SATURDAY'S GAME: The Washington State University football team (3-5, 1-4 Pac-12) travels to San Francisco to face the California Golden Bears (4-4, 1-4), Saturday, Nov. 5 at AT&T Park. Gametime is set for 3:30 p.m. and will be televised in the state of Washington on ROOT Sports and in the Bay Area on Comcast SportsNet California. The game can also be heard across the IMG College Sports Radio Network.

WSU vs. CALIFORNIA - THE SERIES: The 2011 meeting between the Cougars and Golden Bears marks the 73rd time the two teams have met on the gridiron, with Cal holding a 42-25-5 series advantage. The Golden Bears hold a 28-12-3 advantage when playing the series at home, including a 49-17 victory the last time the game was played in California. Cal has won each of the last six meetings, including a 20-13 victory last season in Pullman.

ARIZONA STATE GAME PICKED UP BY VERSUS: Washington State's home football game against Arizona State Nov. 12 will be televised live nationally by Versus. Game time is set for 7:30 p.m. at Martin Stadium.

KARSTETTER NFF SCHOLAR-ATHLETE: WSU senior wide receiver Jared Karstetter has been named a National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete, the organization announced last week. As a National Scholar-Athlete, Karstetter will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship. He is also a finalist for the nation's top scholar-athlete award, the William V. Campbell Trophy. If he is selected as the Campbell recipient, the scholarship will grow to \$25,000. Karstetter is the fifth Cougar to earn the prestigious honor, as Alex Brink (2007), Jason Hanson (1991), Ed Tingstad (1988) and Greg Porter (1982) were also named National Scholar-Athletes. Karstetter, one of 16 finalists from a group of 127 semifinalists, and the only Pac-12 representative, is being recognized for accomplishments in the classroom, on the field and in the community. He will be honored during the NFF's 54th Annual Awards Dinner, Dec. 6, at the Waldorf=Astoria in New York City.

Pac-12 Players of the Week

Tailback Chris Polk of Washington, safety Tevin McDonald of UCLA and place kicker Eric Whitaker of Stanford have been named Bank of the West Pac-12 Players of the Week in football.

In the Huskies' 42-31 win over Arizona, Polk became the first player in Washington history to have 100 yards rushing and receiving in the same game. He finished the night with 144 yards on 34 carries and an additional 100 yards on four receptions. Polk scored five touchdowns (four rushing, one receiving) to tie the UW modern school record for touchdowns in a game. Polk joined Napoleon Kaufman as one of just two players in Washington history to rush for 1,000 yards in three seasons as he broke through the mark on Saturday.

McDonald had three interceptions in UCLA's 31-14 win over California. The three interceptions tied the school single-game record, and McDonald became the fifth player to accomplish the feat. Rahim Moore had the last three-interception game for the Bruins in 2009 against San Diego State. McDonald also tied the Pac-12 freshman record with three picks in one game.

Whitaker made both of his field goal attempts (33 and 29 yards) and all six of his PATs in Stanford's 56-48 triple-overtime win over USC. Whitaker was filling in for the injured Jordan Williamson, who entered the week leading the Pac-12 in scoring at 10.6 points per game.

WSU LINEUP STILL YOUTHFUL: Of the 76 players to see the field this season for the Cougars, 30 were playing their first Division I collegiate game, or 40 percent. The Cougars have played 10 true freshmen and 10 redshirt freshmen, while 11 players have started their first collegiate start. As for class breakdown, of the 105 players to start camp, five are in their fifth year, 11 in their fourth, 28 in their third, 28 in their second and 33 in their first year.

HORTON MAKES IT FOUR IN A ROW: WSU sophomore cornerback Damante Horton's interception against Oregon marked his fourth-straight game with an interception and the first four of his career. Horton's pick at against the Ducks was taken back 76 yards for a touchdown, the sixth-longest interception return for a score in school history. Horton's four interceptions leads the Pac-12. The last time a Cougar intercepted a pass in four consecutive games occurred when Jason David picked off passes in five straight during the 2002 season, when he finished the year with seven and helped the Cougs earn a trip to the Rose Bowl.

Last Meeting

California 20, Washington State 13
Nov. 6, 2010 • Martin Stadium

Shane Vereen rushed for a game-high 112 yards and two touchdowns as California earned its first road win of the season with a 20-13 victory against Washington State. Following a scoreless first quarter, Washington State struck first on a 10-yard touchdown run by Logwone Mitz, his third rushing TD of the season. Cal quickly answered with Vereen going in from two yards out. Late in the half freshman Andrew Furney connected on his first collegiate field goal, a 51-yard effort as WSU carried a 10-7 lead into halftime. It marked the first halftime lead against a conference opponents since the Apple Cup during the 2007 season. Jeremy Ross raced in from 27 yards out on Cal's opening possession of the second half while Vereen closed out the scoring midway through the fourth quarter with a one-yard run. Furney added a 48-yard field goal for the Cougars final total. WSU quarterback Jeff Tuel threw for 92 yards on the day, his first game of 2010 that he failed to reach the 200-yard mark. C.J. Mizell led WSU's defense with 12 tackles, including two for loss, while another freshman, Deone Bucannon, added 10 tackles.

WSU ASSISTING VETERANS: WSU Athletics is partnering with Fairchild Air Force Base and the Veteran Tickets Foundation to honor United States Armed Forces veterans and active duty soldiers for WSU's Nov. 19 Armed Forces Day game against Utah. WSU Athletics is offering the general public a special price of \$15 for end zone tickets and \$25 for sideline tickets to purchase and donate to the organization. Veteran Tickets Foundation will distribute the tickets to U.S. Armed Forces veterans and active duty soldiers in the area. Fans can visit wsucougars.com and use the promotional code "HONOR" to purchase tickets to donate for the cause. WSU Athletics donated 100 tickets to jump start the campaign.

HOME STAY WAS SHORT: The Cougars returned to Martin Stadium for the first time since Sept. 10 when they hosted Stanford Oct. 15, a span of 34 days away from home. The last time WSU had an extended absence from Martin Stadium came during the 2005 campaign when the Cougars opened in Martin Stadium Sept. 1 and returned home, Oct. 8, coincidentally against Stanford. While last weekend's Oregon State contest was considered a home game, it marked the first of three more consecutive games away from Martin Stadium. The entire stretch has the Cougars playing in Martin Stadium once over a 62-day span. You have to go back to 1979 when WSU opened the season with two home games in Spokane, then played six of its next seven games on the road, a stretch of 55 days playing once at home.

KARSTETTER CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Senior wide receiver Jared Karstetter's touchdown catch at Oregon was the 17th of his career, moving him into a tie for sixth on the WSU career receiving touchdowns list alongside Brandon Gibson (2005-08). The Spokane native currently sits sixth on WSU's all-time career receptions list with 143 after making seven catches against Oregon. He is five receptions away from catching Phillip Bobo and Jason Hill, who are tied for fourth with 148 receptions. Karstetter has started in 32 consecutive games and caught a pass in 35 straight.

WSU'S LONG SCORING DRIVES: WSU's 85-yard touchdown drive in the fourth quarter against Oregon was its ninth scoring drive of at least 80 yards this season. The Cougars have scored on drives of 70-plus yards 19 times and scored touchdowns on drives in five-or-fewer plays 11 times.

STATISTICALLY SPEAKING, COUGS ARE MUCH IMPROVED: In the middle of his fourth year at the helm, Cougar Head Coach Paul Wulff is starting to see the benefits of his hard work. Both the Cougar offense and defense have taken huge steps forward this season. Through eight games this season, WSU's offense and defense are far ahead of the past two seasons. Below is a breakdown of the offense and defense for the past three seasons at the midpoint of each campaign. National ranking in parentheses:

COUGARS PLACE SEVEN ON PHIL STEELE PAC-12 MIDSEASON TEAMS: Seven members of the Washington State University football team were included on Phil Steele's Midseason All-Pac-12 Conference list. Defensive end Travis Long and wide receiver Marquess Wilson were named to the first team, linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis, guard B.J. Guerra, safety Deone Bucannon and kicker Andrew Furney were named to the second team, while kick returner Isiah Barton was a third-team pick.

FURNEY'S 40-YARD FIELD GOALS: Andrew Furney had kicked a field goal in all five games this season prior to Stanford, where WSU managed two touchdowns but no field goal attempts. After a two-game drought, Furney connected on his first attempt at Oregon (40 yards), his 10th-straight to open the season. His four field goals at UCLA were a single-game career high and tied for the second-most in WSU single-game history. Furney is now 5-for-5 this season on field goals of 40-yards or more and has hit his last six attempts from 40-yards plus, dating back to last season. Furney leads the conference in field goal percentage at 91.7 percent, making 10 of 11 attempts this season.

WILSON'S BIG PLAYS: Marquess Wilson's go-ahead 63-yard touchdown catch at Colorado wasn't his first big play of his career. In just 20 games, the sophomore wideout owns six career touchdown catches for 50-plus yards, including four this season. Dating back through the 1984 season, the only Cougar with more touchdown catches of 50-plus yards is former Cougar great Tim Stallworth who finished his four-year career with seven.



HOFFMAN-ELLIS PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Washington State senior linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis was named Bank of the West Pac-12 Conference Defensive Player of the Week, following his performance against Colorado. Hoffman-Ellis registered a game-high 14 tackles in the Cougars' 31-27 comeback victory at Colorado. His 14 tackles, which included 12 solo tackles and two sacks, were a WSU season-high and one shy of his career-best 15 against Oregon State in 2009. The award marks the first of Hoffman-Ellis' career and the first for a Cougar defensive player since Husain Abdullah earned the honor in November, 2007. It's also the first weekly accolade for the Cougs this season and first since Jeff Tuel earned Offensive Player of the Week after beating Oregon State last season.

FANS DECIDED HOMECOMING UNIFORMS: Cougar fans determined the uniform combination WSU wore for the Homecoming game against No. 7 Stanford. There were eight uniform combinations to choose from, made up of both crimson and gray pants, tops and helmets. The winning uniform choice, consisting of gray pants, gray tops and gray helmets, was unveiled prior to the game.

COUGARS GET 500th WIN: With its victory over Colorado Oct. 1, Washington State University football earned win number 500 in program history. Entering the 2011 season there were 72 Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams with at least 500 wins, while in the Pac-12 Conference, the Cougars were tied at 499 with Oregon State in the race for win No. 500 before the victory in Boulder.

DOUBLE-DIGIT COMEBACKS: WSU's 31-27 win at Colorado after trailing by 10 points late in the fourth quarter was Washington State's first come-from-behind victory after trailing by double-digits in the fourth quarter since beating Montana State 23-22 last season. The Cougs trailed MSU 22-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Saturday's win was also the first double-digit come-from-behind conference win since beating Oregon State 36-30 in Pullman (10/25/03) after trailing the Beavers 28-16 in the fourth quarter. It was also the first time WSU posted a conference road win after trailing by double-digits in the fourth quarter since scoring 28 points in the final period in a 49-42 victory at Stanford (10/20/84) after trailing 42-21 in the quarter.

LOBBESTAEL NAMED MANNING AWARD PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Washington State's Marshall Lobbestael was selected as the Manning Award Player of the Week. Lobbestael earns the honor over seven other Manning Award Stars of the Week in the Allstate Sugar Bowl's Facebook contest. Lobbestael completed 32-of-49 passes for 376 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Cougars to a 31-27 victory Colorado. This is the second time that Lobbestael has been recognized as a Manning Award Star of the Week and his first Manning Award Player of the Week honor.

300-YARD PASSING PERFORMANCES: Marshall Lobbestael threw for 376 yards in WSU's win at Colorado, setting a career-high for the third consecutive game and notching his third straight game with 300 passing yards (361 – UNLV, 368 – San Diego State). It's the first time a Cougar quarterback has passed for 300 yards in consecutive games since Alex Brink reached the mark in each of the final four games of the 2007 season. Brink and Ryan Leaf sit tied atop the Cougar record book with 12 career 300-passing yard performances. Leaf recorded nine 300-yard games during the 1997 season while Brink reached the mark eight times in 2007.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD: In addition to Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit and Lee Corso, ESPN's College Gameday has had another constant – the WSU flag, which this weekend will be making its 114th consecutive appearance on the weekly show, dating back to the beginning of the 2004 season. Two flags – Ol' Crimson and Whitey – have been flown in the background of the Gameday set by dozens of friends and alumni. WSU recognized the Gameday flag wavers in a pregame ceremony prior to the Montana State game last season. In addition to the flags that fly, there is a traveling flag signed by the holders after each episode. The traveling flag is retired after each season, the first of which is hanging in WSU's Alumni Center.

OREGON HIGHLIGHTS:

- Damante Horton's interception was his fourth straight game with an INT. It's the second interception returned for a touchdown this season for the Cougars (Hoffman-Ellis vs, Idaho State).
- Jared Karstetter's touchdown catch was his 17th career touchdown catch and 35th straight game with a reception.
- Karstetter's seven catches for 114 yards move him into sixth place on WSU's all-time receptions with 143.
- Marquess Wilson had a career-high 11 catches for 126 yards, his fourth 100-yard game this season and ninth of his career.
- Marshall Lobbestael's 337 passing yards is his fourth 300-yard game this season and career.
- Carl Winston ran for a career-high 69 yards.
- It's the second time Karstetter and Wilson each went over 100 yards in the same game this season (at Colorado).

OREGON STATE HIGHLIGHTS:

- WSU's nine play 80-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter was its eighth scoring drive of at least 80 yards this season.
- Damante Horton picked off his third pass of the season and of his career. He has an INT in each of the last three games.
- Jeff Tuel's touchdown pass to Marquess Wilson in the first quarter was his 25th career TD pass, moving him into sole possession of ninth place on WSU's career passing touchdowns list.
- Marquess Wilson's first quarter TD catch was his sixth of the season and 12th of his career.
- The Cougars three-play touchdown drive in the second quarter was the third quickest (plays) scoring drive this season. WSU had scoring drives of one play and two plays at San Diego State.
- Jared Karstetter has now caught a pass in 34 consecutive games.

STANFORD HIGHLIGHTS:

- Damante Horton's interception on the Cardinal' opening drive was his second career INT and second straight came with an INT.
- Marquess Wilson has caught a pass in each of his 18 career games played.
- Carl Winston's second quarter TD was the second of his career (at Colorado).
- Deone Bucannon's 11 tackles are the third most in his career and fourth career double-digit tackle performance.
- Isiah Barton's seven catches tied a career high.
- Jeff Tuel completed 17 passes to up his career total to 308 and pass Steve Birnbaum for 10th on WSU career completions top-10.

UCLA HIGHLIGHTS:

- Andrew Furney has kicked a field goal in all five games this season. His four field goals are a single-game career high. Furney is now 4-for-4 this season on field goals of 40-yards or more and has hit is last five attempts from 40-yards plus.
- Damante Horton's interception was the first of his career.
- Jared Karstetter's touchdown catch was the 16th of his career, moving him into a tie for 10th on WSU's top-10 career receiving touchdowns list. Karstetter finished with two catches to up his career catches to 130 and move into sole possession of eighth place on WSU's all-time career

receptions list.

- Marquess Wilson set a career single-game high with 10 catches, surpassing previous high of seven (USC last season).
- Rickey Galvin caught his first career touchdown pass and set a career high with 16 carries for 93 yards.

COLORADO HIGHLIGHTS:

- Jared Karstetter had nine catches for 105 yards to pass Mike Levenseller and Tim Stallworth and move into a tie for eighth place with C.J. Davis on WSU's all-time career receptions list. Karstetter has 128 career receptions and three career 100-yard games.
- Carl Winston's two-yard rushing touchdown was his first career touchdown.
- Jared Byers 11-yard touchdown catch was his first career touchdown.
- Logan Mayes recorded his first career sack while making his collegiate debut.
- Lobbstael's 376 passing yards are a career-high and the 18th most in WSU single-game history. It's his third straight game with 300-plus passing yards.
- Alex Hoffman-Ellis had a season-high 14 tackles, one off his career-high 15, and made a career-high two sacks. It's his fifth career double-digit tackle performance.
- Travis Long made a career-high eight tackles.
- WSU notched its first fourth quarter comeback win since beating Montana State 23-22 in Pullman last season (trailed 22-7 entering 4th). It's the first come-from behind conference win since beating Washington in double-overtime in 2008 (trailed 10-7 entering 4th).

SAN DIEGO STATE HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Cougars scored on their first offensive play for the first time since Jerome Harrison had an 80-yard rushing TD against Idaho (9/1/05) on the game's first play.
- Marquess Wilson's 80-yard touchdown catch was the longest of his career, second longest career catch (83 yards from Tuel at Stanford last season) and fifth consecutive game with a TD catch.
- Wilson's 78-yard TD catch was the second longest TD catch of his career, third longest career reception, 10th career touchdown catch and fourth of the season.
- Marquess Wilson's 236 receiving yards was his seventh career 100-yard receiving game and second of the season.
- Wilson set a career high with 236 receiving yards and two touchdowns. The 236 yards are the fifth most in WSU single-game history and the most since Jason Hill had 240 yards at Cal (10/22/05).
- Marshall Lobbstael's 368 passing yards were a career-high.

UNLV HIGHLIGHTS:

- First time scoring 50-plus points in back-to-back games since beating Oregon 55-44 (9/21/96) and San Jose State 52-16 (9/28/96).
- WSU's 123 total points in the first two games is the second-most points scored in a two-game span since the first two games of 1907 season, 132 points, beating Eastern Washington 46-0 (10/5/07) and Blair Business College 86-0 (10/12/07).
- Jared Karstetter had a pair of receiving touchdowns, his fourth career multi-TD game and now has 15 career TD catches, needing just one TD catch to break into all-time top-10 list.
- Marshall Lobbstael's five touchdown passes are a career high, he now has seven TD passes in 2011, he came into the season with seven career TD passes.
- Lobbstael's career-high 361 passing yards was the first 300-yard passing game since Jeff Tuel threw for 311 at UCLA last season and the most since Alex Brink's 399 at Washington (11/24/07).
- Marquess Wilson had five catches for 102 yards and one touchdown, his sixth career 100-yard receiving performance.

IDAHO STATE HIGHLIGHTS:

- WSU scored 60 points for the first time since beating Southwestern Louisiana 77-7 (11/8/97).
- Rickey Galvin, Isiah Barton, Kristoff Williams and Marcus Mason each scored their first career touchdowns. Galvin had a 11-yard rushing TD and later added a seven-yard scoring run, Barton caught a 27-yard TD pass, Williams had a 20-yard TD catch and Mason scored on a 65-yard TD run.
- Alex-Hoffman Ellis recorded his second career interception return for a touchdown (52 yards against SMU last season), 6th career Cougar to have two INT returns for TD.
- WSU's 40 first half points are the most in any half since scoring 56 in the first half of a 77-7 win over Southwestern Louisiana (11/8/97).
- Andrew Furney's 51-yard field goal matches his career long (California, 2010)
- WSU had four rushing touchdowns for the first time since rushing for six in the win over Southwestern Louisiana (11/8/97).
- WSU's 590 yards in total offense is its highest total since putting up 638 in the win over Portland State (9/20/08).
- WSU's 289 rushing yards are the most since recording 344 against Idaho (9/9/06).

Head Coach Paul Wulff



Paul Wulff enters his fourth season on the Cougar sideline after being named Washington's State's 31st head coach, Dec. 10, 2007. With his appointment Wulff became the first WSU football letterwinner and graduate to lead the Cougars since Phil Sarboe served as head coach from 1945-49.

With three full recruiting classes under his belt heading into the 2011 campaign, Wulff has the Cougars on the rise following three years of rebuilding a program from the ground up. The end of 2010 saw a glimpse of what is coming as WSU earned its first Pacific-10 Conference road win under Wulff, a 31-14 victory at Oregon State. The following week WSU dropped a heartbreaker in the Apple Cup, falling to Washington 35-28. The back-to-back games with 28-plus points showed the offense has come miles from even the 2009 season.

A 1990 graduate of WSU and a four-year letterwinner, Wulff's first season leading the Cougars proved difficult as the transition to a new head coach combined with numerous injuries resulted in a 2-11 record. WSU's lone conference win came in dramatic fashion as the Cougars needed a last-second field goal in regulation, and again in double overtime, to defeat Washington 16-13 in the Apple Cup.

Wulff's second season was once again marred by injuries, yet progress was being made as 13 freshmen and 23 players overall made their first-collegiate starts. The bright spot of the year came in week three as WSU fought back from a 13-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat SMU in overtime, 30-27.

Prior to Washington State, Wulff spent the previous 15 seasons at Eastern Washington University, the final eight as head coach. There he amassed a record of 53-40 while his current 11-year head coaching record stands at 58-72. During his eight-year head coaching tenure Wulff was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year three times (2001, 2004, 2005) and led the Eagles into the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs three times in his final four seasons.

In 2007 he guided the Eagles to a 9-4 mark, including a quarterfinal appearance at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs, falling to two-time defending champion Appalachian State. It marked the seventh time in his eight years at Eastern that his teams posted winning records.

Wulff began his coaching career at EWU in 1993 as a volunteer assistant working with the offensive line. He was named offensive line/strength coach the following season and spent four years in the position before being promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line/strength coach in 1998. Following two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator, Wulff was named head coach prior to the 2000 season. He guided the Eagles to six-straight winning seasons and seven overall during his eight-year tenure.

Wulff's 2005 team was loaded with experience, talent and leadership, featuring a group of seniors that included the Big Sky's Offensive and Defensive MVP's (Erik Meyer and Joey Cwik), and featured a trio of All-Americans (Meyer, Eric Kimble and Matt Alfred). Meyer would go on to win the Walter Payton Award as the best football player in the Football Championship Subdivision. The Eagles finished 7-5 and won the Big Sky title with a 5-2 record before losing to eventual national runner-up Northern Iowa in the first round of the playoffs.

In 2004, Wulff's squad finished 9-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. The crowning glory came when the Eagles knocked off No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois in the first round.

Statistically, the 2004 and 2005 teams were nearly identical with each finishing the year ranked fourth in FCS in total offense. In 2005 the Eagles averaged 477.8 yards per game, and were 14th in scoring (35.0). A year earlier the Eagles averaged 475.5 yards and 37.5 points per game to rank sixth.

Wulff coached 21 players to 54 Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America honors in his first seven years at the helm of the EWU program, and two more of his players were named to the Sports Network's 2007 FCS All-America team at the conclusion of last year. Of the 21 players to earn All-America recognition, 15 have been offensive lineman. Additionally, Wulff mentored 15 players who have earned 18 total CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors and a total of 131 All-Big Sky Conference Academic team members.

As a student-athlete and four-year starter at center for the Cougars from 1986-89, Wulff was an All-America honoree himself as a senior, earning honorable mention accolades from The Sporting News. Wulff started at center under three different coaches after redshirting in 1985. He played for Jim Walden in 1986, Dennis Erickson from 1987-88 and Mike Price in 1989. He was also the starting center on WSU's 1988 Aloha Bowl championship team.

After a successful collegiate career Wulff had a brief pro career as a center after graduating from WSU in 1990. He signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets, but was released after injuring an ankle and a rib in the preseason. He played in spring 1991 with Raleigh-Durham of the World League, then played in spring 1992 with New York-New Jersey.

A 1985 graduate of Davis High School in Davis, Calif., Wulff played for three different coaches while he was at WSU. He redshirted in 1985 and started four games at guard in 1986 under Jim Walden.

Dennis Erickson directed the program in 1987 and 1988 with Wulff as his starting center both years. In 1988, the Cougars were victorious in the Aloha Bowl as Wulff earned honorable mention All-Pacific-10 Conference honors.

Under Mike Price in 1989, Wulff earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention selection on The Sporting News All-America squad. He was also WSU's long snapper during his stay there.

Wulff was born Feb. 25, 1967, in Woodland, Calif. He and his wife Sherry have a daughter, Katie, and two sons, Max and Sam.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Backup quarterback Marshall Lobbestael threw for 230 yards and two touchdowns as Washington State overwhelmed Idaho State 64-21 in the season opener for both teams in front of 22,034 fans. Washington State scored on its first four possessions against the Bengals, jumping to a 23-0 lead after the first quarter and 40-0 at halftime. Lobbestael completed his first nine passes and finished 14 of 19 in WSU's most dominant win since beating Portland State 48-9 in 2008. The Cougars piled up 590 yards against Idaho State. Marquess Wilson caught four passes for 91 yards for WSU. Freshman Marcus Mason rushed six times for 88 yards as the Cougars produced 289 rushing yards. Washington State took the opening kickoff and went 58 yards in five plays, with Rickey Galvin scoring on an 11-yard run. Lobbestael hit Isiah Barton on a 27-yard touchdown pass on WSU's second possession. Tavoy Moore fumbled the ensuing kickoff and Bennett Bontemps recovered for WSU at ISU's 30. WSU quarterback Jeff Tuel did not start the game because of a stomach virus, and only played one series before injuring his left clavicle. Idaho State drove to WSU's 36 on the next possession, but Yost was intercepted by linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis, who returned the ball 67 yards for a touchdown and a 23-0 WSU lead. Wilson caught a 61-yard touchdown pass for a 40-0 halftime lead. Idaho State scored when Jahmel Rover ran in from 3 yards to cap a 73-yard drive with 8:53 left in the third. Rover ran in a second touchdown with 4:21 left in the third to bring Idaho State within 54-14. Mason added a 65-yard touchdown run for WSU. It was the first time WSU has scored 60 points in a game since a 77-7 win over SW Louisiana in 1997.

PULLMAN, Wash. -- Marshall Lobbestael threw for career highs of 361 yards and five touchdowns as Washington State defeated UNLV 59-7. WSU scored touchdowns on its first five possessions and held a 35-0 lead at halftime to win its first two games of the season for the first time since 2005. Lobbestael completed 24 of 32 passes in little more than a half of action. UNLV was scoreless until Tim Cornett's 95-yard kickoff return for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter. The Rebels gained just 158 yards and could not stop the WSU offense, which produced 610 yards. Backup quarterback Connor Halliday threw a pair of late touchdown passes for WSU, giving them seven for the game. Marquess Wilson caught five passes for 102 yards and a touchdown for WSU. Jared Karstetter had six receptions for 66 yards and two touchdowns. Freshman Rickey Galvin ran 48 yards for a touchdown on WSU's opening drive and finished with 80 yards on five carries. Lobbestael had two touchdown passes to senior Jared Karstetter, along with scores to Isiah Barton and Andrei Lintz in the first half as WSU took a 35-0 lead into halftime. caught a 5-yard touchdown pass from Lobbestael to cap a 74-yard drive for a 14-0 Cougars' lead. Lobbestael completed 18 of 21 passes for 274 yards in the first half, and WSU had 372 total yards in the first half while holding UNLV to 95 yards. This was the first meeting between the two programs since 1991, and WSU has won all five times they have played.

SAN DIEGO, Calif. – Ronnie Hillman ran for 191 yards and four touchdowns to lead San Diego State to a 42-24 win over Washington State. Marshall Lobbestael threw touchdown passes of 80 and 78 yards to Marquess Wilson for Washington State (2-1). Lobbestael completed 20 of 42 passes for a career-high 368 yards with three TDs and two interceptions. Hillman, a sophomore, ran 32 times as he scored four rushing touchdowns for the second time in his career. Hillman contributed to 500 yards of total offense for the Aztecs on the day. SDSU quarterback Ryan Lindley threw for 273 yards, but also committed the first two San Diego State turnovers this season with an interception and later fumbling a snap out of the shotgun formation at the Cougars 16-yard line. The Cougars, the nation's highest-scoring team at 61.5 points per game, scored on its first play from scrimmage, an 80-yard pass to Wilson. Lobbestael later hit Wilson on a 78-yard scoring pass to give Washington State a 24-14 lead early in the third quarter. Lindley passed the 10,000-yard career passing mark with a second-quarter completion. Lindley is second in school history to Todd Santos, who threw for 11,425 yards. Lindley has thrown touchdown passes in 13 straight games, but his lone interception broke a string of 112 pass attempts without one. After the Cougars scored on their first play from scrimmage, San Diego State responded with a score on a 13-yard run by Hillman. Washington State took a 10-7 lead on Andrew Furney's 48-yard field goal. The Aztecs then went 76 yards in 13 plays with Hillman scoring on a 12-yard run at the end of the first quarter. Lobbestael gave Washington State a 17-14 halftime lead after a 23-yard TD pass to Isiah Barton.

BOULDER, Colo. – Marquess Wilson sped past two defenders and hauled in a 63-yard touchdown pass from Marshall Lobbestael with 1:10 left to lead Washington State to a stunning 31-27 comeback win over Colorado. The Buffaloes were primed for a win in their Pac-12 debut before surrendering two touchdowns in the final 2 1/2 minutes. Lobbestael threw for 376 yards and three touchdowns in leading the Cougars. The Buffaloes led 27-17 with 5:11 left after Rodney Stewart's 1-yard TD run, which he set up with a 52-yard scamper to the Washington State 21. Lobbestael led Washington State 77 yards in seven plays, hitting Isiah Barton from 19 yards out with 2:35 left to pull the Cougars within a field goal. With three timeouts remaining, Wulff elected to forgo a risky onside kick, and the strategy paid off when the Cougars forced a punt and got the ball back with 1:50 left. This time, they needed just 40 seconds to cover 90 yards. Bottled up for much of the afternoon - 58 yards on five catches - Wilson sped past cornerback Greg Henderson and safety Anthony Perkins and was wide open as he hauled in the pass and raced into the end zone. CU had one more chance, but receiver Paul Richardson was stripped of the ball by cornerback Damante Horton after a 23-yard gain and linebacker C.J. Mizell recovered for Washington State at its 39 with just under a minute left. CU quarterback Tyler Hansen threw touchdown passes of 9 yards to Richardson and 4 yards to Toney Clemons, the latter giving Colorado a 20-10 lead in the third quarter. Lobbestael responded with an 11-yard TD strike to fullback Jared Byers to keep it close. Will Oliver's third field goal, a 48-yarder as the first half expired, gave Colorado a 13-10 halftime lead. It came just 16 seconds after Andrew Furney tied the game with a 28-yarder following Hansen's first interception in 133 passes.

PASADENA, Calif. – Kevin Prince threw a go-ahead, 7-yard touchdown pass to Shaq Evans with 3:26 to play, and UCLA rallied from an eight-point deficit in the fourth quarter for a 28-25 victory over Washington State. Prince passed for 173 yards after starter Richard Brehaut broke his leg in the second quarter, mounting two late touchdown drives. Derrick Coleman rushed for two scores, and Josh Smith caught a TD pass for the Bruins. Marshall Lobbestael passed for 235 yards and hit Jared Karstetter and Rickey Galvin for second-half touchdowns. Andrew Abbott intercepted Lobbestael's final pass near midfield with 2:01 to play, and Smith made an exceptional catch for a first down while getting hit in the closing seconds, allowing UCLA to run out the clock. Andrew Furney kicked four field goals for the Cougars. After the Cougars settled for three field goals in the first half when their offense stalled inside the UCLA 10, Karstetter scored Washington State's first touchdown midway through the third quarter. Galvin then caught a fourth-quarter TD pass from Lobbestael, who went 28 for 40. The longtime backup quarterback remained in the Cougars' starting lineup despite the return of Jeff Tuel, back in uniform after breaking his collarbone in the season opener. Prince immediately sparked the Bruins, connecting with Nelson Rosario on a 41-yard pass to the goal line, where Coleman scored. Coleman added another short TD on the Bruins' opening drive of the second half, but UCLA's fourth personal foul allowed the Cougars to make a short touchdown drive capped by Karstetter's 8-yard grab over the middle. Lobbestael hit Galvin in stride for a 21-yard TD, but UCLA blocked the extra point and made a swift drive for Smith's TD catch. Rosario couldn't hold on to the 2-point conversion throw, keeping Washington State ahead 22-20. Furney hit a 47-yard field goal with 5:49 to play, but Rosario made an electrifying, one-handed 58-yard catch that put the Bruins inside the Washington State 10 moments later. Evans scored on a 7-yard slant, and Rosario caught a 2-point conversion pass, putting UCLA up by three points.

Washington State vs. No. 7 Stanford

PULLMAN, Wash. – Andrew Luck threw two third-quarter touchdown passes to Levine Toilolo as No. 7 Stanford beat Washington State 44-14 Saturday to extend the nation's longest winning streak to a school record 14 consecutive games. Stanford (6-0, 4-0 Pac-12) struggled against the Cougars defense before blowing the game open in the second half. Luck completed 23 of 36 passes for 336 yards with four touchdowns and one interception. Washington State (3-3, 1-2) hoped to get a boost from the return of quarterback Jeff Tuel. But they had little success against a Stanford defense that is allowing just 10 points per game. Tuel, who fractured his collarbone on his first series of the season, finally was cleared to play and started the game in place of reserve Marshall Lobbestael. He completed 17 of 30 passes for 145 yards. The Cougars generated 257 yards of total offense in the game. Leading 10-7 after the half, Stanford drove 85 yards on its first possession of the second half, with a 62-yard pass play from Luck to Coby Fleener covering most of the distance. Luck fired a 10-yard touchdown pass to Toilolo for a 17-7 lead. After punting on its next series, Stanford scored on a 62-yard drive late in the third when Luck hit Toilolo for a 26-yard scoring pass and a 24-7 lead. Luck also fired an 8-yard scoring pass to Stepfan Taylor and a 28-yard touchdown pass to Fleener in the fourth. Lobbestael scored on a short run for Washington State in the fourth quarter. In the first half, Jordan Williamson kicked a 23-yard field goal with 1:34 left in the first quarter to give Stanford a 3-0 lead. The Cardinal have not been scored on in the first quarter all season.

SEATTLE, Wash. – Sean Mannion threw for a career high 376 yards and four touchdowns, Malcolm Agnew added 103 yards rushing and Oregon State beat Washington State 44-21 in The Seattle Game. Mannion, a redshirt freshman who took over as Oregon State's starter in Game 3, threw a pair of scores in the first half, then connected with Joe Halahuni on a 25-yard touchdown in the third quarter as the Beavers ran off 20 unanswered points. Tuel threw for 127 yards and a touchdown, and added another touchdown running, but was sacked three times and took a big hit on an incompleting just before halftime. He was late returning from the locker room at half and was replaced by Marshall Lobbestael, the starter for the first five games of the season. Tuel broke his collarbone in the opener against Idaho State and returned for WSU's sixth game against Stanford. The Cougars dropped their third straight after a promising 3-1 start to the season and now face the teeth of their schedule with upcoming games at Oregon, California, home for Arizona State and the Apple Cup against rival Washington in the final five weeks of the season. Mannion had touchdown passes of 31 yards to Jordan Jenkins on Oregon State's opening drive, 12 yards to Brandin Cooks, his third-quarter TD to Halahuni and an 18-yard toss to Clayton York in the fourth quarter to push the Beavers lead back to 20. And when Mannion wasn't finding open receivers, Agnew was rushing for healthy chunks of yards. Agnew averaged 4.5 yards per carry and had his second 100-yard game of the season. Oregon State entered ranked 107th in the country at running the ball, but finished with 175 yards rushing. Trevor Romaine also kicked three short field goals for the Beavers. Lobbestael finished 10 of 20 for 105 yards and was intercepted in the end zone late in the game. Marquies Wilson had a 20-yard touchdown catch in the first half and Carl Winston rushed for another in the third quarter

EUGENE, Ore. – Freshman De'Anthony Thomas sparked No. 7 Oregon with two second-half touchdowns in a 43-28 victory over Washington State. Darron Thomas returned to start against the Cougars but threw two interceptions in the first half and was replaced by backup Bryan Bennett in the second. Lavasier Tuinei caught two touchdown passes for Oregon. The Ducks have also won 17 straight conference games. De'Anthony Thomas has 11 touchdowns this season, an Oregon record for a true freshman. His second score of the game was a 93-yard kickoff return. Thomas finished with 8-of-13 passing for 153 yards and a score. Bennett completed four of seven passes for 88 yards and two touchdowns. Marshall Lobbestael, who played in place of injured Cougars quarterback Jeff Tuel, completed 28 of 48 passes for 337 yards and a touchdown. He was intercepted twice. Oregon's special teams set the tone when they blocked Washington State's punt after the game's opening series and Boseko Lokombo returned it 26 yards for the touchdown. Andrew Furney kicked a 40-yard field goal to narrow the margin for the Cougars. Oregon made it 15-3 when Darron Thomas, scrambling away from several defenders, got off a pass moments before he was hit. Tuinei awkwardly pulled it down and stumbled into the end zone for a 55-yard touchdown. Washington State cornerback Damante Horton's 76-yard interception return for a touchdown narrowed the lead to 15-10 with 1:50 left. Bennett set the tone for Oregon in the second half with a pitch to De'Anthony Thomas who ran the rest of the way for a 45-yard score. After Furney's 35-yard field goal for the Cougars, Bennett found Tuinei in the end zone for a 19-yard touchdown to give the Ducks a 29-13 advantage. The Cougars closed the gap again with Lobbestael's 24-yard TD pass to Jared Karstetter, but De'Anthony Thomas answered with a 93-yard kickoff return for a score. Kenjon Barner ran for a 28-yard touchdown to open the fourth quarter for the Ducks. Washington State's Rickey Galvin had an 8-yard scoring run and the two-point conversion was successful for the final margin.
