**SATURDAY'S GAME:** Washington State (1-5, 0-4) begins its longest stint away from Martin Stadium when it travels to California (3-2, 0-2) for a Saturday contest at 1:30 p.m. Following their home game Oct. 10 against Arizona State, the Cougars will not return to Martin Stadium until Nov. 14, a span of 35 days. Saturday's contest marks the first of three straight on the road, followed by Notre Dame (in San Antonio) and Arizona. The contest will be radio only and can be heard across the Cougar Sports Radio Network.

**WASHINGTON STATE vs. CALIFORNIA - THE SERIES:** The 2008 meeting between the Cougars and Golden Bears marks the 70th time the two teams have met on the gridiron, with Cal holding a 40-25-5 series advantage. When playing at home, Cal holds owns a 27-12-3 advantage, though WSU is 2-2 in the last four meetings at Memorial Stadium. The Golden Bears have won each of the last four games played between the two schools (2005-08), including a 66-3 victory last season in Pullman. Prior to 2005 WSU held a four-game winning streak (1999-2002), including two wins in Berkeley (2000 & 2002).

**FOUR COUGARS RECEIVE MIDSEASON RECOGNITION:** Four Cougars were included on Phil Steele's Midseason All-Pacific-10 Conference list, including Redshirt junior punter Reid Forrest was named to the first team, redshirt senior center Kenny Alfred was named to the second team and freshman defensive end Travis Long and junior safety Chima Nwachukwu were each named to the third team.

**LINEUP SHUFFLE:** Through the first six games of the 2009 season, the Cougar coaching staff is still searching for continuity within its starting lineup. Though early in the campaign, injuries have forced the Cougars to use four different starting lineups in its offensive live, five different starting lineups on offense and four different starting units on defense. There has yet to be two games this year where WSU has used the same starting offense and defense.

**PUTTING IN TIME:** Looking at the 2009 WSU roster reveals few names who have been in the program more than two years. Of the 114 players currently on the Cougar roster, only 37 have been a member of the team more than two years. That includes only six current fifth-year seniors and 15 total players who have earned more than one varsity letter. Compare that to the success of WSU during the 2002 and 2003 season, when the Cougars had 28 and 24 players, respectively, with multiple varsity letter winners.

**INJURIES TAKING A TOLL:** Through the first six games of the 2009 season, the Cougars have been hit hard by the injury bug, particularly the offensive and defensive lines. So far this season WSU has missed 46 player games due to injury or illness. On the offensive line five players who have started this season have 12 missed games due to injury, while the defensive line has missed a total of 10 games from four players.

FIRST STARTS: Continuing a trend from last season, WSU has had a number of players make their starting debuts this season. Through the first six games of 2009, 17 Cougars have made their first career starts, six on offense and 11 on defense. In 2008 26 players registered their first start for WSU, 17 on offense and nine on defense. First-time offensive starters include Gino Simone (WR), Zack Williams (OG), Jeffrey Solomon (WR), Alex Reintouer (OL), Jeff Tuel (QB) and Tyson Pencer (OT). Defensive first-time starters include Travis Long (DE), Bernard Wolfgramm (DT), Josh Luapo (DT), Jason Stripling (LB), Brandon Jones (CB), LeAndre Daniels (S), Alex Hoffman-Ellis (LB), Casey Hamlett (DE), Daniel Simmons (CB), Anthony Laurenzi (DT) and Dan Spitz (DE). Through the first six games of 2009, the Cougars have had a combined 29 starts by freshmen, already more than in eight of the last 10 seasons. In the last 10 years, only 2004 (32) and 2008 (47) saw more combined starts by freshmen.

A SECOND TIME FOR A FIRST: True freshman Jeff Tuel was given the starting nod at quarterback last week at Oregon, marking only the second time in school history WSU started a true freshman signal

caller. The first was Drew Bledsoe in 1990, who made his first career start at Oregon State in the seventh game of the season. Tuel, who was 1-of-2 before leaving the game in the first quarter with a hip pointer, made his Cougar debut against USC, entering in the second quarter and finishing the game as he completed 14-of-22 passes for 130 yards. Tuel is only the second true freshman quarterback to attempt a pass for the Cougars since Bledsoe in 1990 (JT Levenseller was the other in 2008).

HOME SWEET HOME?: For only the third time since the inception of the Pacific-10 Conference in 1978, the Cougars have at least four games during the month of October with only one being played in the friendly confines of Martin Stadium.

NOTABLES FROM ARIZONA STATE: Redshirt freshman defensive tackle Anthony Laurenzi became the ninth freshman to record his first-career start this season, matching the total number of freshmen to start a game in all of 2009...the last time WSU started as many as nine freshmen in back-to-back seasons was in 1999 (11) and 2000 (10), the two seasons prior to WSU's run of three consecutive

bowl games...Freshman quarterback Jeff Tuel's 99-yard touchdown pass to Johnny Forzani was the longest play from scrimmage in school history...The Cougar defense recorded six takeaways against the Sun Devils, and now has 18 on the season, more than in all of last season (13)...the six takeaways were the most against Arizona State since also recording six in 1987, and the most against any opponent since recording seven against UCLA in 2003.

LONG ROADTRIP AHEAD: Following WSU's home game against SMU, the Cougars have embarked on a part of their schedule that sees them play five of six games on the road. Following contests at USC and Oregon, WSU returned home to host Arizona State Oct. 10. After a bye, the Cougars play their following three games on the road at Cal, Notre Dame (San Antonio) and Arizona. All added up, WSU will be away from Martin Stadium for 35 days.

Jahvid Best ran for 200 yards and three touchdowns as California defeated Washington State (0-2, 0-1) 66-3. Best made his first career start and California (2-0, 1-0) produced 505 yards on offense...Best rushed 14 times for an average of 14.3 yards per carry. Cal jumped to an early lead, scoring on its first three possessions and piling up 171 yards to take a 21-3 lead after one quarter...the Cougars returned 11 kickoffs for 298 yards, both school records. WSU's lone score came on a 43-yard field goal from kicker Nico Grasu, the longest field goal since Nov. 19, 2005 against Washington.

NOTABLE FROM OREGON: With Carl Winston (running back), Alex Reitnauer (offensive guard) and Jared Byers (fullback) all seeing action against the Ducks, the Cougars have now played six true freshman in 2009...WSU played nine true freshman during the 2005 season...redshirt senior running back Dwight Tardy became only the ninth running back in WSU history to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards...red-shirt freshman cornerback Terrance Hayward recorded a career-high nine tackles...his eight first-quarter tackles were more than he had on the season entering the game (three).

ALFRED NAMED A DRADDY SEMIFINALIST: Senior offensive lineman Kenny Alfred was named a semifinalist for the Draddy Trophy, the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame recently announced. The Draddy Trophy recognizes the best and brightest in college football, as nominees must have at least a 3.2 GPA, must be a first team player or significant contributor and must demonstrate strong leadership and citizenship. Alfred's former teammate Alex Brink was a finalist for the award in 2007. Alfred was also named to the 2009 Rimington Trophy Watch List earlier this year, awarded annually to the nation's top college center

FRESHMEN CONNECTION: It didn't take long for true freshmen Jeff Tuel and Gino Simone to connect on the field. While Tuel grabbed much of the headlines, Simone had a huge game two weeks ago against the Trojans. The freshman from Sammamish, Wash., caught eight passes for 83 yards, all after Tuel entered the game midway through the second quarter. The eight receptions were the most by a Cougar since Brandon Gibson pulled down 10 catches for 103 yards against Oregon in 2008. Simone entered the game with four catches for 24 yards on the season.

TARDY RUSHING FOR A FIRST: Redshirt senior running back Dwight Tardy is looking to become the first known running back in school history to lead WSU in the statistical category in four consecutive seasons. Dating as far back as 1942, only three backs have led WSU in rushing in three consecutive seasons: Tardy (2006-08), Shaumbe Wright-Fair (1990-92) and Tim Harris (1980-82). So far this season Tardy has rushed for a team leading 187yards.

NOTABLES FROM USC: Redshirt freshman cornerback Daniel Simmons recorded the first two tackles-for-loss of his career...sophomore linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis led WSU with a season-high 10 tackles...junior punter Reid Forrest connected for a 65-yard punt in the fourth quarter, eclipsing his career-best of 64 in the 2009 opener against Stanford...the Cougar defense held USC scoreless in the second and third quarters, making the first time since 2000 that WSU held the Trojans scoreless in back-to-back periods.

MONTGOMERY OUT FOR SEASON: Washington State University junior running back James Montgomery underwent surgery Sept. 20 for acute compartment syndrome in his left leg. The surgery was performed by Cougar team physician Dr. Ed Tingstad and will end Montgomery's season. Through the first three games of the season Montgomery led the Cougars in rushing, including his 118-yard effort against Hawaii. His 132.3 all-purpose yards per game ranked 46th in the nation and his 24.0 kickoff return average was t-51st.

PHASE III OF MARTIN STADIUM RENOVATION LAUNCHED: Washington State University Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced Tuesday (Sept. 22) the public launch of the third phase of the Martin Stadium Renovation project. Originally budgeted at approximately \$40 million, Phase III involves the construction of luxury suites, loge boxes and club seats atop the north stands. It follows the completion of Phases I and II, which included the addition of concession and restroom areas throughout the stadium, a concourse at the stadium's north side, many new comfort and safety enhancements, a Martin Stadium sign at the east end, a state-of-the-art scoreboard and the Cougar Pride statue at the newly created plaza area on the stadium's northeast side. Phases I and II began in December 2006 and were completed in the fall of 2008. The motto of the renovation project is TeamBuilt, a slogan that Sterk says communicates the importance of the involvement of all Cougar fans in this project. COUGAR DEFENSE GETS TWO SCORES AGAINST SMU: Redshirt junior linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis and redshirt junior Myron Beck each returned interceptions for touchdowns against SMU, sparking the Cougar comeback. Hoffman-Ellis went 52 yards near the end of the third period and Beck brought WSU to within seven points early in the fourth when he raced 67 yards to payday. The two interception returns for a touchdown tied the school record, set twice in 1987, against Wyoming (Sept. 12) and against Arizona (Oct. 24).

PUNT FORREST, PUNT: Junior Reid Forrest continues to be a bright spot for the Cougars' special teams. So far this season he is averaging 44.7 yards per kick, with a career-best 65-yarder two weeks ago against USC. He has eight punts this season over 50 yards, including three over 60. Forrest has moved into WSU's all-time list for both career punts and career punting yards. His 6,512 career punting yards rank seventh on the Cougars' all-time list while his 156 career punts are tied for seventh.

five games of the 2009 season, the Cougar defense has taken a hard stand in the red zone. WSU leads all Pac-10 schools in red zone defense, allowing just 65.2 percent of chances finding the scoreboard. Opponents have entered WSU's red zone 23 times, coming away with 12 touchdowns (52.2 percent) and three field goals. The Cougars have created four turnovers inside their 20, the most by any conference school. Since the start of the 2001 season, no Cougar team has allowed less than 70 percent of successful red zone chances.

COMEBACK WIN LARGEST SINCE 1994: WSU's come-from-behind, 30-27 overtime win against SMU marked the largest comeback by a Cougar squad since the 1994 season. The last time WSU overcame a 17-plus point deficit to win the game was against California Oct. 29, 1994, when the Cougars trailed California by



18 points in the first quarter (20-2), and came back to win 26-23.

NOTABLES FROM SMU: Sophomore Marshall Lobbestael earned his first start of the season and responded with a career-best 239 passing yards...the Cougar defense forced its seventh and eighth fumbles of the season, recovering one...WSU's five recoveries in 2009 are also more than in all of 2008 (three)...the Cougar defense intercepted four passes on the day... the last time the Cougars intercepted four passes was against Oregon State in 2008 (Oct. 11)...freshman defensive end Travis Long's sack in the first quarter was the first of his career...redshirt freshman defensive tackle Anthony Laurenzi also recorded the first sack of his career in the second quarter...junior wide receiver Daniel Blackledge's second-quarter touchdown was the first of his career.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD: In addition to Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit and Lee Corso, ESPN's College Gameday has had another constant - the WSU flag, which has appeared on the weekly show a record 83-consecutive times since the beginning of the 2004 season. Two flags - Ol' Crimson and Whitey - have been flown in the background of the Gameday set by as many as 115 friends and alumni. In addition to the flags that fly, there is a traveling flag signed by the holders after each episode. The traveling flag is retired after each season, the first of which is hanging in WSU's Alumni Center.

TARDY MOVING UP THE RUSHING LISTS: Redshirt senior running back Dwight Tardy entered the 2009 season ranked 10th in both career rushes and career rushing yards. Tardy became only the ninth running back in WSU history to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards following the Oregon game. Tardy now has 2,008 on his career, and ranks ninth on WSU's career rushing list. His 473 carries rank seventh all-time.

2011 HAWAII GAME REMOVED FROM SCHEDULE: The 2011 meeting between Washington State and Hawaii has been removed from the Cougars schedule to allow for flexibility in the Pac-10 Conference schedule that year, said WSU Director of Athletics Jim Sterk. "The conference is looking at ways to create an off week during a 12-game schedule and this allows us the opportunity to adjust accordingly,"

said Sterk. WSU will pay the \$300,000 buyout stipulated in the contract.

CORY MACKAY UPDATE: Washington State University redshirt freshman defensive end Cory Mackay continues his rehabilitation following a single-car accident on his way home from WSU last May. The accident left Mackay without the use of his lower body, though he continues to show improvement. His rehabilitation includes work at Pushing Boundaries, an exercise facility in his hometown of Redmond, Wash. Mackay is currently taking online classes through WSU and plans to return to campus in January to begin the winter semester. Against Hawaii at Qwest Field Mackay served as the Cougars' honorary captain, raising the Cougar flag pregame and greeting his teammates in the lockerroom prior to kickoff.

NOTABLES FROM HAWAII: Junior wide receiver Jeffrey Solomon had team-highs of six receptions and 71 yards against the Warriors...in addition to his 118 yards on the ground, James Montgomery added a 10-yard reception and 78 yards in kickoff returns for 206 yards of all-purpose yards...in the first start of his career, linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis had a game-high-tying nine tackles, including five solo and two TFLs...junior punter Reid Forrest continued his strong start, averaging 46 ypp on four kicks, with a long of 62.

NOTABLES FROM STANFORD: Eight different Cougars made their first collegiate start against Stanford...sophomore Louis Bland registered a game and career-high 10 tackles...senior running back Dwight Tardy moved into eighth place on the career rushes list with 434...junior punter Reid Forrest booted a career-long 64-yard punt, one of three punts over 50 yards on the day...quarterback Kevin Lopina's five-yard strike to Jared Karstetter was the first TD pass of his career...Karstetter ended the day with 91 receiving yards, one yard better than his 2008 season total...junior wide receiver Daniel Blackledge (67 yards) and senior tight end Tony Thompson (36 yards) both had career-best days.

ANDERSON TO FOCUS ON TRACK CAREER: Washington State University junior wide receiver Jeshua Anderson decided to leave the Cougar football team last week and focus

solely on his track endeavors. Anderson has played in the first two games this season, catching four passes for 66 yards. For his career he has played in 26 games, 13 as a starter, catching 48 passes for 743 yards and four touchdowns. On the track Anderson is a two-time Pacific-10 Conference, NCAA West Regional and NCAA champion in the 400-meter hurdles. He earned outdoor All-America honors twice and indoor All-America recognition once, and holds the school record in the 400m hurdles (48.47 seconds) and 4x400m indoor relay (3:06.74). He finished ninth at the 2008 Olympic Trials and fifth at the 2009 USA Outdoor Championships.

COUGARS ON LIVE TV: Washington State University has already been selected to appear on live television five times this season. Both ABC, FSN and Versus can select additional games during the course of the 2009 season, with selections made six or 12 days in advance of the games.

STARTING FROM DAY ONE: The Cougars had two true freshman start the 2009 season-opener against Stanford (Travis Long, defensive end; Gino Simone, wide receiver), the second time since the inception of the Pacific-10 Conference in 1978, and first in 31 years, two true freshmen position players started a season-opener for WSU. Prior to this season, only 12 Cougars had started a season-opener as true freshmen, eight of which were position players.

THOMPSON WEARING DAD'S NUMBER: Senior tight end Tony Thompson wears a familiar number this season, one that his father wore more than 30 years ago. The younger Thompson wears No. 14, a tribute to his father, Jack, who wore the number from 1975-78. Following Jack's WSU playing career, the Cougars retired his No. 14, only the second football jersey to be retired (No. 7, Mel Hein) at WSU.

## HEAD COACH PAUL WULFF



Paul Wulff enters his second season on the Cougar sideline after being named Washington's State's 31st head coach, Dec. 10, 2007. With his appointment Wulff became the first WSU football letterwinner and graduate to lead the Cougars since Phil Sarboe served as head coach from 1945-49.

A 1990 graduate of WSU and a four-year letterwinner, Wulff's first season leading the Cougars proved difficult as the transition to a new head coach combined with numerous injuries resulting in a 2-11 record. WSU's lone conference win came in dramatic fashion as the Cougars needed a last second field goal in regulation and two overtimes to defeat Washington 16-13 in the Apple Cup.

Wulff spent the previous 15 seasons at Eastern Washington University, the final eight as head coach. There he amassed a record of 53-40. During his eight-year head coaching tenure Wulff was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year three times (2001, 2004, 2005) and led the Eagles into the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs three times in the last four years. He enters the 2009 campaign with a 55-51 career head coaching record in nine seasons.

In 2007 he guided the Eagles to a 9-4 mark, including a quarterfinal appearance at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs, falling to two-time defending champion Appalachian State. It marked the seventh time in his eight years at Eastern that his teams posted winning records.

Wulff began his coaching career at EWU in 1993 as a volunteer assistant working with the offensive line. He was named offensive line/strength coach the following season and spent four years in the position before being promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line/strength coach in 1998.

Following two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator, Wulff was named head coach at Eastern prior to the 2000 season. He guided the Eagles to six straight winning seasons and seven overall during his eight-year tenure.

Wulff's 2005 team was loaded with experience, talent and leadership, featuring a group of seniors that included the Big Sky's Offensive and Defensive MVP's (Erik Meyer and Joey Cwik), and featured a trio of All-Americans (Meyer, Eric Kimble and Matt Alfred). Meyer would go on to win the Walter Payton Award as the best football player in the Football Championship Subdivision. Together, Meyer and Kimble rewrote Eastern's record book as they combined for 27 school records and four Big Sky marks. Meyer set a FCS record for passing efficiency rating (166.47 with 10,261 yards, 84 touchdowns, just 17 interceptions and a .657 completion rate), while Kimble's 46 touchdown grabs ranked second in FCS history behind the 50 of legendary Jerry Rice. The Eagles finished 7-5 and won the Big Sky title with a 5-2 record before losing to eventual national runner-up Northern Iowa in the first round of the playoffs.

The 2004 season was also special, even after the Eagles opened the season 0-2. Eastern won eight of its next nine games - most by substantial margins - as the Eagles closed the year with a 51-44 overtime victory at Montana State to secure a place in the playoffs. Quarterback Erik Meyer was named the league's Offensive Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award. Senior offensive tackle Michael Roos joined Meyer, wide receiver Eric Kimble and guard Rocky Hanni as All-Americans, with Roos eventually being taken in the second round of the NFL draft by the Tennessee Titans.

In 2004, Wulff's squad finished 9-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. The crowning glory came when the Eagles knocked off No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois in the first round.

Statistically, the 2004 and 2005 teams were nearly identical with each finishing the year ranked fourth in FCS in total offense. In 2005 the Eagles averaged 477.8 yards per game, and were 14th in scoring (35.0). A year earlier the Eagles averaged 475.5 yards and 37.5 points per game to rank sixth.

Wulff coached 21 players to 54 Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America honors in his first seven years at the helm of the EWU program, and two more of his players were named to the Sports Network's 2007 FCS All-America team at the conclusion of last year. Of the 21 players to earn All-America recognition, 15 have been offensive lineman.

Additionally, Wulff has mentored 15 players who have earned 18 total CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors and a total of 131 All-Big Sky Conference Academic team members.

As a student-athlete and four-year starter at center for the Cougars from 1986-89, Wulff was an All-America honoree himself as a senior, earning honorable mention accolades from The Sporting News. Wulff started at center under three different coaches after redshirting in 1985. He played for Jim Walden in 1986, Dennis Erickson from 1987-88 and Mike Price in 1989. He was also the starting center on WSU's 1988 Aloha Bowl championship team.

After a successful collegiate career Wulff had a brief pro career as a center after graduating from Washington State University in 1990. He signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets, but was released after injuring an ankle and a rib in the preseason. He played in spring 1991 with Raleigh-Durham of the World League, then played in spring 1992 with New York-New Jersey.

A 1985 graduate of Davis High School in Davis, Calif., Wulff played for three different coaches while he was at WSU. He redshirted in 1985 and started four games at guard in 1986 under Jim Walden.

Dennis Erickson directed the program in 1987 and 1988 with Wulff as his starting center both years. In 1988, the Cougars were victorious in the Aloha Bowl as Wulff earned honorable mention All-Pacific-10 Conference honors.

Under Mike Price in 1989, Wulff earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention selection on The Sporting News All-America squad. He was also WSU's long snapper during his stay there.

Wulff was born Feb. 25, 1967, in Woodland, Calif. He and his wife Sherry have a 14-year-old daughter, Katie, and two sons, six-year-old Max and three-year-old Sam.

Sept. 5, 2009, PULLMAN – Toby Gerhart rushed for a game-high 121 yards and two touchdowns as the Stanford Cardinal opened the season with a 39-13 victory over host Washington State. Stanford opened the scoring on a one-yard Gerhart touchdown run but the Cougars responded with a pair of long drives, cutting the lead to 8-3 early in the second quarter. A pair of touchdowns by the Cardinal, one through the air and another on the ground, gave Stanford a 22-3 lead at halftime. WSU opened the second half with an 8-play, 80-yard scoring drive, capped by a five-yard Kevin Lopina touchdown pass to Jared Karstetter, the first TD pass of Lopina's career. Nico Grasu's second field goal of the game cut the lead to 39-13 after three periods and WSU drew no closer. WSU receiver Daniel Blackledge finished the day with a career-best six catches and 67 yards while punter Reid Forrest averaged 47.7 yards per punt on six kicks, including a career-best 64 yarder.

Sept. 19, 2009, PULLMAN – Alex Hoffman-Ellis and Myron Beck each had interception returns for touchdowns and Nico Grasu's 39-yard field goal in overtime capped a 30-27 come-from-behind victory as Washington State defeated SMU for its first win of the 2009 season. SMU scored the game's first 17 points and led 27-13 with just over 10 minutes remaining in regulation before a furious Cougar rally. Beck stepped in from of a Bo Levi Mitchell pass and raced 67 yards with 10:07 left to bring WSU with seven at 27-20. Oct. 10, 2009, PULLMAN –Danny Sullivan ran for one touchdown and threw for another as Arizona State relied on the Pacific-10's best defense to beat Washington State 27-14 on Saturday. Kyle Williams had 13 catches for 126 yards and a touchdown as Arizona State (3-2, 1-1 Pac-10) beat WSU for the sixth-straight time. The Sun Devils won despite suffering three interceptions and losing three fumbles in unseasonably cold, windy conditions. Washington State (1-5, 0-4) managed only 181 yards, 99 of them on the longest touchdown pass in school history. But it was their closest conference loss so far. Embattled quarterback Danny Sullivan played most of the game for Arizona State, although Brock Osweiler got some plays. Sullivan completed 19 of 29 passes for 169 yards.
