Also tied for second in the league by throwing out 17 baserunners in 56 attempts (.304) ... Had big games versus nationally-ranked Tennessee

and Clemson ... Went 2-for-3 with a double and RBI in game one versus the Volunteers, then wrapped up the three-game series with a 2-for-4 performance with two RBI and a home run ... At Clemson, went 3-for-4, including a double and a home run, with two RBI and three runs scored ... Went 6-for-14 in a three-game span versus Wofford, Appalachian State and Furman ... (2001): Started in all 54 games as a true freshman for the Bulldogs ... Batted .239 and led UNCA with 39 walks ... Saw most of his action at catcher, but also played some first base and designated hitter ... Had six multi-hit games ... Best performance was a 2-for-4 outing versus Appalachian State with three RBI in the contest.

HIGH SCHOOL: Earned All-State honors and was his conference's Player of the Year as he hit .419 with nine home runs and 44 RBI as a senior at Enka HS ... Was a three-time all-conference pick ... Selected to play in the State Games after his junior season, when he batted .481 with three homers and 47 RBI.

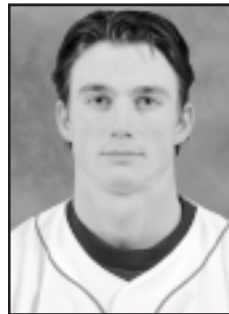
