## ARIZONA ST. SUN DEVILS (17-4, 6-2) AT UW HUSKIES (12-9, 4-4)

Huskies will have to take down hot ASU if they want to snap a four-game losing skid.

### A TALE OF TWO CONFERENCE SEASONS

For the first time during conference play, Washington (12-9, 4-4 Pac-12) will have just one day off between games. The Huskies welcome in Arizona State (17-4, 6-2 Pac-12) to Alaska Airlines Arena on Saturday at 6:00 p.m. The Sun Devils are having their best season since 1980-81 when they were 19-2 through 21 games, while the Huskies have their most losses at this point of the season since starting 11-9 during the 2008 campaign. Recent history is on the Huskies side as they have won five straight over ASU and 18 of the last 21 games.

Saturday's game will be carried on ESPNU with **Dave Flemming** and **Sean Farnham** on the call. Locally, the game will be broadcast over the radio by **IMG College Sports Network** and **KJR Sportsradio 950 AM** and **102.9 FM** with **Bob Rondeau** and **Jason Hamilton** calling the action (Satellite radio Sirius 123, OSU broadcast). In addition, **Gregg Bell** will chat live from courtside on **GoHuskies.com**.

### DAWG BITES - TEAM

• For the first time in Washington's history they have lost four-straight league games after winning the previous four contests. They have done the streak in reverse before, winning five-straight Pac-10 games in 2004 after starting with five-straight losses. That also marks their last 5-game losing streak, which UW will try to avoid replicating on Saturday.

• The 57 points UW allowed Arizona on Thursday were the fewest points allowed in a loss since No. 4 Washington State beat the Huskies 56-52 on Jan. 5, 2008.

• The Huskies are trying to avoid being swept at home by Arizona and Arizona State for the first time since Lorenzo Romar's inaugural season at UW in 2003.

• The Huskies are giving up 66.1 ppg which ranks 9th overall among league teams but would be UW's best mark since the 2000 team allowed 65.1 ppg. The previous low watermark in Romar's tenure is 69.5 in 2009.

• UW is definitely getting more and more defensive in league play. They are allowing a Pac-12 best 63.8 ppg in conference action after ranking 10th in non-conference play giving up 67.6 ppg. UW also ranks tops in conference play in 3-point FG pct defense (.222). They were 11th during non-conference action.

# 2012-13 UW MEN'S BASKETBALL - HUSKY NOTES

## DAWG BITES - INDIVIDUALS

- **C.J. Wilcox** has scored 20 or more points in 9 of 11 home games total. He is averaging a team-best 20.3 ppg in Alaska Airlines Arena. In 9 games away from home, Wilcox is averaging 16.3 ppg and scored 20+ just twice.
- **Wilcox** ranks 28th all-time in UW history with 1,114 points. Up next on the list is **Donald Watts** (1,158).
- **Wilcox** is third all-time in UW history with 191 3-point makes. Next up on the list is **Deon Luton**, who made 212. **Scott Suggs** jumped up to 9th all-time on UW's top-10 career 3-point list. He is currently tied with **Eldridge Recasner** at 119. Next up on the list is **Nate Robinson** (127).
- **Abdul Gaddy** is sixth all-time in UW history for career assists (388). Up next, **Venoy Overton** with 390, followed by **Justin Dentmon** with 401.
- **Aziz N'Diaye** is 3rd all-time in UW history with a .567 career field goal percentage. He shoots a league best 63.6% in Pac-12 action and 62.1%, overall which represents the 6th best shooting season all-time in UW history. **Todd MacCulloch** holds the top four spots on the list of best single-season FG percentages (.676, 1997; .675, 1996; .662, 1999; .650, 1998).
- **N'Diaye** is tied for the Pac-12 lead with eight double-doubles (also, Carrick Felix of ASU, Eric Moreland of OSU and Andre Roberson of Colo).
- **N'Diaye** became the fourth Husky with 100 career blocks after swatting away three shots on Thursday.
- Among active Pac-12 players, **Wilcox** leads everyone with 191 career 3-point field goals (2nd, Allen Crabbe, Cal, 182), while **Abdul Gaddy** leads in assists with 388 (2nd, Joe Burton, OSU, 274).
- In wins, **Desmond Simmons** is grabbing 8.8 rebounds per game, while in losses he is only at 5.8 rpg.

## WASHINGTON VS. ARIZONA STATE

Washington owns a 38-36 series lead over ASU since the schools first played in the 1977-78 season. The Huskies are 21-14 all-time in Seattle vs. ASU, 14-21 in Tempe and 3-1 on a neutral floor. The bulk of the Sun Devils' victories have come in two streaks - six-straight from 1979-81 and 14-straight from 1990-96. The Huskies are on an impressive run against Arizona State, having won 18 of the last 21 meetings against the Sun Devils, including the last five. The Huskies won 11 straight in 2004 through 2008. Husky coach Lorenzo Romar is 18-5 all-time against ASU as the Husky head man. UW has won eight of the last nine in Seattle. Arizona State head coach Herb Sendek is 3-9 vs. the Huskies. The last time the Huskies and Sun Devils met was at Alaska Airlines Arena on Feb. 16, 2011 when the Huskies won 77-69.

## LAST TIME VS. ARIZONA STATE

AP (2/16/12) -Terrence Ross led four Washington players in double figures with 18 points, and the Huskies stayed tied for first place in the Pac-12 with a 77-69 victory over Arizona State. Washington used a late run in the first half to take an 18-point lead at the break, and then coasted to its seventh win in the last eight games. Carrick Felix led Arizona State with 13 points, but the Sun Devils lost for the fourth time in their last five. Washington remained tied with California for the Pac-12 lead heading to Washington's final home game of the season.

# 2012-13 UW Men's BASKETBALL - COACH LORENZO ROMAR

## COACH LORENZO ROMAR (1 1TH YR. AT WASHINGTON, 1 7TH YR. OVERALL)

Now in his 11th season, **Lorenzo Romar** is coming off a year in which he won the 2012 Pac-12 Coach of the Year after guiding UW to a 14-4 conference record and Pac-12 regular season championship. It was the third time that Romar, the 18th head men's basketball coach at Washington, has earned Coach of the Year (also 2009 & 2005). Romar is the dean of coaching in the Pac-12 having spent more seasons at UW than any other current coach at their school. Romar owns a **231-122 (.654) record at Washington** and is **324-210 (.607) in 17 seasons** overall. Romar reached several milestones during the year including his 200th win as UW's coach, 300th overall coaching victory & 100th Pac-12 conference win. The first African-American head basketball coach at UW, Romar is **third all-time in victories at UW** and reached 200 wins second fastest. Washington has won its first two outright conference titles (2012 & 2009) since 1953 under the direction of Romar. He has led UW to six NCAA tournament Appearances -- all in spurts of three-consecutive seasons (2004-05-06 & 2009-10-11) -- and the school's first back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances (2005 & 06). Overall, he has led Washington to three Sweet 16 appearances. In 2012 he led UW to the semifinals of the NIT, a first in UW history. He was the 2005 Pac-10 and Black Coaches Association Coach of the Year. Romar played point guard for Marv Harshman's 1979 and 1980 teams and spent five years in the NBA after college. Prior to UW, Romar served as the head coach at Saint Louis (1999-02) and Pepperdine (1996-99) and was an assistant coach at UCLA (1992-96) - He helped lead the Bruins to the 1995 national title. A native of Compton, Calif., he graduated from Pius X High School. Romar and his wife, Leona, have three daughters: Terra, Tavia and Taylor.



## UNPRECEDENTED SUCCESS UNDER ROMAR

The Huskies are enjoying their greatest stretch of success in team history under the direction of Lorenzo Romar. Besides three Sweet 16 appearances, three Pac-10 tournament championships, two regular-season conference titles & a trip to the NIT semifinals, the numbers show Romar has entered uncharted territory. From 2004-2005 to 2011-12 the Huskies won 190 games, the most ever in an eight-year span of UW basketball history. He has avg 21.9 wins per season during his 10-year UW career and has amassed four of the seven largest single-season win totals in UW history. Romar earned his sixth 20-win season in 2012, including a school record four-consecutive seasons, and only trails Hec Edmundson's 11 seasons with 20+ wins.

## LAST TIME OUT: AZ 57, UW 53 (1/31)

AP - Nick Johnson had 15 points, five in the final 2 minutes, and No. 8 Arizona rallied from an early deficit for an ugly 57-53 victory over Washington on Thursday night, snapping a three-game losing streak to the Huskies. Mark Lyons and Solomon Hill both added 10 points for the Wildcats, who won their second straight after losing at home to UCLA. Johnson held Washington's leading scorer C.J. Wilcox to 11 points. Arizona trailed 48-46 with 4:34 left after Wilcox hit Washington's first 3-pointer of the game. The Wildcats then closed on an 11-5 run -- that featured big shots from Johnson and Hill -- and got plenty of help from the carelessness Huskies. Scott Suggs also scored 11 points, which has lost four straight for the first time since 2008. Wilcox sat for a large chunk of the second half after picking up his fourth foul, but was hounded all game by Johnson and finished nine points below his average in conference play.

## ODD BUT TRUE TIDBITS

- The Huskies game vs. No. 8 Arizona was its first against a ranked opponent since 12/22/09 vs. #23 Texas A&M.
- The Dawgs came into the Utah game allowing Pac-12 opponents to shoot .374 from the field. The Utes shot 60.4%, the highest FG% vs. the Huskies since Arizona shot 65.3% on Jan. 4, 2007.
- The Huskies started Conference play 4-0 for the 2nd time in **Lorenzo Romar's** 11 seasons - also 2011 - and just the 4th times in the last 35 years.
- The Huskies went down to the Bay Area and earned their first road sweep of Cal and Stanford since 1985. That year they went on to win a share of the Pac-10 championship.
- Since Washington's first season in 1896, this year marked the sixth time that UW opened conference play with three road games (1911, 1912, 1943, 1993 and 1999) and the first times since 1912 they only won all three.

## POINT-LESS STAT

The Huskies are averaging 68.6 points per game this year, the lowest total during Lorenzo Romar's 11 seasons at Washington. The Huskies have led the Pac-12 in scoring in five of the last eight seasons, but are 8th in the Conference this season. The last time UW averaged less than 70 points per season was 2001 when they scored 67.6 points per game. The previous low during Romar's tenure was 73.2 ppg in 2008. Conversely, they are allowing 66.1 ppg, the Huskies lowest average allowed since 65.1 in 1990.

## INJURY REPORT

UW is full strength with all 10 scholarship players finally healthy, but for the first 10 games at least one player was out of each game. **Shawn Kemp** missed the first 7 games due to a knee injury (losses to Albany, Ohio State and Colorado State during that span). **Scott Suggs** played only 2 minutes vs. Albany after suffering a concussion, leaving the Huskies short-handed and missed 3 games with a sprained right foot (loss to Colorado St). **Andrew Andrews** missed 3 games with a sprained ankle (loss vs. Nevada).

**UW LEADS DIVISION I WITH MOST ALL-TIME WINS AT THEIR HOME ARENA**

Washington has **928 wins inside of Hec Edmundson Pavilion**, the most by any Division I team at its current home arena. The Huskies started playing in their arena on Dec. 27, 1927 and have amassed 100 more victories than No. 2 on the list, Pennsylvania.

**FRIENDLY CONFINES OF HOME**

Losing at Alaska Airlines Arena in Hec Edmundson Pavilion is rare under coach Lorenzo Romar's watch. **In 11 years with Romar at the helm, UW is 154-33 (.824) overall at home**, 82-9 (.901) in non-conference games. UW was 18-2 at home in 2012, the 5th time under Romar that they have reached at least 17 wins at home. The Huskies have won 15+ at home 18 times overall, but only two other times in the last 60 years outside the Romar era. The Huskies won a school record 32 straight non-conference games at Alaska Airlines Arena, dating back to a 72-71 home loss on March 14, 2008 in the College Basketball Invitational to Valparaiso, before South Dakota State beat them on Dec. 18, 2011.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS**

**C.J. Wilcox** was named Pac-12 Player of the Week on for the week of Jan. 7-13 after averaging 23.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.5 blocks in the Huskies first Bay Area sweep since 1984. Wilcox shot 53.1% from the field, including 50% from 3-point range. He scored 27 points and grabbed a career high 9 rebounds vs. Stanford on the way to winning his 2nd career weekly honor. It was the Huskies 46th player of the week selection all-time and 27th in Lorenzo Romar's 11 seasons.

**THREE-POINT PROWESS**

The Huskies have a pair of long-range bombers that are assaulting the Huskies' record books. **C.J. Wilcox** is steadily climbing the UW three-point charts and is up to third all-time in UW history with 191. Next up is Deon Luton with 212. **Scott Suggs** is on the all-time list too and has 119 to tie Eldridge Recasner for 9th. When it comes to accuracy, Wilcox is tied for 7th in UW history making 40.5% of his career attempts. Suggs is tied for 8th all-time in UW history at 39.8%.

**REVERSE TREND IN REBOUNDING**

Washington has finished first in the conference in rebounding four-straight years, six of the last eight and has finished first or second in each of the last eight seasons. If they are going to continue that trend, the Huskies are going to have to hit the glass in monumental proportions. So far this season, they are 10th in the Pac-12 in rebounding with 36.0 per game, which currently represents their lowest average since 2004. The biggest culprit in the reverse trend is that UW is last in the league with 23.1 defensive rebounds per game and they are only grabbing 66.3% of the rebounds when the other team is on offense.

**WILCOX DIVERSIFYING HIS GAME**

Everyone knows **C.J. Wilcox** can shoot from the outside. Entering the season, statistically speaking, it was easy to tell he preferred to fire away from outside the 3-point line. Entering the year, 56% of his field goal makes came from behind the 3-point arc, while 61% of his FG attempts were 3-pointers. He has diversified

his game this year, according to the stats. So far in his junior season, of Wilcox's field goal makes, just 38.2% have come from beyond 3-point range and 42.5% of his attempts are 3-pointers. Despite moving closer to the rim, his scoring average has gone up and so has his field goal percentage. He is 45.7% this year after entering the season as a 43% career shooter.

**SEFERIAN-JENKINS STICKS TO FOOTBALL**

**Austin Seferian-Jenkins** has decided to not play basketball this season, it was announced on Jan. 2. The record-setting tight end for the Husky football team played in 17 games last season as a freshman for the UW basketball team. He averaged 1.1 points and 2.1 rebounds in 7.2 minutes per game. The Huskies were 13-4 with ASJ on the squad. Through two seasons on the football field he owns Washington's career tight-end marks with 110 catches, 1,388 yards receiving, and 13 touchdown catches

**HUSKIES SIGN TWO TO LOI'S**

Lorenzo Romar reeled in two of the nation's top guard recruits during the NCAA early signing period. **Darin Johnson** of Sacramento's Sheldon HS and **Nigel Williams-Goss** of Findlay Prep in Henderson, Nev. both officially declared their intentions of joining Washington for the 2013-14 season by sending in their National Letters of Intent. Johnson is a 6-foot-4 guard that averaged 16.8 ppg and 2.5 assists as a junior at Franklin HS in Elk Grove, Calif. He is the No. 86 player overall by Scout.com; 18th among shooting guards and No. 126 according to Rivals.com. Williams-Goss, originally from Happy Valley, Ore., helped Findlay Prep to the 2012 high school national championship. The 6-foot-4 point guard is the 50th-ranked overall prospect in ESPN's top 100, No. 61 on Rivals.com's list and No. 97 according to Scout.com (23rd ranked point guard). As a junior, Williams-Goss averaged 14.3 ppg, 4.3 apg and 4.0 rpg plus shot 60% from the field.

## WHO ARE THESE GUYS?

**THREE-HEADED MONSTER:** The Huskies' backcourt is one of the strengths of the squad. The Huskies have talent, size and experience at the position thanks in large part to the trio of senior captains **Abdul Gaddy** and **Scott Suggs** and junior **C.J. Wilcox**. Gaddy is the Pac-12's leading active player in assists, Wilcox was honorable mention All-Pac-12 and ranks third in UW history in 3-point makes, and Suggs, a 41% career 3-point shooter, returns from a broken foot that cost him all of last season.

**CENTER OF DEFENSE:** Returning to man the middle for the Huskies is 7-foot senior **Aziz N'Diaye**. The Dakar, Senegal native was a member of the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team as a junior and is up to 5th all-time on the UW list for career blocks. The career 57% shooter scored was the team's top rebounder grabbing 7.3 per game. N'Diaye, the third player to stand 7-feet or taller in the Romar era, is especially rejuvenated this season after spending part of the summer in his native Senegal with his teammates and family.

**THE REDSHIRTS:** **Jernard Jarreau** and **Andrew Andrews** finally make their debuts after sitting out 2011-12 as redshirts. Both will be counted on to contribute right away after spending a year learning Romar's system, putting on weight (Jarreau has gained 25 pounds since stepping on campus) and developing their games. Andrews will be counted on for big minutes off the bench to spell the guards, while Jarreau is the fifth starter.

**THE WALK ONS:** The Huskies gained a pair of newcomers that chose to walk on during the summer. **Quinn Sterling** joined the Huskies early in the summer and traveled with the team to Europe and Africa. The 6-foot-4 guard showed his shooting prowess on the trip but has been slowed this fall with a stress fracture in his foot. **Dion Overstreet** joined the team after contacting the coaching staff expressing his interest to join the team. The 5-9 guard averaged double-digit points at Edmonds CC.

**THE TRANSFERS:** Washington will have a pair of forwards sitting out due to NCAA transfer rules. **Perris Blackwell** from San Francisco and 6-11 **Gilles Dierickx** from Florida International both joined the Huskies but are ineligible to play this season. The 6-foot-9 Blackwell was honorable mention All-West Coast Conference after averaging 12.7 ppg and 6.1 rpg while shooting 57.5% from the field. He will have one season of eligibility remaining. Dierickx started 15 games for Isiah Thomas' squad as a freshman last year and has the ability to help inside with his size and knock down shots from outside. The Belgium native will have three years left to play starting in 2013.

**COACHING ADDITIONS:** Washington has two new faces on the bench this season. Joining Lorenzo Romar's coaching staff are **Brad Jackson** and **Lamont Smith**. Jackson joins the Huskies after leading Western Washington to the 2012 NCAA Division II championship. He spent 27 years as head coach for the Vikings before making the move to Seattle after Raphael Chillous left

the Huskies' bench to become an assistant at Villanova. Smith joined the staff soon after Jackson, reuniting with his former boss, Romar. Smith spent the last five years as an assistant at Arizona State, but got his coaching start under Romar at Saint Louis from 1999-2000. Long-time assistant **Paul Fortier** moves to the new role of Director of Player Personnel and Recruiting.

## NOTEWORTHY

### RECAPPING THE TIP-OFF HALL OF FAME TOURNEY

Washington went 2-2 in the four-game Tip-Off Hall of Fame Tournament that saw the Huskies split a pair of games both at home and at the Mohegan Sun in Uncasville, Conn. The Huskies beat Loyola in the season-opener vs. Loyola but came out flat against Albany and suffered a rare non-conference home defeat against a non-BCS conference team. The Huskies bounced back with an overtime win over the BIG EAST's Seton Hall Pirates and then lost to No. 4 Ohio State in the championship. Abdul Gaddy led the Huskies with 16.0 ppg in the four games, while Aziz N'Diaye averaged 11.5 ppg and 11.8 rpg. In the two games at Mohegan Sun, Gaddy led the Huskies with 15.5 ppg, but it was C.J. Wilcox who earned all-tournament honors for the Naismith Bracket by averaging 14.5 ppg, 3.5 rpg, 1.5 bpg and 1.0 spg.

### GADDY AMONG COUSY AWARD NOMINEES

Senior **Abdul Gaddy** was among over 80 nominees for the 2013 Bob Cousy Award, handed out annually to the nation's top point guard. This watch list of candidates was narrowed down to a final 20 in January, a final 10 near February 1st, and final five by approximately March 1st. Gaddy did not make the top-20 cut.

### UW PICKED 5TH IN PAC-12 PRE-SEASON POLL

The Huskies were picked to finish fifth in the Pac-12 by a poll of media that cover the conference. Washington garnered 272 points, including two first-place votes. The last time the Huskies were picked to finish fifth was in 2008-09 when they ended up winning the Pac-10 regular season title. Last year the Huskies were picked to finish fourth, but ended up winning the title. Arizona was predicted as the winner of the league by a very close margin. The Wildcats edged UCLA by one point despite receiving one less first place votes than the Bruins. California was picked to finish third and Stanford was chosen to finish fourth. Defending Pac-12 tournament champion Colorado was selected to finish right behind Washington in sixth.

### HIGH POST OFFENSE

Washington installed a half-court high-post offense this year and has been working on the new system since the summer. Luckily for the Huskies, they had 10 extra practices to prepare for their summer foreign tour. Lorenzo Romar learned the high-post offense while an assistant under Jim Harrick at UCLA and has implemented the style at his previous coaching stops of Pepperdine and Saint Louis. The Huskies will still run the floor at every opportunity as evidenced by their 85 points scored in the season opener vs. Loyola.



## 2012-13 WASHINGTON MEN'S BASKETBALL – HUSKY NOTES

### ROMAR REACHING MILESTONES

Last season, Lorenzo Romar coached his 500th game in his career that has spanned 17 seasons. He is 324-210 (.607) all-time. He earned victory No. 300 overall AND No. 100 in Pac-12 action on Jan. 21, 2012 vs. Stanford. On Dec. 16, 2011 he reached 200 wins as the Huskies' head man. He is the second fastest Husky coach to reach the milestone. Romar has one other milestone that he reached this season vs. OSU in the Pac-12 Tournament: 200 losses in his overall career.

### HUSKIES ARE NBA READY

UW has developed a reputation for sending players to the NBA during Lorenzo Romar's first 10 seasons as head coach. Last year, UW was the only Pac-12 school with multiple players selected and for the first time ever saw two players selected in the 1st round (Terence Ross, 8th to Toronto and Tony Wroten 25th to Memphis). A total of 6 Huskies have been selected as first round picks under Romar's tenure to equal UCLA for the most among Pac-12 schools. Eight Huskies were on NBA rosters at the start of the year: **Will Conroy** (T-Wolves/cut), **Spencer Hawes** (76ers), **Quincy Pondexter** (Memphis), **Nate Robinson** (Chicago), **Terrence Ross** (Toronto), **Brandon Roy** (T-Wolves), **Isaiah Thomas** (Kings) and **Tony Wroten** (Memphis).

### WORLD TRAVELERS

The Huskies embarked on a two-week trip this summer to Europe and Africa that saw them visit Barcelona, Spain; Nice France; Monaco; Paris, France; and Dakar, Senegal. During their foreign tour, the Huskies played six games and went 3-3 against professional teams. Scott Suggs and Abdul Gaddy led the team with 13.5 ppg, while C.J. Wilcox was third with 13.2 ppg. But more importantly, the team had many experiences that will stay with them for their entire lives. While on the trip, the team saw such sites as the Eiffel Tower, The Louvre, the Prince's Palace in Monaco, Fragonard Perfume Factory; Sagrada Familia, Parc Guell and the 1992 Olympic sites in Barcelona, Spain. They wrapped up their trip with three days in Dakar, Senegal.

### DAWGS VISIT AFRICA

The Huskies capped their foreign tour this summer by spending three day in Dakar, Senegal. While in Africa, the team had a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Dakar, the capital of Senegal, is home to senior Aziz N'Diaye. He returned home for the first time in two years and served as host, ambassador and translator during the trip. The team started their Africa leg with a visit to the Bandia Animal Reserve, followed by a stop at the SEEDS Academy, where N'Diaye got his basketball start. N'Diaye led the Huskies as they ran a clinic for the younger members of the academy. The next day the team joined N'Diaye on a visit to his home where they saw the home in which N'Diaye grew up. His mom cooked N'Diaye's favorite meal -- fish and rice -- for the whole team. Later that evening the Huskies were scheduled to play Dakar

University, but a severe rainstorm flooded the court and made the venue unplayable. On the final day, the team visited Goree Island, a slave-trading post that served as the last stop for millions of African slaves before they were shipped off to Europe and the Americas.

### SONS OF SONICS

**Shawn Kemp Jr.** is not the first Husky player to come from NBA lineage -- specifically sons of Seattle Sonics. Through the years, four other Huskies had dads that spent portions of their NBA careers playing for the Sonics. Here is a look at the list:

### STUCK IN NEUTRAL?

Washington is 6-10 in regular season neutral site games (2-10 in the last 12) during **Lorenzo Romar's** 11-year tenure at the school. But, when it counts during the post-season, the Huskies are much better on neutral site courts. The Huskies are 13-6 under Romar at the Pac-12 Tournament and have won three tournament championships. UW is 8-6 on neutral sites in the NCAA tournament and have made three Sweet 16 appearances. The Huskies went 0-1 at MSG during the NIT. Overall, UW was 0-4 on neutral courts last season and have lost their last five neutral site games.

## REVIEWING 2012

### ROMAR LEADS UW TO ANOTHER HISTORIC SEASON

Once again, Husky Coach Lorenzo Romar led the Huskies to unchartered territory in 2011-12. The list is long of accomplishments that helps solidify Washington as one of the elite college basketball programs in the nation. Here is a quick overview of some of the program's accomplishments during the year:

- For the first time in school history, the Huskies have won 20 or more games in four-straight seasons.
- Washington has amassed 100 wins over the last four seasons, the first time in program history they have reached the century mark in a four-year span.
- The Huskies won the Pac-12 regular season title with a 14-4 record, their 23rd conference title since 1911 -- 18 of those crowns are outright -- but only two of those have come in the last 58 years (2009 & 2012).
- Fourteen conference wins equals the 4th most in team history and just the 9th time the Huskies have achieved that many league victories.
- UW advanced to the semifinals of the 2012 NIT Tournament, the furthest they have advanced in the post-season tournament and furthest they have advanced in either the NIT or NCAA's since 1953.
- Tony Wroten was named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year, the fifth time in UW history they have won the award.
- Wroten and Terrence Ross both earned first team All-Pac-12 honors, making UW the only team with multiple players on the first team in four-straight years.

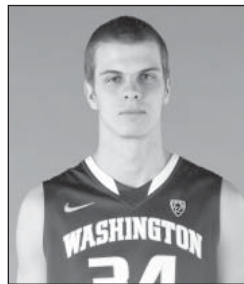
