Tournament Resume

■ Head coach Skip Prosser is leading a team into the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time -- and for the fourth consecutive year -- in his 11-year coaching career.

■ Prosser is one of eight active coaches who has taken three different schools to the NCAA Tournament. In fact, Prosser is the only coach to take all three schools to the Tournament in his first year at each school.

■ Including NIT play, Prosser has guided 10 of his 11 teams to postseason play.

■ His NCAA Tournament record is 5-7, including a 4-2 mark while at Wake Forest.

■ Prosser led Xavier to the NCAA Tournament four times (1995, 1997, 1998 and 2001).

■ In his first year as a Division I coach, Prosser led Loyola (MD) to its first NCAA Tournament appearance.

■ After leading Loyola to the Tournament, Prosser then took Xavier to the Big Dance in his first year with the Musketeers. Thad Matta is the only other coach to lead two different

schools to the NCAA Tournament in his first two seasons as a head coach.

■ Prosser is the fifth coach to lead Wake to the NCAA Tournament. Only Dave Odom (8) and Carl Tacy (4) led the Deacs to the NCAA Tournament more than Prosser.

Wake vs. Oklahoma State: Series History

- The all-time series is tied, 1-1.
- Oklahoma State won the first meeting between the two teams, 71-66 in the NCAA East Regional semifinals in East Rutherford on March 24, 1995. The Cowboys went on to play in the Final Four.
- The Deacons gained a small measure of revenge the next season when Wake beat the Cowboys, 69-53 in Auburn Hills, MI as part of the Great Eight (Nov. 29, 1995).
- Wake Forest is 8-5 all-time against teams currently in the Big 12 Conference, including a 94-81 loss to Texas in Austin earlier this season.
- The Deacons are 2-2 all-time against Big 12 teams in NCAA Tournament play. The last time Wake Forest played a Big 12 team in the Tournament was a 65-62 second-round win over Texas on March 17, 1996. The Deacons went on to the Elite Eight.
- Wake Forest coach Skip Prosser has never coached against Oklahoma State.

Deacon-Cowboy Connections

- Skip Prosser and Eddie Sutton are two of the eight active coaches to have taken three teams to the NCAA Tournament (Rick Barnes, Mike Deane, Pete Gillen, Rick Pitino, Tubby Smith and Gary Williams).
- Wake Forest has faced an Eddie Sutton team five times, twice in the NCAA Tournament. Sutton is 2-3 against the Demon Deacons.
- Four of those five games have been decided by six points or less.
- The Deacons defeated Sutton's Arkansas squad in the 1977 NCAA Tournament, 86-80, in Norman, Okla.
- The Cowboys eliminated Wake Forest from the 1995 NCAA Tournament in the Sweet 16 in East Rutherford, N.J., 71-66.
- Wake Forest defeated Sutton's Cowboys in the 1995 Great Eight, 69-53.
- Wake Forest beat Sutton's Razorbacks in 1982, 49-48, in Fayetteville, Ark.
- In 1983, Sutton's Arkansas team beat Wake Forest in Greensboro, 68-65.
- Oklahoma State guard John Lucas is the son of former Cleveland Cavaliers coach and Maryland standout John Lucas. During his playing days at Maryland (1973-76), the elder Lucas was 7-2 against the Demon Deacons.

Wake vs. Pittsburgh: Series History

- The Deacons and Panthers have never met on the hardwood.

■ While Wake Forest has never played Pittsburgh previously, the Deacons are 0-5 all-time when playing in the Iron City. Wake played in the Steel Bowl in Pittsburgh on Dec. 29-30, losing to host Duquesne and Navy. The Deacons lost a road game at Duquesne on Dec. 17, 1966. On Dec. 11-12, 1953, the Deacs lost consecutive games to Duquesne and Bradley in the Steel Bowl.

■ Wake has played two teams from the state of Pennsylvania in back-to-back games previously. In the 1961-62 season, the Deacons lost consecutive January road games to St. Francis and St. Joseph's. Later that season in the NCAA Tournament, Wake beat St. Joseph's and Villanova to advance to the Final Four.

■ Wake Forest is 39-45 all-time against teams from the Big East Conference (44 of those 84 games have come against Virginia Tech). The Deacons' last game against a Big East opponent came on Dec. 21, 2002 - an 84-72 win over St. John's in Winston-Salem.

■ The Deacons are 2-1 all-time against Big East teams in NCAA Tournament play. Wake's last Tournament meeting with a Big East foe was a 67-64 loss to Boston College in the opening round of the 1981 NCAA Tournament in Tuscaloosa, AL.

■ Wake Forest coach Skip Prosser is 0-1 all-time against Pittsburgh. His Xavier team lost to the Panthers, 94-76 on Nov. 26, 1998 in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Deacon-Panther Connections

- Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser was born in Pittsburgh on Nov. 3, 1950. He played basketball and football at Carnegie High School.
- Prosser is an avid Steelers and Pirates fan. He made a reference to Roberto Clemente during his press conference at the time of his hiring at Wake Forest.
- Pittsburgh assistant Joe Lombardi coached against Prosser's staff while an assistant coach in the Atlantic 10 at St. Bonaventure (1996-01). Prosser's Musketeers were 4-2 against the Bonnies during that time period.

Wake's History In The Garden State

- Wake Forest is 0-2 all-time in East Rutherford.
- The Deacons have played an NCAA Tournament game in East Rutherford just once - a 71-66 East Regional semifinal loss to Oklahoma State on March 24, 1995. The Cowboys went on to the Final Four that season.
- The only other time Wake played in East Rutherford was a 69-64 loss to 19th-ranked Princeton on Dec. 19, 1997 in the Jimmy V Classic.
- The Deacons have one win in the state of New Jersey. Wake won on the road against Fairleigh-Dickinson, 66-43 on Dec. 7, 1991.
- Wake Forest opened the season just across the river, at Madison Square Garden, beating Memphis.

NCAA Tournament/Sweet 16 Notebook

■ The East Rutherford region is the only region to have all four top seeds reach the Sweet 16, which hasn't happened since 2001.

■ Wake Forest has the best record in NCAA Tournament overtime games (3-0) in the history of the tournament.

■ The Deacons went 2-3 this season against teams in the Sweet Sixteen. Wake Forest split two games each with Duke and Georgia Tech and Wake lost on the road at Texas.

■ Wake Forest was one of five North Carolina teams in the 65-team NCAA Tournament field, joining Charlotte, Duke, North Carolina and NC State.

■ The four North Carolina ACC schools (Duke, North Carolina, NC State and Wake Forest) -- the "Big Four" -- were all in the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 1991.

■ In 1962, Len Chappell averaged 26.8 points and 17.2 rebounds in five NCAA Tournament games.

■ Bones McKinney, who coached Wake Forest to the 1962 Final Four, is one of six men to play and coach in a Final Four game. McKinney is joined by Vic Bubas, Billy Donovan, Dick Harp, Bob Knight and Dean Smith.

■ On Thursday, the Deacons will play their 11th game in the New York metropolitan area since the 1995 season. The Deacons are 5-5 during that stretch.

■ The last time a four-seed defeated a one-seed was 1999 when Ohio State knocked off Auburn in the South region in Knoxville.

■ The last time a four-seed defeated a one-seed in East Rutherford was 1995 when Oklahoma State defeated Wake Forest.

■ Six of the last nine East Rutherford regional champions reached the NCAA championship game, but only one (North Carolina in 1993) went on to win the title.

■ The last time there was an ACC/A-10 match-up in a regional was 1999 when Duke defeated Temple 85-64 to go to the Final Four. That game took place in East Rutherford.

■ The ACC is 7-2 against teams currently in the Atlantic 10 in regional semifinal games. Thursday's game will be the first since 1988 when Duke edged Rhode Island 73-72 in East Rutherford.

■ The last No. 4 seed to win the national championship was Arizona in 1997. That Wildcat team beat the 12th seeded team by four points to make the Sweet 16 (as Wake Forest did). Once there, Arizona, with no senior starters, defeated once-beaten and top-seeded Kansas in regional semifinal. That game featured a battle of highly-touted point guards -- Arizona freshman

Mike Bibby and Jayhawk senior Jacque Vaughn.

■ There are 12 student-athletes from the state of North Carolina participating in the Sweet 16. Eight are on the Wake Forest roster, two from Duke, one at Kansas (Christian Moody from Asheville) and one at Texas (P.J. Tucker from Raleigh).

ACC Rookie Of The Year Is Chris Paul

In a conference loaded with talented freshmen, Chris Paul came away with the ACC Rookie of the Year honor, which was awarded March 16th.

Paul is the first Wake Forest player to earn ACC Rookie of the Year honors since Robert O'Kelley in 1998. He is just the third Deacon all-time to win the award (Rodney Rogers was the other selection in 1991).

Paul's award means that over the last two seasons Wake Forest has won all three individual ACC awards. Josh Howard was the ACC Player of the Year last season and Skip Prosser was the 2003 Coach of the Year.

Justin Gray: First Team All-ACC

Wake Forest sophomore guard Justin Gray, the ACC's third-leading scorer and one of only two league players to average more than three three-point field goals per game, was named first team All-ACC March 8th.

Gray is joined on the first team by Rashad McCants (North Carolina), Julius Hodge (NC State), Tim Pickett (Florida State) and Chris Duhon (Duke). More on Gray's All-ACC selection.

■ Gray gives Wake Forest first team selections in back-to-back years (Josh Howard was a unanimous first team selection last season) for the first time since 1996-97.

■ Gray and McCants are the only two sophomores on the team. Hodge is a junior and Pickett and Duhon are seniors.

■ Gray is the first Wake Forest sophomore to earn All-ACC first team honors since Tim Duncan in 1995.

■ Twenty-one Wake Forest players have earned first team honors a total of 33 times.

Chris Paul Earns Four ACC Honors

Chris Paul became the first Wake Forest freshman to earn All-ACC honors since Rodney Rogers in 1991 when he was named third team All-ACC March 8.

Paul was also named to the ACC's All-Freshman and All-Defensive Teams. More on Paul's ACC awards:

■ Paul was named second team All-ACC Tournament even though the Deacons lost in the quarterfinals.

■ Paul and Duke's Luol Deng, also a third team selection, were the only freshmen to earn All-ACC honors.

■ Paul and Deng were unanimous selections for the All-Freshman Team.

■ The ACC leader in steals per game, Paul was the only freshman named to the All-Defensive Team.

■ Paul gives Wake Forest a member of the All-Freshman Team for the second straight year. Justin Gray was on the team last year.

■ Paul is the sixth Deacon to earn All-Freshman honors since the team originated in 1993. He joins Tim Duncan (1994), Loren Woods (1997), Robert O'Kelley (1998), Darius Songaila (1999) and Gray (2003).

Gray And Paul Named All-District

Justin Gray was named first team USBWA All-District III and Chris Paul was named second team March 8.

Gray was joined on the first team by Chris Duhon (Duke), Julius Hodge (NC State), Rashad McCants (North Carolina) and J.J. Redick (Duke).

Paul Earns National Recognition

Chris Paul has been named the National Freshman of the Year by three different sources. Paul was named "Diaper Dandy" of the Year by ESPN/ABC analyst Dick Vitale. He was also named the nation's top freshman by CollegelInsider.com and The Sporting News. Rivals.com named Paul first team All-Freshman.

Paul A Finalist For The Cousy Award

Deacon freshman Chris Paul is a finalist for the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard Award.

Paul is one of 16 finalists for the Cousy Award and he is the only freshman on the list of candidates. North Carolina's Raymond Felton is the other ACC player on the list. St. Joseph's Jameer Nelson heads the list.

Paul was also one of just two freshmen on the Wooden Award midseason list of candidates, joining Minnesota's Kris Humphries. He is one of five ACC players on the list, joining Duke's Chris Duhon, Georgia Tech's B.J. Elder, NC State's Julius Hodge and UNC's Sean May.

Levy Recognized For Defense

Junior Jamaal Levy was named to the Fans' Guide ACC All-Defensive Team March 8th.

Levy was also named honorable mention All-Defensive by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association.

■ The Deacs have beaten two teams ranked in the top five -- No. 4 North Carolina and No. 3 Duke -- for the first time since 1994-95.

■ Wake has two road wins this season against ranked teams -- at then-No. 4 North Carolina on Dec. 20 and at then-No. 18 Georgia Tech Feb. 22 -- for the first time since 1996-97.

■ The Deacs beat three ranked teams -- No. 13 Cincinnati, No. 3 Duke and No. 18 Georgia Tech -- in consecutive games for the first time in school history.

Deacons Reach Milestone Victories

■ Wake Forest's win over Virginia Commonwealth last Thursday marked the Deacons' 20th victory of the season. Wake owns three consecutive 20-win seasons and nine 20-wins seasons in the last 12 years.

■ Wake Forest earned all-time win No. 1,300 Feb. 22 at Georgia Tech.

■ Wake's win at Maryland Feb. 28 was its ninth ACC win of the season, securing a winning record in league play for the third straight year.

■ Wake Forest is trying to delay its 1,000th loss as long as possible. The Deacons' all-time record is 1,304-999.

Wake 2nd In The Nation In Scoring

■ Wake Forest leads the ACC and ranks second in the nation in scoring offense (83.7 points per game).

■ The Deacons could finish first in the ACC in scoring for the first time since 1981 and for just the fifth time in the 51-year history of the conference. Duke has led the league in scoring each of the last seven years.

■ Wake is averaging more points per game than any Deacon team since 1976.

■ The Deacons have scored 90 or more points in a game 10 times this season.

Deacons Win A Pair By Five Points

Wake Forest advanced to the Sweet Sixteen by a combined five points. The Deacons beat Virginia Commonwealth by one point (79-78) and Manhattan by four points (84-80).

Only UAB (combined wins by three points) and Alabama (four points) had closer margins.

Paul Plays The Ultimate Complete Game

To say that Chris Paul was instrumental in Wake Forest's 84-80 win over Manhattan last Saturday in the second round of the NCAA Tournament would be a huge understatement.

Paul led Wake Forest in almost every statistical category -- points (29), rebounds (career-high 8), assists (6), steals (3), blocked shots (2), field goals (10), field goal attempts (14), free throws (8), free throw attempts (9) and minutes played (38). He also made his only three-point field goal attempt.

Paul's 29 points tied for the fifth-most points in an NCAA Tournament game by a Deacon player and were the most since Rodney Rogers scored 33 against Iowa on March 19, 1993.

More On Paul In The NCAA Tournament

It would not be a stretch to say that Chris Paul's performance in the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament has been one of the best efforts ever by a freshman.

In two NCAA Tournament games, Paul is averaging 25.5 points, 6.5 assists, 5.5 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game. He is shooting 60 percent (15-of-25) from the field and 83.3 percent (20-of-24) from the free throw line. He has 13 assists and just three turnovers in 75 minutes.

Paul needs just seven assists to tie the Wake Forest record for the most assists in an NCAA Tournament series.

CP A Good Bet To Break ACC Record

Chris Paul would need an off-night not to break the ACC freshman record for steals on Thursday. Paul enters the St. Joseph's game with 81 steals, tying former Duke standout Jason Williams for the most steals ever by an ACC frosh.

To put Paul's rookie-year total of 81 steals into perspective, consider that he has 34 more steals than any freshman in Wake Forest history; and consider that only nine freshmen in NCAA history recorded 90 steals.

Wake One Of Nation's Youngest Teams

■ With no scholarship seniors on the roster, Wake Forest is one of college basketball's youngest teams. In fact, the Deacons are one of just six Division I schools with no scholarship seniors on the roster.

■ Walk-on Alan Williams is the only senior on the Deacon roster.

■ Wake Forest has just three juniors on the roster to go with five sophomores and four freshmen.

■ Wake's top three scorers are all freshmen or sophomores. In fact, freshmen and sophomores have combined to produce 69.1 percent of the Deacons' point total (1,735 of 2,510).

■ One junior, three sophomores and one freshman made up the starting five last time out.

Wake Forest 2-0 In Extra Minutes

■ Wake Forest is 2-0 in overtime games this season after it beat visiting Florida State, 90-87, Feb. 25. The Deacons beat North Carolina in triple-overtime back on Dec. 20, 119-114. Oddly, the Florida State game was Wake's first overtime game that didn't go to at least a second overtime since Jan. 31, 2001.

■ Wake Forest hasn't played an overtime game in the NCAA Tournament since a 73-71 win over DePaul in 1984.

■ The Deacons are 3-0 all-time in NCAA Tournament overtime games.

Individual Milestones On The Horizon

■ **Taron Downey** and **Justin Gray** enter Thursday's game with 128 career three-point field goals each. They are tied for the sixth-most in Wake Forest history.

■ Gray's fifth point will be the 800th of his two-year career. Downey is 17 points shy of his 800th point.

■ Gray (93 three-point field goals this season) is within reach of breaking the school single-season record. With four more three-point field goals, he will pass Randolph Childress for second place for the most single-season three-pointers in Wake history. The all-time school record is 100 three-point field goals by Craig Dawson in 2002.

■ Downey's fourth three-point field goal attempt will be his 349th, passing Rusty LaRue for the sixth-most attempts in school history.

■ Downey (281 career assists) needs three assists to pass Delaney Rudd (283) for 10th place on Wake's all-time assists chart.

■ **Chris Paul** (81 steals this season), is four steals away from tying for the second-most single-season steals in Wake history. With eight steals, Paul will tie Muggsy Bogues (89 steals in 1986) for the most single-season steals in school history.

■ Paul (175 assists this season) needs three assists to pass Skip Brown (177 assists in 1975) for the sixth-most single-season assists in Wake history. With eight assists, he will pass Frank Johnson (182 assists in 1981) for fifth place.

■ Paul (448 points) is 40 points away from breaking the Wake Forest freshman record of 497 points by Robert O'Kelley in 1998.

■ Paul (143 free throws) is seven free throws made shy from becoming the 19th player in WFU history with 150 single-season free throws.

■ When Paul starts on Thursday, he will tie teammate Eric Williams for the third-most starts ever by a Deacon freshman.

■ With 37 more minutes of action, Paul will break the Wake Forest freshman record of 1,044 minutes held by Frank Johnson in 1977. Paul and Johnson are the only freshmen in Wake Forest history to play more than 1,000 minutes.

■ **Eric Williams'** second rebound will be the 300th of his two-year career.

■ Freshman **Chris Paul** carries with him to every game a copy of his grandfather's obituary. Paul's grandfather was tragically killed last year. On the day of the funeral, Paul went out and scored 61 points -- one for every year of his grandfather's life.

■ Sophomore **Trent Strickland's** father makes the three-hour drive to every Wake Forest home game, then returns, often in the middle of the night, to get to his workplace by 6 a.m.

■ Junior **Vyatas Danelius** can speak four different languages -- English, Lithuanian, Russian and German.

■ **Joyce** grew up not far from Winston-Salem in Mount Airy, NC. Mount Airy is the town in which the Andy Griffith Show was based.

■ Freshman **Kyle Visser's** parents, Diane and James Visser, have made the drive from Grand Rapids, MI for several Deacon home games this season.

■ There are four walk-ons on the Deacon roster: senior **Alan Williams**, junior **Scott Benken**, junior **Scott Feather** and sophomore **John Buck**.

■ Benken, a transfer from Cincinnati, will graduate this spring. He plans to end his basketball career and enroll in pharmacy school.

Last Hurrah For Senior Walk-Ons

Wake Forest had "Senior Night" Feb. 25 to honor two Deacon players and two student-managers.

Walk-on **Alan Williams** is the only true senior and the only fourth-year player on the Deacon roster. Williams' career began as a walk-on under coach Dave Odom in the 2000-01 season. He has been a part of one of the best four-year runs in Wake Forest history as the Deacons have won 83 games in the last four seasons combined.

Scott Benken, who earned a spot on the roster with his remarkable work ethic, is in his second year with the Deacons. He will graduate in the spring and enroll in pharmacy school.

Also honored were managers **Tom Norton** and **Adam Ampuja**.

Deacons Have Had Share Of Injuries

Wake Forest head trainer, assistant athletic director **Greg Collins**, has been one of the most active people on the Deacon staff this season as Wake has suffered more than its share of injuries.

Four different Deacons have missed a combined 14 games. Junior **Vytas Danelius** (high ankle sprain) missed five straight games before returning to action Jan. 13 at Texas. Sophomore **Chris Ellis** is back in the fold after breaking a bone in his foot on the first day of practice. Freshmen **Kyle Visser** and **Todd Hendley** missed one game each.

Wake Signs One In Early Period

Cameron Stanley, a 6-7 senior at Raleigh Millbrook High School, signed a letter-of-intent to play basketball at Wake Forest, Demon Deacon head coach **Skip Prosser** confirmed November 19.

Stanley averaged 21.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists, and 2.0 steals per game as a junior in 2002-03 while leading Millbrook to a 26-5 record.

He was a finalist for North Carolina's Mr. Basketball, he earned a spot on the all-conference team and he emerged as one of the nation's top prospects at the ABCD camp in Teaneck, N.J..

Stanley was also invited to USA Basketball's Youth Development Festival in Colorado Springs, Colo.

As a sophomore, Stanley averaged 19.2 points and 6.7 rebounds per game.

The current Wake Forest roster includes no scholarship seniors. Assuming the roster remains intact, Stanley will be one of nine North Carolina natives on the 2004-05 Deacon roster.

Wake Forest Retires Howard's Jersey

Wake Forest retired the jersey of former consensus All-American **Josh Howard** during a ceremony at halftime of Wake's Jan. 29 game against Maryland.

Howard, currently a rookie with the NBA's Dallas Mavericks, attended the ceremony.

In 2003, Howard enjoyed a remarkable season. He was the first unanimous selection for ACC Player of the Year since NC State's **David Thompson** in 1975. Howard, a consensus first

Miscellaneous

■ There are 2,662 living Wake Forest alumni in the states of New Jersey and New York.

■ Wake Forest and Duke are the only teams in the ACC to have finished each of the past four seasons in the top 30 of the RPI.

■ Several members of the Deacon basketball team took part in Santa's Helpers Dec. 12-13. Some 60 Deacon student-athletes from all sports helped purchase gifts for area needy families. They wrapped the gifts and delivered them personally to the families. Wake's **Chris Paul** dressed as Santa Claus.

■ **Paul Cluxton** of Northern Kentucky holds the NCAA record (all divisions) for consecutive free throws made with 94 in 1996-97. Who is **Paul Cluxton**? He is the brother-in-law of Wake Forest director of basketball operations **Pat Kelsey**.

■ The Wake-Texas game on Jan. 13 drew the largest crowd (16,837) in the history of UT's Erwin Center.

■ Apparently, the basket is bigger in Texas -- at least for sophomore **Justin Gray**. In two games this season in the Lone Star State (vs. SMU and Texas), Gray made 14 three-point field goals (6 vs. SMU, 8 vs. Texas).

■ Sophomore **Trent Strickland** is wearing jersey No. 33 this year after wearing No. 34 last season.

■ Wake Forest has played against the sons of some pretty famous dads this season -- North Carolina's **Sean May** (Scott May), Indiana's **Patrick Ewing, Jr.**, and Yale's **John Shumate**. Last season the Deacons played SC State's **Moses Malone, Jr.** Of course, Wake's own **Chris Ellis** is the son of **Dale Ellis**.

■ Wake Forest is 26-23 all-time against the three teams that will soon join the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Deacons are 24-20 all-time

against Virginia Tech and last played the Hokies in 1999. Wake is 2-0 versus Miami with the last meeting in 1991. The Deacs are 0-3 all-time against Boston College with the last meeting coming in 1986.

■ Four former Deacons -- **Tim Duncan** (San Antonio), **Rodney Rogers** (New Jersey), **Josh Howard** (Dallas) and **Darius Songaila** (Sacramento) -- are on NBA rosters.

■ Deacon head coach **Skip Prosser** has never lost a season opener in 11 years of coaching.

■ Wake Forest has won 15 consecutive home openers, including a 97-55 win over **Elon** on Nov. 22.

Downey's Remarkable Recovery

Junior guard **Taron Downey** was expected to play sparingly -- if at all -- in Wake Forest's season opener Nov. 13 against Memphis in Madison Square Garden.

After all, just eight days earlier, Downey had an emergency appendectomy. He took part in just one practice and avoided all contact drills prior to the team's departure to New York. Freshman **Chris Paul** started in Downey's spot at point guard.

When sophomore guard **Justin Gray** got into foul trouble, Downey was inserted into the game. Coach **Skip Prosser** continually consulted with Downey on his condition and the junior ended up playing 29 minutes. Downey scored a career-high 20 points, made 4-of-7 three-point field goals and he added five assists, five rebounds and a blocked shot. For his efforts, he was named Coaches vs. Classic game MVP.

A chronological look at Downey's week:

Nov. 4 -- Downey began feeling poorly and had difficulty sleeping.

Nov. 5 -- After consulting with head trainer **Greg Collins**, Downey's blood was tested. Later that night, an appendectomy was performed.

Nov. 6 -- Downey was released from the hospital.

Nov. 10 -- Downey dressed out for practice but limited only to shooting.

Nov. 11 -- Downey went through a full practice, although avoiding contact drills.

Nov. 12 -- Team takes a turbulent flight to New York.

Nov. 13 -- Downey comes off the bench to play 29 minutes, score a career-high 20 points, make four three-point field goals, dish out five assists, grab five rebounds and block one shot.

- In three postseason games -- one ACC Tournament game and two NCAA Tournament games -- Paul is averaging 27.0 points, 7.3 assists and 5.0 rebounds per game while shooting 53.3 percent.
- He joins Dickie Hemric as the only freshmen in Wake history to have more than one 30-point game.
- In the second round of the NCAA Tournament last Saturday, Paul led Wake in scoring (29), rebounds (8), assists (6), steals (3) and blocks (2).
- Over his last 10 games, Paul has been Wake Forest's leading scorer (19.8 ppg.) and has shot a sizzling 62.1 percent (18-of-29) from three-point range.
- Edged out Duke's Luol Deng for ACC Rookie of the Year and was named National Freshman of the Year by three sources.
- Paul became the first Deacon freshman to earn All-ACC honors since Rodney Rogers in 1991 when he was named third team All-ACC. He was also named to the ACC All-Freshman and All-Defensive teams.
- One of just two freshmen -- joining Minnesota's Kris Humphries -- on the midseason list of 30 candidates for the John R. Wooden Award.
- The only freshman candidate for the Bob Cousy Point Guard Award.
- Named ACC Rookie of the Week five times.
- Has an assist-turnover ratio of better than 2-to-1 with 175 assists and just 79 turnovers; which ranks Paul second in the ACC.
- He ranks fifth in the nation and first in the ACC in steals per game (2.79).
- Leads all ACC freshmen and ranks third in the ACC overall in assists per game (5.83).
- His 81 steals are the third-most single-season steals in Wake Forest history. Only Muggsy Bogues, who had 89 steals in 1986 and 85 steals in 1985, ranks ahead of Paul. Paul's 81 steals shatter the Wake Forest freshman record of 53 held by Rodney Rogers.
- His 175 assists are the most ever by a Deacon freshman and rank as the seventh-most single-season assists overall in Wake Forest history.
- He is the co-holder of Wake freshman single-game records for assists (10) and steals (6).
- Attempting to be the first freshman to lead the ACC in steals since NC State's Chris Corchiani in 1988.
- Attempting to become the first Deacon player, regardless of class, to lead the ACC in steals since Bogues did it three straight years from 1985-87.
- His free throw percentage (.841) is the highest ever by a Deacon freshman, ranks third overall in the ACC and he goes to the line more than any Deacon.
- His three-point percentage (.464) is the highest ever by a Wake freshman and it ranks 22nd nationally.
- Has started every game and leads the team in minutes played (33.6 mpg.).
- The shortest player on the roster, Paul (6-0) has 12 blocked shots.

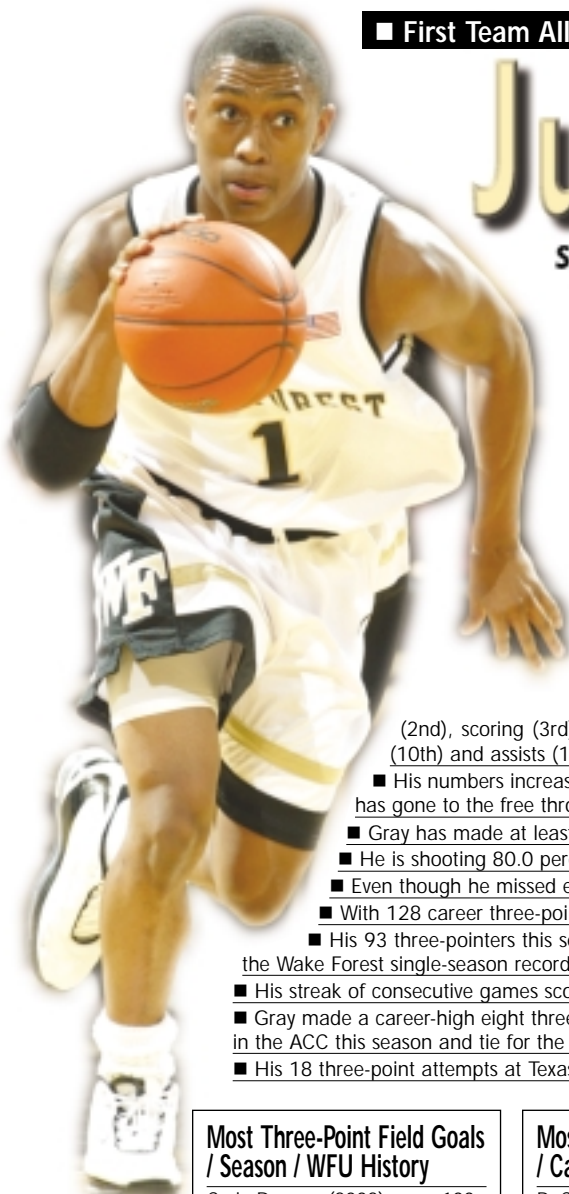

- Has put up All-America-type numbers since late January. Over his last 10 games, Gray has averaged 18.8 points, 3.4 three-point field goals and 2.5 assists per game.
- The first Wake Forest sophomore to earn first team All-ACC honors since Tim Duncan in 1995.
- Gray has developed into one of the nation's best three-point shooters. He has 93 three-point field goals this season for an average of 3.10 per game, ranking second in the ACC. Over his last eight games, Gray has 30 three-point field goals.
- He tied with Florida State's Tim Pickett for the most three-point field goals per game in ACC games only (3.25).
- He was named ACC Player of the Week in consecutive weeks (Feb. 23 and March 1).
- He averages 19.3 points and 3.4 three-point field goals against nationally-ranked teams.
- He ranks third in the ACC in scoring (16.8) and second in ACC games only (19.4).
- Gray ranks in the ACC's top 15 in six different statistical categories -- three-point field goals (2nd), scoring (3rd), free throw percentage (8th), three-point field goal percentage (10th), field goal percentage (10th) and assists (13th).
- His numbers increased when he began to be more aggressive on the offensive end in mid-January. For example, he has gone to the free throw line 62 times over the last 12 games, compared to 53 attempts in the first 18 games.
- Gray has made at least one three-point field goal in 41 out of his last 42 games.
- He is shooting 80.0 percent from the free throw line, which ranks fourth in the ACC.
- Even though he missed eight games last season because of a broken jaw, he has already amassed 795 career points.
- With 128 career three-point field goals, he already ranks tied for sixth in Wake Forest history.
- His 93 three-pointers this season are the fourth-most single-season three-pointers in Wake history and he is within sight of the Wake Forest single-season record of 100 three-point field goals.
- His streak of consecutive games scoring in double figures was snapped at 14 games on Saturday.
- Gray made a career-high eight three-point field goals Jan. 13 at Texas en route to 27 points. His eight three-pointers were the most in the ACC this season and tie for the 11th-most in ACC history.
- His 18 three-point attempts at Texas broke a Wake Forest single-game record and tie for the third-most in ACC history.

While his backcourt mates have garnered most of the awards, junior guard **Taron Downey** has quietly been the glue that holds the Deacons together:

- Downey scored 10 key points in Saturday's NCAA second-round win over Manhattan.

- In two NCAA Tournament games, Downey is 4-of-8 from three-point range and 2-of-2 from the free throw line.

- Downey has made a three-point field goal in 19 of his last 20 games.

- Downey's career free throw percentage (.839) is the fourth-highest in Wake Forest history. His free throw percentage this season (.838) would be one of the highest percentages in Wake history.

- In Wake's 16 ACC games, Downey shot 42.9 percent from three-point range, which ranked fifth in the league.

- He has 128 career three-point field goals, which ties for the sixth-most in Wake Forest history.

- With 281 career assists, Downey ranks 11th in Wake history.

- With 783 career points, he is on track to become the 42nd Deacon to score 1,000 career points.

- Downey leads the team with 95 career games played.

- He is one of three team captains.

- Levy ranks fourth in the ACC in rebounding (8.4 rpg.), and in ACC games only he averaged 9.2 rebounds per game, which also ranks third.

- The ACC Fans' Guide named him to the league's All-Defensive Team.

- Since Feb. 22, Levy has averaged 9.4 rebounds per game.

- He has pulled down double-figure rebounds in nine games this season including four of the last seven games.

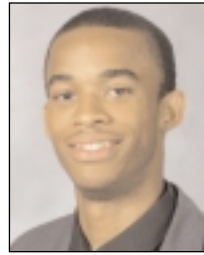
- Levy's production is not limited to rebounding and defense. He has scored in double figures in all three postseason games including 12 points Saturday against Manhattan.

Sophomore center **Eric Williams** weighs about the same as he did last year (275 pounds), but he has gotten stronger and lowered his body fat. The Wake Forest (NC) native has also re-shaped his game.

- Williams has improved his scoring average from 8.7 ppg. last season to 12.2 ppg. this season.

- He has scored in double figures in eight of his last 10 games.

- Williams is shooting 53.6 percent from the floor and he shoots 67.5 percent from the free throw line, which ranks 14th in the ACC.

- "Big E" has been instrumental in two of Wake Forest's biggest victories this season. He scored 16 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the Feb. 18 win over No. 3 Duke. He hit what proved to be the game-winning shot in the third overtime of the Dec. 20 win at No. 4 North Carolina. He scored 24 points against the Tar Heels.

- Williams ranks among the ACC leaders in three statistical categories -- offensive rebounds (7th), rebounds (11th) and scoring (19th).

- He was ACC Player of the Week Dec. 22.

Skip Prosser, one of college basketball's winningest active coaches, is in his third season as the head coach at Wake Forest. Prosser's overall record of 232-106 (.686) gives him one of the highest winning percentages among all active Division I coaches. In three seasons at Wake Forest, he has compiled a record of 67-28.

In Prosser's first season at Wake Forest in 2001-02, he led the Deacons to a 21-13 record, a third-place finish in the highly-competitive Atlantic Coast Conference and an NCAA Tournament appearance. But the 2001-02 season was just a stepping stone. In 2002-03, Prosser guided Wake Forest to its highest level since the Tim Duncan era.

Wake Forest finished last season with a 25-6 overall record and a final No. 8 ranking in the Associated Press poll -- Wake's highest finish in the poll since 1995. The Deacons finished 13-3 and in first place in the ACC standings for the first time since 1995. It was WFU's first outright ACC regular season title in 41 years.

Prosser's Deacons were not ranked in any of the preseason polls and were picked to finish as low as seventh in the ACC, but Prosser molded a rotation of seven freshmen and sophomores with All-American senior Josh Howard into one of college basketball's top teams in 2002-03.

Wake Forest led the nation in rebounding (+9.6 rebound margin), becoming the first ACC team to ever accomplish that feat. The Deacons were also ranked among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, free throw percentage, scoring margin and winning percentage. With an NCAA at-large bid, Wake Forest advanced to postseason competition for an ACC-leading 13th consecutive year.

For his efforts, Prosser was named the ACC Coach of the Year. He was also named district coach of the year by the NABC and the USBWA, and he was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year.

The energetic Prosser has also helped make Wake Forest's home court, Lawrence Joel Coliseum, into a difficult venue for the opponent. He was responsible for moving the student section closer to the court and developed a close relationship with the student cheering section, The Screamin' Demons. It

became a ritual for Deacon players to don the Screamin' Demons' tie-dyed shirts for warm-ups and Prosser himself wore one of the black and gold shirts for Midnight Madness.

Prosser and his young staff also worked with the marketing office to make home games an "event" as much as a game. With loud music and an array of pre-game antics (such as the Deacon mascot on a Harley-Davidson), Lawrence Joel Coliseum is certainly a home court advantage.

The Deacons responded by going 16-0 at home last season -- their best record ever in the building -- and stretched their home court winning streak to 24 games in 2004. In Prosser's three seasons at Wake, the Deacs are a combined 41-6 at home.

From Day One, Prosser has made academics a priority with his players. Mandatory study halls are the norm, class attendance is checked, and Prosser even named academic counselor Jane Caldwell the team's "MVP" in 2002. In his first two seasons at Wake, all seven senior basketball players have earned their diplomas.

Prosser's 10 years as a head coach have been a model of consistency. His teams have won at least 21 games in each of the last seven seasons. His teams have advanced to the NCAA Tournament seven times and to the NIT twice.

Prosser has won regular season titles in three different leagues (ACC, Atlantic 10, MCC), postseason conference tournament crowns in two leagues (Atlantic 10, MAAC). He has been named conference Coach of the Year in two different leagues and he is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to lead three different teams into the NCAA Tournament. Prosser, in fact, is the only coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the NCAA Tournament in his first year at each school.

In two years of ACC competition, Prosser has compiled a record of 22-10. Only North Carolina's Bill Guthridge won more league games in his first two seasons as an ACC coach.

George Edward "Skip" Prosser, who was born on Nov. 3, 1950 in Pittsburgh (Pa.), is married to the former Nancy Franklin. He has two sons, Scott (26) and Mark (25). Mark played basketball at Marist College, coached at Wofford last season and is coaching at Bucknell in 2003-04.

Skip Prosser: 65 Wins In Three Seasons At WFU

Wake Forest coach Skip Prosser has guided Wake Forest to 67 wins -- or an average of 22.3 victories per season -- in his three years with the Demon Deacons. His ACC coaching start is one of the best in league history:

- Prosser's winning percentage in ACC league games (.646/31-17) is the third-highest percentage ever by a coach in his first three seasons in the conference. Vic Bubas (.667) and Bill Guthridge (.667) are tied for first.

- His overall winning percentage at Wake Forest (.705/67-28) gives him the sixth-highest percentage in the 51-year history of the ACC. Only Dean Smith



Skip Prosser

(.776), Mike Krzyzewski (.776), Bubas (.761), Guthridge (.741) and Frank McGuire (.710) have/had higher percentages.

- Prosser's career winning percentage (.686/232-106) is the 17th-highest among all active Division I coaches.

- Wake Forest's 67 wins in three seasons ties for the fourth-most wins over a three-year period in school history.

- The Deacons have won 31 ACC regular season games in three years under Prosser. Only Duke (37 wins) and Maryland (33) have won more than Wake Forest.

- In Prosser's three years with the Deacons, Wake has scored 100-plus points six times. Before his arrival, the Deacons reached 100 points just five times in the previous 13 years.

- Prosser was the unanimous selection for ACC Coach of the Year in 2003.

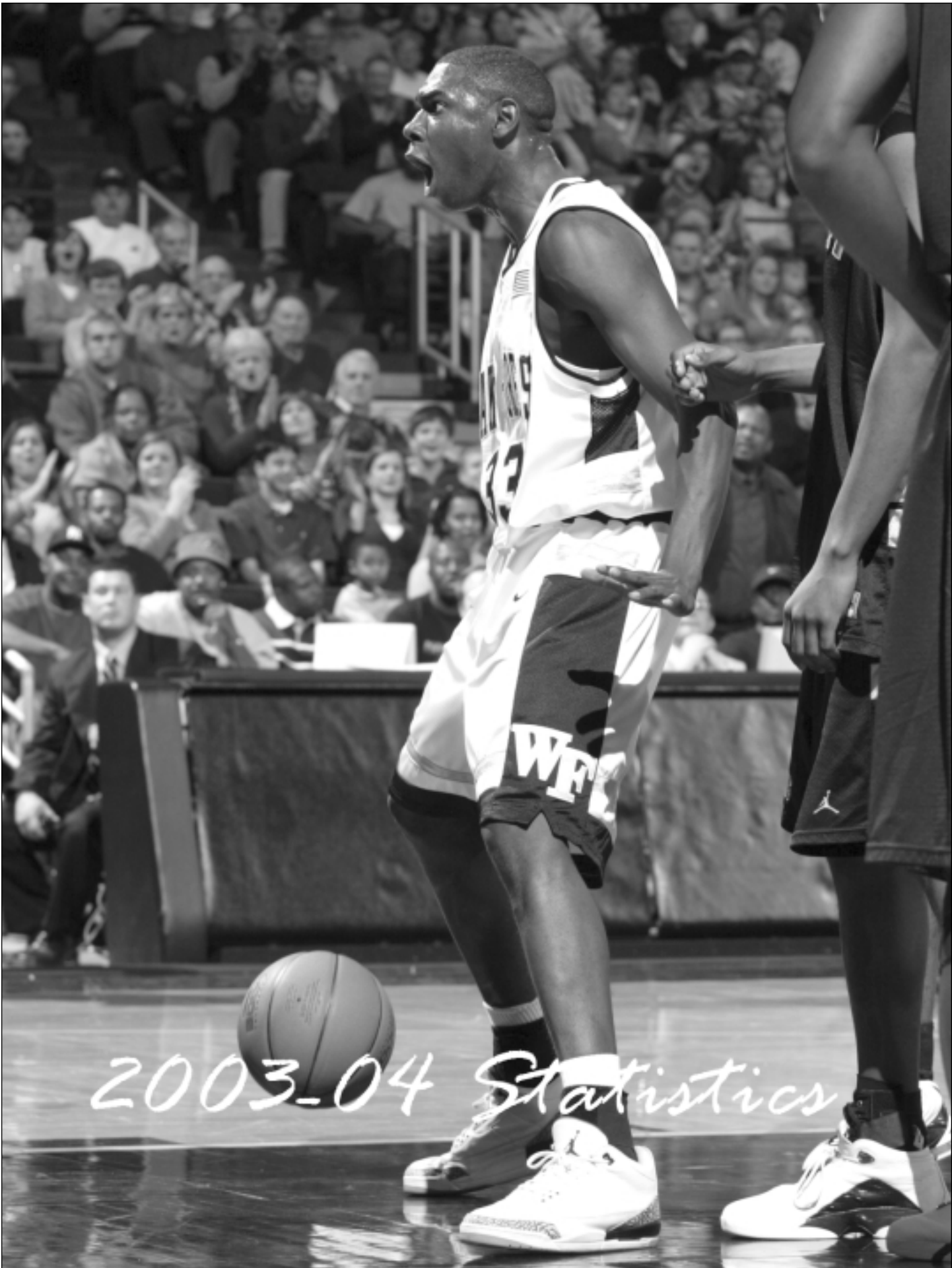
