Video Coordinator

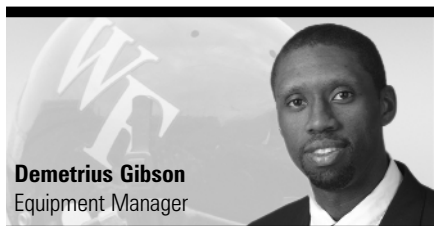
Allen Franklin begins his third year as a member of the Wake Forest football program, his second season as video coordinator.

Ethan Reeve
Strength & Conditioning Coordinator

Ethan Reeve is in his fourth season at Wake Forest, coming from Ohio University in February 2001 to guide the Demon Deacon strength and conditioning program.

Reeve, who spent six seasons with the Bobcat program, was a two-time All-America and four-time SEC champion wrestler at the University of Tennessee. He began his coaching career at his alma mater, serving as assistant coach/strength coach for wrestling for two seasons. He also assisted with the wrestling programs at Oklahoma State, Ohio and Clemson before serving as the head wrestling coach at Chattanooga from 1984 to 1990.

Reeve is certified through three organizations: USA Weightlifting, Russian Kettlebell Challenge and



the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association. He was the strength coach for the U.S. women's rowing team that won four gold medals and one silver medal in the 1995 world championships. He then returned to Ohio in 1995 to work with the football program. He also designed and oversaw the opening of the Carn Center, Ohio's athletic strength and conditioning facility, in 1999.



Don Steelman
Assistant Athletic Trainer

Don Steelman, now in his seventh season at Wake Forest, is one of the most important members of the football staff in his role as the assistant athletic trainer in charge of football. Steelman works on a personal basis with the Demon Deacon players in the daily prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of injuries throughout the entire year. Steelman also serves as the treasurer and Director of the Atlantic Coast Conference Sports Medicine Annual Symposium.

For nine years prior to coming to Wake Forest, Steelman served as an assistant athletic trainer at the University of North Carolina, where he was the assistant trainer for the football program. He received both his undergraduate and master's degrees from UNC, and began his career in sports medicine as a student trainer with the Tar Heel football team.
