SATURDAY'S GAME: Washington State (1-10, 0-8) closes out its 2009 season when it travels cross-state to face the Washington Huskies (3-7, 2-5) in the annual Apple Cup, proudly sponsored by Boeing, Saturday at 3:30 p.m. WSU will be going for its first-three-game winning streak in series history and its third-straight win at Husky Stadium. The game will be televised by FSN Northwest, with Tom Glasgow (play-by-play), Mack Strong (analyst) and Jason Stiles (analyst). FSN NW will have a pregame show starting at 2:30 with Brad Adam, Jason Gesser, Damon Huard along with Angie Mentink and Jen Mueller. The game can be heard across the Cougar Sports Radio Network.

WSU-UW SERIES: Dating back to the first meeting between the Huskies and Cougars in 1900, a 5-5 tie in Seattle, Washington leads the 101-game series by a 64-31-6 margin. From 1934-61 the winner of the cross-state rivalry was awarded the Governor's Trophy. In 1962 the Apple Cup trophy was instituted, and Washington holds a 32-14 record in Apple Cup games since. WSU has won four of the last five Apple Cups, however, including last season's 16-13 double-overtime win in Pullman. Washington holds a 36-15-5 advantage when playing in Seattle, although the Cougars have won the last two meetings when playing in Husky Stadium.

COUGS LOOKING FOR FIFTH APPLE CUP IN SIX YEARS: The Cougars will be going for their fifth Apple Cup victory in the past six years. Should they succeed, this group of Cougar seniors will be just the fifth class to be a part of three victories over Washington. The first group to accomplish the feat dated back to the early 1950's, when the Cougars defeated Washington in 1951, 1953 and 1954. WSU also captured Apple Cup victories in 1982, 1983 and 1985, while each of the past two senior classes earned three Apple Cup victories (2004, 2005 2007 and 2008). A win Saturday will also give the Cougars their first three-game winning streak in the series.

ALFRED SELECTED FOR EAST-WEST SHRINE GAME: Washington State University senior center Kenny Alfred has been selected to compete in the 85th annual East-West Shrine Game. Alfred will join the West squad for the annual game that will be held Jan. 23, 2010 at the Citrus Bowl in Orlando, Fla. Alfred is the 17th Cougar since 2000 to be selected to play in the Shrine Game, the most recent being former Cougar Jed Collins in 2007. It also marks the 28th straight season a Cougar senior has participated in a postseason all-star game since 1981.

BOB ROBERTSON HONORED WITH RADIO BOOTH DEDICATION: WSU Athletics honored hall of fame Cougar broadcaster Bob Robertson by renaming the radio booth at Martin Stadium the Bob Robertson Broadcast Suite. Robertson, in his 43rd season calling Cougar football, was honored in a pregame ceremony prior to the UCLA game.

JOHNSON MAKES SWITCH: Prior to the Oregon State game, junior wide receiver Easton Johnson had played in six games without making a reception, primarily on special teams. Two days before the Oregon State game, injuries in the Cougar secondary prompted Johnson to move to safety. In his 2009 defensive debut, Johnson recorded 10 tackles, five solo, with a tackle-for-loss and two quarterback hurries. His efforts earned him WSU's defensive player of the game.

FRESHMAN STARTERS REACH 20-YEAR HIGH: Through 11 games of the 2009 season, the Cougars have started 13 different freshmen, more than any other full season in at least 20 years. The previous known high was 11 in 1999. Five have been true freshmen, also the highest known total since at least 1997.

COUGARS HONOR 14 SENIORS: Last Saturday's contest against Oregon State marked the final home contest for 14 seniors playing their final game at Martin Stadium. A brief pre-game ceremony took place at midfield to honor those players. The list of seniors included Kenny Alfred, Jesse Feagin, Xavier Hicks, Colin Huemmer, Andrew Kreutz, Reed Lesuma, Kevin Lopina, Andy Mattingly, Patrick Rooney, Dwight Tardy, Zach Tatman, Sam Tennant, K.C. Thometz and Tony Thompson.

TARDY MOVES UP RUSHING LISTS: Earlier this season senior running back Dwight Tardy became only the ninth running back in WSU history to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards following the Oregon game. Tardy now has 2,204 on his career, and ranks seventh on WSU's career rushing list. His 514 carries rank sixth all-time.

LAST MEETING AT HUSKY STADIUM: Alex Brink threw for 399 yards and five touchdowns, the last a 35-yarder to Brandon Gibson with 31 seconds left, as the Cougars came from behind to win the 100th Apple Cup 42-35, Nov. 24, 2007. Brink completed 27-of-40 throws, becoming the first Cougar quarterback to beat the Huskies three times while setting a record for passing yards in an Apple Cup game. Redshirt freshman Jake Locker rushed for 103 yards and two touchdowns

- including a go-ahead, 1-yard run that gave Washington a 35-28 lead with 12:18 remaining. On WSU's final drive, Brink found Gibson, who had six catches for 137 yards and two scores while setting the school record for receiving yards in a season.

PUTTING IN TIME: Looking at the 2009 WSU roster reveals few names who have been in the program more than two years. Of the 114 players currently on the Cougar roster, only 37 have been a member of the team more than two years. That includes only six current fifth-year seniors and 15 total players who have earned more than one varsity letter. Compare that to the success of WSU during the 2002 and 2003 season, when the Cougars had 28 and 24 players, respectively, with multiple varsity letter winners.

INJURIES TAKING A TOLL: Through 11 games of the 2009 season, the Cougars have been hit hard by the injury bug, particularly on the offensive and defensive lines. So far this season WSU starters or significant reserves have missed 111 player games due to injury or illness. On the offensive line five players who have started this season have 17 missed games due to injury, while the defensive line has missed a total of 26 games from five players.

FIRST STARTS: Continuing a trend from 2008, WSU has had a number of players make their starting debuts in 2009. This season 23 Cougars have made their first career starts, nine on offense and 14 on defense. In 2008, 26 players registered their first start for WSU, 17 on offense and nine on defense.

LINEUP SHUFFLE: Through the first 11 games of the 2009 season, the Cougar coaching staff continues to search for continuity within its starting lineup. Injuries have forced the Cougars to use seven different starting lineups in its offensive line, 10 different starting lineups on offense and nine different starting units on defense. There has yet to be two games this year where WSU has used the same starting offense and defense.

THREE COUGARS NAMED TO ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM: Washington State University football student-athletes Casey Hamlett, Micah Hannam and Chima Nwachukwu were named to the ESPN The Magazine 2009 Academic All-District VIII First Team as selected by CoSIDA. It marks the third-straight season Hannam, a civil engineering major with a 3.59 GPA, has been honored. He was named first team in 2008 and second team in 2007. Hamlett, a management and operations major with a 3.72 GPA, and Nwachukwu, a political science major carrying a 3.79 GPA, were honored for the first time. The Pacific-10 Conference placed

eight individuals on the first team, with WSU placing a conference-best three players on the list, while Stanford and California each had two. Since the 2002 season, Washington State has placed 14 student-athletes on the CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII teams, the most by any school in the conference.

COUGARS, JACK THOMPSON AND WORLD VISION JOIN FOR TSUNAMI RELIEF: Prior to WSU's home game against UCLA, Cougar great Jack Thompson, World Vision and WSU students collected cash donations to raise funds for American Samoa Tsunami Relief. Thompson and others urged fans to "Fill the Helmet" to help traumatized children and families receive much-needed supplies for recovery and rebuilding. Fans wishing to donate can do so online at www.worldvision.org/respond.

NWACHUKWU A WUERFFEL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST: WSU junior safety Chima Nwachukwu was named a semifinalist for the Wuerffel Trophy, honoring the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with outstanding academic and athletic achievement. Nwachukwu carries a 3.79 GPA in the classroom and started the first eight games this season before an ankle injury against Notre Dame kept him out of the Arizona contest. In the community Nwachukwu volunteers his time with numerous activities in Pullman and serves as WSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee president.

PUNT FORREST, PUNT: Junior Reid Forrest continues to be a bright spot for the Cougars' special teams. So far this season he is averaging 43.6 yards per kick, with a career-best 65-yarder against USC. He has 16 punts this season over 50 yards, including four over 60. Forrest has moved into WSU's all-time list for both career punts and career punting yards. His 8,478 career punting yards rank third on the Cougars' career list while his 202 punts are fourth.

OREGON STATE NOTABLES: Senior offensive guard Reed Lesuma received his first-career start...senior kicker Patrick Rooney's field goal on WSU's first drive of the game marked the first time the Cougars have scored on their opening drive since Chris Ivory's five-yard touchdown run against Portland State, Sept. 20, 2008...it also marked the first field goal of Rooney's career...senior safety Xavier Hicks' second-quarter interception was his second of the season and fifth of his career...three of his interceptions have come against Oregon State...with six receptions, sophomore receiver Jared Karstetter has caught a pass in 14 consecutive games...sophomore linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis's 15 tackles were a career high and the most by a Cougar since Xavier Hicks's 17 against Arizona

State in 2007...sophomore cornerback Aire Justin's 10 tackles were also a career high, as were junior Easton Johnson's 10 tackles.

UCLA NOTABLES: Wide receiver Jeffrey Solomon's third-quarter touchdown reception was the first of his career...the 46-yard reception was the longest of his career...sophomore wide receiver Jared Karstetter has caught a pass in 13 consecutive games...senior linebacker Andy Mattingly forced his second fumble of the season, and the seventh of his career.

ARIZONA NOTABLES: Redshirt freshman safety Jay Matthews and true freshman fullback Jared Byers recorded their first-career starts against Arizona, becoming the 20th and 21st Cougars to make their starting debuts in 2009...with his four receptions



for 16 yards, freshman wide receiver Gino Simone has now caught a pass in each of his eight games played in his debut season...linebacker Andy Mattingly's 11 tackles were a season high...safety Xavier Hicks recorded 12 tackles against Arizona, his third-consecutive game with 10-plus tackles...sophomore wide receiver Jared Karstetter's 64-yard touchdown catch was his sixth of the season, the most since Brandon Gibson caught nine in 2007.

FOUR COUGARS RECEIVE MIDSEASON RECOGNITION: Four Cougars were included on Phil Steele's Midseason All-Pacific-10 Conference list. Redshirt junior punter Reid Forrest was named to the first team, redshirt senior center Kenny Alfred was named to the second team and freshman defensive end Travis Long and junior safety Chima Nwachukwu were each named to the third team.

NOTRE DAME NOTABLES: Freshman wide receiver Gino Simone caught one pass for 15 yards, giving him at least one reception in each of the seven games he has played this year...he missed the SMU game with a concussion...sophomore wide receiver Jared Karstetter caught two touchdown passes, giving him five on the season...the total is the most by a Cougar since Brandon Gibson caught nine touchdown passes in 2007...freshman Jared Byers' 12-yard reception in the second quarter was the first of his career...redshirt senior linebacker Jason Stripling's 13 tackles were a career high and marked the first double-digit effort of his career...redshirt sophomore linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis recorded his second double-digit tackling game of the season...his 12 tackles were a career high...Andy Mattingly became the 10th Cougar to force a fumble this season...WSU has forced 13 fumbles in 2009, more than twice the total than in all of 2008 (six).

TURNOVERS WAY DOWN FROM 2008: The Cougars have a turnover margin of -7 in 2009. Through 11 games of 2008, WSU had a turnover margin of minus-24. Against both Stanford and California this season the Cougars have played turnover-free, something they did not accomplish at any point during 2008.

TUEL GOES OVER 300: Freshman quarterback Jeff Tuel's 354 passing yards are the second-most by a true freshman quarterback in school history. Drew Bledsoe holds WSU's record by a true freshman, throwing for 385 yards against Arizona, Oct. 27, 1990. Tuel had eclipsed his career high with 232 yards in the first half. The last Cougar quarterback to throw for 300 yards in a game was Alex Brink, who threw for 399 yards against Washington in 2007.

LONG ROADTRIP ENDS: Following WSU's home game against SMU, the Cougars embarked on a part of their schedule that saw them play five of six games on the road. Following contests at USC and Oregon, WSU returned home to host Arizona State Oct. 10. After a bye, the Cougars played three games on the road at Cal, Notre Dame (San Antonio) and Arizona. All added up, WSU was away from Martin Stadium for 35 days.

FORZANI GOES DEEP: Junior wide receiver Johnny Forzani's 68-yard touchdown against California was his second of more than 65 yards in as many games (he also caught a 99-yard touchdown against Arizona State). The last Cougar to catch multiple 65-yard-plus touchdowns in the same season was Chris Jackson in 1997. Jackson caught 72- and 78-yard touchdown passes against California and UCLA, respectively.

ALFRED NAMED DRADDY SEMIFINALIST: Senior offensive lineman Kenny Alfred was named a semifinalist for the Draddy Trophy by the National Football Foundation and College Football Hall of Fame. The Draddy Trophy recognizes the best and brightest in college football, as nominees must have at least a 3.2 GPA, must be a first team player or significant contributor and must demonstrate strong leadership and citizenship. Alfred's former teammate Alex Brink was a finalist for the award in 2007.

TARDY RUSHING FOR A FIRST: Redshirt senior running back Dwight Tardy is looking to become the first known running back in school history to lead WSU in the statistical category in four consecutive seasons. Dating as far back as 1942, only three backs have led WSU in rushing in three consecutive

seasons: Tardy (2006-08), Shaumbe Wright-Fair (1990-92) and Tim Harris (1980-82). So far this season Tardy has rushed for a team leading 380 yards.

IMPROVEMENT IN RED ZONE: Through 11 games of the 2009 season, the Cougar defense has taken a hard stand in the red zone. WSU is second in the Pac-10 in red zone defense, allowing 78.8 percent of chances finding the scoreboard. The Cougars have created five turnovers inside their 20, tied for the most by any conference school.

NOTABLES FROM CALIFORNIA: WSU ended its first-quarter scoring drought with Nico Grasu's 24-yard field goal with 2:20 remaining in the opening stanza...the last time WSU scored in the opening period was against Arizona, Nov. 8, 2008...true freshman running back Carl Winston's 37-yard run in the second quarter was the longest rush by a Cougar in 2009...WSU's 440 yards of total offense were the most since Portland State in 2008 (638), and the most against a Pac-10 foe since Washington in 2007 (509)...the Cougars scored 17 first-half points, the most in a half against a Pac-10 opponent since scoring 21 second-half points against Washington in 2007...defensive tackle Toby Turpin's blocked field goal at the end of the second quarter is the first by a Cougar since 2005, when Aaron Johnson blocked a Stanford field goal attempt...true freshman wide receiver Gino Simone's second-quarter 19-yard touchdown reception was the first of his career.

NOTABLES FROM ARIZONA STATE: Freshman defensive tackle Anthony Laurenzi became the ninth freshman to record his first-career start this season, matching the total number of freshmen to start a game in all of 2009...the last time WSU started as many as nine freshmen in back-to-back seasons was in 1999 (11) and 2000 (10), the two seasons prior to WSU's run of three consecutive bowl games...freshman quarterback Jeff Tuel's 99-yard touchdown pass to Johnny Forzani was the longest play from scrimmage in school history...the Cougar defense recorded six takeaways against the Sun Devils, and now has 18 on the season,

more than in all of last season (13)...the six takeaways were the most against Arizona State since also recording six in 1987, and the most against any opponent since recording seven against UCLA in 2003.

NOTABLE FROM OREGON: With Carl Winston (running back), Alex Reitnouer (offensive guard) and Jared Byers (fullback) all seeing action against the Ducks, the Cougars have now played six true freshman in 2009...WSU played nine true freshman during the 2005 season...senior running back Dwight Tardy became only the ninth running back in WSU history to eclipse 2,000 career rushing yards...freshman cornerback Terrance Hayward recorded a career-high nine tackles...his eight first-quarter tackles were more than he had on the season entering the game (three).

NOTABLES FROM USC: Redshirt freshman cornerback Daniel Simmons recorded the first two tackles-for-loss of his career...sophomore linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis led WSU with a season-high 10 tackles...junior punter Reid Forrest connected for a 65-yard punt in the fourth quarter, eclipsing his career-best of 64 in the 2009 opener against Stanford...the Cougar defense held USC scoreless in the second and third quarters, making the first time since 2000 that WSU held the Trojans scoreless in back-to-back periods.

MONTGOMERY OUT FOR SEASON: Washington State University junior running back James Montgomery underwent surgery Sept. 20, for acute compartment syndrome in his left leg. The surgery was performed by Cougar team physician Dr. Ed Tingstad and will end Montgomery's season. Through the first three games of the season Montgomery led the Cougars in rushing, including his 118-yard effort against Hawaii. His 132.3 all-purpose yards per game ranked 46th in the nation and his 24.0 kickoff return average was t-51st.

PHASE III OF MARTIN STADIUM RENOVATION LAUNCHED: Washington State University Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced Tuesday (Sept. 22) the public launch of the third phase of the Martin Stadium Renovation project. Originally budgeted at approximately \$40 million, Phase III involves the construction of luxury suites, loge boxes and club seats atop the north stands. It follows the completion of Phases I and II, which included the addition of concession and restroom areas throughout the stadium, a concourse at the stadium's north side, many new comfort and safety enhancements, a Martin Stadium sign at the east end, a state-of-the-art scoreboard and the Cougar Pride statue at the plaza area on the stadium's northeast side. Phases I and II began in

December 2006 and were completed in the fall of 2008. The motto of the renovation project is TeamBuilt, a slogan that Sterk says communicates the importance of the involvement of all Cougar fans in this project. More information can be found by visiting the official stadium renovation Web site www.martinstadium.org.

NOTABLES FROM SMU: Sophomore Marshall Lobbestael earned his first start of the season and responded with a career-best 239 passing yards...the Cougar defense forced its seventh and eighth fumbles of the season, recovering one...WSU's five recoveries in 2009 are also more than in all of 2008 (three)...the Cougar defense intercepted four passes on the day...the last time the Cougars intercepted four passes was against Oregon State in 2008 (Oct. 11)...freshman defensive end Travis Long's sack in the first quarter was the first of his career...junior wide receiver Daniel Blackledge's second-quarter touchdown was the first of his career.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD: In addition to Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit and Lee Corso, ESPN's College Gameday has had another constant – the WSU flag, which has appeared on the weekly show a record 88-consecutive times since the beginning of the 2004 season. Two flags – Ol' Crimson and Whitey – have been flown in the background of the Gameday set by as many as 115 friends and alumni. In addition to the flags that fly, there is a traveling flag signed by the holders after each episode. The traveling flag is retired after each season, the first of which is hanging in WSU's Alumni Center.

2011 HAWAII GAME REMOVED FROM SCHEDULE: The 2011 meeting between Washington State and Hawaii has been removed from the Cougars schedule to allow for flexibility in the Pac-10 Conference schedule that year, said WSU Director of Athletics Jim Sterk. "The conference is looking at ways to create an off week during a 12-game schedule and this allows us the opportunity to adjust accordingly," said Sterk. WSU will pay the \$300,000 buyout stipulated in the contract.

NOTABLES FROM HAWAII: Junior wide receiver Jeffrey Solomon had team-highs of six receptions and 71 yards against the Warriors...in addition to his 118 yards on the ground, James Montgomery added a 10-yard reception and 78 yards in kickoff returns for 206 yards of all-purpose yards...in the first start of his career, linebacker Alex Hoffman-Ellis had a game-high-tying nine tackles, including five solo and two TFLs...junior punter Reid Forrest averaged 46 ypp on four kicks, with a long of 62.

NOTABLES FROM STANFORD: Eight different Cougars made their first collegiate start against Stanford...sophomore Louis Bland registered a game and career-high 10 tackles...senior running back Dwight Tardy moved into eighth place on the career rushes list with 434...junior punter Reid Forrest booted a career-long 64-yard punt, one of three punts over 50 yards on the day...quarterback Kevin Lopina's five-yard strike to Jared Karstetter was the first TD pass of his career...Karstetter ended the day with 91 receiving yards, one yard better than his 2008 season total...junior wide receiver Daniel Blackledge (67 yards) and senior tight end Tony Thompson (36 yards) both had career-best days.

ANDERSON TO FOCUS ON TRACK CAREER: Washington State University junior wide receiver Jeshua Anderson decided to leave the Cougar football team and focus solely on his track endeavors. Anderson played in the first two games this season, catching four passes for 66 yards. For his career he played in 26 games, 13 as a starter, catching 48 passes for 743 yards and four TDs. On the track Anderson is a two-time Pac-10 Conference, NCAA West Regional and NCAA champion in the 400-meter hurdles. He earned outdoor All-America honors twice and indoor All-America recognition once, and holds the school record in the 400m hurdles (48.47 seconds) and 4x400m indoor relay (3:06.74).

STARTING FROM DAY ONE: The Cougars had two true freshman start the 2009 season-opener against Stanford (Travis Long, defensive end; Gino Simone, wide receiver), the second time since the inception of the Pacific-10 Conference in 1978, and first in 31 years, two true freshmen position players started a season-opener for WSU.

THOMPSON WEARING DAD'S NUMBER: Senior tight end Tony Thompson wears a familiar number this season, one that his father wore more than 30 years ago. The younger Thompson wears No. 14, a tribute to his father, Jack, who wore the number from 1975-78. Following Jack's WSU playing career, the Cougars retired his No. 14, only the second football jersey to be retired (No. 7, Mel Hein) at WSU.



HEAD COACH PAUL WULFF



Paul Wulff enters his second season on the Cougar sideline after being named Washington's State's 31st head coach, Dec. 10, 2007. With his appointment Wulff became the first WSU football letterwinner and graduate to lead the Cougars since Phil Sarboe served as head coach from 1945-49.

A 1990 graduate of WSU and a four-year letterwinner, Wulff's first season leading the Cougars proved difficult as the transition to a new head coach combined with numerous injuries resulting in a 2-11 record. WSU's lone conference win came in dramatic fashion as the Cougars needed a last second field goal in regulation and two overtimes to defeat Washington 16-13 in the Apple Cup.

Wulff spent the previous 15 seasons at Eastern Washington University, the final eight as head coach. There he amassed a record of 53-40. During his eight-year head coaching tenure Wulff was named Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year three times (2001, 2004, 2005) and led the Eagles into the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs three times in the last four years. He enters the 2009 campaign with a 55-51 career head coaching record in nine seasons.

In 2007 he guided the Eagles to a 9-4 mark, including a quarterfinal appearance at the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs, falling to two-time defending champion Appalachian State. It marked the seventh time in his eight years at Eastern that his teams posted winning records.

Wulff began his coaching career at EWU in 1993 as a volunteer assistant working with the offensive line. He was named offensive line/strength coach the following season and spent four years in the position before being promoted to offensive coordinator/offensive line/strength coach in 1998.

Following two seasons as the team's offensive coordinator, Wulff was named head coach at Eastern prior to the 2000 season. He guided the Eagles to six straight winning seasons and seven overall during his eight-year tenure.

Wulff's 2005 team was loaded with experience, talent and leadership, featuring a group of seniors that included the Big Sky's Offensive and Defensive MVP's (Erik Meyer and Joey Cwik), and featured a trio of All-Americans (Meyer, Eric Kimble and Matt Alfred). Meyer would go on to win the Walter Payton Award as the best football player in the Football Championship Subdivision. Together, Meyer and Kimble rewrote Eastern's record book as they combined for 27 school records and four Big Sky marks. Meyer set a FCS record for passing efficiency rating (166.47 with 10,261 yards, 84 touchdowns, just 17 interceptions and a .657 completion rate), while Kimble's 46 touchdown grabs ranked second in FCS history behind the 50 of legendary Jerry Rice. The Eagles finished 7-5 and won the Big Sky title with a 5-2 record before losing to eventual national runner-up Northern Iowa in the first round of the playoffs.

The 2004 season was also special, even after the Eagles opened the season 0-2. Eastern won eight of its next nine games - most by substantial margins - as the Eagles closed the year with a 51-44 overtime victory at Montana State to secure a place in the playoffs. Quarterback Erik Meyer was named the league's Offensive Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award. Senior offensive tackle Michael Roos joined Meyer, wide receiver Eric Kimble and guard Rocky Hanni as All-Americans, with Roos eventually being taken in the second round of the NFL draft by the Tennessee Titans.

In 2004, Wulff's squad finished 9-4 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the playoffs. The crowning glory came when the Eagles knocked off No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Southern Illinois in the first round.

Statistically, the 2004 and 2005 teams were nearly identical with each finishing the year ranked fourth in FCS in total offense. In 2005 the Eagles averaged 477.8 yards per game, and were 14th in scoring (35.0). A year earlier the Eagles averaged 475.5 yards and 37.5 points per game to rank sixth.

Wulff coached 21 players to 54 Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Division I-AA) All-America honors in his first seven years at the helm of the EWU program, and two more of his players were named to the Sports Network's 2007 FCS All-America team at the conclusion of last year. Of the 21 players to earn All-America recognition, 15 have been offensive lineman.

Additionally, Wulff has mentored 15 players who have earned 18 total CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors and a total of 131 All-Big Sky Conference Academic team members.

As a student-athlete and four-year starter at center for the Cougars from 1986-89, Wulff was an All-America honoree himself as a senior, earning honorable mention accolades from The Sporting News. Wulff started at center under three different coaches after redshirting in 1985. He played for Jim Walden in 1986, Dennis Erickson from 1987-88 and Mike Price in 1989. He was also the starting center on WSU's 1988 Aloha Bowl championship team.

After a successful collegiate career Wulff had a brief pro career as a center after graduating from Washington State University in 1990. He signed a free agent contract with the New York Jets, but was released after injuring an ankle and a rib in the preseason. He played in spring 1991 with Raleigh-Durham of the World League, then played in spring 1992 with New York-New Jersey.

A 1985 graduate of Davis High School in Davis, Calif., Wulff played for three different coaches while he was at WSU. He redshirted in 1985 and started four games at guard in 1986 under Jim Walden.

Dennis Erickson directed the program in 1987 and 1988 with Wulff as his starting center both years. In 1988, the Cougars were victorious in the Aloha Bowl as Wulff earned honorable mention All-Pacific-10 Conference honors.

Under Mike Price in 1989, Wulff earned second-team all-conference honors and was an honorable mention selection on The Sporting News All-America squad. He was also WSU's long snapper during his stay there.

Wulff was born Feb. 25, 1967, in Woodland, Calif. He and his wife Sherry have a 14-year-old daughter, Katie, and two sons, six-year-old Max and three-year-old Sam.

Sept. 5, 2009, PULLMAN – Toby Gerhart rushed for a game-high 121 yards and two touchdowns as the Stanford Cardinal opened the season with a 39-13 victory over host Washington State. Stanford opened the scoring on a one-yard Gerhart touchdown run but the Cougars responded with a pair of long drives, cutting the lead to 8-3 early in the second quarter. A pair of touchdowns by the Cardinal, one through the air and another on the ground, gave Stanford a 22-3 lead at halftime. WSU opened the second half with an 8-play, 80-yard scoring drive, capped by a five-yard Kevin Lopina touchdown pass to Jared Karstetter, the first TD pass of Lopina's career. Nico Grasu's second field goal of the game cut the lead to 39-13 after three periods and WSU drew no closer. WSU receiver Daniel Blackledge finished the day with a career-best six catches and 67 yards while punter Reid Forrest averaged 47.7 yards per punt on six kicks, including a career-best 64 yarder.

Sept. 19, 2009, PULLMAN – Alex Hoffman-Ellis and Myron Beck each had interception returns for touchdowns and Nico Grasu's 39-yard field goal in overtime capped a 30-27 come-from-behind victory as Washington State defeated SMU for its first win of the 2009 season. SMU scored the game's first 17 points and led 27-13 with just over 10 minutes remaining in regulation before a furious Cougar rally. Beck stepped in from of a Bo Levi Mitchell pass and raced 67 yards with 10:07 left to bring WSU with seven at 27-20. Getting the ball on its own 20 with 2:03 left, Marshall Lobbestael orchestrated an 80-yard, 11-play drive in 1:35, tying the score when he connected with Jared Karstetter for a seven-yard strike to send the game into overtime. Sept. 26, 2009, LOS ANGELES – Freshman Matt Barkley threw for 247 yards and two touchdowns as the USC Trojans jumped to a 20-0 lead in the first quarter en route to a 27-6 victory over Washington State. Barkley threw touchdown passes of 57 and 29 yards to Danian Williams and Brice Butler, respectively, to put the Trojans ahead early. The Cougars defense settled down late in the first quarter and held USC to just seven points over the final three periods. Oct. 31, 2009, SAN ANTONIO – Jimmy Clausen threw for 268 yards and two touchdowns while Robert Hughes rushed for a game-high 131 yards and a touchdown as Notre Dame defeated Washington State 40-14 during the San Antonio Showdown Halloween night. Clausen completed 22 of 27 passes before leaving the game midway through the third period. The Irish led 23-0 in the first half before the Cougars found the scoreboard on a Jeff Tuel to Jared Karstetter 11-yard scoring pass.
