(AP) - Jeff Jennings scored from five yards out with 1:48 to play to help Vanderbilt beat Wake Forest 24-20 and win a season opener for the first time in eight years.

Jay Cutler threw for 276 yards and a score while running for 89 more. Jennings ran for just 43 yards, but finished with two scores - the last helping Vanderbilt shake off a blown 11-point, third-quarter lead.

Herdley Harrison added a 18-yard sack on the Deacons' final drive after Wake had pushed to the Commodores' 30 with less than a minute to play.

Micah Andrews ran for a career-best 254 yards on 34 carries for the Demon Deacons, who appeared ready to shake their late-game troubles from last year and stay unbeaten in home openers under fifth-year coach Jim Grobe.

Both teams had trouble finishing close games last year, combining to lose 11 games by seven or fewer points. But this time, Vanderbilt - which appeared headed for another late disappointment when Benjamin Mauk scored on a 1-yard keeper for a 20-17 lead with 10 minutes left - managed to come out ahead.

Trailing by three, the Commodores put together a four-play, 49-yard drive, starting with a 28-yard pass from Cutler to Earl Bennett. Then, after Cutler connected with George Smith for a 7-yard gain, Jennings carried twice for the final 14 yards and a 24-20 lead.

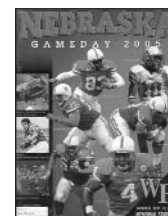

(AP) - Chris Barclay ran for 210 yards and tied a school record with four rushing touchdowns to lead Wake Forest past East Carolina 44-34.

Micah Andrews added 142 yards rushing for the Demon Deacons (1-2), who got a much-needed win and beat their in-state rival for the fifth straight season.

Barclay and Andrews led the team's 407-yard rushing total, the school's best rushing day since tallying 528 yards against Tulsa in 1971.

Wake Forest took a 31-6 late in the first half and held a 21-point lead mid-way through the third quarter before the Pirates fought back. (AP) - Cory Randolph threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Marion with 33 seconds left and Wake Forest rallied to hand Clemson another loss, 31-27.

The comeback wasn't sealed until the final play, when Clemson's Curt Baham was stopped at the 3-yard line after a 27-yard gain just as time expired. by Patrick Ghee

They drove 66 yards in slightly less than 2 minutes for the winning score after Clemson coach Tommy Bowden called for a fake field goal instead of letting Jad Dean attempt a 44-yarder that would have put the Tigers up by six. The poorly executed play was stopped easily, and Wake Forest took over on its 34.

Randolph was 5-for-6 on the final drive and finished 20-for-25 for 222 yards. He threw for a total of three TDs.

Charlie Whitehurst bounced back from a rough start to go 28-for-42 for 304 yards for the Tigers, and James Davis ran for his first two touchdowns of the season. They rallied from a 21-7 deficit to take a 27-21 lead on Dean's 47-yard field goal late in the third quarter. Those were their final points.

Wake Forest got within three points on Sam Swank's kick from 33 yards out, but Clemson's Nick Watkins appeared to seal it by intercepting a pass from Randolph with about 3 minutes left.

(AP) - Drew Weatherford threw for 351 yards and three touchdowns as fourth-ranked Florida State blew open a close game with three quick scores in the final quarter to defeat Wake Forest 41-24.

Wake Forest (2-4, 1-2) closed to 20-17 on the final play of the third quarter on a 31-yard touchdown run by Chris Barclay, who finished with 125 yards against a rush defense that was ranked sixth nationally.

"We had them on the ropes," said Wake Forest tailback Chris Barclay, whose 31-yard touchdown run pulled his team to 20-17 late in the third quarter. "We had a good chance of upsetting these guys."

"I was concerned it was slipping away from us," Florida State coach Bobby Bowden said. "I was very concerned."

But the Seminoles scored three touchdowns in the next nine minutes to take a 41-17 lead. Faced with a third-and-15 at his own 21, Weatherford escaped a heavy rush and threw the ball long for the 6-foot-6 Carr, who caught it near midfield and ran to the Wake Forest 16 for a 63-yard gain.

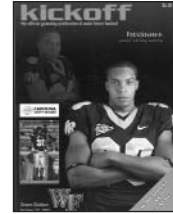

(AP) - Chris Barclay ran for 68 of his 204 yards on his first carry, broke the Wake Forest career rushing record and helped the Demon Deacons beat Duke 44-6 for their first winning streak of the season.

In the third quarter, Barclay took a handoff and gained 19 yards to move in front of James McDougald, who totaled 3,811 yards on the ground from 1976-79. Barclay completed that drive with a 9-yard touchdown and later ran 71 yards for another to make him the top scorer at Wake Forest.

His record-breaking run came on Wake Forest's second drive of the second half, and he was done for the day after his long touchdown run that made it 34-6. Sam Swank added three field goals for the Deacons.

(AP) - Kyle Wright tied a school record with five touchdown passes, ran for two more scores and No. 3 Miami stayed on track for a spot in the first Atlantic Coast Conference championship game by beating Wake Forest 47-17 Saturday.

A week after a surprisingly easy victory at Virginia Tech, the Hurricanes used a quick-strike offense to avoid a letdown in their first visit to Groves Stadium since 1971.

The Demon Deacons completed their third straight losing season with an inspired effort, taking a 17-14 lead late in the second quarter on a 7-yard run by Chris Barclay.

The Deacons again won't have a postseason, but there were a couple of highlights in the lopsided loss. Despite two fumbles, Barclay became only the third player in conference history to rush for 4,000 yards and 40 touchdowns in a career. He had 105 yards against the top-ranked defense in the country and will lead the ACC in rushing for the third straight season.

And punter Ryan Plackemeier cemented his spot as the NCAA's all-time leader by averaging 46 yards on five kicks, including a 62-yarder in the third quarter. That was his 13th of the season of at least 60 yards
