SENIOR / GUARD / 6-0 / 175 / CONCORD, N.C. / CENTRAL CABARRUSH S.

Lightning quick point guard who started for the Deacons as a freshman and sophomore ... An injury to start 2008-09 pushed him to a reserve role, but he excelled as the team's sixth man ... Consummate team leader both on the court and off ... Three-year team captain ... Has developed a knack for hitting clutch shots late in games ... Looks to pass first but has scoring ability as well ... Led the ACC in assists as a rookie in 2006-07 ... Perfect fit for Wake Forest's up-tempo offense.
