Wake's Last Road Trip Tuesday At UVA

Wake Forest, riding a six-game winning streak including three straight wins on the road, plays its final road game of the year Tuesday night at Virginia (7:00 p.m./ESPN2).

The Demon Deacons, 19-6 overall and 9-5 in the ACC, are coming off a 91-83 road win at Maryland on Saturday. Junior Vytas Danelius scored a career-high 23 points and sophomore Justin Gray added 22 points in the win over the Terrapins.

The Cavaliers, 15-10 and 5-9, should be well-rested. Virginia has not played since a 74-72 win over 12th-ranked North Carolina last Tuesday. Todd Billet hit a game-winning jumper for the Wahoos.

Wake Forest leads the all-time series, 61-56, including a 91-78 win in Winston-Salem on Jan. 31. Wake hasn't won in Charlottesville since 2000.

Noteworthy

■ Wake Forest needs a win Tuesday to clinch sole possession of third place in the final ACC standings and remain in contention for second place and a No. 2 seed in the ACC Tournament.

■ The Deacons are attempting to break a trend in the Wake-Virginia series. The two teams have split regular season meetings in each of the last six seasons. Neither team has swept the regular season series since Wake Forest did it in 1996-97.

■ Wake is looking for its first win at Virginia since the 1999-00 season.

■ A Wake Forest win would give the Deacons a 20-win season for the third straight year and for the ninth time in the last 12 seasons.

■ The Deacons are attempting to win four consecutive ACC road games for the first time since 1996-97.

More From The 91-83 Win At Maryland

Junior Vytas Danelius scored a career-high 23 points, junior Jamaal Levy grabbed a career-high 15 rebounds and freshman Chris Paul dished out a career-best 10 assists as Wake Forest won at Maryland, 91-83, Saturday afternoon. More from that game:

■ Wake sank a season-high 13 three-point field goals and shot 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from three-point range.

■ The Deacons enjoyed their largest rebound margin of the season (44-27).

■ Levy won in College Park and swept the regular season series with Maryland for the first time since 1998.

■ Danelius made a career-high four three-point field goals -- twice as many as he has made in any game in his career.

■ Levy's 15 rebounds were the most by a Deacon player since Josh Howard had 15 boards, also at Maryland, on Feb. 24, 2002.

■ Paul's 10 assists tied a Wake Forest freshman record for single-game assists.

Wake Forest's Scenarios

Heading into the final week of the regular season, Wake Forest could earn a seed as high as No. 2 or as low as No. 5 in the March 11-14 ACC Tournament. With one more win, Wake can be seeded no lower than third. Below are the unofficial scenarios (not confirmed by the ACC office):

Wake Forest will earn the No. 2 seed if...

Wake beats Virginia (Tue.) and NC State (Sat.); and NCSU loses to Maryland (Wed.) and Wake (Sat.);

OR

Wake beats Virginia (Tue.) and NC State (Sat.); and NCSU beats Maryland (Wed.) and loses to Wake; and UNC earns a higher seed than Georgia Tech and FSU

Not Much On Line Tuesday? Yeah, Right

Wake Forest won't win a second straight ACC regular season title and the Deacons are almost assured of an NCAA Tournament bid. So, Tuesday's game has little meaning, right? Hardly.

■ A Deacon victory Tuesday would keep them in the race for second place in the final ACC standings and a No. 2 seed in the ACC Tournament.

■ A Wake victory would give the Deacons a third consecutive 20-win season and its ninth 20-win season over the last 12 years.

■ Wake Forest is looking for its fourth straight ACC road win for the first time since 1996-97.

■ The Deacs are attempting to top the six-game winning streak Wake had to end last year's regular season.

■ Tuesday's game also has great meaning for Virginia, which could finish as high as tied for fourth in the ACC standings, or as low as eighth.

■ Tuesday night is Senior Night for the Cavaliers.

About The Six-Game Winning Streak

The most impressive thing about Wake Forest's six-game winning streak is the quality of opponents -- road wins at Maryland, No. 18 Georgia Tech and Clemson, and home victories over No. 3 Duke, No. 13 Cincinnati and Florida State.

The keys have been three-point shooting accuracy and rebounding. During the six-game winning streak Wake has shot a sizzling 47.1 percent from three-point range while making an average of 9.3 three-pointers per game. Wake has out-rebounded each of its last six opponents, including a +17 rebound margin at Maryland Feb. 28.

Wake loses at Virginia (Tue.) and to NCSU (Sat.); and Georgia Tech beats Duke (Wed.) and FSU (Sat.); and UNC loses one of its remaining two games; and Wake Forest wins a coin toss with Georgia Tech

Wake Forest will earn the No. 4 seed if...

Wake loses at Virginia (Tue.) and to NCSU (Sat.); and Georgia Tech beats Duke (Wed.) and FSU (Sat.); and UNC beats Clemson (Wed.) and Duke (Sat.); and Wake Forest wins a coin toss with Georgia Tech

OR

Wake loses at Virginia (Tue.) and to NCSU (Sat.); and UNC beats Clemson (Wed.) and Duke (Sat.); and Georgia Tech loses one of its remaining two games

Wake Forest will earn the No. 5 seed if...

Deacon-Cavalier Series History

■ Wake Forest leads the all-time series, 61-56. The Deacons won the first meeting of the season, 91-78, in Winston-Salem on Jan. 31.

■ The two teams have split the regular season series in each of the past six seasons. Neither team has swept the season series since Wake did it in 1996-97.

■ The Deacons have won 15 of the last 22 meetings.

■ Virginia holds a 28-9 series lead in University Hall and the Cavaliers haven't lost at home to Wake Forest since 2000.

■ The two teams have not met in the ACC Tournament since playing in back-to-back years in 1995 and 1996.

■ The Wake-UVa series traces back to 1910-11 when Virginia won the first meeting, 22-12.

■ Wake Forest is 2-0 this season against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia with a win over Richmond, and a win over Virginia.

■ Deacon coach Skip Prosser is 3-2 all-time against Virginia.

■ Cavalier coach Pete Gillen is 5-6 all-time against the Deacons.

Wake Forest-Virginia Connections

■ Wake Forest's coaching staff, especially Skip Prosser, has many ties with Virginia coach Pete Gillen. Prosser was Gillen's assistant coach at Xavier for eight seasons, from 1986 to 1993. After the 1993-94 season, Gillen left Xavier for Providence and Prosser replaced him as the head coach at Xavier.

■ Deacon assistant coach **Chris Mack** played for Gillen at Xavier, in 1992 and 1993, serving as a team captain for the Musketeers.

■ Virginia assistant coach Scott Shepherd previously worked at Hargrave Military Academy, where he worked with former Deacon All-American Josh Howard.

■ Deacon junior **Taron Downey** attended prep school in Virginia at Fork Union Military Academy.

■ Wake sophomore **Trent Strickland** also attended prep school in Virginia at Hargrave Military Academy.

■ Wake Forest sophomores **Justin Gray** and **Richard Joyce** both played their finals seasons of high school basketball in Virginia at Oak Hill Academy.

■ Prosser made his college head coaching debut in the commonwealth of Virginia when his Loyola (MD) team won at William & Mary on Nov. 29, 1993.

■ Wake Forest's fifth head coach was J.L. White, a 1917 Virginia graduate.

The Last Meeting: Wake 91, Virginia 78

Sophomore **Justin Gray** was nearly flawless on Jan. 31, scoring 26 points to lead No. 19 Wake Forest to a 91-78 victory over Virginia.

Gray made his first four shots of the game, including three 3-pointers, to spark the Deacons to an early lead that Virginia never challenged. Gray finished 7-of-10 from the field, went 5-for-8 on 3-pointers and was 7-of-8 from the line. He also led Wake Forest with six rebounds and four assists.

Elton Brown led Virginia with 24 points. The Cavaliers missed all 12 of their 3-point attempts.

Taron Downey, Gray and **Chris Paul** combined to score Wake's first 27 points. The Deacons started a perfect 6-for-6 from the field and Gray and Downey started a perfect 6-for-6 from 3-point range. It sparked Wake to an early 37-10 lead that Virginia couldn't overcome.

One Of The Nation's Toughest Schedules

Wake Forest has faced one of the nation's most difficult schedules this season:

■ The Wake schedule is ranked as the third-toughest by Sagarin and the seventh-most difficult by CollegeRPI.

■ Seven Wake Forest opponents are in the AP top 20 -- (5) Duke, (10) Texas, (12)

North Carolina, (14) NC State, (15) Cincinnati, (18) Georgia Tech and (19) Memphis.

■ Ten Wake opponents have an RPI of 47 or better.

■ Wake Forest has faced eight nationally-ranked opponents (going 4-4) so far this season. The Deacons played just six ranked teams all of last season.

■ Wake has defeated four ranked teams for the first time since 1996-97.

■ The Deacs have beaten two teams ranked in the top five -- No. 4 North Carolina and No. 3 Duke -- for the first time since 1994-95.

■ Wake has two road wins this season against ranked teams -- at then-No. 4 North Carolina on Dec. 20 and at No. 18 Georgia Tech Feb. 22 -- for the first time since 1996-97.

■ The Deacs beat three ranked teams -- No. 13 Cincinnati, No. 3 Duke and No. 18 Georgia Tech -- in consecutive games for the first time in school history.

Prosser: 65 Wins In Three Seasons At WFU

Wake Forest coach Skip Prosser has guided Wake Forest to 65 wins -- or an average of 21.7 victories per season -- in his three years with the Demon Deacons. His ACC coaching start is one of the best in league history:

■ Prosser's winning percentage in ACC league games (.674/31-15) is the highest percentage ever by a coach in his first three seasons in the conference. Vic Bubas (.667) and Bill Guthridge (.667) are tied for second.

■ His overall winning percentage at Wake Forest (.722/65-25) gives him the fifth-highest percentage in the 51-year history of the ACC. Only Dean Smith (.776), Mike Krzyzewski (.776), Bubas (.761) and Guthridge (.741) have/had higher percentages.

■ Prosser's career winning percentage (.691/230-103) is the 15th-highest among all active Division I coaches.

■ Wake Forest's 65 wins in three seasons ties for the fifth-most victories over a three-year period in school history.

■ The Deacons have won 31 ACC regular season games in three years under Prosser. Only Duke (36 wins) and Maryland (31) join Wake Forest as the teams to win more than 30 conference games over the last three seasons combined.

■ In Prosser's three years with the Deacons, Wake has scored 100-plus points six times. Before his arrival, the Deacons reached 100 points just five times in the previous 13 years.

■ Prosser was the unanimous selection for ACC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Deacons Up To 11th In The Polls

Wake Forest moved up four spots in the Associated Press and ESPN/ USA Today polls this week to 11th. More on Wake in the polls:

■ The Deacons, ranked as high as 4th this season, are at their highest position in the Associated Press poll since being ranked 10th on Jan. 19.

■ Four other ACC teams are in the AP poll -- (5) Duke, (12) North Carolina, (14) NC State and (18) Georgia Tech.

■ The Deacons have been ranked in the AP poll for 29 consecutive weeks dating back to last season. Duke is the only ACC team with a longer current streak.

■ Wake has been ranked in the AP poll 43 times in 50 weeks under Skip Prosser.

■ Wake is ranked 5th in the Sagarin Ratings, 7th at CollegeRPI.com, 12th at CBS Sportsline and 12th by Blue Ribbon Yearbook.

Magic Number: 82

Wake Forest is undefeated (14-0) when it scores at least 82 points -- or 2.4 points less than what the Deacons are averaging this season (84.4 ppg.). The Deacons are also undefeated (9-0) when they shoot 50 percent or better.

Hitting The Boards Like Last Year

One thing that has been consistent in Wake Forest's six-game winning streak is the Deacons' rebounding. Wake has out-rebounded each of its last six opponents.

The recent rebounding success has moved the Deacons up to first in the ACC in rebounding for ACC games only (+4.7). Last year the Deacons led the nation in rebounding (+9.4).

Good News And Bad News

The good news is that Wake Forest has shot the ball better recently and now leads the ACC in field goal percentage (ACC games only) at 46.9 percent (47.5 percent overall). The bad news is that Wake's ACC opponents are also shooting 46.9 percent, which ranks the Deacons last in the ACC in field goal percentage defense.

Deacons Reach, Chase Victory Milestones

Wake Forest earned all-time win No. 1,300 Feb. 22 at Georgia Tech. The Deacons' all-time record is currently 1,302-996.

Wake's win at Maryland Feb. 28 was its ninth ACC win of the season, securing a winning record in league play for the third straight year.

The win at Maryland also guaranteed that Wake Forest will finish at least tied for third in the final ACC standings for the third straight year and for the eighth time in the last 12 years.

Wake Forest now needs the following number of wins to reach other milestones:

One more victory would give Wake Forest its third straight 20-win season, its fourth 20-win season in five years and its 18th 20-win season all-time.

One more win would also give the Deacons double-digit ACC victories for the second straight year, for the sixth time in 12 years and for the 11th time in the 51-year history of the league.

Deacons 2-0 In Extra Minutes

Wake Forest improved to 2-0 this season in overtime games when it beat visiting Florida State, 90-87, Feb. 25. The Deacons beat North Carolina in triple-overtime back on Dec. 20, 119-114.

One of the oddities about the Florida State game is that it was Wake's first overtime game that didn't go to at least a second overtime since Jan. 31, 2001. It was also the first WFU-Florida State game that needed an extra period since Jan. 6, 1996.

Deacons Eye 14th Straight Postseason Appearance

Wake Forest is on track to make its 14th consecutive postseason appearance. Wake's current streak of 13 straight postseason appearances is the longest current streak among ACC schools.

Paul A Finalist For Wooden, Cousy Awards

Deacon freshman Chris Paul is a finalist for two of college basketball's most prestigious individual awards -- the John R. Wooden Award and the Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard Award.

He is one of 30 candidates for the Wooden Award and Wooden All-America Team, announced Jan. 26.

Paul is one of 16 finalists for the Cousy Award and he is the only freshman on the list of candidates. North Carolina's Raymond Felton is the other ACC player on the list of candidates.

Lineup Has Interesting Results

Six games ago -- on Feb. 12 at Clemson -- coach Skip Prosser used his fifth different starting lineup of the season -- one that included freshman center Kyle Visser and junior forward Vytas Danelius. The lineup change has done several things for the Deacons:

- With Danelius in the starting lineup, junior Jamaal Levy can play the No. 3 position.

- It has given the Deacons one of the best benches in the ACC. Junior Taron Downey and sophomore Eric Williams have 104 combined career starts. Sophomores Trent Strickland and Chris Ellis also have starting experience.

- The new starting lineup has produced a 6-0 record.

Wake One Of Nation's Youngest Teams

- With no scholarship seniors on the roster, Wake Forest is one of college basketball's youngest teams. In fact, the Deacons are one of just six Division I schools with no scholarship seniors on the roster.

- Walk-on Alan Williams is the only senior on the Deacon roster.

- Wake Forest has just three juniors on the roster to go with five sophomores and four freshmen.

- Wake's top three scorers are all freshmen or sophomores. In fact, freshmen and sophomores have combined to produce 68.8 percent of the Deacons' point total (1,452 of 2,109 points).

- A freshman or sophomore leads Wake in scoring, three-pointers, three-point attempts, three-point percentage, free throws, free throw attempts, assists and steals.

■ Attempting to be the first freshman to lead the ACC in steals since NC State's Chris Corchiani in 1988.

■ Attempting to become the first Deacon player, regardless of class, to lead the ACC in steals since Bogues did it three straight years from 1985-87.

■ He is four assists away from breaking the Wake Forest freshman record of 147 held by Derrick McQueen.

■ His free throw percentage (.832) is the highest ever by a Deacon freshman, ranks second overall in the ACC and he goes to the line more than any Deacon.

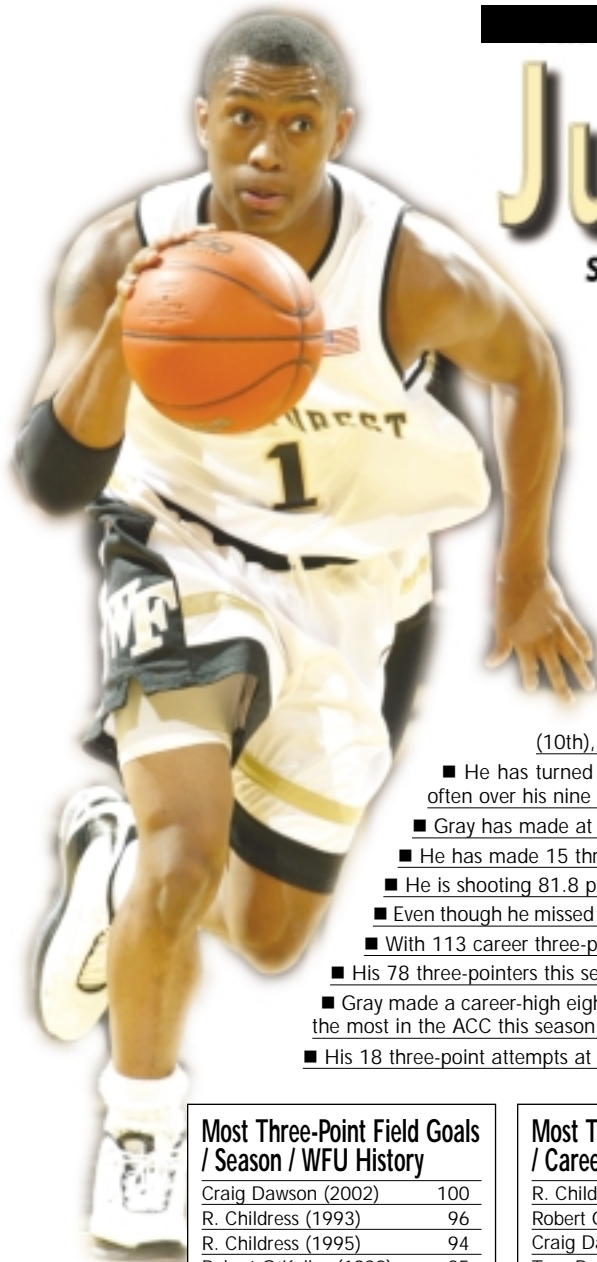

On a very balanced team, sophomore guard **Justin Gray** has emerged as one of the top players in the ACC -- a prime candidate for first team All-ACC honors.

■ Since Jan. 29, Gray has been arguably the ACC's hottest player, averaging 22.1 points, 3.6 rebounds, 3.7 three-point field goals and 2.7 assists per game.

■ He was named ACC Player of the Week on Feb. 23.

■ Gray seems to play his best in big games. Against nationally-ranked teams, Gray averages 18.9 points, 3.1 assists and 3.8 three-point field goals per game.

■ He averages more points on the road (20.1) than overall (17.0).

■ He ranks third in the ACC in scoring (17.0) and second in ACC games only (19.1).

■ With 78 three-point field goals in 25 games this season, Gray ranks second in the ACC for three-pointers per game (3.12). In ACC games only, he is tied for first.

■ Gray ranks in the ACC's top 12 in seven different statistical categories -- three-point field goals (2nd), free throw percentage (3rd), scoring (3rd), assist-turnover ratio (10th), assists (10th), field goal percentage (11th) and three-point field goal percentage (12th).

■ He has turned his game up a notch by being more aggressive on offense. He has gone to the line more often over his nine eight games (56) than he did in his first 16 games (43).

■ Gray has made at least one three-point field goal in 36 out of his last 37 games.

■ He has made 15 three-point field goals over the last three games.

■ He is shooting 81.8 percent from the free throw line, which ranks third in the ACC.

■ Even though he missed eight games last season because of a broken jaw, he has already amassed 717 career points.

■ With 113 career three-point field goals, he already ranks 10th in Wake Forest history.

■ His 78 three-pointers this season are the fifth-most single-season three-pointers in Wake history.

■ Gray made a career-high eight three-point field goals Jan. 13 at Texas en route to 27 points. His eight three-pointers were the most in the ACC this season and tie for the 11th-most in ACC history.

■ His 18 three-point attempts at Texas broke a Wake Forest single-game record and tie for the third-most in ACC history.

Jamaal LEVY

Junior / F / 6-9 / Panama City, Panama

At 6-9 and just 180 pounds, Jamaal Levy is a good example of one of Skip Prosser's favorite sayings: "It's not how big you are, it's how big you play." Levy uses his thin frame and quickness to his advantage as one of the ACC's best rebounders:

■ Levy ranks third in the ACC in rebounding (8.6 rpg.), and in ACC games only he is averaging 9.2 rebounds per game, which ranks third.

■ In ACC games only, he is tied for the league lead in offensive rebounds per game.

■ Levy is coming off a 14-point, 15-rebound performance Feb. 28 at Maryland. His 15 rebounds were the most by a Deacon player this season.

■ He has pulled down double-figure rebounds in eight games this season including each of the last three games.

■ Levy's production is not limited to rebounding and defense. He scored a career-high 19 points against North Carolina Feb. 7 and he has scored in double figures 13 times this season.

■ At 6-9, he has the ability to shoot from the perimeter. Levy has six three-point field goals this season and 20 for his three-year career.

■ He had three double-doubles in February and has five overall this season.

■ Levy is shooting a team-best 56.6 percent from the field, which would easily lead the ACC if he had enough field goals made to qualify.

■ He leads the team and ranks 11th in the ACC in blocked shots.

■ With 62 career blocked shots, he already ranks 12th in Wake Forest blocked shots history.

Junior guard Taron Downey, has proven to be productive as a starter (54 career starts) or as Wake's sixth man.

■ Downey is playing his best basketball of the season. Over his last three games -- wins against Georgia Tech, Florida State and Maryland -- Downey has averaged 16.7 points and 3.0 assists per game while making 9-of-16 three-point field goal attempts.

■ Downey has made a three-point field goal in 15 straight games.

■ Downey's career free throw percentage (.839) is the fourth-highest in Wake Forest history. His free throw percentage this season (.841) would be one of the highest percentages in Wake history.

■ His three-point percentage in ACC games (44.1) ranks third in the league.

■ He has 120 career three-point field goals, which ranks as the seventh-most in Wake Forest history.

■ With 268 career assists, Downey ranks 11th in Wake history.

■ With 734 career points, he is on track to become the 42nd Deacon to score 1,000 career points.

■ Downey leads the team with 90 career games played.

Skip Prosser, one of college basketball's winningest active coaches, is in his third season as the head coach at Wake Forest. Prosser's overall record of 230-103 (.691) gives him one of the highest winning percentages among all active Division I coaches. In three seasons at Wake Forest, he has compiled a record of 65-25.

In Prosser's first season at Wake Forest in 2001-02, he led the Deacons to a 21-13 record, a third-place finish in the highly-competitive Atlantic Coast Conference and an NCAA Tournament appearance. But the 2001-02 season was just a stepping stone. In 2002-03, Prosser guided Wake Forest to its highest level since the Tim Duncan era.

Wake Forest finished last season with a 25-6 overall record and a final No. 8 ranking in the Associated Press poll -- Wake's highest finish in the poll since 1995. The Deacons finished 13-3 and in first place in the ACC standings for the first time since 1995. It was WFU's first outright ACC regular season title in 41 years.

Prosser's Deacons were not ranked in any of the preseason polls and were picked to finish as low as seventh in the ACC, but Prosser molded a rotation of seven freshmen and sophomores with All-American senior Josh Howard into one of college basketball's top teams in 2002-03.

Wake Forest led the nation in rebounding (+9.6 rebound margin), becoming the first ACC team to ever accomplish that feat. The Deacons were also ranked among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, free throw percentage, scoring margin and winning percentage. With an NCAA at-large bid, Wake Forest advanced to postseason competition for an ACC-leading 13th consecutive year.

For his efforts, Prosser was named the ACC Coach of the Year. He was also named district coach of the year by the NABC and the USBWA, and he was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year.

The energetic Prosser has also helped make Wake Forest's home court, Lawrence Joel Coliseum, into a difficult venue for the opponent. He was responsible for moving the student section closer to the court and developed a close relationship with the student cheering section, The Screamin' Demons. It

became a ritual for Deacon players to don the Screamin' Demons' tie-dyed shirts for warm-ups and Prosser himself wore one of the black and gold shirts for Midnight Madness.

Prosser and his young staff also worked with the marketing office to make home games an "event" as much as a game. With loud music and an array of pre-game antics (such as the Deacon mascot on a Harley-Davidson), Lawrence Joel Coliseum is certainly a home court advantage.

The Deacons responded by going 16-0 at home last season -- their best record ever in the building -- and stretched their home court winning streak to 17 games. In Prosser's two seasons at Wake, the Deacs are a combined 29-3 at home.

From Day One, Prosser has made academics a priority with his players. Mandatory study halls are the norm, class attendance is checked, and Prosser even named academic counselor Jane Caldwell the team's "MVP" in 2002. In his two seasons at Wake, all seven senior basketball players have earned their diplomas.

Prosser's 10 years as a head coach have been a model of consistency. His teams have won at least 21 games in each of the last seven seasons. His teams have advanced to the NCAA Tournament seven times and to the NIT twice.

Prosser has won regular season titles in three different leagues (ACC, Atlantic 10, MCC), postseason conference tournament crowns in two leagues (Atlantic 10, MAAC). He has been named conference Coach of the Year in two different leagues and he is one of just 14 active Division I coaches to lead three different teams into the NCAA Tournament. Prosser, in fact, is the only coach in NCAA history to lead three different schools to the NCAA Tournament in his first year at each school.

In two years of ACC competition, Prosser has compiled a record of 22-10. Only North Carolina's Bill Guthridge won more league games in his first two seasons as an ACC coach.

George Edward "Skip" Prosser, who was born on Nov. 3, 1950 in Pittsburgh (Pa.), is married to the former Nancy Franklin. He has two sons, Scott (26) and Mark (25). Mark played basketball at Marist College, coached at Wofford last season and will coach at Bucknell in 2003-04.
