Moving On

Following Sunday's historic 1-1 (5-4 PKs) decision over No. 3 seed North Carolina, UCF has advanced to the NCAA Championship Elite Eight for the first time since 1987. The Knights will meet No. 1 seed Wake Forest (17-3-4) in Winston-Salem, N.C. The last time that the Knights made it to the Elite Eight, they advanced all the way to the national semifinals. Since 1987, UCF has made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship. Head coach Amanda Cromwell's squad is making its fifth-straight postseason appearance.

Series History

Entering the 2011 season, both UCF and Wake Forest had never met on the pitch, but Friday night's meeting will mark the second time this season the two teams will go head-to-head. In the second match of the year for both squads, the Demon Deacons broke a 0-0 stalemate in the 60th minute en route to a 1-0 victory in Orlando. UCF senior goalkeeper Aline Reis totaled five saves including two highlight-reel stops against Wake Forest, while Tishia Jewell led all players with six shots, placing three on goal.

No Seed? No Problem

Of the eight teams left vying for a national championship, only UCF and Long Beach State are unseeded. Both teams finished the regular season outside of the NSCAA coaches poll, with the 49ers ranking No. 21 in the Top Drawer Soccer standings and the Knights at No. 23.

Topping the Tar Heels

It was a historic outcome against North Carolina on many levels last Sunday for UCF. The two teams were a pair of the original squads to feature a varsity women's soccer program. They met in the AIAW Championship match in 1981 as well as in the 1982 NCAA Championship match. Up until last Sunday, UCF had never advanced past the Tar Heels in tournament play. UCF jumped on the board first with a 18-yard rocket off the foot of Kristina Trujic, her second goal in three days. UNC tied it up with five minutes left in regulation and proceeded to go scoreless through two overtime periods. Reis' clutch stops on the second and sixth penalty kicks proved to be the deciding factor for UCF. On the weekend, the Knights topped two teams that combined for 22 NCAA National Championships (Florida and UNC).

Follow the Leader

The Knights are led by Tishia Jewell, who was named to the All-Conference USA First Team earlier in the month. The junior forward totaled an assist in the win over FIU in round one, and added an assist in the victory over Florida. She has seven goals on the season to go with a team-high 10 assists. Jewell is seeking her master's degree in non-profit management, and has garnered C-USA All-Academic Team and CoSIDA Academic All-District honors this fall.

Getting Defensive

UCF senior goalkeeper Aline Reis has recorded another outstanding campaign for the Knights. She has started all 23 contests and has played all but 16 minutes this year. Reis, who was named to the All-C-USA Second Team, ranks 40th in the country with a 0.82 goals against average. She has played in the NCAA Championship each year during her career. In UCF's 2-0 victory over FIU in the opening round, Reis picked up her first career assist when she found Tishia Jewell on a breakaway in the first half.

More Honors

In addition to Tishia Jewell and Aline Reis, three other Knights picked up honors from Conference USA earlier this month. Marissa Diggs was named to the All-C-USA First Team, Stacie Hubbard was selected to the second team and Carleigh Williams garnered all-freshman recognition.
